NATIONAL LIBERAL PARTY.

The objects of the Party shall be :

(a) to work for the attainment by constitutional means of Swaraj (Responsible Self-Government and Dominion Status) for India at the earliest possible date :

(b) to promote the attainment of a higher standard of national efficiency by means of administrative reforms, the wider spread of education, the improvement of public health, economic development, the promotion of inter communal unity, and the amelioration of the condition of the backward classes of the population ;

(c) to promote and safeguard the spirit of nationalism in all spheres of public activity ;

(d) to promote the economic freedom and development of India ;

(e) to organise and maintain a National Liberal Party organisation in (i) every taluk, municipality or electoral constituency, (ii) the provincial and central legislatures ;

(f) to co-operate with National Liberal Party organisations in other provinces in political or other action in harmony with the party constitution ; and

(g) to give effect as far as may be practicable to the principles from time to time approved of by the National Liberal Party, Madras, and by the National Liberal Federation of India.
