## Foreword



The present handbook, under the title of *Special Price Legislation*, is a supplement to Part Two of *State Price Control Legislation*, which is Volume II in the *Marketing Laws Survey* series. *Special Price Legislation* includes administrative price control, legislative price fixing and miscellaneous price practices in the same order in which they were presented in the original volume. Research and analysis covered all pertinent statutes enacted by 1940 and 1941 legislative sessions and decisions in these three fields by the courts of State and Federal jurisdiction through 1940, 1941 and 1942.

To aid the agencies of government, students of law and marketing, the supplement follows the State by State summaries of Volume II. Each chapter and each subsection under the States designates the pages in the original volume which are amplified or amended by later legislation and judicial interpretation.

This supplement is the work of the *Marketing Laws Survey* project in the WPA Administration for Southern California. The early completion of this supplement in a field of legislation which holds during these war days the spotlight of national attention has been made possible by the generous co-operation of Henry Russell Amory, State Administrator for Work Projects Administration in Southern California. The research and production work has been under the immediate direction of William J.
