RESOLUTION

1. Constitution of the municipal committees.—The number of municipal committees increased from 66 to 68 on account of the establishment of a municipality at Mehkar and the conversion of the notified area at Itarsi into a municipality. General elections were held only in three municipalities. These were keenly contested, the number voting at Amraoti Camp being 84 per cent. Eighteen by-elections were held. In eight cases members were returned unopposed, while in the others the percentage of voters attending the poll varied from 50 at Mandla to 86 at Basim. At the general elections of Amraoti Camp, with a Muhammadan population of 12 per cent, 18 per cent of the elected and selected members were Muhammadans, while in Khamgaon with Muhammadans constituting 20 per cent of its population, no Muhammadan was elected or selected; and the representation of this community was secured by nomination. The Municipal Committee, Chhindwara, has been working without three members, the dispute regarding whose selection has been pending in the civil courts for nearly three years.

2. Disposal of business.—All the committees except Pachmarhi, Sausar and Narsinghpur held the prescribed number of meetings. The total number of meetings increased from 1,622 to 1,791. The average attendance

RESOLUTION

1. Constitution of the municipal committees.—The number of municipal committees increased from 66 to 68 on account of the establishment of a municipality at Mehkar and the conversion of the notified area at Itarsi into a municipality. General elections were held only in three municipalities. These were keenly contested, the number voting at Amraoti Camp being 84 per cent. Eighteen by-elections were held. In eight cases members were returned unopposed, while in the others the percentage of voters attending the poll varied from 50 at Mandla to 86 at Basim. At the general elections of Amraoti Camp, with a Muhammadan population of 12 per cent, 18 per cent of the elected and selected members were Muhammadans, while in Khamgaon with Muhammadans constituting 20 per cent of its population, no Muhammadan was elected or selected; and the representation of this community was secured by nomination. The Municipal Committee, Chhindwara, has been working without three members, the dispute regarding whose selection has been pending in the civil courts for nearly three years.

2. Disposal of business.—All the committees except Pachmarhi, Sausar and Narsinghpur held the prescribed number of meetings. The total number of meetings increased from 1,622 to 1,791. The average attendance

of both officials and non-officials slightly fell from 62 to 61 and that of non-officials also from 63 to 62. The attendance of official members increased from 43 to 44. Official attendance showed improvement in all divisions except Jubbulpore. The number of meetings which proved abortive for want of a quorum increased from 188 to 256. An inordinately large number of meetings (more than 30) was held by 17 municipal committees against 16, the worst offenders in this respect being Amraoti Town and Jubbulpore which held as many as 96 and 59 meetings respectively. These have become chronic features in the disposal of municipal business and are chiefly due to the apathy of members after election, unnecessarily protracted discussions and obstructive tactics arising from factionousness. Government hopes that the committees would partly remedy them by acting on the suggestion repeated in previous years of making delegation of their powers on a larger scale to sub-committees and office-bearers. Instances of habitual absentees continue. There were bad cases of absentees in the Murwara, Harda, Sausar, Pandhurna and Drug Municipalities. Formal warnings were issued to them in some cases. Kalmeshwar and Chanda Municipalities took action under section 22 for the removal of absentee members. The requirement of a two-thirds majority has been found to be an obstacle in the way of the removal of absentee members where factions exist. Government would, however, be prepared to consider the request of municipalities in suitable cases for excepting them from the operation of this provision under section 9 (1) of the Municipalities Act. Deputy Commissioners should impress on absentee nominated members their responsibilities in this respect.

3. Legislation, rules and byelaws.—Mr. G. R. Pradhan, M.L.C., introduced two bills to amend the Municipalities Act. One aimed at extending the period of municipal committees from three to five years and making a lay-out for roads and drains compulsory for the sale of plots in any large residential area. The object of the other bill was to empower municipal committees to obtain information regarding any corporation, company or association for the purposes of assessment. Both the bills lapsed with the expiry of the term of the Council. The account rules were amended so as to provide for the maintenance of registers of immoveable

property and civil suits. A register was also prescribed for showing the income for which there was no fixed demand. Provision was also made for the periodical verification of the solvency of a municipal banker in places where there is no Government treasury or sub-treasury. Model byelaws on two subjects were issued. A circular letter was issued drawing the attention of municipal committees to byelaws which could be suitably adopted as model. A large number of byelaws was made during the year, the principal among which being the byelaws made by four committees for regulating traffic and the duties of sweepers and those made by nine for the delegation of powers to office-bearers.

4. General financial results.—The total income of the committees, excluding opening balances and extraordinary and debt heads, showed an increase from Rs. 70,01,000 to Rs. 74,93,000. The increase occurred under all the main heads except "Contributions". The income from taxation and revenue derived from municipal property and powers apart from taxation rose by a little over 5½ lakhs and half a lakh, respectively. There was a fall of 1¾ lakhs under the head "Contributions" out of which Rs. 1,35,000 occurred under Government "Contributions" and Rs. 40,000 under other "Contributions." The total expenditure excluding extraordinary and debt heads rose from Rs. 65,46,000 to Rs. 75,00,000 and was more than the ordinary income by about Rs. 7,000. There has been increase under all the sub-heads. Expenditure on Public Health and Convenience rose by 4½ lakhs, while that on Public Instruction by a little over 2 lakhs. Expenditure on General Administration and Collection charges also rose by 1½ lakhs. The closing balance decreased from Rs. 15,96,000 to Rs. 15,87,000. The proportion of indirect taxation continues to be high, viz., 61 per cent to 39 per cent.

5. Octroi and terminal taxes.—The number of municipalities which levy octroi was reduced from 17 to 16, as the octroi at Burhanpur was replaced by terminal tax. Excluding Burhanpur, the income increased from Rs. 8,27,000 to Rs. 9,25,000. The increase was shared by all the municipalities except Hoshangabad. The increase was most noticeable at Kamptee, Raipur, Jubbulpore and Saugor. The increase was due to larger

imports, specially of cloth and articles of food attributed to the rush of marriages before the Sarada Act came into force. The proposal of the Saugor Municipal Committee to substitute terminal tax for octroi which has already been published for objections is still under consideration.

The number of municipal committees levying the terminal tax increased from 28 to 30 and the income from Rs. 15,41,000 to Rs. 17,82,000. At Balaghat the income fell by Rs. 2,000. Here and at Burhanpur the import traffic is being diverted to roads, in order to evade the payment of the tax. The advisability of imposing a tax on road-borne traffic is under consideration at Burhanpur. The tendency to impose indirect taxation in towns situated on the railway is particularly on the increase. Government agrees with the Commissioner, Berar, that the bulk of the proceeds of such taxation should be utilized for financing schemes involving large capital outlay, like water works, drainage and compulsory education and not frittered away in meeting current expenditure, as is the practice at present. Government therefore deplores the indifference of the municipal committees to its repeated advice for making the public utility services self-supporting which is the only way to release the proceeds of indirect taxation for larger schemes of development. The case of the Amraoti Town Municipal Committee is a glaring instance of this kind where the incidence of direct taxation is Re. 0-11-0 against the indirect incidence of Rs. 6-5-7.

**6. House and Haisiyat taxes.**—The total income from these taxes which are levied in 42 municipalities rose from Rs. 2,44,000 to Rs. 2,57,000. In Khurai, Damoh and Mandla large arrears remained outstanding at the close of the year. In Sohagpur the income from the Haisiyat tax fell from Rs. 4,993 to Rs. 2,778 as the committee did not recover the tax for a part of the year and subsequently suspended it altogether. The committee has, however, recently resolved to continue the assessment of the tax. At Dhamtari the haisiyat tax which had been suspended for several years, was reimposed during the year. The low receipts under this head are explained by the inherent aversion to direct taxation and present a sadcontrast to the increasing eagerness on the part of municipal committees to impose indirect taxation the incidence of which largely falls on the countryside



for which the towns are distributing centres. It stands to reason that those who benefit most from urban amenities should pay for them and Government appeals to the municipal committees to set their face against this shirking of their financial obligations by their towns people.

7. Water rate.—The number of municipal committees levying this rate remained the same as in the previous year, viz., 17; but the income rose from Rs. 6,18,000 to Rs. 7,50,000. Excluding, however, a nominal item of Rs. 56,600 on account of the withdrawal of the sinking fund at Nagpur the real increase was Rs. 75,000. The increase was noticeable at Nagpur (Rs. 53,000), Akola (Rs. 6,000) and Buldana (Rs. 4,000). At Nagpur the increase was due to better collections while in Buldana the construction of new buildings accounts for the increase. The collections at Akola include old arrears of special water rate. The income from this source at Hinganghat, Harda, Burhanpur, Damoh, Raipur, Amraoti Town and Camp, Akola and Shegaon fell short of the expenditure including repayment of the loan instalments. As stated in the previous year the position at Amraoti and Akola continues to be very unsatisfactory, the receipts being Rs. 8,000 and Rs. 10,000 against an expenditure of Rs. 86,000 and Rs. 71,000. As the Commissioner, Berar, points out at this rate the richest resident of Amraoti Town pays no more than 8 annas per month for his water. Damoh spends twice as much on water supply as it gets from water rate, but is opposed to increasing the rate on the plea of economic depression. There is absolutely no justification for any municipal committee declining to recover the full cost of supplying this elementary necessity to its residents.

8. Collection of taxes.—Government notes with regret that in spite of the previous year's observations, there has been no improvement in the collection of taxes. Taking 95 per cent as the standard of good collection, only six municipal committees reached this standard in the year under report against three in the previous year. In three others (Kamptee, Mowar and Jubbulpore) the collections exceeded 90 per cent against two in the previous year. In Ellichpur the collections amounted to

only 22 per cent owing to the late preparation of assessment lists. The average percentage of collection for the whole province was 71.1 against 71.5 in the previous year. Late preparation of assessment lists, the unsatisfactory condition of accounts, inadequacy of collection staff and insufficient supervision of the staff are assigned as reasons for poor recovery. All these are remediable defects and the remedies lie in the hands of the municipal committees concerned. Fourteen municipal committees were empowered to issue coercive processes, but most of them made no use of these powers while the number of cases in which coercive action was used is practically negligible. In one municipal committee 154 warrants were prepared, but the arrears were paid before their execution. The fundamental cause of poor recoveries would thus appear to be that the will to recover is not as effective as it should be. Municipal taxes represent the cost of the minimum amenities of decent living and all sensible townsmen should be prepared to treat them as prior charges on their income. Government believes that once the municipal committees make it perfectly clear that they do mean to collect their dues both the staff and the ratepayers would make a more tangible response. The blot of their own members being in arrears continues on the municipal committees of Malkapur, Seoni, Dhamtari and Ellichpur City. In Malkapur the arrears against members related to the year 1921-22! In the Ellichpur City Municipality even the President was in arrears. Those primarily responsible for the management of a municipal committee must obviously set a better example if the habit of punctual payment of municipal taxes is to be fostered in the general public.

9. General Administration.—The expenditure on general administration rose from Rs. 3,86,000 to Rs. 4,07,000 which is equal to 6 per cent of the total municipal income excluding grants and contributions and the extraordinary and debt heads. The percentage for the four chief towns were—

10. **Lighting.**—The expenditure on lighting increased from Rs. 3,20,000 to Rs. 3,65,000. The increase is mainly shared by the Jubbulpore and Amraoti Town Municipalities. Electric light was available during the year in the Nagpur, Jubbulpore, Raipur, Hinganghat, Wardha, Khandwa and Amraoti Municipalities and has been made available in the Akola and Saugor Municipalities since the close of the year. Electric works are under construction at Burhanpur and schemes for the supply of electricity at Khamgaon, Chanda, Yeotmal and Katni are under consideration. The Raipur Electrical Works have been transferred to the Raipur Municipal Committee, pending the completion of its purchase by the committee. This is the first instance in the province of an electrical undertaking being managed by a municipality and the experiment will be watched with interest.

11. **Water Supply.**—The total expenditure on water supply rose from Rs. 6,98,000 to Rs. 8,22,000, the proportion representing capital outlay showing a rise from Rs. 1,43,000 to Rs. 3,51,000. Government sanctioned a grant of Rs. 30,000 for the preparation of the detailed estimate of the Kanhan scheme at Nagpur, but owing to financial stringency this scheme has been kept in abeyance. In Wardha Rs. 91,000 were spent on the improvement of the water works. The rough scheme prepared by this municipality is under examination by an official of the Public Works Department. A chloronome apparatus was installed at Khandwa at a cost of Rs. 3,300. At Burhanpur the recurring expenditure on establishment was reduced by Rs. 7,400 chiefly owing to the installation of a larger pump. This municipality has applied to Government for an estimate of the cost of investigation of a permanent pumping scheme to be worked with electricity. The scheme for Chhindwara is still under the consideration of the committee, but in the meantime it has started depositing Rs. 2,000 every year with a view to building up a reserve fund for financing the scheme. The Itarsi Municipality has also a scheme under consideration. The expenditure at Raipur rose by Rs. 47,000 owing to the construction of a high-level reservoir and the payment of a full year's pumping charges to the electric company. The survey of the water works scheme for Drug was sanctioned late in the

year. In Berar there was an unusual water scarcity as the rainfall in 1929 had been poor. But nowhere was it more acute than at Amraoti. Experimental bores were put at likely places and the Legislative Council voted Rs. 40,000 for the purpose. Government also obtained for the committee the services of Major Pogson, the well known water diviner, but unfortunately the suggestions made by him did not prove very fruitful. A grant of Rs. 7,000 was sanctioned for the investigation of the Khamgaon water supply scheme. The Malkapur scheme, which is estimated to cost Rs. 4,23,000 has been approved by the Board of Public Health and is now under the consideration of the committee. The scheme at Basim has been dropped as it is beyond the financial capacity of the municipality. Municipal committees are devoting much attention to the improvement of water supply, but the real stumbling block is finance. This further proves the necessity of committees making their public utility services like water supply self-supporting.

12. Drainage.—The total expenditure on drainage fell from Rs. 3,07,000 to Rs. 2,69,000. The expenditure in Nagpur City increased from Rs. 99,000 to Rs. 1,50,000, out of which a sum of Rs. 36,600 was spent on the development of the sewage farm. There is an urgent necessity for drains in the new extension of Wardha town, but owing to heavy outlay on water works the municipality is unable to take up the work. The Bhandara Municipal Committee has abandoned its drainage scheme as it is beyond its financial capacity. Schemes for surface drains and the canalisation of the Omti nalla at Jubbulpore have been passed by the Board of Public Health, but they must await the return of normal conditions. The Khandwa Municipal Committee is unable to undertake the big drainage scheme and the question of taking it up piecemeal is under consideration. In Raipur the construction and repairs of drains are being carried out on an extensive scale and during the last seven years over Rs. 88,000 have been spent on this object. In Berar several schemes are under consideration, but no appreciable progress is possible until an adequate supply of water is assured.

13. Conservancy.—The income and expenditure under this head were Rs. 6,57,000 and Rs. 12,54,000 against Rs. 6,26,000 and Rs. 12,39,000, respectively, in

the previous year. About half the expenditure was on road cleaning. The actual income from latrine taxes was Rs. 5,88,000, while the expenditure on latrines both private and public amounted to Rs. 6,41,000. Only in a few municipalities, however, notably Nagpur, Kamptee, Akola, Khamgaon, Malkapur, Yeotmal and Digras, the receipts were more than the expenditure, while in 12 out of a total of 68 municipalities, the expenditure was in excess of receipts. Deori, Etawah and Khurai Municipalities have not yet imposed the latrine and conservancy cess and the expenditure continues to be met from general revenues. Owing to the failure of the Municipal Committee, Amraoti Town, to carry out the important recommendations of three successive Directors of Public Health Government in exercise of its powers of control was compelled to prescribe a time limit for the completion of certain works. A general strike of sweepers working under the Nagpur Municipality took place in the year under report for increase in their pay. New sweepers had to be imported from outside, but the strike ended in a compromise.

14. Hospitals and dispensaries.—The number of transferred dispensaries under the control of the municipal committees remained the same, *viz.*, 32. The number of indoor patient rose from 3,875, to 6,075 while that of outdoor patients fell from 834,000 to 788,000. The total income and expenditure fell from Rs. 1,13,000 and Rs. 1,62,000 to Rs. 96,000 and Rs. 1,54,000, respectively. The financial condition of almost all the transferred dispensaries is not sound. The total expenditure on all municipal hospitals and dispensaries rose from Rs. 2,68,000 to Rs. 2,78,000. The Khapa Municipal Committee constructed a family ward at a cost of Rs. 2,547 paid from Government grant. The Ayurvedic dispensaries maintained by the Jubbulpore, Harda, Raipur and Drug Municipalities are doing good work and gaining in popularity. One Ayurvedic dispensary was started by the Itarsi Municipality during the year. Child welfare is more and more coming to be regarded as part of the normal duties of municipalities and there are now centres working in all headquarters towns, except Balaghat, Buldana, Damoh, Mandla and Narsinghpur. The number of centres in the larger towns is also increasing.

15. Roads.—There was a slight fall of Rs. 1,000 in the expenditure on roads which amounted to Rs. 4,22,000 or 6 per cent of the total expenditure excluding debt heads. In addition to this a sum of Rs. 39,000 was sanctioned from the provincial revenues for the construction of roads and drains in the Rifle range area at Akola. The work is being carried out by the Public Work Department. Nagpur, Chanda, Warora, Raipur, Dhamtari, Akot, Murtizapur and Digras Municipalities spent more on roads than in the previous year, but this was counter-balanced by less expenditure in Jubbulpore, Gadawara, Bilaspur and Khamgaon. Several municipal committees have revived or imposed the internal or external vehicle tax or the toll tax and they should make it a point to ear-mark the income therefrom to be spent on roads.

16. Education.—The expenditure on education again increased and reached the proportion of 22 per cent of the total expenditure excluding debt heads against 20 in the previous year. There was a rise of a little over two lakhs over the figure of the previous year bringing the total to Rs. 16,63,000. The increase is due to the introduction of compulsory primary education in two municipalities, the construction of school buildings, the opening of new schools and the ordinary increments in the time-scale of teachers. By the end of the year compulsory primary education came to be in force in 14 municipalities and schemes for 5 others are under the consideration of Government. The total number of boys on the roll rose from 61,894 to 65,256 and the average daily attendance from 50,086 to 52,864 or 81 per cent of the enrolment. There is an increasing demand for high school education in Chanda and the municipality should consider the advisability of opening a second middle school in order to relieve the present congestion in the middle school section of the Government High School. At Saugor the necessity of another high school is felt and the committee contemplates adding high school classes to its anglo-vernacular middle school. Itarsi has arranged for the teaching of English as an optional subject in its vernacular middle school, while two high school classes have been opened at Gadawara. The Dhamtari Municipal Committee opened an anglo-vernacular middle school but the Director of Public Instruction has informed the committee that the school cannot be

recognized so long as it remains a centre of anti-Government activities. In Nagpur the substantial rise in the number of girls from 620 to 1,089 is encouraging. In pursuance of the Government's orders in the Education Department, the Municipal Committees of Amraoti Town and Shegaon have made a beginning in starting municipal girls' schools within their limits. The Municipal Weaving School at Burhanpur is progressing well and is expected to repay the costs of maintenance soon. A private factory has been started on the same model and the local weavers are likely to benefit from this municipal experiment.

17. Closing balances.—All committees except Kalmeshwar, Pauni, Murwara, Khurai, Hoshangabad, Pachmarhi, Chhindwara, Gadarwara, Akola, Karanja, Jalgaon and Malkapur close the year with a balance in excess of the prescribed minimum. But this includes in many cases amounts on account of ear-marked items of expenditure and unutilized balance of Government grant and loan. The budget rules were, therefore, amended requiring that unspent balances of Government grants, if included in the closing balance, should be shown separately. This would disclose the real financial position of the committees. In some municipalities the minimum balance was secured by suspending several works.

18. Audit.—The number of financial irregularities disclosed by the report of the Examiner of Local Fund Accounts fell from 3,178 to 2,329. The report disclosed that a slight improvement had been effected in the general state of accounts particularly in the matter of disposal of old audit objections. The Examiner reports that the accounts of Hinganghat, Wardha, Bhandara, Gondia, Raipur, Drug, Amraoti Camp, Khamgaon and Yeotmal Municipalities deteriorated, while those of Deoli, Balaghat, Ellichpur City, Murtizapur and Jalgaon were bad and those of Kalmeshwar, Katol and Murwara were very bad. The Examiner's report shows that much of the delay in dealing with audit objections and the recurrence of the same type of account irregularities are due to a lack of organization of, and systematization of, procedure in the offices of municipal committees. The Examiner suggests that an office manual describing office procedure

and specifying the duties and responsibilities of each individual servant of a local body would improve matters. The Government commends this suggestion to the municipal committees. As the staff varies from place to place it is not possible to prepare one manual for the whole of the province. Each municipal committee will have to prepare its own manual. The accounts of the Amraoti Town Municipality were in disorder and as the municipal committee failed to put them right within the time allotted to them, a special Auditor was appointed to dispose of the audit note and the cost recovered from the municipal committee. The office building of the Saoner Municipal Committee together with most of the account records was destroyed by fire and the accounts had to be built up anew. In Bhandara it was noticed that there was considerable delay in remitting money to outside places and as a result of the enquiry made, the President resigned and the Secretary was removed from service. The Gondia Municipal Committee applied for sanction to an expenditure on the purchase of photographs of political leaders, but was informed that such expenditure should be incurred out of public subscriptions. A bill to empower the officers of the Audit Department to surcharge members who incur expenditure contrary to law is under the consideration of the Government. There has been no improvement in the unpunctuality in the submission of budgets to the local Government and the budgets of only six municipal committees were received on the prescribed date.

**19. Notified Areas.**—The number of notified areas was reduced from 9 to 8 owing to the conversion of the notified area at Itarsi into a municipality. Section 13 of the Municipal Act has been extended to the Sindi and Bhatapara Notified Areas to enable them to hold elections by wards. The attendance of three elected members at Multai was unsatisfactory and Government's sanction to their removal was obtained after the close of the year. The total income fell from Rs. 1,38,000 to Rs. 1,19,000. At Pipariya the income rose from Rs. 16,000 to Rs. 22,000 owing to the receipt of a Government grant of Rs. 5,588 for the girls' school. At Kareliganj also the increase in income from Rs. 10,000 to Rs. 23,000 is nominal as it includes a grant of Rs. 8,000 for the construction of the girls school and



the dispensary building. At Bhatapara the fall in income by Rs. 4,000 was due to reduced receipts from the terminal tax as a result of short supply of wagons due to the strike on the Great Indian Peninsula Railway. The total expenditure fell from Rs. 2,05,000 to Rs. 1,65,000. But if the previous year's figure for Itarsi is excluded it rose by Rs. 21,000. At Sindi and Kareliganj the expenditure rose by Rs. 10,000 and Rs. 26,000. Part of the increase at Sindi is due to the construction of a building for the primary school and an anicut across the river for water supply at a cost of Rs. 3,893 and Rs. 1,328, respectively. At Bamora and Pipariya there was a fall in expenditure by Rs. 10,000 and Rs. 8,000, respectively. No explanation has been given for the decrease in the former, while in the latter the committee could not undertake any new expenditure on account of financial stringency. Sindi had a closing balance of Rs. 11,000 out of which Rs. 5,000 is intended as a reserve for the improvement of the water supply. The closing balance at Multai was Rs. 357 only against the prescribed minimum of Rs. 500. An allotment for the survey of the drainage scheme at Bhatapara has been sanctioned and the work has been commenced by the Public Works Department. The water supply scheme at Bhatapara and the drainage scheme at Kareliganj have been dropped for the present.

20. **General.**—On the whole the relations between the municipal committees and Government officers were cordial during the year. The administration of the Murwara Municipality showed no improvement and the committee has had to be dissolved after the close of the year. The administration of Bhandara, Hoshangabad, Pandhurna, Raipur and Dhamtari was marred by party factions. In Berar also the administration of several committees suffered in efficiency owing to the existence of factions. At Pandhurna in more than one instance injustice was done to the employees. In Raipur the President who had worked hard and well had to resign. In Dhamtari the Deputy Commissioner had to take action for suspending the execution of certain resolutions passed by the municipal committee. Government records its appreciation of the services rendered by the gentlemen whose names have been brought to notice in the reports of the Commissioners. The thanks of the Government

are also due to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for their assistance and advice in municipal administration.

ORDER.—Ordered that a copy of the resolution be submitted to the Government of India in the Department of Education, Health and Lands, that copies be forwarded to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for information and guidance; and that it be translated and circulated (through Deputy Commissioners) for the information and guidance of all municipal committees.

Ordered also that the resolution be published in the Supplement to the *Central Provinces Gazette*.
