RESOLUTION

1. Constitution.—The Nerbudda division and the revenue districts of Damoh, Seoni and Narsinghpur were abolished during the year, but the three district councils were continued, the Local Self-Government Act having been amended for the purpose. Except for the establishment of three municipalities and two notified areas in Yeotmal the constitution of the district councils and local boards remained unchanged. The Raipur and Betul district councils remained under supersession, but advisory boards were appointed in February and June 1932, respectively, for assisting the officers-in-charge. The office-bearers and certain other members of the Drug district council tendered their resignations on Government's ordering the council to take certain steps to improve its administration. As it appeared that the council had an explanation to offer Government suspended the orders towards the close of the year pending the receipt of the council's explanation. It was hoped that as a result the situation would improve, but owing to the unreasonable attitude adopted by the office-bearers and a section of the council, matters took a turn for the worse after the close of the year. Two important questions affecting the constitution of district councils and local boards are at present under the consideration of Government. One of them is the revision of the local franchise



and the other the abolition of local boards and the constitution of district councils or smaller unitary organizations by direct election.

2. Elections.—No general elections were held during the year. The constitution of the Yeotmal district council, which was a subject of litigation before the court of the Judicial Commissioner was completed in the year under review resulting in a majority for the non-Brahmin and democratic party as in the other district councils of the Berar division. The question of the abolition of plural-member constituencies was taken up during the year, but subsequently it was decided to defer action on it pending the inauguration of the reforms.

3. Disposal of business.—All district councils except one, and 69 local boards out of 83 held the prescribed number of meetings. The total number of meetings held was 779 against 791 in 1930-31 and 815 in 1929-30. Of these 74 proved abortive for want of a quorum as compared with 75 and 90, respectively, in the preceding two years. The need of adopting a more business-like procedure in order to avoid the holding of unnecessary meetings is being realized but slowly and the proportion of abortive meetings is susceptible of considerable reduction. The average percentage of attendance of members rose from 46 to 51 in the case of local boards and from 61 to 62 in the case of district councils, the percentage being unduly low in three district councils and as many as 43 local boards. Various explanations have been given of unsatisfactory attendance, such as the existence of casual vacancies, factions, stoppage of travelling allowance and long distances from tahsil headquarters, but there is little doubt that the main reason is the lack of a sense of responsibility on the part of the absentee members, which the local bodies concerned do little to correct. It is possible that legislation providing for the automatic removal of habitual absentees and their disqualification for future membership, which is advocated by two of the Commissioners, will effect some improvement in attendance, but where the default is so widespread as in the local boards of the Drug and Bilaspur districts any real improvement must await the growth of civic and political consciousness among the electorate.

4. General Financial Results.—The year opened with a balance of Rs. 25.44 lakhs. The total receipts from all sources amounted to Rs. 72.80 lakhs and the

total expenditure to Rs. 75.32 lakhs leaving a closing balance of Rs. 22.93 lakhs. The following table shows the net expenditure and receipts in lakhs of rupees in the various departments of the councils administration during the year :—

Although the crops yielded on the whole a fair outturn except in the Berar division and parts of Nagpur, the agricultural depression and the slump in trade continued in a more pronounced form, causing further deterioration in the income of the councils. Except in the case of the district councils, Wardha, Chanda, Chhindwara and Raipur, the closing balances of all district councils exceeded the prescribed minimum, but in some instances they still included unspent balances of Government grants and cheques outstanding for payment at the close of the year. The financial condition of the district councils of Wardha and Chanda is reported to be far from satisfactory.

5. General Departments.—The income under this head fell by Rs. 31,703. The fall is conspicuous under the heads "Local rates" (Rs. 25.19 to Rs. 24.73 lakhs), and "Land Revenue" (Rs. .93 to Rs. .80 lakh) and was shared by all district councils except some in the Jubbulpore division which show increased receipts on account of the collections of arrears of cesses. The decrease under "Land Revenue" is due to the suspension and remission of cesses on land revenue on a large scale. The decrease under "Local rates" occurred mainly in the Berar and Chhattisgarh divisions and is due to smaller receipts from 1 per cent abatement of land revenue and from market and cattle sale registration fees. Income under the minor head "civil works" however,

increased from Rs. 1.41 to Rs. 1.77 lakhs. On the expenditure side there was an all round decrease of Rs. .78 lakh attributable to measures of retrenchment necessitated by the dearth of funds.

6. Cattle pounds.—The number of cattle pounds fell by 18 to 1,823, several pounds which were not self-supporting having been closed. The income and expenditure declined from Rs. 7.45 and Rs. 3.93 lakhs to Rs. 6.19 and Rs. 3.33 lakhs, respectively. The fall in income is again attributed to the general economic depression reacting on the owners' care of their cattle and to the private settlement of trespass cases. The fall in expenditure is due to retrenchment and cheapness of fodder. Reduction of pound establishment has been effected by several district councils with a varying measure of success, but a note of warning must be sounded against the employment of unsuitable agencies which is bound to prove uneconomic in the long run. There could, however, be no such risk in the re-employment of agencies tried in the past as that of police patels in Berar on a suitable rate of remuneration. The neglect or entire absence of pound buildings of which the Commissioner, Jubbulpore division, complains is another false economy which Government wishes to see avoided.

7. Education.—The total expenditure on education, including buildings fell by Rs. 2.59 lakhs and was Rs. 28.85 lakhs, of which Rs. 9.79 lakhs was provided by Government, while fees and miscellaneous receipts covered Rs. .17 lakh leaving Rs. 18.89 lakhs, to be met out of the surplus from general purposes, grants and other resources of the councils. The total number of schools increased from 3,824 to 3,893, enrolment from 280,788 to 288,762 and the average attendance from 198,614 to 206,724. The increase is shared by all district councils except those in the Jubbulpore and Chhattisgarh divisions. The inadequacy of accommodation and equipment are commented upon by the Commissioner, Nagpur division, who suggests that the more urgent works of construction and repairs should be financed from loans. Although the expenditure on education absorbs as much as 54 per cent of the income it is obvious that with the resources likely to be available for some years to come no large extension of educational facilities in rural areas is possible. In the circumstances district councils will do well to consolidate the position in regard to their main concern, primary education; and refrain from diverting funds to higher

forms of education. The present is perhaps in some districts an inopportune moment for the imposition of the extra school rates allowed, but no lasting improvement can be effected unless it is imposed sooner or later. It is also most essential to minimize wastage and to induce school committees to take a livelier interest in attendance. Rules have been framed enabling village panchayats to be represented on school committees and the results of the innovation will be watched. Compulsory education was introduced in five centres in the Nagpur district. Elsewhere schemes were held up for want of funds and in some districts existing schemes languished. Government has noted for examination the suggestion that cases under the C. P. Primary Education Act should be triable by Village Benches.

It is satisfactory to note that the prejudice against the admission of the children of the depressed classes to the ordinary schools is rapidly breaking down, and that in some districts there has been an appreciable rise in the number of pupils from these classes and from the Muslim community. The opening of 9 new schools for girls in Berar and the increase in the number of girls attending boys' schools testifies to the growing demand for girls' education. The education of adults, however, which must be regarded as an essential complement of primary education does not appear to receive the encouragement it deserves. The movement for the provision of public libraries at selected centres seems to have taken root in the Jubbulpore division and has received some attention in Berar.

8. **Medical.**—The total expenditure on medical relief fell further from Rs. 3.23 to Rs. 3.21 lakhs, of which Rs. 1.09 lakhs was provided by Government grants. Although the expenditure in the province as a whole declined, it rose in Berar owing mainly to larger expenditure on buildings. The total number of cheap plan and transferred dispensaries managed by district councils remained the same as in the previous year. Three Ayurvedic dispensaries in the Bilaspur district had to be closed on account of financial stringency, while three new ones were opened in Bhandara. All the Commissioners animadvert on the reductions made by several district councils in their contributions to dispensaries and hospitals. Government trusts that the councils will take the earliest opportunity of restoring the grants to their old level, by economizing, if necessary, in the expenditure on other purposes less vital to the well-being of the rural population.

9. Public Health.—The total expenditure on vaccination decreased from Rs. 1.65 lakhs to Rs. 1.54 lakhs, while that on sanitation remained nearly the same as in the previous year, *viz.*, Rs. 22,000. The total number of vaccinations performed during the year was 629,700 (529,453 primary and 100,247 revaccinations) against 603,282 in the year preceding. A large number of children again remained unvaccinated in Nagpur and Nimar. There is a general deterioration in Nagpur and Wardha due to inadequate inspections by the assistant superintendent of vaccination. The deterioration in Wardha is all the more inexcusable because the council has a special medical officer. The district councils in Berar again appear to have paid insufficient attention to revaccination, the figure for which fell from 27,638 to 26,054. None of the district councils has so far put into effect the provisions of the Central Provinces Vaccination Law (Amendment) Act, 1932, and applied for its extension to selected rural areas. The reports are also silent about the action taken by the members of the councils and local boards in making use of their powers under the Central Provinces Juveniles Smoking Act. An interesting innovation is reported from Chhindwara where the council has appointed two doctors to combat malaria in selected rural areas: they are reported to be doing useful work. The total expenditure on water supply fell to Rs. 55,691 from Rs. 92,564 as owing to financial stringency no grants were paid for the purpose. The real remedy for defective water supply in rural areas is, as the Commissioner, Jubbulpore, points out, self-help, *i.e.*, for the well-to-do to offer cash contributions and for the poor to give their unskilled labour free of charge.

10. Veterinary and stock-breeding.—Veterinary receipts fell slightly and the expenditure from Rs. 1.08 lakhs to Rs. 1.03 lakhs. The decrease in expenditure is shared by all district councils except Wardha, Saugor, Raipur, Bilaspur, Balaghat and Akola and all independent local boards except Melghat. The total number of veterinary dispensaries under district councils was 91. The number of cases treated rose from 294,439 to 438,350, that of inoculations from 229,041 to 230,242\* and that of castrations from 82,776 to 96,175. Government notices with regret the disagreement between certain district councils and municipal committees over the payment

of proportionate contributions for the upkeep of veterinary dispensaries. It is hoped that the municipal committees will realize their responsibilities and settle the matter amicably. The Commissioner, Nagpur, reports that owing to unavoidable reasons the project of establishing a society in Nagpur for the prevention of cruelty to animals has not yet materialized. It is hoped that it will be possible to make a beginning soon.

**11. Civil Works.**—There was a further decrease of total expenditure on civil works from Rs. 8.05 lakhs to Rs. 6.72 lakhs. This is due chiefly to the shortage of funds and smaller grants from Government for transferred works. The total mileage of provincial roads transferred to district councils for maintenance was 1,971 against 1,949 in the previous year. The unspent balance of Government grants for transferred works at the beginning of the year was Rs. .62 lakh and grants aggregating Rs. 9.58 lakhs were paid during the year. A sum of Rs. 9.60 lakhs was expended and Rs. .16 lakh refunded, leaving a balance of Rs. .47 lakh at the close of the year.

Village roads continued to be neglected, while, except in the Berar division, district councils spent insignificant sums on the upkeep of their own roads and buildings. The complaint of the Jubbulpore district council about the transfer of an unduly large mileage to its charge as well as the demand of the Berar district councils for the transfer of additional mileage in order to reduce the relative cost of establishment have been noted by Government, but the decision will take time as the entire policy in regard to the transfer of roads is under Government's review.

**12. Markets.**—Three new markets were notified as public and one was cancelled. The number of villages to which sections 26—34 have been applied remained unchanged. The total number of markets regulated under section 23 and of villages to which sections 26—34 have been applied was thus 455 against 453 in the previous year. The income from this source of revenue declined further from Rs. 2.67 lakhs to Rs. 2.32 lakhs on account of the continuance of unfavourable economic conditions. None of the district councils incurred any expenditure either in improvements or repairs except the district councils, Mandla, Narsinghpur, Nimar and those in Berar. The district councils Mandla and Nimar paid

Rs. 2,437, a major portion of the surplus income from the markets in the village panchayat areas, to the respective panchayats and the district council, Damoh, handed over the management of the two markets held in the panchayat areas within its jurisdiction to the panchayats concerned. It is only fair that panchayats should be allowed either the management of the markets within their jurisdiction or a substantial portion of the income therefrom, a principle which many district councils appear to be reluctant to recognize.

13. Legislation, rules and byelaws.—There was no legislation concerning district councils during the year except the one referred to in paragraph 1 above. A Government bill to amend the Local Self-Government Act (Bill No. X of 1931) was introduced in the Legislative Council in August 1931 and has since become law. Among other things the amendment provides for appeals by the employees of district councils against orders of dismissal and for the grant of pension to them by the councils. The only important amendments to the rules framed under the Local Self-Government Act were the two following :—

- (i) In order to minimize delays in district council and local board elections, rule 1 of the rules under section 79 (i) (v) was so amended as to authorize Deputy Commissioners to fix the dates of and hold the elections of district councils and local boards subject to the orders of the Local Government.
- (ii) The power to try election disputes has been transferred to the Deputy Commissioners and the jurisdiction of the civil courts in the matter of election trials and appeals has been completely ousted.

The provident fund rules referred to last year were issued finally after considering the suggestions and objections received in respect thereof. The district fund account rules are still pending the consideration of Government. Model byelaws defining the respective spheres of duties of district councils and local boards as clearly as possible in order to reduce occasions for friction between the two classes of bodies to the minimum, which were under the consideration of Government, were finally issued at the close of the year.

14. **Taxation.**—Taxes under section 24 of the Local Self-Government Act were levied by all district councils in the Chhattisgarh division. The additional cess in Nagpur which was sanctioned as far back as 1930 and the levy of which was postponed for the revenue year 1930-31 on account of the depression in the price of cotton, was finally levied from the revenue year 1931-32 in order to make up the deficit in the council's budget. The district council, Chanda, also proposes to follow suit. The proposals of the district council, Jubbulpore, to levy a wheel tax and a special school rate referred to in the last year's resolution were sanctioned during the year. Although the wheel tax has been kept in abeyance owing for the moment, to unfavourable economic conditions, it is doubtful if the real difficulties of assessment and collection, together with the general unpopularity of the tax, will ultimately allow of its imposition. The school rate was imposed in 10 villages only. The levy of a tax on ginning factories in Hoshangabad was also sanctioned. The imposition of terminal tax in Raipur, on imports and exports at all railway stations in the district except those situated within the limits of municipal or notified areas has recently been sanctioned and the collection of the tax commenced from the 1st July 1932. Terminal tax proposals of the Nagpur district council were sanctioned after the close of the year but those of Chanda and Bilaspur are still pending, the latter because the council has not furnished the additional information called for.

15. **Staff.**—The provident fund system was in force in all district councils except Bhandara where the pension fund continued. Owing to the prevailing financial stringency almost all district councils were constrained to carry out retrenchments in their establishments and imposed cuts in the salaries of the staff. There is probably considerable scope for the weeding out of inefficients and the recruitment of carefully selected young men with minimum qualifications, of whom there is an abundant supply at present. The delay with which reports and returns are sent by district councils and the inaccuracies and other defects which disfigure them clearly indicate the need of improving the staff.

16. **Financial Irregularities.**—The accounts of the district councils, Seoni, Raipur, Akola and Buldana showed signs of improvement, while those of Nagpur, Bhandara and Hoshangabad district councils had apparently



deteriorated. The district councils, Amraoti, Chanda, Saugor, Damoh, Narsinghpur and Jubbulpore maintained their accounts in a satisfactory manner, but the accounts of Bilaspur and Drug continued to be unsatisfactory, the former having inherited a seriously deranged financial administration from its predecessor. The annual report of the Local Audit Department for 1931-32 has brought to light a large number of the usual financial irregularities with which the public is now painfully familiar. It is clear that office-bearers do not always take their duties as trustees of public funds sufficiently seriously, and instances are not lacking where they seemed to be guilty of something more than neglect. In the case of the Bilaspur district council, for example, the numerous irregularities that appeared to have been committed under the direct orders of the chairman of the district council, Bilaspur, resulted in the local Government sanctioning the institution of a civil suit against him in respect of damage caused by a variety of acts of misappropriation and misapplication of the district fund money. The Examiner of Local Fund Accounts repeats his complaint about the chronic delay in the disposal of audit objections on the part of district councils and local boards.

17. Village Panchayats.—During the year 75 new panchayats were established and two were disestablished, the total number of panchayats thus rising to 601. Enhanced powers under sections 18 (2) and 32 (2) of the Act were conferred on 81, the total number of panchayats exercising these powers being 93. Owing to financial stringency Government had to reduce the initial grant to new panchayats from Rs. 10,000 to Rs. 8,000, but even at the reduced rate, viz., Rs. 80 per panchayat, the grant should enable most of the new bodies to meet the necessary initial expenditure. The total income of the panchayats amounted to Rs. 1,53,673 and the total expenditure to Rs. 97,689. The panchayats performed much useful judicial work, having disposed of 4,492 criminal cases and 9,227 civil suits, but again failed to pay adequate attention to their administrative functions. Very few imposed any taxes or having imposed them made real efforts to collect them. Government is convinced that this one-sided development is not in the ultimate interests of the rural population and that no real or lasting progress in rural uplift can be effected so long as

village panchayats fail to realize their responsibilities in the matter. That this failure is due largely to lack of guidance and not to any inherent incapacity to manage administrative duties on the part of the panchayats is clear from the fact that wherever district officers have had the time or opportunity to interest them in rural welfare activities the panchayats have responded to the stimulus and given valuable assistance. But with the present rapid growth in the number of panchayats district officers will find it increasingly difficult to pay individual attention to these bodies; nor will it be possible for the Village Panchayat Officer, whom Government proposes to re-appoint at an early date, to provide more than general advice and guidance. It is to the district councils that panchayats must look for constant inspection, detailed guidance and steady encouragement. The district councils, Nagpur, Bilaspur, Amraoti and Yeotmal have taken active steps for fostering the growth of the panchayat movement in their districts on the right lines, but most of the other district councils are either apathetic or decidedly step-motherly in their treatment of the panchayats within their jurisdiction. Government trusts that district councils will give proof of a livelier sense of their duty towards these bodies by so exercising their statutory powers of inspection, supervision and control as to make of the panchayats the important instrument of rural welfare they were intended to be.

18. **General.**—The general economic depression continued to be the outstanding feature of the year, but the civil disobedience movement was on the wane. The relations of district councils and local boards with the executive officials of Government were cordial as usual, and generally the administration of these bodies was not aligned with reference to extreme political views. The tendency to use village school masters for the purpose of political propaganda, which Government has deprecated in the past, was not, however, always curbed and in a few instances the undesirability of permitting employees to take part in illegal political activities was not sufficiently realized. The relations between the councils and the local boards also continued to be harmonious, except in Wardha, where the friction between the council and the local board, Hinganghat, necessitated the intervention of the Deputy Commissioner and the Commissioner. Many of the district councils administered their affairs in the face of difficult conditions with courage and a reasonable

degree of efficiency, a result which bears testimony to the interest taken by the office-bearers and members concerned in the performance of their public duties. The thanks of Government and the public are due to those gentlemen whose names have been specially brought to notice by the Commissioners.

RESOLUTION

1. **Constitution.**—The constitution of the district councils and local boards remained unchanged during the year. The district council, Betul, which had been under supersession, was reconstituted in February 1933. The district council, Raipur, continued to be managed by Government through an Extra-Assistant Commissioner assisted by an advisory board. As a result of the resignation of the office-bearers and some members there was a deadlock in the affairs of the district council, Drug. Government had to take action under section 62(1) of the Local Self-Government Act to put an end to this. The resignations were accepted and the council was reconstituted. The two important questions referred to in the last year's resolution, viz., the revision of local franchise and the replacement of the existing local boards and district councils by smaller unitary organizations constituted by direct election, are still under the consideration of Government.

2. **Elections.**—General elections were due in 12 district councils and one independant local board. These were held more or less punctually, except in the districts of Saugor, Hoshangabad and Jubbulpore, where undue delay occurred in the preparation of the voters' lists in spite of the recent amendment of the electoral rules with a view to expediting elections. Except in the Wardha and Chanda districts, where they were hotly

contested on communal, political or personal issues, the elections did not evoke much public interest and it is disappointing that as many as 16 seats remained unfilled for want of candidates.

3. Disposal of business.—All district councils, except three, and 65 local boards out of 83, held the prescribed number of meetings. The total number of meetings held was 693 against 779 in 1931-32 and 791 in 1930-31. Of these 75 proved abortive for want of a quorum as compared with 74 and 75, respectively, in the preceding two years. The average percentage of attendance of members, however, rose from 62 to 64 in the case of district councils in general, but declined from 51 to 48 in that of the local boards. With a few exceptions, there was a general improvement in the attendance of district council members; and this is attributed in Berar in part at least, to the grant of travelling allowance to members. The percentage of attendance is undoubtedly affected by the apathy of habitual absentees and two of the Commissioners again advocate legislation for the automatic removal of such persons. Government is examining this suggestion.

4. General Financial Results.—The year opened with a balance of Rs. 23.62 lakhs. The total receipts from all sources amounted to Rs. 71.79 lakhs and the total expenditure to Rs. 68.20 lakhs, leaving a closing balance of Rs. 27.21 lakhs. The following table shows the net expenditure and receipts in lakhs of rupees in the various departments of the councils' administration during the year:—

With no improvement in the economic situation the finances of district councils continued to be unsatisfactory. Almost all the councils had to curtail their expenditure and to retrench the pay of their staff and the councils of Jubbulpore, Saugor and Hoshangabad were compelled to draw largely upon their balances to meet the year's liabilities. Except in the case of Wardha, Chanda, Chhindwara and Seoni, the closing balances of all district councils were in excess of the prescribed minimum, but in some instances they included unspent balances of Government grants and cheques outstanding for payment at the close of the year.

5. General Departments.—The income under this head rose by Rs. 2.02 lakhs and the rise was shared by many. The increase is mainly under the heads "Local rates" (from Rs. 24.73 lakhs to Rs. 26.80 lakhs) and "Land Revenue" (from Rs. 0.80 lakh to Rs. 1.05 lakhs). The receipts under other minor heads remained more or less stationary except those under "Miscellaneous" which decreased by Rs. 6,028. On the expenditure side also there was a small increase of Rs. 9,019 mostly under the heads "General Administration", "Stationary and Printing" and "Miscellaneous".

6. Cattle pounds.—The number of cattle pounds fell from 1,823 to 1,819 owing to the closure of several pounds which were not self-supporting. The income and expenditure dropped further from Rs. 6.19 and Rs. 3.33 lakhs to Rs. 6.01 and Rs. 2.92 respectively. The fall in income is again attributed to the general economic depression, less receipts from the sale of unclaimed cattle, to the prevalence of the "anni" system in the case of Raipur and Drug and in some cases to lack of proper supervision and inspection. The fall in expenditure is attributed to retrenchment and cheapness of fodder. The appointment of full-time pound inspectors has resulted in a marked rise in pound receipts in the Amraoti and Murtizapur taluqs. The discontinuance of such inspectors by the Yeotmal district council caused a drop in pound income. Government would like to draw the attention of district councils to the moral of these facts.

7. Education.—The total expenditure, including that on buildings fell further from Rs. 28.85 lakhs to Rs. 27.64 lakhs, of which Rs. 10.07 lakhs were provided

by Government, while fees and miscellaneous receipts covered Rs. 0.11 lakh leaving Rs. 17.46 lakhs, to be met out of the surplus from general purposes grant and other resources of the councils. The total number of schools increased from 3,893 to 3,928, enrolment from 288,762 to 292,477 and the average attendance from 206,724 to 213,319. The inadequacy of accommodation and equipment still continue to be the outstanding complaints almost everywhere. The condition of the school buildings in Wardha is reported to be very unsatisfactory as a result of the failure to effect timely repairs and of defective construction. Many schools in the Jubbulpore division meet in rented buildings and many need extensions. Education in the Drug district is said to have deteriorated considerably owing to lack of control as the result of internal disputes in the district council. It is satisfactory to note that the process of replacing untrained teachers by trained ones is being carried on with increasing zeal. Transfers of teachers are reported to be excessive in the councils in the Jubbulpore and Berar divisions. While Yeotmal kept them down to 100, Amraoti with a staff of 1,127 recorded 335 transfers, and Buldana produced the abnormal figure of 716—a percentage of 71 on its staff of 1,003. Such transfers, besides involving unnecessary waste of public money, are, as the examination results signify, harmful to the cause of education itself.

Compulsion in education was extended to 50 villages in the Amraoti district and 5 in the Nagpur district. The year saw the introduction of a new scheme of superintendence and of a common primary certificate examination in Berar. The attendance of girls improved greatly both in their own and in boys' schools.

**8. Medical.**—The total expenditure on medical relief declined further from Rs. 3.21 lakhs to Rs. 2.74 lakhs of which Rs. 0.92 lakh was provided by Government grants. Only two cheap plan dispensaries were started in Berar; but the total number of cheap plan and transferred dispensaries managed by district councils came down by 5 to 81 and the reduction is due to the transfer of some dispensaries from the district councils to the municipal or notified area committees newly started within the respective jurisdiction of the district councils. It is regretted that most of the councils have not yet restored the dispensary grants to their old levels; and the Commissioner, Jubbulpore division, apprehends that some of the dispensaries, especially those in Saugor,

may have to be closed for want of funds. Government would like to emphasize once more the need of giving precedence to expenditure on the medical relief of the rural population. Three Ayurvedic dispensaries were opened by the Amraoti council and two by the Akola council, while the Bhandara council subsidized a private practitioner at Lakhandur.

**9. Public Health.**—The total expenditure on vaccination decreased further from Rs. 1.54 lakhs to Rs. 1.48 lakhs and that on sanitation from Rs. 21,942 to Rs. 19,276. The total number of vaccinations performed during the year was 648,166 (558,825 primary and 89,341 re-vaccinations) against 629,700 in the year preceding. A large number of children again remained unvaccinated in Nagpur, Raipur and Drug, in the latter two districts owing partly to sickness amongst children and partly to slackness on the part of some of the vaccinators. Inadequate inspections by assistant superintendents of vaccination are still the rule in Nagpur, Wardha and Chanda. The new doctor appointed in Chhindwara to combat malaria is said to be doing good work. None of the councils has so far put into effect the provisions of the Central Provinces Vaccination Law (Amendment) Act, 1932, but the introduction of compulsory vaccination is reported to be engaging the attention of several councils. The expenditure on water supply fell heavily from Rs. 55,691 to Rs. 27,945. The fall was conspicuous in the case of the Berar councils. Government notes with regret the apathy of councils in this matter as is evidenced by Government grants being left unspent even by the Akola district council with its problems of the saline tract.

**10. Veterinary and stock-breeding.**—Veterinary receipts increased from Rs. 1,152 to Rs. 2,819, and the expenditure from Rs. 1.03 lakhs to Rs. 1.06 lakhs. The increase in expenditure is shared by almost all the district councils. The total number of veterinary dispensaries under district councils was 92, a new one being opened at Saoner. The number of cases treated rose from 438,350 to 597,417 that of inoculations, from 230,242 to 368,325 and that of castrations, from 96,175 to 114,355. The year was particularly unhealthy for the cattle, severe outbreaks of rinderpest occurring in all divisions except Chhattisgarh. The complaint about certain municipal committees failing to pay their proper contributions to veterinary dispensaries is repeated again.

Government hopes that the committees concerned will come to an amicable settlement in the matter.

**11. Civil Works.**—The expenditure on civil works fell further from Rs. 6.72 lakhs to Rs. 6.36 lakhs. This is due to there being little expenditure on original works and to smaller grants from Government for transferred works. The total length of provincial roads transferred to district councils for maintenance fell from 1,971 to 1,930 miles. The unspent balance of Government grants for transferred works at the beginning of the year was Rs. 0.52 lakh, and grants aggregating Rs. 9.17 lakhs were paid during the year. A sum of Rs. 9.04 lakhs was expended and Rs. 0.32 lakh refunded, leaving a balance of Rs. 0.33 lakh at the close of the year.

Village roads were neglected as usual. The question of fair weather roads is again agitated by the district councils Buldana and Akola, the latter calling it anomalous that Government should expect local authorities to shoulder this responsibility. In this connection Government would like to point out that such roads of local utility are now recognised to be a proper charge on local funds. The question of the transfer of additional Government roads is still under the consideration of Government, and a committee has recently been appointed to go into it.

**12. Markets.**—Six new markets were notified as public and 13 were cancelled. The number of villages to which sections 26—34 have been applied remained unchanged. The total number of markets regulated under section 23 and of villages to which sections 26—34 have been applied was thus 448 against 455 in the previous year. The income from this source, however, rose from Rs. 2.32 lakhs to Rs. 2.61 lakhs and the increase is shared by all the district councils. The only district councils which spent some amount on the improvement or repair of markets are those of Narsinghpur, Bhandara, Drug and Balaghat. Government notices with regret that other councils, which derive a fairly large income from this source, did practically nothing for improving the market amenities. Nimar and Mandla continued the practice of paying a portion of income from markets within village panchayat areas to the panchayats concerned. Government reiterates its appeal to other councils to adopt this fair practice.

**13. Legislation, rules and byelaws.**—Act No. VII of 1933 passed during the year provides among other

things for appeals by district council employees against orders of their dismissal. A more far reaching measure is the Central Provinces Local Fund Audit Act, 1933, which was passed towards the end of the year. The Act is a landmark in the history of efforts to place the financial administration of local bodies on a proper footing. It provides for the amounts of illegal or unauthorized expenditure out of local funds being surcharged against those responsible for it. A bill introduced by Mr. R. W. Fulay, seeking to authorize municipal committees to frame byelaws for regulating the employment of children and the employment of women at night in sarais, markets, etc., has since been passed into law.

14. **Taxation.**—A terminal tax was introduced in Raipur with effect from the 1st July 1932. Buldana and Yeotmal have increased the pitch of the special school rate. As foreshadowed last year the imposition of the wheel tax was postponed in Jubbulpore and the council is contemplating the abandonment of this form of direct taxation in favour of the terminal tax. The necessity of additional taxation is acutely felt by the Jubbulpore, Saugor and Hoshangabad councils, the financial position of which is serious. The suit regarding the right of the Bhandara district council to levy a terminal tax on bidi and bidi leaves was finally decided in its favour by the Additional Judicial Commissioner. Buldana has submitted proposals for the imposition of fees on cattle registration and Melghat has also published for criticism its proposals for the assessment of market fees. In Akola, proposals for the levy of tolls on the bridges on the Pen and Katepurna have been passed, but are not yet operative.

15. **Staff.**—The cuts imposed by the councils in the pay of the staff as a measure of retrenchment continued during the year and a few more posts have had to come under the axe. In order to deal with the financial chaos in Wardha resulting from the mismanagement by the old body, the new council has had to effect drastic retrenchments in posts and pay. In spite of there being a glut of qualified candidates the councils, particularly those in the Chhattisgarh division, show no disposition to replace their inefficient staff by persons of superior calibre. For example, not a single member on the establishment of Drug district council is even a matriculate. Delays and irregularities in the transaction of district council business are therefore on the increase.

**16. Financial irregularities.**—The accounts of the district councils of Jubbulpore, Saugor, Damoh, Mandla, Narsinghpur and Yeotmal continued to be well-maintained, but those of Amraoti, Seoni and Chanda deteriorated to some extent. Some improvement was noticeable in the accounts of the district councils of Nagpur and Bhandara. The accounts of Hoshangabad district council were in a bad state, while those of Bilaspur district council were extremely unsatisfactory. Several cases of embezzlements, misappropriations and financial irregularities of all descriptions are again brought to light in the annual report of the Local Audit Department for the year 1932-33. The attention of the councils concerned has been pointedly drawn by Government to these and in the case of the more intransigent of them the payment of Government grants has had to be withheld. This step has also been considered necessary for making many councils dispose of the audit objections expeditiously. In Amraoti members have been called upon to refund sums unauthorizedly expended. The provisions of the Central Provinces Local Fund Audit Act, 1933, will no doubt be an effective check on financial irregularities in future, but Government expresses the hope that those in charge of local bodies will develop a greater sense of responsibility and a more sensitive conscience in respect of public funds so that the occasions for restoring to these provisions may be minimized.

**17. Village Panchayats.**—During the year 197 new panchayats were established and 4 were disestablished. Yeotmal district alone is responsible for an increase of 157 panchayats. Government shares the apprehension of the Commissioner that when these bodies are multiplied in such haste many of them must be mushroom growths. Enhanced powers under sections 18 (2) and 32 (2) of the Act were conferred on 5 village benches and 48 village courts respectively. Five panchayats in Amraoti and 3 in Wardha have received powers under section 54 to try suits above one year. Rs. 10,000 were provided for initial grants to village panchayats of which Rs. 1,425 were surrendered. The total receipts of the panchayats amounted to Rs. 1,63,363 and the total expenditure to Rs. 1,04,289. 4,950 criminal cases and 9,395 civil suits were disposed of by the village benches and village courts respectively. The post of the Village Panchayat Officer was revived in February 1933 and an officer appointed after the close of the year. The Village



Panchayat Officer works under the general control of the Registrar of Co-operative Societies. Two bills, introduced by Rao Sahib U. S. Patil in the Central Provinces Legislative Council to amend the Village Panchayat Act have since been passed into law. Panchayats continue to be apathetic towards the assumption of administrative functions. Taxation is not essential to this in every case. Several district councils are quite willing to render financial assistance by giving away substantial portion of the local bazar income or even with grants. Other activities like the improvement of general sanitation do not require much money. Too much faith is pinned to the efficacy of legislation alone. What is wanted is more sustained efforts to train them in the actual art of rural self-government. To this end Government would welcome the formation of sub-committees of district councils as recommended in 1928.

18. General.—On account of the continuance of the financial stringency, works of improvement have been held in abeyance. Local boards took no part in politics but confined themselves to their legitimate duties. With the single exception of the district council, Drug, the relations between the executive officials of Government and the district councils were cordial. Government has to record with regret that the tendency on the part of some of the local boards to disregard the superior authority of the district councils and to claim undue independence of action is becoming more frequent. This has in some cases embittered the relations of the local boards and councils with unfortunate repercussion on general administration. The common object of both is public service and Government would appeal to those at the helm of such bodies to give precedence to the interests of the public and good administration over their personal feelings. The thanks of Government and the public are due to those gentlemen whose names have been specially brought to notice by the Commissioners.

ORDER.—Ordered that a copy of this Resolution be submitted to the Government of India, Department of Education, Health and Lands, that copies be forwarded to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for information and guidance and that it be translated and circulated (through Deputy Commissioners) for the information and guidance of all district council and local board members.

ORDERED also that the Resolution be published in the *Central Provinces Gazette*, Part I.

RESOLUTION

1. **Constitution.**—The constitution of the district councils and the local boards remained unchanged during the year. The District Council, Raipur, which had been under supersession, was reconstituted in March, 1934. The two questions relating to the revision of local franchise and the replacement of the existing local boards and district councils by smaller unitary organizations constituted by direct election were further examined in the light of the proceedings of the Commissioners' conference at which they were considered. It was decided to keep the former pending till the franchise for the provincial councils under the new reforms was settled finally and the latter has been referred to district councils for opinion.

2. **Elections.**—General elections were held or completed in 15 district councils, of which those in Nagpur, Jubbulpore, Nimar, Bhandara and Berar were keenly contested. The percentage of votes polled was fairly high, generally varying from 55 to 65. Except in Berar and Chhattisgarh, members of the depressed classes were not generally successful at elections and their representation had to be secured by nomination. Although, as the Commissioner, Berar, observes, the eventual result at elections was determined largely by the personal



influence of the candidate and his friends, it is interesting to note that the grouping of political parties in the provincial Council was partly reflected in the grouping for these local elections in Berar and the Marathi districts of the Central Provinces.

3. Disposal of business.—All the district councils except 3 and all the local boards except 15 held the prescribed number of meetings. The total number of meetings held was 725 (693), of which 58 (75) proved abortive for want of a quorum. The average percentage of attendance at the district council and local board meetings rose slightly to 69 (64) and 51 (48) respectively. Habitual absenteeism, however, continues to be a feature in some district councils and local boards, and no use was made of section 17 (2) (a) of the Local Self-Government Act to remove the members concerned. The Commissioner, Jubbulpore, suggests that legislation providing for automatic vacation of the seats of such members appears to be the most effective remedy for this state of things.

4. General Financial Results.—The year opened with a balance of Rs. 27.94 lakhs. The total receipts from all sources amounted to Rs. 71.39 lakhs and the total expenditure to Rs. 70.10 lakhs, leaving a closing balance of Rs. 29.23 lakhs. The following table shows the net expenditure and receipts in lakhs of rupees in the various departments:—

There was no improvement in the economic situation and the district councils had thus to pass through another

year of stagnation. All the measures of retrenchment in the way of drastic cuts in salaries and curtailment of avoidable expenditure adopted in previous years were continued; but in spite of that the district councils of Jubbulpore, Saugor and Hoshangabad had again to draw upon their balances to some extent to meet their essential commitments. With the exception of Wardha, Seoni, Jubbulpore and Hoshangabad, the closing balances of all the district councils were above the prescribed minimum.

5. General Department.—The income under this head amounted to Rs. 35.48 (36.41) lakhs and the expenditure to Rs. 9.06 (8.45) lakhs. The decrease occurred mainly under "Land Revenue" in Berar and under "Cesses" in Chhattisgarh division owing to suspensions and remissions granted on account of crop failures and the damage done by floods. The increase in expenditure was mainly under the head "General Administration" and "Miscellaneous". The restoration of the 5 per cent cut in salaries in some district councils is mainly responsible for the rise under "General Administration".

6. Cattle-pounds.—The number of cattle-pounds increased from 1,819 to 1,848. The income, however, fell from Rs. 6.01 lakhs to Rs. 5.76 lakhs while the expenditure rose from Rs. 2.91 lakhs to Rs. 3.06 lakhs. This result is to be attributed chiefly to the general economic depression. In the Chhattisgarh division the income rose from Rs. 85,000 to Rs. 92,000 partly as a result of more effective supervision by increasing the staff of pound inspectors. The increase would have been larger but for the prevalence of what is known locally as the "Kathena" system in Bilaspur whereby malguzars and tenants make their own arrangements for seizing trespassing cattle and realizing fees generally in grain from their owners, the proceeds being utilized for remunerating the staff employed. The Deputy Commissioner, Bilaspur, is examining the legality of this system. In view of the results of increase in supervising staff in Chhattisgarh, the proposal of the District Council, Akola, to disband the pound inspectors seems to be ill-advised.

7. Education.—The total expenditure including that on buildings was Rs. 28.62 (27.64) lakhs, of which

Rs. 10.07 (10.07) lakhs were provided by Government, while fees, contributions other than those from provincial revenues and miscellaneous receipts covered Rs. 0.20 (0.17) lakhs leaving Rs. 18.35 (17.40) lakhs to be met out of the surplus from the general purposes grants and other resources of the councils. The total number of schools increased further to 3,979 (3,928), enrolment to 298,399 (292,477) and the average attendance to 226,529 (213,319). The increase in expenditure is due to the restoration partly or in full of the cuts in the salaries of teachers in some districts and also to the repairs of school buildings and the opening of new schools in some. Further deterioration is reported in the condition of school buildings, and unless the councils draw up a carefully thought-out programme of repairs and carry it out in order of urgency, they may be faced with the heavy cost of replacing sooner or later some of the buildings which are not yet beyond repair. Except in Nagpur, Wardha and Betul, compulsory primary education made little headway. An Act has recently been passed empowering village panchayats to try cases under the Primary Education Act and it is hoped that this will facilitate action to improve the attendance.

8. **Medical.**—The total expenditure on medical relief rose slightly to Rs. 2.78 (2.74) lakhs of which Rs. 1.04 was provided by Government grants. The number of cheap plan and transferred dispensaries rose to 83 (81). The demand for more dispensaries of this kind is insistent, but in view of the difficulty experienced by local bodies in maintaining the existing institutions, the establishment of new dispensaries must await an improvement in the financial position. The three Ayurvedic dispensaries started in the Bhandara district in 1931-32 were closed down as they were found to be doing no useful work. Three such dispensaries were, however, opened by the District Council, Amraoti.

9. **Public Health.**—The total expenditure on vaccination and sanitation decreased further to Rs. 1.46 (1.48) lakhs and Rs. 0.17 (0.19) lakhs respectively. The total number of vaccinations performed during the year was 674,062 (648,166) of which 567,291 (558,825) were primary and 106,771 (89,341) re-vaccinations. The thoroughness achieved by the Independent Mining Local

Board, Chhindwara, in vaccination deserves special mention as not a single child within the Board's area is reported to have remained unvaccinated. In Nimar also the number of such children was brought down to 494, an epidemic of smallpox in the district having encouraged vaccination on an intensive scale. Government is glad to note that several councils have taken up seriously the question of making vaccination compulsory in rural areas, and since the close of the year compulsory vaccination has been introduced in certain selected villages of the Mandla district and the District Council, Damoh, has submitted a proposal to introduce it in 170 villages. District councils must, however, expedite the extension of this measure which is of such vital importance to the public health of the province. The expenditure on water-supply amounted to Rs. 31,972 (27,945). Government regrets to note that this matter does not receive proper attention in the budgets of councils. The two touring malaria dispensaries started by the District Council, Chhindwara, did useful work.

10. **Veterinary and Stock breeding.**—Veterinary receipts decreased to Rs. 1,730 (2,819), while the expenditure increased by Rs. 515 to Rs. 1,06,696. The fall in the receipts was chiefly due to the non-payment by the Municipal Committee, Wardha, of its contribution to the District Council, Wardha. The total number of dispensaries remained the same, namely, 92. The number of cases treated, and of inoculations and castrations was 637,717 (597,417), 490,711 (368,325) and 130,044 (114,355) respectively. Except in the Nagpur division where the mortality from rinderpest was serious, particularly in the Chanda district, the year was healthy for cattle on the whole. Some of the dispensaries are without suitable buildings and Government hopes that a beginning will be made in supplying them as early as possible. Disputes about contributions payable by some of the municipal committees continue. In this connection Government commends for the consideration of district councils the suggestion of the Commissioner, Berar, that a compromise may be possible in some cases by setting off the benefit conferred on the district council area by the human dispensaries usually supported by municipal committees.

**11. Civil Works.**—The expenditure on Civil Works rose to Rs. 6.93 (6.35) lakhs. The rise was marked in the Raipur, Bilaspur, Amraoti, Akola and Yeotmal districts. Government hopes that increased expenditure under this head during the present financial stringency is incurred on really urgent works. The total length of provincial roads transferred to district councils for maintenance fell further to 1,901 (1,930) miles. The unspent balance of Government grant for transferred works at the beginning of the year was Rs. 44,141 and grants aggregating Rs. 9,10,416 were paid during the year. A sum of Rs. 8,80,950 was expended and Rs. 16,091 refunded leaving a balance of Rs. 57,516. The whole question of the transfer of Government works to district councils is under the examination of a committee appointed by Government. Government regrets to note that village roads continue to be neglected, a small sum of Rs. 15,492 only having been spent on them by eight district councils.

**12. Markets.**—Forty-three new markets were notified as public and one was cancelled. The total number of public markets and of villages to which sections 26 to 34 of the Local Self-Government Act have been applied was 489 (448). The nominal rise of the income to Rs. 3.26 (3.24) lakhs would seem to be incommensurate with the number of new markets notified during the year. In Chhattisgarh, where the pinch of the economic depression has been felt least on account of the succession of good rice harvests, there was a fall in the income which is attributed mainly to a considerable fall in the income from the registration of cattle sales. The only district councils which paid some attention to the improvement of markets were those of Mandla, Narsinghpur, Bhandara and Balaghat. Government would urge once again that a much larger proportion of the income ought to be spent on local improvements of the market villages.

**13. Legislature, rules and byelaws.**—No legislation was undertaken during the year. The important rules made were those (i) requiring every candidate for election to deposit a sum of Rs. 50, (ii) enjoining the calling of tenders for transferred works, (iii) prohibiting the utilization by district councils of money out of provident funds and (iv) declaring that the employment of any district council officer or servant as an agent or canvasser

at an election shall be deemed to be a corrupt or illegal practice. Several lacunæ in the present law have come to notice and a number of amending bills have been introduced since the close of the year. Government has, therefore, recently appointed a committee to overhaul the whole structure of local self-government in the province.

14. **Taxation.**—The special school rate was imposed in 11 villages in the Jubbulpore district and in certain villages in the Independent Local Board, Melghat. The rates of terminal tax on some articles in the Raipur district and the rate of the tax on bidis in the Bhandara district were reduced. The proposals of the Chanda and Bilaspur district councils for the imposition of a terminal tax and of the Independent Mining Local Board, Chhindwara, to impose a coal cess are under the consideration of Government.

15. **Staff.**—The cuts in salaries imposed in previous years remained in force. They ranged from 5 to 33½ per cent and were keenly felt in Wardha, Chanda and Seoni where they were very heavy. The employees have now been given a right of appeal against dismissal and this may be expected to promote a greater sense of security of tenure. As observed last year, there is, however, a great scope for improvement in the quality of the staff and Government hopes that with greater security of tenure and the gradual increase in the products of our university a progressive effort will be made to raise the standard of the staff of the councils.

16. **Financial irregularities.**—The accounts of the district councils of Saugor, Damoh, Mandla, Narsinghpur and Yeotmal continued to be maintained in a satisfactory manner but those of Wardha, Chhindwara and Jubbulpore somewhat deteriorated. The accounts of the District Council, Drug, were in a very bad state and 152 objections were outstanding against it. Several cases of embezzlement, temporary misappropriation and financial irregularities of other description are again brought to light in the annual report of the Local Audit Department for the year 1933-34. Government's efforts for the removal of such irregularities have been treated with persistent indifference by certain councils in the past, and

it had therefore to withhold part of its grants temporarily from the more intransigent of them. This has resulted in considerable improvement in the disposal of audit objections. Government also sanctioned the prosecution of the old and new office-bearers and a clerk of the Local Board, Gondia, alleged to have been responsible for certain embezzlements. Government has not thus hesitated to use its disciplinary powers to rectify and prevent the recurrence of irregularities and defects disclosed in audit. The new Local Fund Audit Act came into force during the year and is to apply under certain circumstances to any item included in the accounts subsequent to the 8th October 1932.

17. Village Panchayats.—During the year 65 new panchayats were established and 2 were disestablished. Enhanced powers under sections 18 (2) and 32 (2) of the Act were conferred on 31 village benches and 22 village courts respectively. 6,162 criminal cases and 10,162 civil suits were disposed of. Rs. 8,000 were provided for initial grants to village panchayats, of which Rs. 3,120 were surrendered. The total receipts of the panchayats amounted to Rs. 1,95,585 and the total expenditure to Rs. 1,24,226. The number of panchayats imposing taxation is the highest in the Yeotmal district but the tendency to expand on the judicial rather than on the administrative side continues to be a common feature of the panchayats generally. The District Council, Yeotmal, has given a lead to other councils by appointing 5 inspectors and one superintendent to supervise the work of the panchayats and to train their members. Government considers that there is much scope for intensive action by district councils to encourage panchayats to undertake administrative duties and develop them into really effective agencies for rural self-government.

18. General.—The continuance of the economic depression obliged the councils to confine their activities mainly to the primary needs of administration. Government is pleased to note that the advice and guidance of the revenue officers are appreciated by the district councils and that the relations between its officers and the councils continued to be cordial. Government also records its thanks to those members whose good work has been specially commended in the divisional reviews.

ORDER.—Ordered that a copy of this Resolution be submitted to the Government of India, Department of Education, Health and Lands, that copies be forwarded to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for information and guidance and that it be translated and circulated (through Deputy Commissioners) for the information and guidance of all district councils and local board members.

RESOLUTION

1. **Constitution.**—There was no change in the constitution and jurisdiction of district councils and local boards, except that the areas comprised in one municipality and one notified area committee established in the Akola district were excluded from the district council area.

2. **Elections.**—General elections were held or completed in nine district councils of which those in Bilaspur and Buldana were keenly contested, the percentage of votes polled being 59 and 62, respectively. It is encouraging to note that two representatives of the aboriginal Gond community contested the elections to the Betul local board successfully. The Commissioner, Berar, gives an analysis of the result of the elections in the four districts in his division which shows that the predominant Maratha population is coming into its own in these bodies. This result is interesting when it is recalled that it was only ten years ago that a deputation of their leaders petitioned His Excellency the Governor for special representation for their backward community alleging that they did not stand much chance in open election.

3. **Disposal of business.**—All the district councils except two and all the local boards except twenty held the prescribed number of meetings. The total number of meetings held was 711 [725], of which 64 [58] proved abortive. The average percentage of attendance at district council and local board meetings rose slightly to 71

[69] and 55 [51], respectively. Habitual absenteeism still continues to be a feature in some district councils and local bodies, and it is regrettable that no use was made of section 17 (2) (a) of the Local Self-Government Act to remove the members concerned.

4. General Financial Results.—The year opened with a balance of Rs. 29.03 lakhs. The total receipts from all sources amounted to Rs. 71.99 lakhs and the total expenditure to Rs. 72.27 lakhs leaving a closing balance of Rs. 28.74 lakhs. The following table shows the net expenditure and receipts in lakhs of rupees in the various departments :—

It is pleasing to note that there was a slight improvement in the financial position of district councils except those in the Jubbulpore division the finances of which are still unsatisfactory. All councils in this division except Damoh had to draw upon their balances to meet the current liabilities of the year in spite of heavy cuts in the pay of the staff and postponement of essential works. With the exception of the district council of Hoshangabad the closing balances of all district councils were above the prescribed minimum. But in not a few cases these balances were more apparent than real as they left out of account liabilities remaining outstanding at the close of the year. Orders have now issued laying down that effective balances should be shown both in the annual account and budget estimates.

5. General Department.—The income under this head amounted to Rs. 36.84 [35.48] lakhs and the expenditure to Rs. 9.21 [9.06] lakhs. The increase in receipts was due to the collection of suspended cesses in the Nagpur division, to larger receipts from terminal tax,

market dues and registration of cattle sales in the Chhattisgarh division, and to the successful recovery of the current demand and outstanding arrears of cesses and special school rate in the Berar division.

6. **Cattle-pounds.**—The number of cattle-pounds increased from 1,848 to 1,892. The income, however, fell further from Rs. 5.76 lakhs to Rs. 5.27 lakhs and the expenditure from Rs. 3.06 lakhs to Rs. 2.94 lakhs. The fall in the income is attributed chiefly to the fact that, owing to the prevailing economic depression, fewer cattle were impounded as the owners took greater care to prevent straying, and people hesitated to impound cattle and burden their neighbours with heavy charges payable for their release. The *anni* system in vogue in the Raipur district according to which a watchman is employed by the malguzars to catch stray cattle which are released on payment of one anna per head which goes to meet the watchman's pay is also to a large extent responsible for the fall. In the Wardha district the cattle-pound buildings are in a hopelessly dilapidated condition. This facilitates the escape of impounded cattle and has caused much loss of income. Complaints of loss arising from the impounding of unclaimed and infirm cattle were received from several district councils. The recent amendment of section 14 of the Cattle Trespass Act authorizing the summary sale of such cattle a week after admission will largely remedy this.

7. **Education.**—The total expenditure including that on buildings was Rs. 29.72 [28.62] lakhs of which Rs. 10.19 [10.07] lakhs were provided by Government while fees, contributions other than those from provincial revenues and miscellaneous receipts covered Rs. 0.20 [0.20] lakh leaving Rs. 19.33 [18.35] lakhs to be met out of the surplus from the general purposes grants and other resources of the councils. The increase in expenditure is due mainly to the construction and repairing of school buildings and the restoration of cuts in teachers' salaries. The total number of schools increased to 4,116 [3,979], enrolment to 311,826 [298,399] and the average attendance to 235,468 [225,529]. Compulsory primary education made little progress during the year. Government regrets to note that failure to pay punctually the teachers' salaries and their constant transfers have become a great blot on the administration of certain district councils. The worst offender was the district council,

Wardha, which depleted its resources by reckless expenditure on opening many new schools till it had no money left to pay the salaries of its teachers and other employees. This culminated in a strike of the teachers. In response to an adjournment motion in the Legislative Council Government had to step in to put matters straight and enforce punctual payment of teachers.

8. Medical.—The total expenditure on medical relief rose to Rs. 3.03 [2.78] lakhs of which 1.05 lakhs was provided by Government grants. The increase is attributed chiefly to establishment and buildings. The number of cheap plan and transferred dispensaries was 84 [83]. It is disappointing to note that some local bodies persisted in cutting down their contributions to medical institutions. Medical relief should receive greater precedence in the budgets of local bodies even with their reduced resources. One new Ayurvedic dispensary was opened by the district council, Akola. The Raipur district council has started a scheme of giving medical relief in villages through school masters who are specially trained in the administration of Ayurvedic medicine. A scheme drawn up by the district council, Drug, to afford medical aid by settling vaidyas in villages has also been sanctioned by Government. The result of these schemes will be watched with interest.

9. Public Health.—The total expenditure on vaccination and sanitation rose to Rs. 1.50 [1.47] lakhs and Rs. 0.23 [0.17] lakh. The total number of vaccinations performed during the year was 712,640 [674,062] of which 563,641 [567,291] were primary and 148,999 [106,771] re-vaccinations. The district council, Nimar, continued its programme of intensive vaccination with the result that only 27 children below one year of age remained unvaccinated within its area. Compulsory vaccination was introduced in 13 villages of the Mandla district and in 170 villages of the Damoh district. It is gratifying to note that the district councils of Yeotmal, Wardha, Seoni, Betul, Nimar, Jabulpore, Narsinghpur and Amraoti are also taking action to introduce compulsory vaccination. Government hopes that the extension of compulsory vaccination will be in the forefront of the public health programme of the district councils. The expenditure on water-supply amounted to Rs. 25.633 [31,972]. Since the close of the year substantial grants have been given by Government towards this object out

of the Government of India's grant for rural development and it is an encouraging sign that several district councils have shown greater readiness to undertake rural water-supply schemes and to bear their share of the cost.

**10. Veterinary and Stock Breeding.**—Veterinary receipts decreased to Rs. 1,546 [1,730] while the expenditure increased by Rs. 2,391 to Rs. 1,09,087 [1,06,696]. The decrease in receipts was chiefly due to non-payment of contributions by the municipal committees. Disputes between district councils and municipalities regarding this matter were on the increase, and Government may have to consider whether the payment of municipal contributions towards these dispensaries should not be made compulsory by legislation. The rise in expenditure is attributed mainly to the larger purchases of medicines and instruments by the district councils in the Chhattisgarh division. The total number of dispensaries remained the same, *viz.*, 92. The year was on the whole a healthy one for cattle except in the Berar division and the Wardha district. The district councils of Damoh and Bilaspur maintained stud bulls for breeding purposes. Government is now able to supply a large number of bulls out of the allotment of Rs. 30,000 from the Government of India's grant for rural development and as a result of His Excellency the Viceroy's appeal for an intensive campaign for improving the live-stock of the province, and it trusts that district councils will effectively co-operate in expanding further activities in this direction.

**11. Civil Works.**—The expenditure on Civil Works fell to Rs. 6.65 [6.93] lakhs. The fall was noticeable chiefly in the Jubbulpore division where no original works were undertaken and the expenditure was confined to annual repairs to buildings and maintenance of roads. The total length of provincial roads transferred to district councils for maintenance decreased further to 1,877 [1,901] miles. The amount of Government grant for transferred works was Rs. 8,52,401 and of expenditure Rs. 8,07,223. The unspent balances of these grants are now adjusted by debit to the balances of the district councils concerned and are credited to Government in the accounts of the financial year to which the transaction relates. The committee appointed by Government to examine the question of the transfer of Government works to district councils did not complete its deliberations



during the year. A small sum of only Rs. 29,256 [15,492] was spent on the construction and repairs of village roads. These roads require much greater attention.

**12. Markets.**—Ten new markets were notified as public and one was cancelled. The total number of public markets and of villages to which sections 26 to 34 of the Local Self-Government Act have been applied was 920 [489]. The income from markets rose to Rs. 3.47 [3.26] lakhs, owing mainly to slightly improved economic conditions in the Chhattisgarh division where income from this source showed an increase in all districts. There was no improvement in the attitude of district councils towards the provision of public amenities in these markets.

**13. Legislation, rules and byelaws.**—Several new provisions were made in the law by amending legislation. The disqualification for membership of legal practitioners suspended from practising was removed and district councils were empowered to make byelaws to prohibit the levy of unauthorized dues in public markets. A rule was framed making election expenses a charge on the district funds.

**14. Taxation.**—The special school rate was imposed in 44 villages of the Yeotmal district. The imposition of a cess on coal by the independent mining local board, Chhindwara, was sanctioned after the close of the year. Terminal tax proposals of the Chanda, Hoshangabad and Chhindwara district councils were examined further. The district council, Bilaspur, did not proceed further with its proposals for terminal tax. Local bodies are more than ever reluctant to impose direct taxation but the need for increasing their resources is so keenly felt that sooner or later they will have to face this responsibility.

**15. Staff.**—The emergency cuts in salaries remained in force and only a few councils restored them partially. The Wardha district council continued the cut at the heavy rate of  $33\frac{1}{3}$  per cent. This council and several others left the pay of their employees in arrears for inordinately long periods. Government has since used its disciplinary powers to put a stop to serious default in this matter. The provisions of appeal were used fully by many employees and may be expected to exercise a sobering influence on the capriciousness of local bodies in their dealings with the staff.

16. **Financial irregularities.**—The most serious irregularity mentioned in the annual report of the Local Audit Department for the year 1934-35 was the grant of indiscriminate advances to members usually long before the actual expenditure, their refunds after a lapse of two or three years and grant of fresh advances to members who have previous advances still outstanding against them. Government has already impressed on these bodies that it takes a most serious view of such irregular handling of money and will not hesitate to take action under the criminal law in all cases in which the so-called “advances” hide misappropriation. Such irregularities in making advances out of district funds show an utter disregard of the provisions of the account rules and action under the Local Fund Audit Act will no doubt gradually prevent or minimize their recurrence. The next serious irregularity which was not uncommon was disregard of audit instructions to adopt a system of contract for the sale of bazars and ferries. This has resulted in accumulating arrears to the extent of about Rs. 80,000 to which the contribution of Akot local board alone is Rs. 31,400. Government trusts that office-bearers and members of local bodies will maintain a higher standard of conscientiousness in handling public funds and this seems to be the only effective cure of such evils. There was great delay on the part of many councils in the disposal of audit objections and the accounts of some of the councils were in a very bad state. Serious irregularities were also disclosed in the handling of the provident fund of employees. Accounts were not maintained up to date, the councils’ contributions were not credited in time and there was unauthorized diversion of such funds. By withholding grants and using its disciplinary powers Government has done its best to rectify these irregularities. In certain cases the work has been completed by appointing additional staff at the cost of the bodies concerned. Government would, however, like to sound a note of warning that such cost may be surcharged against those responsible for the irregularities.

17. **Village panchayats.**—During the year 56 new panchayats were established and 12 panchayats were dis-established. Enhanced powers under sections 18 (2) and 32 (2) of the Act were conferred on 69 village benches and 42 village courts. 5,920 criminal cases and 8,439 civil suits were disposed of. Rs. 8,000 were provided for initial grants to village panchayats of which Rs. 3,370

were surrendered. The total receipts of the panchayats amounted to Rs. 1,80,485 and the total expenditure to Rs. 1,17,853. Village panchayat sub-committees were formed in 13 districts. In nine districts there were honorary panchayat officers while paid panchayat superintendents were appointed in four. It is reassuring to note that this has led to the assumption of administrative duties by panchayats on a greater scale. 20 per cent of the panchayats levy taxation and 43 per cent of them are doing administrative work. This is a distinct improvement although much yet remains to be done in this direction. Government would like to emphasize once more that it is only by encouraging them to undertake administrative work that village panchayats can be made live agencies for rural self-government.

18. On account of the persistence of the economic depression the district councils had to pass through another year of stagnation and confine their activities only to the primary needs of administration. It is pleasing to note that their relations with the officers of Government were cordial. Government's thanks are due to those members whose good work has been specially brought to notice in the divisional reviews.

ORDER.—Ordered that a copy of this resolution be submitted to Government of India, Department of Education, Health and Lands, that copies be forwarded to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for information and guidance, and that it be translated and circulated (through Deputy Commissioners) for the information and guidance of all district council and local board members.

RESOLUTION

1. **Constitution.**—The constitution of district councils and local boards remained unchanged during the year. The number of *ex officio* members of the district council, Bilaspur, however, decreased by one, as its vice-chairman is not now a member of the council. Similar reasons led to a decrease of two each in the Bilaspur and Mungeli local boards and an increase of one in the Janjgir local board.

2. **Elections.**—Fresh general elections were held in 7 district councils and 2 independent local boards, of which those in Wardha, Chanda and Mandla were keenly contested. One seat in Garchiroli tahsil, 2 in Damoh and 7 in Drug were filled by nomination under section 10-A of the Local Self-Government Act for want of candidates. It is gratifying to note that one Gond was successful at the elections in Balaghat and three Korkus were elected in Melghat.

3. **Disposal of business.**—All the district councils except 4 and all the local boards except 16 held the prescribed number of meetings. The total number of meet-

ings held was 742 [711] of which 51 [64] proved abortive. The average percentage at district council and local board meetings fell to 66 [71] and 51 [55], respectively.

Habitual absenteeism still continues in several district councils and local boards. It is disappointing that no district council or local board took action under section 17 (2) (a) of the Local Self-Government Act for the removal of the members concerned.

4. **General financial results.**—The year opened with a balance of Rs. 28.56 [29.03] lakhs. The total receipts from all sources amounted to Rs. 75.2 [71.99] lakhs and the total expenditure to Rs. 72.10 [72.27] lakhs, leaving a closing balance of Rs. 31.48 [28.74] lakhs. The following table shows the net expenditure and receipts in lakhs of rupees in the various departments:—

The increase in receipts was due, not to any improvement in the economic situation of the councils, but mainly to the restoration of one-fourth of the 20 per cent cut in Government grants and to the receipt by several district councils of grants during the year for the improvement of water-supply. The financial position of the Jubulpore and Hoshangabad district councils continued to be unsatisfactory. To meet their current liabilities both had to draw upon their balances which were already below the prescribed minimum. The financial position



of the district councils, Wardha, Chanda and Chhindwara, deteriorated and their closing balances also fell below the prescribed minimum.

**5. General departments.**—The income under this head increased to Rs. 38.13 [36.84] lakhs and the expenditure slightly fell to Rs. 9.20 [9.21] lakhs. There was an increase in the receipts of all the district councils in the Central Provinces, mainly due to the partial restoration of the cut in the general purposes grant, the collection of suspended cesses in Nagpur, Hoshangabad, Narsinghpur and Nimar and the collection of arrears of the terminal tax for the export of *bidis* in Bhandara. The income of the district councils in Berar, however, fell mainly on account of a decrease under (i) "land revenue" (1 per cent abatement of land revenue) and (ii) "local rates". There was a marked increase in expenditure in Wardha, mainly due to the payment of arrears of the salaries of the district council staff.

**6. Cattle-pounds.**—The number of cattle-pounds decreased to 1,889 [1,892]. The income from and expenditure on them, however, increased to Rs. 5.53 [5.27] lakhs and to Rs. 3.02 [2.94] lakhs, respectively. The increase in receipts is attributed to the closing of un-economic pounds, better supervision by members, and larger number of cattle impounded. There was a marked fall in the income in Wardha (from Rs. 25,965 to Rs. 13,089). This is attributed to the unsuccessful experiment of auctioning the cattle-pounds and inefficient supervision. It is gratifying to note that in the Akola district local board secretaries and circle members inspected cattle-pounds frequently. The example of Akola is commended to local boards of other districts.

**7. Education.**—The total expenditure on education including that on buildings amounted to Rs. 30 [29.72] lakhs, of which Rs. 10.58 [10.19] lakhs was provided by Government. Fees, contributions other than those from provincial revenue and miscellaneous receipts brought in Rs. .18 [.20] lakh, while the remaining amount of Rs. 19.24 [19.33] lakhs was met out of the surplus from the general purposes grant and other sources of the councils. The increase in receipts was mainly due to the restoration of 5 per cent out of the 20 per cent cut in the vernacular education grant. The increase in expenditure is attributed to the grant of increments to the staff, the

supply of furniture and the payment of arrears of salaries of the teachers in Wardha. The total number of schools decreased from 4,116 to 4,102, enrolment from 311,826 to 305,818, and the average attendance from 235,468 to 230,527. Compulsory primary education made little headway during the year, the main reason being the paucity of funds. There is a general complaint about the frequent transfers of teachers. Government agrees in the remarks of the Commissioner of Nagpur division that "the practice of transferring teachers for political and party reasons is a dangerous one which may recoil on the party which indulges in it, while it cannot fail to have evil effects on the quality of the instruction imparted and the morale of the students". It is with a view to checking this harmful tendency that Government has prescribed a maximum percentage of transfers and has warned district councils that if it were exceeded the education grant might be reduced. The district council, Amraoti, has introduced a new scheme of cheap type school under which the schools are to be opened at villages having a population of 500 or more, on the condition that the villagers contribute Rs. 75 per year as pay of teachers and make the other arrangements required for the school. The results of this experiment will be watched with interest.

8. **Medical.**—The total expenditure on medical relief fell to Rs. 2.22 [3.03] lakhs of which Rs. .21 [1.05] lakh was provided by Government grants. The decrease in the amount of the Government grants is due to the payment of the salaries and travelling allowance of the assistant medical officers in charge of the travelling and cheap plan dispensaries direct from the treasuries instead of through the medium of the councils. The progress towards establishing more cheap plan dispensaries is retarded by the difficulty experienced in raising the necessary local contributions on account of the continued economic depression. The scheme introduced by the district council, Raipur, of extending medical relief to villagers through schoolmasters trained in the use of medicines is reported to have failed. The council is, however, contemplating the establishment of 5 qualified Ayurvedic practitioners in rural areas, on the lines followed by the district council, Drug. It remains to be seen whether these experiments will furnish a solution of the problem of providing cheap medical facilities in rural areas.

9. **Public Health.**—The total expenditure on vaccination and sanitation rose to Rs. 1.57 [1.50] lakhs and that on sanitation was the same as last year, *i.e.*, .23 lakh. The total number of vaccinations performed during the year was 720,556 [712,640], of which 561,883 [563,641] were primary and 158,673 [148,999] were revaccinations. It is an encouraging sign that several district councils are contemplating the introduction or extension of compulsory vaccination in rural areas. The expenditure on water-supply amounted to Rs. 28,173 [25,633]. At the close of the year substantial grants were given to district councils for improvement of water-supply out of the Government of India grant for rural development and the amount will be spent during the current year. It is disappointing to note that village sanitation is not receiving the attention it deserves. Every effort should be made to bring home to the mukaddams their responsibilities in the matter. District councils must also help by the supervision of village panchayats and by taking steps to ensure a pure water-supply. The administration of village tanks in Berar in particular leaves much to be desired. The matter is already engaging the attention of the Commissioner, and Government trusts that his efforts to put the administration of these tanks on a sound footing will effect a speedy improvement.

10. **Veterinary and stock breeding.**—Veterinary receipts and expenditure amounted to Rs. 2,969 [1,546] and Rs. 1,09,820 [1,09,087] respectively. Several municipal committees continue to make defaults in the payment of contributions for the upkeep of the veterinary dispensaries and the disputes between district councils and municipal committees regarding this matter show no signs of abatement. The question of making the payment of municipal contributions towards these dispensaries compulsory will be examined by Government. The total number of dispensaries remained the same, *viz.*, 92. The year was on the whole a healthy one for cattle except in the Betul district. The need for more veterinary dispensaries in rural areas is recognized; but substantial progress must await the return of better times. Money is not, however, likely to be plentiful even during the best of times and the suggestion of the Commissioner, Berar division, that a cheap type of veterinary dispensary should be evolved is sound and the Director of Veterinary Services will be asked to work out the details. All the

veterinary dispensaries in the Jubbulpore district have been supplied with cages for rabid dogs. The practice can be followed by other district councils with advantage. It is hoped that the district councils will participate actively in the campaign for the improvement of cattle-breeding initiated by His Excellency the Viceroy and will establish controlled units for breeding in each local board area in co-operation with the Agriculture Department.

**11. Civil works.**—The expenditure on civil works fell to Rs. 6.54 [6.66] lakhs. The total length of provincial roads transferred to district councils for maintenance further decreased to 1,832 [1,877] miles. The amount of Government grant for transferred works was Rs. 8,15,245 [8,52,401] and of expenditure Rs. 7,99,033 [8,07,223]. The transferred works are reported to have been badly maintained by the district council, Nagpur, and the Public Works Department has asked for the council's explanation. The school and cattle-pound buildings are reported to be in a bad state of repairs in Nagpur, Wardha and Jubbulpore. The improvement of village roads continues to be neglected, mainly on account of lack of funds. The independent mining local board, Chhindwara, has shown commendable enterprise in taking a loan of Rs. 2 lakhs from Government for the construction of a first class road from Eklara to Damoh. The committee appointed by Government to examine the question of the transfer of Government works to district councils has completed its deliberations and its report is under the consideration of Government.

**12. Markets.**—Three new markets were notified as public markets in Chanda. The total number of public markets and of villages to which sections 26 to 34 of the Local Self-Government Act have been applied was 935 [920]. The income from markets rose to Rs. 3.70 [3.47] lakhs. It is regrettable to find that the district councils are reluctant to spare adequate funds for the improvement of markets. Thus, in the Chhattisgarh division, although the income rose from Rs. 1,05,207 to Rs. 1,23,121, the expenditure fell from Rs. 12,606 to Rs. 5,793. Three panchayats under the district council, Damoh, managed local markets and utilized the income therefrom. This example might well be followed in other districts.

13. **Legislation, rules and byelaws.**—In pursuance of an assurance given in the Legislative Council, a committee was appointed by Government in May 1935 in order to examine the whole structure of Local Self-Government in the province and to make recommendations for its reconstruction where necessary. The committee completed its labours and submitted its report in December 1935, which was under the consideration of Government at the close of the year.

Three Bills were passed into law: (1) inserting section 63-A in the Local Self-Government Act, giving power to Government to direct the person having the custody of the district fund to make payment in case of default in certain circumstances; (2) inserting section 52-A, authorizing district councils to lease the levy of tolls and fees; and (3) amending sections 9, 11 (1) and 79 (1) (iv), providing for election and selection of members by single transferable vote. Rules regarding the procedure to be followed in inflicting punishment on district council servants were revised during the year, prescribing the detailed procedure to be followed. The district councils, Mandla and Drug, and the independent mining local board, Chhindwara, framed byelaws prescribing standard weights and measures which were sanctioned by Government. Those councils which have not yet adopted these byelaws should do so without further delay. Government agrees with the Commissioner, Jubbulpore division, that all the district councils should frame byelaws to regulate the pension fund of their employees.

14. **Taxation.**—No new tax was imposed by any council owing to the general trade depression and the unfavourable economic condition of the agriculturists, although there was a pressing necessity for more money in almost all the districts. The district councils, Bilaspur and Akola, levied special school rate in some additional villages and the district council, Chhindwara, imposed licence fees on brokers trading in the public markets at Ubhegaon. Several councils had under consideration proposals for the imposition of the terminal tax. This source of taxation is no longer within the direct purview of the local bodies, as under section 139 of the Government of India Act, 1935, "terminal taxes on goods or passengers carried by railway . . . . . shall be levied and collected by the Federation".

15. **Staff.**—Emergency cuts in the salaries of the employees continued in several districts. In the opinion of Government, the indefinite continuance of the cuts is not conducive to the contentment of the staff, and Government trusts that as circumstances permit district councils will endeavour to restore them wholly or partly. It is obvious that for the efficient management of a council's affairs the services of a paid secretary are essential. Those councils which have no secretary or have an honorary secretary would do well to appoint a paid secretary.

16. **Financial irregularities.**—The report on the working of the Local Audit Department for 1935-36 makes special mention of the irregularities in public works expenditure, such as commencement of work without provision in the budget and without preparation of estimates and non-acceptance of lowest tenders without assigning any reasons. The Examiner of Local Fund Accounts also draws attention to the great laxity that prevails in some councils in the matter of drawing advances. There was a large number of defalcations in connection with cattle-pound receipts which indicates the necessity of effective supervision over the administration of cattle-pounds. The report again emphasizes the need of expeditious and proper disposal of audit notes. The worst offenders were the district councils, Wardha and Hoshangabad, which did not even return to the Examiner previous audit notes. The indifference of local bodies in the matter of the removal of irregularities pointed out in audit notes has been the subject of adverse criticism in successive resolutions of Government. Government is determined to put an end to this state of affairs and will not hesitate to use the disciplinary powers under the Local Self-Government Act and the surcharge provisions under the Local Fund Audit Act for enforcing prompt and proper compliance with audit notes.

17. **Village panchayats.**—During the year 24 [56] new panchayats were established and 7 [12] panchayats were disestablished. 109 village benches and 91 village courts exercised enhanced powers and 10 village courts and benches exercised powers under section 54 of the Village Panchayat Act. 6,820 [5,920] criminal cases and

8,156 [8,439] civil suits were disposed of. Out of the amount of Rs. 6,000 provided for initial grants to panchayats, a sum of Rs. 3,090 only was utilized and Rs. 2,910 was surrendered. The total receipts of the panchayats amounted to Rs. 2,06,190 [1,80,486] and the total expenditure to Rs. 1,37,076 [1,17,853]. 18 [13] district councils have now their village panchayat sub-committees and in 9 [7] districts honorary panchayat officers have been appointed. Proposals to appoint honorary panchayat officers are maturing in Yeotmal, Amraoti, Jubulpore, Drug and Hoshangabad districts. The extension of this system should lead to an appreciable improvement in the working of the panchayats. Fifteen district councils have made arrangements for the periodical audit of the panchayat fund accounts and for imparting instructions on administrative matters. Nearly 21 [20] per cent of the panchayats levy taxes whilst the percentage of panchayats doing administrative work of one kind or another rose to 61 [43]. The display by panchayats of increased interest in administrative work is gratifying and shows that for providing the ordinary amenities of village life taxation is not always a condition precedent. The system of rendering voluntary labour and free grant of materials is gradually spreading and is reported to be current in the districts of Amraoti, Wardha, Betul, Chhindwara and Nagpur.

18. **General remarks.**—The relations of the local boards with their district councils were cordial except in the case of some boards in the Hoshangabad, Saugor, Balaghat, Amraoti and Buldana districts. The common object of both is public service and Government appeals to the persons in charge of these institutions to sink their personal differences and to work for the amelioration of the condition of the people living in the countryside. The adoption by the district councils of the model bye-laws governing their relationship with the local boards should also tend to minimize the friction. The relations between the local boards and the district councils and the officers of Government generally continued to be amicable. Government acknowledges with thanks the good work done by the office-bearers and members whose names have been specially mentioned in the divisional reviews.

ORDER.—Ordered that a copy of this resolution be submitted to Government of India, Department of Education, Health and Lands, that copies be forwarded to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for information and guidance, and that it be translated and circulated (through Deputy Commissioners) for the information and guidance of all district council and local board members.

Ordered also that the resolution be published in the *Central Provinces and Berar Gazette*, Part I.

## Statement showing the constitution of District Councils

### RESOLUTION

Constitution.—The area under the Amraoti district council was reduced by the formation of four municipalities and four notified area committees. The Khariar zamindari having been transferred to the new province of Orissa with effect from the 1st April 1937, the area of the zamindari local board in the Raipur district was reduced by one circle and the number of elected members was correspondingly reduced by one. There was a decrease of one *ex officio* member on the Sakoli local board owing to an elected member becoming Chairman.

2. Elections.—General elections were held in seven district councils and in the independent mining local board, Chhindwara. The elections in the Jubbulpore district and the four Berar district councils were postponed under the orders of Government on account of the elections to the Provincial Legislative Assembly, the widening of the franchise and the reconstitution of circles. Two members from the Harijan class and one from the backward classes were nominated on the local boards in the Nagpur district and two women were nominated on the local boards in the Nagpur district and one on the Bhandara district council. It is gratifying to note that a Gond was elected Chairman of the Dindori local board and that a Bhoi was elected from the Pindrai circle of the Mandla local board in a re-election. There are seven Gond members on the local boards in the Mandla district. The elections were generally well contested except in the Chhindwara, Hoshangabad and old Saugor districts. In the absence of candidates, one of the circles of the Chhindwara independent mining local board remained

unrepresented and two seats in Raipur and seven seats in Drug had to be filled by appointment, under section 10-A of the Local Self-Government Act. Owing to election petitions and the delay in making nominations, it took about a year and eleven months to complete the constitution of the Nimar and Bhandara district councils, respectively.

3. Disposal of business.—All the district councils except one and all the local boards except 25 held the prescribed number of meetings. The total number of meetings held was 767 [742], of which 66 [51] proved abortive. The average percentage of attendance at district council meetings fell to 65 [66] and that of the local board meetings rose to 54 [51]. Habitual absenteeism continued and it is discouraging to find that in no case was action taken under section 17 (2) (a) of the Local Self-Government Act. All the divisional reports mention the need of a provision for the automatic disqualification of members who fail to attend the minimum number of meetings. This will be considered along with other suggestions for the amendment of the Local Self-Government Act.

4. General financial results.—The year opened with a balance of Rs. 31.38 [Rs. 28.56] lakhs. The total receipts from all sources amounted to Rs. 73.73 [Rs. 75.2] lakhs and the total expenditure to Rs. 72.42 [Rs. 72.10] lakhs, leaving a closing balance of Rs. 32.69 [Rs. 31.48] lakhs. The following table shows the net receipts and expenditure in lakhs of rupees in various departments:—

There was a fall in the income in most of the Central Provinces districts. There was an appreciable increase in the income in the Berar districts which was due to the help given by revenue officers in the collection of arrears

of taxes. The expenditure exceeded the income in Raipur and all the Berar districts except Amraoti. The district councils concerned should take stock of their finances and keep the expenditure within the actual income. The financial position of the district councils, Bhandara, Chanda, Hoshangabad and Wardha, was not sound, their effective closing balance being below the prescribed minimum. For want of funds the district council, Wardha, could not pay its staff regularly, with the result that Government had to arrange for the payment of the salaries of the schoolmasters through the Deputy Commissioner by placing at his disposal the whole of the education grant amounting to Rs. 45,490. The Amraoti district council is reported to have accumulated a closing balance of Rs. 7.70 lakhs. It would be well-advised to utilize the greater portion of this large balance on schemes of permanent value to the agriculturists, such as improvement of water-supply, medical aid and communications in rural areas.

5. **General departments.**—The income and expenditure under this head increased to Rs. 38.54 [Rs. 38.13] and Rs. 9.34 [Rs. 9.20] lakhs, respectively. The receipts include a sum of Rs. 17,683, being the proceeds of the new coal cess levied by the independent mining local board, Chhindwara. There was an appreciable increase in Berar due to an increase in revenue from cesses. The increase in expenditure was largely due to the grant of annual increments to the staff.

6. **Cattle-pounds.**—The number of cattle-pounds decreased to 1,878 [1,889]. The income fell to Rs. 5.18 [Rs. 5.53] lakhs and the expenditure to Rs. 2.96 [Rs. 3.02] lakhs. The fall in the number of pounds is due to the closing of unprofitable pounds and the transfer of pounds in the Khariar zamindari to the new province of Orissa. The decrease in receipts is due to the smaller number of pounds, the fall in the sale-proceeds of unclaimed cattle and inefficient inspection and supervision. Supervision would probably improve if the district councils drew up in the beginning of the year a roster of inspections by their office-bearers, circle members and staff, and insisted on inspections being made accordingly.

7. **Education.**—The total expenditure on education, including that on buildings, amounted to Rs. 30.61 [Rs. 30] lakhs of which Rs. 10.64 [Rs. 10.58] lakhs were provided by Government. Fees, contributions other

than those from provincial revenues and miscellaneous receipts brought in Rs. .19 [Rs. .18] lakh, while the remaining amount of Rs. 19.78 [Rs. 19.24] lakhs was met from the surplus of the general purposes grant and other sources. There was no progress in compulsory education, mainly owing to the paucity of funds. The total number of schools increased from 4,102 to 4,196 but the enrolment decreased from 305,818 to 305,023, while the average attendance increased from 230,527 to 236,253. The largest increase in the number of schools was in Berar, Akola accounting for as many as 56. Thirteen schools were closed in the Wardha district and seventeen schools in the Khariar zamindari of the Raipur district were transferred to the new province of Orissa. The agricultural anglo-vernacular school at Betul was transferred to Government during the year. It is disappointing to note that in spite of an increase in the number of schools, the enrolment decreased. There is great scope for the extension of educational facilities in the backward tracts of the Chhindwara, Seoni and Jubbulpore districts. The Betul district council has embarked on an ambitious scheme of education among the aboriginals the results of which will be watched with interest. It is unsatisfactory to find that adequate attention was not paid to the proper housing of schools. In Nagpur 47 schools out of 162 were not provided with suitable buildings. There was no improvement in the condition of the buildings under the control of the Wardha and Chanda district councils. Transfers of teachers are still frequent and above the maximum percentage fixed by Government. The number of untrained teachers is also large in several districts although attempts are being made to reduce it as far as possible. The schools imparting vocational education continued to work satisfactorily during the year.

8. Medical.—The number of dispensaries rose to 86 [82] during the year, while the expenditure on medical relief fell to Rs. 2.13 [Rs. 2.22] lakhs. As the Commissioner, Nagpur division, observes, "In general, the district councils have paid insufficient attention to the extension of medical relief in the rural areas". Two cheap plan dispensaries were established in the Akola district. The response to the appeal for raising local contributions for opening more dispensaries of this type has been disappointing and the utilization of the Government of India's grant of Rs. 1 lakh had to be postponed.

The question of relaxing the present conditions for making the grant is under the consideration of Government. The example of the independent mining local board which has obtained a loan from Government for the construction of a hospital within its area is commended to other local bodies. There is a widespread demand for the establishment of more Ayurvedic dispensaries in the province. In order to enable Government to determine the place of the indigenous systems of medicine in a scheme of medical relief for the province, Government has appointed a committee and is awaiting its report before taking any action.

9. **Public health.**—The total expenditure on vaccination and sanitation fell slightly to Rs. 1.56 [Rs. 1.57] lakhs and Rs. .20 [Rs. .22] lakh, respectively. The total number of vaccinations performed during the year was 584,444 [720,556], of which 491,387 [561,883] were primary and 93,057 [158,673] were revaccinations. Government views with concern the fall in the number of vaccinations performed in the year. The Nagpur district council has resolved to introduce compulsory vaccination in its jurisdiction and the Jubbulpore district council has sent up proposals for compulsory vaccination in 33 villages. Government hopes that compulsory vaccination will be pushed on with vigour in rural areas. The Commissioner, Jubbulpore division, rightly points out that the usual excuse of shortness of funds has little weight, for the actual extra cost of compulsion is small. The expenditure on water-supply amounted to Rs. 77,258 [Rs. 28,173]. The increase is due to the grant from the Government of India. The district councils have realized the necessity of providing pure water in the villages and have readily co-operated in preparing schemes to be financed out of the Government of India's grant. The construction of wells and the expenditure of the grant have not however proceeded fast enough and the Damoh and Nagpur district councils spent only Rs. 2,370 and Rs. 758, respectively, out of the amounts of Rs. 10,112 and Rs. 4,422 allotted to them for the improvement of water-supply. Considerable sums are being earmarked out of the provincial revenues and the Government of India's grant for the improvement of water-supply and Government trusts that all possible attempts will be made to utilize them properly, so as to provide pure water in rural areas. Government regrets to note that village sanitation is not receiving adequate attention even from the village panchayats.



10. **Veterinary and stock breeding.**—Veterinary receipts and expenditure amounted to Rs. 2,898 [Rs. 2,969] and Rs. 1,11,286 [Rs. 1,09,820], respectively. Several municipal committees have not realized their duties in respect of the maintenance of veterinary dispensaries situated in municipal areas and the necessity of making their contributions compulsory under the law has been noted by Government. The number of veterinary dispensaries rose to 94 [92]. Two travelling dispensaries were opened in the Narsinghpur sub-division the working of which will be watched with interest. It is disappointing to note that the response made by the district councils to the campaign initiated by His Excellency the Viceroy for the improvement of cattle-breeding has been unsatisfactory.

11. **Civil works.**—Expenditure on civil works increased to Rs. 7.38 [Rs. 6.54] lakhs. The total length of provincial roads transferred to district councils for maintenance further decreased to 1,798 [1,832] miles. The Government grant for transferred works was Rs. 7,17,701 [Rs. 8,15,245] while the expenditure amounted to Rs. 6,96,234 [Rs. 7,99,033]. The Chhindwara district council has acquired land for the Sausar-Mohogaon road and it is contemplating the construction of the Sausar-Berdi road. The Seoni district council wants the Lakhnadon-Narsinghpur road and the Seoni-Nainpur road transferred to it. The Narsinghpur district council has reiterated its demand for the transfer of all the public works department roads and buildings to justify the maintenance of its highly paid engineering staff. The report of the committee appointed to examine the question of the re-transfer of Government works to the public works department is still under the consideration of Government. Except in Berar where it is reported that the standard of maintenance has been generally high buildings and roads maintained by district councils are in an unsatisfactory condition. There is no improvement in the condition of the buildings maintained by the Wardha district council and the buildings and roads under the Jubbulpore district council are said to have deteriorated. District councils generally continue to be apathetic to the improvement of village roads. They would do well to devote more funds to rural communications, the improvement in which will be reflected in the increased prosperity of the countryside.

12. **Markets.**—The total number of public markets and of villages to which sections 26 to 34 of the Local

Self-Government Act have been applied was 931 [935]. The income from markets was Rs. 3.40 [Rs. 3.70] lakhs. There was a fall in all the districts except two which is attributed to the lack of competition among contractors and the transfer of some markets to the province of Orissa. In Raipur the district council decided to work all the markets departmentally on account of complaints of harassment by the contractors. There is a general complaint that the district councils do not spend sufficiently on markets. They derive considerable income from this source and it is but fair that a part of this income should be applied to the provision of reasonable amenities in the markets. The Damoh district council handed over three markets and the income from them to village panchayats for management. The Mandla district council paid a portion of the income to the panchayats of the villages where markets are held.

13. Legislation, byelaws and rules.—The report of the Local Self-Government Committee, 1935, was considered by Government during the year and two Bills to amend the Local Self-Government Act based largely on the recommendations of the Committee were introduced in the Legislative Council in August 1936. The bills were referred to a select committee and the reports of the select committee were presented to the Council in November 1936. By that time, however, opinion in the Council appeared to have undergone a change and the prospects of the bills passing the final stage seemed to be doubtful. No further motion in respect of the bills was therefore made and the bills lapsed.

Five minor bills were, however, passed into law—

- (i) inserting section 24-A in the Local Self-Government Act giving power to the district council to inspect weights and measures and to seize false weights, etc.;
- (ii) amending section 7 of the Local Self-Government Act so as to render persons residing within municipal limits ineligible for election, selection or nomination as office-bearers or members of district councils and local boards unless they possess the qualification of a voter under section 6;
- (iii) providing for the ratification of contributions made in contravention of section 55 of the Act;

- (iv) inserting section 65-A for the enforcement of Government orders; and
- (v) giving all powers and duties of the district council to such person or persons as the Local Government may appoint in that behalf during the time of its dissolution and supersession.

The suggestion of the district council, Jubbulpore, that certain employees of district councils and local boards should be declared to be public servants within the meaning of section 21 of the Indian Penal Code is under the consideration of Government.

Rules were made regarding the management of veterinary dispensaries, disposal of defects and irregularities pointed out in audit reports, transfer of roads, buildings and other Government works to district councils and prescribing a report of delay in cases of suspension of its officers and servants by district councils.

The Nagpur district council made byelaws for licensing brokers and commission agents. The Damoh district council made byelaws for standard weights and measures. There are still several district councils which have not undertaken this very necessary reform.

**14. Taxation.**—The new coal cess sanctioned from the 1st January 1936 brought an income of Rs. 17,683 to the Chhindwara independent mining local board. The wheel tax which the Jubbulpore district council levied is reported to be extremely unpopular. The assessment is made by school teachers who in practice assess all carts without exception and there is no effective supervision of the assessment and collection or satisfactory provision for appeals against assessment. The promise of the district council to spend the proceeds on the improvement of village roads has not also been fulfilled. The Bhandara district council imposed taxes on manganese ore and grain, milled or husked. No new taxes were imposed by the other district councils. The Commissioner, Berar division, points out that there is considerable disparity in the cesses levied by the various district councils in that division under sections 48 and 49 of the Local Self-Government Act. The Amraoti district council whose financial position is the soundest levies a cess at the rate of 27 pies against 21 in Buldana and 18 in Akola and Yeotmal. Only three district councils in the Central Provinces (Nagpur, Raipur and Nimar) have levied an additional

cess under section 49 of the Act. Other district councils would do well to follow their example in order to augment their resources.

15. Staff.—The Nagpur district council restored the cut in the salaries of its employees and granted with retrospective effect the increments that it had withheld. It also appointed a paid secretary and a district engineer. The Damoh and Yeotmal district councils also restored the cuts to their employees while the Buldana district council restored the cut in the case of its teachers only. In several district councils, however, the cuts continued. Loyal and efficient service can hardly be expected from employees who are not fairly treated in the matter of their pay and the remaining district councils would be well-advised to remove this standing grievance of the staff.

16. Financial irregularities.—The report on the working of the Local Audit Department during the year shows that irregularities in respect of public works such as commencement of work without budget provision or estimates and non-acceptance of lowest tenders without adequate reasons continued in several district councils. During the year three embezzlements were detected in Bilaspur, two council employees and a sarpanch of a school committee being involved. There were several serious irregularities, such as temporary misappropriation, failure to adjust advances in time, excess payments, illegal refunds and delays in recording final measurements of works. Government considers that no radical improvement in the state of accounts can be effected unless means are devised to ensure that untrained and unqualified accountants are not retained in service. Delays in returning audit notes were frequent, showing that local bodies are not yet fully alive to their responsibilities in this matter. It is hoped that the amendment to the Local Fund Audit Act which provides that after the expiry of four months the Examiner can report a body for surcharge though its explanation is not received will effect an improvement in this respect. Some district councils do not realize the importance of providing the minimum balance as prescribed by the rules. Government has decided to take action under section 63 of the Act to enforce the maintenance of the minimum balance against the worst defaulters. The accounts of the district council, Wardha, disclose many irregularities and no less than 139 old objections are outstanding. The loan of Rs. 7,000 taken by

the council in 1933 from the provident fund of its employees still remains unpaid. If warnings and withholding of grants do not have the desired effect Government will be reluctantly compelled to take action to dissolve the recalcitrant councils.

17. Village panchayats.—During the year 20 [24] new panchayats were established, one [7] was disestablished and two were transferred to the province of Orissa. One hundred and sixteen [109] village benches and 99 [91] village courts exercised enhanced powers and 13 village courts exercised powers under section 54 (1) of the Village Panchayat Act. 6,987 [6,820] criminal cases and 8,764 [8,156] civil suits were disposed of. Out of the amount of Rs. 3,500 provided for initial grants to panchayats a sum of Rs. 3,125 was utilized and Rs. 375 surrendered. The total receipts of the panchayats amounted to Rs. 2,01,251 [Rs. 2,06,190] and the total expenditure to Rs. 1,32,093 [Rs. 1,37,075]. Nineteen [18] district councils have now their village panchayat sub-committees and in 11 [9] district honorary panchayat officers have been appointed. It is an encouraging sign that the district councils are realizing their duty of training panchayats in the administrative work and their statutory responsibility of exercising general supervision over the panchayat fund and have given a proof of this by appointing local agencies for imparting instructions for carrying out periodical audit.

• Nearly 28 [21] per cent of the panchayats levy taxes while 63 [61] per cent of panchayats undertook some kind of administrative work. The majority of the panchayats are not unmindful of the fact that without supplementing their judicial income by taxation they cannot lead a useful and effective existence, but they are unable to make much headway in the matter of taxation on account of the continued economic depression. Government trusts that all panchayats without exception will at least maintain their areas in a sanitary condition and a long stride will have been taken in the improvement of the village conditions.

18. General remarks.—The relations of the local boards and district councils were cordial except in the case of some boards in Hoshangabad, Saugor, Amraoti and Buldana. Government regrets to note that there is little improvement in the relations between the local bodies in the districts mentioned above in spite of the

appeal to them in the last year's resolution. The relations between Government officers and the local boards and district councils continued to be on the whole harmonious. Government desires to put on record its appreciation of the good work done by the office-bearers and members whose names have been specially mentioned in the divisional reports.

This is the last pre-autonomy report relating to local self-government in rural areas and it is now abundantly clear that there is considerable scope for improvement both as regards its structure and working. How best to bring about the improvement so as to make local self-government an effective force in the national economy is a problem which will claim the earnest attention of the Provincial Government.
