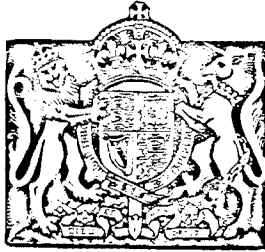

RESOLUTION

Constitution.—The number of municipalities increased from 79 to 82 owing to conversion of notified area committees into municipal committees. No general elections were held during the year under report, but by the end of July 1939 a new committee was constituted at Jalgaon where the previous committee had been dissolved in February 1938. A feature which severely reflects upon the inefficiency of municipal administration in the province was the dissolution of a number of municipal committees, *viz.*, Jubbulpore, Raipur, Kamptee, Umrer, Arvi, Chanda, Shegaon and Ellichpur City. The chronic party feuds in the Nagpur municipal committee resulted ultimately in the resignation of the office-bearers in March 1940. Under section 18-A (6) of the Municipalities Act, Government appointed Mr. D. R. Rutnam, I.C.S., to perform the duties of the president of the committee. Later the committee had to be dissolved and Mr. Rutnam was appointed to exercise all the functions and powers of the committee. Thus, at the moment municipal committees in all the four premier towns in the province, *viz.*, Nagpur, Jubbulpore, Amraoti Town and Raipur, stand dissolved. During the year under review the Amendment Act abolishing the system of nominations came into force, necessitating revision of the constitution of all committees and re-division of towns into wards. Proposals for fresh wards were called for in October 1939 and have now been finally notified for several towns. Every effort is made to see that in the remaining towns these proposals are not delayed thus postponing elections—most of which are overdue—particularly where municipal committees have been dissolved and fresh elections have been ordered.

2. **Disposal of business.**—The average attendance fell to 54 [59]. Sixteen [22] municipal committees failed to hold the prescribed number of meetings. The total number of meetings convened decreased to 2,122 [2,239] of which 374 [404] proved abortive and 506 [633] were adjourned. Although the position

has slightly improved as compared with the preceding year, it is regrettable that in over 40 per cent of the total number of meetings called no business was transacted. In Warora out of 39 meetings called business was transacted only at 5, and in Hinganghat and Arvi out of 80 and 55 meetings called, all except 2 and 11, respectively, either proved abortive for want of a quorum or were adjourned. None of the municipal committees except Khapa reported cases of habitual absentees for action under section 22 (2) (a), and the Commissioner, Nagpur Division, while reiterating his previous suggestion to provide for automatic disqualification of habitual absentees, remarks that "to expect elected members to disqualify their fellows is to expect too much from human nature".

3. Legislation, rules and byelaws.—The year saw the enactment and enforcement of the following legislation effecting important changes in the system of urban local self-government:—

(1) Election of the president by adult franchise and the procedure for his removal and for the appointment and removal of vice-presidents [C. P. Municipalities Second Amendment Act, 1939 (Act XII of 1939)].

(2) Introduction of adult franchise [C. P. Municipalities Third Amendment Act, 1939 (Act XXVIII of 1939)].

(3) Abolition of the system of nominations [C. P. Municipalities Fourth Amendment Act, 1939 (Act XXXI of 1939)].

The following other Acts were passed and brought into force:—

(1) Central Provinces and Berar Grants-in-aid to Local Bodies Act, 1939 (Act XXXV of 1939), to provide for the payment to local bodies of grants-in-aid equal to the amount realized by them in the shape of fines, etc., under certain Acts, like the Cattle Trespass Act, which have now to be credited to the provincial revenues.

(2) Revision of section 14 (1) of the Municipalities Act so as to make it compulsory for a candidate to reside within the limits of the municipality in order to make him eligible to stand for election [Central Provinces Municipalities (Amendment) Act, 1939 (Act XI of 1939)].

The late Ministry contemplated other radical changes in the system of local self-government and had appointed a committee under the chairmanship of Mr. D. P. Mishra, the then Minister in charge of the Local Self-Government Department, to examine the whole question and make suitable recommendations. Before, however, much progress could be made, the constitution was suspended, necessitating the suspension of the work of the committee also. As usual, many municipal committees framed byelaws on various subjects and amended the existing ones.

4. General financial results.—The total income of the committees, excluding opening balance and debt heads, rose to Rs. 76.67 [Rs. 71.28] lakhs. The increase occurred under all heads except "Realization under Special Acts". The ratio of direct to indirect taxation was 45:55 [44:56]. The average incidence of direct taxation per head of population was Re. 1-10-8

[Re. 1-7-10]. The total expenditure, excluding the extraordinary and debt heads, decreased to Rs. 76.53 [Rs. 76.74] lakhs. The closing balance decreased to Rs. 10.73 [Rs. 13.20] lakhs.

The financial administration of municipal committees showed no signs of improvement in spite of repeated suggestions, advice and admonitions from Government and its officers, and the control exercised by the Examiner of Local Fund Accounts. Poor finances prevented several municipal committees from paying their staff regularly and in Berar only 6 out of 31 municipal committees were able to discharge this liability regularly throughout the year. The incidence of taxation has undoubtedly increased during the year, but unless sustained effort is made to collect taxes in full no improvement in the financial condition can possibly be expected.

5. **Octroi and terminal tax**—The number of municipal committees levying octroi was the same as in the preceding year, *i.e.*, 16. The total income amounted to Rs. 9.29 [Rs. 8.88] lakhs, having risen in 11 and fallen in five committees. The number of municipal committees levying terminal tax was 33 [32]. The income was Rs. 16.07 [Rs. 14.89] lakhs. The total increase of Rs. 1.59 lakhs in the income from these taxes is generally due to better crops and a larger number of cotton cart arrivals as also to the closer supervision exercised in certain municipalities like Umrer, Khurai, Mandla and Nagpur. In Khandwa, Burhanpur, Damoh and Gadawara there was a noticeable fall in income attributed to failure of crops, diversion of traffic and general economic depression.

6. **House and haisiyat taxes**.—The number of committees levying these taxes was 62 [58]. The total income increased to Rs. 3.70 [Rs. 3.20] lakhs. Collections were creditable in Bhatapara (98 per cent) and Saoner (96 per cent). At the other extremity was Kalmeshwar which recovered only 39 per cent of the demand. Imposition of a haisiyat tax has been sanctioned in Gadawara.

7. **Collection of taxes**.—True to its traditions the municipal committee, Seoni-Malwa, recovered the full demand. Other municipal committees deserving notice are Bhatapara (98 per cent), Saoner (96 per cent), Pachmarhi (91 per cent) and Gondia (91 per cent). In Umrer, the officer-in-charge succeeded in bringing the collections up to the prescribed standard; in Raipur and Dhamtari where also there are officers-in-charge the percentage increased from 79 and 74 to 89 and 92, respectively. Collections were extremely poor in Deori (32.9 per cent), Khurai (16.4 per cent), Kamptee (34 per cent), Kalmeshwar (39 per cent) and Mowar (49 per cent). In Berar, in spite of improved agricultural conditions, as many as eight municipal committees collected only 40 per cent of the total amount due. The results achieved by officers-in-charge show unmistakably that the plea of economic distress, usually advanced by municipal committees which are unable to collect their taxes, is untenable. What is required is staff with a keen sense of duty, absence of interference by the office-bearers and members and willingness to resort to coercive action against defaulters promptly and fearlessly. Government would once again ask all committees to leave no stone

unturned in their endeavours to realize the taxes imposed without which it is clearly impossible for them to provide even the most elementary civic amenities.

8. Lighting.—The expenditure on lighting was Rs. 5.85 [Rs. 5.54] lakhs. Electric lighting was available in 23 [22] towns. Construction of works at Itarsi is nearing completion and the licensees for Shegaon are negotiating for the purchase of a power plant. The grant of licences for Bhandara, Murtizapur and Kamptee is pending the receipt of deposit money. Application for licences for Pusad and Wun have been received and are under the consideration of Government. Proposals for the electrification of Drug, Damoh, Dhamtari, Pulgaon, Ellichpur and Betul are being investigated by prospective licensees. No committee has so far imposed a lighting tax although provision for it exists in the Municipalities Act.

9. Water-supply.—The income from water-rates increased to Rs. 9.69 [Rs. 8.51] lakhs, while the expenditure on water-supply decreased to Rs. 9.12 [Rs. 11.94] lakhs. During the year the third instalment of Rs. 5 lakhs was sanctioned by Government for the construction of the Kanhan Water Works on which so far in all Rs. 12,23,701 have been spent. In Arvi the officer-in-charge is investigating the possibilities of improving the local water works. There was a serious dispute between the Hinganghat Electric Supply Company and the municipal committee and at one time it was apprehended that the town might be deprived of electric supply which is used for both lighting and water pumping. Government had to intervene and to appoint, with the consent of both parties, an arbitration board to end the deadlock. No new water works were established during the year, but a scheme for Bhatapara is being preliminarily surveyed by the Public Works Department. The water-supply at both Raipur and Bhandara continues to be unsatisfactory.

10. Drainage.—The total expenditure on drainage rose to Rs. 2.45 [Rs. 2.34] lakhs. No Government grant or loan was given to any municipal committee for improvement of drainage. The municipal committee, Jubbulpore, has been advised to work out a scheme for the gradual canalization of the Omti nallah. Drainage schemes are being considered for Bilaspur, Drug and Gondia. In Akola Rs. 0.26 lakh were spent on the Rifle Range Scheme and Rs. 0.22 lakh were spent in Buldana on construction of drains. In Nagpur sewage disposal presents a difficult and urgent problem. A comprehensive sewage disposal scheme has been prepared by the Nagpur Improvement Trust and is now awaiting examination by an expert.

11. Conservancy.—The income and expenditure under this head were Rs. 9.28 [Rs. 8.08] lakhs and Rs. 12.15 [Rs. 11.67] lakhs, respectively. The actual income from the latrine tax was Rs. 8.80 [Rs. 7.73] lakhs. No marked progress was registered during the year in making the conservancy service self-supporting. In Chanda an attempt was made to revise the rates, but the proposal was incomplete and the officer-in-charge is now paying his attention to this matter. In the Jubbulpore division the service is self-supporting only in ten towns, and in Berar it is so in only six. Chhattisgarh has a good record inasmuch

as the service is self-supporting in all except one municipal committee and even for this one town proposals to revise the conservancy rates have been received by Government. Government attaches great importance to the principle that specific services, such as conservancy and water-supply, must be self-supporting and would ask Commissioners to take up each case one by one and to see that the committees concerned submit necessary proposals on pain of disciplinary action.

12. Hospitals and dispensaries.—The number of dispensaries under the control of municipal committees was 52 as in the previous year. The number of indoor and outdoor patients was 20,843 [25,464] and 2,634,541, [2,468,161] respectively. The total expenditure on all municipal hospitals and dispensaries increased to Rs. 2.30 [Rs. 2.12] lakhs. There are ayurvedic and unani dispensaries in various towns like Jubbulpore, Mandla, Damoh and Saugor and they are reported to be doing useful work. Their advantage lies both in their familiarity and in the small cost to the patients. The new women's dispensary at Gondia has started functioning. There were no serious epidemics of cholera in municipal towns, but smallpox broke out in some towns like Chhindwara, Seoni, Raipur and Kamptee and suitable action was taken everywhere to check it. Plague broke out in Balaghat but inoculation and partial evacuation suppressed it effectively. It is depressing to note that despite the growing popularity of the allopathic system and the increasing use made of dispensaries by the public, the municipal committees are generally reluctant to provide adequate funds for medical aid in their areas. Grants, exiguous in themselves, are being curtailed and even then paid irregularly. Urgent improvements have to be postponed. Government is, therefore, examining the question with a view to ensuring that unless a municipal committee discharges its duty in this matter adequately, it should not receive the Government grant in respect of medical institutions in its charge.

Facts and figures regarding the use made by municipal committees of their sanitary byelaws and of the Prevention of Adulteration Act have not been reported, but there is evidence to show that municipal committees are generally not fully alive to their responsibilities in this respect and provisions of the above Act are not rigorously enforced, a fact which Government cannot but view with concern.

13. Roads.—The income from tax on animals and vehicles and from tolls on roads and ferries amounted to Rs. 2.58 [Rs. 2.20] lakhs, while the expenditure on roads was Rs. 3.00 [Rs. 2.83] lakhs. The slight increase in the expenditure on roads is welcome but with a few exceptions municipal committees did not either construct any new roads or substantially improve the existing ones. Among the exceptions are Chanda, Saugor, Damoh, Khandwa, Itarsi and Drug. Typical of the neglect shown by municipal committees in improving roads is the case of the Amraoti Town municipal committee, which spent only Rs. 2,222 [Rs. 7,409] on roads.

14. Markets.—The income from market dues and fees amounted to Rs. 6.07 [Rs. 5.63] lakhs and the expenditure to Rs. 1.21 [Rs. 0.98] lakhs. With the exception of Bilaspur and

Tumsar municipal committees which spent substantial sums on providing amenities in their markets most others continue to disregard the oft-repeated advice to spend more on markets from which they derive such large income.

15. **Education.**—The expenditure on education rose to Rs. 18.31 [Rs. 18] lakhs, and accounted for 20 [21] per cent of the total expenditure (including debt heads). Owing to financial stringency, Government was obliged to continue the 9 per cent cut in the education grants. There was increase in the number of primary schools from 581 to 600. The number of boys and girls on the rolls increased from 87,061 to 92,962, but the percentage of attendance declined from 84 to 83. There was no extension of compulsory education during the year and the scheme prepared by the Khurai municipal committee was not approved by Government. There are no separate schools for depressed classes, except one each in Nagpur, Chhindwara, Khurai and two in Burhanpur. Elsewhere depressed class boys are admitted freely in schools. The Saugor, Khandwa and Bilaspur municipal committees maintain a carpentry, an industrial and a weaving school, respectively. The special arrangements made by the Mandla municipal committee for the education of Bhumijans are popular and the demand for admission is expanding. Adult education is receiving increasing attention. There are two night schools for depressed classes at Saoner, one night class for adults at Mowar, two night classes at Khandwa and one each at Jubbulpore, Seoni-Malwa and Hoshangabad and four adult education classes were started at the four centre schools in Betul.

16. **Closing balance.**—Government is glad to note that the number of municipal committees which failed to maintain the minimum closing balance decreased from 30 to 17.

17. **Audit.**—The annual audit report repeats the usual sorry tale of badly kept accounts, poor collections, defective preparation of assessment registers, embezzlements and frauds, irregularities in the execution of public works and delays in the disposal of audit objections. In the dissolved municipal committees special efforts are being made by the officers-in-charge to clear off the mass of accumulated audit objections left by successive elected bodies and to improve the accounts generally. Among the municipal committees which are reported to have maintained the accounts in good order may be mentioned Seoni-Malwa, Burhanpur, Bhatapara, Drug, Bhandara and Warud. The accounts of Deori, Chhota-Chhindwara, Raipur and Balaghat municipal committees were far from satisfactory and should receive special attention.

18. **Notified area committees.**—The number of notified area committees decreased from 20 to 18. General elections were held in the Ballarpur, Bamora and Waraseoni notified area committees and were on the whole keenly contested. The income and expenditure fell to Rs. 2.32 [Rs. 2.58] lakhs and Rs. 2.23 [Rs. 2.77] lakhs, respectively. The notified area committees, Umarchhed, Dhamangaon and Bhatapara were raised to the status of municipalities and the village sanitation panchayat at Patur was converted into a notified area committee. The administration by notified area committees was on the whole

unsatisfactory. For example, the Multai notified area committee had to be dissolved for mismanagement. Charges were framed against the Sindhi committee and maladministration which has recently resulted in the dissolution of the Piparia committee attracted attention during the year. The financial condition of the Shendurjana committee continued to be bad and the Ballarpur committee was rent by internal dissensions. The budgets of the Champa, Kota and Mungeli committees disclosed a weak financial condition.

19. **General.**—Save for a few notable exceptions, the administration of municipalities continued to be carried on in a routine manner, showing no initiative or keenness for progress and improvement. The municipalities are in general still dominated by personalities instead of being run on sound democratic principles with well defined policies. The desire to serve the town and to improve the civic amenities is conspicuous by its absence and instead the civic administration is sought to be influenced by private, communal or political interests. Punctual collection of taxes, which is the backbone of municipal administration, is neglected with the result that the finances of most of the committees are in a deplorable state and not only are the essential needs starved, but even payment of the staff is irregular, necessitating frequent use by Government of powers of control. To make things worse, party factions are rampant and differences and intrigues among members hamper the municipal administration to the detriment of the interests of the rate-payers whose apathy is often regarded by many as the justification for what they get. Both in the year under review and subsequently Government has been freely exercising the power of dissolution to end the era of chronic maladministration and to put matters right through the appointment of officers-in-charge. This policy is fully vindicated by the reports of clean-up and progress received from these officers-in-charge. In these towns, long-pending audit objections have been disposed of, arrears of taxes often ranging over many years have been collected, office staff has been strengthened and improved, finances have been rehabilitated and works of improvement have been initiated. The phase of dissolution is however a temporary one and when the reins of administration are again resumed by elected committees, it is hoped that the standard set up by the officers-in-charge will be maintained, if not improved upon. Despite the spate of dissolutions and cases of disciplinary action, relations between Government and the office-bearers and members of municipal committees remained cordial.

ORDER.—Ordered that copies of the resolution be forwarded to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for information and guidance, and that it be translated and circulated (through Deputy Commissioners) for the information and guidance of all municipal committees.

Ordered also that the resolution be published in Part I of the *Central Provinces and Berar Gazette*.
