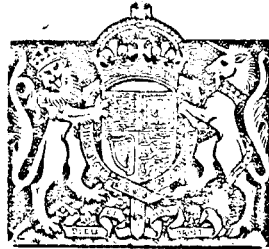

RESOLUTION

1. Constitution.—The number of district councils and local boards remained unchanged. Consequent on the abolition of nominations, the number of elected members in local boards and of elected and selected members in district councils was increased and orders were issued inviting proposals for division of local board areas into circles on the revised basis.

2. Elections.—General elections to local boards were held in the Chhindwara, Chanda, Wardha, Saugor (including Damoh), Hoshangabad (including Narsinghpur), Nimar, Mandla, Raipur and Drug districts. It was noticed that a large number of candidates were returned unopposed, mainly on the Congress party ticket. There was no contest in any circle in the Narsinghpur local board while in the Saugor district 30 out of 46 seats and in the Drug district 37 out of 58 seats were un-contested.

The percentage of the electorate attending the polls was comparatively small, being 24 per cent in Drug and a little less than 33 per cent in Chhindwara. The absence of candidates in six circles in the Drug district is said to be due to the inability of candidates in poorer tracts to deposit the security of Rs. 50. During the year Berar district councils and the Jubbulpore district council to which elections had been held in the previous year were fully constituted.

3. Disposal of business.—All district councils and all local boards except 22 [17] held the prescribed number of meetings. The total number of meetings held was 683 [750] of which 77 [90] proved abortive. The average percentage of attendance at district council meetings increased to 66 [65] and that of the local board meetings rose to 56 [52]. No district council made use of section 17 (2) of the Act, although instances

of members who failed to attend even a single meeting during the year were numerous. The Commissioners, Nagpur and Jubbulpore, have again stressed the need of legislation to provide for automatic disqualification of members who are habitually absent.

4. **General financial results.**—The year opened with a balance of Rs. 26.28 [Rs. 31.36] lakhs. The total receipts from all sources amounted to Rs. 78.55 [Rs. 71.56] lakhs and the total expenditure to Rs. 76.30 [Rs. 75.84] lakhs, leaving a closing balance of Rs. 28.53 [Rs. 27.08] lakhs. The following table shows the net receipts and expenditure in lakhs of rupees in various departments :—

The appreciable increase in the total receipts was shared by district councils in all the divisions. A good cotton crop and favourable cotton prices were responsible for the increased income from cesses and from grants equal to 1 per cent of the total land revenue in the Berar district councils. It is satisfactory to note that the district councils of Akola, Buldana and Yeotmal have taken to heart the warning given to them last year and have made efforts to improve their previously precarious finances. The Commissioner, Berar, remarks that the drastic retrenchment measures courageously introduced in Yeotmal and Buldana were clearly necessary. Government agrees with the Commissioner when he goes on to say that estimates should never exceed one year's normal demand and that in preparing the budgets councils should avoid the all too common mistake of overestimating receipts.

5. **General Departments.**—The income under this head increased to Rs. 38.72 [Rs. 33.52] lakhs while the expenditure increased to Rs. 11.85 [Rs. 10.54] lakhs. The increase was contributed by various sources of receipts such as land revenue cesses in Berar and some other districts, wheel tax in Jubbulpore and sale of lands and buildings in Seoni. The increase in expenditure is attributed mainly to larger election expenses where elections were held.

6. Cattle Pounds.—The number of cattle pounds decreased to 1908 [1909]. The income decreased to Rs. 2.55 [Rs. 4.99] lakhs while the expenditure to Rs. 2.76 [Rs. 2.85] lakhs. The large fall in receipts is only apparent and is chiefly due to the fact that fees, fines and other receipts were credited to the provincial revenues, while equivalent refunds to district councils were not made fully before the close of the year. Supervision over cattle pound staff is still reported to be inadequate and the appointment of pound inspectors and greater vigilance by members are obviously indicated. The Commissioner, Jubbulpore division, points out that inspections are generally inadequate but no district council seems as yet to have prescribed a roster of inspections.

7. Education.—The total expenditure on education, including that on buildings, amounted to Rs. 29.69 [Rs. 30.95] lakhs, of which Rs. 11.69 [Rs. 12.10] lakhs were provided by Government. Fees, contributions other than those from provincial revenues, and miscellaneous receipts brought in Rs. .26 [Rs. .38] lakh while the remaining amount of Rs. 17.74 [Rs. 18.47] lakhs was met from the surplus of the general purposes grant and other sources. The total number of schools increased from 4,761 to 4,858, the enrolment increased from 318,423 to 323,159, and the average attendance rose from 241,351 to 245,721.

A proposal for the extension of compulsory education in 10 villages was submitted by the Narsinghpur district council. Wardha and Chhindwara district councils which were considering its introduction have not been able to effect it for want of funds. Financial difficulty impedes progress in other districts also. The agricultural classes attached to the Lakhnadon and Chappara schools are working satisfactorily. Agricultural training classes have also been started by the Nagpur, Mandla, Narsinghpur, Damoh and Nimar district councils. Training in handicrafts is receiving increasing attention. There are tailoring classes at Bamhni in the Mandla district and at Jaberia in the Damoh district. The Damoh district council has introduced hand-spinning and hand-weaving and carpentry classes in two schools and one school, respectively. Radio sets were installed in two villages in the Mandla district with the help of Government grants and attracted large gatherings of villagers. Efforts for adult education were made by the Nagpur, Mandla and Narsinghpur district councils. Government notes with regret that the scheme of cheap type schools initiated by the Amraoti district council is reported by the Deputy Commissioner not to have worked satisfactorily so far and trusts that the council will concert adequate and timely measures to remove the defects and to make a success of this promising scheme.

In the Betul district the ambitious scheme of aboriginal education is stated to be a failure.

Taking advantage of the policy previously followed by Government in regard to participation of teachers and other staff in activities of a political nature, several district councils constrained or encouraged their staff to engage in non-educational activities to the detriment of their legitimate duties. Teachers were asked, on threat of disciplinary action, to enrol themselves and others

as Congress members, to organize Congress meetings, to recite vows of independence, to take out morning processions (prabhat pheries), to wear nothing but khadi and to foment general disaffection towards Government. Since the close of the year, Government has issued revised instructions against the employees of local bodies indulging in political activities, which if faithfully followed by these bodies as well as their employees, should avoid friction between Government and its officers and the local bodies and should improve efficiency by discouraging undesirable distractions. The Betul district council, a serious defaulter in this respect, had to be dissolved in the current year and Government would like to take this opportunity to impress upon local bodies the need for concentrating on their statutory duties and functions, to the exclusion of controversial and subversive politics and to steer their administration so as to maintain and foster friendly relations (1) with Government and its officers, and (2) amongst the various communities and component parts of the body politics.

8. Medical.—The number of dispensaries increased to 92 [83] and the expenditure on medical relief increased from Rs. 2.19 to Rs. 2.49 lakhs. During the year 10 cheap plan dispensaries were sanctioned partly out of the provincial revenues and partly from the Government of India grant for rural development. It is regretted however that district councils did not take full advantage of the new schemes introduced by Government for extending medical relief in the countryside. Thus, although provision was made during the year for the opening of 83 indigenous dispensaries, the settling of 83 indigenous practitioners and the establishment of 19 subsidised allopathic practitioners, only two subsidised vaid and hakims and three allopathic practitioners were settled and only five ayurvedic dispensaries were sanctioned out of which two in the Akola district were never opened.

While there is an obvious need for bringing medical relief within easier reach of the rural population and every effort by district councils in that direction must be encouraged, Government must deprecate the tendency shown by certain district councils to reduce the contributions paid by them to existing urban hospitals and dispensaries which also minister to the needs of the countryside and which can ill afford to forego their support.

9. Public Health.—The total expenditure on vaccination and sanitation decreased slightly from Rs. 1.59 to Rs. 1.48 lakhs and Rs. .24 to Rs. .15 lakhs, respectively. The total number of vaccinations performed during the year was 450,880 [445,358]. Compulsory vaccination was extended to parts of the Chanda and Betul districts, proposals for its introduction have been received from the Jubbulpore district, while the Nagpur and Hoshangabad district councils are considering the question of its introduction. The most notable feature of the year was Government's taking over of vaccination work hitherto done by district councils. As the change was effected only a few months before the close of the year it is too early yet to comment on its results.

Improvement of water-supply in rural areas made slow progress but now that certain conditions regarding local contributions have been relaxed, district councils should be able to take greater advantage of the Government of India rural development grant for this purpose than has so far been possible.

**10. Veterinary and stock breeding.**—Veterinary receipts and expenditure amounted to Rs. 2,955 [Rs. 2,525] and Rs. 1,17,226 [Rs. 1,14,005], respectively. The number of full-fledged veterinary dispensaries remained 99 as in the previous year. Fifteen outlying dispensaries were however opened during the year under review and provision has been made for paying to them periodical visits by the veterinary assistant surgeon in charge of the area. It is a good move and will be watched with interest by the other district councils. Most of the reports complain of lack of accommodation the provision of which is a direct responsibility of the district councils which derive the great bulk of their funds from agricultural interests.

**11. Civil Works.**—Expenditure on civil works decreased to Rs. 5.90 [Rs. 6.56] lakhs. The total length of provincial roads transferred to district councils for maintenance decreased to 1,784 [1,802] miles. The Government grant for transferred works decreased to Rs. 6,72,705 [Rs. 7,06,554] and the expenditure to Rs. 6,59,404 [Rs. 6,95,345]. During the year the Wardha-Sevagram road was completed at a cost of Rs. 13,749 of which a sum of Rs. 12,500 was paid by Government. Similarly, the Eklehra-Damua first class road has been completed at a cost of over Rs. 1½ lakh. The roads in Jubbulpore, Saugor, Damoh and Narsinghpur district council areas continue to be in a bad condition and the buildings of the Jubbulpore district council are also deteriorating and need special repairs. It is unfortunate that the Jubbulpore district council which alone has resorted to a wheel tax should continue to have unsatisfactory roads year after year.

Twelve district councils and two independent local boards received grants amounting to Rs. 70,000 in all for the improvement of rural communications out of the provincial fund of Rs. 1,50,000 set apart for the purpose. Government has since obtained the Government of India's permission to distribute a sum of Rs. 1 lakh amongst district councils on conditions closely similar to those governing the payment out of provincial funds and Government is glad to see that there is a good demand for grants out of this amount. Government is pleased to note the tribute paid by the Commissioner, Berar Division, to the district councils in that division for the very ready co-operation extended by them in organizing relief operations. The Commissioner has made special mention of the members of the Buldana district council "who gave much assistance as honorary disbursing officers".

**12. Markets.**—The total number of public markets and of villages to which sections 26 to 34 of the Local Self-Government Act have been applied was 954. The income from markets was Rs. 3.14 [Rs. 3.25] lakhs. District councils continue to be unwilling to spend on the improvement of markets larger amounts out of the substantial income they derive from this source. For

example, none of the district councils in the Jubbulpore division incurred any expenditure on this account, while the Drug and Bhandara councils spent the paltry sums of Rs. 254 and Rs. 63 only.

13. Legislation.—A committee was appointed in July 1939 to examine the working of local self-government under the present law and to suggest if any changes were called for, but before it could make much progress with its work the normal working of the constitution was suspended. The following legislation was enforced during the year :—

- (1) Local Self-Government (Amendment) Act (XXXII of 1939) by which nominations to local boards and district councils were abolished while securing at the same time that Muslims, Harijans and women do not remain altogether unrepresented.
- (2) Local Self-Government (Amendment) Act (XVI of 1939) declaring office-bearers and members of district councils to be public servants under the Indian Penal Code.
- (3) Grants-in-aid to Local Bodies Act (XXXV of 1939) providing for the payment of a grant to local bodies approximately equal to the sums realized by them in the shape of certain fees, and fines which under the Government of India Act, 1935, are required to be credited to the provincial revenues.

14. Taxation.—No new taxes were imposed during the year but the district council, Nagpur, is formulating a proposal for the imposition of a special school rate on the unit system, while the Saugor and Jubbulpore district councils are considering the imposition of octroi and additional cess under section 49 of the Local Self-Government Act, respectively.

15. Staff.—The Jubbulpore, Hoshangabad and Nimar district councils continued their so-called emergency cuts. The Damoh district council has not paid increments since 1929. The Wardha district council reduced the cut from 15 per cent to 5 per cent and hopes to give increments to its staff who have been on the same pay for seven years. The Wardha district council furnished a particularly bad instance of the treatment of a protected employee against whom no less than three departmental inquiries were held one after another, although each time Government refused to sanction the dismissal recommended by the district council. Such action not only dissipates energy, but makes relations between employees and employer unpleasant and also involves waste of public funds as the employee has to be paid for the period of his suspension for no work done by him.

Towards the close of the year some district councils, notably Betul, Hoshangabad, Raipur and Bilaspur were found to be employing their staff on work which could not form part of their legitimate duties and to use them as agents for a political party. Instructions have recently been issued which, if properly complied with, should put a stop to this abuse of authority.



16. **Financial irregularities.**—The financial administration of district councils and local boards with a few exceptions was on the whole satisfactory and no serious flaws were disclosed. The accounts of Hatta, Seoni-Malwa and of the local boards under the Raipur district council were below standard. It is satisfactory to note that the accounts of the Raipur district council which were severely criticised last year showed distinct improvement this year. The remarks of the Examiner, Local Fund Accounts, that if all local boards followed rules scrupulously and district councils supported their action without making any exception of individuals, both audit and the administration of local bodies will be saved much unpleasant and unnecessary work, deserve to be carefully noted by all local bodies in the province.

17. **Village Panchayats.**—During the year 36 [34] new panchayats were established and 4 [4] panchayats were dis-established owing to internal dissensions and apathy of the influential men in the village. 1,020 [987] village courts and benches functioned; of these 146 [121] benches and 99 [97] courts exercised enhanced powers under section 18 (2) and section 32 (2), respectively. 19 [13] village courts exercised special powers under section 54 (1) of the Village Panchayat Act. 6,823 [6,798] criminal cases and 7,126 [7,393] civil suits were disposed of. Civil and criminal work was generally done with care and responsibility but the average duration of criminal and civil cases continued to be high and panchayat benches and courts have yet to learn the value of simplicity of and promptness in procedure. There was no increase in the number of panchayats levying taxes. The number of panchayats doing administrative work remained the same. Panchayats did useful work in distributing medicines for combating epidemic disease, and in improving drainage and roads. One panchayat in the Amraoti district contributed Rs. 4,000 to the district council for making the village a model one. 21 [18] out of 24 district councils have formed sub-committees for supervision over the panchayat work and all district councils have now made arrangements for the periodical audit of panchayat fund accounts and for inspection and educative propaganda.

The Village Panchayat Bill which was to have introduced far-reaching changes in the panchayat system could not be proceeded with on account of the suspension of the normal constitution.

18. **General remarks.**—There was no occasion for the use of the powers of control under the Local Self-Government Act and the relations between the district councils and Government officers continued to be cordial. The majority of the councils continued as in previous years to conduct their administration in a more or less routine manner, little progress being made in expansion of education, extension of rural medical relief and improvement of communications and water-supply. Despite the shortcomings referred to above, however, the administration of the councils generally was conducted smoothly.

ORDER.—Ordered that copies be forwarded to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for information and guidance and that the report be translated and copies circulated (through Deputy Commissioners) for the information and guidance of all district council and local board members.

Ordered also that the resolution be published in Part I of the *Central Provinces and Berar Gazette*.
