READ AGAIN—

This Administration's Resolution, Local and Municipal Department, No. 27-VIII, dated the 15th January 1918.

RESOLUTION.

The reports of the Commissioners on the working of the Local Self-Government Act in the Central Provinces and the Rural Boards Law in Berar were due on the 15th September. The Berar report was two months late, owing to the fact that the statistical information contained in the district reports was inaccurate and had to be corrected.

2. There was no change in the number of Councils or Boards or in the sanctioned number of members. One important change was the appointment of a non-official Secretary by the Chanda District Council, both the Chairman and Secretary of which are now non-officials.

3. All District Councils in the Central Provinces and District Boards in Berar held the prescribed number of meetings; but the Meetings, attendance and elections. Local Boards of Garchiroli, Khurai, Seoni-Malwa, Betul, Multai and Chhindwara failed in this respect. Out of a total of 126 meetings held by District Councils and District Boards, 7 proved abortive for want of a quorum, while out of 696 meetings held by Local Boards, 76 similarly failed. The average non-official attendance was below 50 per cent in 10 District Councils and in the great majority of Local Boards, the highest percentage being 68 in the Bilaspur Zamindari Local Board. In the Hoshangabad and Drug District Councils the average was under 40 per cent, while in Jubbulpore and Balaghat the average non-official attendance was under 30 per cent. As the constitution and functions of Local Bodies will shortly undergo radical alteration, it is not necessary to repeat the strictures which have frequently been made in past years on the want of enthusiasm and of a sense of responsibility shown by Local Board members and on the lack of interest displayed in the elections.

4. Income and expenditure, excluding debt heads, showed increases of Rs. 7,60,506 and Rs. 2,27,075 respectively. The bulk of the increase in income, amounting to Rs. 5,44,467, occurred in Berar, and was mainly due to the receipt by the Boards of Government grants amounting to Rs. 2,43,093 for Public Works Department Works in the four Sub-Divisions transferred to them during the year and a grant of

Rs. 1,18,750 for school buildings. There was also an increase of Rs. 1,26,064 in Berar under the Education Cess, due to the doubling of the cess, and of Rs. 37,029 on account of the surplus of Jaglia and Local Cess in the Amraoti and Buldana Districts. Contributions from Government amounted to over 19½ lakhs, or nearly 44 per cent of the total income of the Councils and Boards. Nearly 11 lakhs was allotted for education, and 8½ lakhs for Civil Works, excluding school buildings. Of the latter sum, over 5 lakhs was absorbed by communications and works transferred by Government to District Councils for maintenance under the Local Fund Engineer Scheme. In the aggregate the closing balances at the end of the year under report were in excess of those for the previous year by over 3 lakhs. The District Boards in Berar, which showed some improvement in this respect in the previous year, were again responsible for the major portion of this increase. The grant for school buildings having been made at the close of the year, the Boards were unable to spend the amount given before the close of the year, and one lakh out of the sum transferred by Government for Public Works was also unspent. The financial position was not satisfactory in the Chhattisgarh Division, especially in the Raipur District, where over Rs. 37,000 of the expenditure on education had to be met from the Road Cess. The cattle registration fee levied in 12 markets of the Bilaspur District was raised during the year, and 3 markets of the Raipur District were brought under the system of cattle sale registration.

5. The total expenditure on education, excluding that on buildings and repairs, which is included in Public Works, rose from Rs. 8,21,000 in the Central Provinces and Rs. 3,94,000 in Berar to Rs. 8,81,000 and Rs. 4,11,000 respectively. Expenditure on school buildings fell from Rs. 3,19,000 to Rs. 2,88,000. Government contributions amounted to Rs. 7,70,000 in the Central Provinces and Rs. 3,09,000 in Berar as against Rs. 7,27,000 and Rs. 1,89,000 respectively in the previous year. The principal special grants made by Government for education were Rs. 2,34,000 for the maintenance of new Primary Schools, Rs. 83,000 for pension contributions and for raising the pay of school masters, and Rs. 2,60,000 towards the construction of new, and the extension of existing, buildings of the Vernacular Middle and Primary Schools. There was an increase of 82 in the number of Primary Schools and 6 in the number of Middle Schools in the Central Provinces, while in Berar the increases were 25 and 6 respectively. The proportion of recurring expenditure on education to the total income was the same in the Central Provinces as in the previous year: in Berar it decreased from 37 to 25 per cent, the proportion for the whole Provinces falling from 32 to 29. If non-recurring expenditure on buildings is added, the proportion is about 35 per cent of the total income. In the Nerbudda Division it is disappointing to find that the rise in the number of students is not commensurate with the increase in the number of schools. In Berar during the three years ending 1916-17 there was a steady decline in the number of boys on the roll, and during the year under report there was only a slight recovery. It is clear from the reports that the supply of trained teachers is the greatest want of the day. In Raipur alone out of 755 teachers 519 are untrained; there are 2 Normal Schools in the Chhattisgarh Division, but it will be some time before the position is satisfactory. In Berar more than 75 per cent of the teachers are untrained; but with the new Normal School at Akola and a substantial improvement in the pay of school masters it is hoped that more and better men will be attracted to the Normal Schools. In the Nerbudda Division the number of uncertificated teachers rose from 335 to 355, the largest number being in Nimar where there is a Normal School. The opening of a Normal School at Seoni has so far had no perceptible effect on the number of untrained teachers in the Chhindwara District.

The Chief Commissioner observes with interest the experiment of including a course of Agriculture in the school curriculum which is being tried in the Chhindwara District. A farm of about 10 acres is worked entirely by the boys of the Chaurai school, all the boys of the higher classes being compelled to do their share. The experiment bids fair to be a success, and so far has caused no decrease in the attendance of the school. In Berar there is a demand for elementary agricultural education, and it is reported that the Department of Agriculture intends to

establish schools at Akola and Yeotmal. Owing to the keen interest taken in night schools by a non-official member in the Yeotmal District, their number rose from 32 to 40, with 615 boys on the roll, against 515 in the previous year. The Commissioner of Berar mentions the assistance given by the Boards in stimulating interest in the war and improving recruiting by organising magic lantern and singing parties which toured the districts, each party consisting of two masters and two singers. The recent orders that school buildings constructed out of Government grants must not cost more than Rs. 15 per boy accommodated gave rise to some difficulty at first, but a solution was found in Khandwa, where the Deputy Commissioner suggested that school buildings should not be of a better type than the best village houses. Estimates have been worked out for buildings on these lines within a cost of Rs. 11 per pupil. A great advantage of this type of building is that it can be built by local artisans, thus entirely removing the obstacle arising from the difficulty of finding contractors for village works. An important feature of the year in Berar was the enactment of Section 22-A of the Rural Boards Law, which empowers District Boards to impose a school-rate on non-agricultural incomes in villages served by their schools. It is expected that this cess will add more than a lakh to the income of the Boards; but so far Amraoti is the only Board which has imposed the rate.

6. District Funds subsidised 169 dispensaries as against 165 in the previous year. The amount of contributions for maintenance Medical and Sanitary work. increased by Rs. 7,000, while those for buildings and repairs decreased by Rs. 4,000. There was a decrease of 2 per cent under the head "Medical." The extension of medical relief is out of the question at present owing to the scarcity of medical assistants; but now that the war is over, an improvement in this respect may be expected in the near future. Small-pox is becoming increasingly frequent in Berar, where there has been a tendency on the part of some of the Boards to claim a much larger and more direct control over the executive work of the vaccination staff than is the case in the Central Provinces.

7. The expenditure on conservancy was Rs. 27,000 against Rs. 29,000 in the previous year. Nearly all of this was spent in Berar, where it is divided between grants to the Panchayats of villages under the Village Sanitation Act and the cost of sweepers in some of the larger villages. During the year grants amounting to Rs. 42,500 were sanctioned for expenditure on the improvement of the water-supply in rural areas. In Bhandara the whole grant was utilised, and some progress was made in Seoni; but in Jubbulpore, Hoshangabad, Raipur, Drug, Buldana and Yeotmal large unspent balances accumulated. The chief cause of the failure to utilise the grant is said to be the dearth of contractors to sink wells. Owing to the war and to the failure of the crops there was a lack of private subscriptions. The Deputy Commissioner, Nagpur, questions the wisdom of making grants for the improvement of village wells, but, as the Commissioner remarks, it is a definite experiment in order to test how far the provision of a good supply of drinking water in a defined area affects cholera epidemics. With regard to village sanitation generally there was a considerable amount spent in Berar on the construction and repairs of roads; and the Chief Commissioner endorses the Commissioner's opinion that improvement of the roads is an important sanitary work, in that it reduces dust and the accumulation of filth.

8. The expenditure on Civil Works increased from Rs. 17,18,000 to Rs. 18,19,000. This figure includes Rs. 2,88,000 expended on school buildings, as well as expenditure from Civil Works. the sum of Rs. 5,07,000 contributed by Government for the maintenance of roads and buildings transferred from the Public Works Department to District Councils. In the case of 10 District Councils the proportion of lapses to total allotment was more than 20 per cent, the causes being the inefficiency of the Public Work staff of the Councils and the difficulty of finding efficient contractors for the execution of works. The expenditure on communications was about 48 per cent of the total expenditure on Civil Works against 41 per cent in the previous year. Opinions vary as to the success of the Divisional Local Fund Engineer Scheme. In the Nagpur Division the area is too large for effective supervision

by one Engineer, and the Commissioner has submitted proposals for the revision of the scheme, but this must wait for the decision of the larger questions raised by the Public Works Department Reorganisation Committee. Similarly, in the Nerbudda Division the scheme cannot be expected to be a success while one Engineer has such a large area to look after. The scheme has worked well in Berar, where a second Engineer has been appointed and the subordinate staff strengthened. The Chief Commissioner entirely agrees with the Commissioner, Nerbudda Division, that the scheme depends for its success on securing really good supervisors.

9. The number of pounds rose from 1,472 to 1,501. The income and expenditure increased by 7 and 10 per cent respectively.

Cattle-pounds.

All pounds were self-supporting, except 3 in Raipur, 5 in Drug and 2 in Amraoti. Five pounds in the Drug District which worked at a loss have been closed, and the District Board, Amraoti, is considering the question of closing 2 pounds. During the year the receipts on account of feeding charges of cattle impounded was Rs. 1,11,000 and the expenditure Rs. 1,07,000. Of the latter sum Rs. 30,000 was devoted to the feed of cattle, while the balance represents the cost of pound servants and of feeding appliances, etc., which, according to the orders issued by the Administration in 1899, are treated as legitimate charges against the recoveries made. Taking the Province as a whole, there was a surplus of Rs. 4,000 only, but in certain Districts, noticeably Jubbulpore, Nimar, Saugor and Wardha, there appear to have been undue surpluses. The matter should be looked into by the Deputy Commissioners concerned, as the fees are only intended to cover expenditure and not to be a source of profit.

10. All charges on account of Veterinary Dispensaries, except the pay of Veterinary Assistants, are met from District Funds.

Veterinary.

They amounted to Rs. 55,000 as against Rs. 50,000 in the previous year. The reports are unanimous that the dispensaries are doing good work and gaining in popularity.

11. The Government of India have recently issued a Resolution in which the principles to be followed in the matter of Local Self-Government are laid down, and a Bill embodying those principles has been prepared and is now under the consideration of the Government of India. The Commissioner, Nagpur, reports that the progress made in his Division gives every promise that District Councils will be able to undertake with success the enlarged functions and powers contemplated in the Government of India Resolution, and they look forward with keen interest to the introduction of the Local Self-Government Bill.

12. The relations between District Officers and the Councils or Boards

Notice of services.

continue to be satisfactory. The thanks of the Chief Commissioner will be conveyed separately to those gentlemen whose good work has been brought to notice in the reports. Since the close of the year the Chief Commissioner has heard with deep regret of the deaths of Rao Bahadur R. K. Pandit, Secretary of the Nagpur District Council, and of Rao Bahadur P. L. Damle, Vice-Chairman of the Buldana District Board.

ORDER.—Ordered that a copy of this Resolution be submitted to the Government of India in the Department of Education, and that copies be forwarded to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for information and guidance.

Ordered also, that the Resolution be published in the Supplement to the *Central Provinces Gazette*.
