Annual Reports of the District Councils in the Central Provinces and Berar for the year 1919-20.

Reviews of the Commissioners of Divisions on the above.

RESOLUTION.

The reports of the Commissioners on the working of the Local Self-Government Act in the Central Provinces and the Rural Boards Law in Berar were due on the 15th September; but the report from the Nagpur Division was over six weeks late, the delay being again due to the unsatisfactory condition of the Balaghat District Council office. The Berar report was received on the 19th November 1920 and the delay is attributed to the inaccuracy of the statistical information contained in the district statements and the necessity for a number of references to the Boards for the reconciliation of discrepancies. On the whole, however, the reports were received somewhat more punctually than is usual.

2. *Constitution.*—There was no change in the number of District Councils or Boards, but the number of Local Boards increased by one owing to the inclusion of the newly created Board at Waraseoni. The only districts which still retain official Chairmen are the three Plateau districts of Seoni, Betul and Chhindwara; but the practice of official Chairmen is still general among Local Boards. With the introduction of the new system of local self-government all official Chairmen will disappear.

3. *Meetings, attendance and elections.*—All District Councils and Boards held the prescribed number of meetings, but seven Local Boards failed to do so. Out of a total of 139 meetings held by District Councils and District Boards, 13 proved abortive for want of a quorum, and out of the 693 meetings held by Local Boards 91 proved similarly abortive. The average non-official attendance was below 50 per cent in the case of 14 District Councils and in a great majority of Local Boards, the highest percentage reached being 65 in the case of the Malkapur Local Board. The prevalence of plague, influenza and relapsing fever was to a certain extent responsible for these poor results, but, as in previous year, the chief cause was the failure of members to realize their responsibilities. The limited powers hitherto exercised by local bodies may also have affected the interest of members in their duties. With the widening of the powers of local bodies which will follow on the introduction of the Local Self-Government Act it is hoped that a more lively sense of responsibility will come into being.

4. *General financial results*—Income and expenditure, excluding debt heads, showed increases of Rs. 5,84,843 and Rs. 5,91,349 respectively. The increase in income was shared by all divisions. In the Jubbulpore Division the increase was chiefly due to the recovery of the suspended cesses of last year, the increased income from pounds, the winding up of the salt operations by the Saugor District Council, and the receipt of a grant from Government for the payment of war and scarcity allowances. In the Chhattisgarh Division the increase was chiefly due to the larger receipts from cattle-pounds and from Government contributions for education and civil works; while in Berar the increase occurred under the heads Local Rates, Police and

Miscellaneous. Contributions from Government amounted to Rs. 23 lakhs, or 40 per cent of the total income of the Councils and Boards. Of this sum about Rs. 14 lakhs was allotted for education, and the balance was given for civil works (excluding school buildings). Of the latter, nearly Rs. 6 lakhs were spent on communications and works transferred by Government to District Councils for maintenance. In the aggregate, the actual closing balance was Rs. 21 lakhs in excess of the fixed minimum closing balances. As usual, the Berar Boards were responsible for most of the excess, the bulk of it being due to unspent balances from contributions for transferred works. The Commissioner of Berar remarks that the Boards possess numerous opportunities for profitable expenditure; and if they fail to take advantage of those opportunities, they cannot claim that Government should continue to contribute towards the inflation of their balances.

5. *Education.*—The total expenditure on education, excluding that on buildings and repairs, which is included in Public Works, rose from Rs. 10 $\frac{3}{4}$ lakhs in the Central Provinces and Rs. 6 lakhs in Berar to Rs. 13 lakhs and Rs. 7 lakhs respectively. Government contributions amounted to Rs. 11 lakhs in the Central Provinces and Rs. 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ lakhs in Berar as against Rs. 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ lakhs and Rs. 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ lakhs respectively in the previous year. The principal special grants made by Government for education were Rs. 3,43,000 for the maintenance of new primary schools and Rs. 98,000 for pension contributions and for raising the pay of school masters. There was an increase of two each in the number of primary and middle schools in Berar, but in the Central Provinces there was a decrease of 6 and 2 respectively. The decrease occurred mainly in the Nerbudda Division, where it is stated that on account of the prevailing high wages the parents of children in villages prefer that their children should be earning 4 or 5 annas a day rather than be sitting at school. In the Central Provinces the proportion of recurring expenditure on education to the total income rose from 32 to 39 per cent, and that in Berar from 34 to 43 per cent, the proportion for the whole province being 41 per cent. In Berar the expenditure on education has increased very greatly in the past three years and still continues to absorb money from heads of receipts which should be devoted to other purposes. All the Boards have schemes for future development, but they must see that this development is not effected at the expense of the other needs of the district. The Boards have already begun to realize this, and proposals have been received from the District Board, Amraoti, to double the education cess so as to raise it to the maximum of two annas per rupee of revenue allowed by Section 159 of the Berar Land Revenue Code.

6. Notwithstanding the increased expenditure devoted to it, education made little progress during the year. The number of schools remained practically the same, while the attendance declined. It is, however, satisfactory to note that the number of aboriginal and backward scholars increased in the Betul and Nimar districts, and that the numbers of untouchables in the latter district also showed a rise. This is gratifying considering the unprecedented demand for labour. The number of night schools in Berar fell from 55 to 14 and the attendance also declined, while the two schools of this kind in the Nimar district were closed owing to poor enrolment and attendance.

7. No mention is made in the Nagpur and Jubbulpore reports of the scheme of constructing cheap buildings, but in the Chhattisgarh and Berar Divisions the scheme has been found to be impracticable owing to the inability of such buildings to withstand heavy rainfall. Such a building at Babulgaon in the Akola district was occupied for a few months, but the first showers of rain destroyed the walls. One of the advantages urged in favour of the scheme was that this type of school could be built by the villagers themselves, but in the Amraoti and Akola districts village agency has been found to be unwilling to undertake the work. The problem requires reconsideration.

8. *Medical and sanitary works.*—District Funds subsidised 172 dispensaries against 170 in the previous year. The amount of contributions for maintenance decreased by Rs. 28,000, while those for buildings and repairs increased by Rs. 1,000. There was an increase of 13 per cent in expenditure under the head

" Medical." Since the close of the year the scheme for the creation of a Health Service for work in rural areas, referred to in the last year's Resolution, has taken concrete form, and sanction has been accorded to the appointment of two officers of health for the Nagpur and Jubbulpore districts. A proposal to introduce the scheme in the Amraoti district is receiving consideration.

9. The expenditure on conservancy was Rs. 19,000 against Rs. 18,000 in the previous year. Nearly all of this was spent in Berar. During the year a special grant of Rs. 50,000 was made from provincial revenues for the improvement of water-supply in rural areas, but only Rs. 36,000 was spent from this grant and the balance of previous grants, and the Councils still have Rs. 80,000 unspent. During the year the Sanitary Commissioner enquired into the progress achieved in the improvement of the water-supply from the annual grants made from the year 1913-14 to 1918-19. The enquiry showed that nearly Rs. 3 lakhs have been expended throughout the province in the construction of 375 new wells and repairs to 225 existing wells. A very large number of wells are, however, still needed everywhere, and the local bodies should make fresh efforts to utilize to the full the funds allotted to them for the purpose.

10. *Civil works.*—The expenditure on civil works increased from Rs. 18 $\frac{3}{4}$ lakhs to Rs. 20 $\frac{3}{4}$ lakhs. This figure includes Rs. 3 $\frac{1}{3}$ lakhs expended on school buildings as well as expenditure from the sum of Rs. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ lakhs contributed by Government for the maintenance of roads and buildings transferred from the Public Works Department to District Councils. In the case of 9 District Councils the proportion of lapses to total allotments was more than 20 per cent, the causes being, as before, the insufficiency of the public works staff and the difficulty of finding efficient contractors for the execution of works. The expenditure on communications was 48 per cent of the total expenditure on civil works against 45 per cent in the previous year. The Divisional Local Fund Engineers' Scheme was again reported from some divisions not to have worked well, but, as mentioned in previous year's Resolution, the question of the revision of the scheme must await the decision of the larger questions raised by the Public Works Reorganisation Committee. Sanction has, however, been accorded to the conversion of the Divisional Local Fund Engineers' Scheme in Berar into a District Engineers' Scheme.

11. *Cattle-pounds.*—The number of pounds rose from 1,538 to 1,584, the income and expenditure increasing by 22 and 14 per cent respectively. The receipts on account of feeding charges of cattle impounded were Rs. 1,94,000, and the expenditure Rs. 1,51,000. Of the latter sum, Rs. 67,000 was devoted to the feeding of cattle, while the balance represents the cost of pound servants and food-stuffs. Taking the province as a whole, there was a surplus of Rs. 43,000. As remarked last year, fees are only intended to cover expenditure and not to be a source of profit, and the accrual of undue surpluses should receive the special attention of the local bodies concerned.

12. *Veterinary.*—All charges on account of veterinary dispensaries, except the pay of Veterinary Assistants, are met from District Funds. They amounted to Rs. 65,000 as against Rs. 62,000 in the previous year. The dispensaries continued to do useful work, and their popularity is reported to be steadily increasing. Government regrets to notice that the refusal of the District Council, Balaghat, to grant either free quarters or house rent in lieu thereof compelled the Superintendent, Civil Veterinary Department, to withdraw the touring Veterinary Assistant from this district.

13. Since the close of the year the new Central Provinces Local Self-Government Act has been passed into law. As soon as the rules under it have been framed, the Act will be brought into operation. It will not only liberalize the constitution of the local bodies and make them largely independent of official control, but will also give them considerable independent powers of taxation. If the measure succeeds in creating amongst the electorate a corporate body of public opinion, capable of exercising an effective control over its representatives, and in awakening those representatives to a proper sense of their duties and responsibilities, a new chapter will have commenced in the history of local institutions in the province.

14. *Notice of services.*—The relations between district officers and the local bodies continued to be satisfactory. The thanks of the Government will be conveyed separately to those gentlemen whose good work has been brought to notice in the reports.

ORDER.—Ordered that a copy of this Resolution be submitted to the Government of India in the Department of Education and that copies be forwarded to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for information and guidance.

Ordered also that the Resolution be published in the Supplement to the *Central Provinces Gazette*.
