2. *Number of Municipalities, their constitution and meetings.*—The number of Municipalities was the same as in the preceding year, namely, 57. Proposals for raising Drug, Katol and Gondia Notified Areas to the status of Municipalities were approved during the year. There was no change in the constitution of Municipalities except at Jubbulpore and Mandla. At Jubbulpore the election of a person who was not a member of the Committee as Vice-President raised the number of members from 33 to 34. At Mandla, on the provincialisation of the Jaganath High School on 1st April 1917, the two teachers of the school who were Municipal members became official members; one of them, however, subsequently resigned the service. In the Nagpur Division the Commissioner found that the electoral scheme was defective in several Municipalities, the number of voters forming a very small proportion of the population and the arrangement of wards being uneven; and the question of extending the franchise and re-arranging the wards so as to effect a better representation of different interests is now being considered. In some of the smaller towns of the Nagpur Division there is a reluctance to give up the official Chairman, through fear of the odium attached to the assessment of taxes. If the spirit of self-government in local affairs is to be developed, it is important that this reluctance should be overcome. The Committees of Deoli, Sehora, Deori, Mandla, Pachmarhi, Pandhurna and Gadarwara failed to hold the prescribed number of meetings. In Pandhurna and Gadarwara this was due to the prevalence of plague, and in Pachmarhi, where the Committee is purely official, the number of meetings is necessarily restricted. The attendance of non-official members was generally satisfactory except at Wardha and Narsinghpur, where it was only 40 per cent. The attendance at Amraoti Town, where the average percentage was 53, though an improvement upon the previous year, was the poorest in the Berar Division.

3. *Elections.*—General elections were held at Nagpur and in ten other Municipalities of the Nagpur Division. At Nagpur there was keen competition and much canvassing of voters by candidates, with an unfortunate tendency to introduce politics into Municipal affairs. The Commissioner, Nagpur Division, is of opinion that the system under which Municipal elections affect those for the Legislative Councils is undoubtedly detrimental to the best interests of Municipal government. There were also keen contests at general and by-elections in several other Municipalities in both the Central Provinces and Berar. In Berar the rotation system of election is still in force. The revised election rules for this Division have been finally issued and will come into force from February 1919, when the first general elections will be held; and in these Buldana will participate for the first time, as the elective franchise has been granted to the town. The number of elected non-official Chairmen rose from 13 to 15, the official Presidents in Khandwa and Chhindwara resigning their offices and non-officials being elected in their places. At Bhandara a Rate-payers' Association has been established and is reported to be working harmoniously with the Municipal Committee.

4. *Income.*—The total Municipal income, excluding Extraordinary and Debt heads, rose from Rs. 34,23,390 to Rs. 39,77,866; but excluding Government contributions, which amounted to Rs. 8,68,332, the real Municipal income rose from Rs. 27,76,325 to Rs. 31,09,534. The principal increase was under the heads "Octroi" (Rs. 1,00,523), "Conservancy" (Rs. 28,185), "Pounds" (Rs. 12,987), "Fees and Revenue from Markets and Slaughter-houses" (Rs. 15,783), "Contribution from Local Funds for Educational purposes" (Rs. 17,570), and "Miscellaneous" (Rs. 1,23,691), the bulk of the increase under the last head, namely, Rs. 1,01,588, representing the profits from the sale of salt at the depôts established by the Municipal Committees in the Nerbudda Division. The net receipts from Octroi rose from Rs. 8,00,763 to Rs. 9,01,286, refunds falling from Rs. 4,07,652 to Rs. 4,04,570. The increase in Octroi receipts was shared by most of the Municipal Committees, and was due to the revival of trade, to the abnormal rise in the price of cloth and other articles on which the duty is levied at *ad valorem* rates, and in Nagpur to the celebration of a large number of marriages, which necessitated special imports. In Saugor the net Octroi income fell from Rs. 64,644 to Rs. 56,050 against a budget estimate of Rs. 75,000. The estimate was pitched high in anticipation of the imposition of a terminal tax, which was, however, eventually postponed in view of the restrictions on railway traffic and the failure of crops in the district. In Hoshangabad, where the income had already declined considerably since the beginning of the war, there was a further loss of Rs. 3,000 on account of plague.

5. *Taxes other than Octroi.*—The total income from taxes other than Octroi rose from Rs. 11,24,307 to Rs. 11,73,899. The principal increase, amounting to Rs. 28,185, was under "Conservancy or latrine cess." This was due to large arrear collections in several Municipalities, to the collection of the tax for the first time in the Murtizapur Municipality, to the revision of rates in the Shegaon, Karanja and Malkapur Municipalities, and to fuller collections in Akola and Khamgaon. There was an increase of Rs. 18,431 in the income from the terminal tax. The income of the Amraoti Municipality from this tax increased from Rs. 42,004 to Rs. 70,400, while at Harda the income fell by about Rs. 6,500, owing to the shortage of waggons and the poorness of the crops. The case of this Municipality furnishes an illustration of the dangers of indirect taxation which falls partly upon the countryside. It was discovered that traders were evading the payment of the tax by booking their goods to and from the adjoining station of Timarni. This is said to have been stopped by the imposition of a tax on goods carried along the road between the two stations; but, as there is a market of considerable size at Timarni, to which cultivators and traders can resort, the measure seems to be of doubtful utility. At Wardha the income decreased from Rs. 31,193 to Rs. 24,558, mainly owing to suspensions of the usual railway traffic; and the Municipal Committee is considering the question of raising the rate of the tax. The tax was introduced in Betul and Murwara during the year, and proposals were received for the abolition of Octroi

in its favour in Khandwa and Saugor, and for its imposition in Mandla. In Khandwa, as in Saugor, the change was postponed chiefly owing to the suspension of railway traffic. The question with regard to Mandla is still under consideration. A memorandum of principles governing the imposition and collection of the tax was issued by the Government of India during the year, and the Central Provinces Municipal Act was amended so as to empower the Local Government to sanction the substitution of the tax for Octroi in places where the latter tax is in force. In Berar there was a marked decrease of Rs. 30,100 in the yield of the tax on professions and trades, due to the bad cotton crop. The all-round incidence of taxation rose in the Central Provinces from Rs. 2-3-11 to Rs. 2-7-2 and in Berar from Rs. 1-12-7 to Rs. 1-14-4.

6. *Income from Nazul and Special Acts, etc.*—Realizations under Special Acts fell from Rs. 1,39,561 to Rs. 1,38,907. The revenue derived from Municipal property and powers apart from taxation rose from Rs. 5,57,452 to Rs. 5,99,702. This is due to various causes, including the increase in the income from health camp plots during the plague epidemics at Nagpur, the auction for larger amounts of the right of fishing and water-nut cultivation in the tanks at Bhandara, keen competition at auctions in Harda and Khandwa, and the large income yielded by the ganj established at Betul. In the last-mentioned town the premia for leasehold rights of nazul land, which Government now allows the Committee to retain, brought in Rs. 2,556 in addition to the annual ground rent of Rs. 2,644. In Berar the income fell by Rs. 7,092. In Betul school fees show a decrease of about Rs. 1,100 owing to the transfer of four classes from the Anglo-Vernacular School to the Government High School. There was an increase from Rs. 3,022 to Rs. 4,069 under this head in Raipur, which is due to the extension of the Laurie Middle School. Receipts under fees and revenues from markets and slaughter-houses in the same Municipality increased by Rs. 4,201, the ganj takings having been increased owing to the shortage of waggons.

7. *Contributions.*—Government contributions rose from Rs. 6,47,065 to Rs. 8,68,332, and formed about 22 per cent of the total Municipal income against 19 per cent in the previous year. A sum of Rs. 5,22,144 represents grants for sanitary purposes, which included a grant of Rs. 1,70,735 to the Nagpur Municipality for the City and Craddock Town drainage schemes, sanitary improvements, repairs to the Ambajheri Reservoir, &c. Grants totalling Rs. 2,08,742 were made to the Damoh, Arvi, Akola and Harda Municipalities for water-works and the improvement of the water-supply. Rs. 14,237 was given to Bilaspur and Sausar for town improvements, Rs. 84,500 to Nagpur, Jubbulpore, Amraoti and Akola for miscellaneous sanitary improvements, Rs. 31,000 to Akola and Harda for drainage works, and Rs. 19,500 to Wardha and Shegaon for the relief of congestion. Indirect expenditure on sanitation amounted to Rs. 8,386, which included expenditure on the training at Bombay of candidates for the posts of Secretary and Sanitary Inspector. Grants for general purposes to Municipalities amounted to Rs. 70,474 against Rs. 42,377 in the previous year. The Arvi Municipality was given a special grant of Rs. 1,500 for the construction of a park. The Saugor Municipality received a grant of Rs. 10,000 to meet ordinary charges, as its financial position had suffered seriously owing to an outbreak of plague; and a special grant of Rs. 6,000 was paid to the Damoh Municipality to meet extra expenditure and loss of income due to the same cause. The Khamgaon Municipality received a grant of Rs. 5,239 to defray the cost of putting up pipe connections to Government offices. Educational grants, recurring and non-recurring, amounted to Rs. 2,69,714, as compared with Rs. 1,79,544, the former figure including special grants aggregating Rs. 50,000 for expenditure on primary school buildings.

8. *Loans.*—The amount advanced during the year was Rs. 1,74,400 against Rs. 3,21,000 in the previous year. Rs. 1,50,000 was advanced to Nagpur as the eighth instalment of the loan of eight lakhs sanctioned towards the Nagpur drainage scheme, and Rs. 5,000 represents the last instalment of the loan of Rs. 2,60,000 for the Akola water-works. A loan of Rs. 19,400 was

advanced to the Damoh Municipal Committee to meet expenditure in connection with the improved water-supply. Eighteen Municipalities and one Notified Area are now indebted to Government on account of loans for various purposes. The loans outstanding at the close of the year amounted to Rs. 28,91,701, of which Nagpur was responsible for Rs. 15,23,896 and Jubbulpore for Rs. 3,07,004. With the exception of Nagpur and Harda the finances of all towns which have taken loans are satisfactory. The financial position of Nagpur is far from sound, and the question of its improvement is under consideration. The same may be said of Harda, and the financial position of this town requires attention.

9. *General Financial Results.*—The total opening balance was Rs. 12,05,608. Receipts amounted to Rs. 44,94,343 and expenditure to Rs. 43,62,001, leaving a closing balance of Rs. 13,37,950, or Rs. 1,32,342 more than last year. The closing balances of all Municipalities, except Hinganghat and Pulgaon, were well over the prescribed minima. In most cases the balances are inflated either by Government grants which could not be spent during the year, or by the accumulation of reserves for specific objects or for works already in progress. The large surplus balance of the Nagpur Municipality is wholly earmarked for special objects, and is therefore not an indication of its true financial position. The Municipal Committee can with difficulty maintain its minimum balance. At Akola an increase of Rs. 18,000 was due to inability to spend money on works, the responsibility for which rests partly with the District Board Works Staff.

10. *Water-supply.*—The capital outlay on water-supply fell from Rs. 5,41,666 to Rs. 2,79,445. The Nagpur Municipal Committee spent Rs. 25,000 on laying mains, branch mains and stand-posts in the City and Craddock Town. A grant of Rs. 89,619 has been sanctioned towards meeting the cost of repairing and strengthening the embankment of the Ambajheri Reservoir, which threatened to burst in October 1917 and to submerge a portion of the Nagpur City. The investigation of the Panchdhara Gravitation Scheme for Wardha showed that the cost would be very much higher than was originally anticipated and would be beyond the means of this town. The water-works at Arvi and Akola were completed, and progress was made with those at Damoh. The water-supply at Seoni needs special attention, as the water is reported to contain bacteria and other impurities drained into the reservoir from the manure fields adjoining the catchment area. In Harda the water-works require minor improvements, and a grant for the purpose was given from Provincial Revenues last year; but, as the financial position of the Committee has been upset by the small receipts from the terminal tax, it has been allowed to divert the grant temporarily to general purposes. The scheme for the improvement of the water-supply at Khandwa, for which a grant of Rs. 30,000 was provided in the budget, is under preparation. A scheme for Chhindwara had to be postponed for lack of funds, and one for Shegaon was found to be beyond the means of the Committee.

11. *Drainage.*—The capital amounts expended on drainage totalled Rs. 2,80,680 against Rs. 1,80,498 last year. Of this the Nagpur drainage scheme is responsible for Rs. 2,51,320. The drainage system at Harda has been completed. The improvement of the two insanitary nullas at Akola and the drainage of the Ghut-Kula tank at Chanda were sanctioned during the year. The maintenance of the Wardha drainage works has been entrusted to Messrs. Lane Brown and Hewlett for a term of five years on payment of Rs. 1,750 per annum, towards which the Government makes an annual grant of Rs. 750. Drainage schemes for Khandwa and Burhanpur and several other Municipalities are under consideration.

12. *Conservancy and Sanitation.*—The expenditure on conservancy and sanitation amounted to Rs. 6,71,195 against Rs. 5,95,173. The increase was due to the grant of grain compensation allowances to, and the rise in the pay of, the conservancy staff, to the increase in the prices of conservancy appliances, and to the construction and repairs of public latrines

The Amraoti Town Municipal Committee received a special grant of Rs. 15,000 for removing congestion in the locality known as Bajaj; but, owing to the difficulty experienced in coming to terms with the owners of houses to be acquired, no portion of the grant was spent during the year. Negotiations are now complete, and a sum of Rs. 10,315 was spent after the close of the year. The Shegaon Municipality also received a grant of Rs. 4,500 at the end of the year for the removal of congestion. The scheme for the extension of the Amraoti Town was not taken up during the year. At Yeotmal the extension area towards the railway station was laid out, and the sale of plots began after the close of the year. The Municipal Committee of Akot also acquired land for building sites at a cost of Rs. 5,985 and a good many of the sites have already been sold. Since the revision of the Circular regarding vital statistics, most of the Municipal Committees in Berar have revised their rules. The scavenging-tax at Murtizapur and the revised scavenging rates at Shegaon and Malkapur came into force during the year. The expenditure on plague fell from Rs. 64,925 to Rs. 60,058.

13. *Education.*—The expenditure on education was Rs. 5,35,005 against Rs. 5,08,638 in the previous year. Most of the increase is due to larger expenditure on the construction of new buildings and the extension of existing ones.

14. *Notified Areas.*—The number of small towns administered as Notified Areas rose from 11 to 12, the town of Bamora in the Saugor District being declared a Notified Area with effect from the 1st January 1918. The town of Drug was raised to the status of a Municipality from the 1st April 1918. Similar proposals for Katol and Gondia were sanctioned during the year and detailed schemes in respect of both are being worked out. The total income of Notified Areas amounted to Rs. 1,54,713 and the expenditure to Rs. 1,56,859 against Rs. 1,30,693 and Rs. 1,19,293 respectively in the previous year. Of the increase in receipts Gondia is responsible for Rs. 12,783, which was obtained from the ganj tax, tolls on roads and educational grants. In Etawah the expenditure increased by Rs. 3,179 owing to the construction of a meat market and extension of the Vernacular Middle School. The Itarsi Notified Area Committee spent Rs. 2,000 in the collection of materials for the repairs of roads. The drainage scheme for this town, which is estimated to cost Rs. 50,000, was postponed till the end of the war, and of the amount reserved for it Rs. 15,000 was invested in the first Indian War Loan. The Anglo-Vernacular School building in Sohagpur has made good progress, and Rs. 6,564 was spent on it during the year.

15. *Notice of Services.*—The relations between the Municipal Committees and Government officers are everywhere reported to be good. The reports bring to notice the names of several gentlemen who have rendered good service on Municipal Committees, and the Chief Commissioner's thanks will be conveyed to them separately.

16. *General.*—The year was marked by an outbreak of plague in many of the Municipal towns, which, coupled with the war, was responsible for the dislocation of trade and a consequent loss of income. The high level of prices was keenly felt by all classes, particularly the poor. Owing to delays in the carriage by the railways of stocks covered by permits, great difficulty was experienced in keeping the bazar stocked with sufficient food-grains to meet the ordinary demands, and the margin of safety was on several occasions exceedingly small. Apart from this defect, the permit system has generally worked satisfactorily and has been an important factor in keeping under some control the prices of food-stuffs. The sacrifices demanded by war conditions increased rapidly in intensity, but were borne in a good spirit. Many Committees in the Jubbulpore, Berar and Nerbudda Divisions undertook the control and sale of salt, the price of which rose rapidly towards the end of the year, and their efforts were generally successful in keeping the price within reasonable limits.

ORDER.—Ordered that a copy of this Resolution be submitted to the Government of India in the Department of Education; that copies be forwarded to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for information and guidance; and that it be translated and circulated (through Deputy Commissioners) for the information and guidance of all Municipal members.

Ordered, also, that the Resolution be published in the Supplement to the *Central Provinces Gazette*.
