Famine.—In 1896-97 some relief measures were necessary owing to a partial crop failure due to an insufficient rainfall. The maximum daily average number relieved, however, was only 2,139 in October 1896. The works remained open for 14 months. Two works of ractal-breaking were opened in September 1897 for the Alibag-Campoli and Dharamtar-Mahad Roads. The total amount expended on these works amounted to Rs. 2,732. Rs. 55,120 were advanced under the Land Improvement Loans Act and Rs. 16,114 under the Agriculturists' Loans Act. The total expenditure incurred on famine relief amounted to Rs. 11,639, of which Rs. 3,152 were advanced from Local Funds.

Plague.—Plague established itself in the district in an indigenous form in the beginning of February 1897, when Panvel and Uran were attacked. It then spread throughout the district. The infection was due to cases imported from Bombay. The total mortality on account

of plague up to the end of 1921-22 was 12,838 or 2·2 per cent. of the total population :—

Thus the Survey Settlement showed an increase in area of 41,021 acres and enhanced the revenue by Rs. 5,277. The State forests covering an area of 44,944 acres have been divided into 30 blocks and annual receipts of over rupees one lac are derived from them. Unarable land amounts to 128,902 acres and arable to 26,806, of which the culturable waste is 623 acres. The principal crops are rice (24,671 acres), cocoanuts and betelnuts (1,512). Skilled artisans are paid annas 12 to Rs. 1-8-0 per day, and unskilled labourers earn 8 to 10 annas per day. Tagavi advances made during the last eleven years are :—

Famine.—In 1899-1900 the crops in several villages failed on account of the scanty rainfall. The grain in stock in the State was insufficient to meet local requirements. Prices rose and distress followed among the poorest classes. Works were undertaken to give employment to those affected. The total amount expended on these works was Rs. 85,862 or nearly Rs. 14,500 above the ordinary State expenditure. Gratuitous relief to the extent of Rs. 2,000 was given to the non-working children, invalids, etc. Remission of Land Revenue to the amount of Rs. 36,750 was granted and Tagavi was advanced to the extent of Rs. 7,000. Cheap grain shops were also open. Seven hundred and three persons out of those in distress in Jafarabad were brought into the State for employments and about 185,940 lbs. of grass was sent to Jafarabad for the use of the cattle there. Relief measures were continued till the harvest in 1900-01. The total expenditure in the year 1900-01 amounted to Rs. 24,172, out of which Rs. 1,200 were given to non-working children, invalids, etc. The average total number of persons on relief was 931, of whom 641 belonged to Jafarabad in Kathiawar.

Plague.—After the Cholera, which carried off over 500 persons between the months of April and August 1896, three cases of bubonic plague were recorded in December of the same year. Plague assumed epidemic form in April 1897, and has caused over 2,000 deaths since :—

General.—The Military Force consists of 24 infantry, 13 gunners and 200 irregulars, in all 237. They are Sidi Sardars, Habshi Bhaibands, Janjirkars and Chhorwads and are employed as guards and escorts. The total cost of maintaining the force is about Rs. 37,000. The Janjira Imperial Service Signalling Units were disbanded in April 1917 as they were found unfit for active service. The Police numbers 150 at an annual cost of Rs. 25,000. There is a Central Jail at Murud with a daily average of 15 prisoners, and maintained at an annual cost of Rs. 2,065. The State has a revenue of over Rs. 20,000 derived from Salt. The annual sale of Salt amounts to over 12,000 maunds. Opium is purchased from British Government. The annual requirements are over 150 pounds. The Abkari system is the same as in the Bagayat portion of the Alibag Taluka in Kolaba District. The heads of the realizations in 1921-1922 were as under :—
