## ADMINISTRATION REPORT

OF THE

## SALT DEPARTMENT

### MADRAS PRESIDENCY

FOR

1926-1927.

#### CHAPTER I.

#### Administration.

The year under review is the third year of the existence of the Salt Department after its separation from 'Excise.' It was found necessary during the year to relieve the Secretary to the Collector of Salt Revenue of his additional appointment of Assistant Commissioner, Central Division, and to appoint a full time Assistant Commissioner for that Division. In consequence an additional Assistant Commissioner's post was created from 1st October 1926. The new Assistant Commissioner was placed in charge of the Central Division and the Secretary to the Collector relieved of his duties as Assistant Commissioner with effect from the same date. Simultaneously the territorial jurisdiction of the Assistant Commissioners, Central and Northern Divisions, was altered by the transfer of the Krishnapatnam Circle from the Northern to the Central Division. With effect from the same date, the Preventive Circle with its head-quarters at Coimbatore, was abolished and in the place of the Preventive Inspector two permanent Assistant Inspectors for preventive duty with head-quarters at Coimbatore and Cannanore were employed. The Preventive Assistant Inspector stationed at Coimbatore was placed under the direct control of the Assistant Commissioner, Central Division, and the Assistant Inspector at Cannanore under the control of the Assistant Commissioner, Southern Division.

During the year the Government of India were pleased to declare the Collector of Salt Revenue as "Head of the Department" under rule 2(10) of the Supplementary Rules framed by them. In addition to these changes, the chief administrative changes made during the year were:—

- (1) The closure of the Surla Factory in the Ganjam District on 1st December 1926 and the surrender of the establishment sanctioned for the factory with effect from the same date.
- (2) The conversion of the monopoly block (Extension I) of the Penuguduru Factory into Modified Excise from the season of 1927.
- (3) The bifurcation of the Chinnaganjam Factory into Chinnaganjam North and Chinnaganjam South Factories, each in charge of an Assistant Inspector.
- (4) The conversion of the monopoly block in the Vedaranniyam factory and of Sarahad No. I of the Karambalam factory into Modified Excise from 1st January 1927.
- (5) The introduction of revised rules for the control of the Saltpetre industry in the Presidency on the basis of the system obtaining in Northern India.
- (6) The extension of the concession of the export of salt under bond by rail to Calcutta which had been enjoyed by the factories in the Ganjam District other than Calingapatam, to all the factories in the Presidency.
- (7) The extension of the principle of making the charge of an Assistant Inspector a separate factory to the cases of the Naupada, Krishnapatnam and Adirampatnam factories.
- (8) The transfer of control of the Theethandathanam Sub-Port from the Salt to the Customs Department.
- 2. Personnel.-Mr. C. H. Masterman, I.C.S., was in charge of the department up to 28th February 1927, when, he proceeded on leave. Mr. L. K. Fearon officiated for him for about three weeks from 1st March and was succeeded by Mr. J. B. Brown, I.C.S., who took charge on 23rd March 1927 and continued to officiate till the end of the year. Mr. E. W. Truter was Secretary to the Collector of Salt Revenue throughout the year except for a period of six weeks from 4th January 1927 when Mr. W. G. Baldrey acted for him. Mr. P. V. Rangaswami Ayyangar held the post of Assistant Commissioner, Northern Division, till the end of June 1926 when he retired and was succeeded by Mr. H. L. Prager. On 29th September 1926, Mr. Prager was relieved by Mr. W. G. Baldrey who continued to officiate till the return of Mr. L. K. Fearon from leave on 6th November 1926. For the period from 24th February 1927 to 31st March 1927 Mr. Baldrey was again in charge of the Northern Division. The Central Division continued to be a combined charge under the Secretary to the Collector of Salt Revenue and Assistant Commissioner, Central Division, till a separate Assistant Commissioner was sanctioned for it from 1st October 1926 and Mr. Prager was appointed to the new post. Mr. B. M. Marriott was in charge of the Southern Division throughout the year.

#### CHAPTER II.

#### Establishment.

- 3. In the light of the experience gained in working the separate department since its formation a re-distribution of the subordinate executive and clerical establishments in the several factories and offices was effected during the year. The principal alterations in the total sanctioned strength resulted from the substitution of permanent Assistant Inspectors at the Naupada, Chinnaganjam, Krishnapatnam and Adirampatnam factories for the temporary Assistant Inspectors sanctioned for them. This change was necessitated by the division of each of these factories into two or more separate units, each in charge of an Assistant Inspector. Appendix A shows the sanctioned strength of the establishment. There was an increase of 168 men and a decrease of 447 men resulting in a net decrease of 279 men. The decrease is chiefly due to the revision and re-distribution of establishments, especially Petty Officers and peons, which was sanctioned by the Central Board of Revenue in its R. Dis. No. 487-Salt, dated 2nd November 1926 and partly to the surrender of the staff in the Surla and Karasa factories which were closed.
- 4. Punishments.—The total number of punishments imposed on officers of the department was 350 (319) and the percentage of punishments to the total strength was 10·32 (8·69). The majority of the punishments related to fines and stoppages of pay imposed on the menial establishment for absence without leave or for sleeping while on guard duty, and, in a few cases, for disobedience of orders.
  - 5. Resignations.—Fifteen peons resigned their appointments.

#### CHAPTER III.

#### Manufacture.

6. The season of 1926 was on the whole favourable for salt manufacture. In view of the failure of manufacture in the previous two seasons and the low stock of salt at the beginning of October 1925 special steps were taken to begin manufacture in the 1926 season at the earliest possible date in each factory and to work all cultivable holdings to their full extent. These efforts, aided by favourable conditions, produced successful results in almost all the factories in the Presidency. In a few isolated cases, namely, at the Sumadi factory in the Ganjam District, at Tada in the Nellore District and at Thambikkottai and Adirampatnam in the Tanjore District manufacture was interrupted by rains. At Sumadi it was a practical failure owing to intermittent rains. At Tada it had to be stopped in August owing to a heavy downpour in that month. At Thambikkottai and Adirampatnam it was a partial failure owing to intermittent rains in the months of May to July 1926. Monopoly

factories also were worked to their full capacity during the year. At the Chinnaganjam monopoly factory the output was increased by 2.75 lakhs of maunds over that of the previous year by granting an enhanced rate of kudivaram on all salt stored up to 30th June 1926, while at Ennore the dittam which had been originally fixed at 15 lakhs of maunds was subsequently raised to 20 lakhs of maunds and the quantity actually stored was 18.34 lakhs of maunds against 9.72 lakhs of maunds in the previous year. The result of these measures was an increase in stocks at the end of the year by 11½ lakhs of maunds over the stocks at the corresponding date in the previous year.

7. The quantity of salt manufactured in the year was 131 lakhs of maunds or 392 lakks of maunds more than the quantity produced in 1925. Of this quantity nearly 30 lakhs of maunds belonged to Government and the balance to the licensees. The stock on hand at the beginning of the year was 46\frac{3}{4} lakhs of maunds and the quantity imported during the year, mainly from Bombay, was 173 lakhs of maunds. The total stock of salt available for consumption was therefore 195½ lakhs of maunds. The quantity issued during the year amounted to nearly 136 lakhs of maunds as against  $137\frac{1}{2}$  lakhs of maunds in 1925-1926. The decrease in issues is slight. Excluding the years 1922-1923 and 1924-1925 when the removals were abnormally large owing to an apprehension of enhancement in the salt duty in the former year and the replenishing of stocks by the merchants in the latter year as a result of restricted removals in 1923-24 the average issues in the three years 1921-1922, 1923-1924 and 1925-1926 were 136 lakhs of maunds. The average for the five years ending with 1921-1922 was 134 lakhs of maunds. The issues during the year under review therefore represent nearly the normal demand. The stock of salt at the end of the year was 58 lakhs of maunds as against 47 lakhs of maunds at the end of 1925-1926. The ascertained wastage in the year was 11 lakhs of maunds as against 4 lakhs of maunds in the previous year. The low wastage is due to the very small stock of old salt at the beginning of the year and the higher percentage of new season's salt removed by the merchants.

Steps have been taken to increase the output of salt in the current season also by commencing manufacture early and by requiring licensees to exercise due diligence in manufacture.

8. During the year under report orders were received directing the closure of the Surla factory. As there had been no manufacture in the factory for several years and no stock of salt at the factory there was no difficulty in giving immediate effect to the orders of closure. Mention was made in last year's report of the re-opening of the Veppalodai factory and of the extension of time granted for removal of salt in the Muthuraghunathapatnam factory. The lessee of the former factory is working it in the current season and the time for removal of salt from the latter factory has been extended up to 31st December 1927 as it was found that there was still a large stock of salt at that factory and that the cost of its destruction would be prohibitive. In the new Modified

Excise Extensions opened at Balacheruvu and Iskapalle in the early part of the 1926 season nearly three-fourths of the area of the former and almost the entire area of the latter had been brought under cultivation at the end of 1926-1927. Not much progress in manufacture, however, was made in the Balacheruvu extension in the year under review as it was the first year of working and the lessee had to devote his time to the construction of the necessary works. The lessee has however done well in the current season. Towards the close of the year the Maharaja of Venkatagiri, the lessee of the Modified Excise Extensions in the Tada factory relinquished extensions III and IV (about 34 acres). During the year two new extensions under the Modified Excise system, one of about 116 acres at Chinnaganjam and the other of about 42 acres at Krishnapatnam were opened. Nearly 34 acres of the former and 20 acres of the latter extension have been brought under cultivation in 1926.

- 9. The policy of the department in reserving Government stocks only in localities where conditions as to stocks and prices rendered it necessary was continued in the year under review. Manufacture under the monopoly system was permitted at Calingapatam, Polavaram, Guruzanapalle Extension I, Chinnaganjam, Ennore factories, Karambalam and Kattumavadi and a quantity of  $27\frac{1}{2}$  lakhs of maunds was stored. The right of Government to purchase salt from Modified Excise licensees at a fixed rate of kudivaram was exercised in several of the factories north of Madras, namely Gokurkudda, Sumadi, Pundi, Naupada, Badjanapara, Balacheruvu, Guruzanapalle, Chinnaganjam and Iskapalle, as owing to low stocks at the beginning of the year the excise prices tended to rise unduly in these factories. The quantity purchased from the Modified Excise licensees was 2,39,125 maunds against 42,000 maunds in the previous year. The sanction of the Central Board of Revenue has been obtained to work Guruzanapalle Extension I, Sarahad No. I of the Karambalam factory and the monopoly block in the Vedaranniyam factory under the Modified Excise system from 1st January 1927.
- 10. The quantity of salt removed under the bag storage system during the year was nearly 36 (28) lakes of maunds or 33.6 per cent. of the total sales for Home and Inland Consumption. The system of bag storage has been abolished in the current year.
- 11. The wholesale prices of excise salt increased on the average from 4 annas 11 pies in 1925-1926 to 5 annas in 1926-27. There was a decrease in the case of Government salt, the average price being 6 annas 1 pie (6 annas 3 pies). The increase in the average excise prices was marked in the Ganjam, Naupada and Penuguduru Circles and it was soldly due to the very low stocks at the beginning of the year. The prices came down gradually as the stock of Government salt manufactured in monopoly factories and purchased from Modified Excise licensees was put up for sale. The issues of Government salt had to be restricted and the salt sold in auction in the Sumadi, Calingapatam and

Polavaram factories during the first part of the year. This accounts for the increase in the price of Government salt in these factories over the Presidency average for 1926-1927. The Central Board of Revenue has recently prescribed revised instructions for the calculation of the financial results of the working of monopoly factories and for regulating the prices at which Government salt should be issued. The existing form of Appendix J has been split up into three parts,—J (1), J (2) and J (3)—and the Appendix has been prepared in accordance with the above orders. The transactions in 1926-1927 resulted in a loss only in the Vedaranniyam and Manakkudi factories.

The retail prices at the head-quarter stations varied on the average from 1 anna 1·2 pies to 2 annas 3·1 pies a Madras measure of 120 tolas. The prices in 1925-1926 were higher and ranged from 1 anna 1·9 pies to 2 annas 5·4 pies a Madras measure. The price exceeded 2 annas a Madras measure only in the Vizagapatam District and in the Nilgiris.

12. In connection with the high retail prices at Vizagapatam mention was made in last year's report of the preference shown by the local consumer for the reddish brown salt of the Balacheruvu factory and of the arrangements made for increasing the output of salt at this centre. This expectation has been to some extent realised: The output at Balacheruvu in the year under review was 1,48,178 maunds against 5,892 maunds in the previous year and the average retail price at Vizagapatam was 2 annas 3·1 pies against 2 annas 5·4 pies a Madras measure in the previous year.

#### CHAPTER IV.

#### Distribution and Consumption.

13. The total quantity of salt issued from the salt factories for ordinary consumption during the year under report was 11,742,319 (11,783,758) maunds. Of this quantity 64,310 (63,510) maunds were issued to the French Government, 414,286 (501,214) maunds to the Travancore Durbar, 141,104 (255,888) maunds to the Fisheries Department and 448,114 (385,410) maunds were exported by sea to Colombo. The balance of 10,674,505 (10,577,736) maunds was distributed by rail or road for ordinary consumption in the areas usually supplied, viz., the Madras Presidency and the Indian States within its borders, part of Behar and Orissa, the Central Provinces, the Nizam's Dominions, Mysore and Coorg. The supply from local sources to areas within the Presidency was supplemented by 1,389,509 (1,553,893) maunds imported by sea mainly from Bombay into the West Coast districts and 385,506 (333,078) maunds imported from Bombay and Goa by rail. From the same sources 651,479 (658,249) maunds were imported by rail into My-The imports by sea into South Kanara and Malabar show a decrease since the year 1924-1925. The decrease is chiefly due to the import of an exceptionally large quantity of 18.78 lakhs of maunds in 1924-1925 and to a small extent due to replacement of Bombay salt by Madras (Tuticorin) salt.

14. During the year there was no export of salt to Calcutta under bond either by sea or by rail though steps were taken to stimulate the licensees and merchants by extending the concession of export to Calcutta under bond by rail which had been restricted to the factories in the Ganjam District except Calingapatam, to all the factories in the Presidency.

Owing to the dearth of salt in Ceylon during the year, the exports to that country show an increase of about 62,700 maunds over the figures

of the previous year.

15. Appendix G shows the salt traffic in the Madras Presidency as far as it can be ascertained from the railway and sea customs returns corrected by the factory declarations. It is noticeable that the salt of the Tuticorin factories has begun to compete in the interior districts of the Presidency, notably in South Arcot, Tanjore, Coimbatore and the Nilgiris which were hitherto supplied largely from the factories situated in the Tanjore and South Arcot districts. The preference for

the Tuticorin salt is due to its lightness and low selling price.

The quantities consigned to Bengal, Central Provinces and the Nizam's Dominions decreased from 16,136; 134,939; 166,250 maunds in 1925-1926 to 15,185; 85,668; 136,998 maunds in the year, while the quantity consigned to Orissa increased from 791,758 maunds to 966,550 maunds in the year under review. The demand from the Central Provinces is usually met partly from the Ganjam and partly from the Vizagapatam district. Owing to the closure of Karasa in 1925-1926 and the low stock of salt in the factories of the Vizagapatam district at the beginning of 1926 there has been no export of salt from this district to the Central Provinces during the year under review. This accounts for the decrease in the removals to Central Provinces. The decrease in removals to the Nizam's Dominions is due to the preference for Bombay salt in that centre. Orissa gets its supply entirely from the Ganjam District and the increase in removals to that Province during the year is due to the fact that the quantities removed in the previous year 1925-1926 were below the normal owing to low stocks in the factories of the Ganjam district in that year.

16. The consumption of salt per head of population in the year under report was 20 lbs. against 20 20 lbs. in 1925-1926 and 21 84 lbs. in 1924-1925.

#### CHAPTER V.

#### Revenue and Expenditure.

17. The total receipts on account of Salt Revenue were Rs. 143·12 (147·71) lakhs. The fall in the revenue compared with the revenue.

realised in 1925-1926 is due chiefly to the decrease in sales during the year ending 30th September 1926. The sales are mostly on the credit system under which duty is payable six months after the date of issue of the credit order. The refunds during the year amounted to Rs. 10,605 (12,124).

- 18. Of the total revenue Rs. 15.45 lakhs represents the duty and the cost price realised in cash, Rs. 124.57 lakhs the duty on salt sold on credit and the balance of Rs. 3.10 lakhs customs duty, cess and fines. The percentage of issues of salt under the credit system was 94.5 (93.6).
- 19. Charges.—The total charges amounted to Rs. 20·40 lakhs of which Rs. 10·40 lakhs were the recurring charges for establishments, supplies, services and contingencies of the Department and Rs. 10·00 lakhs charges for the purchase, transport and storage of salt and the recoverable charges on account of excise licensees' works. The charges in 1926-1927 were on a par with the charges in the previous year except under (1) "Purchase of Salt Manufacturers' share" (2) "Conveying and Storing salt" and (3) "Miscellaneous." The increased expenditure under items (1) and (2) was due to the necessity of securing a large stock of salt in the monopoly factories owing to the failure of manufacture in the two previous years. The decrease in expenditure under item (3) "Miscellaneous" was due to decrease under payments by way of compensation to licensees of closed factories.

#### CHAPTER VI.

#### Measures for the protection of the Revenue.

- 20. Appendix K shows the number of salt cases reported and the action taken on them. There was an increase of about 10 per cent. in the number of cases reported. The increase occurs chiefly in the Ganjam, Naupada, Chinnaganjam and Cheyur Circles and in the Salt Preventive areas under the charge of the Assistant Inspectors, West Coast and Coimbatore and is due to more efficient supervision of the swamps and saline areas. It is noticeable that there has been a considerable increase in cases of possession of earth salt in the Preventive area under the jurisdiction of the Assistant Inspector, Coimbatore and this fact indicates that illicit manufacture of salt from salt earth is still rife especially in the interior parts of the Trichinopoly District.
- 21. The total number of offences reported (inclusive of undetected cases and undetected scrapings) was 159 (143). The offenders were traced in 151 cases of which 125 cases were sent up for trial. No cases were pending with the Magistracy at the beginning of the year. Convictions were obtained in 119 cases and the remaining 6 cases were pending with the Magistracy at the end of the year. Of the cases traced, 133 cases related to possession of illicit salt or salt earth or to the manufacture of salt by illicit means and the rest to minor offences. The

quantity of contraband salt and salt earth involved was 42 maunds. The average duration of enquiry into cases by Inspectors and Assistant Inspectors was 7.74 (6.48) days.

#### CHAPTER VII.

#### Miscellaneous.

- 22. Saltpetre.—Reference has been made to the introduction during the year of the system adopted in Northern India for the regulation of the saltpetre industry. Under this system a single license is issued for the manufacture of both crude and refined saltpetre and the licensee is left free to dispose of the educed salt. The number of licenses issued from 1st January 1927 the date on which the new rules were brought into force to 31st March 1927 was 72 and the quantity of saltpetre produced during that period was 690 maunds. It was expected at the time of the introduction of the new system that very little of the educed salt would pass into human consumption. It was however ascertained that nearly 373 maunds of educed salt had been issued for human consumption during the year. It has been found on enquiry that this salt is subjected to a cleaning process before it is offered for sale and that it has had no harmful effect on the consumers. Steps are being taken to have samples of this salt analysed periodically, and the result will be watched.
- 23. Amenities.—During the year the departmental elementary schools at the Kanuparti, Chinnaganjam, Krishnapatnam, Iskapalle, Voyalur and Neidavasal factories were closed and schools were opened at the Humma and Polavaram factories. Tennis and badminton courts exist in most of the factories for the recreation of the staff.
- 24. The work of the officers of the Department has been satisfactory on the whole.
