PREFACE TO THE FIRST EDITION.

The object of this Compilation is to bring together the Rules and Orders which have been made, from time to time, under Acts of the Government of India and of the Government of Bombay, chiefly dealt with by the Judicial Department, and which are scattered throughout the *Government Gazettes* of years. Where additions and amendments have been made to any of the Rules and Orders by subsequent Notifications, the Rules and Orders are printed with the additions and amendments, and references made to the amending Notifications. The Rules and Orders contained in this Compilation have been prepared and corrected up to 31st December 1891.

2. To facilitate reference, the Compilation is divided into Chapters and a heading indicating contents has been given to each Notification. In addition to a General Table of Contents prefixed to the book, an Alphabetical Index and an Index of Sections have been given at the end. In some cases, Resolutions of Government having an important bearing on the Rules and Orders have been quoted.

3. The Compilation is printed half-marginally to enable officers to make such alterations and amendments as may from time to time be necessary.

In preparing the revised edition of this Compilation an attempt has been made to condense it, as far as possible, by massing, according to the alphabetical order of Districts, formal Notifications issued under the Bombay Gambling Act and the Bombay District Police Act, and grouping together Notifications issued under the same sections of an Act. The Rules and Orders contained in the Compilation have been corrected up to 31st December 1901.
