In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 1 of the Bombay Anatomy Act, 1949 (Bom. XI of 1949), the Government of Bombay is pleased to direct that the provisions of sections 2 to 10 (both inclusive) of the said Act shall come into force in the areas stated below with effect from 1st July 1950 :—

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 10 of the Bombay Anatomy Act, 1949 (Bom. XI of 1949), the Government of Bombay is pleased to make the following rules :--

1. The near relative of the deceased person shall claim the body within two days from the date of the death of the deceased person excluding the day on which the death takes place :

Provided that, if in the opinion of the authority in charge of the hospital or prison, there are good and sufficient reasons for believing that the dead body is likely to be claimed by a near relative of the deceased person, it may keep the dead body in its possession for a further period of two days.

2. If any of the approved institutions does not require the dead body for the anatomical examination and dissection, the authorised officer of the place shall dispose of the dead body by cremation or burial, as the case may be.

In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to clause (17) of section 2 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), and in supersession of Government Notification in the Revenue Department, No. 522, dated the 25th February 1921, the Government of Bombay is pleased to declare that the following descriptions of country liquor shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be deemed to be foreign liquor, namely:—

(1) Perfumed spirits, essences of whisky, rum and brandy, denatured spirits and drugs, medicines and chemicals containing spirit;

(2) Methyl alcohol, Amyl alcohol, Butyl alcohol, Capryl alcohol, Propyl alcohol, and Fusel oil;

(3) Grape liquor and Malt liquor;

(4) All other liquors such as ale, \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, wines, medicated and tonic wines, spirits of wine, rectified spirits, absolute alcohol, brandy, whisky, rum, gin and ginger-wine, which are certified by the Chemical Analyser to the Government of Bombay as having the same properties as those possessed by the liquors of the corresponding descriptions imported from foreign countries, and which are liable to duty at the same special rates as those prescribed in the First Schedule to the Indian Tariff Act, 1934 (XXXII of 1934) or at such special rates as may be prescribed by Government under section 105 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949); and

(5) All liquid medical preparations containing self-generated alcohol prepared by a process of fermentation—whether known by the name of 'drakshasava', 'asava', 'arishta', 'kadha'; or by any other Ayurvedic appellation.

If for any reason the Collector shall order the withdrawal of any *nokarnama* issued by the licensee, the *nokarnama* shall be forthwith withdrawn. No *nokarnama* shall be issued to any person under 18 years of age and no such *nokarnama*, if issued, shall be valid.

3. The licensee shall display the licence at a conspicuous place in the shop.

4. (1) The licensee shall keep correct accounts from day to day showing the quantities of rotten gur or/and rotten dates received, sold and held in balance at the shop. The account shall be so written as to show sales to licensed dealers and the persons other than such dealers, separately.

(2) The licensee shall also maintain a register of purchasers wherein he shall enter under his signature full names and addresses of purchasers, the date of sale and the quantities of rotten gur or/and rotten dates sold to them and the purpose for which they were sold.

5. The shop, the stock of rotten gur or/and rotten dates kept therein and the accounts and the register of purchasers maintained under clause 4 shall be open to inspection by the Collector, Prohibition Officer not lower in rank than a Sub-Inspector of Excise or any Prohibition Officer deputed by the Collector to inspect the same.

6. The licensee shall, when called upon by any Officer on inspection under clause 5, give an explanation in writing regarding any irregularity detected at the shop. He shall also allow him to take samples of rotten gur or/and rotten dates for analysis, free of cost.

7. The licensee shall maintain at the shop a visit book, paged and stamped with the seal of the Collector, in which visiting officers may record their remarks.

8. The licensee, his heirs, legal representatives or assigns shall have no claim whatsoever, to the continuance or renewal of the licence after the expiry of the period for which it is granted. It is entirely within the discretion of the Collector, whether to permit or not the assignee of the licensee in case of sale or transfer, or the heir or legal representative of the licensee in case of death, to have the benefit of the licence for the unexpired portion of the term for which it is granted.

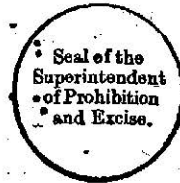

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 143 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), the Government of Bombay is pleased to make the following rule, namely :—

The form of pass for the transport of foreign liquor from a depot established under the Bombay Foreign Liquor Rules, 1950, to the premises of a person holding a permit, other than a tourist interim permit or an emergency permit, under the said rules, shall be in the Form hereto annexed.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 143 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), and all other powers enabling it in this behalf, the Government of Bombay is pleased to make the following rules, namely :—

1. *Title*.—These rules may be called the Bombay Foreign Liquor Rules, 1950.

2. *Extent and commencement*.—(1) These rules shall extend to the whole of the State of Bombay.

(2) They shall come into force on the 6th April 1950.

Provided that such of the provisions of these rules as relate to the making of applications for licences, or permits and making inquiries in connection therewith and the grant of such licences and permits shall come into force immediately.

3. *Definitions*.—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

(1) " Act " means the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 ;

(2) " Club Licensee " means a person holding a club licence under these rules ;

(3) " Duty-paid foreign liquor " means foreign liquor on which—

(i) duty leviable under the Indian Tariff Act, 1934, or the Sea Customs Act, 1878, or

(ii) the excise or countervailing duty under the Act has been paid and includes foreign liquor which is exempted from such duty ;

(4) " excise supervision " means the supervision of the members of the staff of the Prohibition and Excise Department appointed in that behalf by a competent authority ;

(5) [*Deleted*.]

(6) (1) " foreign liquor " means potable duty paid foreign liquor of the following kinds, namely :—

(i) spirits,

(ii) wines, and

(iii) fermented liquors ;

(2) (a) " spirits " means brandy, whisky, rum, gin, liqueurs and milk punch ;

(b) " wines " means champagne, port, vermouth and sherry ;

(c) " fermented liquors " means ale, beer, porter and cider.

- (7) " Form " means a form appended to these rules ;
- (8) " hotel licensee " means a person holding a hotel licence under these rules ;
- (9) " licence " means a licence granted under these rules ;
- (10) " licensed premises " means premises in respect of which a licence has been issued under these rules ;
- (11) " licensee " means a person who has been granted a licence under these rules ;
- (12) " Permit " means a permit granted under these rules ;
- (12A) " temporary resident " means a person falling under clause (c) of subsection (1) of section 40 of the Act ;
- (13) " Trade and Import licensee " means a person holding a Trade and Import licence under rule 5 ;
- (14) " Sale by wholesale " means sale to licensed retailers or wholesalers ;
- (15) " unit " means the quantity of foreign liquor equivalent to (i) one quart bottle of spirits, (ii) or three quart bottles of wines or (iii) nine quart bottles of fermented liquors of a strength exceeding 2 per cent. of alcohol by volume or (iv) 27 quart bottles of fermented liquors of a strength not exceeding 2 per cent. of alcohol by volume ;
- (16) words and expressions not defined in these rules shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

#### PART I.—*Foreign Liquor Trade and Import Licence.*

4. *Application for licence.*—Any person desiring to import and to sell by wholesale foreign liquor shall apply to the Collector for a trade and import licence in that behalf. The application shall contain the following particulars, namely :—

- (i) Name and address of the applicant.
- (ii) Location of the shop or premises where he wants to sell foreign liquor, with census No. of the house or building, name of street, city, town, or village, as the case may be.
- (iii) Whether any foreign liquor was sold at such shop or premises in the past and if so the period during which it was sold.
- (iv) Whether the applicant held any trade and import licence in the past ; and if so, the year and period during which it was held.

5. *Grant of licence.*—On receipt of the application, the Collector may make inquiries for verification of the details stated in the application and also such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If he is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the licence applied for, he may with the previous sanction of the State Government grant the applicant a licence in form F. L. I on payment of such fee and of such deposit as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act.

6. *Duration of licence.*—No licence in form F. L. I shall be granted for a period beyond the 31st of March next following the date of the commencement of the licence and in no case shall such licence be granted for a period exceeding one year.

7. *Kinds of foreign liquor authorised to be imported and removed from customs frontier, etc.*—The Trade and Import licensee shall not remove from the customs frontier or import or sell any liquor other than foreign liquor.



8. *Removal from Custom House, etc.—No foreign liquor—*

(i) brought into the Port of Bombay, or  
 (ii) imported into the State of Bombay from any other part of India, or  
 (iii) manufactured in the State of Bombay, shall be transported by any trade and import licensee from any place in the State of Bombay to his licensed premises or his warehouse except under a transport pass issued by an officer duly authorised in this behalf and on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act.

9. *What foreign liquor shall not be kept or sold.*—A trade and import licensee shall not keep in his licensed premises or in his warehouse, any foreign liquor which has not been lawfully removed from a customs frontier or which has not been lawfully imported or transported.

10. *Sale of foreign liquor.*—(1) (a) A trade and import licensee shall exhibit at his licensed premises a list, supplied by the Director from time to time, showing the names and address of persons holding licences for the sale of foreign liquor.

(b) Such licensee shall not sell foreign liquor stocked by him to any person in the State of Bombay unless such person holds a licence for the sale of foreign liquor and produces a transport pass issued by an Officer duly authorised in that behalf.

(2) A trade and import licensee shall not sell foreign liquor to any person outside the State of Bombay except with the permission of the Collector. No such sale shall be effected unless the licensee is satisfied that the export of the liquor is covered by a valid export pass.

(3) A trade and import licensee may with the special permission of the Collector sell foreign liquor out of his stock in Customs bond to a ship going abroad provided that the person in charge of such ship produces a valid transport pass.

(4) A trade and import licensee may sell foreign liquor to persons referred to in section 41 of the Act out of his stock in Customs Bond provided that they hold special permits under the said section and produce a valid transport pass.

(5) A trade and import licensee may supply foreign liquor to any depot referred to in rule 24 provided that the depot keeper produces a valid transport pass.

(6) The price at which the licensee shall supply foreign liquor shall not exceed the maximum price fixed by the Director under the Act.

11. *Foreign liquor bottles to be banded.*—No bottle containing foreign liquor shall be sold to any person for consumption in the State unless it is banded in such manner as the Director may, from time to time, direct.

12. *No drinking in licensed premises.*—A trade and import licensee shall not permit any foreign liquor to be drunk in the licensed premises or in his warehouse or any premises connected therewith that may be in his occupation or under his control.

13. *Racking, etc., not permitted.*—No foreign liquor shall be racked, bottled, blended, reduced, flavoured or coloured by a trade and import licensee, except in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder.

14. *Adulterated and spurious foreign liquor not allowed.*—No trade and import licensee shall adulterate or deteriorate any foreign liquor or keep in his licensed premises or warehouse or sell any foreign liquor knowing it to have been adulterated or deteriorated. He shall also not keep or sell spurious foreign liquor of any kind.

15. *Sale of foreign liquor prohibited in certain cases.*—The licensed premises of a trade and import licensee shall not be kept open on such days and during such period as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act, nor shall any foreign liquor be sold to any person on such days and during such period.

16. *Transactions under excise supervision.*—(1) All transactions pertaining to receipt, transport, storage and sale of foreign liquor shall be carried out under the excise supervision;

(2) Except with the special permission of the Collector, no such transactions shall be carried out on Sundays and public holidays notified under section 25 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881.

17. *Appointment of staff for excise supervision.*—The Collector may appoint such excise staff at the licensed premises for excise supervision as he deems necessary.

18. *Combination of other business not permitted.*—The trade and import licensee shall not in any case combine the business of sale of foreign liquor with any other business in the same premises.

19. *Foreign liquor to be sold in sealed bottles, etc.*—Foreign liquor shall not, save with the permission of the Director, be kept or sold by a trade and import licensee except in full corked bottles, sealed or capsuled.

20. *Excise escort for conveyance of foreign liquor.*—The conveyance of foreign liquor consignments from the licensed premises of the trade and import licensee to a place of booking and to the premises of other licensee shall be under the excise supervision.

21. *Regulation of business of licensee.*—(1) No person shall be recognised as the partner of the trade and import licensee for the purposes of his licence, unless the partnership has been declared to the Collector before the licence is granted and the names of the partners have been entered jointly in the licence or if the partnership is entered into after the granting of the licence, unless the Collector agrees, on application made to him, to alter the licence and to add the name or names of the partner or partners in the licence.

(2) A trade and import licensee shall carry on his business under the licence either personally or by an agent or servant duly authorised by him in this behalf by a written *nokarnama* signed by himself and countersigned by an Excise Officer not lower in rank than a Sub-Inspector: Provided that any such *nokarnama* signed by the licensee shall be valid until countersignature is refused. If for any reason the Collector shall order the withdrawal of any *nokarnama* issued by the licensee, the *nokarnama* shall be forthwith withdrawn. For every *nokarnama* issued by him the licensee shall pay such fee as may from time to time be prescribed by the Director under the Act. No *nokarnama* shall be issued to any person under 21 years of age and no such *nokarnama*, if issued, shall be valid.

(3) (a) A Trade and Import licensee shall keep in the licensed premises and also in his warehouse an up-to-date list showing the names of all authorised agents or servants.

(b) The licensee shall keep in the licensed premises and also in his warehouse, in a bound book of stout paper, paged and stamped with the seal of the Collector accounts in such form as may be prescribed by the Director. The accounts shall be clearly and correctly written up-to-date daily. With these accounts shall be filed the transport passes under cover of which foreign liquor was received or sold. These accounts shall be open to inspection by the Collector or any other officer empowered under section 77 (a) or 122 of the Act.

(c) The licensee shall submit such returns as may be prescribed by the Director.

(d) The licensee shall keep a complete set of testing instruments for testing foreign liquor.

(4) The licensed premises and the warehouse of a Trade and Import licensee and all foreign liquor therein contained shall at all times be open to inspection by the Collector and the Prohibition Officers empowered under section 122 of the Act and in the Greater Bombay by the Commissioner of Police, Bombay, and elsewhere by the District Superintendent of Police.

(5) The licensee shall, when called upon by any Prohibition Officer not below the rank of a Sub-Inspector of Excise, give an explanation in writing regarding any irregularity detected at his licensed premises and shall furnish any information regarding the management of the said premises; and shall answer all reasonable questions to the best of his knowledge and belief. He shall also, on demand, allow an inspecting officer to take samples for analysis free of cost.

(6) The licensee shall keep a visit book paged and stamped with the seal of the Collector in which visiting officers may record any remarks when inspecting the licensed premises. The licensee shall, on the termination of the period of his licence, deliver up the visit book, the accounts and the licence to the local Excise Inspector.

22. *Licence to abide by provisions of Act, etc.*—(1) Every trade and import licensee shall comply promptly with all orders or directions issued from time to time under the Act and the rules and regulations and orders made thereunder.

(2) Such licensee shall give an undertaking to the Collector that he will abide by the provisions of the Act and rules, regulations and orders made thereunder and the conditions of the licence.

(3) [*Deleted.*]

23. *Suspension or cancellation of licence.*—A licence granted under rule 5 may be suspended or cancelled in accordance with the provisions of section 54 or 55 of the Act.

PART II.—*Vendor's licences for sale of foreign liquor.*

24. *Depots to be established.*—Depots for the sale of foreign liquor to persons holding permits for its possession, consumption or use and for Government purposes may be established at Bombay, Poona, Ahmedabad, Sholapur, Baroda, Nasik, Belgaum and such other places as the State Government may from time to time direct. Such depots may be conducted through the agency of persons approved by the State Government, hereinafter referred to as depot keepers.

25. *Appointment of Depot Keepers and location of Depots.*—(1) A depot keeper may be appointed from amongst persons who immediately before the 6th day of April 1950 held foreign liquor Vendor's or retail "Off" licences under the Act.

(2) A depot may be located in the premises in which the holder of such licence conducted his business: Provided that the State Government may locate any depot in a Government liquor warehouse or any other suitable place and entrust the business of such depot to the Officer in charge of such warehouse or place or any other officer as it deems fit.

26. *Application for appointment of Depot Keepers and grant of vendors licence.*—Any person eligible for appointment as a depot keeper under rule 25 and desiring to be so appointed shall apply to the Collector for such appointment and for the grant of a vendor's licence to sell foreign liquor at a depot. The application shall contain the following particulars:—

- (1) Name and address of the applicant;
- (2) If the applicant is a firm, names and addresses of the directors or partners of the firm;
- (3) Location of the premises where the applicant intends to conduct the depot;
- (4) Whether any foreign liquor was sold at the above place in the past, and if so, the year and period during which it was sold.

27. *Grant of vendor's licence and payment of fees.*—On receipt of the application, the Collector may make inquiries for verification of the details of the application and also such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If he is satisfied that there is no objection to appoint the applicant as a depot keeper and to grant the vendor's licence applied for, he may, with the previous sanction of the State Government, appoint him as a depot keeper and grant him a vendor's licence in form F. L. X on payment of such fee and such deposit as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act.

28. *Duration of licence.*—No licence under rule 27 shall be granted for a period of more than one year at a time and in no case shall such period extend beyond 31st March next following the date of the commencement of the licence.

29. *Transactions at the depot to be under excise supervision.*—(1) The depot keeper shall, if required by the Collector, transact all business pertaining to receipt, transport, storage and sale of foreign liquor under excise supervision.

(2) Except with the special permission of the Collector, no such business shall be transacted on Sundays and on such public holidays as are notified under section 25 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881.

30. *Appointment of staff for supervision.*—The Collector may appoint such staff at the depot for excise supervision as he deems necessary.

31. *Kinds of foreign liquor authorised for sale.*—No liquor other than foreign liquor shall be bought, held in stock and sold at the depot.

32. *Sources of supply.*—Foreign liquor required for sale by the depot shall be obtained from a person holding a trade and import licence in respect of foreign liquor or from a distillery in the State of Bombay or with the special permission of the Director from any other place. All such foreign liquor shall be transported to the depot under a valid transport pass.

33. *What foreign liquor shall not be kept or sold.*—(1) No foreign liquor other than that obtained under rule 32 shall be kept or sold at the depot.

(2) No adulterated or spurious foreign liquor of any kind shall be kept or sold at the depot.

34. *To whom foreign liquor shall or shall not be sold.*—(1) (i) The depot-keeper may sell any part of the stock of foreign liquor to foreign liquor licensees in the State of Bombay or to any persons outside the State, subject to such conditions as the Director may prescribe.

(ii) The depot-keeper may also sell foreign liquor only to holders of permits or authorizations and chemists, messes and clubs holding licences.

(2) No sale of any foreign liquor kept for sale in the depot shall be made to any permit holder unless the permit holder has got a corresponding balance of units remaining unpurchased against his permit during the month of such sale to him. The depot keeper or officer in charge of the depot, as the case may be, shall on each occasion enter in the permit of the permit holder to whom foreign liquor is sold, the details of sale of such liquor and sign below such entry.

35. *Maximum selling prices.*—Foreign liquor shall not be sold from the depot at a price exceeding the maximum price fixed by the Director from time to time.

36. *Foreign liquor bottles to be banded.*—No bottle containing foreign liquor shall be sold from the depot unless it is banded in such manner as the Director may, from time to time, direct.

37. *No drinking in depot.*—The person in charge of a depot shall not permit foreign liquor to be drunk in the depot.

38. *Closure of depot.*—The depot shall not be kept open on such days and during such hours as may be prescribed by the Director in this behalf.

39. *Combination of business.*—Except with the special permission of the Director, the business of selling foreign liquor at a depot shall not be combined with any other business in the same premises.

40. *Foreign liquor to be sold in sealed bottles.*—Foreign liquor shall not be kept or sold at the depot except in corked bottles sealed or capsuled.

41. *Maintenance of accounts.*—(1) There shall be maintained at a depot such accounts as may be prescribed by the Director. Such accounts shall be kept in a bound book of stout paper, pagged and stamped with the seal of the Collector.

(2) The depot, all foreign liquor kept or stored therein and all accounts, registers and books and passes shall at all times be open to inspection by any officer empowered under section 77(a) or section 122 of the Act.

42. *Transport passes for foreign liquor sold.*—Unless permitted under his permit or licence no foreign liquor sold from a depot shall be transported by a permit-holder or licensee except under a valid transport pass.

43. *Visit book.*—A visit book, paged and stamped with the seal of the Collector, shall be maintained at each depot in which visiting officers may record any remarks when inspecting a depot.

44. *Depots in charge of officers.*—Whenever the business of any depot is entrusted under rule 25 to an officer in charge of a Government liquor warehouse or other place or any other officer, no licence, permit, pass or authorisation shall be necessary for the possession, transport, sale or buying of foreign liquor by such officer on behalf of the depot. The officer in charge of the depot shall abide by the rules in this Part and shall also comply with all orders and instructions, issued by the Director, Collector, Superintendent of Excise or any other officer duly empowered in this behalf in connection with the management of the business relating to the depot.

### PART III.—Hotel licence.

45. *Application for a hotel licence.*—Any manager of a hotel desiring to sell foreign liquor by retail to the boarders in his hotel who hold permits granted under the Act shall apply to the Collector for a Hotel licence. The application shall contain the following particulars namely :—

(i) Name and address of the applicant—

(ii) Name of the Hotel, its location with Census No. of the house or building, name of street, city, town, or village, as the case may be.

(iii) Whether the hotel held any foreign liquor hotel licence in the past and if so, the period during which it was held.

(iv) Average number per day of resident boarders who are foreigners. The average shall be calculated on the total number of such resident boarders during the six months immediately preceding the date of the application.

(v) Number of the room assigned for sale of foreign liquor.

46. *Grant of licence and its duration.*—(1) On receipt of an application under rule 45, the Collector shall make inquiries for verification of the particulars given in the application and also such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If he is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the licence applied for, he may grant the applicant a licence in Form F. L. II on payment of such fee and such deposit as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act.

(2) No licence under this rule shall be granted for a period exceeding one year at a time and in no case shall such period extend beyond the 31st March next following the date of the commencement of the licence.

47. *Admission of partners.*—No person will be recognised as the partner of a hotel licensee unless the partnership has been declared to the Collector before such licence is granted and the names of the partners have been entered jointly in the licence, or if the partnership is entered into after the granting of the licence, unless the Collector agrees on application made to him to alter the licence and to add the name of the partner in the licence.

#### PART IV.—*Club Licence.*

48. *Application for a club licence.*—The Secretary of a club or any person duly authorised in that behalf by the club shall, if it is intended to sell foreign liquor at such club, apply to the Collector for a club licence. The application shall contain the following particulars, namely :—

- (i) Name of the Club—
- (ii) Location of the Club, with Census No. of the house or building, name of street, city, town, or village, as the case may be.
- (iii) Object of the Club.
- (iv) Name of the Secretary or the other person authorized.
- (v) Number of members.
- (vi) Rules of the Club relating to the election of members, terms of subscription, entrance fee, if any, hours of opening and closing.
- (vii) Whether the Club held any foreign liquor Club licence in the past and if so, the year and period during which it was held.
- (viii) Average number per day of resident members. The average shall be calculated on the total number of such resident members during the six months immediately preceding the date of the application.
- (ix) Number of the room assigned for sale of foreign liquor.

49. *Grant of licence and its duration.*—(1) On receipt of an application under rule 48, the Collector shall make inquiries for verification of the particulars given in the application and such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If he is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the licence applied for, he may grant such licence in Form F.L.III to the Secretary or the authorised person on payment of such fee and such deposit as may be prescribed by the Director.

(2) No licence shall be granted for a period exceeding one year at a time and in no case shall such period extend beyond 31st March next following the date of the commencement of the licence.

#### *Rules for Hotel and Club Licences.*

50. *Employment of servants.*—The business of selling foreign liquor at a hotel or club shall be carried on by a hotel or club licensee personally or by an agent or servant duly authorised by him in this behalf by a written *nokarnama* signed by himself and countersigned by an Excise Officer not lower in rank than a Sub-Inspector; provided that any such *nokarnama* signed by the licensee shall be valid until such countersignature is refused. Such *nokarnama* shall be forthwith withdrawn by the licensee if so ordered by the Collector for any reason. For every *nokarnama* issued by him the licensee should pay such fee as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act. No *nokarnama* shall be issued to any person under 21 years of age.

51. *Source of supply.*—Foreign liquor required for a licensed hotel or club shall not be bought except from a person holding a Trade and Import licence and shall not be transported from the latter's premises to the hotel or club premises except under a transport pass.

52. *Prohibition to store or sell any other foreign liquor.*—(i) A hotel or club licensee shall not keep or sell in the licensed premises of the hotel or club foreign liquor of any kind which he is not authorised to buy under the licence, nor shall he keep, or sell foreign liquor in any place except in the licensed premises of such hotel or club.

(ii) No adulterated or spurious foreign liquor of any kind shall be sold or kept by the licensee in the hotel or club.

53. [Deleted.]

54. *Maintenance of accounts and inspection thereof.*—(1) There shall be maintained at the licensed premises such accounts as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act. Such accounts shall be kept in a bound book of stout paper, pagged and stamped with the seal of the Collector.

(2) The licensed premises in the hotel or club and the foreign liquor kept or stored therein and all accounts, registers and books maintained in respect of such foreign liquor by a hotel or club licensee, as the case may be, shall at all times be open to inspection by any officer empowered under section 77 (a) or section 122 of the Act. Any irregularity noticed by such officer shall be explained to him by the licensee.

55. *Appointment of staff for supervision.*—The Collector may appoint such staff for Excise supervision at a licensed hotel or club premises as he deems necessary.

56. *Closure of premises.*—(1) A hotel or club licensee shall close the licensed premises on such days and during such hours as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act or for any other sufficient reason.

(2) The licensee may also of his own accord close the licensed premises during any riot or disturbance in the neighbourhood thereof.

(3) The licensee shall not be entitled to claim any compensation on account of the closure of the licensed premises under this rule.

57. *Prohibition regarding drunkenness etc.*—No drunkenness or gambling in or near the licensed premises or in any other portion of the hotel or club shall be permitted by a hotel or club licensee nor shall any disorderly persons be allowed to remain therein.

58. *Sale to permit-holders.*—(1) (a) A hotel or club licensee shall not sell foreign liquor except to a permit-holder. No sale of foreign liquor shall be made to such permit-holder unless the permit-holder has got a corresponding balance of units remaining unpurchased against his permit during the month of such sale to him.

(b) Such licensee shall enter the details of sale of foreign liquor to any permit-holder in the permit of such permit-holder.



(2) A hotel or club licensee shall not sell or serve foreign liquor except during the hours prescribed in this behalf by the Director.

(3) A hotel or club licensee shall not permit any permit-holder to remove foreign liquor sold to him to his room unless the foreign liquor is removed in a sealed bottle.

(4) A hotel or club licensee shall maintain a register of permit-holders holding permits under these rules and state therein their permit numbers and the number of units sanctioned to them. The licensee shall enter in the register details of foreign liquor sold to them from day to day.

(5) A hotel or club licensee shall not sell or supply or attempt to sell or supply any foreign liquor to or for the use of—

(a) a permit-holder who is insane, or

(b) a permit-holder known or believed to be intoxicated.

59. *Licensees to abide by the Bombay Prohibition Act, Rule, etc.*—(1) A hotel or club licensee shall abide by the conditions of the hotel or club licence and the provisions of the Act and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder and shall give an undertaking to that effect;

(2) *[Deleted.]*

60. *No claim to renew a licence.*—A hotel or club licensee or his successors or assigns shall have no claim whatsoever to the continuance or renewal of the hotel or club licence after the expiry of the period for which such licence was granted.

61. *Cancellation of licence.*—A hotel or club licence may be suspended or cancelled in accordance with the provisions of section 54 or 56 of the Act.

62. *Unsold foreign liquor to be surrendered.*—When a hotel or club licence is suspended or cancelled during the currency of the licence period or is not renewed on its expiry, the hotel or club licensee shall forthwith surrender the whole stock of unsold foreign liquor to the Collector.

#### PART V.—Permits for possession of foreign liquor.

63. *Description of permits.*—Permits of the following kinds only for the possession, use and consumption of foreign liquor shall be granted under these rules, namely :—

(i) Permit on grounds of health;

(ii) Temporary resident's permit;

(iii) Special permit for Privileged Personages;

(iv) Interim permit;

(v) Emergency permit;

(vi) Visitor's permit.

64. *Permit on grounds of health.*—(1) Any person desiring to possess, use and consume foreign liquor on the grounds of health shall apply to the Collector in

form FL/A-1. He shall obtain such form from the office of the Collector or the Superintendent of Excise, on payment of a fee of Re. 1. On receipt of such form he shall appear for medical examination before the Medical Board appointed for the purpose under the Act, present his application to such Board with a fee of Re. 1 for medical examination and obtain a medical examination certificate in form F.L.M.C. from the Board. The application together with the certificate shall then be forwarded to the Collector through the Superintendent of Excise.

(2) (i) On receipt of the application, the Collector shall satisfy himself—

(a) that the applicant is not a minor ; and

(b) that the health of the applicant shall be seriously and permanently affected if he is not permitted to use or consume foreign liquor mentioned in his application.

(ii) The Collector shall also make such other inquiries as he deems necessary.

(3) If the Collector, on making necessary inquiries, is satisfied that there is no objection, he may in conformity with the orders of the State Government and the Director and the recommendation in the certificate of the Medical Board, grant the applicant, on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act, a permit in form F.L. IV for the possession, use and consumption of foreign liquor on grounds of health.

(4) No such permit shall be granted for a period exceeding that recommended by the Medical Board and such period shall not exceed six months in any case.

(5) A permit-holder desiring to renew the permit after the expiry of period of six months shall make a fresh application. The provisions of sub-rules (1) to (4) shall apply to such application.

(6) No permit under this rule shall be granted for a quantity exceeding that recommended by the Medical Board, provided that such quantity shall not exceed 4 units of foreign liquor per month in any case. The quantity recommended by the Medical Board shall further be liable to such reduction as may be recommended by the Medical Board.

(7) [*Deleted.*]

(8) The privileges of purchase and possession of foreign liquor granted under the permit shall extend only so far as they are incidental to its use or consumption in accordance with these rules and the conditions of the permit.

(9) [*Deleted.*]

(10) (i) Foreign liquor permitted for use and consumption under a permit granted under this rule shall not be obtained from a place other than a Government or licensed depot or a licensed hotel or club ;

(ii) The permit-holder shall get all purchases of foreign-liquor entered in his permit by the depot keeper or the Officer-in-Charge of the depot or the hotel licensee or the club licensee, as the case may be.

(11) [*Deleted.*]

(12) The permit-holder shall not, at any one time, possess any quantity of foreign liquor exceeding that which he is permitted to use and consume in any month.

(13) The permit-holder shall abide by the conditions of the permit and the provisions of the Act and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder and shall give an undertaking to that effect.

(14) A permit may be suspended or cancelled in accordance with the provisions of section 54 of the Act. Where a permit is suspended or cancelled during its currency or is not renewed after its expiry, the permit-holder shall surrender forthwith the whole of the unconsumed stock of foreign liquor to the Collector.

65. *Temporary resident's permit.*—(1) A temporary resident desiring to possess, use and consume foreign liquor shall apply to the Collector in form F.L./A-2. The form may be obtained from the office of the Collector or the Superintendent of Excise, on payment of a fee of Re. 1.

(2) (i) On receipt of the application, the Collector shall satisfy himself—

(a) that such person is not a minor; and

(b) that he is a temporary resident.

(ii) The Collector shall also make such other enquiries as he deems necessary.

(3) If the Collector, on making the necessary inquiries, is satisfied that there is no objection, he may, in consultation with the Superintendent of Excise of his district and in conformity with the orders of the State Government and the Director grant the applicant, on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Director, under the Act, a permit in form F. L. V. for the possession, use and consumption of foreign liquor.

(4) No permit shall be granted for a period extending beyond the date on which the applicant's residence in India for six months expires.

(5) The permit shall be granted for such monthly quantity of foreign liquor as the Collector may fix in each case:

Provided that such quantity shall not exceed 4 units of foreign liquor per month in any case.

(6) The permit-holder shall not possess at any one time any quantity of foreign liquor exceeding that which has been fixed in his case by the Collector under sub-rule (5).

(7) The privileges of purchase and possession of foreign liquor granted under the permit shall extend only so far as they are incidental to its use or consumption; in accordance with these rules and the conditions of the permit.

(8) [*Deleted.*]

(9) (i) Foreign liquor permitted for consumption under a permit shall not, except with the previous permission of the Director be obtained from any place other than a Government or licensed depot or a licensed hotel or club.

(ii) The permit-holder shall get all purchases of foreign liquor entered in his permit by the Officer-in-charge of the Government depot or the depot keeper, or the hotel licensee or the club licensee, as the case may be.

(10) [*Deleted.*]

(11) [*Deleted.*]

(12) A permit holder shall abide by the conditions of the permit and the provisions of the Act and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder and shall give an undertaking to that effect.

(13) A permit may be suspended or cancelled in accordance with the provisions of section 54 of the Act.

(14) Where the permit is suspended or cancelled during the currency of the permit period or is not renewed after its expiry, the permit-holder shall surrender forthwith the whole of the unconsumed stock of foreign liquor to the Collector.

66. *Special permit for Privileged Personages.*—(1) Any person who is a Sovereign of a foreign state or an Ambassador or a diplomatic Envoy or Consul of a foreign State or the consort or a member of the staff entitled to diplomatic privileges, of such Sovereign, Ambassador, Envoy or Consul, desiring to possess, use and consume foreign liquor, shall apply to the Collector in form F.L./A-3 which shall be supplied to him, free of cost.

(2) On receipt of the application, the Collector shall grant him a permit in form F. L. VI for the possession, use and consumption of foreign liquor.

(3) The permit may be granted for a period not exceeding one year at a time but not exceeding beyond the 31st March next following the date of the commencement of the permit whichever is earlier.

(4) The permit shall not be granted for any quantity of foreign liquor exceeding the quota fixed for such permit-holders by Government from time to time and it shall not be lawful for a permit holder to possess at any one time foreign liquor in excess of the quantity represented by the units specified in his permit.

(5) The privileges of purchase and possession of foreign liquor granted under the permit shall extend only so far as they are incidental to its use or consumption in accordance with these rules and the conditions of the permit.

(6) [Deleted.]

(7) Foreign liquor permitted for consumption under the permit shall not be obtained by the permit-holder except from his own stock in Customs Bond or from the stock in Customs Bond of a trade and import licensee :

Provided that the Director may permit the permit holder to obtain foreign liquor from any other place.

(8) The permit-holder shall enter in his permit the quantity of foreign liquor obtained by him from time to time.

(9) [Deleted.]

(10) [Deleted.]

(11) In the event of any permit-holder going out of the State the stock of foreign liquor held by him under the permit shall be disposed of in such manner as the Director may direct.

67. *Interim Permit.*—(1) Any person who is eligible for a permit under rule 64, 65 or 66 and desires to possess, use or consume foreign liquor may apply to the Collector or to any other officer authorised in this behalf in form F.L./A-4 for an interim permit while applying for a regular permit under any of the said rules.

(2) On receipt of the application the Collector shall satisfy himself—  
 (a) that such applicant is not a minor ; and  
 (b) that the applicant is *prima facie* eligible for a permit under clause (b), (c) (i) or (c) (ii) of sub-section (1) of section 40 or under section 41 of the Act.

(3) If the Collector or the officer authorised under sub-rule (1) is satisfied that there is no objection to grant an interim permit pending the disposal of his application for a regular permit under rule 64, 65 or 66, as the case may be, he may grant the applicant a permit in Form F.L. VII for the possession, use and consumption of foreign liquor.

(4) No permit shall be granted for a period exceeding 2 months.

(5) The permit shall be granted for such monthly quantity of foreign liquor as the Collector or the officer authorised under sub-rule (1) may fix in each case :

Provided that such quantity shall not, in any case, exceed 4 units of foreign liquor per month, except with the sanction of the Director.

(6) The permit-holder shall not possess at any one time any quantity of foreign liquor exceeding that which has been fixed in his case by the Collector or the authorised officer under sub-rule (5).

(7) The privileges of purchase and possession of foreign liquor granted under the permit shall extend only so far as they are incidental to its use or consumption in accordance with these rules and the conditions of the permit.

(8) (i) Foreign liquor permitted for consumption under the permit shall not, except with the previous permission of the Director, be obtained from any place other than a Government or licensed depot or a licensed hotel or club.

(ii) The permit holder shall get all purchases of foreign liquor entered in his permit by the Officer in charge of the Government depot or the depot-keeper or the hotel licensee or the club licensee, as the case may be.

(9) The permit-holder shall abide by the conditions of the permit and the provisions of the Act and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder.

(10) The permit may be suspended or cancelled in accordance with the provisions of section 54 of the Act.

(11) Where a permit is suspended or cancelled during the currency of the permit period the permit-holder shall surrender forthwith the whole of the unconsumed stock of foreign liquor to the Collector.

68. *Emergency Permit.*—(1) Any person desiring to possess brandy or rum for himself or any head of the household desiring to possess such liquor for the use of his household for medicinal use on emergent occasions shall apply to the Collector in form F. L./A-5. He may obtain such form from the office of the Collector or the Superintendent of Excise on payment of a fee of Re. 1.

(2) On receipt of the application, the Collector shall make such inquiries as he deems necessary and if he is satisfied that there is no objection, he may, in conformity with the orders of the State Government and the Director issued in that behalf, grant the applicant, on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act a permit in form F. L. VIII for the possession of brandy or rum for medicinal use :

Provided that the applicant is not a minor.

(3) No permit under sub-rule (2) shall be granted for a period exceeding one year or beyond 31st March next following the date of the commencement of the permit and for a quantity exceeding 2 drams of brandy or rum per six months.

(4) No brandy or rum shall be purchased or obtained by a permit holder under this rule if he has already in his possession more than 2 drams of either brandy or rum.

(5) If any permit-holder who has used up his permitted quantity before the expiry of six months from the date of the permit, requires to purchase, possess, consume or use a further quantity of two drams of brandy or rum for the rest of the period of six months, he shall obtain a special medical certificate to that effect and shall apply to the Collector with such certificate. The Collector shall make such inquiries as he may deem necessary and if he sees sufficient reasons to recommend the application, he may submit the application together with the medical certificate to the Director.

The Director may, if he is satisfied that there are sufficient and cogent reasons to do so, permit the applicant to purchase such further quantity of brandy or rum as he may fix.

(6) The privileges of purchase, transport and possession of brandy or rum granted under the permit shall extend only so far as they are incidental to its use or consumption in accordance with these rules and the conditions of the permit.

(7) The brandy or rum purchased under the permit shall be used solely for the use of the permit-holder and his household. The permit holder may allow consumption or use of such brandy or rum by any person requiring it on *bona fide* medical grounds.

(8) The permit-holder shall not obtain brandy or rum except from a Government or licensed depot. He shall get all purchases of brandy or rum entered in his permit by the officer in charge of the Government depot or the depot keeper, as the case may be.

(9) The permit-holder shall abide by the conditions of the permit and the provisions of the Act and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder and shall give an undertaking to that effect.

(10) The permit may be suspended or cancelled in accordance with the provisions of section 54 of the Act.

(11) In case the permit is suspended or cancelled during its currency or is not renewed on its expiry, the permit holder shall surrender forthwith the whole of the unused stock of brandy or rum to the Collector.

(12) Notwithstanding anything contained in this rule a permit may be granted for the possession of any kind of foreign liquor for the maximum quantity of either one quart bottle of spirit or one quart bottle of wine or three quart bottles of fermented liquors to any applicant who has been in possession of that quantity of any such foreign liquor on the midnight of 31st March 1950 and who has declared to the Collector on or before the 6th April 1950 the whole stock of foreign liquor in his possession on 1st of April 1950, provided that the bottle of spirit or wine was opened for use before 1st April 1950.

(13) Sub-rules (1) to (11) shall, so far as may be, apply in respect of a permit granted under sub-rule (12) and the Form F. L. VIII shall be adapted suitably :

Provided that no foreign liquor shall be purchased without the previous sanction of the Director.

*Explanation.*—For the purpose of this rule a household shall mean a group of persons residing and messing jointly as the members of one domestic unit.

68-A. *Visitor's Permit.*—(1) Any person visiting the State of Bombay for a period not more than a week and desiring to possess, use and consume foreign liquor shall apply to the Collector.

(2) The application shall contain the following particulars—

- (1) Name in full,
- (2) Permanent address,
- (3) Temporary address in the State
- (4) Period of stay in the State of Bombay,
- (5) Nationality,
- (6) Place of birth,
- (7) Place where brought up,
- (8) Country of domicile,
- (9) Age,
- (10) Occupation,
- (11) Number of units of foreign liquor required per week,
- (12) Date of arrival in the State of Bombay.

The application shall be accompanied by an undertaking that the applicant will abide by the conditions of the permit and the provisions of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949, and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder.

(3) On receipt of the application the Collector shall satisfy himself that the applicant is a visitor to the State of Bombay and if he sees no objection, he may grant him a permit in Form F.L.XI for the possession, use and consumption of foreign liquor on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Director.

(4) The permit shall be granted for a period not exceeding one week. Provided that the Collector may extend the period of such permit, but in no case such period shall be extended to a total period exceeding one month.

(5) No permit shall be granted for a quantity exceeding one unit per week.

(6) The permit-holder shall not possess at any one time any quantity of foreign liquor in excess of the quantity specified in his permit.

(7) The privileges of purchase, transport and possession of foreign liquor granted under the permit shall extend only so far as they are incidental to its use or consumption in accordance with these rules and conditions of the permit.

(8) The foreign liquor permitted for consumption under the permit shall not, except with the previous permission of the Collector, be obtained from a place other than a Government or licensed depot or a licensed hotel or club.

(9) The permit-holder shall get the details entered in his permit of all foreign liquor obtained by him from time to time by the Officer-in-Charge of Government Depot or the Depot keeper or by the hotel or club licensee, as the case may

(10) The permit-holder shall abide by the conditions of the permit and the provisions of the Act and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder.

(11) The permit shall be suspended or cancelled in accordance with the provisions under section 51 of the Act.

**PART VI.—Consumption and sale of foreign liquor on Steamers.**

69. *Bringing of foreign liquor by passengers etc.*—No passenger on board any vessel, boat, launch, ship or steamer plying on the coast of the State of Bombay shall possess any foreign liquor while such vessel, boat, launch, ship or steamer is in the territorial waters of the State unless such possession is covered by a valid permit.

70. *Foreign steamers and through steamers.*—(1) The stock of foreign liquor in the bar on any foreign steamer or through steamer if it touches the Bombay harbour, shall be sealed by the Customs authorities as soon as it enters the territorial waters of this State.

(2) No sale or consumption from such stock shall be made while the steamer is in the port of Bombay and the visitors and disembarking passengers are on board the steamer.

(3) After the disembarking passengers and visitors have left the steamer, the sealed stock shall be released by the customs authorities and consumption of foreign liquor therefrom by through passengers shall be permitted.

(4) No licence or permit shall be required for sale, purchase, possession, use or consumption of foreign liquor on board such steamer, if it is in accordance with the above conditions.

(5) If the steamer terminates its voyage at Bombay, the stock of foreign liquor in the bar on the steamer shall be sealed by the Customs authorities and shall not be released until the steamer leaves the port of Bombay on outward voyage.

(6) Sale and consumption of foreign liquor on such steamer shall not be permitted after the steamer enters the port of Bombay nor before it leaves that port. The Captain of the steamer as well as the proprietor of the bar shall be responsible for the observance of this rule.

*Explanation.*—In this rule, steamer includes any ship or other vessel.

**PART VII.—Alcoholic beverages not containing more than 2 per cent. of alcohol by volume.**

71. *Sale of fermented liquors.*—No person shall sell any fermented liquors (including any alcoholic fruit juice and other alcoholic beverages) containing alcohol in strength not more than 3.5 per cent. of proof spirit (equivalent to 2 per cent. of alcohol by volume) except in the manner and to the extent provided by these rules.

72. *Application for licence.*—Any person desiring to sell any such fermented liquors shall apply to the Collector for a licence in that behalf. The application shall contain the following particulars, namely :—

(1) Name and address of the applicant.

(2) Location of the shop or premises where he wants to sell such fermented liquors and beverages with the census No. of the house, name of street, City, town, or village as the case may be.

(3) Whether any foreign liquor was sold at the above place in the past and if so, the period during which it was sold.



(4) Whether the applicant has any previous experience in the business of this nature.

73. *Grant of licence.*—On receipt of the application, if the Collector, after making such inquiries as he deems necessary, is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the licence applied for, he may, on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act grant the applicant a licence in Form F. L. IX for the sale of such fermented liquors. Such licence shall not be granted for a period of more than one year at a time and in no case beyond 31st March next following the date of its commencement.

74. *Regulation of business of licensee.*—(1) The licensee shall carry on the business of his shop either personally or by an agent or servant duly authorised by him and who has not been disapproved by the local Excise Inspector.

(2) The licensee shall allow any officer empowered under section 122 of the Act to take samples for analysis of fermented liquors, fruit juice and other alcoholic beverages kept in his shop, free of cost.

(3) The licensee shall keep a visit book paged and stamped with the Collector's seal.

(4) The licensee shall give an undertaking to the Collector that he will abide by the provisions of the Act and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder and the conditions of his licence.

75. *Cancellation or suspension of licence.*—(1) A licence may be suspended or cancelled in accordance with the provisions of section 54 or 56 of the Act.

(2) In case the licence is not renewed on its expiry or is cancelled or suspended during the currency of the licence period the licensee shall, immediately, after its expiry, cancellation or suspension, as the case may be, surrender all his unsold stock of fermented liquors (including fruit juices and alcoholic beverages) to the Collector for further disposal.

*Preamble.*—Licence is hereby granted, under and subject to the provisions of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949, and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder, to.....of Messrs.....(hereinafter called "the licensee") authorising him to remove from a Customs Frontier and to import and sell by wholesale foreign liquor at his premises situated at.....(hereinafter referred to as the "licensed premises") from.....19 to the 31st day of March 19 (both days inclusive) subject to the following conditions, namely:—

CONDITIONS.

1. The licensee shall pay into the Government treasury a sum Rs..... (.....) as licence fee and a sum of Rs..... (.....) as deposit.

2. The licensee shall not sell foreign liquor at any place other than the licensed premises nor shall he keep foreign liquor in any place except in the licensed premises or, if specially permitted in writing by the Collector, at the warehouse which is situated at the place specified below. He shall keep separate accounts of the stocks of foreign liquor kept at the warehouse. A consolidated account of the stocks of foreign liquor at the licensed premises and the warehouse shall also be maintained by him. Stocks of foreign liquor shall be transported from the warehouse to the licensed premises under passes issued by a Prohibition Officer duly authorised in this behalf. In no case shall the licensee sell foreign liquor from such warehouse.

(Situation of warehouse.....)

3. The licensee shall pay to Government in advance at the beginning of each quarter commencing from the date of the licence such cost of the staff appointed at the licensed premises for the purpose of excise supervision as may be fixed by the Director from time to time.

4. The expenses in respect of excise supervision for transporting foreign liquor from the licensed premises shall be paid by the licensee.

5. The licensee shall sell foreign liquor at a price not exceeding that fixed by the Director in that behalf.

6. The licensee shall furnish such information in connection with his business under the licence as may be required by the Director from time to time.

7. The licensee shall comply with all orders and instructions issued to him by the Prohibition Officers not lower in rank than a Sub-Inspector of Excise.

8. In case the licence is suspended or cancelled during its currency or is not renewed on its expiry the licensee shall forthwith surrender the whole of the unsold stock to the Collector.

9. As this licence is granted only for the period specified above, it shall not give the licensee, his heirs, legal representatives or assigns, any claim whatsoever to the continuance or renewal thereof beyond the said period.

10. This licence may be suspended or cancelled in accordance with the provisions of section 54 or 56 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949.

Vendor's licence for the sale of foreign liquor.

Licence is hereby granted, under and subject to the provisions of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949, and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder, to .....of.....(hereinafter called "the

licensee"), on payment of a fee of Rs. .... and deposit of Rs. .... in advance, authorising him to sell foreign liquor at his depot situated at..... during the period from ..... to ..... (both days inclusive), subject to the following conditions, namely:—

#### CONDITIONS.

1. The licensee shall carry on business of selling foreign liquor at the depot either personally or by an agent or servant duly authorised by him in this behalf by a written *nokarnama* signed by himself and countersigned by an Excise Officer not lower in rank than a Sub-Inspector: Provided that any such *nokarnama* signed by the licensee shall be valid unless and until such countersignature is refused. If for any reason the Collector shall order the withdrawal of any *nokarnama* issued by the licensee, the *nokarnama* shall be forthwith withdrawn. For every *nokarnama* issued by him, the licensee shall pay such fee as may from time to time be prescribed by the Director under this Act. No *nokarnama* shall be issued to any person under 21 years of age.
2. The licensee shall, if required by the Collector, pay to the State Government in advance at the beginning of each quarter commencing from the date of this licence such cost of the staff appointed at the depot for the purpose of excise supervision as may be fixed by the Director.
3. Except with the permission of the Collector, the licensee shall not sell, transfer or sub-let his right of selling foreign liquor conferred upon him by this licence, nor shall he in connection with the said right enter into any agreement or arrangement which is of the nature of a sub-lease. If any question arises whether any agreement or arrangement is in the nature of a sub-lease the decision of the Collector on such question shall be final and binding on the licensee.
4. No person shall be recognised as the partner of the licensee for the purpose of this licence unless the partnership has been declared before the licence is granted and the names of the partners have been jointly entered in the licence, or if the partnership is entered into after the granting of the licence, unless the Collector agrees on application made to him to alter the licence and to add the names of the partners in the licence.
5. The licensee shall affix to the front of his depot a signboard bearing his name, the name of the depot and the location thereof.
6. The licensee shall abide by the conditions of this licence and the provisions of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949, and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder and shall give an undertaking to that effect.
7. The licensee shall comply promptly with all lawful orders and directions issued from time to time by the Director, Collector or the Superintendent of Excise.
8. The licensee, his heirs, legal representatives or assigns shall have no claim whatsoever to the continuance or renewal of this licence, after the expiry of the period for which it is granted. Whereas the Government of Bombay is satisfied that it is necessary to make and to bring into force the following rules at once without previous publication ;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 143 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, the Government of Bombay is pleased to make the following rules, namely :—

1. *Title.*—These rules may be called the Bombay Perfumed Spirits and Toilet Preparations (Sale) Rules, 1950.

2. *Extent and commencement.*—(1) These rules shall extend to the whole of the State of Bombay.

(2) They shall come into force at once.

3. *Definitions.*—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

(1) "Act" means the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 ;

(2) "essences" means essences containing alcohol ;

(3) "Form" means a form appended to these Rules ;

(4) "licence" means a licence granted under rule 5 ;

(5) "licensed premises" means the premises in respect of which a licence is given under rule 5 and includes a ware-house of a licensee approved by the Collector ;

(6) "licensee" means a person who has been granted a licence under rule 5 ;

(7) "pass" means a pass granted under the Act or the rules, regulations or orders made thereunder ;

(8) "perfumed spirits" means liquid perfumes containing alcohol and includes Eau-de-Cologne ;

(9) "spirituous toilet preparations" means liquid toilet preparations containing alcohol.

4. *Application for licence.*—Any person desiring to sell perfumed spirits, spirituous toilet preparations or essences shall apply to the Collector for a licence to sell such spirits, preparations or essences. The application shall contain the following particulars, namely :—

(i) Name and address of the applicant ;

(ii) Location of the shop or premises where perfumed spirits, spirituous toilet preparations and essences will be sold with the name of the building and the name of street, town or village, as the case may be ;

(iii) Whether the applicant held any licence in the past to sell any kind of perfumed spirits, toilet preparations or essences. If so, the period during which such licence was held.

5. *Grant of licence.*—On receipt of the application, the Collector may make inquiries for verification of the details stated in the application and also such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If he is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the licence applied for he may grant the applicant a licence in form S. M. P. III on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act.

6. *Duration of licence.*—No licence under rule 5 shall be granted for a period exceeding one year and in no case shall such period extend beyond 31st March next following the date of the commencement of the licence.

7. *Kinds of perfumes which can be kept and sold.*—No intoxicant other than perfumed spirits, spirituous toilet preparations or essences shall be sold by the licensee.

8. *Source of supply.*—(1) The licensee shall not obtain any perfumed spirits, spirituous toilet preparations or essences required by him except from a licensed manufacturer or dealer in the State of Bombay or from a Customs House or from any other State in India and except in accordance with the rules, regulations and orders made under the Act.

(2) The licensee shall preserve the invoices, cash memos, passes and other documents relating to the consignments of perfumed spirits, spirituous toilet preparations or essences received by him for a period of one year from the date of their receipt.

9. *What perfumed spirits and toilet preparations shall not be kept or sold.*—The licensee shall not keep in his licensed premises any perfumed spirits, spirituous toilet preparations or essences which have not been lawfully obtained, transported or imported.

10. *Limit of sales.*—(1) The licensee shall not sell to any person on any one day any kind of perfumed spirits, spirituous toilet preparations or essences in excess of such quantity as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in this rule the licensee may sell perfumed spirits, spirituous toilet preparations or essences in any quantity to a person holding a licence under rule 5 or to a Registered Medical Practitioner or to a person in charge of a hospital or dispensary.

(3) All such sales of perfumed spirits, spirituous toilet preparations or essences shall be made subject to the issue of an invoice or a cash memo. The original copy of such invoice or cash memo shall be sent along with the consignment and the duplicate shall be preserved by the licensee for the period of one year from the date of the sale. The cash memo or invoice shall show the name and address of the purchaser and the quantity of perfumed spirits, spirituous toilet preparations or essences sold by the licensee.

11. *Regulation of business of licensee.*—(1) The licensee shall carry on his business under the licence either personally or by an agent or servant duly authorised by him in this behalf.

(2) The licensed premises and all perfumed spirits, spirituous toilet preparations or essences, therein contained shall at all times be open to inspection by any officer empowered under section 122 of the Act.

(3) The licensee shall, when so required by any Prohibition Officer not below the rank of a Sub-Inspector of Excise, give an explanation in writing regarding any irregularity detected at his licensed premises and shall furnish any information regarding the management of the said premises. He shall answer all questions put to him to the best of his knowledge and belief. He shall also, if so required allow any officer empowered under section 122 of the Act to take samples of perfumed spirits, spirituous toilet preparations or essences free of cost, for analysis.

(4) The licensee shall provide a visit-book paged and stamped with the seal of the Collector in which visiting officers may record any remarks when inspecting the licensed premises. The licensee shall, on the termination of the period of the licence, deliver up the visit-book, the accounts and the licence to the local Excise Inspector.

(5) No person shall be recognised as the partner of the licensee for the purpose of this licence, unless the partnership has been declared to the Collector before the licence is granted and the names of the partners have been entered jointly in the licence, or if the partnership is entered into after the granting of the licence unless the Collector agrees, on application made to him, to alter the licence and add the name of the partner in the licence.

12. *Licensee to abide by provisions of Act.*—(1) The licensee shall comply with all lawful orders and directions issued from time to time by the Director, Collector or Superintendent of Excise.

(2) He shall abide by the provisions of the Act and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder and the conditions of the licence and shall give an undertaking to that effect.

Whereas the Government of Bombay is satisfied that it is necessary to make and to bring into force the following rules at once without previous publication ;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 143 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf the Government of Bombay is pleased to make the following rules, namely :—

1. *Title.*—These rules may be called the Bombay Spirituous Medicinal Preparations (Sale) Rules, 1950.

2. *Extent and commencement.*—(1) These rules shall extend to the whole of the State of Bombay.

(2) They shall come into force at once.

3. *Definitions.*—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

(1) " Act " means the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 ;

(2) " asava " or " arishta " means a medicinal preparation in liquid form which contains alcohol generated by a process of fermentation and which is prepared in accordance with the Ayurvedic System of Medicine ;

(3) " Form " means a form appended to these rules ;

(4) " licence " means a licence granted under these rules ;

(5) " licensed premises " means the premises in respect of which a licence has been granted under these rules and includes a warehouse of a licensee approved by the Collector ;

(6) " medical prescription " means a prescription in writing issued by a registered medical practitioner ;

(7) "medicated tonic" or "medicated wine" means a mixture or compound of any spirit or wine with medicinal substances, whether the wine is fortified with spirit or not and includes medicated bitters;

(8) "registered medical practitioner" means—

(a) a medical practitioner registered under the Bombay Medical Act, 1912, or

(b) a medical practitioner registered or entered on the list under the Bombay Medical Practitioners' Act, 1938;

(9) "Spirituous medicinal preparation" means any medicinal preparation in liquid form containing alcohol and includes a medicated tonic, medicated wine, an Asava and Arishta;

(10) words and expressions not defined in these rules shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

#### PART I.—*Licence for sale of Spirituous Medicinal Preparations.*

4. *Application for licence to sell spirituous medicinal preparations.*—Any person desiring to sell spirituous medicinal preparations shall apply to the Collector for a licence. The application shall contain the following particulars, namely:—

(i) Name and address of the applicant;

(ii) Location of the shop or premises where spirituous medicinal preparations will be sold with the name of the building and the name of street, city, town or village, as the case may be;

(iii) Whether the applicant held any licence in the past to sell any kind of spirituous medicinal preparations; and if so, the year and the period during which such licence was held.

5. *Grant of licence.*—On receipt of the application the Collector may make inquiries for verification of the details stated in the application and also such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If he is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the licence, he may grant the applicant a licence in form "S. M. P. I" on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act.

6. *Duration of licence.*—A licence under rule 4 shall not be granted for a period beyond 31st March next following the date from which it commences and in no case shall such licence be granted for a period exceeding one year.

7. *Source of supply.*—(1) No person holding a licence under rule 5 shall obtain any spirituous medicinal preparation except from a licensed manufacturer or dealer in the State of Bombay or from a Customs House or from any other place in India outside the State of Bombay and except in accordance with the rules, regulations and orders made under the Act.

(2) The licensee shall preserve the invoices and cash memos, passes and other documents relating to the consignments of spirituous medicinal preparations received by him, for a period of one year from the date of receipt of such consignments.

8. *What spirituous medicinal preparations shall not be kept or sold.*—The licensee shall not keep in his licensed premises any spirituous medicinal preparations which have not been lawfully obtained, transported or imported.



9. *Spirituos medicinal preparations which licensee shall not sell.*—The licensee shall not sell medicated tonics or medicated wines containing more than 10 per cent. of alcohol (or containing alcohol in strength more than 17·5 per cent. proof spirit) except those which are classified as spirituos medicinal preparations and regulated as such under the Drugs Act, 1940.

10. *Sale of spirituos medicinal preparations on production of medical prescription.*—Subject to the provisions of rule 9 the licensee shall not sell the following spirituos medicinal preparations to any person unless he produces a medical prescription in that behalf, namely :—

- (a) medicated tonics and medicated wines ;
- (b) *asavas* and *arishtas* specified in the Schedule hereto annexed ;
- (c) any other spirituos medicinal preparations containing more than 10 per cent. of alcohol (or containing alcohol in strength more than 17·5 per cent. of proof spirit) which are intended for internal use :

Provided that the following spirituos medicinal preparations may be sold to any person without the production by such person of any medical prescription, namely :—

- (1) Chlorodyne.
- (2) Camphorodyne.
- (3) Ear Drops.
- (4) Tooth-ache Drops.
- (5) Cholera Mixture.
- (6) Pain Killer.
- (7) Tincture Iodine.
- (8) Tincture Benzoin.

11. *Sales of spirituos medicinal preparations to certain persons.*—(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in rule 10, the licensee may sell any spirituos medicinal preparations without the production of any medical prescription to—

- (1) a person holding licences under rule 5 ;
- (2) a person in charge of a hospital or dispensary ;
- (3) a registered medical practitioner :

provided that he signs the entries pertaining to the purchase of such preparations in the seller's or dealer's book.

(2) All sales made under sub-rule (1) shall be subject to the issue of invoices or cash memos the original of which shall be sent along with the consignments and the duplicate shall be preserved by the licensee for a period of one year from the date of sale. The cash memo or invoice shall show the name and address of the purchaser and the particulars of the spirituos medicinal preparations sold.

12. *Preservation of prescriptions.*—The licensee shall preserve all medical prescriptions presented to him for the purchase of the spirituos medicinal preparations for period of one year from the date of the sale.

13. *Regulation of the business of the licensee.*—(1) A licensee holding a licence under rule 5 may carry on his business under the licence either personally or by an agent or servant duly authorised by him in that behalf.

(2) The licensee shall maintain such accounts and shall furnish such returns to the Collector as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act.

(3) The licensed premises and all spirituous medicinal preparations therein contained shall at all times be open to inspection by any officer empowered under section 122 of the Act.

(4) The licensee shall, when so required by any Prohibition Officer not below the rank of a Sub-Inspector of Excise, give an explanation in writing regarding any irregularity detected at his licensed premises and shall furnish any information regarding the management of the said premises. He shall answer all questions put to him to the best of his knowledge and belief. He shall also, if so required, allow any officer empowered under section 122 of the Act to take samples of spirituous medicinal preparations free of cost for analysis.

(5) The licensee shall provide a visit book paged and stamped with Collector's seal in which visiting officers may record any remarks when inspecting the licensed premises. The licensee shall, on the termination of the period of his licence, deliver up the visit book, the accounts, and the licence to the local Excise Inspector.

(6) No person shall be recognised as the partner of the licensee for the purpose of this licence, unless the partnership has been declared to the Collector before the licence is granted and the names of the partners have been entered jointly in the licence, or if the partnership is entered into after the granting of the licence unless the Collector agrees, on application made to him, to alter the licence and add the name of the partner in the licence.

14. *Licensee to abide by the provisions of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949.*—

(1) A licensee holding a licence under rule 5 shall comply with all orders and directions issued from time to time by the Director, Collector or Superintendent of Excise.

(2) The licensee shall abide by the provisions of the Act and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder and the conditions of the licence and shall give an undertaking to that effect.

PART II.—*Licence to Registered Medical Practitioners and persons in charge of hospitals and dispensaries for dispensing spirituous medicinal preparations.*

15. *Application for licence for dispensing spirituous medicinal preparations.*—Any registered medical practitioner or any person in charge of a hospital or dispensary desiring to dispense spirituous medicinal preparation shall apply to the Collector for a licence for dispensing spirituous medicinal preparations. The application shall contain the following particulars:—

- (i) Name and address of the applicant;
- (ii) Where the applicant is a registered medical practitioner, his registration number and the name of the authority by which he has been registered;
- (iii) Where the applicant is an officer in charge of a hospital or dispensary, his designation and the name of the hospital or dispensary of which he is in charge.

16. *Grant of licence.*—On receipt of an application under rule 15, the Collector may make inquiries for verification of the details stated in the application and also such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If he is satisfied that there is

no objection to grant the licence applied for, he may grant the applicant a licence in form S.M.P. II on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act.

17. *Duration of licence.*—No licence granted under rule 16 shall be granted for a period beyond 31st March next following the date from which it commences and in no case shall such licence exceed the period of one year.

18. *Source of supply.*—(1) No person holding a licence under rule 16 shall obtain any spirituous medicinal preparation except in accordance with the provisions of the rules, regulations and orders made under the Act.

(2) The licensee shall preserve the invoices and cash memos, passes and other documents relating to the consignments of spirituous medicinal preparations received by him, for a period of one year from the date of receipt of such consignments.

19. *Inspection of licensed premises, etc.*—(1) The licensed premises and all spirituous medicinal preparations therein contained shall at all times be open to inspection by any officer empowered under section 122 of the Act.

(2) The licensee shall, when so required by any Prohibition Officer not below the rank of a Sub-Inspector of Excise, give an explanation in writing regarding any irregularities detected at his licensed premises and shall furnish any information regarding a management of the said premises. He shall answer all questions put to him to the best of his knowledge and belief. He shall also if so required allow any officer empowered under section 122 of the Act to take samples of spirituous medicinal preparations free of cost for analysis.

20. *Licensee to abide by the provisions of the Act.*—(1) The licensee shall comply promptly with all orders and directions issued from time to time by the Director Collector or Superintendent of Excise.

(2) The licensee shall abide by the provisions of the Act and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder and the conditions of the licence and shall give an undertaking to that effect.

Whereas the Government of Bombay considers that the rules hereinafter appearing should be brought into force at once ;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 143 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, the Government of Bombay is pleased to make the following rules, namely :—

1. (1) These rules may be called the Bombay Sacramental Wine Rules, 1950.
- (2) They shall extend to the whole of the State of Bombay.
- (3) They shall come into force at once.

2. In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context—

- (1) "Act" means the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 ;
- (2) "authorisation" means an authorisation granted under rule 4 ;
- (3) "Form" means a form appended to these rules ;
- (4) "household" means a group of persons residing and messing jointly as the members of one domestic unit.
- (5) "liquor" means country liquor of a strength not exceeding 20 per cent. of proof spirit ;
- (6) "wine" means any wine, known by the name of Mass Wine or sacramental wine or by any other name which is used for sacramental purposes, of a strength not exceeding 20 per cent. of proof spirit ;
- (7) Words and expressions not defined in these rules shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

3. Any person who according to the religious tenets of the community to which he belongs is required to use wine or liquor for sacramental purposes and who desires to possess, consume or use wine or liquor for such purposes shall make an application to the Collector in Form S.W./A-1 for an authorisation. The application shall be accompanied by a certificate of recommendation granted by the religious head of the community to which the applicant belongs and who is approved by the State Government for the purpose under section 45 of the Act or where there is no such religious head of the community, by a member of the community to which the applicant belongs and who is approved by the State Government under section 45 of the Act. If the applicant is himself such religious head or the person approved under section 45 of the Act he shall make an application direct to the Collector stating that he is such religious head or the person approved under section 45 of the Act.

4. On receipt of the application and the certificate of recommendation, the Collector may make such enquiries as he may deem necessary and if he is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the authorisation applied for, he may grant an authorisation in Form S.W. I on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act.

5. No authorisation shall be granted for a period of more than one year at a time and in no case shall it extend beyond 31st March next following the date of the commencement of the licence.

6. No authorisation shall be granted to any applicant for a quantity exceeding that specified in the certificate of recommendation and in no case shall it be granted to such applicant exceeding such quantity as the Director may determine in this behalf.

7. Wine or liquor required by a person holding an authorisation under rule 4 shall not be obtained from any place except from a Government or licensed depot or from a licensed manufacturer of sacramental wine.

8. A person holding an authorisation under rule 4 shall get all purchases of wine or liquor, as the case may be, entered by the depot-keeper, the Officer in-Charge of the depot, or licensed manufacturer of sacramental wine, as the case may be, in his authorisation.

9. The privilege of purchase, transport and possession of wine or liquor granted under the authorisation shall extend only so far as it is incidental to the use or consumption of such wine or liquor in accordance with these rules and the conditions of the authorisation.

10. Any wine or liquor purchased under an authorisation shall be used solely for sacramental purposes.

11. No licence, permit, pass or authorisation shall be necessary for the consumption or use by any person of wine or liquor for sacramental purpose if such wine or liquor is given to him by a person holding an authorisation under rule 4 in accordance with the conditions of the authorisation.

Whereas the Government of Bombay considers that the rules hereinafter appearing should be brought into force at once ;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 143 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, and in supersession of Government Notification, Revenue Department, No. 7167/39, dated 18th May 1943, the Government of Bombay is pleased to make the following rules, namely :—

1. (1) These rules may be called the Bombay Sacramental Wine Manufacturing Rules, 1950.

(2) They shall extend to the whole State of Bombay.

(3) They shall come into force at once.

2. In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

(1) " Act " means the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 ;

(2) " authorization " means an authorization granted under the Bombay Sacramental Wine Rules, 1950 ;

(3) " Bishop " means a priest of the Roman Catholic Church consecrated as a Governor of a diocese ;

(4) " Form " means a form appended to these rules ;

(5) " Inspector " means an Inspector or a Sub-Inspector of Excise in charge of the taluka or division in which the manufactory is situated ;

(6) " licence " means a licence granted under rule 4 ;

(7) " licensee " means a person who has been granted a licence under rule 4 ;

(8) " manufactory " means the room or building wherein the manufacture of sacramental wine is permitted under a licence ;

(9) " Officer-in-Charge " means a Prohibition Officer appointed for the purpose of supervising the operations at a manufactory ;

(10) " sacramental wine " means wine required for offering the Holy Sacrifice of Mass in a Roman Catholic Church or for use by any person for sacramental purposes and prepared from raisins at a manufactory in accordance with the provisions of these rules ;

(11) words and expressions not defined in these rules shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

3. (1) Any regional head of a religion or religious sect desiring to manufacture and sell sacramental wine shall make an application to the Collector for a licence. The application shall contain the following particulars, namely :—

(1) Name and address of the applicant ;

(2) Place where sacramental wine is to be manufactured ;

(3) Description and plan in duplicate of the manufactory ;

(4) A statement in triplicate specifying the number, size and description of the fermenting, filtering and settling vessels and such other permanent apparatus as are proposed to be used in the manufactory ;

(5) A statement showing the maximum quantity of sacramental wine proposed to be manufactured at the manufactory during the currency of the licence ;

(6) A statement showing the region to which the sacramental wine will be distributed after manufacture together with the number and names of persons with their designations in the region and the quantity of sacramental wine to be distributed to each such person ;

(7) Whether sacramental wine was manufactured in the manufactory in the past and if so, the period during which, sacramental wine was manufactured and the quantity thereof ; and the number and names of places and persons and quantities of sacramental wine distributed to them.

(2) The applicant shall also give an undertaking to the effect that he shall abide by the provisions of the Act and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder and the conditions of the licence.

*Explanation.*—For the purposes of this rule the head of a religion or a religious sect shall include a bishop.

4. On receipt of the application the Collector may make such inquiries as he deem necessary; and if he is satisfied that the manufactory and the apparatus are suit for the manufacture of sacramental wine and that there is no objection to grant the licence, he may, with the previous approval of the Director, grant a licence to the applicant in form S.W.-II, on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Director under the Act. He shall retain the originals of the description, plan and statements referred to in rule 3, forward the duplicates thereof with a copy of the licence to the Officer-in-Charge concerned and return the triplicates, if any, to the licensee.

5. No licence shall be granted for a period of more than one year at a time and in no case shall such period extend beyond 31st March next following the date of the commencement of the licence.

6. A licence may be granted for such quantity as may be fixed by the Collector having regard to the maximum quantity of sacramental wine, if any, manufactured by the applicant and specified by him in his application.

7. The licensee shall carry out all the operations connected with the manufacture of sacramental wine at the manufactory under the supervision of the Officer-in-Charge.

8. The licensee shall use only raisins as base for the manufacture of sacramental wine without adding any sugar, fermenting agent or other substance either before, at the time of, or after fermentation.

9. The licensee shall adopt the following process for manufacturing sacramental wine, namely :—

The licensee shall—

- (a) put raisins into a receptacle, preferably a cask, cut into two halves ;
- (b) wash them if dirty ;
- (c) add water to raisins in proportion of not less than 11 : 10 (thus 22 gallons or more of water for 200 pounds of raisins) ;
- (d) leave the raisins in the water and crush them after 48 hours ;
- (e) put the raisins in the cask for fermentation ;

- (f) stir the fresh crushed juice of raisins, hereinafter called "must" with a clean stick once a days during fermentation ;
- (g) draw off the wine after fifteen day of fermentation ;
- (h) pour it into a vat prepared for filtration ;
- (i) filter it with white sack-cloth (Dutch system) ;
- (j) pour it into a cask after filtration ;
- (k) if the cask is not filled up to the brim with wine, burn some sulphur in the empty space ;
- (l) after a short time, draw the wine off and bottle it.

10. The licensee shall, before proceeding with the manufacture of sacramental wine, send an intimation in form 'A' to the Officer-in-Charge and shall forward a copy thereof to the Collector of the district and the Excise Inspector of the taluka concerned.

11. The licensee shall on demand by the Officer-in-Charge permit samples to be taken for analysis free of cost of the raisins and the water used and of must and sacramental water manufactured at the manufactory.

12. (1) The licensee shall destroy all sacramental wine which, on analysis, is found to be deteriorated or unfit for human consumption in accordance with the orders of the Collector.

(2) The licensee shall not manufacture sacramental wine of a strength exceeding 20 per cent. of proof spirit.

13. (1) The licensee shall not issue any sacramental wine unless he sends previous intimation in form 'B' to the Treasury Officer concerned or the Chief Account Officer of Excise, Bombay, as the case may be he shall forward a copy thereof to the Collector of the district and the Officer-in-Charge.

(2) The licensee shall pay into Government treasury the amount of excise duty, pass (vend) fee and special fee under the Act in respect of the sacramental wine to be issued from the manufactory and shall present to the Officer-in-Charge a copy of the chalan in token of the payment.

14. The licensee shall not issue any quantity of sacramental wine from the manufactory unless he has paid thereon the excise duty, pass (vend) fee and special fee at the rates on force in the date of its issue.

15. The licensee shall not use, distribute or sell sacramental wine manufactured at the manufactory to any person who does not hold an authorization.

16. The licensee shall not issue sacramental wine to any holder of an authorization unless the holder has got a balance of sacramental wine remaining unpurchased against his authorization. The licensee shall on each occasion enter in the authorization the details of the sale of sacramental wine and sign below such entry.

17. The licensee shall distribute sacramental wine according to the directions of the Director.

18. (1) Except as permitted under an authorization sacramental wine shall not be removed except under a transport pass in Form S. W. III.

(2) The transport pass shall be made out in quintuplet which shall be dealt with as under—

Part I shall be retained by the Officer-in-Charge ;

Parts II, III and IV shall be given to the licensee ; and

Part V shall be sent by the Officer-in-Charge to the Excise Inspector at the place of destination.

(3) The licensee shall retain Part II for his record and forward Parts III and IV along with the consignment to the person receiving the consignment. The person receiving the consignment shall retain Part IV and return Part III with his acknowledgement to the Officer-in-Charge who shall file it with the Part I.

19. (1) The licensee shall maintain such accounts and shall furnish such returns as may be prescribed by the Director under this Act.

(2) The licensee shall keep at the manufactory a chart in form 'C' showing the monthly outturn and issue of sacramental wine in each year and also a visit book wherein inspecting Officers may record their remarks.

20. The licensee shall hand over the accounts maintained by him, the chart and the visit book to the Collector on the expiry of the licence period or on the cancellation or suspension of his licence, as the case may be.

2. The licensee shall, if the Director so directs, pay the costs of supervision of the Officer-in-Charge. The licensee shall not manufacture sacramental wine at the said manufactory exceeding ..... gallons during the period of the licence.

3. The licensee shall not carry out any alterations in the said manufactory except with the previous sanction of the Collector.

4. The licensee shall hang up the licence in a conspicuous place in the said manufactory.

5. The said manufactory shall, when not in use, be kept closed under separate locks and keys of the Officer-in-Charge and the licensee.

6. The licensee may authorise in writing a priest to work on his behalf but both the licensee and the priest shall be responsible for the operations connected with the manufacture, storage and sale of sacramental wine carried out at the said manufactory.

8. This licence may be suspended or cancelled in accordance with the provisions of section 54 or 56 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949.

9. In case the licence is suspended or cancelled during the currency of licence period or is not renewed on its expiry, the whole stock of sacramental wine in balance with the licensee on the date of such suspension, cancellation or non-renewal, as the case may be, shall forthwith be surrendered by him to the Collector.

10. The licensee shall comply with all orders and instructions issued to him by the Director, Collector or the Superintendent of Excise.

11. The licensee shall abide by the provisions of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949, and the rules, regulations and orders made thereunder and the conditions of this licence.

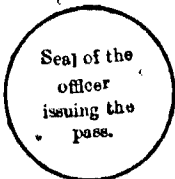

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 143 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), and in supersession of Government Notifications, Revenue Department, No. 1985-B, dated the 16th March 1893, and No. 10800/45(a), dated the 23rd May 1949, and of Commissioner of Excise, Bombay's Notification, No. 23A-8/49, dated the 4th June 1949, the Government of Bombay is pleased to make the following rules, namely :—

1. (1) These rules may be called the Bombay Mhowra Flowers Rules, 1950.
- (2) They extend to the whole of the State of Bombay and shall come into force at once.
2. In these rules unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context—
  - (a) "Act" means the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949;
  - (b) "Form" means a form appended to these rules;
  - (c) "Recognised body" means a person or a body of persons or an institution, whether incorporated or not, recognised by the Commissioner of Prohibition and Excise as such for the purposes of these rules.
3. A licence for the possession or sale of mhowra flowers may be granted to a person who is eligible for the grant of such licence under Government Order in the Revenue Department No. 5735/49, dated 27th June 1950.
4. (1) Any person desiring to possess or sell mhowra flowers shall make an application to the Collector.
- (2) An application for a licence to possess mhowra flowers shall contain the following particulars, namely :—
  - (i) the name and address of the applicant;
  - (ii) the correct address of the place where mhowra flowers will be stored or used;
  - (iii) the quantity of mhowra flowers which will be required for use per year in case of distillers and per month in the case of other persons;
  - (iv) the period for which the licence is required;
  - (v) the details of the use or uses to which the mhowra flowers will be put.
- (3) An application for a licence to sell mhowra flowers shall contain the following particulars, namely :—
  - (i) the name and address of the applicant;
  - (ii) the correct address of the place where mhowra flowers will be kept for sale;
  - (iii) the total quantity of mhowra flowers to be stocked for sale during the course of the licence period;
  - (iv) period for which the licence is required;
  - (v) whether the applicant is a trader or owner of mhowra trees or a recognised body.
5. On receipt of an application under rule 4, the Collector shall make inquiries for verification of the particulars given in the application and such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If he is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the licence applied for he may grant the applicant the licence on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Commissioner under the Act. The licence for the possession of mhowra flowers shall be in Form M. F. I and the licence for the sale thereof shall be in Form M.F.II.

6. Before granting any licence under rule 5 the Collector shall, after making such enquiries as he deems necessary, fix the maximum quantity of mhowra flowers which the licensee may possess—

- (i) during the period of the validity of the licence or at any one time ; and
- (ii) in the case of a licence to be granted for the possession of mhowra flowers for *bona fide* use other than use in distillation during any one month.

7. Every licence shall be granted for one year commencing on the 1st day of April and ending on the 31st day of March next following and may be renewed thereafter for a period of one year on each occasion :

Provided that a licence granted for the first time under these rules may be granted at any time after the 1st day of April up to the 31st March next following ;

Provided further that a licence for the possession of mhowra flowers may be granted or renewed for a period of less than one year, as the Collector deems fit.

8. No permit for the collection of mhowra flowers shall be granted to any person unless—

- (a) the mhowra flowers or the produce of trees belonging to him ; or
- (b) such person is lawfully entitled to the ownership of mhowra flowers of trees not belonging to him.

9. Any person desiring to collect mhowra flowers shall make an application to the Collector of the place where mhowra flowers trees are situated for a permit to collect such flowers. The application shall contain the following particulars, namely :—

- (i) the name and address of the applicant ;
- (ii) the situation of the trees from which mhowra flowers are to be collected, i. e., survey numbers, village, taluka and district.
- (iii) the number of trees ;
- (iv) the name and address of the owner of trees ;
- (v) the place where the mhowra flowers will be transported after collection ;
- (vi) whether the applicant has got any licence for the possession or sale of mhowra flowers at the above place ; if so, its number and date ;
- (vii) the period for which the permit is required to be valid.

10. (1) On receipt of an application under rule 9, the Collector shall make inquiries for the verification of the particulars given in the application and also such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If the Collector is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the permit applied for, he may grant such permit in Form M.F.III on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Commissioner under the Act.

(2) The permit shall contain four parts which shall be dealt with as under :—

Part I shall be retained on the record of the officer issuing the permit ;

Part II shall be given to the applicant ;

Part III shall be sent to the Excise Officer of the place where mhowra flower trees are situated ;

Part IV shall be sent to the Prohibition and Excise Officer at the place where mhowra flowers are to be transported after collection.

11. No permit for the purchase or transport of mhowra flowers shall be granted to any person unless such person holds a licence for the possession or sale of mhowra flowers.

12. Any person desiring to purchase mhowra flowers shall make an application to the Collector of the place where mhowra flowers are to be purchased for a permit to purchase such flowers. The application shall contain the following particulars, namely—

- (1) the name and address of the applicant ;
- (2) whether the applicant holds a licence for the possession or sale of mhowra flowers and its number and the place in respect of which such licence is held ;
- (3) the quantity of mhowra flowers to be purchased ;
- (4) the name and address of the person from whom the mhowra flowers are to be purchased ;
- (5) the place where the mhowra flowers will be transported after purchase ;
- (6) the route by which the mhowra flowers will be transported ;
- (7) the period for which the permit is required to be valid.

13. (1) On receipt of an application under rule 12, the Collector shall make inquiries for verification of the particulars given in the application and also such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If the Collector is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the permit applied for, he may grant such permit in Form M. F. IV on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Commissioner under the Act.

(2) The permit shall contain four parts which shall be dealt with as under :—

Part I shall be retained on the record of the officer issuing the permit ;

Part II shall be given to the applicant ;

Part III shall be sent to the officer of the place where mhowra flowers are to be transported after purchase ;

Part IV shall be sent to the vendor from whom the mhowra flowers are to be purchased.

14. Any person desiring to transport mhowra flowers shall make an application to the Collector or any officer duly authorised in that behalf for a permit to transport mhowra flowers. The application shall contain the following particulars, namely :—

- (i) the name and address of the applicant ;
- (ii) the number of the licence for the possession or sale, as the case may be, of mhowra flowers held by the applicant ;
- (iii) the quantity of mhowra flowers to be transported ;
- (iv) the place from and to which the mhowra flowers are to be transported ;
- (v) the route by which the mhowra flowers will be transported ;
- (vi) the name and address of the person from whose premises mhowra flowers will be removed ;
- (vii) the number of the licence held by the vendor ;
- (viii) the period for which the permit is required to be valid.

15. (1) On receipt of an application under rule 14, the Collector or the authorised officer shall make inquiries for verification of the particulars given in the application and also such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If the Collector or the authorised officer, as the case may be, is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the permit applied for, he may grant such permit in Form M.F. V on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Commissioner under the Act.

(2) The permit shall contain four parts, which shall be dealt with as under :—

Part I shall be retained on the record of the officer issuing the permit ;

Part II shall be sent to the person supplying the mhowra flowers ;

Part III shall be sent to the Prohibition and Excise Officer in whose jurisdiction the place of business of the permit-holder is situated ; and

Part IV shall accompany the consignment of mhowra flowers and thereafter shall be kept by the permit-holder.

16. No pass for the import of mhowra flowers shall be granted to any person unless such person holds a licence for the possession or sale of mhowra flowers :

Provided that such pass may be granted to other persons provided the quantity to be imported does not exceed the prescribed limit in weight under sub-section (2) of section 60 of the Act and mhowra flowers are to be used for *bona fide* scientific, educational, medicinal or domestic purpose.

17. Any person desiring to import mhowra flowers shall make an application to the Collector for a pass to import mhowra flowers. The application shall contain the following particulars, namely :—

(a) the name and address of the importer ;

(b) the number of the licence for the possession or sale, as the case may be, of mhowra flowers held by the applicant ;

(c) the quantity of mhowra flowers authorised for possession under the licence or without a licence, as the case may be ;

(d) the quantity of mhowra flowers to be imported ;

(e) the place from and to which the mhowra flowers are to be imported ;

(f) the route by which the mhowra flowers will be imported ;

(g) the name and address of the person from whom the mhowra flowers are to be imported ;

(h) the purpose or purposes for which the mhowra flowers are to be imported ;

(i) the period for which the pass is required to be valid.

18. (1) On receipt of an application under rule 17, the Collector shall make inquiries for verification of the particulars given in the application and also such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If the Collector is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the pass applied for, he may grant such pass in Form M. F. VI on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Commissioner under the Act.

(2) The pass shall contain four parts, which shall be dealt with as under :—

Part I shall be retained on the record of the officer issuing the pass ;

Part II shall be sent to the person from whom the mhowra flowers are to be imported ;

Part III shall be sent to the Prohibition and Excise authority of the place from which mhowra flowers are to be imported ;

Part IV shall be handed over to the applicant and it shall accompany the consignment under import and thereafter be kept with the applicant.

19. No pass for the export of mhowra flowers shall be granted to any person unless such person holds a licence for the possession or sale of mhowra flowers or a permit for buying mhowra flowers ;

Provided that such pass may be granted to other persons provided the quantity to be exported does not exceed the prescribed limit in weight under sub-section (2) of section 60 of the Act.

20. Any person desiring to export mhowra flowers shall make an application to the Collector for a pass to export such flowers. The application shall be accompanied by an import authorisation or a no-objection certificate issued by an officer duly authorised in this behalf of the place to which mhowra flowers are to be exported and shall contain the following particulars, namely :—

- (a) the name and address of the exporter ;
- (b) the number of the licence for the possession or sale of mhowra flowers held by the applicant or the number of permit for buying mhowra flowers, if any, held by him ;
- (c) the quantity of mhowra flowers to be exported ;
- (d) the place from and to which mhowra flowers are to be exported ;
- (e) the route by which mhowra flowers will be exported ;
- (f) the name and address of the person to whom the mhowra flowers are to be exported ;
- (g) the period for which the pass is required to be valid ;
- (h) the number and date of the import authorisation or no-objection certificate granted by the Excise authority of the place to which mhowra flowers are to be exported.

21. (1) On receipt of an application under rule 20, the Collector shall make inquiries for verification of the particulars given in the application and also such other inquiries as he deems necessary. If the Collector is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the pass applied for, he may, with the previous approval of the Commissioner, grant such pass in Form M. F. VII on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Commissioner under the Act.

(2) The pass shall contain four parts, which shall be dealt with as under :—

Part I shall be retained on the record of the officer issuing the pass ;

Part II shall be sent to the person supplying the mhowra flowers ;

Part III shall be sent to the officer of the place to which mhowra flowers are to be exported and who has issued the import authorisation or no-objection certificate ;

Part IV shall accompany the consignment of the mhowra flowers and thereafter it may be kept by the person to whom the mhowra flowers are sent.

22. Nothing in the aforesaid rules shall apply to the collection, transport, sale, purchase or possession of mhowra flowers permitted under the first proviso to sub-section (2) of section 60 of the Act or to the transport by rail of such flowers permitted under the second proviso to the said sub-section (2).

5. The licensee shall maintain from day-to-day true and correct account in the form prescribed by the Commissioner under the Act. The accounts shall be clearly written in a book, pagged and sealed with the seal of the Collector.

6. The licensee shall furnish the Excise Officer of the in which the said premises are situated, not later than the fifth day of each month with a return in the form prescribed by the Commissioner under the Act.

7. The licensee's premises, vats and other receptacles used by him for the storage of mhowra flowers and the accounts maintained by him under condition 5 shall, at all times, be open to inspection by the Commissioner, Collector or any Officer duly authorised in that behalf.

8. The licensee shall keep his premises, vats and other receptacles for the storage of mhowra flowers clean and in good condition.

9. Except with the permission of the Collector, the licensee shall not sell, transfer or sublet the right conferred upon him by this licence nor shall he in connection with the exercise of the said right enter into any agreement or arrangement which, in the opinion of the Collector, is of the nature of a sub-lease. If any question arises whether any agreement or arrangement is in the nature of a sub-lease, the decision of the Collector on such question shall be final and binding on the licensee.

10. No person shall be recognised as the partner of the licensee for the purpose of this licence unless the partnership has been disclosed to the Collector before the licence is granted and the names of the partners have been entered jointly in the licence or if the partnership is entered into after the granting of this licence unless the Collector agrees on application made to him to alter the licence and to add the name or names of the partner or partners in the licence.

11. The licensee shall maintain at the said premises a "Visit Book" pagged and sealed with the seal of the Collector in which visiting Officers may record any remarks when inspecting the said premises. The licensee shall on the termination of the period of this licence, deliver up the said book, the accounts and the licence to the Prohibition Officer in whose jurisdiction the said premises are situated.

12. The licensee shall comply with all rules, orders or directions which may be made or issued by the State Government or any competent Officer under the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949, from time to time during the currency of the licence.

5. The licensee shall not, without permission from the Collector, sell mhowra flowers to any person except:—

(a) in the State of Bombay, to a person holding a valid licence for the possession or sale of mhowra flowers under the Bombay Mhowra Flowers Rules, 1950, and a permit for the purchase or transport of the same under the said rules; and

(b) outside the State of Bombay, to a person holding an import authorisation or a no-objection certificate from a duly authorised officer of the place where mhowra flowers are to be sent and valid permits for the purchase and export thereof under the said rules.

6. The licensee shall not, except with the permission of the Collector, effect any sales of mhowra flowers before 6-0 a.m. (S.T.) or after 6-0 p.m. (S.T.).

7. The licensee shall maintain from day-to-day a true and correct account in the form prescribed by the Commissioner under the Act. The accounts shall be clearly written in a book, paged and sealed with the seal of the Collector.

8. The licensee shall furnish the Prohibition and Excise Officer of the in which the said premises are situated, not later than the fifth day of each month, with a return in the form prescribed by the Commissioner under the Act.

9. The licensee's premises, vats and other receptacles used by him for the storage of mhowra flowers and the accounts and registers maintained by him under condition 7 shall, at all times, be open to inspection by the Commissioner, Collector or any Officer duly authorised in that behalf.

10. The licensee shall keep his premises, vats and other receptacles for the storage of mhowra flowers clean and in good condition.

11. Except with the permission of the Collector, the licensee shall not sell transfer or sublet the right conferred upon him by this licence nor shall he in connection with the exercise of the said right, enter into any agreement or arrangement which, in the opinion of the Collector, is of the nature of a sub-lease. If any question arises whether any agreement or arrangement is in the nature of a sub-lease, the decision of the Collector on such question shall be final and binding on the licensee.

12. No person shall be recognised as the partner of the licensee for the purposes of this licence unless the partnership has been disclosed to the Collector before the licence is granted and the names of the partners have been entered jointly in the licence or if the partnership is entered into after the granting of this licence, unless the Collector agrees on application made to him to alter the licence and to add the name or names of the partner or partners in the licence.

13. The licensee shall maintain at the said premises a "Visit Book" paged and sealed with the seal of the Collector in which visiting officer may record any remarks when inspecting the said premises. The licensee shall, on the termination of the period of this licence, deliver up the said book, the accounts and the licence to the Prohibition Officer in whose jurisdiction the said premises are situated.



14. The licensee shall comply with all rules, orders or directions which may be made or issued by the State Government or any competent Officer under the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949, from time to time, during the currency of the licence.

It shall entirely be within the discretion of the Collector to permit or not the assignee of the holder of the licence in case of sale or transfer, or the heir or legal representative of the holder of the licence in case of death, to have the benefit of the licence for the unexpired portion of the term for which it is granted.

19. This licence may be suspended or cancelled by the Collector in accordance with the provisions of section 54 or 56 of the Act.

2. In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

(1) " Act " means the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 ;

(2) " duty-paid foreign liquor " means foreign liquor on which—

(i) duty leviable under the Indian Tariff Act, 1934, or the Sea Customs Act, 1878 ; or

(ii) the excise or countervailing duty under the Act, has been paid ;

(3) " place of import " means the place outside the State of Bombay to which duty-paid foreign liquor is exported ;

(4) words and expressions not defined in these rules shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

3. No person shall export duty-paid foreign liquor to any part of India except in accordance with the provisions of the Act and these rules.

4. Any person desiring to export duty-paid foreign liquor shall apply to the Collector of his district for an export pass. The application shall contain the following particulars, namely :—

(1) Name and address of the applicant ;

(2) Kind of licence or permit held by the applicant and its number ;

(3) Kind and quantity of duty-paid foreign liquor to be exported ;

(4) Place to which duty-paid foreign liquor is to be exported ;



(5) Name and address of the person to whom duty-paid foreign liquor is to be exported;

(6) Route (stating the place up to which removal of duty-paid foreign liquor will be by road during its transit in the State of Bombay);

(7) Reasons for the export of duty-paid foreign liquor.

5. Such application shall be accompanied by an import pass or no-objection certificate granted by the Collector or Chief Excise Authority of the place of import.

6. (1) If the Collector, after making such inquiries as he deems necessary, is satisfied that there is no objection to grant the pass, he may grant such pass in the form hereto annexed.

- (7) Route (state also the place up to which removal of duty-paid foreign liquor will be by road during its transit in the State of Bombay).
- (8) Period for which this pass shall be valid.

This pass is granted under and subject to the provisions of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949, and the Bombay Duty-paid Foreign Liquor (Export) Rules, 1950, made thereunder and subject to the condition that the whole quantity of duty-paid foreign liquor shall be exported in one consignment only and its bulk shall not be broken in transit.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 107 of the Bombay Prohibition Act 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), the Commissioner hereby remits wholly the fees leviable on any potable foreign liquor removed from a Custom House or a Land Custom Station in the State of Bombay or across the boundary of the State of Bombay to any place within the said State if such removal is—

(i) by or on account of a person holding a special permit granted under section 41, or

(ii) by a foreign tourist holding an interim permit granted under section 47.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 144 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), the Prohibition Commissioner, Bombay, is pleased to make the following regulations, namely:—

1. These regulations may be called the Bombay Foreign Liquor (Sale on Cash) Regulations, 1950.

2. In these regulations, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context—

(1) "Foreign Liquor Rules" means the Bombay Foreign Liquor Rules, 1950;

(2) "Foreign Liquor" has the meaning assigned to it in the Foreign Liquor Rules;

(3) "Licensee" means a person holding a licence for sale of foreign liquor at a depot established under the Foreign Liquor Rules or a person holding a hotel licence or club licence under the said Rules;

(4) "Permit holder" means a person who holds a permit under the Foreign Liquor Rules and who is authorized to purchase foreign liquor from a licensee under the said rules.

3. A licensee shall not sell any foreign liquor except for cash.

4. A licensee or his authorized agent or servant shall make out a cash memo. in duplicate which shall be signed by the licensee or his authorized agent or servant, as the case may be.

5. The original copy of the cash memo. shall be handed over to the permit holder and the duplicate copy shall be retained by the licensee for his record.

6. The cash memo. shall clearly show—

(1) the name of the licensee, his licence number and the nature of the licence held by him;

(2) the name of the permit holder, his permit number and the nature of the permit held by him;

(3) the details regarding the brand and quantity of foreign liquor sold; and

(4) the amount charged in respect of the sale of foreign liquor to the permit holder.

7. The duplicate copies of cash memos shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by a Prohibition Officer not lower in rank than a Sub-Inspector of Excise or any Prohibition Officer duly empowered under section 122 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949.

8. The provisions of these regulations shall, so far as may be, apply also to the sale of foreign liquor from a Government Depot.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-clause (iv) of clause (a), clause (e) and sub-clause (vi) of clause (f) of sub-section (1) of section 144 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), and in supersession of all previous notifications and orders issued in this behalf, the Prohibition and Excise Commissioner, Bombay, is pleased to make the following rules, namely :—

1. *Short title.*—These rules may be called the Bombay Toddy Tapping Rules, 1949.

2. *Definitions.*—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context—

(a) " Act " means the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 ;

(b) " Excise Inspector " includes a Sub-Inspector or Assistant Inspector in charge of a taluka, petha or mahal ;

(c) " Form " means a Form appended to these rules ;

(d) " licence " means a licence for tapping toddy producing trees and drawing toddy therefrom ;

(e) " licensing authority " means an officer who has been duly authorised under section 52 of the Act, to grant a licence for the tapping of any toddy producing tree or the drawing of toddy from such trees ;

(f) " tapping a tree " includes " drawing toddy from a tree " ; and

(g) " tree " means a toddy producing tree.

3. *Purposes for which licence granted.*—A licence may be granted for the purpose of supplying toddy to shops or tree-foot booths, for retail sale.

4. *Period of licence.*—Unless specific orders are issued to grant licences for a shorter period, a licence shall ordinarily be granted for a period of one year from the 1st day of April to the 31st day of March next following (both days inclusive) in the Ahmednagar District and the Ratnagiri District and from the 1st day of August to the 31st day of July next following (both days inclusive) elsewhere :

Provided that a licence granted on a date subsequent to 1st April or 1st August as the case may be, shall be granted only for the period from such date to the 31st day of March or the 31st day of July next following, as the case may be.

5. *Application for licence.*—Any person, who has obtained a licence to sell toddy by retail at a shop or a tree-foot booth, or obtained from the Collector permission in writing, for using toddy for domestic consumption may make an application for a licence to the licensing authority at least fifteen days previous to the date of tapping

a tree. Such application shall be in triplicate in Form "A". It shall be accompanied by a Treasury challan in duplicate showing that the instalment of duty required by rule 14 or 14A has been paid :

Provided that an application for tapping trees situated on Government forest lands shall be in quadruplicate :

Provided further that trees situate in the areas in charge of different Excise Inspectors or trees, toddy from which is supplied to different shops or booths shall not be included in one and the same application.

6. *Particulars to be furnished by applicant.*—The applicant shall (in addition to the information to be supplied in Form "A") furnish to the licensing authority the following information, namely :—

(1) In the case of a licence for the purpose of supplying toddy to the applicant's toddy shop—

(a) when the number of trees to be tapped within a prescribed limit of a city or town for the supply of toddy to the applicant's shop outside the city or town has been fixed by the Collector—

(i) details regarding the trees which are within the limit, and

(ii) a declaration to the effect that the number of trees applied for is not in excess of the number so fixed ;

(2) In the case of a licence for the purpose of supplying toddy to the applicant's tree-foot booth—

(a) details regarding the location of the booth ;

(b) the distance of the booth from the trees if the trees are not in the same part or survey number ; and

(c) a declaration that the trees are situated in the survey number or numbers sanctioned for the booth by the Collector or within such distance of the applicant's booth as has been generally or specially prescribed by the Collector in the behalf.

(3) In the case of trees belonging to Government, a certificate from the Government Department concerned to the effect that the applicant has been granted permission to tap the trees.

(4) A statement to the effect that to the best of his knowledge the trees do not fall within an area where tapping of trees has been prohibited by Government or where the trees so fall, the applicant has been allowed to tap the trees under Government memorandum/letter No. dated

7. *Disposal of application.*—(1) On being satisfied that the applicant has fully complied with the provisions of rules 5 and 6 and that the particulars furnished by him are correct, the licensing authority shall, unless he sees any objection, endorse under his signature the duplicate and triplicate copies of the application authorising the applicant to mark and number the trees in accordance with rule 8 or 9, as the case may be, and to tap them. If the licensing authority is of the opinion that there is any objection to tapping any of the trees mentioned in the application, he shall allow the applicant to mark, number and tap those trees only the tapping of which is free from objection, in which case the licensing authority shall endorse the duplicate and triplicate copies of the application accordingly and inform the applicant that he may select other trees in lieu of the trees objected to

and make a fresh application in respect of the same. Where such licensing authority is subordinate to the Collector, he shall immediately report to the Collector the reasons for his refusal to grant a licence in respect of all or any of the trees objected to, to enable the Collector to pass orders on any appeal filed by the applicant in this behalf.

(2) The licensing authority shall after entering in red ink the serial number of the licence as entered in the Register maintained under rule 11 on all the copies of the application and on the Treasury challans, return the duplicate copy of the application to the applicant and forward the triplicate copy with a copy of the Treasury challan to the Excise Inspector in charge of the area where the trees are situated, for examination of the trees as required by rule 13. In the case of trees situated on Government forest lands the licensing authority shall retain the certificate furnished to him under clause (3) of rule 6 and after making a remark to that effect on all the copies of the application return the duplicate and quadruplicate copies of the application to the applicant for presenting them to the Forest Officer in charge of the Range as required by rule 9.

8. *Marking and numbering trees.*—(1) Within ten days from the date on which the applicant is authorised to mark and number the trees permitted to be tapped (hereinafter referred to as the said trees), under sub-rule (1) of rule 7, the applicant shall proceed to mark and number the said trees by means of a stencil or otherwise, as the Director may from time to time direct, with paint previously approved by the Superintendent of Excise.

(2) The following instructions shall be observed in marking and numbering the trees, namely :—

(a) Licences of a kind shall be numbered serially, and the following letters shall denote the kinds of licences, namely :—

S—Shop.

T—Tree-foot booth.

(b) The marking shall be in Form "B" and indicate on each of the said trees the year, the consecutive number of the licence, its distinctive letter "S" or "T", as the case may be, and the number of the trees and where the toddy drawn therefrom is to be supplied to shops outside the district, also such additional mark or marks as the Superintendent of Excise may direct in this behalf.

9. *Marking and numbering of trees in Government forest lands.*—When the said trees are situated in Government forest lands, the licensee shall present the duplicate and quadruplicate copies of the application to the Forest Officer in charge of the Range within whose jurisdiction the said trees are situated, and obtain back the duplicate copy from the Forest Officer in charge of the Range endorsed and dated to acknowledge receipt of the quadruplicate copy. The Forest Officer in charge of the Range shall retain the quadruplicate copy with him. The licensee shall then settle with the Forest Officer in charge of the Range the date on which he should mark and number the said trees under his supervision. If, for a period of seven days from the date settled by the licensee the Forest Officer in charge of the Range does not present himself for supervising the marking and numbering of the said trees, the licensee may proceed to mark and number them in his absence in the manner provided in rule 8.

10. *No tapping of trees not marked and numbered, and no exchange of trees.*—The licensee shall not tap or cause to be tapped or drawn toddy from any of the said trees until the said trees have been marked and numbered in the manner provided

in rule 8 or 9. The licensee shall not tap, or cause to be tapped, or draw toddy from any tree not permitted to be tapped. The licensing authority shall not permit any trees to be tapped in exchange for the said trees on the ground that the said trees have proved barren or unproductive of toddy at any time during the period of the licence. No exchange of the said trees shall be permitted on any other ground except with the permission of the Director.

11. *Toddy Register.*—(1) The licensing authority shall maintain a register in Form "C" in which he shall enter the full particulars of all applications after they are verified by him as required by rule 7. On receipt of the challans he shall also note in the register the dates of payment, and the amount of duty actually paid by each licensee under rule 14 or 14A. The Excise Inspector shall also maintain a similar register of toddy trees.

(2) The licensing authority shall, from time to time, examine the register to see that the instalment of duty due from each licensee has been paid, and in case of default he shall take immediate steps to recover the arrears with interest due thereon from the licensee.

12. *Preparation of licence.*—After entering the particulars of the application in the register under rule 11, the licensing authority shall prepare a licence and after signing it himself, forward it to the Excise Inspector concerned for delivery to the applicant.

13. *Examination of trees by the Excise Inspector.*—(1) The Excise Inspector shall take the earliest opportunity to visit the cart, plantation, survey number or other place where the said trees are situated, and examine the said trees and satisfy himself that the provisions of these rules have been duly complied with.

(2) If during the examination of the said trees, the Excise Inspector notices any minor irregularity in the marking or numbering of the said trees, he may ask the licensee to rectify it. But if the irregularity on the marking, numbering, or tapping of the said trees, or in marking the number and distance of the said trees from the booth is so material as not to be remedied by mere rectification, he shall bring the irregularity to the notice of the Superintendent of Excise.

14. *Payment of duty.*—(1) The licensee shall, before making an application under rule 5, pay into a Government Treasury one-third of the total duty leviable in respect of the said trees at the rate fixed under section 109 (1) of the Act :

\*Provided that if an application is made on any date after the 1st day of April in the Ahmednagar District and the Ratnagiri District or the 1st day of August elsewhere, the licensee shall pay as the first instalment an amount equal to the aggregate of the instalments that would have become payable had the licence been granted from the 1st day of April or the 1st day of August, as the case may be, and shall pay the subsequent instalments, if any, on the dates specified in sub-rule (2) and in the manner specified in sub-rule (3).

(2) Of the remaining two-thirds of the duty, one-third shall, in the Ratnagiri District, be paid on the 1st day of August and the remaining one-third on the 1st day of December and elsewhere on the 1st day of December and the 1st day of April respectively :

Provided that the licensee may, and if the licensing authority so directs, in any case, shall, pay the full duty in advance.



(3) The licensee shall pay the second and third instalments of the duty direct into the Treasury of the Chief Account Officer of Excise or the Huzur or Taluka Treasury according as the licence pertains to Bombay or mofussil, by presenting a challan in triplicate. The Treasury Officer shall forward one copy of the challan to the Excise Inspector concerned, and in Bombay to the Superintendent of Excise, Bombay, return the second copy to the licensee and retain the third copy on his record.

14A. As licences for the sale of toddy and tapping licences will ordinarily be granted only for a period of eight months ending 31st March 1950 for the year 1949-50 in the districts other than the Ahmednagar District and the Ratnagiri District, the licensee in a district other than these two districts shall, before making an application under rule 5, pay into a Government Treasury one-half of the total annual duty leviable in respect of the said trees at the rates fixed under sub-section (1) of section 109 of the Act; the remaining one-half of the duty shall be paid on or before 30th November 1949 :

Provided that if an application is made on any date on or after the first day of December 1949, the licensee shall pay the full annual duty leviable in respect of the said trees before making the application.

15. *Liability to pay interest on duty overdue.*—The licensee shall pay interest at such rate as Government may from time to time direct on all instalments of duty not paid by him on the dates specified in rule 14 or 14A, as the case may be. Any payment made by the licensee, shall, unless the Director otherwise directs, be appropriated, first towards the payment of the interest, if any, and the balance towards the payment of the instalments.

16. *Liability of the licensee to pay the full duty leviable.*—The licensee shall pay the full duty in respect of the said trees irrespective of the fact whether the trees have actually been tapped or not, and save as provided in rule 17, shall not claim any refund of duty paid by him under rule 14 or 14A.

17. *Refund of Duty.*—The applicant shall, on application, be entitled to the refund of so much of the duty as has already been paid by him in respect of tree tapping of which is found objectionable by the licensing authority, and in respect of which a licence has not been granted. A copy of the Treasury challan in respect of the duty paid by him shall be attached to each application for refund.

18. *Time for tapping trees and drawing toddy therefrom.*—A tree shall not be tapped nor shall toddy be drawn therefrom before 4-30 a.m. (S. T.) or after sunset and toddy drawn from a tree shall not, without the written permission of the Collector or the Superintendent of Excise concerned be removed after 8 p.m. (S.T.).

19. *Transport of toddy under a pass and issue of Nokarnamas.*—The licensee shall tap the trees and remove toddy drawn therefrom only under cover of a transport pass in form "D", issued either by himself or by an agent or servant duly authorised by him in this behalf by a written nokarnama signed by himself and countersigned by an Excise Officer not lower in rank than a Sub-Inspector :

Provided that, any such nokarnama signed by the licensee shall also be valid unless and until countersignature is refused. If for any reason the Collector orders the withdrawal of any nokarnama issued by the licensee, the nokarnama shall be forthwith withdrawn. For every nokarnama issued by him the licensee shall pay such fee as may from time to time be prescribed for this privilege by the Director under clause (b) of section 144 of the Act. The person authorised to tap the said trees and transport toddy under this rule shall, whenever so employed, carry in his possession a copy of the nokarnama certified under the

signature of the aforesaid officer. No nokarnama shall be issued to any person under twenty-one years of age.

20. *Tapping of additional trees.*—(1) A licensee who is desirous of obtaining permission to tap additional trees during the currency of his licence shall forward an application in Form "A" to the licensing authority together with his licence and comply with the provisions of rules 5, 6, 14 and 14A in so far as they are applicable in respect of the additional trees covered by the application. The licensee shall also furnish the following additional information, namely:—

(a) If the toddy drawn from the additional trees is to be supplied to his shop, the licensee shall attach a certificate from the Superintendent of Excise concerned to the effect that he has no objection to the permission being granted for tapping additional trees covered by the application.

(b) If the toddy drawn from the additional trees is to be supplied to his tree-foot booth the licensee shall attach a statement that the number of additional trees together with those already licensed to be tapped does not exceed the maximum number of trees fixed for his tree-foot booth.

(2) The licensing authority shall dispose of the application in the manner provided in rules 7, 11 and 12 and after satisfying himself that the provisions of sub-rule (1) have been complied with, may grant the permission. If the licensee is permitted to tap any additional trees, he shall mark and number them as required under rule 8 or 9, as the case may be, and comply with the provisions of rules 10 and 14 or 14A as the case may be:

Provided that the licensing authority shall, instead of preparing a fresh licence, endorse on the licensee's licence in red ink that the licensee has been permitted to tap and draw toddy from the additional trees specified in the endorsement.

20A. *Permission to tap trees after expiry of licence.*—If a licensee makes an application to the licensing authority for permission to tap the trees in respect of which he was granted the licence after the expiry of the period of his licence at the end of the year, he may be permitted for special reasons to do so for a period not exceeding one month during the next succeeding year, if he pays in advance into a Government Treasury duty at the rate prescribed by Government in that behalf.

21. *Transfer of licence.*—No licence shall be transferred to the name of another person without the sanction of the Collector:

Provided that neither the licensee nor the transferee shall be entitled to claim any refund of duty if the transfer of a licence is refused, or a reduced number of trees is sanctioned while transferring the licence:

Provided further that the heir or legal representative of the licensee or of the transferee, as the case may be, shall have no claim to the transfer of the licence in his name.

22. *Suspension and cancellation of licences.*—The licence shall be liable to be suspended or cancelled in accordance with the provisions of sections 54 and 56 of the Act.

23. *Additional restrictions not provided for in these rules.*—Trees tapped in an area where the rate of duty is lower for supply of toddy to shops in an area where the rate of duty is higher shall be subject to such additional restrictions, as the Director may, from time to time, impose either generally or in individual cases.

24. *Saving.*—Nothing in these rules shall—

(i) apply to Nira, or

(ii) affect the operation of any special rules for the tapping of trees for any purpose other than those specified in rule 3.

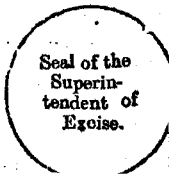

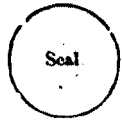

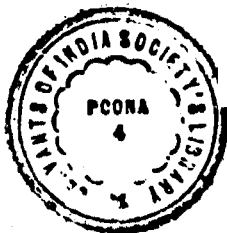
