#### PREFACE

The slum areas in the towns and cities have so far been inadequately attended to. With the increase in pace of urbanisation in recent years, the problem has come into prominence. There is a paramount necessity for clearing the slum areas both from social and hygienic point of view. It is, therefore, essential to provide the inhabitants of these slum areas with an alternate accommodation.

A sum of Rs. 2.80 lacs was provided by the State and Central Governments to the Municipal Committee, Moga for constructing suitable residential houses to accommodate the slum dwellers.

The Housing Department of Punjab Government proposed that a Socio-Economic Survey of Slum Areas of Moga should be conducted by the Economic & Statistical Organisation, Government Punjab. In response to this the Ludhiana Wing of the Organisation under the guidance and supervision of Shri Jagir Singh Sandhu, Deputy Economic and Statistical Adviser to Govt. Punjab, conducted this survey in January, 1960. The socio-economic and housing conditions of the residents of the selected slum areas have been briefly described in this report. The survey is the first of its kind undertaken by this organisation. There is a great need of conducting similar surveys in big cities like Amritsar, Jullurdur and Ludhiana which are the growing industrial and commercial centres of the State.

Thanks are due to the Municipal Committee, Moga for their co-operation.


