Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to enquire into the relations now existing for financial and administrative purposes between the Supreme Government and the various Provincial Governments in India, and between the Provincial Governments and the authorities subordinate to them, and to report whether, by measures of decentialization or otherwise, those relations can be simplified and improved, and the system of Government better adapted both to meet the requirements and promote the welface of the different Provinces, and, without impairing its stiength and unity, to bring the executive power into closer touch with local conditions

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your know ledge and ability, have authorized and appointed and do, by these Presents, authorize and appoint you, the said Sir Henry William Primiose* (Churman), Sir Frederic Styles Philpin Lely, Sir Steyrung William Edgerly, Romesh Chunder Dutt, William Stevenson Meyer, and William Lionel Hickens to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said enquiry

And for the better effecting the pulposes of this Our Commission, We do, by these Presents, give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power, at any place in Our said United Kingdom of Great Britin and Ireland or in India, to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission and also, whether in Our said United Kingdom, or in India, to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever

And We do, by these Presents, authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid

Sir Henry Primrose subsequently resigned and Mr C F H Hobbouse MP then Under Secretary of State for India and now Secretary to the Treasury was appointed Churm in of the Commission—see page 1v

And We do, by these Presents, will and ordain that this, Our Commission, shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment

And We do further ordun that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do

And Our furthe will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration
