ADMINISTRATION REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1921-1922.

I.—THE COMMITTEE.

1. The year under review was signalized by an expansion of the Schools Committee in conformity with the Bombay Primary Education Act of 1920, Section 19 thereof provides that in addition to the 12 members of the Committee, chosen from amongst themselves by the Members of the Municipal Corporation, there should be four co-opted Members, two of them ladies, all these four to be chosen by them from the general public outside their own ranks. Effect was given to this provision from August 1921. At the beginning of the year under review, *i.e.*, on 1st April 1921 the Committee was constituted as follows:—

2. Dr. Jehangir J. Cursetji's term of office as Chairman for the calendar year 1921 expiring, Dr. M. C. Javle, J. P., was unanimously elected Chairman for 1922. The Committee placed on record "their sense of high appreciation of the great zeal and selfless devotion with which Dr. Jehangir had discharged his onerous duties as the Chairman of the Committee" and passed a special vote of cordial thanks in recognition of his services.

5. These four vacancies were filled by the re-election of the first three out of the above-mentioned gentlemen and the election of Dr. Rustomji N. R. Ranjina, L.M. & S., J.P.

6. Dr. Nadirshaw H. E. Sukhia tendered in January his resignation of his Membership of the Schools Committee with effect from 1st April 1922. In forwarding it, as desired by Dr. Sukhia, to the Corporation, the Committee placed on record "their appreciation of the zeal and earnestness, with which the doctor had discharged his duties as a Member of the Committee for the long and unbroken period of the last seven years."

7. During the year under review the Committee held in all 26 Meetings, 11 out of which were Ordinary Monthly Meetings and the remaining Special or Adjourned ones.

8. To the Standing Sub-Committee for the Inspection of New Premises for Schools was added during the year, another for considering all proposals from the Secretary or otherwise for the opening of New Schools or the taking over of Private Schools, for being maintained as Municipal Schools. For various other casual purposes, six more Sub-Committees were appointed, one of them having to discharge particularly onerous duties in the course of the investigation, entrusted to it, about various matters connected with the appointment of Miss Wells, referred to later in para. 21. In addition to the Committee and the Sub-Committee work, abovementioned, Members also carried out the work of "Inspection of Municipal Schools" assigned to them, as provided for in Bye-law 7— (2) and (3), some Members visiting other Schools also. These inspections are of the nature of *sûr* visits and have been found in various ways to have a salutary effect.

9. R. B. D. G. Padhye continued throughout the year to be the Committee's Secretary. The Staff and the establishment of the Committee's Office was re-organized in accordance with the new triplicate division and now consists of one Chief Clerk, Mr. Shamrao N. Chachad, one Accountant, three Head Clerks and seven Clerks.

II.—General Progress.

10. The year under review was another year of sustained progress all round. True to the policy of improvement and expansion at as rapid a pace as possible, inaugurated in 1917-1918, the Committee have paid as much attention to quality as to quantity, the ideal they have in view being to make education not merely universal but also popular and useful. They will leave the following facts and figures to tell their own tale.

11. By far the most important step taken during the year from the Schools Committee's point of view, was the submission by them to the Corporation in November 1921, of carefully considered proposals for taking immediate action under the new Primary Education Act for the City, enacted by Government early in the year, and introducing Free and Compulsory Primary Education throughout the City under a graduated programme, spread over a period of three years dating from April 1922. Under the Scheme, submitted by the Committee in 1917-1918 and approved of by the Corporation and the Government, the goal of Free and Compulsory Education was to be attained in 10 years. Aware of the feeling expressed in some quarters that this period was much too long, the Schools Committee have been glad to revise their original proposals, so as to quicken the pace of advance, specially in the light of the facilities, the new Act affords by permitting the introduction of Free and Compulsory Education, piecemeal, and ward by ward, and for males and females or for males only, as may be found convenient. The Committee's new proposals seek to accelerate the progress towards the goal very materially, the full attainment being dated for 1924-1925. They were referred by the Corporation to a Committee and have just (29th July 1922) come back to the Schools Committee with certain modifications for further report. This the Committee intend to present quickly and they may well give the assurance of their fixed determination to move in the matter with as much despatch as possible.

12. The net growth in the number of Schools, during the year under review, was 25, bringing the total number of Municipal Schools to 298, 33 of them being Night Schools and the rest Full-time Day Schools. The new Schools opened were 25 and the Private Schools, taken over to be maintained as Municipal Schools, were 4. Owing to fall of attendance, 4 Municipal Schools were amalgamated with other Schools in close proximity. The new Schools were distributed as follows :—

The four amalgamated Schools were 3 Boys' Schools, each of one side, and 1 Marathi Girls' School.

13. The number of pupils also showed a very satisfactory increase. On the 31st March of 1921, the number on the rolls of all the Municipal Schools together was 32,211, the average for the year being 32,580. These numbers grew up on 31st March, 1922 to 35,062 and 33,550, an increase of 2,851 and 970 respectively. The growth of nearly 3,000 pupils, that took place during the year, was over 50 per cent. higher than the ordinary previous average of 1,500 to 2,000 pupils *per annum*.

14. It is a matter for regret that a similar story of progress cannot be told of the Private Schools. The increased costs of the day seem to be telling heavily upon them. The number of the Recognized and Aided Schools decreased, during the year, from 161 to 147 and the number of pupils from 16,877 to 15,386. The Unrecognized Private Schools, worth taking note of, numbered 79 with 5,643 pupils on the rolls.

15. The total actual expenditure and receipts of the year amounted to Rs. 19,63,573 and Rs. 19,31,065 respectively, the Municipal Funds and the Fees collected contributing Rs. 18,79,340 and Rs. 50,561 respectively, towards the latter amount.

The corresponding figures for the last year were Rs. 15,91,298 and Rs. 16,41,458 and Rs. 15,90,800 and Rs. 47,653 respectively. Out of the total expenditure, the Government half share, under the agreement of 1918-1919 (G.O. 499 of 10th February 1919) of all costs in excess of Rs. 6,58,175, the Budgetted expenditure of 1917-1918, is estimated to be Rs. 6,26,836, as against Rs. 4,41,232, for the previous year. The opening and the closing Balances were Rs. 92,647-0-11 and Rs. 60,138-15-11 respectively.

16. Amongst the special efforts of a far reaching character, put forth by the Schools Committee, during the year under review, prominent mention may well be made of the widening of the sphere, and the systematising of the organization of the now permanently established annual fixture of the Exhibition of Art and Handicraft of the Municipal Schools, and the simultaneously held competitive Sports, both for boys and girls. Experience has proved the great utility of these two Institutions, as much from the Literary as the moral and physical points of view. The leading idea of the Exhibition is that a necessary constituent even of Primary Education must be a Training of the eye and the hand even in the Primary Standards, so that the three "R"s (Reading, writing and rithmetic) may have a due complement of the three "D"s. (Drill, Drawing and Droitness) and specially so in the case of girls. The Competitive Sports, it is unnecessary to state, conduce to better attention to health and strength. But a higher object, namely, the promoting of healthy rivalry and the stimulating of manly *esprit de corps* is sought to be obtained by arranging to hold the Exhibition and the Sports synchronously and in the same place, by making several of the competitions general ones, open to picked pupils from Marathi, Gujarati and Urdu Schools, all on terms of fraternal equality, and lastly by asking every School to send representatives to compete at least in certain specified events. All the Schools are by turn brought to visit the Exhibition and have a glimpse of the Sports, and both the Opening and the Prize Distribution ceremonies are made *gala days*, celebrated with *eclat*. The Exhibition and the Sports of the year under review began on 7th April 1922 and continued for 12 days. On three days the Exhibition was thrown open to the general public and from 11 a.m. to evening, on all these days, men and women of position, of all races and creeds came in crowds. They passed commendations on the work of the juveniles, at which the Committee cannot but feel great gratification. They had sanctioned Rs. 3,500 for the expenditure and out of this sum the following were the prizes offered :—

Both the number and the value of the prizes had to be materially increased, so eager was an unexpected growth of entries, the addition being 100 prizes of the value of about Rs. 175. It may be mentioned that the prizes in Needle work and other handi-work as well as the Sports were for work done at special examinations under strict supervision. These examinations were themselves an Object lesson and had greater stimulating effect than the set Exhibition of completed work, as held in the Lord Harris School.

17. A specially stimulating and much appreciated novelty of the year was the Institution of 6 Challenge Shields, artistically executed in silver and ebony, with a *Satar* a Sword and a lotus as devices on them, 3 for Girls' Schools and 3 for Boys' Schools, one each for the Marathi the Gujarati and the Urdu sides, to be won for a year by obtaining the highest number of prizes with the highest total value. The Shields were won this year by the Lamington Road Marathi the S. S. Bengalee Gujarati and the Imamwada Urdu Girls' Schools, and the Chinch-poogli Marathi, the Bapty Road Gujarati Nirashrit (Depressed Classes) and the Madanpura Urdu Boys' Schools. The superiority of the Depressed Class and Moslem Boys in Sports was as much marked as generously appreciated by the other competitors themselves. To Schools for making a good cumulative show and to individual teachers or pupils for good work, certificates of merit were also awarded. The two ceremonies of the Exhibition were presided over by Dr. M. C. Javle, the Chairman of the Committee, and several Members thereof as well as of the Corporation paid welcome visits.

18. As subsidiaries of considerable value to the gatherings connected with the Exhibition and Sports, may be mentioned the Prize distributions of individual Schools and the Navaratra gatherings and Garbha singings which all the Gujarati Girls' Schools manage to hold with the help of sympathising friends. A novel step was taken during the year by the official organization of a Joint Prize Distribution of about 15 Schools of Girgaum, held in December last, at the Lord Harris School, the success whereof will result in more such gatherings in future. Mention has also to be made of the participation by all the Municipal Schools, in the rejoicings, organized by the Sub-Committee for Children's Entertainment of H.R.H. the Prince of Wales Reception Fund and their holding individual gatherings in their own premises.

19. Another noteworthy effort of the year was the development, just initiated at the close of last year of the Boy Scouts and Girl Guides Corps. The Girgaum Corps, mustering 100 to 200 pupils representing 11 Gujarati and Marathi Boys' and Girls' Schools, has matured well and acquitted itself with great credit in various performances on the day of the Prize Distribution of the Exhibition. They had been drilled in First Aid and other Exercises and had been taken to Excursions and given some idea of Camp life. Another Corps, called the Bhuleshwar Corps, representing 9 big Gujarati and Urdu Schools, was organized during the year and made a promising exhibition. More Corps of the kind are evidently needed to extend the benefits to all Municipal Schools, in response to widely expressed desires of the kind.

20. Another event worthy of special mention was the completion, in practice and principle, of the Committee's establishment for the supervision and inspection of their Schools. To the two Assistant Lady Superintendents, in charge of the Marathi and the Gujarati Schools, (see Section VI) was added a Lady Superintendent for the Urdu Schools; and the Girls' Schools on the three sides were placed primarily in charge of these Assistant Lady Superintendents, subject only to a general guidance from the three Male Superintendents, who preside severally over the three sets into which the Bombay Municipal Schools are so far divided. On the Marathi side a Deputy Superintendent was added to cope with the increased work. One additional clerk and a peon were also added to the staff.

21. Special effort was made during the year to push forward the education of Moslem Girls, which, it has to be owned with regret, is in a very unsatisfactory condition for more reasons than one. Generally speaking, the parents do not care much for any higher teaching for their Girls than reading and writing of simple Urdu books and mere reading the Koran in Arabic. The girls, however, after a couple of years in School show great appreciation of higher learning. Other causes of backwardness are poverty and such social usages as the *Parda* and general aversion from exercises and accomplishments other than Needle work, *e.g.*, Music Drill, &c. The most grievous impediment is the want of Moslem Lady Teachers with even the minimum education required for Primary Schools. The Committee's Urdu Lady Teachers' Training Class has only given us, within 5 years, less than 2 dozen Lady Teachers, educated up to the Vernacular IVth Standard. As in Bombay, so it is throughout the Presidency and the newly established Urdu Girls' Training College at Poona suffers from want of pupils. The Committee sends girls, so willing, to the said Class. Its result was to give to the Bombay Municipal Schools, during the last year, two 1st Year Trained Urdu Lady Teachers the very

first of the kind in the Department. Evidently, this takes matters too slowly. It was with a view to give a more rapid push to the education of Moslem girls, that in addition to the appointment of an Assistant Lady Superintendent for them, as specified above, it was resolved to raise the centrally situated Nagpada School to the status of a Full Primary Girls' School, so that we may bring up a local race of Moslem Girl teachers, qualified and eligible for Training Certificates. Unhappily, the Committee could not get competent Moslem Lady teachers, and to the appointment of a particularly competent Christian Lady Teachers Miss E. F. Wells, who had to be taken up, there cropped up a considerable opposition, evidently due to misunderstanding. The air has been however cleared completely and there are now three Urdu Girls' Schools with the Vth Standard Classes, and a healthy rivalry to get good results therefrom has already sprung up.

22. Some other items of improvement, though of a comparatively smaller importance may conveniently be enumerated here. By way of experiment, two *Cooking Classes* were introduced in two popular Girls' Schools, one, the Kalbadevi Gujarati, and the other, the Thakurdwar Marathi School. The experiments have proved successful and caste does not seem to have operated as a hindrance to co-cooking or to co-tasting the cooked things, either. Another novelty was the introduction of the *Spinning Wheel* in all the Municipal Girls' Schools and some of the Boys' Schools. The Committee supplied 150 *Charkas* and appointed an itinerant Lady teacher for the Girls' Schools. There were also patriotic gifts of about 50 *Charkas* to individual Schools. The exercise has become popular in certain Schools and some prizes in the Exhibition were assigned for it and duly won. Another improvement was the getting up of a systematically graduated *course of Music* and songs for the Marathi Schools, all put down in a carefully prepared book of songs, set forth with due notation. Another advance was the introduction of *higher Standards* in 5 Marathi, 8 Gujarati and 8 Urdu Schools. Then there was the *Deputation* of two Lady Teachers to the *Montessori Class* of Miss Nixon's Secondary Lady Teachers' Training College at Malabar Hill. Another couple of Lady Teachers were deputed to the *Ladies Physical Training Class*, opened under the supervision of Miss MacCallum, under the auspices of the Y. W. C. A. An *increase in the fixed monthly contingencies* and in the staff of the Hamals and Sepoys may conclude the list of the more notable improvements of the year.

23. The general efficiency of Municipal Schools, under the care and supervision of the Superintendents and their Assistants, strengthened and reorganized as mentioned in para. 20 above, was maintained at a high level. The Schools stood well the ordeal of the riots of November 1921, only one teacher being reported to be killed, a couple of them molested and two or three School Buildings subjected to on rushes of crowds and pelting, but not so as to cause much damage. Not more than half a dozen Schools had to remain closed and that too, for a day or two only. The Examination results of the year were gratifying. The Marathi side claimed 1,021 passes out of 1,521 sent up, at the Government Vernacular IVth Standard Examination, the Gujarati Schools 204 out of 440 and the Urdu Schools 139 out of 157, total 1,454 passed out of 2,118 sent up, *i.e.*, 68·6 per cent. At the Vernacular Final Examination, 18 out of 26 passed from the Marathi Schools, and 8 out of 28 from the Urdu Schools. The 3 Marathi A. V. Schools claimed 5 passes in the First Grade Drawing Examination and earned Rs. 449 as Government Grant. The Urdu Schools secured two Miss Mary Carpenter Scholarships. Two out of the 7 Government Middle School Scholarships of the year were won, one by a Marathi Nirashrit and the other by an Urdu Boys' School.

24. During the year under review, the Committee gave 156 Scholarships, distributed between Girls' Schools and Depressed Class Schools, their total value being Rs. 425 p.m. Besides the Exhibition, Prizes were awarded to the extent of Rs. 8,800. The Drawing materials supplied cost Rs. 4,800, the Sewing and Knitting materials Rs. 10,200 and various Educational requisites, Rs. 25,487. The Sewing classes got the materials above mentioned late in the year: They started with a supply made at the end of the last year of materials worth Rs. 4,500. They made new articles worth about Rs. 5,500, whereof part was sold for Rs. 2,035 and the rest retained in School. The furniture supplied cost Rs. 38,915, the figures including articles supplied to the newly opened Schools.

25. The encouragement of the attainment by teachers of higher Training and other qualifications was pursued during the year under review as a matter of fixed policy. The Marathi Teachers' Training Classes, under Mr. N. G. Limaye, B.A.L.T., Headmaster, had about 75 Teacher-pupils, 22 out of whom (one of them a Lady) attained the rank of 'Qualified' Teachers from 1st April 1921. The Gujarati Training Classes, under Mr. C. L. Bakshi, B.A.L.T., had about 3 dozen teacher-pupils, the majority of them in the Nirashrit Schools Teachers' Division. Seven of them became 'Qualified' Teachers. Nine Urdu School Teachers attained the same rank. Mr. Shahabuddin Imam Munshi, the Headmaster of the Urdu Teachers' Training Classes, has ceased to hold that office. A successor has yet to be appointed. The re-training of selected batches of teachers in the Nagpada Urdu, the Lamington Road Marathi and the Bhuleshwar Gujarati Schools under the eye of these Headmasters of the Teachers' Training Classes has continued. The Committee maintained at the Poona, Ahmedabad and Dhulia Training Colleges. 6 teachers on full salaries and 32 Female and 57 Male Stipendiaries. The

stipends have been increased to Rs. 20 *per mensem* as compared to the fixed Government scale of Rs. 15. The number of the Committee's stipendiaries, who returned during the year with Training Certificates from the colleges, was 10 males and 8 females on the Marathi side, 10 males and 2 females on the Gujarati side and 9 males and 1 female on the Urdu side. The teachers who got higher or *de novo* Training College Certificates "from outside" were 31 males and 17 females on the Marathi side, 17 males and 20 females on the Gujarati side and 19 males and 1 female on the Urdu side. A large number of the Lady teachers who so improved their status have to thank the local Training Colleges, maintained by the Seva Sadan and the Vanita Vishram Societies, which enable them to remain in service and at the same time to attend the Training Classes in the mornings and study for the Certificate Examinations, though it is feared this double stress tells upon their health.

26. There was one addition to the 9 School Buildings, that are so far owned by the Municipality itself. That was the Jafferbhai Rahimtulla School Building, in a small part whereof is also located a Municipal Dispensary, and towards the cost of which the Hon'ble Sir Ibrahim Rahimtulla, Kt., has made a substantial contribution. Such improvement in the location of Schools, as was found possible under the scarcity and costliness of house accommodation prevalent in Bombay, was made. The new premises engaged during the year were 25. Additional accommodation was provided for a dozen more Schools. There were, besides, about two dozen cases of improvement of premises and consequent revision of rent. School gardening, wherever and to whatever extent possible, continued to be encouraged.

27. Regarding Grant-in-Aid Schools, mention was made in the Report for the last year of a new scheme, formulated by the Schools Committee and forwarded, as required by law, to Government for their sanction. The scheme proposes to increase the present Code Maximum of one-third of the total expenditure to more than half and vest the administration of grants in officers responsible to the Schools Committee. The question is still the subject of a triangular correspondence between the Committee, the Corporation and Government. But one step was realized last year, namely, the assessment of the grants by the Committee and its own officers, with the result that the allowable full one-third expenditure grant was given to all Schools coming up to a minimum level of efficiency. The total amount of grants given during the year under review came to Rs. 1,44,500 for 147 Schools, which meant an average of Rs. 983 per School. This figure of Rs. 983 per School, as the first result of the administration coming into the Committee's hands, compared very favourably with the figure of Rs. 626, average per School, given last year, in accordance with the recommendations of the Government Educational Officers, which totalled Rs. 1,00,878 for 161 Schools.

28. Some miscellaneous statements may well be made by way of concluding the above account of the Committee's stewardship of Primary Education in the City. The number of ordinary teachers in the Municipal Schools rose during the year from 1,383 to 1,558, that of special teachers for Drill, Drawing, Scouting, Music and Needle work from 87 to 112, and that of the subordinate service from 156 to 198. The Schools for the Depressed Classes were 13 Marathi and 6 Gujarati Boys' and 2 Marathi and 1 Gujarati Girls' Schools and they had, on the Marathi side, 2,000 boys and 324 girls, and on the Gujarati side, 378 boys and 155 girls; a total of 2,857 pupils as against 2,565 of the previous year. It may be mentioned that a third of the pupils of the Bombay Municipal Depressed Class Schools always belong to the literary classes of society, attending such Schools quite voluntarily. The Night Schools that had risen in the year previous to that under report, from 9 to 25 with pupils risen from 336 to 919, increased, during the year under review, to 33 Schools with 1,136 pupils. The two Marathi Mill Schools had an attendance of 94 boys and 66 girls, total 160, as against 234 for 1920-1921 and 195 for the year previous. The decrease shows that the half-time working juvenile Mill hands, will never go to School unless under a system of compulsion. Fourteen new permissions for the use *gratis* of Municipal Schools were given during the year for various educational or literary institutions. Amongst them there were 45 Schools with 1,693 pupils as against 31 Schools with 1,400 pupils in 1920-1921.

III.—The Supervising Staff.

29. The Supervising Staff, working under the general direction of the Secretary consisted of the following Officers:—

N.B.—Mr. Padgaokar was on leave for 22 days, Mr. Manerikar for 19 days and Mrs. Shantabai Kashalkar for 5 months. They paid 285, 537 and 198 visits, respectively, to Schools. Mr. Manerikar acted as Superintendent during Mr. Padgaokar's leave and Mrs. Sundar Talpade for Mrs. Shantabai Kashalkar. Mrs. Talpade paid 124 visits. Mr. Kulkarni paid 260 visits.

N.B.—Mr. Anjaria was on 5 months' furlough from 24th March 1921 and Miss Dallas acted for him. Mr. Bakshi, B.A.L.T., the Headmaster, Gujarati Teachers' Training Class acted in Miss Dallas' place. Their visits numbered 461, 463 and 463, respectively.

(C) *The Urdu Schools*—total 89 Schools with 8,951 pupils.

1. Superintendent—Mr. A. R. Bhajji, B.A.
2. Assistant Superintendent—Mrs. A. Bawa, Matric Trained.
3. Deputy Superintendent—Mr. Shaikh Ahmed, 3rd Year Trained.

N.B.—The visits of these three officers came to 362, 273 and 631, respectively. Mrs. A. Bawa was appointed in July only.

The work of the Superintendents is varied and complex. They conduct personally the Annual Examinations of the Schools under their respective charges, keep themselves in active touch with all the teachers, guide the teaching and see to the preservation of general discipline. An onerous part of their duty is to help the local Government Educational Officers in conducting the IVth Standard Examination.

All the officers discharged their duties creditably. The three permanent Lady Superintendents are persons of superior calibre, quite able to hold their own with their male colleagues. Indeed, Miss Dallas acted and acted with remarkable efficiency as the Superintendent during the long leave of Mr. Anjaria. She and Mrs. Kashalkar were in their element at such functions as the Exhibition. Though yet a junior, Mrs. Bawa has already got a firm hold on her work.

IV.—Municipal Schools and Attendance.

30. The following statement shows the number of Municipal Schools of various descriptions, with the pupils attending them, at the end of the year under review, comparing the same with the figures for the previous year. The total growth in the number of Schools has been, as stated in the general summary, 25 :—

The total number of Schools at the end of the year was 298, of which 209 Schools were Boys' Schools with 24,731 pupils and 89 Girls' Schools with 10,331 pupils. The boys attending the Girls' Schools were 225 and the girls attending Boys' Schools, 2,333.

V.—Finance.

31. The figures for Income and Expenditure and the opening and the closing balances, as well as the expected Government contributions for the year under review and the previous year both, are already given in para. 15 of Section II (General Progress) above. The various items of Income and Expenditure are given in detail in Appendix B. The fee income rose from Rs. 47,603 to Rs. 50,561, the Municipal contribution from Rs. 15,90,800 to Rs. 18,79,340 and the expenditure from Rs. 15,91,298 to Rs. 19,63,573. The increased expenditure was due to the annual increments of salaries per fixed grades, the opening of new Schools involving proportionately much higher outlay in rent, and various other items of increase, owing to the general expansion of the Department, and consolidation of the staff for Superintendence and Medical Inspection. The average cost per pupil including the cost of the supervising and Medical Establishments came to 51.9 as against 46.3 of the previous year.

VI.—Teachers and other Employes.

32. The following table shows the total number of ordinary teachers for the different kinds of Municipal Schools for the year under review and the year previous :—

33. The increase in the number of teachers was 175. The percentage of trained teachers, which was 51, rose by about 1½ per cent., and may in itself be regarded as satisfactory, specially in view of the fact that the above given figure of all untrained teachers includes over 100 teachers who have passed the local Qualified Teachers' Examination and are nearly equal to 1st Year Trained persons.

34. To the above mentioned 1,670 teachers of the Day and Night Schools have to be added 17 teachers of the Teachers' Training Classes, 211 peons, sepoys and hamals and 8 clerks of the Superintendents' and the Medical Inspectors' Offices, total 1,906. Adding the 9 Superintendents and their Assistants, and the 6 Medical Inspectors and their Assistants the number of the personnel, controlled by the Committee and its Office Establishment of 1 Secretary and 12 clerks, totalled on 31st March 1922, 1,921 persons.

VII.—Retirements and Deaths, &c., amongst the Teachers, etc.

35. The deaths recorded in the year amongst Teachers and others totalled 26 males and 9 females, tuberculosis claiming 6 victims. The most deplored losses by death were those of Mr. K. B. Nene, Mr. H. V. Juvekar and Mr. G. S. Kanitkar, the Headmasters of the Girgaum, the Sutar Lane and the Nagdevi Marathi Boys' Schools. They were all three veterans of an uniformly approved record, Mr. Nene being also a scholar and writer and had the honour of having his service borrowed recently by Government for appointment to an Acting Assistant Deputy Educational Inspectorship. There were two cases of retirement amongst the Trained Teachers, those of Bai Veerbaiji Mehta and Bai Radhabai Ranade, Head Mistresses of the S. S. Bengalee, Gujarati and the South Girgaum Marathi Girls' Schools. Both were persons of marked characteristics, Bai Veerbaiji having 45 years' service to her credit and Bai Radhabai 31 years'. They were at the head of Schools with advanced standards and the manner they discharged their duties was highly creditable. In recognition of their unique services, the Committee granted to them substantial bonuses over and above their pensions. The following table classifies per disease the deaths of the year :—

VIII.—Medical Inspection.

36. The Establishment for the Medical Inspection of the children and Teachers of Municipal Schools, as revised and enlarged on a permanent basis in 1920-1921, consisted at the beginning of the year under review, of the following persons :—

37. Drs. S. A. Desai and B. G. Mahodaya resigning early in the course of the year, Dr. B. P. Narielwala, L.M.&S., and Dr. V. J. Gidh, L.M.&S., were appointed as their successors. The new-comers are tried persons of considerable experience, and with their help the Inspectors carried on satisfactorily their work of Examination as well as delivering lectures on Sanitary subjects to pupils as well as to their parents and guardians, to collect the latter of whom special efforts were put forth with considerable success.

38. Drs. Kher and Narielwala worked together. They visited 84 Schools, 77 twice and 7 only once. The total number of children examined was 6,085 out of whom 1,560 were re-examined, being marked cases. 65 per cent. of the children at the first examination were found to have one ailment or another. The cases of mal-nutrition showed a percentage of 30, bad eyes 31, defective tooth 27 and defects of throat 14. There were 15 per cent. cases of enlargement of Lymphatic Glands. 1,897 intimations of ailments were sent to the parents and guardians and 1,198 of them had replies. 852 cards for treatment at Municipal Dispensaries were issued. 34 per cent. of the cases found defective at the first visit were cured. In 346 cases private treatment was resorted to mostly with success.

39. Dr. Miss Gulbai with her Assistant Miss Tarabai visited 67 Schools, examining a total of 5,533 children out of whom the number of marked cases re-examined was 1,869, 70 per cent. of the children were found at the first examination to have one defect or another. Out of the marked cases examined twice, 40 per cent. showed improvement, 8 per cent. deterioration and above 40 per cent. the development of some new complaint. Amongst the 1,869 children found having some ailment, mal-nutrition claimed a percentage of 40, eye diseases 22, tooth diseases 33 and throat complaints 21. 2,193 intimations were sent to the parents and guardians. The replies received were 1,177 and the cards issued for treatment at Municipal Dispensaries were 446 whilst 731 cases preferred private treatment.

40. Drs. Afinwala and Gidh visited 83 Schools and examined 6,025 children, 4,508 at the first visit and 1,517 at the second, 1,711 children out of 4,508, i.e., 37 per cent. were found to have one defect or another. Tooth complaint claimed a percentage of 10, bad eyes 5, lungs and skin diseases 6 to 7. 1,178 intimations were sent to the parents and 1,328 cards for treatment at the Municipal Dispensaries were issued.

41. Drs. Afinwala and Gidh delivered 12 lectures to groups of 17 Schools. Dr. Miss Gulbai gave 10 lectures. Drs. Kher and Narielwala delivered 10 lectures. At some of these lectures the attendance of the general public was very satisfactory.

42. The reports presented by the Medical Inspectors are interesting reading and they make some valuable suggestions, e. g., the suggestions that the co-operation of teachers in the remedial measures should be stimulated; that more free Dispensaries should be established in F and G Wards and that the Sanitary Lectures delivered should be accompanied by Magic Lantern demonstrations.
