LETTER ADDRESSED TO THE SUPERINTENDANT—

Col. READ appointed by MARQUIS CORNWALLIS, Superintending Collector of the CEDED COUNTRIES north of the Cauvery, with three Assistants Capt<sup>ns</sup>. Munro, Macleod & Graham—Proceeds to take Charge, leaving Capt<sup>n</sup>. G at Bangalore, till the Army should pass it—Col. READ takes possession of all the forts in the Barramahal &c<sup>a</sup>.—& having made the necessary Military Arrangements, turns his thoughts to the duties of his Civil Appointment—takes up his residence for that purpose, in the Village of Trippatoor—is there joined by the Assistant Collector—accomplishes two settlements, the *Pou Bauki* of Fusly 1201, and the *Keliok Pcuna Beriz* or three quarters of Tippoo's 1788/9 settlement, for Fusly 1202—The Assistant Collector being nominated to the interior management of the districts, composing the Northern Division, the Superintendent leaving the necessary papers, proceeds to the southward—the Assistant enters upon the discharge of his arduous duties—principal occurrences During his stay at Trippatoor—establishes his Cutcheree—fixes the hours for its assembling & adjourning—Collects the balance of rent Outstanding Against Ratcheya, one of Mr. Kindersley's Amildars—also Collects the balances against two Amildars of the Conquered Countries & Against the sair-farmer of Trippatoor—he proceeds to Kistna Gerry—A *Lungur Khauna*, or dispensary for the poor, established at Trippatoor—from which Conjee is served out to them—Sends the Kistbundy of the *Pou Baukey* 1201, to the different Tahsildars, with orders to Commence the Collections—the *first* & a part of the second Kist of the Congoondy Nuzzerana received—the Kist Grain delivered to the troops, on indent by Commanding Officers—the late renters of *Ossoor & Rai Cotta*, required to pay up their balances forthwith—Orders to Tahsildars, respecting Enaums—some Robbers are apprehended & subsisted at the public expence—The Collector daily hears complaints, & redresses them according to equity—Keeps regular accounts of receipts & Disbursements & passes his receipts to Tahsildars—Certain accounts got up by means of the Zemindars and Village Curnums—& copies of them sent to the Superintendent—The Serishtadar of Veerabudderdroog having been found guilty of malversation, is discharged—Two Officers of Tippoo's left at Kistna Gerry to receive stores, are interfering with the inhabitants—this put a stop to, by the Collector—Complaints preferred against the abuses practiced by the *Wutt Gours* or head farmers—they are threatened by the Collector—Tigers very troublesome in the districts—rewards paid for killing them—Tippoo Claims the small district of Bellumpilly, dependent on Raikotta; the Collector visits the boundary, & sends a report thereon to Capt<sup>n</sup>. Macleod Assistant Southern Division, to communicate to the Vakil—an intelligent person also sent to substantiate our claim—Another *Lungur Khauna* established at Kistnagherry—The Collector returns to Trippatoor invites the inhabitants to come forward with their Complaints, promising redress—meets the Jevadipaur head farmers at Matrapilly—makes a settlement with them for 5100 Chuckrums—gives them presents of Cloth & . establishes a third *Lungur Kauna* at Raikottah—receives complaints against the Trippatoor Tahsildar, who is confined, as is one of the Zemindars—Proceeds to Vanniambaddy—having appointed an Aumin at Trippatoor—the Serishtadar dismissed—Instructions to the Amin—The Country rented out by the Superintendent in large farms or Hottlies, to the *Wut Gours* on most substantial farmers—explanation of the Collector's objects in making this tour—1st to endeavour to make a *Village* settlement, and to adopt it to the ability of each—to obtain a Knowledge of the Circumstances of the ryots—local information—hearing & detaching complaints—arrives at Vanniambaddy & commences on its Village settlement to *Muttoor* of effecting it—*Cowle Putties* given to each farmer—their tenor—to be strictly

 —Cutcheree returns to Trippatoor—The Tahsildar acquitted and restored to his func-  
 tions—Zemindars also released from want of proof—ordered to attend the Cutcheree—  
 a Village in the Vanniambaddy district, which Tippoo had appropriated for defraying  
 the expences of his Mosque at Arcot, continued to the Fakirs, as formerly—The *Pou*  
*Bauki Kham Wussool* of this district taken—Cutcheree moves to Muttoor, for the purpose  
 of making the settlements of *Trippatoor*, *Coonatoor*, & *Singarpate*, there not being time  
 to visit each, separately—the same mode followed as at Vanniambaddy a person punished  
 with stripes for having preferred a malicious charge against a Tahsildar—Governor's  
 Orders that the Congoondy Rajah shall be excused a part of his *Nuzzerana*—A noto-  
 rious robber apprehended, & put in irons—the Cutcheree moves to Caveripatam, at  
 which the *Dehaut* settlements of that district & Veerabudderdroog are made—The Tah-  
 sildar of Vanniambaddy dismissed, for various acts of malversation—The Manager of  
 Jevadipar obliged from sickness, to resign his situation—another appointed in his room  
 the Cutcheree proceeds to Kistnaghery—the late Vanniambaddy Tahsildar assisted  
 in the recovery of money advanced by him to farmers for paying their Kists—The Trip-  
 patoor Zemindars permitted to return to their Villages—It is proposed to establish a  
 Mint at KishnGerry—persons invited from Vallajanaggur to manage it—a great scarcity  
 of Grain felt in the districts—duties on it's importation excused—store houses established  
 at KistnaGerry—a Poligar, who had done great mischief in the country, during the  
 war, by plundering the inhabitants, is fined 5,000 Rupees, to be divided among them,  
 as a compensation for the loss of their Cattle—The Collector attacked with a dangerous  
 sickness, obtains leave to proceed to the Coast—his Division managed, during his absence,  
 by Captain Munro—Captain Munro moves with the Cutcheree to Raikottah—invites  
 people to come to him with their Complaints—the head farmers accused, falsely, of  
 making unauthorized Collections—the system of large farms continued, for the present,  
 in that district—The Tahsildar & Serishtadar fined for renting a Village, as being con-  
 trary to orders—Cutcheree returns to Kistna Gerry.

An *Amikar* or Mint Manager, with an establishment arrives from Arcot—two soukars  
 become security for him—Nature of their joint bond—he strikes a few new Pagodas—  
 they are assayed, & found to correspond with the Madras Stars—General intimation  
 given, of the Mint being established, & of the terms, that Merchants may bring in their  
 bullion—The Managers represent, that they will sustain great loss by the Revenue Rate  
 of Exchange, at which the Gold fanams were issued to them, from the treasury—an  
 advance of 3,000 Pagodas is made to them, as *Tuccavi*, with which to purchase  
 Bullion—disputes between them about the distribution &c, finally adjudicated by Mr.  
 Hurdis—The New Pagodas cried down at Madras—assayed by the Assay Master General  
 who gives in an unfavourable report to Government—the Mint abolished for the present  
 —sealed musters of Assays, by the Collector, sent along with the Managers, to Madras—  
 The *Wut Gours* commit great abuses—resolved, that the system of large farms shall be  
 abolished, the ensuing year; and the *Villages* rented independently—The Collector again  
 sets out on a tour thro' his districts—proceeds to Raikottah—avows his intention of  
 doing away the Authority, hitherto exercised by the *Wutt Gours*—invites candidates for  
 farming Villages, to come forward—Curnums employed on the *Muttawully* of last year  
 & the *dowles* of the present—the *Kelick Beriz* compared with the settlement of last year  
 —& the *Derkhausts* of individuals form the basis of the present *Jumma*—*Rauzy Naumas*  
 or *Cabooliats* taken from each farmer—and *Cowle Putties* given, with the Collector's  
 seal & signature—tenor of his *Putty*—a preference, in the disposal of Villages, shown to  
 the Potails, or principal inhabitants—Lists of the number of new & old ploughs of each  
 Village given in by the Curnums—the settlement of the Current Fusly to include *Sib-*  
*bendy*, *Sauderward Roosooms* &c—Lands appropriated to defray the funds required  
 for the Pagodas at this place—Certain ryots who furnished Grain for the Raikottah store,  
 after it came into the Company's possession, having been defrauded of their due by the  
 late Manager, who had received the Amount, the money is collected from him, & paid  
 into their own hands—orders received from the Superintendent to excuse all road duties,  
 on articles of supply, proceeding to the Army, besieging Pondicherry—the following  
 taxes and monopolies abolished—*Ryot Sengooty*, *Putty Sankaitum*, *Junneep Sankaitum*,  
*Javadinaugur*, *Ghee*, *Tobacco*—the *Lunar* year rejected and the *Solar* adopted for  
 Accounts—the Cutcheree proceeds to PolliCode—difficulty in making the settle-  
 ment, owing to the intrigues of the *Wutt Gours*, who wish to preserve their

... collection of a Villastablishment made out—and lands appro-  
 priated—formerly collected on this account, entered in the *Jumma*—  
 Gours & Curnums punished, for embezzling Tuccavi, intended for the ryots—and  
 made to return it—the Cutcheree proceeds to UttinGirra—all *Wurtana* & Zemindar's  
 Enaums entered in the *Jumma*—Lands given to the Curnums in lieu of their *Wurtana*—  
 a Curnum punished for preventing the Ryots from coming to a settlement—Pondi-  
 cherry falls, & further supplies put a stop to—move to Coonatoor—its *Jumma* made  
 on the same principles as the other districts—a Curnum, for being in the habit of exacting  
 from the ryots a fee of a Gold fanam, for writing their Receipts, flogged—made to refund  
 & dismissed from his employ—another punished for making Extra Collections—Move to  
 Caverypatam—The *Wutt* Gours & Tahsildar confined by the Superintendent, & sent  
 under a Guard to the Collector—forced to pay back their exactions & fined an equivalent  
 to the Sirkar—Enaums of a Village investigated by the Collector in person & the Bramins  
 sworn, that they have not extended the original limits of their *Bhutwarty lands*—the  
*Jumma* of a remaining district, in PolliCode, settled—The Tahsildar & Serishtadar of  
 Cauverypatam dismissed—reasons Assigned—The district divided into two Tahsildaries  
 —move to KistnaGerry—The Cutcheree proceeds to Vanniambaddy—Collector employ-  
 ed in hearing Complaints—Old settlers, who had migrated, invited to return, & Cowle  
 offer'd.

Move to Trippatoor—its *Jumma* ascertained from actual survey—the Collector gives  
*Cowle Patties*, *Currawar*—*Wurtana* entered separately—Superinten<sup>t</sup>. forced to the Coast,  
 for the recovery of his health—The Collector with *his* surveyors moves to Cundilly—  
 Observes their mode of measuring & Valuing the lands—proceed together to Cakin  
 Girra—from thence to Pauparputty, when the Collector, leaving them to prosecute  
 the survey of the Coonatoor districts, returns with his Cutcheree to KistnaGerry—at  
 Pauparputty he received a Vakil of Tippoo Sulstaun, charged with a letter from Govern-  
 ment, on the subject of plunderers—a great scarcity of Grain, still felt—the Garrison  
 of *KistnaGerry*, with difficulty, procures enough for its consumption—Collector resolves  
 on building a new Village in the neighbourhood to which all dealers shall be invited to  
 resort—means taken to accomplish this desirable object—*Cowle* required by the new  
 settlers—consented to—a head Chitty appointed—prohibited from levying any fees  
 or perquisites of any description, during the *Cowle*—a weekly fair established—cere-  
 monies observed, & public treat given to the inhabitants on the first market day—The  
*Cowle* flag hoisted & *Cowle* granted for a period of *three* years—the new inhabitants,  
 and persons bringing goods to market excused all duties for that time—the foundation  
 of a new Square laid—streets to issue from it—advances of money to persons, for col-  
 lecting building materials—Ceremony called *Wastoo*. The *Pooroheet* appointed to each  
 cast—his functions—a *Firka* of surveyors received from the Superintendent—their  
 number & descriptions—were employed on the survey of the three Eastern districts—  
 are began upon Kistna Gherry—explanation of the surveyors functions, & their Accounts  
 —references to the appendix—two more *Firkas* entertained—their several duties parti-  
 cularly detailed in the appendix—as are the *principles*, observed by the Collector, in  
 carrying on the survey, contained in a letter addressed to Superintendent—The *Ghair*  
*Mahadies*, leave Tippoo's dominions, & some of them settle in the Barramahal—a part  
 of the Raikottah collections carried off by a shroff—efforts to recover it by applying to  
 Tippoo's Minister fruitless—The Tahsildar dismissed—a Canal dug for conveying water  
 to the new Village—its source—the foundation of a Cutwal's Choultry, in the midst  
 of the new square, laid—Cutwal's establishment—The Collector taking a Mutsiddy along  
 with him proceeds to scrutinize the Conduct of a Tahsildar—Paishkar detached to hasten  
 the Collection of outstanding balances on certain districts—Accounts got up at the  
 close of the Fusly year—Splitting the sair farm into separate districts, inconvenient—  
 The whole given to one Renter—who shall tender good security—surveyors &<sup>a</sup>. move to  
 Mahrauz Gur—forced to return by the Monsoon—The Tahsildar of Singarpate dismissed  
 —Complaints against the surveyors—investigated by the Collector—makes a circuit for  
 that purpose—assembles the ryots—permits them to throw up their surplus lands—  
 Move towards Mutoor—from thence to Nagagupilly—to forward the survey, the two  
 Cutcherees separate—visited alternately by the Collector—survey of the KistnaGerry  
 Tahsildaury finished—survey of *Caverypatam* began—Collector's Cutcheree move near  
*Nadingull*, & the survey to the Cusba—Collector afterwards proceeds to Carimungull—  
 the new Tahsildar and Serishtadar of RaiKottah dismissed by the Superintendent—  
 survey Cutcheree, leaving Caveripatam, goes to *Baroor* & the Collector to *Comminelloor*  
 —it's Tahsildar confined, and afterwards released—prohibited from borrowing money of  
 the ryots—the next move to *Cullavee* & *Anandoor*—Lands appropriated for the Pagodas  
 of a Village in the neighbourhood—*Cullavee* finished—move to *UttenGirra*—Paishkar  
 detached—from Anundoor the survey Cutcheree went to *Hunnomateert*—& the Collector  
 to *Muttoor*—survey Cutcheree at *Balay Totum*—in the neighbourhood—*Tarbuns* or

Division confined by order of the Superintendent, who had received complaints against him—sent to Trippatoor to answer to those charges—The *Church Lands* annexed to the Sirkar, and *money* establishments instituted—the District Serishtadars employed on the *Stallwar* or Registers of Fields—*Cowle Putties*, prepared in the districts, first examined by the head Serishtadar & then signed by the Collector—again proceeds to PolliCode, in his inquisitorial Capacity—detaches Muttasiddies to measure and investigate Enaums &c. Paishkar acquitted of all the Charges—restored to his functions—ordered on a circuit of the Trippatoor district—PollCode Amin with two Assistants employed on the *Kham Wussool* of the district from 1202 to 1208—investigation of the *Baura Balotty* Enaums—the Members composing it—Prosecution of the Collector's enquiries—proceeds to Marandhully—Cutcheree at Commenelloor—driven in to Kistna Gerry by the rains—The Jumma bundi of Fussly 1208 began upon.
