Courtney leapt at one of the Centinells, called Lewis Ferrel, to seise his arms, but the Corporal run in & catcht hold of Cap<sup>t</sup>. Courtney, & I with my p<sup>r</sup>. struck him on his head, & another struck him on the back, afterwards he went to his room & took his sword & came to kill us, upon which I told him, if he did not keep in his room, I would kill him, he answered you have not order, & cannot fire, if you advance you shall see if I have not order, afterwards he came out of his room when I and another remained Centry, Cap<sup>t</sup>. Courtney came & told me he would break my head when he was clear of his Confinement.

Jonathan Blake being Examined says that when he came into the Square he heard Cap<sup>t</sup>. Davis say to Cap<sup>t</sup>. Courtney, go into your room Civilly & be quiet, but he refused & struck Cap<sup>t</sup>. Davis with his hand & pulled off his Hat and Wigg, upon which Cap<sup>t</sup>. Davis struck Cap<sup>t</sup>. Courtney over the head with his cane, who called him names, upon which Cap<sup>t</sup>. Davis commanded the Guard to carry him to his room by force as a prisoner, but as the Guard came near Cap<sup>t</sup>. Courtney endeavour'd to seise Lewis Ferrels piece, but Peter Jacobs struck Cap<sup>t</sup>. Courtney & the Corporal seized him & Carried him to his roome, where he shut the door after him, & afterwards came out with his sword & made two passes at the Corporal, Sybrand Peterson who retreated Cock't his piece saying if Cap<sup>t</sup>. Courtney came any farther he would shoot him, upon which Cap<sup>t</sup>. Courtney Answered you dare not, I will kill one of you & be revenged on the rest, after this Sybrand went into the room & brought out both the swords, one drawn the other in the Scabbard, & carried them to Cap<sup>t</sup>. Davis, this is all I know.

Thomas Key being examined Says that at first when the Corporal came with the Guard to the Square, Cap<sup>t</sup>. Davis went to Cap<sup>t</sup>. Courtney & desired him in Civillity to go to his roome as a prisoner in the Gov<sup>r</sup>. name, upon that Cap<sup>t</sup>. Courtney bid him stand out of the way for a Chucklehead dog & struck at Cap<sup>t</sup>. Davis & struck his Hat & Wigg off, upon that Cap<sup>t</sup>. Davis took hold of him with one Hand & struck him 2 or 3 blows I can't tell which & ordered the Guard to take
