Courtneys resisting the Guards, sent to Confine him, & striking Capt. Davis, Commander of the Guard, upon a Quarrel between Capt. Roach & the aforesaid Captain Courtney.

---- AFRIL 1710 ----

Sybrand Peterson being examined says, that he was Corporal of the Guard & he was ordered to come with a file of Musketeers by Captain Davis who was Captain of the Guard, & comeing into the Square, heard Capt. Roach & Capt. Courtney Quarreling, when Capt. Davis by order of the Depty. Govr. ordered me to carry Capt. Courtney & confine him to his room, upon which Capt. Courtney gave Capt. Davis several uncivil words & Capt. Davis desired him civilly, saying Brother go to your roome, upon which Capt. Courtney went up to Capt. Davis & struck him with his hand, & took hold of his Perriwigg & hat, upon which Capt. Davis struck him with his Cane & ordered him to go Prisoner to his [room] it being the Depty. Gov. order, Capt. Courtney hearing that run to Lewis Ferrel & took hold of his peice, upon which I seeing that, I run to Capt. Courtney & took hold of him, upon which one of the men named Peter Jacobs took & struck at Capt. Courtney with his p., after we brought him to his room, the said Capt. Courtney comeing into his room, run to his sword & pusht twice at me, I seeing that retreated & cock't my firelock to defend myself, upon which Capt. Courtney cry'd God Damme You, You durst not fire, upon which I went into his room & took both the Swords by force out of the boys hands, one being drawn the other in the Scabbard, both which I delivered to Capt. Davis as he was Commander of the Guard.

SYBRAND PETERSON.

Peter Jacobs being examined says, that when he went with the Corporal into the Square he saw Cap^t. Davis & Cap^t. Courtney, when Cap^t. Davis desired said Cap^t. Courtney to go to his room as a prisoner, by order of the Governour upon which Cap^t. Courtney said something in English, which I did not understand & struck Cap^t. Davis & beat his Wigg & hat off, after which Cap^t. Davis said God Damme I will beat you now, & so struck him with his cane, afterwards Cap^t. Courtney leapt at one of the Centinells, called Lewis Ferrel, to seise his arms, but the Corporal run in & catcht hold of Cap^t. Courtney, & I with my p^t. struck him on his head, & another struck him on the back, afterwards he went to his room & took his sword & came to kill us, upon which I told him, if he did not keep in his room, I would kill him, he answered you have not order, & cannot fire, if you advance you shall see if I have not order, afterwards he came out of his room when I and another remained Centry, Cap^t. Courtney came & told me he would break my head when he was clear of his Confinement.

PETER JACOBS.

Jonathan Blake being Examined says that when he came into the Square he heard Capt. Davis say to Capt. Courtney, go into your room Civilly & be quiet, but he refused & struck Capt. Davis with his hand & pulled off his Hat and Wigg, upon which Capt. Davis struck Capt. Courtney over the head with his cane, who called him names, upon which Capt. Davis commanded the Guard to carry him to his room by force as a prisoner, but as the Guard came near Capt. Courtney endeavour'd to seize Lewis Ferrels piece, but Peter Jacobs struck Capt. Courtney & the Corporal seized him & Carried him to his roome, where he shut the door after him, & afterwards came out with his sword & made two passes at the Corporal, Sybrand Peterson who retreated Cock't his piece saying if Capt. Courtney came any farther he would shoot him, upon which Capt. Courtney Answered you dare not, I will kill one of you & be revenged on the rest, after this Sybrand went into the room & brought out both the swords, one drawn the other in the Scabbard, & carried them to Capt.
