$INTRODUCTORY\ NOTE.$

To the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury:-

The University Grants Committee have the honour to present to Their Lordships a series of comparative tables of statistics based on the returns for the academic year 1932-33 supplied by Universities and Colleges in Great Britain which receive Treasury grants on the Committee's recommendation. Their Lordships will observe that four Institutions of the University of London have been added to those named in the tables, viz., the Courtauld Institute of Art, the Institute of Education, the Institute of Historical Research, and the School of Slavonic and East European Studies. These Institutions are School of Slavonic and East European Studies. These Institutions are administered by the University as "central activities"; the Courtauld Institute of Art was first opened in October, 1932; the Institute of Education (formerly the London Day Training College) was transferred from the control of the London County Council to that of the University in September, 1932; and the School of Slavonic and East European Studies* was similarly transferred from King's College, London, in August, 1932. The financial figures for the Institute of Historical Research have hitherto appeared in the tables incorporated with those of the University; the opportunity has now been taken of including this Institute separately.

The Committee are now engaged in their periodical task of visiting all the Universities and Colleges on the grant list. At the conclusion of these visits they will, in accordance with their usual practice, address to Their Lordships a general Report on the conditions prevailing at the Institutions as a whole; this Report will include a comprehensive review of student numbers and finance over a period of five years. It is therefore thought sufficient to give on this occasion in the Introductory Note little more than a summary of the figures included in the detailed returns, and a comparison of the more important of these

figures with those of the previous year.

STUDENTS.

Total Number.—For the academic year 1932-33, the total number of fulltime students attending the Universities and Colleges to which this publication relates was 50,155; of these, 2,586 were engaged in research and other advanced work, 38,816 were reading for a first degree, and 8,753 for a diploma.

The total number of part-time students was 13,960, of whom 6,166 were engaged in research or other advanced work or were reading for a first degree, or for a diploma, and 7,794 were occasional students, i.e., taking one or more courses of lectures or laboratory instruction, which, though of university standard and given by university teachers, did not lead to a degree or diploma.

Regional Distribution.—Of the total number of 50,155 full-time students, 35,813 were in English, 3,367 in Welsh, and 10,975 in Scottish University Institutions; the English figure is made up as follows:—Oxford and Cambridge 10,509, London University, its Colleges and Schools 12,017, Provincial Universities and Colleges 13,287.

Of the 6,166 part-time students engaged in Advanced work, or reading for a first degree or for a diploma, 5,469 were in English, 70 in Welsh, and 627 in

Scottish Institutions.

Residence.—The number of full-time students residing in Colleges and Hostels was 12,069† or 24·1 per cent. of the total, in Lodgings 16,167 or 32·2 per cent., and at Home 21,919 or 43,7 per cent.

The proportion of men residing in Colleges or Hostels was 20 per cent. of

their total number, of women 358 per cent. of their total number.

It should be remembered that, while in any one year there is always a considerable number of students at Oxford and Cambridge shown as residing "in Lodgings", these are somewhat differently circumstanced from the students at other Universities placed under that category. Practically all undergraduate members of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge also enjoy, throughout their courses, membership of some College, Hall or

recognised Society, with all the opportunities of corporate life which such membership implies, and the great majority live for a substantial period in College or Hall buildings at some stage of their careers.

British Empire and Foreign Students.—Of students coming from homes cutside the British Isles but within the British Empire, there were 2,653 full-time and 605 part-time; of students from Foreign Countries there were 1,825

full-time and 787 part-time.

The Institutions attended by 100 or more full-time British Empire and Foreign students were:—Cambridge University, 538; Oxford University, 524; Edinburgh University, 505; London School of Economics, 375; University College, London, 339; Imperial College of Science and Technology, 213; Glasgow University (including the Glasgow Royal Technical College), 213; King's College, London, 143; Manchester University (including the College of Technology), 131; Guy's Hospital Medical School, 117; Birmingham University, 113; St. Bartholomew's Hospital Medical College, 112; St. Andrews University (including Dundee University College), 101.

Entry.—The total number of full-time students admitted for the first time amounted to 15,050, of whom 12,349 were reading for a First Degree and 2,701 for a Diploma. Of the 12,349 reading for a First Degree, 229 were under 17 years of age, 1,547 were 17 and under 18, 4,803 were 18 and under 19, and 5,770 were 19 or over.

. Subjects of Study.—The distribution of the general body of full-time students over the various subject groups was as follows:—

Arts, 25,175 (50.2 per cent. of the total); Medicine and Dentistry, 11,247 (22.4 per cent.); Pure Science, 8,394 (16.7 per cent.); Technology, 4,534 (9.1 per cent.); Agriculture, 805 (1.6 per cent.).

Of the full-time Advanced students 1,038 or 40·1 per cent. were in the Arts group, 1,023 or 39·6 per cent. in the Pure Science and Mathematics group, 347 or 13·4 per cent. in Technology, 134 or 5·2 per cent. in Medicine, 44 or 1·7 per cent. in Agriculture.

The part-time students engaged in Advanced work were distributed somewhat differently, viz.: 845 or 44.9 per cent. in Arts, 536 or 28.4 per cent. in Medicine, 393 or 20.9 per cent. in Pure Science and Mathematics, 104 or 5.5 per cent. in

Technology, and 5 or 3 per cent. in Agriculture.

Men and Women.—Out of the grand total of 50,155 full-time students, the men numbered 37,258 or 74·3 per cent., and the women 12,897 or 25·7 per cent.; in the English Universities and Colleges men were 75·9 per cent. and women 24·1 per cent. of the total; in Wales the corresponding figures were men 71·1 per cent. and women 28·9 per cent., and in Scotland men 70 per cent. and women 30 per cent. Of the total number of full-time advanced students, 2,178 or 84·2 per cent. were men, and 408 or 15·8 per cent. were women.

The percentage distribution of the total number of the men and the women full-time students over the subject groups was as follows:—Men, Arts 428 per cent., Medicine 264 per cent., Pure Science 17 per cent., Technology 119 per cent., Agriculture 19 per cent.; Women, Arts 715 per cent., Pure Science 16 per cent., Medicine 11 per cent., Agriculture 8 per cent., Technology 7 per cent.

Comparisons with previous year.—In making these comparisons, account must be taken of several factors. The Courtauld Institute of Art and the Institute of Education, London, are new Institutions in the list, and the few students working at the Institute of Historical Research but not included in the returns of another University or College* have not previously been included in the tables. In addition, two of the Institutions showed, as part-time students in the academic year 1931-32, 104 men and 2 women, who should have been shown as full-time students.

After making due allowance for these variations, there was an increase of 1,255 (1,267 more men and 12 fewer women) in the total number of full-time students, made up as follows:—England 1,050 more men and 57 more women students; in Wales 211 more men and 34 more women; in Scotland 6 more men and 103 fewer women. The number of full-time advanced students rose by 171 (167 more men, 4 more women), the number of first degree students by 1,137 (1,038 more men, 99 more women), and the number of diploma students fell by 53 (62 more men, 115 fewer women). Taken together, full-time and part-time students from Foreign Countries increased from 2,516 to 2,595, but British

Empire students were again less numerous than in the year before, falling from 3,385 to 3,240.

The total entry of full-time students rose by 451 in the year 1932-33, there being an increase of 665 in the number reading for a First Degree, and a decrease of 214 in the number of Diploma students.

There has again been no alteration in the general outlines of the distribution of the whole body of full-time students over the different subject groups; the Arts group still contains just about one-half, the next largest groups being Medicine, Pure Science, Technology, and Agriculture, in that order. Detailed examination shows 389 more men and 211 fewer women in the Arts group, 667* more men and 140† more women in the Medical group, 203 more men and 60 more women in the Pure Science group, 42 more men and 4 more women in the Technological group, and 34 fewer men and 5 fewer women in the Agricultural group. Among the fulltime Advanced students in all subjects, the Pure Science and Mathematics group, formerly first, is now a close second to Arts, with Technology third, Medicine fourth, and Agriculture fifth. The relative popularity of individual subjects also shows practically no change, Chemistry remaining far ahead of all the rest.

FINANCE.

Income.—In the academic year 1932-33 the total incomes of the Institutions covered in this publication amounted to £5,919,518. This sum was distributed over the main heads in the following manner:—Endowments, £808,940 (13.7 per cent.); Donations and Subscriptions, £148,863 (25 per cent.); Grants from Local Authorities, £541,672 (91 per cent.); Parliamentary Grants, £2,093,512 (354 per cent.); Fees for Tuition, Examination, Graduation, Matriculation and Registration, £1,924,154 (325 per cent.); Other Incomet £402,377 (68 per cent.).

The total income for England was £4,691,894: (London University, £1,692,061; §Oxford and Cambridge, £1,060,376; Provincial Universities and

Colleges, £1,939,457); for Wales, £364,042; for Scotland, £863,582.

Expenditure.—The total expenditure of the Universities and Colleges concerned was £5,818,957, distributed as follows over the main heads:-

Administration, £496,059 (8.5 per cent.); Departmental Maintenance, £3,792,154 (65.2 per cent.); Maintenance of Premises, £641,409 (11 per cent.);

Other Expenditure, £889,335 (15.3 per cent.).
The head "Departmental Maintenance", which accounts for so large a proportion of the total, covers salaries of teaching and research staff and payments for superannuation, the cost of maintaining laboratories, lecture rooms, libraries, and museums, and of supplying them with materials, apparatus, books, specimens, etc. Under the miscellaneous head entitled "Other Expenditure" the largest items are cost of ordinary university examinations (column 18), and capital expenditure met from income (column 19); of the sums included in column 25 the largest items are the expenditure on local and school examinations and on extra-mural work by the appropriate Boards and Delegacies at the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge and London.

Comparisons with previous year. - The total figures of income and expenditure for the year 1932-33 do not show any very noteworthy change when

compared with the figures for the preceding year. Total income rose by over £22,000, the main items which produced this figure being an increase of over £52,000 in Tuition, Examination and other fees (mainly due to the increased number of students), against which has to be set decreases of over £19,000* in Parliamentary Grants and of over £17,000 in Grants from Local Education Authorities. Total expenditure was greater by a sum of over £10,000, in which the principal items were increases of over £52,000 under the head Departmental Maintenance, due no doubt, in the main, to the larger number of students under tuition, and of over £9,000 under Maintenance of Premises, against which has to be set a decrease of over £53,000 under the head of Other Expenditure, the principal cause of which was a fall of over £57,000 in the amounts which the Institutions were able to provide from their annual revenues for capital expenditure.

In 1932-33 the total of accumulated revenue deficits was again reduced, this time by the substantial amount of over £17,000. It is also a matter for satisfaction that the level of financial stability, as measured by the revenue accounts, has been successfully maintained. There were only four Institutions whose accounts showed deficits on the year, and at only one of these four was the deficit of any substantial amount—two of the others were each under £50; all the remainder, with the exception of four which precisely balanced their accounts,

showed surpluses of income over expenditure.

The total amount of debt on capital account (about £1,000,000) has increased by some £65,000, but this rise was more than accounted for by the transaction entered into by one of the London Medical Colleges during the past year, in the purchase of a site and buildings which will ultimately provide a new home for the College. The effect of this transaction was to show an increase of about £100,000 in the indebtedness of the College at the end of last year, but active steps are being taken by the Governing Body to raise the funds necessary to reduce the debt. This total of debt, spread over a large number of Institutions, many of which are well able to make adequate provision for repayment, may not seem unduly burdensome, but it does represent a sobering charge upon the funds of the Institutions.

It must not be assumed from the preceding paragraphs that these University Institutions will emerge quite unscathed from the financial crisis which overshadowed the Nation in 1931. As we have pointed out in the Introductory Note to this publication for the previous two years, the Universities have since that time been continuously engaged in the task of keeping down expenditure to the lowest point compatible with the maintenance of a proper standard of efficiency. Faced with considerable difficulties, they have in general succeeded in main-

taining a position of financial stability.

A most important contribution to this satisfactory state of affairs was made by the Government when they decided to make no reduction in the annual Treasury grants to the Universities, which had already been fixed for the current quinquennium. Although Local Authorities generally in England and Wales could not see their way to follow the Government's example without qualification, none the less the total reduction in Local Authority grants for 1932-33, as compared with 1930-31 (i.e. the last completed year before the crisis), amounted to no more than approximately £28,000. This fall is not proportionately large, although only a few of the individual Institutions have entirely escaped, and at some of them the reductions have caused embarrassment. It may be hoped that as soon as better times return, the Local Authorities concerned will be found willing to restore the reductions which have been made, and thus give a renewed proof of their faith in the value of the work which the Universities are doing.

A considerable part of this sum is payment for work below University standard, and as such is allowed by the Board of Education to rank in due course for grant from the Board under their Regulations. If it were possible to include the Board's grant in the above figures, the percentage in column 14 would be very considerably increased, and that in column 8 correspondingly diminished. The Manchester College of Technology is controlled by the Local Education Authority.

A part of this sum is payment for work below University standard undertaken by the University on behalf of the Local Education Authority responsible for the provision of technical education in its area, and as such is allowed by the Board of Education to rank in due course for grant from the Board under their Regulations.
