[From January 1 to December 31.]

----- JANUARÝ 1697-98 -----

The Consultation Book and Diary of the Honble. William Hatsell Esqr. President of Fort St. George & Governour of Fort St. David &ca. Councill of Fort St. David, their proceedings and transactions, for affairs of the Rt. Honble, English East India Company; Begun the Primo January 1679-8 and ending the 24th September 1698.

This Evening the Sedgwick (Cap^t. Lockyer Watts Commander) sett sail for Anjengo, wth. 30 Topass Souldiers and 8 slaves, & a Gen¹¹. Letter to the Worp¹¹. John Brabourn Commander, with List of the Packett, to No. 7.

Haveing had certain advices yesterday, that Zulfaker Cawn took Chingie on Thursday the 30th past, and this day are informed by a Moratta (who deliverd Beetle to Gunnagoe Raja, & was taken prisoner by Dowd Cawn but made his escape hither) that his Master Gunnagee Raja, & Amborow are prisoners to Dowd Cawn, with many others of less note, they being upon one of the hills, surrendred them-selves upon discretion, the Rama Raja with his legitimate son Managee Morra, & some others to the number of about 20 made their escape out of Chingie on Monday the 26th inst. at night, & the report is that they got safe to Velore, tis believed the Nabob orderd Rama Raja to goe away.

Honble. Compas. Bounds.

Valaro Lowree & David Bettera, being willing to serve the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Company are entertained in Cap^t. Hugonin's Company, the former a Batchellor, & the latter married, to receive pay as usuall.

Hon^{ble} Comp^{as}. bounds, the paymaster is ordered to buy what Jaggery there may be occasion for, to raise the Southward Curtain wth. the greatest expedition, being now but 11 foot high; & agreed to take in as many Topass souldiers as procureable.

Agreed to send a generall Letter to Madrass, & therein to mention our desire that ship Tavistock may be sent hither if possible, wch. may deterr the Sub-Govern^{rs}. from molesting us.

Orderd that Tappie Peons be placed on the road, for giveing & receiveing speedy advices.

Fort St. David Consultations, 1698

— JANUARY 1697–98 —

Our Spy Braminy from the Nabobs Camp, advises in two letters lately rec^d. that the discourse continues in the Camp, of Selimon Cawn his comeing this way, to cause trouble to us.

This day a Portuguez Padre, that was at Porto Novo, when the news of takeing Chingie arrived there, says that the Avaldar calling the Merch^{ts}. & principall Inhabitants upon that occasion told them that now this Country was entirely under their subjection, & that if any of them had concerns in Cuddalore (calling it their town) he advised them to withdraw the same, saying that he did not know, but that they should goe & take possession of their town of Eslamavad, being the name that Cuddalore bears amongst the Moors.

Dispatched a gen^{II} letter to the Hon^{ble}. Lieu^t. Gen^{II}. of yesterdays date, wth. 14TH an answer to the Auditor Generall 9 parragraphs rec^d. the 14th past: In our Gen^{II}. letter to Madras, advised the above mentioned news, about the trouble the Moors threatned us with.

Rec^d a Gen^{ll}. Letter from D^o. of date the 12th Inst. wth. a Letter to Gov^r. Pitt, ^{15TH.} w^{ch}. was sent to Mr. Calandrini to be forwarded to Negapatam.

Observeing the order in the generall letter from Madrass of the 12th inst. of sending up bales as oppertunity presents, & St. David Brigantine being carried over the barr this day, & Gunner Twyman adviseing that she will be ready to take in bales tomorrow or next day, the Warehousekeeper is orderd to load her.

The Comp^{as}. Chief Dubash advises that yesterday he rec^d. a letter from Troumbulum Chitte, who was formerly one of the Comp^{as}. head Merch^{ts}. at Porto Novo, w^{ch}. mentioned that Aluff Cawn, Avaldar of that place under Selimon Cawn, told him that the Duan had a design to cause trouble to this place. & that said Avaldar did formerly advise our sending a person to Selimon Cawn, w^{ch}. we had not done, therefore the Avaldar would have us send some people to him, & he will take care to make up the difference.

Haveing duly considered of the contents of the above letter, orderd that the chief Dubash doe write an answer to Troumbulum Chitte, that he had acquainted the Gov^r. & Councill what he had writt, who orderd him to return answer that the English here had no difference with the Duan that there is friendship between us & Selimon Cawn, as also between the Hon^{blo}. Lieu^t. Gen^{II}. of Madrass & Zulfaker Cawn, & that there is a good understuding [sic] between the English and the Kings serv^{ts}. in Bengall, Suratt & all other places, & therefore we know no reason there was to send any person to Porto Novo, not doubting but there will be a good understanding between the English & the Duan, in this place as well as in all others.

The Councill met to consider of affairs, relateing to the trouble wth. the Moors, tis orderd that the Lieu^{ts}. doe take in as many Topasses as they can procure, & present them in Councill, & the paymaster is likewise orderd to take as many Rasswarr peons as can gett in the bounds, & 5 or 6 Spye braminys, & tho we hope Zulfauker Cawn may not order a formal seige against this place, yett he may give private directions to some of the adjacent Phousdars to give us trouble, in expectation that we may upon that acc^{tt}. make a present to him; whereof tis thought fitt to represent the same to the Hon^{ble}. Lieu^t. Gen^{II}. & to advise the preparation that Selimon Cawn is makeing at Chellumbrum, & that if we should send to him, as Treumbulum Chitte lately advised, it would be of future bad consequence.

Tis reported that the Dutch are prepareing a very great present for the Nabob, that they send it by Messrs. Calandrini & Cramfer, who are designed to appear in a very rich equipage.

Anthony Cuddalore, a Batchellour, Manuell De Lema, & Wm. St. David, married Topasses, being all willing to serve the Company, are entertained in Cap^t. Hugonins Company.



The Moors haveing given out, that they intend to trouble this place, has caused many hundreds of the Inhabitants to leave this place.

Tho Selimon Cawn sent a letter to the President yesterday by Shack Fursulula, yet haveing certain advices, that either himself with all his party, or part of them is at Trevendaporum, two miles from the bounds, & being able to see their tents with prospective glasses. Orderd that 30 Souldiers be sent, 20 to joyn the Guard of Trepopolore & 10 those of Bandy Pollam.

Thomas De Compo, Gonsolu Borgonsa, Peter Gonsolvis, & Jacob De Rosario, being all willing to serve the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Company, are entertained in Cap^t. Hugonin's Company. The former a Batchellor to receive pay accordingly, the rest married, to receive pay as usuall.

Ebrahim Cawn Gurry, adviseing that Selimon Cawn is comeing this way in his journey to Porto Novo, & haveing sight of his tents aforesaid, that thought requisite that Messrs. Haynes & Berlu, doe goe to meet him with the following present viz^t. : & that they be accompanied wth. a Serjeant & 12 English men, well accoutred, wth. Bayonets fixed to the end of their peices.

And it is thought requisite to present the messenger, that came from Ebrahim Cawn Gurry, wth. one peice of red Taffatie, value 2 Pag^s.

Messrs. Haynes & Berlu returning this night a little after 9 a clock, report that they were treated very civilly, & Selimon Cawn seemed to be troubled at any misunderstanding that had hapned heretofore, and assured them for the future he resolved to be a friend to the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp^a. in doing what service lay in his power, either at Chellumbrum or at the Camp.

Selimon Cawn writing a very curtious letter to the President last night, adviceing that the Kings treasure was going from thence to the Camp, under the conduct of 50 Horse, & desireing they might continue in Cuddalore this night, & as it was a festivall time to him, he sent 8 potts of sweetmeats, wth the Kings Waccanavees's brother, & considering tis requisite to keep a good correspondence wth., him, tis orderd, that some sweetmeats, fruit & China ware, to amo^t. of 33. Pag^s. (provided by Gruapah the expence Braminy) be sent him.

St. David Brigantine, Edmund Ford Master, sett sail this morning for Fort St. George, By her dispatched a gen¹¹. letter of yesterdays date, wth. Invoice & bill of ladeing for bales laden on her.

This morning about 6 a clock, hearing an alarm from Cuddalore, we answerd it from the Fort immediately, and hearing some small arms, and some of their Guns goe off, the Gov^r. immediately sent Serjeant Smith wth. 20 men to Cuddalore, wth. verbal orders (not haveing time to write any) to follow the orders of the Councill, & Cap^t. Hugonin there.

The Wind being southerly, we continued to hear their firing small arms, & some of their great Guns at Cuddalore wherefore the President, Messrs. Ingram & Farmer, order'd Ensign Kerr wth. 30 men & a Drummer, to march immediately thither, wth. the best of our arms, & good store of ammunition, & that Mr. Berlu & Gratia Menta, doe goe on horseback well armed; At same time the Gov^r. &c^a. orderd all the out guards to joyn the guard of Trepopolore, & upon advices of our people being engaged wth. the Moors, orders were sent to the chief Officer to march directly to Cuddalore, & to kill, wound, & destroy all Moor men that came to oppose them.

We discovered wth. our prospectives, some Moors horsemen rideing between the houses & the river, wth. drawn swords in their hands.

About 7 this morning a Peon came from Cuddalore, adviseing that Selimon Cawns people had surprized our guard of Porto Novo Gate, & kild and wounded some of our souldiers, That Mr. Haynes, Cap^t. Hugonin, & Serjeant Smith, were engaged with the Moors.

About 9 a clock rec^d. a note from Mr. Games, that Cap^t. Tracy was killed, & one Benson a souldier dyed of his wounds at Porto Novo gate, that the Corporall was desperately wounded in severall places, but likewise mentions that the Moors were beaten out of the Town, & that we had killd severall of them.

This afternoon the President went to Cuddalore, & ordered the Moor men there, to inter the Corps of the Moor men that we killd, & consulted of what necessary to be done, for security of the place.

FRYDAY 18TH.

— FEBRUARY 1697–98 ——

This night sent a gen¹¹. letter to Madrass, wherein advised that the Moors surprized our guard at Porto Novo gate, & after wounding the Souldiers, a party of their Horse appeared wth. out the gate, who finding they had the Command of the Gate, enter'd the town, but this caused an alarm, & Capt. Hugonin wth. about 18 men, marching towards them, was overpower'd with their numbers, & the enemie made themselves masters of Chellumbrum Point, but after Serjeant Smith wth. his men engag'd them, & they perceived more Souldiers to come from the Fort, upon the approach of Ensign Kerr wth. his men, & after the Ensign fired some volleys, the Moors quitted the town in much disorder , but comeing upon a roguish designd, they seized upon three of Mollem's Eliphants, value about 3000 pags. as soon as they had surprized the Gate, & carried them away; they likewise robbed the shops in the bazar, & severall houses; & Cap^t. Tracy, who came hither lately in a sloop from Mallacca, going out Volunteer wth. Cap^t. Hugonin, was killed, & one Benson a souldier. The Corporall at the Gate mortally wounded, & about 5 or 6 of our English & Portuguez, have slight wounds web. we hope are cureable. Eight of the enemie remain dead at Cuddalore, and they carried off severall that was kill'd, & no doubt but many of them was wounded. We have taken 6 Horses, 3 of wch. are wounded, we likewise took two Bhylees, & 3 horsemen Prisoners.

This day the Councill mett upon consideration of yesterdays transactions, & tis orderd that the President write a letter to the Nabob, & to Amer John, Abdall Labby, & Ebrahim Cawn Gurry, about Selimon Cawns villany, because Ebrahim Cawn Gurry sent a message to the Gov^r. by a Mauldar, belonging to Pullaverta Cheercon.

Cap^t. Calib Tracy, serveing the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Company against the Moors vesterday, was kill'd, & speaking to Doctor Faucett before he expired, that he desired the President would look after his concerns for his wife, Tis agreed that Messrs. Mountague, Farmer & Cranwell, doe look after his concerns, & report the same in Consultation.

Finding by this action of Selimon Cawn, that most of the Moors are of a Base, Treacherous & Perfidious temper, It is thought requisite for future that not above ten horse men at a time, be permitted to come into the town, & that all of them leave their arms at the gate, wth. the Centry, except 2 or 3 that may appear to be the chiefest of them.

And haveing certain advices, that Selimon Cawn arrived Porto Novo yesterday about 4 a clock afternoon, tis thought requisite that the town of Trepopolore be preserved if possible & tis ordered that Serjeant Smith with 12 English & 17 Portuguez Souldiers doe repair to Trepopolore, where the Choultry they use, to keep watch, being now entrencht, that he remain there wth. his men & 30 peons, w^{ch}. we hope will be a means, to prevent Collebeague from tying up leaves, & that orders be given to Serjeant Smith with refference to the difference of yesterdays business.

Dispatched a gen^{ll}. letter for Madrass this night, adviseing the Presidents writeing to the Nabob, Ebrahim Cawn Gurry, & Amerjohn, wth. coppys of what was writt them.

Messrs. Haynes & Mountague continued at Cuddalore, & therefore could not sign to the above Gen^{II}. letter.

Orders were given to cutt down all trees & hedges, that are near Cuddalore.

About 12 a clock this day, we had an acc^{tt}. that Selimon Cawn designed an other attempt upon us; that he had gott 1000 Peons & 300 horse, that their resolutions were to fight & not to plunder; that Selimon Cawn has writt to the Worriar for 2000 Peons, w^{ch}. were promist him. This afternoon about 2 a clock, the Gov^r. &c^a. sent 20 Souldiers to Cuddalore, & about 4 a clock an alarm was given at Cuddalore, w^{ch}. was immediately answered from the Fort, & thereupon the Hon^{ble}. President &c^a. sent 21 souldiers more to Cuddalore, & orderd all the out-guards to come to the Fort.

This evening dispatched a gen¹¹. letter to Madrass, adviseing that we had but 42 souldiers in the Fort, 6 att the Barrs mouth, & all the rest were at Cuddalore; that all our out-guards were withdrawn, so that all our out towns were exposed to the Enimys fury; & that twas impossible for us to avoid it; that we heard Mr. Jones the Dutch Chief at Porto Novo, did supply the Moors wth. powder & shott, upon their expedition hither.

Messrs. Haynes & Mountague did not sign to the above gen^M letter, they remaining at Cuddalore, for security thereof. This day many thousands of the. Inhabitants, left the Companys bounds.

This morning about 8 a clock, Selimon Cawn wth. his horse & foot, enterd the R^t. Hon^{blo}. Comp^{ad}. bounds; They marcht under covert of the Gardens behind Cuddalore; & sett fire to all the houses in their way; the Guns from the Points there, played upon them, w^{ch}. kept them from approaching very near.

Nine a clock this morning, seeing a party of horse near Trepopolore, we fired 4 guns from the Fort upon them. This day we discovered the Enimy, to burn all the houses in the out-towns, as they come along.

A Sally was considered of to be made at night, w^{ch} whilst the Gov^r. & c^a. here were thinking of, Messrs. Haynes & Mountague advised from Cuddalore, that they thought such a thing propper, wherefore the Gov^r. Messrs. Ingram, Farmer & Games, agreed to send Mr. John Berlu & Ensign Henry Kerr wth. 70 souldiers & 200 Peons, to fall upon the Enimy in the night, w^{ch}. we had discovered to lye upon the bank of the river, between Chumundulum & Trepopolore, twas agreed that 30 men should come from Cuddalore; Mr. Berlu was acquainted wth. the design, but the orders to him & the Ensign were sealed up, & not to be opened till two a clock in the morning, & they to march about 3 a clock.

This day many thousand Inhabitants left the bounds, & the rest came as near the Fort as they could.

This night about 11 a clock, rec^d. a note from Messrs. Haynes & Mountague signifying that they had advised wth. Cap^t. Hugonin, who diswaded from sallying this night, saying that our men were weary, twas therefore laid aside.

This morning Selimon Cawn marcht towards Mange Copang & as we believed 's he intended to goe to the Sea side, & that way to come on the back of Tevenapatnam, to prevent w^{ch}. the Gov^r. Messrs. Farmer, Ingram & Games sent out Mr. John Berlu, & Ensign Henry Kerr wth. 50 souldiers, wth. w^{ch}. party Mr. Edmund Bugden went Volunteer; The Enimy marcht boldly towards them, haveing the advantage in numbers, the Horse took particular care to be out of gunshott, & rather appeared only to force on their foot, who spent great numbers of shott in vain, for their powder being weak, did not wound one of our men; Our people killed 4 or 5 of theirs, besides what wounded, and one of their footmen had his leg shott off by a field piece, w^{ch}. was sent upon the plain, from Tevenapatnam gate, but notwithstanding all that, we could doe, their flying partys continued to burn all our out

towns, & great part of Mangee Copang, & perceiveing them to goe towards the waterside, on the back of Tevenapatnam, we orderd our men to withdraw at 12 a clock at noon; They were much wearied in being engaged & continuing in open field till this time.

About one a clock this afternoon, we perceived the Enimy to begin to return, to the same quarters, as they were at last night.

This afternoon the Gov^r. and Councill orderd all the horse to be gott ready, & to borrow as many as to be had.

This evening rec^d. a letter from Abdall Labby, in answer to the Presidents sent the 19th Inst. disapproveing of Selimon Cawns actions, & adviseing of our opposeing him, in all his ill designs.

This night dispatcht a gen¹¹. letter to Madrass, adviseing the necessary, as also sending to Porto Novo to take the Ships there, but that we should be glad, if there may not be a necessity for it, being sencible nothing but necessity should cause us to carry on a quarrel wth. the Mogulls subjects.

Messrs. Haynes & Mountague at Cuddalore, for security thereof, is the reason did not sign to the above gen¹¹. letter. The Sally that was thought upon this night, was defer'd, upon acc^{tt}. that our men was so much wearied, with this days fateague.

This morning Selimon Cawn raised his Camp, wch. was upon the bank of Trepopolore river, marcht at the utmost extent of our bounds, & his people sett fire to all the houses at Trepopolore, Bandypollam &c^a. & severall places behind Cuddalore, where his footmen skulkt behind the gardens : He pitcht his tents upon the Hills a little beyond our random; We fired about four eighteen pounders (the Gun being extraordinarry good) slung the shott amongst them, & by that means they were kept at a greater distance; the Battarys at Cuddalore played upon such as they could discover to come near to burn houses, & some of our Talliars being abroad shott a Bhylee in the legg.

This day we perceived the numbers of the Moors very plain, as they marcht, & we hear consists of 200 horse & about 1200 foot.

This evening an ordinary Moorman came from Selimon Cawn, who pretends to be an Ameir; He says Selimon Cawn is very desireous of the body of his brotherin law who was one of the horsemen that was kild near Chingie gate, at Cuddalore, the 18th Inst., we told the messenger that if he sent one that could have assurance did come from him the body should be deliverd, if could be found.

Mollem & the other Chuliars being in the Fort, messengers were sent to Cuddalore to find out the body.

And an other messenger comeing from Selimon Cawn this night about 8 a clock, twas agreed to deliver the body the next morning; and by this messenger we sent word that if Selimon Cawn would deliver Mollems 3 Eliphants we would deliver the Horses & Prisoners.

Dispatcht a gen^{II}. letter this night for Madrass, wth. coppy of the Presidents letter sent this day, to Nabob Zulfauker Cawn, wth. coppy of a letter to Amerjohn in Persia; the President likewise writt this day to Abdall Labby, & Ebrahim Cawn Gurry, to the same purpose.

Many thousands of the Inhabitants lye near the Fort, & put up clouts & other things, to keep them from the sun, & some shops were put up, for selling necessarys to the distressed people.

This morning the President rec^d. an answer from Ebrahim Cawn Gurry, DAY 24TH. expressing that Selimon Cawn had done a great deal of mischeif without reason, that he would endeavour to perswade him to make restitution, & intended to come to Selimon Cawns Camp for that purpose.

Fort St. David Consultations, 1698

— FEBRUARY 1697–98 —

This day rec^d. a gen^{ll}. letter from Madrass dated the 22th Inst. About 12 a clock we discoverd Ebrahim Cawn Gurry, come to Selimon Cawns Camp, w^{ch}. remains upon the Hills, just without our random. Upon his comeing into the bounds he sent a Mauldar to the President to send our Egip Braminy to meet him at Selimon Cawns Camp, haveing desired the same in his letter; Our Egip did not return till about midnight, when a Braminy from Ebrahim Cawn Gurry came with him, & finding by our Egip, that his discourse to him was much different to what he writt in his letter, we thought fitt to hear what his Braminy had to say in the morning.

This day Selimon Cawns people burnt what houses remaining, & cut what Paddy they could come at, that was growing upon the ground.

Ebrahim Cawn Gurry remains encampt near Selimon Cawn, & this morning we discourst his Braminy, & then shewed him Ebrahim Cawn Gurrys two letters, in both w^{ch} he blames Selimon Cawn, to w^{ch}. the Braminy answerd, that Selimon Cawn gave his Master a different representation of the matter, That his people came into Cuddalore wth. the Kings treasure, that our Souldiers were abusive to them, killd & wounded them &c^a. We told the Braminy, that Ebrahim Cawn Gurry knew that it was quite otherwise, & himself knew so too, but he said that he must discourse as ordered, & that Ebrahim Cawn Gurry as Mediator to make Peace between Selimon Cawn & us desired three things, viz^t. :

1st. Sending the body of Selimon Cawns brother in Law.

2d The delivery of five Prisoners that were taken in the skirmish at Cuddalore, who had their dependance on him, one a Faukeer, the other Horsekeepers & of as little acc^{tb}. The 3d proposition was to give Selimon Cawn a sum of money, & then he would be gone, We did not hesitate to give the two first, but sent the five prisoners wth. his Braminy, & the Corps being found yesterday by Mollems people, was orderd to be sent to the Fort, & from thence they might receive it, the Braminy prest our sending of it, we'n. we refused, & plainly told him, that no man had security in going near a man of Selimon Cawns temper. As to his last proposition of giveing a sum of money, we told him that did much admire Ebrahim Cawn Gurry should mention such a thing, when twas notoriously known Selimon Cawn had basely & wickedly robbed, plundered & damaged this place to a considerable amount, that we had represented the matter to Zulfauker Cawn, & did not question but he would order him to render satisfaction; That Ebrahim Cawn Gurry had in his letters exprest quite contrary as aforesaid, & we expected restitution for his wrongs; his Braminy did not propose the delivery of the four Horses, nor the other Prisoners that were servants to Selimon Cawn. In discourse with this Braminy we are assured that Selimon Cawns people came into Cuddalore wth. some of the Kings treasure: Zulfauker Cawn had sent about 20 horsemen belonging to Ramsing for said treasure, wch. was about 25000 Rups. Selimon Cawn was to send some horse as Convoy wth. it towards the Camp, & haveing had evill designs against Cuddalore, took this oppertunity, & there is reason to beleive Ramsings people knew nothing of it till the morning, & then they hasted away wth. the treasure, tho some of them were spectators of Selimon Cawns base attempt; & tis said that they have reported the same publickly, at Zulfauker Cawns Camp, to the dishonour of Selimon Cawn.

This evening our Mauldar returned from the Nabobs Camp. He brings no answer from Amer John to the Presidents letter, nor from the Nabob; but a curtious letter from Abdall Labby, who writes that he has represented Selimon Cawns base dealings to Zulfauker Cawn, & that we must make our applications to the Nabob; that if we had done it sooner it might have prevented this vastly great loss.

Amerjohn told our Mauldar, that if we had killed Selimon Cawn in his base attempt upon us, Zulfauker Cawn would have been well pleased, & that an order was ready to be deliverd him, requireing Collebeague not to give us any disturbance, but the same was not chopt, because UttumChund had not rec^d. what he expected; & our spye Braminy writes that Amerjohn told him we should upon no account

give anything to Selimon for it would be displeaseing to Zulfauker, who would take care of our business more effectually, when application was only made to himself; And Uttum Chund says that Rama Rajahs papers being in his custody, he observes the English gave much money to him for Tevenapatnam &c^a. but would give none to Zulfauker Cawn.

Ebrahim Cawn Gurrys Egip & our Braminy, went to their Camp, but did not return.

This night dispatcht a gen¹¹. letter to Madrass, adviseing of all occurrences. Messrs. Haynes & Mountague being at Cuddalore did not sign.

Yesterday & to day Selimon Cawn's & Ebrahim Cawn Gurry's people cut a great deal of Paddy in the bounds & carried great quantitys from Trepopolore & other out towns, where the same was buried; The Pollygars that were wth. them were chiefly concerned in carrying away plunder.

Received a gen¹¹. letter from Madrass dated the 24th Inst. This morning our Egip & Ebrahim Cawn Gurry's Braminys returned, who were orderd to tell us that w^{th} . much difficulty he had perswaded Selimon Cawn to return to Chellumbrum, & desired the Corps might be sent & the rest of the Prisoners & horses delivered; Our Egip answered that he knew the Corps was ready, but he had no power to treat about the Prisoners & Horses.

About 9 a clock in the morning, Selimon Cawn took down the great Flags, & gave notice of his departure & about 11 they began to march under the Hills without our bounds, towards Porto Novo; Ebrahim Cawn Gurry accompanyed him about 2 miles, & then returned at the extent of our bounds, where he desired Mr. Berlu might meet him, to treat about the delivery of the Prisoners & horses. He had wholly waved the discourse of giveing Selimon Cawn any money. The Corps went so soon as to meet him, but his stay was so short, that he was gone before Mr. Berlu went $\frac{3}{4}$ of the way, but his Braminy & two Mauldars being with Mr. Berlu, were orderd to acquaint him of his setting out to meet him; After Mr. Berlu's return, twas thought fitt to send a short letter to Ebrahim Cawn Gurry, adviseing him thereof, in w^{ch}. did not mention anything of the Prisoners & Horses.

We told his Braminy, that last night we rec^d. advices from the Camp, that Zulfauker was much displeased with Selimon Cawn, for his base & treacherous dealing with us, he plainly told us, that his master Ebrahim Cawn Gurry had rec^d. the same acc^{tt}. from the camp.

This day twas agreed by the President, Messrs. Ingram, Farmer, Games & Berlu, that if Ebrahim Cawn Gurry insists upon the delivery of the prisoners we should send them to him, significing that tis done purely at his request; but not to deliver the horses, the Owners being dead; for if our advices from the Camp be true, we should therein displease the Nabob.

About six a clock this evening, we had an acc^{tt} that Selimon Cawn & his Party were mett in the way to Porto Novo, driveing of Cattle & plundering all the people they met with.

Considering the miserable condition the out towns are in, from the destruction lately made by Selimon Cawn, & that vast numbers of weavers & Painters are gone, yet find that some remain, & some are willing to stay; They appeard before us to day; We think it absolutely necessary for the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp^{se}. interest to place outguards; Wherefore tis orderd that Serjeant Smith with nineteen men, march to Trepopolore, the usuall guard place, & that an order be sent to Cap^t. James Hugonin, to send a serjeant and ten men to Bandy-pollam, & thirty men to the Fort; esteeming it likewise necessary that Guards be sent out, to Chummundulum & Gangania Copang, 10 men at each place, w^{ch}. is orderd to be done as soon as the men come to the Fort. Haveing in the late trouble taken in Santucrow & Side-Allye with their men, who have rec^d. pay for 15 days, w^{ch}. will be expired in 3 days more, the paymaster is orderd to discharge them, unless some unseen providence should happen to prevent it.

This day rec^d. a gen^{II}. letter from Madrass, dated the 26th Inst. wherein was noted that by advices from the Camp, they heard the Nabob did publickly disapprove of Selimon Cawn's act.

Books Letter H. orderd that it be made rec^d in last month, likewise brought in a List of reall remains which the Accountant is to take care of, that it may correspond with books Letter H.

The Saltpetre last rec^d: from Madrass proveing very dirty, looseing $1\frac{1}{4}$ maund in 20, more then the former; the Storekeeper is orderd to allow the Powder man, half a Pag^o. per Candy, more than for the last, which will be pag^s. 7: 18: - per Candy, they finding Brimstone & Charcoal.

Whereas Cap^t. Mockdum Nina Mollem has since the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp^{as}. settlement here, shewn himself very forward in serveing that R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp^a. on many occasions, & a good Benefactor, haveing 3 ships & 2 Sloops belonging to this place, whereby is brought in considerable customes, & haveing frequent occasion for stores upon account of his shipping, as Cordage, Iron, &c^a., The Storekeeper is orderd to deliver him such stores as his business may require, & the Accountant is orderd to debt the said Mockdum Nina Mollem for the same, he haveing sufficient effects at Cuddalore, in Goods & Houses, to make satisfaction at any time for what stores or goods he may take up.

The Storekeeper is orderd to take of Cap^t. Mockdum Nina 20 garse of Paddy, at 25 pag^s. per garse, & the Paymaster to deliver it out to the Peons at $6\frac{1}{2}$ measures per fanam.

Doctor Faucett reporting that Ralgarus a Beeck has good judgement in physick, orderd that he be entertain'd in the Physick Room in the place of Sam^U. Cox.

Robert Bereman is entertain'd in the Gunroom, at the usuall pay of Europeans, to begin from the first of this month.

Milapah Chitte, &c^a. Tobacco Farmers, haveing formerly bro^t. in an acc^{tt}. of their losses sustaind by Selimon Cawn, amounting to pag^s. 885 : 18 : & haveing been long considering of it; twas agreed they should be allowed 300 pag^s. & they to pay the other three months as usuall, unless further troubles should happen, & we should think it reasonable to make any farther allowance.

The report continueing, & advices from our Spyes, being y^t . Selimon Cawn designs further trouble to us; A gen^{II}. Letter was agreed upon w^{th} . this result; y^t . since the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp^{as}. affairs in this Country cannot be carried on without a right understanding with the Goverment. & the difference w^{th} . them is of so great a loss, as we have found by sad experience; Wherefore we are of opinion, that the necessary to obtain the Nabobs Perwanna, & the sooner the better, & in probability less chargeable.

THURS-DAY 5TH.

Great numbers of Inhabitants have yesterday & to day left our bounds, & more are packing up to be in a readiness to goe.

Dispatcht a gen¹¹. letter to Madrass, adviseing the above.

FRYDAY 6. About 9 a clock this morning 50 Horse and 100 Bhylees of Selimon Cawns came from Trevidie & marcht directly towards our entrenchd guard at Trepopolore, where was a Serjeant with 20 Souldiers and 50 Peons; When they came within shott, our men fired upon them, & kild two of their Horsemen, upon w^{ch}. & firing random shotts from the Fort, they only sett fire to 4 or 5 Houses at Trepopolore, & left the town without further damage, & marched to Gongania Copang, & Witchmeer, burning as they marcht all Houses y^t. were standing, & all the town of Witchmeer was this day burnt, w^{ch}. at Selimon Cawns first coming was preserved from burning by a neighbouring Moor man, w^{ch}. cost the Inhabitants in presents to that Moorman about 60 pag^s.

And haveing an acc^{tt}. what numbers came this day, upon this design; we sent Ensign Williams with 40 Souldiers to the back of Mangee Copang, & preserved severall houses that were new built there.

Sent a Field piece upon the plain wth. 24 men, to prevent burning of Witchmeer if possible.

This afternoon we rec^d. advices by our Spyes, from Narro Puntuloo, Ebrahim Cawn Garrys, Braminy significing y^t. he heard y^t. Zulfauker had confirmed Selimon Cawn in the Goverment of Chellumbrum, for a present of 25,000 rup^s. & as he took leave of the Nabob, asked him if the English at Tevenapatnam had finished their business with him; the Nabob answerd, no, they had not: & therefore permitted Selimon Cawn (who was very desirous of it) to cause trouble to us, expecting we would upon that acc^{tt}. make application to him, & to Selimon Cawn likewise; The Braminy likewise advises, y^t. Selimon Cawn told the Nabob he would goe to Trepopolore & remain there, to doe us what mischief he could, till we gave money to him, & some for the Nabob, This is what Selimon Cawn told Ebrahim Cawn Garry, but he brought no letter to Ebrahim from the Nabob.

Rec^d. an acc^{tt}. from Messrs. Haynes & Mountague, y^t. they had bro^t. in the Merchants Cloth from the Washers, wth. some Souldiers. Our Horsemen being abroad this day, discoverd a party of Moors carrying away Cattle, upon w^{ch}. Mr. Berlu & two other horsemen, made towards them, & killed a Rajapoot, who is said to be Commander of a party of Bhylees. All the Moors returned to Trevidie this afternoon.

Dispatcht a gen¹¹. letter to Madrass, adviseing of all occurrences, After signing, Messrs. Haynes, Mountague and Games returned to Cuddalore.

The Councill mett this evening at the Fort, & it was tho^t. fitt to send a Gen^{II}. Letter to Madrass, adviseing that we understood a Consultation was held last night at Trevidie for Selimon Cawn to come again because his ammunition was arrivd at Trevidie, with two or three small guns. but that Meer Cawn a Pattan Merch^t. did diswade him urgeing that he would but meet with more dishonour, that three of his men were killed yesterday, besides what wounded, & two of his Horsemen taken Prisoners, Meer Cawn & some other Pattans likewise, said the English were how much stronger than formerly, that our men before kept in the Fort, and now they marcht further than Trepopolore. We heard Selimon Cawn was convinct by these arguments, & finding generall dislike in his men to come here again, he said he would goe to Chellumbrum.

It was agreed to send this day six men more to strengthen our guard at Trepopolore. w^{ch}. makes them 27 men, w^{ch}. both ourselves & the Military Officers thinks very secure the Guard's being there yesterday prevented much mischief.

Many thousands of Inhabitants have this day left the bounds, & great quantitys of Goods, laden upon the ships and boats in the Road, out of Cuddalore.

SATURDAY 7th.

This day we rec^d. a letter from Amer John, wth coppy of a Dustick in Persia, requiring Selimon Cawn to make satisfaction.

We hear Selimon Cawn designs to fall upon our Guard y^s. night, at Trepopolore, with all his forces.

This morning we discoverd about 20 Horse comeing from the Southward, w^{ch}. caused an Allarm, & comeing into the bounds our men fired from the Points at Cuddalore, & as some of them came towards our Guard at Trepopolore they fired, & we spent some shott on them from the Fort, w^{ch}. caused them to keep at distance, & so they went to Trevendaporum.

About one a Clock this afternoon, Narro Puntuloo came from Ebrahim Cawn Garry, wth. his letter to the President. The Councill mett this evening, & it was agreed what answer to return Ebrahim Cawn Gurry.

This night dispatcht a gen¹¹. letter to Madrass, of this date, with translate of Ebrahim Cawn Gurrys letter, & our answer, adviseing of all affairs.

The reports continue that Selimon Cawn will come with all his forces hither, y^t . he hath 200 horse & 500 foot, y^t . a 100 of the foot are Lungarees, or plundering . fellows, these reports hath caused great numbers of the Inhabitants to leave the bounds, & to send their familys away by boats, to Pullicherry, Sadrass & Madrass, that we believe there may not be above one quarter part of the People that were here when Selimon Cawn first burnt the Villages; that this place wch. was in a flourishing condition 3 or 4 months past, is now reduced to desolation.

This day we delivered the two horses & prisoners taken the 6th inst. to Cauker Cawns people, being senceable they belonged to them, thô they hapned to be this way, when Selimon Cawns people came to burn & plunder.

This afternoon we sent orders to Ensign Williams to march wth. his 30 Souldiers & a field piece to the extent of the bounds, & there to Pitch his Tent on the bank of Trepopolore River.

This morning we rec^d. a letter from Ebrahim Cawn Gurry, w^{ch}. says that he TUESDAY had much trouble between Selimon Cawn & us, but he had done what he could to 10тн. perswade Selimon Cawn to be gone. & had brot him to a resolution, that if we would withdraw our Souldiers from the entrenchment at Trepopolore, he would be gone to Chellumbrum, but we need not withdraw the 50 Peons.

The Councill mett upon this occasion, & it was agreed to withdraw our Souldiers from Trepopolore to Mangee Copang garden, ordering a trusty Topass wth. six other Topasses to goe in Peons dress & to remain with the Guard of 50 Peons at Trepopolore entrenchment, & to make an alarm if the Moors attackt them, upon w^{ch}. Ensign Williams was ordered to march to the entrenchment.

Twas agreed by the Gov^r. & Councill, y^t. all the high trees & others y^t. stood upon the high ground in Doctor Blackwalls garden should be cutt down, the Enemy haveing formerly marcht under their Covert, therefore of pernicious consequence.

This evening we red. a letter from Selimon Cawn, & one from Ebrahim Cawn WEDNES-Gurry.

Agreed upon sending letters to Amer John, & Emaun Cooly Beague, wch. were dispatcht this day.

Dispatched a gen^{II} letter to Madrass, wth. coppy of Ebrahim Cawn Gurrys translate, & our answer; adviseing wt. Narro Puntuloo said, that 'twas absolutely necessary to have a Perwanna, elce we could not be free from troubles of one kind or other from the Moors.

We have for 3 days successively been in hourly expectation of Selimon Cawn, THURSso that have been always upon our Guard in a readiness. DAY 12TH.

SUNDAY 8тн.

MONDAY 9TH.

About 2 a Clock this morning a Casteez, brother to Mr. Calandrini, came to their factory here from Pullicherry wth. 12 souldiers & 20 Peons, they sent away Mr. Calandrinis slaves & lumber, by 6 a Clock this morning, & in the evening their household goods by boats, & Mrs. Calandrini went about 7 a clock at night for Pullicherry. The Dutch servants say that Mr. Calandrini advised from the Camp that Selimon Cawn designed to plunder Tevenapatnam. Our poor Inhabitants leave the bounds by troops, those that remain are filled with fear.

This day the Councill mett, & consented to the severall letters writt to Selimon Cawn, Ebrahim Cawn Gurry, &c^a. & to a gen¹¹. letter dispatcht this night.

Rec^d. a gen^{ll}. letter from Madrass.

FRYDAY 13TH. Last night about 10 of the clock two of Ebrahim Cawn Gurrys Mouldars came hither, & said that their Master was much concerned that we did not deal cordially with him, for Selimon Cawn had an acc^{tt}. from his Spyes, that our Guard of Souldiers was still at Trepopolore entrenchment. Upon this we sent Muggana, wth. these two Mauldars, & two of Selimon Cawns Spye Braminys to the Comp^{as}. garden, where they saw our Guard that had been at Trepopolore. From thence Muggana went with them to Trepopolore, & they saw the Guard there to be all black men

Narro Puntuloo sent a letter by our Spyes, adviseing we should satisfie these Mauldars, because Selimon Cawn did his utmost to exasperate Ebrahim Cawn Gurry against us; saying we only put tricks upon him, &c^a.

This night our Spyes from Trevidie say, that Selimon Cawn marcht that afternoon towards Vinkatumpat, that Ebrahim Cawn Gurry obleiged him to goe that way. He made a publick declaration that he did not come against us, purely upon the request of Ebrahim Cawn Gurry.

We hear from severall hands, y^t . he is gone w^{th} . a heart full of malice towards us, & y^t . he cried for madness, when he read the Presidents letter to Ebrahim Cawn Gurry, w^{ch} . we writt in Persia the Sth inst.

The President sent a letter to the Hon^{ble}. Lieut. Gen^{ll}. adviseing the needfull relateing to Selimon Cawn.

Shack Bitchu, chief Avaldar to Cauker Cawn, desireing leave to come to the Fort, twas thought requisite to present him & his attendance wth. 3 yards of Aurora, 3 yards of Broadcloth, & 3 yards Perpetuanos.

Our Spyes advise that Selimon Cawn went this day to Bungrypatnam.

This day rec^d. a letter from Amer John, signifieing more delays, & that such a Perwanna as the Nabob proposed to give was of little importance; He advised to make a good resistance against Selimon Cawn, & says the Nabob seemed to wonder that he should give us further trouble.

Rec^d: a gen^{ll}. letter from Madrass, dated the 11th inst.

SATURDAY

14тн.

Our Spyces advise this day, the Selimon Cawn was come to Chellumbrum, & y^t. he kept all his forces with him.

Rec^d. a gen^{ll}. letter from the Hon^{ble}. Leiut. Gen^{ll}. &c^a. Councill, of date the 14th Inst. Coppy of their Consultation of D^o. date, wth. a letter to Amer John, & Amer Johns letter, wth. translate of a draft of a Perwanna.

Our Spyes say that Selimon Cawn has spent money to endeavour to find a way into Cuddalore, but tis likely he did it only to frighten the Inhabitants, for we believe that neither he nor his men are very forward to engage in such an enterprize; but he has lately found the trade of Porto Novo to encrease, one instance being, y^t 40 oxload of Cloth comeing hither from Woorriar Pollam, at the same time y^t . Selimon Cawn threatned to come against us, was orderd by the Owners to Porto Novo.





The Governors letter to Governor Pitt of yesterdays date, was this day forward-24TH. ed to Negapatnam.

This morning about six a clock the Sentinells from some Cuddalore Points spyed a party of horse advanceing that way, which caused an alarm, & they came under the covert of the Beetle garden so quick as to drive away many Cattle, and discovering the party to be as we thought about 50 horse & 100 foot, we thought it requisite to send out Ensign Williams wth. 32 souldiers, who engaged them near Bandypollam & wounded severall of them: about the same time a party of soldiers sallyed out of Cuddalore, & rescued a considerable number of cattle, after this their whole body came up, being about 100 horse & 200 foot.

About 40 of their horse separated from the rest, & came full speed to Trepopolore, at the furthest distance from our Guard, they past the river & on a sudden came to the back of Mangee Copang, where they fired two or three houses, but perceiveing their motion wth. our prespectives from the Fort, sent out 24 men thither who comeing presently after them, caused them to run to the extent of the bounds, about 12 at noon these 40 horse rejovned their main body, one of w^{ch}. passing at a great distance from our Guard at Trepopolore was wounded by the firing a long bullett gun. & thô Ensign Williams with his 32 men were in a little Patcharee in full view of all their body, yet they did not venture on them, but all marcht to the southward under the hills, from whence they came in the morning.

The Moors have this day killed two of the Inhabitants, wounded severall others, & carried many away wth. them.

We have an acc^{tt}. that the Moors killed 3, and wounded 12 of our Inhabitants, the 24th past; Persons unarm'd, such as usually till the ground; & carried this time away above 400 head of cattle.

All our horsemen were out this day, & was as many as could gett horses & accoutrements; for being Mr. Mountague, Mr. Berlu, Capt. Hugonin, Mr. Bugden, Mr. Bulteel, & 8 soldiers wth. a Trumpeter, these horse went to Cuddalore, & advanceing towards the Enimy; at same time Ensign Reay went wth. 24 men towards Ranserpollam, part of the Enimy retird & the rest posted themselves behind bushes & hedges, and some of them going into the Faukers toap, our Guns from the Points played upon them, and they could doe no mischief this day, & returnd in the Evening towards Chellumbrum. This night we had an acc^{tt}. that Selimon Cawn went to Porto Novo, & took 5 guns from the ships, makeing a speech to the Merchants & others, that he was going against Cuddalore, where he was resolv'd to conquer or dye, if the latter, he desired of them to gett his bones, & bury them in Chellumbrum.

We hope our Entrenchment will be finished by tomorrow night.

Answer to Cauker Cawn was agreed upon & sent.

To we'h. we answerd, twas notoriously known by all the Kings people here, yt. we never went out of our bounds to provoke him, nor never acted any thing contrary to Friendship, doing no more then defending ourselves, & therefore we were not any ways blameable for Selimon Cawn's spoyling the Kings Country, & that he was wholy answerable for it, as well as for the dammage he had done to us, And after he had long insisted upon makeing Friendship, we continued to urge to him, we knew not how it could be done, unless Selimon Cawn would make satisfaction, & y^t. we had advised the Hon^{blo}. Lieut. English Colours, under pain of a months imprisonment, or so long as the President & Councill shall think reasonable, & to pay such fine as the aggrivation of the crimes may deserve, not exceeding 500 pag^s. & tis further declared that if any of the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp^{as}. servants shall be found guilty of the breach of this order, they shall be fccthwith dismissed the service, according to an order of Consultation made by the Hon^{ble}. Lieut. Gen^{ll}. & Councill in Fort St. George the 13th. of this Inst. June 1698.

Observeing by the letter from Amerjohn, that he meets with more interruptions in getting the Perwanna, that the Nabob makes a further demand of him. Monday 19th. THE RT. WORPLL. WM. HATSELL ESQR. DEPUTY GOVERNOB.MR. JNO. HAYNES.MR. RA. INGRAM.MR. EDMP. MOUNTAGUE.MR. RI. FARMER.MR.JNO. BEELU.

The Deputy Governor acquaints the Councill, that Mr. Haynes haveing made an Entry in the Generall Books of this place, w^{ch}. went home upon ship King William, relateing to the registering of slaves, w^{ch}. Mr. Haynes spoke of since the arrival of ship Martha, whereupon the Deputy Governor spoke to him concerning it, & upon Fryday the 16th inst. Mr. Haynes sent the Journall of our gen^{II}. books letter F. where we observe there is a long entry made by him (in whiter ink than the rest of the Journall is written in) in foll: 52. added to a Journall parcell related to Mr. Trevor Games; said long entry succeeds the words Viz^t.: [D^o. for slaves registerd by the Justices].

The Deputy Governor likewise produced a Coppy of said Journall, letter F. w^{ch}. was coppied by Dymick Hustwait in Mr. Haynes's house at Cuddalore, w^{ch}. coppy is signed by Mr. Haynes, as a register for this place, In said books, Fol. 52. there is not the least mention of this long entry, but at the end of the above mentiond line, D^o. for slaves registered by the Justices, is drawn out 27 fan^s. so that the amo^t. of Mr. Games entry is the same as in the books writt by Mr. Haynes.

The Deputy Governor likewise produced the Consultations of the 8th November, 1694, the 18th July 1695, & the 31th December 1696, & our gen^{ll}. letter to Madrass. dated the 24th July 1695.

It is agreed y^t. Mr. Games Journall parcell entred in Foll. 52 wth. Mr. Haynes long entry be coppied exactly, & sent to the Hon^{ble}. President & Councill of Madrass, & coppys of our Consultations w^{ch}. relate to it.

Whereas there was formerly an order made, that what grain was bro^t. into the Comp³⁵. bounds & lodged in the out towns, should pay 3 per cent, w^{ch}. order was made by reason of the unsettled condition the country was then in, when great quantitys were bro^t. in by the renters to be secured; but the late troubles by Selimon Cawn has quite altered the condition of affairs, so y^t. we have reason to believe y^t. that revenue does not amount to the wages of 5 Conicoplys; and being senceable that the encreasing of the Inhabitants in the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp³⁵. bounds, is what we ought particularly to have regard unto & believing this small duty may be some obstacle, it is therefore orderd, y^t. the said 3 per cent be taken off till further order, & y^t. the 5 Conicoplys be dismisst. Ordered that the proclamation of peace rec^d from Madrass be proclaimed on Saturday next at the Choultrys of Tevenapatnam & Cuddalore by Mr. Richard Farmer & Mr. John Berlu on horseback, attended by 12 Halberters, & y^t. some fireworks and a bonfire be made at night.

Orderd, that Mr. Games & Mr. Berlu doe take an exact acc^{tt} of all the slaves y^t. has been registerd, from the 1st of August 1695 to the 31st December 1696.



Consultation of the 8th Nov. 1694 & 18th July 1695 with para. of a genu. letter to Madrass dated 24 July 1695 & the acception made were considered of.

Copy of Mr. Haynes his acception the 18th July 1695. The two Consultations of the 8th November 1694 and the 18th July 1695 with a Paragraph of a Gen^{II}. letter dated the 24th July 1695 to the President & Councill of Madrass and Messrs. Haynes and Griffith theire exception to the Consultation of the said 18th July 1695 were considered of, from which it appeares y^t . Mr. Haynes who was one of the Justices did represent to the Deputy Governor and Councill y^t . it was most for the Comp^a. Interest to take off $\frac{3}{4}$ pagoda for such slaves y^t . was registered at the Land Custome Choultry where in the Morattaes time that duty was one pagoda per head, & the matter being duly considered of, an order of Consultation was past for makeing the Comp^{as}. duty $\frac{1}{4}$ pagoda per head in consideration y^t . a Pagodae was paid when the slave was shipt off, & observeing Mr. Haynes exception to the Consultation dated the 18th July 1695 w^{ch}. exception runes in these words, viz^t.:

What ordered in relation to Slaves I apprehend to be Irregular and unpracticiable for any to register Slaves besides the Justices apointed and y^t . being in a manner the only Fees they receive it will be hard to debarr y^m . thereof especially since they have been informed the same Fees have been rec^d. by the Justices in Madrass wherefore humbly referr the same to the determination of the Hon^{ble}. President &c^a.

JNO. HAYNES.

The Paragraph writt from hence the 24th July 1695 to the Hon^{ble}. President &c^a. relateing to this affaire is in the following words, viz^t:

Inclosed is a Coppy of two Consultations relateing to the buying Slaves, to the latter Messrs. Haynes & Griffith being Justices are not satisfyed supposeing y^t. the Justices of the Choultry should have 4 Madras fanams for every Slave y^t. is shipt off w^{ch}. they thinke was practized in the Famine time at Madrass there was three Justices belonging to the Choultry here: the two above mentioned & Capt.
