## PREFATORY NOTE

This Volume contains two sets of the proceedings of the Deputy Governor and Council of Fort St. David for the year 1703-4, one being their proceedings and transactions for the affairs of the Right Honourable United English East India Company from 28th December 1703 to 31st December 1704 and the other being their proceedings and transactions for the separate affairs of the Right Honourable Governor and Company of merchants trading into the East Indies from 4th January 1704 to 31st December 1704. The East India Company was incorporated in 1600 under the title of the Governor and merchants of London trading into the East Indies. In 1698, a rival company was formed under the sanction of Parliament entitled the English Company trading to the East Indies. In 1702 the two companies agreed to amalgamate in 7 year's time and the union was finally effected in 1709. On the 15th July 1703 it was ordered in the Fort St. George Consultations that two sets of proceedings should be made, one for the United trade and the other for the separate trade of the old company. This accounts for the two sets of Fort St. David Consultations sent by the India Office for 1704. Two separate sets are available in this Office only for the Fort St. George Consultations of 1705.

The manuscript volumes corresponding to this year are not found among the records of this Office. The matter contained in this book has therefore been entirely supplied by the courtesy of the India Office from their Factory Records, and the India Office typescripts have been preserved in place of the original.

President & Councill of Madrass upon said vessell, the freight of which amounting to eighty eight Pag<sup>s</sup>., the Dep. Governor is desired to pay the same to the owners of said Ketch or their order.

Agreed that an order bee sent to Captain James Hugonin to send hither Anto. De Mayo & the rest of the Prisoners he has now in his Custody, Concern'd in the death of Francisco De Pina & all other Witnesses concern'd in the same under a strong guard at three a Clock this afternoon in order to their examination before us.

Order'd that a review bee taken of the Old Company's stores not included in the dead stock of this Garrison on Munday next in order to see what is necessary to bee bought for the use of this Garrison acco<sup>tt</sup>. the United Trade.







The Deputy Governor imparted to us a Letter hee had this Morning rec<sup>d</sup>. from the Gentlemen who accompany'd Mrs. Proby to protect her from the Insolencys of the Juncanneers at Broomiapoll<sup>m</sup>. who advis'd that they were return'd back to Conimeer having rec<sup>d</sup>. an acco<sup>tt</sup>. that the Juncanneers have got together about one hundred men, Horse and Foot, with a design to seize upon them in their return hither, Wherefore wee have thought Convenient and doe hereby order that Captain Hugonin with thirty soldiers and ten Peons doe immediately embark himself upon a Chillinge & Land at Conimeer to Join Company with the Gentlemen that are there, where they may receive advice what force the Juncanneers have at Broomypoll<sup>m</sup>. and if hee finds his owne not sufficient to pass hither by Land in safety, that then they hire another Chillinge there, and come hither by Water, and that the following bee given Captain Hugonin and Captain Davis for their directions:

#### To Captains Hugonin & Davis.

The Deputy Governor this morning laid before us the letter hee had rec<sup>d</sup>. from Captain Davis adviseing that himselfe and three other gentlemen remain'd in Conimeer haveing had Intelligence that the Juncanneers of Broomiapollam had intentions to stop them in their returne hither and have gott together a party of one hundred men for that purpose, for which Reason wee have thought Convenient and doe hereby order that you Captain Hugonin with thirty Soldiers & tenn Peons doe immediately imbark on a Chillinge & Joine company with Captain Davis & the other Gentlemen at Conimeer where you may learn a true accott. what force the Juncanneers have at Broomypoll<sup>m</sup>. and if you finde your owne not sufficient to protect you from their Insolencys, Wee leave it to your prudence to take your passage by Water, hireing another boat at Conimeer for the better Conveyance of your men and land when you are past Broomipollam or when you think you are out of danger, or take your passage all the way by Water as you think best and safest, but if you should rewolve [sic] to come by Land avoid shedding of blood or committing any other act of Hostility, except compell'd thereto and bee sure lett them bee the first aggressors, if you come by Water deliver the Companys Horses to the Chief of Conimeer & desire his Care of them till wee have a Convenient opportunity to send for them from thence, Wee wish you a safe return & remain







That the ballance of their old acco<sup>tt</sup>. should be forthwith paid them, because they have no other Stock to Issue out for buying of goods; & it being the Company's orders that no money must be impress'd to the merchants beforehand, they are absolutely unable to undertake this Invest ment till they receive that money.
- . Secondly. Since the Company's urgent occasions require their making an Investment at this time & the Moratta army reported to be very near, they are apprehensive & fearfull that their money & Cloth may be seized in the country, and therefore insist that upon due proof made thereof the Company should oblige to pay them what damages they sustain'd.
- Thirdly. That they cannot oblige for any great quantity of Cloth, because their Joint Stock is no more than fifteen thousand pagodas, in which is included their Godowns & their necessary buildings here, so that they shall not have above twelve thousand pagodas clear money to carry on this Investment. President desireing him to procure a Pilott to carry Yatch Medapollam & Fly between Ceylon and the Main, Pursuant to said order hee acquaints us hee has made the best inquiry hee can, but could find none fitting to undertake that Charge, but one Thomas Browne in our Gunroom, who haveing been Pilott thro' that Passage four Voyages, Wee therefore think him the best Pilott procurable here, and Thomas Chapman, master of the Yatch, approveing thereof, as appears by his Letter to the Deputy Governor, said Thomas Browne is therefore permitted to proceed on this voyage, & order'd to bee discharg'd his present imploy here, & order'd to go on board Immediately, promiseing when the voyage is ended hee will return here again.

The aforesaid Letter directing us that Ketch Huglyanna bee brought in the river to bee repair'd here, order'd shee bee brought in at which of the barrs the Master and Arcott think safest, & that the Storekeeper supply him with what necessary hee wants, takeing an exact account thereof apart.


