The Consultations and Diary of the Worspl. Gabriel Roberts Esqr. Deputy Governour &c^a. Councill of Fort St. David, being their Proceedings & Transactions for the United Trade of the English Company Tradeing to the East Indies. Commencing the 8th January 1706-7. Concludeing the 30th September 1707.

Mrs. Mary Wilson & Doctor Anthony Suply, sett out last night overland for Madrass. 8TH.

We are inform'd that Mons^r. Peter Delivier is arriv'd on a Danes Brigantine from Bengall at Pullicherry, being appointed Governour of that place. 12TH.

Rec^d. a Generall Letter from the Hon^{ble}. President and Councill of Madrass, dated the 10th Instant. 13TH.

Read a Generall Letter from the Hon^{ble}. President & Councill of Madrass, dated the 10th Inst. directing that since the Riseing Sun Smack cannot be got over the Barr, her Master be discharged, who in said Letter is appointed to carry the Yatch to Madrass, therefore order'd that he take charge of her accordingly, & that the Secretary acquaint him therewith.

In the abovesaid Letter we are advised by the Hon^{ble}. President & Councill that they would dispatch to us the St. George in order to carry part of the Bales to Madrass, & to prevent being surprized by any Vessell from Pullicherry, the Spy Braminy is directed to goe thither immediately & to send us daily account of all transactions there, perticularly if any French ships are

arriv'd, and of all vessells that goes in & out of that port, which he is to doe by three Tappy Peons laid between Pullicherry & this place, for the quicker dispatch of his advices to us.

Whereas complaint has been made to the Deputy Gov^r. that perticular people goe out to the edge of the Bounds & monopolize the Grain as it is brought in by the Country People, and after bring it into the Bazar & sell it to the Inhabitants at an extravagant rate; To prevent which Greivance or any further complaint from the Inhabitants, tis order'd that publick notice be given by beating the Tomtom all over the bounds, that no person whatsoever be permitted to buy up or engross any quantity of Paddy, but to permitt the Country People to bring it into the Bazar, & fairly sell it there: & that if after this order any person presume to engross any Paddy but what he fairly buys in the Bazar, he be fin'd fifty pagodas, a month's imprisonment, & afterwards to be whipt at the Choultry.

Order'd that the Deputy Governour pay the Merchants four thousand five hundred pagodas on acct^t. Goods embaled.

Mr. John Bridges read his account of Tobacco, Beetle and Ganjee of Tevenapatam for the month of December. which was examined & past, the ballance of which being one hundred & two pagodas & thirty four fanams, he now pays said sum into the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company's Cash.

Mr. John Bridges bro^t. in Mr. Ralph Ingram's deceas'd, acco^{tt}s. of weighing & measuring Duty of Tevenapatam, from the primo March 1706 to the ult^o. December last, which was examined & past, the whole amounting to pag^s. thirty one & twenty three fanams, One moiety of which being pag^s. fifteen, twenty nine fanams & three Cash, due to the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company, he now pays into their Cash.

Mr. John Bridges bro^t. in & read the Warehousekeeper's account for the month of December, which was examined & past, & pays in the ballance being five pagodas nine fanams & four Cash, into the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company's Cash.

Mr. Richard Harrison bro^t. in his account of Land Customs of Cuddalore for the month of December, which was examined & past, the ballance of which being pag^s. fourty four, six fanams & two Cash, he now pays into the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company's Cash; perticulars of which acco^{tt}. is as enter'd next after this Consultation.

Order'd that the Deputy Governour pay the Paymaster two hundred pag^s. to defray charges Garrison.

Mr. Philip Baker attended this day, & took his place as youngest in Council of this place according to an order from the Hon^{ble}. President & Council of Madrass, dated the 10th Inst. which occasions the debate of stationing the Gentlemen of Council, the result of which was that Mr. Berlu officiate the Warehousekeeper's employ, Mr. Bridges the Sea Customs of Cuddalore, Mr. Harrison in the Paymasters Mr. Duke Faunce in the Land Customs of Cuddalore, & Mr. Baker in the Sea & Land Customs of Tevenapatam & Storekeeper, & that the Scavengers employ of Cuddalore be referred to the determination of the Hon^{ble}. President and Council of Madrass, whither they will please to continue it to Mr. Harrison, or give it to Mr. Faunce, which severall posts each Gentleman is required to take charge of at the expiration of this month; & that those who at present officiate therein, doe then render up their accounts of the same in Consultation, all which is order'd to be signified to the Hon^{ble}. President & Council of Madrass, in our next Gen^l. Letter, for their approvall.

The Deputy Governour imparted to us a Letter he had just now rec^d. from the Hon^{ble}. President, in which he directs that the St. George & Yatch Maddapollam be dispatcht as soon as possible, & that we send upon them all the Betteelas that is ready imbal'd : Order'd that they be laden immediately, & dispatcht as soon as possible.

Mr. Bridges, Paymaster, laid before us a bill for physick expended by Doctor Suply to the time of his departure, amounting to eight pag^s. which he informs us he had paid to the said Doctor Suply, which is approved of.

Mr. John Berlu read his account of Sea Customs of Cuddalore for the months of September & October, which were examin'd & past; particulars of which are as enter'd next after this Consultation.

Mr. John Bridges read his Paymaster's account for the month of December : In which we find charg'd pag^s. two hundred & fifteen, seaventeen fanams and three Cash, paid Mr. Weld Steward : his book was sent for up & examin'd, by which we find he had expended said sum, under the peticular heads as charged at the foot of the Paymaster's account, both which accounts were examined & past, & are as enter'd after this Consultation.

He also bro^t. in & read his account of the proffitt gain'd on the exchange of pagodas into fanams, from the primo May to ult. December, which was read & examined, and the proffitt amounting to pag^s. one hundred & ten, two fanams & four Cash, he now pays into the Rt. Hon^{ble}. United Company's Cash.

Read two Gen^L. Letters from the Hon^{ble}. President & Council of Madrass, dated 18th. & 21st. Inst. the former of which directing us to lode & dispatch the St. George & Maddapollam Yatch with all the expedition imaginable, provided we had no news to discourage us from Pullicherry: foresaid Vessells being now loden accordingly, the Deputy Governour informs us that he had this noon rec^d. intelligence from thence that the French had this morning sent aboard the small vessell in their Road, twelve Europeans with some Topasses, severall boats of ballast, fifteen Cask of water & other provisions, which is more than necessary were the Vessell only to remain in their Road, & gives us reason to suspect they may have some design upon the St. George & Maddapollam, as they pass Pullicherry in their voyage to Madrass with the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company's Bales, since the northerly wind and Current continues so strong, as will oblige them to be some days in beating it up thither, & give the French oppertunity to put in practice what they may design: for which reason it's order'd that no more bales be sent on board till further advice from Pullicherry, & that the Vessells be not dispatcht this evening as intended, but that immediately a Gen^L. Letter be wrote to the Hon^{ble}. President & Council of Madrass, informing them of what we hear, and requesting their farther directions: and that for the better security of the goods now aboard tis ordered that Ensign Carter with 30 men goe aboard the St. George & remain there till further order, with directions to resist any that shall attack them where they lye: And that Ensign Williams doe goe on board of the Yatch with 20 men from Cuddalore for the same reason & with the same instructions.

The Deputy Governour informs us that he accepts the Bill drawn on him by the Hon^{ble}. President for five thousand pag^s. which he has paid into the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company's Cash.

Mr. John Berlu read his Sea Customer's accounts of Cuddalore for the months of November & December which were examined & Past: coppys of which are as enter'd next after this Consultation.

Mr. Berlu bro^t. in the copy of his Sea Customer's account of Cuddalore from the primo November 1705 to the ult^o. December 1706, which is order'd to be remitted home to the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company, with the rest of our books & accounts by the next ships.

Mr. Harrison also produced the copy of his Land Customer's accounts of Cuddalore for the last year, which the Secretary is order'd to send with the rest of accounts & c^s. when our Packett is sent to Madrass, to be remitted to the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company.

Read a Gen^l. Letter from the Hon^{ble}. the President & Council of Fort St. George dated the 27th. Inst. and persuant to the directions therein it is agreed for the greater secrecy in the business of provideing two hundred Garse of Paddy, or as much as can be gott, be referred to the management & direction of the Deputy Governour & Mr. Mountague, who are desired from time to time to consult one another in order to take the best methods for procureing it: who are hereby empowered to issue out such money as they shall think convenient, & is necessary for this occasion.

And whereas in the abovesaid letter they confirm the order given upon the Union for appointing the employs of the Gentlemen of Council here, except who shall officiate as Scavenger of Cuddalore, it is agreed & order'd that each Gentleman take upon him his employ at the expiration of this month according to the direction of said letter.

Whereas in the abovemention'd Generall the President & Council are pleased to approve of the caution we have taken not to dispatch the Vessells with the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company's bales, by reason of the French Vessell remaining still in a sailing posture at Pullicherry, & are pleased to think them secure here whilst the Souldiers are on board under good command, & keep a strict watch; for which reason tis agreed that they be not unladen; but cannot apprehend it safe for us to dispatch them whilst the French Vessell remains where she is, who we are inform'd, has 29 Europe men on board, with provision & ammunition. And since our Vessels are obliged to turn it to windward this northerly Monsoon, it would give them an oppertunity to put in practice any ill designs they may have upon them: All which is order'd to be signified the Hon^{ble}. President & Council in our Generall of this day's date.

Mr. John Bridges bro^t. in the Cobby of his Paymaster's account from the primo January 1705-6 to the ult^o. December 1706, which is order'd to be remitted to the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United English East India Company, by the next ship.

Mr. Duke Faunce also bro^t. in a Cobby of his accounts Sea & Land Customs of Tevenapatam from the primo January, 1705-6 to ult^o. December, 1706, which is also order'd to be sent to the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company by the first Shipping.

Mr. Duke Faunce read his Sea & Land Customer's accott. of Tevenapatam for the month of December, which was read and examin'd; the ballance thereof being pagodas sixteen, fifteen fanams & four Cash, he now pays into the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company's Cash; perticulars of said account is as enter'd next after this Consultation.

Read a Gen^l. Letter from the Hon^{ble}. President & Councill of Madrass, dated primo Inst. which directs that we immediately lode the Sedgewick, & that she with the St. George & Maddapollam be dispatcht together, & that the Soldiers we had on board the two latter remain in the manner they direct for their better security: from which orders we infer that the Hon^{ble}. President & Councill conclude the French Vessell lies still in Pullicherry Road: But we haveing rec^d. certain Information that she sail'd last Saturday morning, are of opinion it is not necessary to continue the Soldiers on board the St. George and Maddapollam that were sent from hence: and not haveing since that time rec^d. any other intelligence that the French at Pullicherry are getting ready any other Vessell, or of any intention they have to intercept or prejudice ours; It's therefore order'd & agreed that they be

dispatcht this evening and that the twenty Soldiers which came on the Sedgewick from Madrass be continued on board her, thinking they may make a better defence kept together (if occasion require) than if parted: Tis therefore agreed that her Commander, Captain Craddock, be enjoyn'd by his Instructions to keep them company, & take them under his Convoy till their arrivall at Madrass.

Inclosed we rec^d. Invoice of one hundred Plank sent us, which was delivered Mr. Mountague Accountant to enter accordingly: and the Storekeeper is order'd to take charge of the same for the use of the Garrison.

The Merchants attended this day in Consultation to bring in their answer about the proposition was made to them of undertakeing an Investment for the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company, to the amount of twenty or thirty thousand pagodas : when in debate they told us that in the two last Contracts they were Loosers, & except we could advance ten per cent on the last years prices & pay them in the same manner, they could not undertake it, because they had already employed their Joynt Stock in buying up Paddy & Cloth, besides what remains in the Company's hands for the ballance of their last account, so till they could turn this into money again, they had not a Stock sufficient to undertake this Investment upon the terms proposed to them the 28th last month : This was the answer of the Tevenapatam Merchants. And the Cuddalore Merchants being asked if they agreed in the same reply, they requested till next Thursday to bring in theirs, which was granted them, and they order'd to attend said day.

Since the Tevenapatam Merchants have refused makeing the Contract; It's order'd that Mr. Faunce Customer of Tevenapatam doe receive the Custome on their Cloth already brought in, & what shall by them hereafter be brought in, But that Mr. Baker doe not receive the Custome on the Cuddalore Merchants Cloth till they have given us their answer.

This day the Cuddalore Merchants attended in Consultation to give their answer about the Investment, when we again proposed to them the undertaking it upon the terms directed by the Hon^{ble}. President and Council of Madrass, according to their orders in their Generall of the 26th past month. And after a long debate did prevail with them to undertake the provideing the severall sorts of Cloth directed in said Generall, to the amount of twenty thousand pag^s. at the same prices as in last years Contract : But at the same time they informed us their Stock was but ten thousand pagodas, & that except the ships arrive to reimburse them said sum, they could not obleige themselves to bring in goods to a greater amount, but if they did, & we were enabled to pay them after the usuall manner, they would, if we pleased, provide Goods to the amount of thirty thousand pag^s. But withall requested that as they undertook this Contract purely to serve the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company on this occasion they might be permitted to pay no more Custome than the Merchants doe at Madrass, & withall that the Interest for their money may be made up at the expiration of every month, for such sums as shall appear due to them for their Cloth measured brown, & that the ballance of their last Contract may be paid them. All which is order'd to be wrote to the Hon^{ble}. President & Council of Madrass for their further directions.

Notwithstanding the Tevenapatam Merchants have already refused provideing any Cloth for the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company, except payment be made to them in the usuall manner, yet since we cannot be assured from the Cuddalore Merchants in case of the non arrivall of the ships of any greater quantity than to the amount of ten thousand Pag^s. by reason of the smallness of their Stock : Tis agreed that the Tevenapatam Merchants be again called up, & all perswasive Arguments used to engage them to provide to the amount of ten thousand pagodas more on the same terms as shall be agreed with the Cuddalore Merchants. And accordingly they were called in, when we prest them with all the perswasions we could to undertake it upon the same terms : To which they replied that two of their Partners were gone to Madrass, and without their consent they could not undertake to provide any Cloth for the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company, except we were enabled to pay them in the usuall manner, which being immediately contrary to directions we received from the Hon^{ble}. President & Council of Madrass we could not consent to their Propositions.

ARTICLES of AGREEMENT made & Contracted at Fort St. David this third day of July, 1707 between the Worsp^{LL}. Gab^L. Roberts Esq^R. Deputy Governor & c^a. Councill of Fort St. David on behalf of the R^t. Hon^{ble}. the Managers for the United Trade of the English Company trading to the East Indies on the one part: and the underwritten Merchants, Omar Nina Mercon, Chinne Viaboga Chitte, Verago Chitte, Pedde Chitee, Comrapa Chitte & Trecome Chitte, in behalf of themselves & the rest of the Two hundred Shares Joynt Stock Merchants of Cuddalore, on the other part, for all & every of them joyntly & severally in manner following. That is to say, the said Omar Nina Mercon & c^a. above mention'd Merchants doe Contract, promise & agree in behalf of themselves & c^a. Partners, with the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company for an Investment to the amount of thirty three thousand pag^s. or thereabouts, to be bro^t. in, in several sorts of Callicoes, Quantitys, Species, Prices & time as followeth, viz^t. :

It's agreed that the above goods is to be bro^t. in immediately or as soon as possible to the amount of ten thousand pagodas in proportion to the abovesaid List, which said sum the aforesaid Merchants being obliged to advance or issue forth of their own joynt Stock; the Deputy Governor & Councill doe Promise & agree in consideration of the same to give them nine Per cent Interest for what Cloth shall be bro^t. in brown, according to the usual manner of payment, & to give them our bond for the same. And it is further Covenanted & agreed, that on the arrivall of the first ship or ships from England the said Merchants are obliged to bring in, in three months time after, the remaining part of the aforesaid thirty three thousand pagodas, something more or less, on the same terms as agreed with them in last Contract, when they are to be paid in the usuall manner as was then Contracted, according to the direction in a Generall Letter from the Hon^{ble}. That is to say as soon as they bring in any Longcloth ordinary brown into the Company's Godown, they shall receive one pagoda per peice, the same upon Betteelas, & half a pagoda upon Sallampores, & that as soon tis washed & sorted, that very day the account shall be stated & cleared.

And it is also agreed that the sev^{ll}. sorts of Cloth to be bro^t. in, in this Investment shall be sorted by the Madrass Musters now agreed upon, & the number of pungeums in them contained, being viz^t., in Longcloth ordinary sixteen pungeums; in Sallampores ordinary seaventeen pungeums, & in Betteelas 40 & 50 cov^d. long eighteen pungeums. The Deputy Governour informs us that he had on receipt of said Letter sent the same person that loaded her before to gett it ready, and given him a strick [*sic*] charge to procure that which is large streight sticks and of a convenient length for their better stowage.

In the forementioned Generall of the 14th of August the Hon^{ble}. President & Council are pleased to approve of the prizes of those severall sorts of Goods mentioned in our Generall of the 7th, Instant for wh^{ch}. reason it is agreed and ordered that the Secretary draw up two Contracts for the Coodalore & Tevenapatam Merchants, both to contain in equal halves the quantity and species of Goods mentioned in the Hon^{ble}. President and Council's Letter of the 25th. July last, that is to say those severall sorts of Goods that are to be exprest and contained in Last Contract : In which is to be exprest the prizes of the severall Sorts of Goods as mentioned in our Consultation dated the 7th Instant.

Both Setts of Merchants were called up and acquainted therewith, who have oblidgeed themselves to bring in all the Goods mentioned in the last and these Present Contracts, early enough to be washed, Sorted, embaled and sent up to Madrass for the January shipping : and the Deputy Governour is hereby ordered to pay them for the same as fast as they bring it in in the usual manner and as 'tis exprest in said Contracts.

Hon^{ble}.
