We have now about £100,000 in Treasure & Merchandize for China, and if the Gentlemen at Bombay could have provided for the Talbot & York the Supplies from hence and those allready sent from your Presidency might have enabled the Supracargoes to have return'd full Cargoes on all the Ships of this Season which we now apprehend may not be in their Power. We have already wrote you this Season in Duplicate three Letters bearing date the 9th. 25th. & 30th. of May by the Bon Voyage St. Vincent Trinidada and St. Catharina and have since received your Letters of the 5th. of February and 3d. of March, the former by the London from Sooloo which arrived at Bimbelpatam the 27th. of last month.

Our Honble Masters Ships the Horsenden, Royal Captain, and Tilbury for Coast & China arrived here the 23d. and 4th. of June & 4th. Instant. The two former we now Dispatch to you with Treasure and Merchandize to the amount of two hundred & thirty three thousand five hundred & fifty seven Pagodas, thirty fans. & seven Cash (233557 30 7) according to their respective Invoices & Bills of Lading enclosed Vizt.

By the Royal Captain to the amount of Pags. ... 119798 30 45 By the Horsendon 113758 35 42

The Tilbury will follow, as soon as possible with a further consignment.

It is with much pleasure we observe that our Honble Masters have assisted you with a very considerable Supply of Treasure, and we are taking every method in our power to increase these consignments. We have allready acquainted you in our Letter of the 30th of May with the Agreement enter'd into with the Gentlemen concerned in the Voyage to Manilha in case their Agents should be able to consign you some Treasure from thence.

The frequent Troubles in this Country have so much reduced the demands for Woolens that we have resolved to send you a part of what we have on hand by these Ships if it sells for Prime Cost considering the difference in Exchange from hence, our Honble Masters will be no loosers as it will be so much added to your Stock.

We are concerned to observe such large Deficiencies in the Articles consign'd to you last year which we are inclined to think must have been occasion'd by other Causes, than the difference in weighing between this Place & Canton. Two of the Companys Servants & the Persons of the Ships always attend for that purpose and the Weights having been try'd lately we find the difference is not more than an ounce in an hundred Weight.

With respect to the Article of Tin which you inform us was fully deliver'd from the Northumberland in Tale, but deficient in weight by 960, it may very possibly be owing to its being exchanged on board the Ships for that of the Captains, which they purchase in their way to China. The deficiencies in Tale are propably [sic] caused by Theft at Whampo, and in the Boats going up to Canton, as the Bills of Lading express the Number in Tale, as well as the Weight, and the officers Receipts are Vouchers for their being received on board. The very great Difficiencies ' Lord Hollond must undoubtedly have been occasion'd by some of those Causes.

In regard to the Cotton, the Method We have taken this Season, has been to empty Sixteen of the Packages, weigh them all, and Charge the Tare upon a Medium, which instead of 26 it was charged at last year turns out 47 in each Bale & at this difference we have taken all the Cotton of this Season, We have purchased about Sixteen hundred Bales which is more than the three ships are able to take in.

We shall pay attention to what you recommend concerning the Gold we may consign to you in future, Particular care was taken in the Assay of that sent you the last Year, a part of the Samples you returned have been sent to Bengal, and shall also be sent to England at the request of the Assay Master on his own vindication, & that the Credit of our Mint may not suffer; a Copy of his Letter on this Occasion comes inclosed.

We are extremely anxious for providing means to bring away the People, upwards of three hundred left at Sooloo. Mr. Dalrymples ordering the Admiral Pocock thence has on all Accounts proved a bad measure. We have taken up a Vessell for this Service, as well as to receive such Goods as may have been provided in Payment of the Ballances due to the Company when Mr. Dalrymple left the Place, which however we fear will not easily be cleared as we find he is of Opinion it will depend on our sending more Goods thither which from the bad success of the former we have too much reason to decline.

We shall be glad to be informed of the Quantity of Silver taken out of the Admiral Pocock, and carried on the London to Canton, that we may accordingly credit the Expedition to Manilha as Mr. Dalrymple has omitted to inform us.

The Packets for Canton by the Horsendon are forwarded by those Ships respectively with several other Papers according to the Lists inclosed to which we refer.

We are informed that the Albion who received her Dispatches with the Horsendon & Royal Captain was lost in her way to the Downes. Her Passengers, Ships Company & Treasure are saved.

We have permitted Captain Baker our Master Attendant to return to England by the way of China & he takes his Passage on the Royal Captain.
