PREFATORY NOTE.

There are two sets of the proceedings of the Deputy Governor and Council of Fort St. David for the year 1703-04, one being their proceedings and transactions for the affairs of the Right Honourable United East India Company from 28th December 1703 to 31st December 1704 and the other being their proceedings and transactions for the separate affairs of the Right Honourable Governor and Company of merchants trading into the East Indies from 4th January 1704 to 31st December 1704. This volume contains the latter set of the proceedings, the former set of the proceedings having been printed already as a separate volume in the year 1937. The East India Company was incorporated in 1600 under the title of the Governor and Merchants of London trading into the East Indies. In 1698, a rival Company was formed under the sanction of Parliament, entitled the English Company trading to the East Indies. In 1702, the two companies agreed to amalgamate in 7 years' time and the union was finally effected in 1709. On the 15th July 1703 it was ordered in the Fort St. George Consultations that two sets of proceedings should be made, one for the United trade and the other for the separate trade of the old company. This accounts for the two sets of Fort St. David Consultations sent by the India Office for 1704. Two separate sets are available in this office only for the Fort St. George Consultations of 1705.

The manuscript volumes corresponding to this year are not found among the records of this office. The matter contained in this book has therefore been entirely supplied by the courtesy of the India Office (now Commonwealth Relations Office) from their Factory Records.

The Consultations and Diarys of the Worp^{ll}. Gabriel Roberts Esq^r. Deputy Governor &c^a. Council of Fort St. David. Being their Proceedings and Transactions for the Seperate Affairs of the R^t. Hon^{ble}. the Governour and Company of Merchants of London Tradeing into the East Indies.

Commencing the 4th January 1703-4

- This Evening dispatch'd a Generall Letter to the Hon^{ble}. President and Council of Fort St. George for the seperate Affairs of this days date. 4TH.
- This morning arrived a Peon from Madrass with Letters from Trincombar who was dispatch'd immediately. 12TH.
- This morning saw three large ships in the Offin standing into Pondicherry Road. D^o.
- This evening arrived here Mr. Deane and Mr. Sommers from Fort St. George by whom received the Consultations sent up to be signed by Mr. Fraser. D^o.
- This afternoon the Deputy Governor received advice that two of the ships which arrived in Pondicherry Road yesterday were the two French ships that sail'd from thence about two months ago, and that the other was ship Canterbury whom they took a prize in the Streights of Mallacca which news hee immediately sent advice of to the Hon^{ble}. President at Fort St. George. 13TH.
- This morning Mr. John Berlu was married to Mrs. Jane Deane. 14TH.
- This afternoon received a Generall Letter from the Hon^{ble}. President and Council of Fort St. George for the seperate Affairs dated the 10th instant. D^o.
- This night Mr. Deane and Mr. Sommers return'd for Fort St. George by whom sent a Generall Letter to the Hon^{ble}. President and Council for the seperate Affairs of this days date with two Coppys of our Consultations, Diary and accounts cash to the ult. December last, and also our accounts of the Expences of the Generall Table att Fort St. David from the primo September to d^o. time. 15TH.

Read a Generall Letter from the Hon^{ble}. President and Council of Fort St. George dated the 10th Instant.

Ordered that the remains of the Generall Stores of this Garrison, as also what Perpetuanoes, Lead, &c^a. is remaining in the Warehouse be put up at outcry and that such part of them as shall be thought necessary for Stores of this Garrison be bought for account of the United trade, and that the Warehousekeeper and Storekeeper doe lay before us next Consultation day a list of what is remaineing under their charge.

The Steward brought in an account of stores salted up for the use of this Garrison bought by order of Consultation amounting to seventy nine Pagodas and four fanams which the Deputy Governor reports hee paid him last month which is approved of.

— JANUARY 1703-4 —

Mr. Empson who is appointed Second of this place being at present at Madrass and Mr. Mountague being the next in station is desired to take charge of the books till the arrivall of Mr. Empson and that hee take to his assistance Mr. Richard Farmer and Robert Berman.

Ordered that a bill bee given the Joint Stock Merchants on the Hon^{ble}. the President and Council of Fort St. George for five thousand and five Pagodas twenty one fanams and five Cash payable to Andevere Chittee, being the full Ballance of their last Contract.

The Deputy Governor read his account of the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Companys Cash for the month of December past as entered after this Consultation.

Ordered that the primo Instant hee commence a new Cash book for the seperate affairs of the Governor and Company of Merchants of London trading to the East Indies.
