**Review of the Annual Report on the Administration  
of Estates under the Court of Wards in the  
Punjab for the year ending 30th Sep-  
tember 1924.**

*Proceedings of the Governor of the Punjab in Council,  
No. 2004-D., dated the 1st June 1925.*

THE same number of estates was under the superintendence of the Court of Wards as last year. The estates of Nawabzadas Niamat Ali Khan and Zulfiqar Ali Khan of Karnal were released from superintendence, and the estates of Lahaul in the Kangra District, and Dab Kalan in the Jhang District were taken under superintendence. Apart from considerable additions to the immoveable property of both the estates, the assets and incomes of both have gone up considerably during the period of the Court's superintendence. The Lahaul Estate was taken under supervision at the request of Thakar Abhai Chand as the family is of considerable importance in Lahaul, the head of it being the hereditary Wazir. In the case of Dab Kalan Estate the ward is a minor, and arrangements for his education and the appointment of a guardian are in process of completion.

2. The total ordinary income amounted to Rs. 20,63,317, a small increase of Rs. 22,783 on last year's figure. This was in addition to Rs. 3,57,000 from investment, loan and debt transactions. The ordinary expenditure amounted to 15½ lakhs, which is 1½ lakhs less than in the previous year, and there is also a decrease of 2 lakhs in capital expenditure. Loans amounting to Rs. 1,26,000 were made to other estates under the Court of Wards, and Rs. 37,142 were invested in Government securities. Some three lakhs and-a-quarter were used for re-payment of debt and over three lakhs were expended on permanent improvements in the estates. The total capital expenditure amounts to nearly 9 lakhs, which is nearly up to the large figure of 9¾ lakhs in the previous year. Although there has been a reduction of over one lakh in the Estates' Treasury balances, some estates still have very high balances in the Treasury, e.g., Sidhowal in Karnal and Behk in Ferozepore. The Governor in Council trusts that local officers will realise

the inadvisability of allowing such large sums to remain idle.

3. It is satisfactory to note that the recoverable arrears of rent have fallen by a quarter lakh, and it is expected that a further very considerable reduction will be made during the present year. Action in the Civil Courts has had to be taken in certain instances, but there is no reason to think that the Estates are at all hard on their tenants, their relations with whom have on the whole been amicable.

4. The large increase in the expenditure on improvements from Rs. 1,78,904 to Rs. 3,02,326 is largely due to expenditure in the Mamdot Estate of Rs. 2,14,759, which includes a new house for the Nawab at Ferozepore, a school and mosque at Jalalabad, the Jalalabad Water Supply scheme, and ten new wells. This Estate is expected to benefit very largely from the Sutlej Valley Project, which will traverse a portion of the Estate and will take over the existing four canals.

5. The horse-breeding operations at the Mamdot Stud, the Sheep Farm and the Agricultural Farms at both Jalalabad and Chak Hiraj continued to be worked successfully, the Stud and Chak Hiraj Farm being in the personal charge of the Nawab. It is satisfactory to see that advanced methods of cultivation are being fostered, and the use of improved implements is encouraged among the tenants.

6. The education and training of the wards is one of the most important matters which the Court of Wards has to consider, and it is therefore satisfactory to find that 12 wards and their relatives are receiving education at the Aitchison College, Lahore, while five are at Queen Mary's College and 12 in local schools. Further as far as possible the older wards are receiving training by being associated in the management of their estates.

7. The general level of the management of the Estates under the Court of Wards continued satisfactory. There is no doubt that the management of the Estates is one of the most beneficial activities of Government, the advantages of which are easily recognised by all. Complaints are few, and there are very few methods of improvement which remain unexplored. Both in the matter of education, and in the management of their Estates the Wards are not slow to recognize that they owe a considerable debt to the beneficent activities of Government, through the medium of Collectors and Managers of Estates.

8. In connection with the large balances in the Treasury, which, as already stated, should not be allowed to remain idle, it should be the aim of the Court to strike a due mean between the husbanding of resources and allowing the wards a sufficient margin of income to admit of their making the best use of their period of preparation for the battle of life. Extravagance is an evil, but there is such a thing as excessive economy. It is perhaps natural that the officers of the Court should lean towards economical methods, but the capacity to spend money well and wisely is also in some cases usefully acquired at an early age.

9. Mr. H. P. Tollinton, C.S.I., C.I.E., I.C.S., and Mr. E. R. Abbott, C.I.E., I.C.S., were in charge for the first few months of the year, and Mr. C. A. Barron, C.S.I., C.I.E., C.V.O., I.C.S., was in charge for the remaining period.

**REPORT**

UNDER THE  
**COURT OF WARDS**  
IN THE  
**PUNJAB**

*For the year ending 30th September 1924.*

---

1. *Estates under management and those released and taken over.*—The year closed with the same number of estates under the superintendence of the Court of Wards as last year, two estates having been released from and two placed under superintendence.

The estates released were those of Nawabzadas Niamat Ali Khan and Zulfqar Ali Khan of Karnal. Both the estates have profited considerably from the management of the Court of Wards during the last 14 or 15 years. The assets and income of the former increased from Rs. 2,56,643 and Rs. 10,220 to Rs. 3,41,217 and Rs. 1n,134, respectively, while those of the latter have gone up from Rs. 4,67,342 and Rs. 20,539 to Rs. 9,53,865 and Rs. 50,376, respectively. The annual savings are estimated to be Rs. 2,422 and Rs. 1,216, respectively. Considerable additions have also been made to the immoveable property of both the estates. Every care was taken of the education of the two wards. Nawabzada Niamat Ali Khan passed the Diploma Examination of the Aitchison College, Lahore, in 1920 and also attended St. Stephen's College, Delhi, and M. A.-O. College, Aligarh. Nawabzada Zulfqar Ali Khan only managed to pass the 6th class and was finally withdrawn from the College in 1923 on account of ill-health. He was thereafter associated with the management of his estate.

The estates taken under the superintendence of the Court of Wards are those of Lahaul in Kangra District

and Dab Kalan in Jhang District. The former was placed under superintendence at the request of Thakar Abhai Chand, the chief ward, under section 5 (i) of the Punjab Court of Wards Act, 1903, with a view to the liquidation of debts amounting to Rs. 23,000, which have been left by his father, the late Rai Bahadur Thakar Amar Chand. As the family is of considerable importance, the head of it being hereditary Wazir of Lahaul, the application was accepted and the estate taken under the Court of Wards in the interests of the administration of Lahaul. The persons and property of Thakar Partap Chand and Pirthi Chand and Mussanmat Rigza Anzom, who are the minor sons and daughter of the late Thakar, have also been taken under superintendence. Thakar Abhai Chand has been entrusted with the management of the estate. During the winter months the Thakar is to undergo training in the local Territorial Battalion, of which he was one of the earliest members.

The latter estate belongs to an influential zamindar family in the Jhang District and owns an area of 6,981 acres of land both in the Jhang and Multan Districts. The ward, Muhammad Nawaz Khan, is a minor. The appointment of a guardian and the advisability of educating the ward at the Aitchison College are matters which are under consideration.

2. *Income and Expenditure.*—The total ordinary income amounted to Rs. 20,63,317, compared with Rs. 20,40,534 of last year. This represents a small increase of Rs. 22,783. However, the income realized from cash rents taken separately has increased by one lakh. The total gross income has fallen by 1½ lakhs, but there has in reality been no decrease as last year the gross income was swollen by sales of house property valued at Rs. 2 lakhs.

The total ordinary expenditure was 15½ lakhs as compared with Rs. 17 lakhs in the previous year. There was also a decrease of 2 lakhs in capital expenditure.

3. *Assets and investments.*—There has been a reduction of over one lakh in the Estates' Treasury balances since last year. Sidhowal (Karnal) invested a sum of Rs. 70,000 in loans, but the balance in the treasury is still Rs. 61,190, which is high for an estate having an ordinary income of Rs. 87,212. The balance of Rs. 97,765 in the treasury on

account of Behk (Ferozepore) with an ordinary income of Rs. 87,944 is also very high. It is intended to invest Rs. 35,000 in the purchase of land, but further investments should be made as it is inadvisable that such large sums should be allowed to remain idle. The same remarks apply to the Tarkhanwala estate (Shahpur) with an ordinary income of Rs. 22,289 and a balance of Rs. 48,309. Amb (Hoshiarpur) invested Rs. 35,750, out of which Rs. 19,000 were lent to Lahaul Estate (Kangra) and Rs. 16,750 were spent on the purchase of land. Mamdot (Ferozepore) advanced a loan of Rs. 55,000 to certain private persons on the security of immoveable property at rates varying from  $6\frac{1}{2}$  to 8 per cent. per annum, and made an investment of Rs. 28,000 in the 5 per cent Government loan of 1945-55. Guru Har Sahai (Ferozepore) invested Rs. 56,880 into the Government War bonds of various terms. Shah Jiwana (Jhang) advanced a loan of Rs. 15,000 to the Wali Dad Khan Estate (Jhang) and provided Rs. 40,000 for the erection of a bungalow in the Jhang civil station. Dharek (Attock) advanced a loan of Rs. 10,000 to some private persons. Buria (Ambala) put one lakh into Government Promissory Notes, War bonds and the New Punjab Loan. Arnauli (Karnal) lent Rs. 20,000 to Jharauli (Karnal).

4. *Reduction of debts.*—Ber Khurd (Ludhiana) paid Rs. 13,850 towards the liquidation of its debts and reduced them to Rs. 30,524. The liabilities of Bhabaur (Hoshiarpur) have gone down from Rs. 38,083 to Rs. 36,512. Guler (Kangra) paid off Rs. 11,142 and reduced its debts to Rs. 14,763. Waziri Rupi (Kangra) paid Rs. 16,257. Rupees 18,335-3-9 have been paid to the creditors of the Lahaul Estate out of the loan of Rs. 19,000 raised from Amb. Rupees 15,690 were paid off by Behk towards the liquidation of its debts and the estate thus reduced its total debt to Rs. 2,095. Khan Wali Dad Khan's estate (Jhang) paid off a sum of Rs. 13,607 from the loan received from Shah Jiwana. Out of its total liabilities of Rs. 83,379, Sher Shah (Multan) paid off Rs. 43,495, and it is hoped that the remainder will be cleared off during the year 1926. Hajipur (Dera Ghazi Khan) paid off Rs. 12,638 and reduced its debts to Rs. 70,366. Attari (Amritsar) paid nothing during the year under report, the management of this estate having been made extremely difficult owing to the refractory behaviour of the ward. A new scheme of management has been sanctioned and the loan is expected to be cleared off in equated



half-yearly payments of Rs. 4,924 for 25 years. It is gratifying to note that Sardar Kesri Singh's estate (Lahore) is now quite free from debts, having paid off Rs. 27,681 during the year under report. Manakmajra (Ambala) has also totally cleared off its debts. Jalpana (Mianwali), Mitha Tiwana, (Shahpur), Raipur (Ambala), Farrukhnagar (Gurgaon) and Jharauli (Karnal) succeeded in materially reducing the amount of their indebtedness. Measures are under consideration for the liquidation of the debts of Doha (Gurgaon) by selling a part of the property.

5. *Arrears of rent and treatment of tenants.*—The total recoverable arrears of rent have fallen from Rs. 2,89,445 to Rs. 2,34,977. The following estates have considerably reduced their arrears :—

Sher Shah (Multan) from Rs. 48,934 to Rs. 4,636, Salarwan (Multan) from Rs. 22,225 to Rs. 404, Jalalpur Pirwala (Multan) from Rs. 8,033 to Rs. 1,330, Rangar Nangal (Gurdaspur) from Rs. 4,045 to Rs. 864, Sidhowal (Karnal) from Rs. 12,415 to Rs. 7,656. The arrears due to Anandpur (Hoshiarpur) have increased from Rs. 3,762 to Rs. 9,643. This is mainly due to the death of the lessee of the Lyallpur property, the non-settlement of the jagir question by the Jind Darbar and the non-payment of rents by the Lodhipur tenants, against whom action will be taken in the Civil Courts. Mamdot (Ferozepore) shows an increase from Rs. 26,000 to Rs. 36,749 for which two lessees are responsible as mentioned last year. Iftikhar-ud-Din's (Lahore) arrears rose from Rs. 16,657 to Rs. 19,452. Rupees 10,575 have, however, since been recovered and the balance is reduced to Rs. 8,877. Rani Chhaunian's (Lahore) arrears also rose from Rs. 13,558 to Rs. 18,726, but Rs. 6,500 have since been recovered and the outstanding balance is Rs. 12,226. This includes Rs. 6,000 due from the lessee of Rakh Baoli against whom a suit has been instituted in Court. Kesri Singh's (Lahore) arrears have gone up from Rs. 21,397 to Rs. 21,934. Suits for the recovery of Rs. 21,076 are pending in Court. Arnauli (Karnal) reduced its arrears from Rs. 17,645 to Rs. 15,685. A sum of Rs. 1,140 has since been recovered, leaving a balance of Rs. 14,545.

6. *Expenditure on improvements.*—The total expenditure has increased from Rs. 1,78,904 to Rs. 3,02,326. According to Statement No. IV (column II) Mamdot spent Rs. 2,14,759 and the important works carried out are :—A new house for the Nawab at Ferozapore (Rs. 1,02,716), a school at Jalalabad, including a mosque (Rs. 18,335), the Jalalabad Water Supply Scheme (Rs. 50,396) and ten new wells at a cost of Rs. 11,200. Guru Har Sahai expended Rs. 10,360 on buildings and wells. Behk spent Rs. 5,584, which includes Rs. 1,750 for the construction of a well. The erection of a guest house at Shah Jiwana with other minor works cost Rs. 10,000. As mentioned last year the construction of a bungalow in the Jhang civil station at a cost of Rs. 40,000 is in progress. Sher Shah spent Rs. 5,962, including Rs. 3,500 as part payment for the construction of two new houses for the wards. Rupees 24,949 were spent on additions to Rani Chhaunian's residential house. Rupees 3,024 have been shown against Sardar Kesri Singh's Estate, but no description of the expenditure has been given. Buria (Ambala) spent Rs. 3,487 on repairs to buildings. Sidhowal spent Rs. 1,083 on stables and shops at Amritsar and Arnali Rs. 3,040 for the same purpose at Amritsar in addition to Rs. 6,916 on the alterations of a building.

7. *Agricultural Developments.*—The survey of Mamdot lands in Muktsar and Ferozapore is being carried out by the Department in charge of the sub-rectangulation work with a view to the introduction of the Kilabandi system, which will facilitate the irrigation and the assessment of water rates. The Sutlej Valley Canal Project will also traverse the estate and prove a great boon to it : the existing four canals of the estate will be amalgamated in that scheme.

The horse-breeding operations at the Mamdot Stud are going on satisfactorily. The net cost of the Stud has been considerably reduced, but it seems probable that further reductions could be made. The Sheep Farm is being run at a profit and a new Cattle Farm at Chak Hiraj is under contemplation. The Agricultural Farms at both Jalalabad and Chak Hiraj are being managed satisfactorily. The former has been extended by an addition of eight ghumaons of land and some thirteen kinds of crops were grown on it. The Chak Hiraj Farm, which like the Stud is in charge of the Nawab, continues to produce many varieties of fodder.

for the Stud animals. The Agricultural Farm at Guru Har Sahai is now self-supporting having an income of Rs. 1,206-5-11 against an expenditure of Rs. 1,012-4-4; it also provides good seed to the tenants. Advanced methods of cultivation are fostered and the use of improved implements is encouraged among the tenants.

Mamdot spent Rs. 24,634 on Arboriculture and House gardens, but of this sum over twenty thousand rupees was incurred in the maintenance of gardens attached to the Nawab's private houses, which yield no return to the estate. Excluding this the net expenditure on Arboriculture was Rs. 4,380 as against income of Rs. 10,530, showing a satisfactory profit of Rs. 6,150. Kikar seeds were sown along the Mamdot canal and roadsides covering a distance of 87 miles. The four nurseries are doing well, and the eucalyptus plantation is flourishing. Guru Har Sahai abounds with Kikar trees. Approximately 7,000 new Kikar and Shisham trees have been planted in the estate. An agricultural experiment at Lodhipur in the Anandpur Estate is also being arranged for the special plantation of white sugarcane. Means of irrigation in the Behk Estate are being extended by the construction of new wells, and water-courses. The tube well at the Tarkhanwala Estate has proved of much value.

8. *Miscellaneous.*—As reported last year the Ward of Garhi Kotaha is making commendable efforts to sell off his surplus property to pay off ancestral debts in the United Provinces and then settle in the Punjab.

A co-operative bank has been started for the tenants of Adhi Sargal in Mitha Tiwana and has proved beneficial. The Co-operative Bank at Tarkhanwala is working with very moderate success, and further efforts should be made to increase its sphere of usefulness. Betrothal ceremonies of Muhammad Sharif Khan, elder ward of Chak Hyderabad and Syedwala (Sheikhupura), Tikka Fateh Jang Singh, elder ward of Sidhowal, marriage ceremonies of the sister of the wards of the Guru Har Sahai Estate with the younger son, of the late Rai Bahadur Lal Chand, Judge, Chief Court, Lahore, and inter-marriages between the families of Syed Akbar Shah and Ghulam Qasim Shah (Sher Shah Estate), and the marriage ceremonies of S. Narain Singh, junior ward of the Rangar Nangal Estate, were celebrated during the year.

9. *Education and Training.*—The education of the wards and their training in the management of their own estates was attended to with as much care as ever. Twelve wards and their relatives are at the Aitchison College, Lahore, five at the Queen Mary's College and twelve at local schools. S. Jogindar Singh of Manakmajra is still at Patiala, serving as A. D. C. to His Highness the Maharaja of Patiala. Guru Karam Singh, the younger ward of the Guru Har Sahai Court of Wards Estate, has also joined the Patiala State Army as a Lieutenant and the Military discipline should do him good :

The Nawab of Mamdot is considerably interested in Polo, Horse-breeding and Agricultural work. His interest in the practical side of these operations is gratifying and advantageous.

The other wards who have taken an active part in the management of their Estates are :—Khan Zabad Khan of Wali Dad Khan's Estate, S. Muhammad Nawaz Shah of Salarwan, S. Balwant Singh of Attari, S. Rajindar Singh of Jharauli, Gurus Jaswant Singh and Karam Singh of Guru Har Sahai Estate, Raja Baldeo Singh of Guler.

10. *Notice of Officers.*—Sh. Nazir Ahmad and S. Hari Singh, managers of the Mamdot and Gur Har Sahai Estates, continued to work with great energy and devotion and have submitted interesting reports. Nawabzada Ahsanullah Khan, General Manager of the estates of Nawabzadas Zulfiqar Ali Khan and Niamat Ali Khan of Karnal deserves to be congratulated on the success which has attended his care of the estates. Others who have worked satisfactorily during the year include Ch. Ali Bakhsh, Ch. Hidayat Khan, Pandat Basant Lal, Lala Beli Ram, Sardar Jiwan Singh, M. Shah Sawar, Lala Kanya Lal, M. Ghulam Rasul and Manager of the Dharek Estate.
