Letter from the Backward Class Officer, Bombay Presidency, No. E. 6/1, dated the 1st May 1932—Submitting the Annual Administration Report on the working of the Criminal Tribes Act in the Bombay Presidency, Part I, for the year ending 31st March 1932.

RESOLUTION.—The annual administration report on the working of the Criminal Tribes Act submitted by the Backward Class Officer, Bombay Presidency, with its accompaniments, is published for information.

2. The effect of the economic depression, and credit is due to the Managers of Settlements that there was no serious unemployment.

3. The high standard of health which prevailed among the inmates of Settlements and Free Colonies shows the extent to which the settlers have learnt habits of cleanliness and hygiene, and establishes the value of the medical and educational work done among the Backward Classes.

4. The most interesting feature of the year has been the growing tendency of the work of the Department to shift towards the North of the Presidency, the reformation of the criminal tribes in the Southern Division being within sight of completion.

5. The thanks of Government are due to Mr. Starte and to his many helpers, both official and non-official, who have contributed to the successful working of the Department. The Governor in Council concurs in the commendation bestowed on those specially mentioned in the final paragraph of the Report and requests the Backward Class Officer to convey the thanks of Government to them.
