Letter from the Registrar of Co-operative Societies (Mr. K. L. Panjabi, I.C.S.), No. A.N.R., dated the 1st November 1933—Submitting the report on the working of Co-operative Societies in the Bombay Presidency (including Sind) for the year ending 31st March 1933.

RESOLUTION.—The Co-operative movement in the Presidency passed through another very difficult year. On the one hand the economic depression seriously crippled the resources of members; and on the other, as a result of acute financial stringency; Government had to embark on a policy of rigid retrenchment. The result was that at a time when the movement required particularly careful attention Government were compelled to abolish certain posts, including that of Personal Assistant to the Registrar and an Assistant Registrar. The gross expenditure was reduced from Rs. 5,67,000 in 1931-32 to Rs. 5,36,000 in the year under report and the net expenditure from Rs. 4,40,000 to Rs. 3,88,000.

The number of agricultural credit societies fell from 4,600 to 4,570, the membership from 2,57,000 to 2,49,000 and the working capital from Rs. 4,20,41,000 to Rs. 4,02,41,000. The fall in numbers was the result of the liquidation of weak societies which had no chance of ever being rehabilitated. Government observe with interest that whereas in 1931-32 the number of societies cancelled was 144, in 1932-33 it was only 42. If, as the Registrar observes, this decrease is due to the strenuous efforts of agriculturists to preserve societies, the position is certainly not unsatisfactory.

The real test, however, of the strength of the movement among the agricultural population is the percentage of unauthorised arrears. In their reviews on the reports of previous years Government have frequently commented on the growth of these arrears. During the year under report Government appointed special recovery officers with a view to help societies to recover unauthorised arrears by the employment of coercive processes. The Registrar reports that the work of these officers was satisfactory, and had a very beneficial effect in checking the tendency to default. Government regret to observe, however, that in spite of

this the percentage of unauthorised arrears rose from 48 to 50 in the whole Presidency and from 56 to 59 in the Presidency proper.

It is satisfactory to notice that among the depressed and aboriginal classes the co-operative movement is beginning to have firm root. The number of societies confined to these classes rose from 93 to 101, the membership from 6,000 to 7,200, and the working capital from Rs. 3,49,000 to Rs. 4,30,000. Members of these classes are also freely admitted in village societies. The number of Bhil societies remained unchanged, although there was a slight fall in the total membership and in the working capital.

The working of agricultural non-credit societies is reported to have been (with certain exceptions) fairly satisfactory. The most important societies of this type, so far as the value of business is concerned, are the Cotton Sale Societies. The number of these during the year was 26 as against 23 in the previous year, but six of them did not function at all: one has been wound up during the year and one other is in a very unsatisfactory position. The quantity of cotton sold was 3,24,700 maunds realising Rs. 26,57,000 as against 3,35,000 maunds realising 26,44,000 in 1931-32. The principal handicap of non-credit societies is the lack of honest and efficient staff.

In contrast with agricultural societies, non-agricultural societies have on the whole been successful in this Presidency. There was no set-back during the year under report. The number of urban banks increased from 91 to 102 and most of them worked well. The Bombay Co-operative Insurance Society under the chairmanship of Professor Kaji increased its popularity particularly among salary earners' societies.

The chief feature of the year so far as co-operative banking is concerned, was the plethora of funds in the hands of most banks. As a result of diminished incomes and uncertain trade conditions, demands for loans fell off, and, naturally, banks themselves were very cautious in lending. Fresh advances granted by district central banks fell from 3,80 lakhs in 1931-32 to 2,53 lakhs in 1932-33 while the deposits rose from 2,60 lakhs to 3,07 lakhs. In the Bombay Provincial Co-operative Bank the deposits increased from 1,29 lakhs to as much as 2,02 lakhs. The problem presented by these figures is not peculiar to co-operative banking alone, and it is clear that the situation will not materially improve except in step with the rest of the economic structure.

It is not a matter of surprise that the Provincial Co-operative Bank was able to declare a dividend of only 4 per cent. during the year under report. Conditions were entirely abnormal. Government are satisfied that the Bank has been working on sound lines and are glad to note that it continues to be under the able guidance of Sir Chunilal Mehta.

Government have read with interest the concluding remarks of the Registrar. The depression which has affected the movement so unfavourably has not been an unmixed evil. It has exposed defects which might otherwise have continued for several years doing irreparable damage. The enthusiasm shown by the official and non-official workers

alike is an augury of better times. Government desire to record their thanks to Mr. Panjabi, the Registrar, for the ability and tact with which he has handled a very difficult situation.
