Sir,

I have the honour to submit the Annual Report of the Department of Land Records for the year ending 31st July 1938.

CHAPTER I.

PREFATORY.

1. The charge of the department was held by Mr. M. J. Desai, I.C.S., from 1st August 1937 to 30th April 1938 and by me from 1st May 1938 to the end of the year as Director of Land Records. The Director of Land Records is also the Inspector General of Registration and the Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages, and he is also the controlling officer for the Government Photozinc Press, Poona.

2. *Superintendents of Land Records.*—Under orders in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 2844/33, dated 16th December 1935, the districts in the three divisions were redistributed into three circles—Northern, Central and Southern—with the headquarters of the Northern and Southern Circles at Ahmedabad and Belgaum respectively. The Central Circle with its headquarters at Poona is immediately under the control of the Director of Land Records, who is also the Superintendent for the Central Circle.

The charge of the Northern Circle was held by Mr. V. Isvarani, I.C.S., throughout the year. In the Southern Circle, Mr. S. J. Moghe was in charge from 1st August 1937 to 2nd October 1937 and Mr. N. B. Kulkarni from 3rd October 1937 to the end of the year.

3. *Touring.*—The Director of Land Records toured in all the districts of the Province except Thana and East Khandesh districts for inspection of District Survey Offices, and city survey offices, for testing the measurement and classification work and for inspection

of village records and Sub-Registrar's and District Registrar's offices. The total number of days devoted to touring was 168. The Superintendent of Land Records, Northern Circle, toured for 238 days in all the nine districts. The Superintendent of Land Records, Southern Circle, toured for 172 days in all the seven districts.

The total number of field workers (including maintenance surveyors) was 141 in Northern Circle, 135 in Southern Circle and 64 in Central Circle. Of these the Superintendents of Land Records concerned tested the work of 103 men in Northern Circle, 111 in Southern Circle and 35 in Central Circle.

CHAPTER II.

LAND RECORDS DEPARTMENT.

4. The functions of the Land Records Department are to provide the statistics necessary for sound administration in all matters connected with land, to reduce, simplify and cheapen litigation in the Revenue and Civil Courts, to provide a Record of Rights for the protection of all who hold interests in land and lastly to simplify and cheapen periodical settlement operations.

5. The main function of the department is to maintain all survey and classification records upto date and for this purpose carry out field operations, preliminary to the incorporation of changes in these records.

A complete Record of Rights and interests in land has been prepared for all unalienated and many alienated villages throughout the Province and steps are being taken to prepare it in those of the remaining alienated villages.

City surveys form an important part of land records. Such surveys which were held up for some time in the past for financial reasons are again being taken up now.

6. The superior staff of the Land Records Department consists of a Director of Land Records, two Superintendents of Land Records and 19 District Inspectors of Land Records.

The subordinate staff of the department is divided into three sections :—

- (a) the district staff of Circle Inspectors under the Collectors ;
- (b) the cadastral survey staff (including the city survey staff and pot hissa survey staff) under the District Inspectors of Land Records; and
- (c) the staff in District Survey Offices, who keep all the survey records upto date.

7. The function of the officers of the Land Records Department in respect of Circle Inspectors' staff is to advise and assist the Revenue Officers who give the actual orders. All the other establishments are controlled by the Superintendents and supervised by the District Inspectors of Land Records.

8. *Training of Junior Civilians.*—In the Northern Circle, Messrs. M. N. Heble, S. G. Barve, I.C.S., F. N. Rana, R. F. Keith, I.C.S., and P. N. Damry; and in Southern Circle Messrs. K. P. Matharani, I.C.S. and S. P. Mohite were trained in survey and settlement matters.

9. *District Survey Offices—Northern Circle.*—The Central Record Office, Ahmedabad disposed of 1,813 cases involving 6,414 survey numbers as against 1,637 cases involving 6,200 survey numbers leaving in arrears 298 cases involving 809 survey numbers as against 306 cases involving 841 survey numbers of the last year. The outturn compares favourably with that of the last year.

The realisations from the supply of extracts from survey records and from the sale of maps amounted to Rs. 3,264 as against 2,893 of the last year. The cost on account of pay of the copying clerks during the year was Rs. 964 and their earnings were Rs. 2,369. The copying staff consisted of one permanent record keeper and one temporary Utara Karkun. The District Survey Offices—Thana, Nasik, East Khandesh, West Khandesh, and Bombay Suburban District—in the Northern Circle disposed of 1,367 cases involving 3,961 survey numbers as against 1,134 cases involving 3,022 survey numbers leaving in arrears at the close of the year 238 cases involving 692 survey numbers as against 523 cases involving 1,340 survey numbers of the last year. The outturn is satisfactory.

The realisations from the supply of extracts from the Survey records and the sale of maps in the District Survey Offices amounted to Rs. 5,255. The cost on account of pay of the copying clerks came to Rs. 1,900 while they earned Rs. 3,359. The copying staff consisted of three permanent and two temporary Utara Karkuns. All the five District Survey Offices and the Central Record Office at Ahmedabad were inspected by the Superintendent during the year.

10. *Central Circle.*—The District Survey Offices Poona, Nagar and Kolaba—disposed of 743 correction cases involving 2,836 survey numbers and 3,909 hissass as against 839 cases involving 1,785 survey numbers and 5,513 hissass of the last year, leaving a balance of 531 cases involving 696 survey numbers and 4,548 hissass as against 452 cases involving 635 survey numbers and 6,750 hissass of the last year.

The realisations from the supply of extracts from survey records and sale of maps came to Rs. 3,295. The cost on account of the copying clerks came to Rs. 1,554 while they earned Rs. 2,693. The copying staff consisted of two permanent and two temporary Utara Karkuns.

11. *Southern Circle.*—The District Survey Offices disposed of 6,954 correction cases involving 5,553 survey numbers and 34,811 hissass as against 7,555 cases involving 5,086 survey numbers 33,330 hissass of the previous year, leaving in arrears 887 cases involving 648 survey numbers and 13,231 hissass as against 883 cases involving 596 survey numbers and 13,052 hissass. The output is satisfactory. The Superintendent of Land Records, Southern Circle, has inspected all the District Survey Offices in his Circle.

The realisations from the supply of extracts from survey records amounted to Rs. 10,490. The cost of the copying clerks was Rs. 5,000. There are 8 permanent and 6 temporary copying clerks in Southern Circle.

District Inspectors.

12. Statement IV shows the routine work done by these officers and the number of days spent on tour for inspection work are shown in column 4 of the statement.

13. *Northern Circle*—The touring of the District Inspectors in Northern Circle considered from the quantity of test of measurement and classification work may be said to be adequate except in the case of District Inspector, Surat, but it is partly due to change of hands. The crop and other inspection work done by the District Inspectors is on the whole adequate except in Nasik district where the inspection of Record of Rights entries is also not adequate. The reasons for this shortage are being enquired into.

14. *Central Circle*.—The crop and waste land inspection work done by the District Inspectors in Central Circle is less compared with last year but it is due to the reduction in the number of touring days which were restricted only to take adequate test of the measurement and classification work of the district as crop and waste inspection is largely inspected by the revenue officers also. The test of measurement work done by the District Inspector, Poona, is not quite adequate and this is due to change in the personnel owing to illness and other causes. The District Inspectors of Poona and Ahmednagar are, however, requested to see that adequate test of all kinds of inspection work is taken by them in future.

15. *Southern Circle*.—The touring of the District Inspectors in Southern Circle judged from the quantity of test taken by them of measurement and classification work may be considered as adequate except in the case of District Inspectors of Sholapur, Ratnagiri and Kanara. These District Inspectors have been requested to see that full and adequate test is taken in future. The crop and waste inspection and the test of entries in Village Forms VI and VII done by the District Inspector, Sholapur, is inadequate. The Superintendent of Land Records has been requested to bring this to the notice of the District Inspector.

16. All the District Inspectors of Land Records have done adequate inspection of the city survey offices in their charge.

Measurement Work.

17. The following statement shows at a glance the permanent and temporary staff employed in the Northern, Central and Southern Circles, the outturn of their work and earnings and cost incurred on the establishment.

It will be seen from the above table that the temporary staff of cadastral surveyors in both the Northern and Southern Circles is self-supporting while the permanent staff in Northern and Central Circles is very nearly so. But in Southern Circle the increase in expenditure on account of the staff over receipts is mainly noticeable in Ratnagiri where a number of non-agricultural cases have to be surveyed on a specially reduced rate of fees under Government orders, in Government Memorandum, Revenue Department, No. 1472-B/33-I, dated 2nd March 1935. The outturn of work is adequate.

18. Statement II shows the outturn of measurement and classification work done in each district. In the Northern Circle, the receipts of measurement and classification cases is more and the balance less than last year's. In Central Circle although the balance is greater than last year's, the disposal compares very favourably as the receipts are nearly double those of last year. In Southern Circle, the disposal compares favourably with the last year's disposal.

CIRCLE INSPECTORS.

19. Statement I shows the work of Circle Inspectors.

The average number of days devoted to inspection work by the Circle Inspectors in Northern Circle and their output of work was on the whole adequate except in Kaira and Nasik districts where the inspection of waste survey numbers which is important from the standpoint of Government cannot be said to be adequate.

In the Central Circle, the average number of days devoted to inspection work and the output of work is on the whole adequate.

In the Southern Circle, the average number of days devoted to inspection work is adequate in all the districts except Dharwar. The output of work on the whole is adequate, except in Belgaum where the inspection of waste survey numbers is not adequate.

The defects noticed in the Circle Inspectors' work which came under inspection of the District Inspectors of Land Records Superintendents of Land Records and Director of Land Records are :—

(a) Omission to correct the village maps and other village records in accordance with the kaujasti patrahs received from time to time.

(b) Neglect in noting in pencil the hissas in village map.

(c) Neglect in preparing the new hissa statement.

(d) Notices of mutations were not posted in the chavdi and not served on the parties concerned.

(e) Neglect in preparing Village Form VII-B correctly.

(f) Index to Village Form VIII-A was not properly maintained.

The omissions noted above were noticed generally in all the districts. The defects noted in clause (a) were noticed particularly in Surat, Broach and Panchmahals, Thana, Satara and Belgaum districts. The defects noticed in clause (b) were particularly noticed in Thana and Nasik and those in clause (c) were noticed particularly in Belgaum, Satara and Bijapur, and (f) in East Khandesh, Nasik, Dharwar, and Bijapur.

All these omissions have been brought to the notice of the revenue officers by the issue of inspection notes, but unless the Collectors and Prants take up the question seriously with the Mamlatdars and see that the inspection notes are carefully complied with, mere instructions are not likely to be of much use.

SUB-DIVISIONAL OFFICERS AND MAMLATDARS' TEST.

20. Statement III shows the inspection work of these officers. But as the figures given in the statement are not in themselves a criterion of the value of inspection work, Government in paragraph 2 of Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. P-62, dated 9th May 1931, have asked the Collectors to offer remarks on the quality of the inspection work done by them. Accordingly, all the Collectors, except the Collectors of Broach and Panchmahals, Bombay Suburban District and Satara have offered their remarks and most of them consider the outturn as adequate and satisfactory.

The Collector of Dharwar, however, promises to make enquiries regarding the standard of test to be taken. The Collector of Kanara is enquiring with the Sub-divisional Officers as to the reasons for such a marked variation in the quantity of inspection work. The Collectors of Ratnagiri, Ahmednagar, Belgaum and Poona have brought to the notice of the officers concerned any inadequacy in their inspection work. But the output on the whole is adequate taking into consideration the heavy duties devolving on the Revenue Officers on account of the collection of land revenue and other important matters.

BOUNDARY DISPUTES.

21. Mr. V. Isvaran, I.C.S., was the British Delegate for the settlement of boundary between the Baroda State and the British territory and he did this duty in addition to his own duties as Superintendent of Land Records, Northern Circle. During the year under report, no fresh field work is done except that 13 sections of boundaries were jointly visited by the surveyors as it was necessary for the purposes of settlement.

During the year under report, nine meetings were held by the delegates. Details about the number of boundary dispute cases pending settlement on 1st August 1937, the number of cases decided

during the year and those pending on 1st August 1933 is as under:—

Out of the 30 cases shown as settled 5 cases have been referred to the Director of Land Records and out of these five, one case has been settled by the Director of Land Records and the Suba of the Baroda State in conference held at Baroda. There still remain some old cases to be disposed of. The cost of the establishment during the year was Rs. 4,025-13-0, and the total cost since the commencement of the work comes to Rs. 1,14,090-2-9.

MEASUREMENT OF SUB-DIVISIONS.

22. Northern Circle.—The post of the Survey Mamlatdar, Central Division, having been abolished with effect from 1st November 1937, out of the four pot hissa survey parties which were working under him in East Khandesh district, two were transferred to Ahmednagar district, one was kept in East Khandesh district and the measures in the 4th party were transferred to Kolaba and Nasik districts. Thus at the commencement of the field season there were two parties in Nasik, one in East Khandesh and one in West Khandesh all working under the control of the respective District Inspectors of Land Records. This temporary staff of 40 pot hissa surveyors under four nimtandars in the four parties has in all measured 30,076 hissas, as detailed in the statement given at the end of the paragraph during the year.

Central Circle.—Two parties of ten measurers each under a nimtandar, one party of ten measurers under a nimtandar and 5 measurers worked in the Ahmednagar, Poona and Kolaba districts respectively under the control of the District Inspector concerned. They have in all measured 30,522 hissas, as detailed in the statement given at the end of the paragraph during the year.

Southern Circle.—During the year under report, two parties of 11 measurers each under a nimtandar worked in Satara district; one party of 12 measurers under a nimtandar worked in Sholapur district; 4, 1 and 4 pot hissa measurers worked in Ratnagiri, Kanara and Belgaum districts respectively. All the above establishments worked under the control of the respective District Inspectors of Land Records and they have in all measured 31,031 hissas.

The sub-joined table shows the total number of hissas measured by the abovementioned temporary staff and by the temporary and permanent staff of cadastral surveyors and the total number of hissas which remained to be measured at the close of the fair season.

In the villages visited during the year for sub-division measurement work, 18,995, 8,413 and 5,019 hissas were found in excess of the reported number of hissas in Northern Circle, Central Circle

and Southern Circle, respectively. This is because the figures of hissas reported by the taluka officers are not correctly arrived at. The difference is noticed particularly in Nasik, Ahmednagar and Solapur districts.

The balance of recovery of original pôt hissa survey in Bombay Suburban District in Northern Circle is still Rs. 1,743-5-5. This amount is pending recovery for a number of years. The Collector has been requested to take special steps for its early recovery. The balance for recovery on 1st August 1938 on account of original pôt hissa measurement fees in Mahad Taluka of Kolaba District was Rs. 48,623-10-5. A sum of Rs. 7,369-14-1 only was recovered during the year as against Rs. 28,588 put down for recovery as per orders in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 2657, dated 17th February 1936. Due to the short recoveries during this year and the previous years, the recovery cannot be completed by the end of 1938-39 as per Government orders quoted above. The attention of the Collector is being drawn to this point.

An amount of Rs. 3,768-11-0 has been received during the year on account of original pôt hissa fees in Honavar and Siddapur talukas of Kanara District leaving still a balance of Rs. 2,550-11-11, while as per orders in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 6425/28, dated 12th January 1935, the whole amount should have been recovered by the end of 1936-37. The Collector has been requested to push on with the recoveries.

A party of ten surveyors under a Head Surveyor worked in Dharwar District after completing the barsat work of the inam villages in Belgaum District. Out of the 28 inam villages taken up by the party for survey for Record of Rights purposes field work has been completed in respect of all villages except one and the barsat work is in progress.

23. As a result of mistakes detected by hissa survey parties and cadastral surveyors' staff in the original hissa survey records assessment was reduced during the year to the extent of Rs. 119-3-0 in Northern Circle, Rs. 35-12-0 in Central Circle and Rs. 141-11-9 in Southern Circle.

24. The following is an account of the hissas surveyed by the Department since the commencement of the operations at no cost to the general tax-payer:—

The field work of about 80 field workers in the Province (excluding maintenance surveyors) was tested by the Director of Land Records and the work was found seriously incorrect in one case as against two out of 61 last year and the man concerned was suitably dealt with. This shows that there is general improvement in the quality of the work turned out by the staff.

CHAPTER III.

SURVEY AND SETTLEMENT.

Revenue Survey.

25. *Northern Circle.*—As the grant for the Field Party establishment was not sanctioned, no Field Party surveyors were entertained in any of the districts in Northern Circle.

Survey and classification work of Anik village in Bombay Suburban District has been undertaken as per orders in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 4465/33, dated 23rd July 1937. All the measurement work is finished and classification work of about 109 survey numbers remains to be done which will be taken up in the next fair season.

26. *Central Circle.*—No survey work in connection with the survey and settlement of inam villages was undertaken this year.

27. *Southern Circle.*—No survey work in connection with survey and settlement of inam villages was undertaken during the year.

The reclassification of fallow garden lands in Kanara sanctioned in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 5387/28, dated 27th May 1936, was taken up during the year and the work is in progress.

28. No revision settlements of Government villages were undertaken during the year. No settlement proposals—whether original or revision—for inam villages were submitted during the year.

CHAPTER IV.

29. *Northern Circle.*—There are in all 56 city surveys and 37 village site surveys. Out of them, the maintenance of two city surveys of Kaira and Borsad has been discontinued from 1st April 1932 and the work of maintaining the Property Registers has been entrusted to the Talathis. The maintenance of Chalisgaon city survey has been started as per orders in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 3796/23, dated 30th April 1933. The maintenance of three village site surveys—Ville Parle, Juhu and Malad—has been abandoned as per Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 6464/33, dated 12th August 1937. Thus 54 city surveys and 34 village site surveys are under regular maintenance.

Introduction of city survey in the town of Savda in East Khandesh district sanctioned under Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 5157/33, dated 17th April 1936, was completed during the year. No fresh city survey operations were undertaken during the year. Village site survey of Ghoti Budruk in Nasik district was started during the year and the house measurement work is in progress.

30. *Central Circle*.—There are in all 13 city surveys and 6 village site surveys in this Circle. The maintenance of Wambori city survey in Ahmednagar district has been discontinued from 1st April 1932, the work of maintaining the Property Register being entrusted to the talathi. The maintenance of Dhond, Baramati and Saswad city surveys has been commenced as per orders in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 3796/28, dated 30th April 1933. Thus 12 city surveys and 6 village site surveys are now under regular maintenance.

The enquiry work of the village site survey of the Inam village Perne in Haveli taluka of Poona district is still incomplete.

31. *Southern Circle*.—There are in all 27 city surveys and 6 village site surveys, out of which 24 city surveys and 6 village site surveys were under regular maintenance. The maintenance of city surveys of Ilkal in Bijapur district and Sirsi in Kanara district has been sanctioned under Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 3796/28, dated 30th April 1933. The maintenance of Malwan city survey in Ratnagiri district is sanctioned under Government memorandum No. 9329-B, Revenue Department, dated 30th April 1933 for a period of two years.

GENERAL REMARKS.

32. Statement "A" shows the earning of the city survey maintenance establishment in the Province and the budget expenditure incurred upon it during the financial year 1937-38.

On the whole, the city surveys and their maintenance staff earn more than their cost. While this is correct in large towns, in smaller towns the staff is hardly self-supporting. To remedy this, as far as possible, two or more smaller towns are put in charge of one maintenance surveyor and the work of maintaining the Property Register is entrusted to the talathis. In some places cadastral surveyor's work is entrusted to the maintenance surveyors to keep them fully employed.

33. The system of writing the Property Registers on cards has been introduced in the towns of Broach, Godhra, Viramgaon, Thana, Dahanu, Igatpuri, Nasik (partly), Malgaon, Dhulia, Nandurbar (partly), Jalgaon and Chalisgaon in Northern Circle and in Poona, Lonavla, Alibag and Ahmednagar in Central Circle and in Pachgani, Mahabaleshwar, Sholapur, Belgaum, Bagalkot, Hubli, Gadag, Ranabennur, Byadgi and Haveri in Southern Circle and the system is working satisfactorily.

34. During the enquiry, a large number of encroachments are detected on Government and municipal lands. Fresh encroachments are also being detected during the maintenance of these city surveys. The progress in the removal of encroachments on Government land is satisfactory but the progress made in removing encroachments on municipal land is as usual unsatisfactory, the encroachments removed being 2,330 on Government lands and 11,161 on municipal lands leaving a balance of 4,823 and 54,641 on Government and municipal lands respectively. Statement "B" shows the position regarding encroachments. The balance of encroachments on municipal land is due to the indifference of the municipal bodies and the Collectors are being requested to take action according to orders in Government Resolution, General Department, No. 1893, dated 4th June 1925, and Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 2558/28, dated 14th August 1933, where necessary. The number of encroachments on municipal land removed during the year, however, compares favourably with the last year's figures and it is hoped that there will be better progress next year. The Ahmedabad municipality has secured on loan the services of two maintenance surveyors and the Belgaum municipality of one surveyor for the removal of encroachments on the public street land in the municipal area. This augurs well for the future:

35. The cost of the establishment required for relaying the theodolite frame work of Ahmednagar city survey has been sanctioned under Government memorandum No. 7990-B/24, dated 30th April 1938, and the work is in progress.

One extra maintenance surveyor has been sanctioned under Government memorandum, Revenue Department, No. 6029-B/33, dated 12th May 1933 for the Poona City Survey Office and one maintenance surveyor has been appointed accordingly.

One additional post of maintenance surveyor for the city survey office, Surat, has been sanctioned under Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 7140/33, dated 26th April 1938 and one maintenance surveyor has been appointed accordingly.

Maintenance of village site surveys.

The maintenance of the village site surveys is as remarked last year, not being done properly. Instructions issued by the inspecting officers are not complied with. Encroachments are allowed to continue unnoticed. Review work is rarely done by the Circle Inspectors or talathis. The defects have been brought to the notice of the Collectors concerned.

In most of the city surveys, the city survey limits comprise portions of areas of more than one village and this involves duplication of work as regards land revenue collection and maintenance of accounts. The proposal, therefore, of constituting the city surveyed area into a separate village wherever possible so as to make city survey officers responsible for all land revenue work as suggested in Government memorandum No. 9339-B/33, dated 25th August 1938, is under consideration.

Government have sanctioned a grant of Rs. 5,000 for survey of important village sites for the year 1938-39. Accordingly, arrangements to start the survey work early in the ensuing fair season have been made in the following villages :—

Utara Karkuns for city survey offices.—The proposal of creating five posts of permanent and seven posts of temporary Utara Karkuns has been sanctioned under Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 7034/28, dated 26th April 1938, and appointments of Utara Karkuns have accordingly been made in Ahmednagar, Poona, Hubli, Sholapur, Ahmedabad, Surat, Broach, Nasik and Dhulia city survey offices.

The city survey maintenance staff is, as remarked last year, not very satisfactory. English knowing men are required in most of the big cities. In order to have a nucleus of survey trained English-knowing men from whom the maintenance staff could be recruited, proposals to revive 15 posts of Field Party Surveyors were made and Government have sanctioned these proposals under Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 5526/33, dated 26th April 1938. Six posts for Northern Circle, six posts for Southern Circle and three posts for Central Circle have accordingly been allotted and arrangements have been made to train these men in all branches of survey.

Out of the 16 city survey offices inspected by the Director of Land Records during the year, the work of only one maintenance surveyor was found unsatisfactory and he was accordingly reduced as a cadastral surveyor. There is a general improvement in work and it is hoped that the improvement will continue.

Photozinco Press.

35. The inspection of the Photozinco Press from the administrative point of view was not done so far. So the Director of Land Records in October 1937 inspected the Press in order to see whether the work in the Press in this respect was being conducted properly. As a result, several improvements were made in the working of the Press. Also two, posts of Assistant Photographers and four posts of Assistant Printers were kept vacant with a view to retrenching them altogether.

The work turned out in the printing branch during the year was 1,205,503 machine-pulls costing about Rs. 34,214 and 70,985 hand-pulls costing about Rs. 20,715. The other branches turned out work costing about Rs. 83,312. The total cost of work done in the Press was Rs. 1.38 lakhs. The total amount realised from private work done in the Press was Rs. 47,884.

CHAPTER V.

RECORD OF RIGHTS.

37. The writing of the combined form VII-XII has already been completed in all the districts of the Province.

38. The Record of Rights (new combined form VII-XII) was for the first time introduced in one inam village of Dharwar district 6 inam villages of Belgaum district and in 20 inam villages of Satara district.

39. Efforts have been made to suppress corruption in the department as directed by Government under Government Circular memorandum No. 8490/33, Revenue Department, dated 7th June 1938 by communicating the orders issued by Government from time to time in this respect. There occurred two cases of corruption in the subordinate services of the department and in both suitable action was immediately taken and the facts have been reported to Government in accordance with Government Resolution No. 1581/34, dated 9th October 1937, Political and Reforms Department.

SUPERINTENDENCE.

40. Mr. V. Isvaran, I.C.S., Superintendent of Land Records, Northern Circle, toured vigorously in his charge and has done a good year's work. Mr. S. J. Moghe, Superintendent of Land Record, Southern Circle, worked diligently till his retirement and Mr. N. S. Kulkarni who took over charge from him has been doing useful work.

The office staff worked hard and satisfactorily under the able guidance of my Office Superintendent, Mr. V. N. Konnur, who has rendered me very valuable assistance since I have been in charge of this department.
