PREFACE

I HAVE endeavoured in this work to give a bird's-eye view of life in the Union of South Africa, beginning with an account of its history and political development, a knowledge of which is necessary to understand the relationships between the different races which inhabit the Dominion. As far as I am aware, no work deals with the history of the Union after its inauguration in 1910, and I have accordingly devoted more attention to events since that date. Of these I have treated in what, I hope, is a strictly historical spirit, without regard to political prepossessions or prejudices.

The second part deals with life in the Union and its problems at the present day, my object being to convey some idea of existing conditions to the reader who desires information in a small compass. Although this work is in no sense a guide-book, the last chapter contains some indications with regard to places to visit and the means of getting there, so that the work may, in some measure, serve for reference by those who are unacquainted with the country.
