## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Road, partly metalled and bridged, but impassable in winter owing to snow especially near Ziārat. The highest pass (8,600) on any cart-road in Balūchistān crossed at Ziārat Tsuri (c. 4 m. from Ziārat). Between Kowās and Smālan it was traversed on their way to Persia in 1614 by Richard Steel and John Crowther, English merchants, who mention Dureus or gates of mountains (apparently Dhre Tangī), Coasta or Kowās and Abdūn or Hamadūn. Ruins of three villages known collectively as Sēh Kōṭa and separately as Kāravān, Rāni and Dōm Killas are seen in Wani valley, 4 miles from Chautēr. Gandak and Sarāntangi lie in Quetta tahsil; Kach, Kabān and Ziārat in Shāhrig (Sibi district); Chautēr and Smālan in Sanjāwī (Lōralai district). Khansamas are stationed at Kach, Kabān and Ziārat from May to September. Water good and abundant at all places, but at Kach, laxative and Gandak, scanty. Ātā, grain, fuel and native provisions are procurable from shops at Kabān, Ziārat and Chautēr (May to September), Smālan (½ dozen permanent shops) and Kach (1 permanent shop), fodder, eggs, fowls and milk obtainable at Ziārat (May to September); for other places previous notice to tahsildārs concerned through P. A. necessary. During season conveyances run between Kach railway station and Ziārat; baggage camels can be reserved on application to thānēdār, Ziārat.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Track, very trying both for loading camels and horses, running chiefly in river-bed full of boulders subject to heavy floods used by few but Powindāhs who like it as there is abundance of excellent water, fuel, grass and camel grazing. No difficulties as far as As Tangi, then entering Rakhshāni gorge (about 1¼ m.) with perpendicular rocky side some 200 feet high on left and passing along a torrent bed, it traverses 5 or 6 stiffish spurs, which are unsuitable for ordinary traffic, one of them being very difficult for laden camels. 1¼ m. from Chachōb it enters a formidable gorge about ¼ mile long and 20 or 30 feet wide with perpendicular hard rocky sides, which after rain may necessitate climbing the very difficult neighbouring hills; further on it passes an enormous boulder (Sarv Kāurai), alleged boundary between Sātakzais and Bārūzais. Between Jagi and Sāngān following Kamāni river it emerges in Sāngān plain, then crosses hills bordering the valley and the Bādra valley. Spin Kārēz and Nigānd lie in Quetta tahsil; As Tangi and Chachōb in Sātakzai country in Kalāt; places beyond Pir Ismāil, in Sibi tahsil. Limited supplies procurable at Sāngān and Bābar Kach, only places permanently inhabited, with fuel available everywhere; for other places previous notice required.



## XXV.—TRAVELLERS' BUNGALOWS

There are three kinds of travellers' bungalows in the district—  
 (i) dak bungalows, (ii) rest-houses and (iii) Political, Civil and  
 Military Works inspection bungalows.

Officials drawing Rs. 100 per mensem and over, N. C. O.'s  
 and private gentlemen, are entitled to  
 accommodation in a dak bungalow on  
 payment of one rupee a head for every  
 24 hours, with half and one-fourth fees for short stays not exceeding  
 six and two hours respectively ; in a rest-house the charge is eight  
 annas with half fees for less than five hours. Officials in superior  
 service drawing less than Rs. 100 per mensem and European soldiers  
 are entitled to shelter in a special room set apart in the compound on  
 payment of one anna a head for every 24 hours, with reduced fees  
 for lesser periods as above. Servants are housed in out-houses ;  
 sepoy, police, etc., in the adjoining shelters or *bardāshikhānās*,  
 free of charge. One anna and six pies a day are charged for  
 every horse tethered in the compound of a dak bungalow and rest-  
 house, respectively. Eight annas a day is charged for each tent  
 pitched in the compound by a person not using the dak bungalow ;  
 four annas is charged for each wheeled vehicle, palanquin or tent,  
 and one anna for each horse, package, box, etc., remaining more  
 than 24 hours in the compound before or after the arrival of the  
 owner. In dak bungalows the khansama supplies food at the  
 prescribed rates (soldiers at half rates) and also cooks provisions  
 furnished by travellers on payment of eight annas a day per head.  
 In rest-houses travellers must make their own arrangements for  
 supplies and cooking, but where possible the man in charge pro-  
 vides wood, etc., on payment. None but Government officers,  
 travelling on duty, can stay in a dak bungalow for more than 48  
 hours if other officers require accommodation, unless specially  
 permitted by the officer in charge.

These bungalows are specially reserved for departmental  
 officers on tour. The gazetted officers  
 of the department owning the bunga-  
 low have prior claims to accommoda-  
 tion

tion in order of seniority ; subject to this rule, the officer in charge of a bungalow may lend it, without payment, to any gazetted officer of any other department travelling on duty, and may also permit others to occupy it, when available, for a period not exceeding seven days. Hanna and Shelābāgh bungalows may be lent for 14 days on payment of one rupee per diem per head.
