APPENDIX B.

Broach, 2nd September 1922.

To—The Executive Engineer in charge Boring Works.

Subject:—Water supply of Bahra Tract of Broach District.

Sir,

In accordance with instructions received from the Commissioner, N. D., I have the honour to address you with regard to the perennial difficulty of sweet water supply from which the Bahra tract of this district suffers.

2. The Bahra tract may be taken to be the part of Wagra and Jambusar Talukas (with a bit of Amod) which lies West of a line beginning from where the Bhukhi River joins Narbudda and running due North to Hetampur in Amod Taluka and Dolia in Jambusar Taluka then curving round through Panchkada to meet the sea-coast at Chhidra. In this tract a fair number of villages have a satisfactory water supply from wells even in years of drought, e.g., Aladar and Atali in Wagra, and Tankari and Chhidra in Jambusar, but some have only sweet water as long as their tanks hold out, and then have to use brackish well-water even in normal years and many are without sweet water at all in years of drought and have to be supplied with drinking water by an organised cart service.

It should be noted that the conditions in some villages seem judging from the confusion in the records on the subject to change somewhat from year to year, sometimes the well-water is potable, sometimes it is not. However it emerges from a scrutiny of two years' reports (one, 1921, a year of drought) that the following villages are in difficulties every hot weather, and either have to drink brackish water or bring sweet water from other villages:—

The population affected every year by these conditions is then as follows :—

Wagra Taluka 6,204, Amod Taluka negligible, Jambusar Taluka, 1,156.

As regards Jambusar Taluka, there are 4 more villages with a total population of 2,260 (*viz.*, Devla 1,405, Kansagar 130, Madafar 475, and Islampur 250) about which reports are so contradictory from time to time that I must presume that their case is not very bad.

It appears therefore that Wagra Taluka is the worst off, and it must be remembered that in addition to these villages there are several others which suffer and have to be assisted in years of drought.

The problem is therefore seen to be a big one, because the population affected is a large one and scattered. It is also a difficult one because the conditions are curious. The wells are nowhere specially deep and yet scattered about in this area of brackish water there are some excellent wells which never fail to supply sweet water, *e. g.*, a famous big well between Kapuria and Islampur of Jambusar Taluka and good wells at Nada, Tankari, etc., of Jambusar and Atali and Aladar and Akhod of Wagra Taluka. It is possible that borings of 300 feet or more might produce good water all the year round, but curiously enough it seems to have been tried only at one place, *viz.*, at Akhod in Wagra where it has produced a good water supply. This boring must have been done a long time ago by private agency, as no record or certain information about it can be found.

Experience seems to be that in this tract a new well often goes on giving sweet water for some years and then becomes permanently salt.

Proximity to the sea seems to have little to do with the matter, since the wells at Aladar and Nada are good and outside this Bahra area Hansot is famous for its good water, and I learn from some old records of mine that there are or were good wells on the Surat coast, *e. g.*, right at the mouth of the Tapti.

The population of Wagra Taluka shows a slight decrease by the census of 1921, and it is possible that the water supply difficulty may be connected with this (the population figures given above are for 1911, as 1921 was a year of drought and not representative of normal conditions). In any case it is indisputable that this water supply problem requires tackling and that the area is one of the most desirable to try the effect of a deep boring.

The only objections that occur to me against the utility of deep boring in this locality are that, even if it is successful in one village, it will only benefit a comparatively small population and the cost of deep boring in *many* villages would be great.

I am inclined to think that if a deep boring did not produce artesian, *i. e.*, surface water, but brought it to within say 50 feet of the surface the villagers would be quite ready to do the necessary pumping.

On the whole then I would recommend the selection of this area for an experimental deep boring and I think it might be tried at Chanchwl in

Wagra Taluka as having the largest population and being adjacent to several villages which are similarly affected.

In 1921, the cost to Government of supplying water by carts was Rs. 2,417 in Wagra and Rs. 4,156 in Jambusar. Considerable expenditure on other items of 'water-supply' was also incurred by Government and other bodies.
