(a) It is proposed to grant compensatory allowances to the ministerial and menial staff of the office of the Accountant General, United Provinces, which was transferred to Lucknow in connection with the scheme for the separation of accounts from audit. The allowances will be granted only during the period the offices at Lucknow remain on an experimental footing and six months thereafter. The annual expenditure is estimated at Rs. 19,500, out of which Rs. 9,500 during the current year can be met from savings anticipated in the voted portion of this grant.
