INTRODUCTION

The Economic Tables for the 1951 Census are published in two parts. This part (Part II-C) contains the Economic Tables for the rural and urban population while Part II-B contains the Economic Tables for the general population. The following tables are published in this part :

Table B-I—Livelihood Classes and Sub-Classes.

Table B-III—Employers, Employees and Independent Workers in Industries and Services by Divisions and Sub-Divisions.

2. The Economic Tables prepared for the 1951 Census are based on the "Indian Census Economic Classification Scheme" for the 1951 Census. The "Indian Census Economic Classification Scheme" as given in the General Introduction of Part II-B applies to this part (Part II-C) also so far as the rural and urban break-up of the population is concerned.

3. This part does not contain Table B-II—Secondary Means of Livelihood, because Table B-II was not prepared for the rural and urban population separately as in the cases of Tables B-I and B-III.
