Sir,

I have the honour to submit the following report on the Administration of the Wai Municipality for the year 1909—1910.

I. *Changes in boundaries.*— Nil

II. *Comments on Tabular Statement Form No. I and annexed Statements.*—

There were 8 ordinary and 4 Special General meetings including adjourns during the year under report. The Managing Committee met 30 times, the Schools Committee 16 times, the Dispensary Committee 3 times and the Sanitary Committee 23 times. The attendance of the members of the several Committees was good. All the Councillors except 5 attended two-thirds of the meetings. The average attendance of the members of the General Body and that of the members of the Managing Committee were 9.8 and 4.6 respectively.

There are 5 fixed octroi nakas surrounding the Municipal limits besides two other temporary ones. Three Inspectors were appointed to inspect the nakas and detect smuggling. The Municipal Secretary and some of the councillors supervised the working of the working of the octroi and toll system.

X. *General Remarks*.—

1. The Sanitary condition of the town is more satisfactory than before. Although the number of public latrines is not sufficient the Municipality have not been able to make any provision for them on account of want of funds. Still during the year under report they have perfectly repaired one set of public latrines situated in Sangar ali. They have also framed rules for the levy of Conservancy Cess, which have been approved by the Municipality and are being sent to Government for sanction. As soon as they are sanctioned and brought into force the Municipality will be able to better the Conservancy arrangements.
2. The changes already made in the Office establishment in the preceding year by which only two karkoons are working in the office and thus the inconvenience caused thereby continues as before.
3. The arrangements made by the Municipality to utilize the income from the Toll and Wheel taxes solely on road repairs under a resolution of the General Committee are continued as before though a portion of it is allowed towards the liquidation of the Plague loan. More attention will be paid to when the balance of the plague loan will be remitted for which an application has already been submitted to the Government.
4. As there was plague in the town the Municipal election due in the month of February last was postponed by the Commissioner C. D. to 31st of August 1910 at the request of the Municipality.
5. From the accompanying statement it will be seen that there are some arrears of taxes. Endeavours are being made by the Municipality for the collection of these arrears by means of issuing warrants of distress and in a very short while every thing will be clear.
6. Before conclusion it may be said that the working of the Municipality under the Presidentship of Messers Pope and Brayne has been perfectly peaceful and harmonious.

The total income during the year under report was Rs. 12868-2-10 against Rs. 13462-12-5 in the preceding year. Detailed explanation regarding increase and decrease under several heads of income is given below :—

- A. 1. *Octroi*—Decrease of Rs. 730-13-9 under this head is due to less import of goods within the Municipal limits on account of plague.
2. *Tax on houses and lands*—Decrease of Rs. 208-8-0 under this head is due to less recoveries of house tax on account of plague.
3. *Tax on animals and vehicles* — Decrease of Rs. 108-12-0 under this head is due to less recoveries on account of prevalence of plague.
8. *Conservancy* — Increase of Rs. 30-1-0 under this head is due to more recoveries of Bhangi Cess during the year.
- B. 1. *Pounds* — Decrease of Rs. 28-7-0 under this head is due to less amount of fees received on account of less number of cattle sent to the pound,
- C. 2. *Sale proceeds of lands &c.* — Decrease of Rs. 73-10-0 under this head is due to less recoveries on account of less auction sale proceeds of grass.
4. *Fees and Revenue from Educational Institutions* — Decrease of Rs. 120-8-8 under this head is due to the closing of schools for about five months on account of plague.
5. *Fees and Revenue from Medical Institutions* — Increase of Rs. 107-13-6 under this head is due to the receipt of amount refunded by Government out of the pay of the Hospital Assistant paid in excess.
6. *Fees and Revenue from Markets and Slaughter Houses* — Increase of Rs. 10 under this head is due to the payment of arrears of the market rent.
8. *Other Fees* — Decrease of Rs. 10-15-7 under this head is due to less recoveries of notice and warrant fees.
- D. *Grants from Government* —
- (b) *For Educational purposes* — Increase of Rs. 60 under this head is due to an additional grant given by Government for making increments in the pay of the trained School masters.
- (c) *For Medical purposes* — Increase of Rs. 550 under this head is due to the fact that in the preceding year the grant of Rs. 550 was not taken into the Municipal accounts as it ought to be, though it is not actually received by the Municipality.
3. *Others — Local Cess for Educational purposes* — Increase of Rs. 95-0-6 under this head is due to the non-receipt of Local Cess amount during the preceding year.
- E. *Other items* — Decrease of Rs. 63-2-9 under this head is due to the fact that during the year under report no deal-stock articles were sold by auction.
- F. *Advances and Deposits* — These being the fluctuating items need no comments.

The total Expenditure during the year under report amounted to Rs. 14392-8-1 against Rs. 12246-14-5 in the preceding year. Reasons for increase and decrease under several heads of expenditure are given below :—

- A. 2. *Collection of taxes & c.* — Decrease of Rs. 162-0-9 under this head is due to non-payment of bills on account of short balance at the disposal of the Municipality.
3. *Collection of tolls on roads and ferries* — Increase of Rs. 104-11-8 under this head is due to the fact that during the year under report the toll establishment was paid and maintained for the whole of the year, while in the preceding year it was maintained and paid for a portion of the year.
5. *Refunds* — Decrease of Rs. 18-9-2 under this head is due to less amount refunded under several heads.
- B. 2. *Lighting* — Increase of Rs. 32-13-6 under this head is due to more quantity of kerosine purchased for increasing the quantity of kerosine in each lamp.
- C. *Public Health and Convenience* —
1. *Water Supply. b. Establishment, & repairs & c.* — The increase of Rs. 30-5-3 under this head is due to the fact that during the year under report the current of the river Krishna being very small a number of coolies were engaged for regulating it and making many other arrangements in the bed of the river
- 3a. *Plague* — Increase of Rs. 197-11-0 under this head is due partly to erect huts for plague patient and partly to the allowance paid to the Hospital Assistant during the time of Plague for visiting plague case.
4. *Conservancy* — Increase of Rs. 594-2-7 under this head is due partly to the promotion given to the Municipal road sweepers and Bhangis and partly to the repairs made to the public latrine situated in Sangar ali.
5. *Hospitals and Dispensaries* — Increase of Rs. 788-2-1 is due to the fact that during the year under report the Govt. grant of Rs. 550, which is utilized direct by Government towards disbursing the pay of the Hospital Assistant was taken into Municipal accounts during the year under report while in the preceding year it was not.
8. *Pounds* — Decrease of Rs. 11-3-3 under this head is due to the fact that during the year under report the amount due to the Police Patel was not refunded.
12. *Public Works* —
2. *Building repairs* — Decrease of Rs. 11-9-5 under this head is due to less repairs made to Municipal buildings.
3. *Roads* — Increase of Rs. 406-15-4 under this head is due to more repairs made to the municipal roads during the year.
- D. *Public instruction* —
1. *Schools and Colleges* — Increase of Rs. 47-15-10 under this head is due partly to the distribution of prizes to the



school boys and partly to the promotions made to the school masters.

This Municipality maintained four boys and two girls schools imparting instruction to 397 boys and 123 girls respectively. These schools were inspected by the Deputy Educational Inspector in November last. Besides the Municipal schools there are two private schools of which one is an English teaching institution. The total number of pupils receiving instruction is 796 of whom 126 are girls.

3. *Libraries and Musiums* — Increase of Rs. 25 under this head is due to an additional grant given to the Native General Library here.
- F. 4. *Other items* — Increase of Rs. 12-12-4 under this head is due partly to the rent of a bullock hired for night soil cart and partly to the refund of Bhatta to the Municipal servants.

X. *General remarks* :—

1. A severe outbreak of plague at Wai during the year under report has affected the general administration to a considerable extent. The whole town was evacuated and the people betook themselves to the fields or to outlying villages for several months. For this reason the Municipal election was postponed on petition till the 31st August 1910. The finances of the Municipality have also been affected resulting in a large decrease under the heads "Octroi", Tax on houses and lands; Tax on animals and vehicles; fees and revenue from Educational Institutions, amounting in all to Rs. 1168-10-3. There is also an increase of nearly Rs. 200 under the head of Plague.

2. The amount of arrears of taxes has not been stated. The information has been called for and will be submitted on receipt. There has been noticeable neglect in former years to take proper measures to secure punctual payment of taxes. The Municipality has at least the excuse of plague this year.

3. The Sanitary condition of the town leaves much to be desired and the foul state of the Krishna river below Wai during the hot weather shows that sufficient care is not exercised in keeping the river unpolluted. Something more must be done in this respect. During the year under report the Municipality employed coolies to regulate the stream and clear the bed. The number of public latrines remains insufficient though the public latrines situated in Sangar ali have been thoroughly repaired at a considerable expense. The Municipality has framed rules for the levy of the conservancy cess, which are being submitted to Government for sanction. When they are sanctioned and put into force the Municipality expect to better the conservancy arrangements.

4. In the preceding year the office establishment was reduced to two karkoons and this arrangement still continues and is reported to be productive of much inconvenience. At any rate the Municipality shows considerable delay in the submission of returns and reports.

5. The Municipality has repeatedly been requested to utilize all the income from the toll and wheel taxes on road repairs according to Government Memorandum No. 4420 of July 1907. The income under these two heads has amounted this year to Rs. 1461-7-0 and the expenditure on roads to Rs. 1509-9-3.

6. The Dispensary arrangements are satisfactory under the present Hospital Assistant, a very able man. A building on the standard plan is urgently required the present one being unsuited for so large a town as Wai is.

7. During this year the Municipality gave an increase grant of Rs. 50 to the Native General Library. In view of the fact that the Library is so laxly supervised as to admit of insults being offered to the portrait of the late Queen-Empress Victoria, culminating in its final removal, the Municipality has been asked to consider the propriety of discontinuing the grant.

8. A petition has been submitted to Government to cancel the balance of the plague loans now due and the Municipality has also requested Government to accord them the privilege of electing their own President and the matter is to be considered after the election of the new council.

9. Finally the working of the councillors has been quite harmonious and there is less apathy to public interests than is often met with in public bodies of this nature.
