



The Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics

About Us

Over the last 70 years, Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics, Pune has been of the premier research and teaching Institutions in Economics in India. From its inception, the Institute was recognised as a Teaching and Research Institution for the Degrees of M.A. and Ph.D. in Economics by the University of Bombay. In 1962, the University Grants Commission (UGC), selected the Institute as a centre of advanced study in Agricultural Economics redesigned by the UGC, two years later, as a centre of advance study in Economics to widen the scope of its assistance to the Institute for all branches of economics.

The Union Ministry of Food and Agriculture Established the Agro-Economic Research Centre at the Institute in 1954 and the Union Ministry of Health the Population Research Centre in 1964. Similarly, the Planning Commission started a Centre for Research in Planning and Development at the Institute in 1971.

The Reserve Bank of India, the Ford Foundation, and the Planning Commission instituted chairs at the Institute in 1976, 1989 and 1995 respectively for studies and research in Finance, International Economics and Planning & Development respectively.

Keeping in view the eminence of the faculty, the contribution made by the Institute in teaching, training and research in economics, availability of physical infrastructure and the potential of the Institute for the further development, the Government of India declared the Institute, on the advice of the UGC, as "Deemed to be a University" from 9th May, 1993, the birthday of late Shri Gopal Krishna Gokhale, after whom the Institute was named.

Master's Programme In Economics

Admission Requirements

Students desirous of seeking admission for the Masters Programme in Economics should have obtained at least higher second class or a B+ grade in their graduation examination. Admission to the programme is based on the performance of the students in the entrance examination.

The Institute conducts a two-year programme in Economics. Students are required to take 10 mandatory and 6 elective courses spread over four semesters. The programme equips the students with a strong foundation in the subject and ability to work under pressure.

Student Evaluation

The performance of the students is evaluated on the basis of end - semester written examinations and performance in tutorials, such an evaluation ensures deeper understanding and encourages analytical thinking among students. Students are encouraged to give talk shops and give papers and assignments on topic of contemporary relevance.

Tutorials

The tutorial system is an essential part of the M.A. programme. It essentially involves written tests throughout the semester, which ensures that students are constantly in touch with all the courses. Since marks obtained in the tutorials are aggregated with the semester end examinations, it reduces pressure on students during the semester end examinations and hence encourages knowledge-based education rather than examination based ones.

Semester end Examination

Semester end Examinations, allow for rigorous evaluation of the students and keeps up the continuity of the tutorial system. They test the student's ability in terms of grasping power and knowledge absorption as well as analytical thinking and application of knowledge to real world economics.

Academic Infrastructure

DHANANJAYARAO GADGIL LIBRARY

The Institute shares the Library of The Servants of India Society and has mainly been responsible for



its building during the last 7 decades. The library is considered as one of the foremost-specialized Libraries in the country in the fields of Economics and Other Related Social Sciences.

The Library houses about 2.7 lakh volumes alongwith a large number of periodicals both from India and from Abroad. It currently receives 472 journals and possesses bound back volumes of more than 2000 periodical titles, received by subscription, exchange, gift and on depository basis. The Library is equipped with a microfilm camera, microfilm and microfiche readers and a documentation section. In order to notify addition of books and periodicals to the Library alongwith the contents of the journals currently received by the Library, Two Fortnightly Lists, namely, Fortnightly List of Additions and Fortnightly List of Articles on India are brought out regularly and circulated in mimeograph form. The Library has recently initiated a Major Programme of computerisation with the help of a grant from the UGC as part of the development assistance under the IX Plan and a grant under the INFLIBNET Programme of the UGC.



COMPUTER CENTRE

The On-Campus Computer Centre contributes significantly in honing the analytical and



quantitative skills of the students. The centre has 25 computers, all equipped with specialized econometric packages.

The Institute offers Consultancy and Guidance services in *Data Processing* in collaboration with **The Indian Council of Social Science Research**. It also offers a certificate course in *Computer Applications for Economic Analysis*. The course includes training in MS Office and Econometric Packages like *SPSS, SHAZAM, RATS and LIMDEP*. Furthermore, the students have access to various Databases like *National Accounts Statistics, Census, NSS websites, PROWESS* (a Database of Companies on the B.S.E.), *CAPEX* (Information on Infrastructure Projects), *Trade* (Export and Import Data) and *Econlit* (a Bi-Annual Compilation of publications in Economics by Researchers throughout the World).

All students are provided with Internet access and e-mail facilities.






