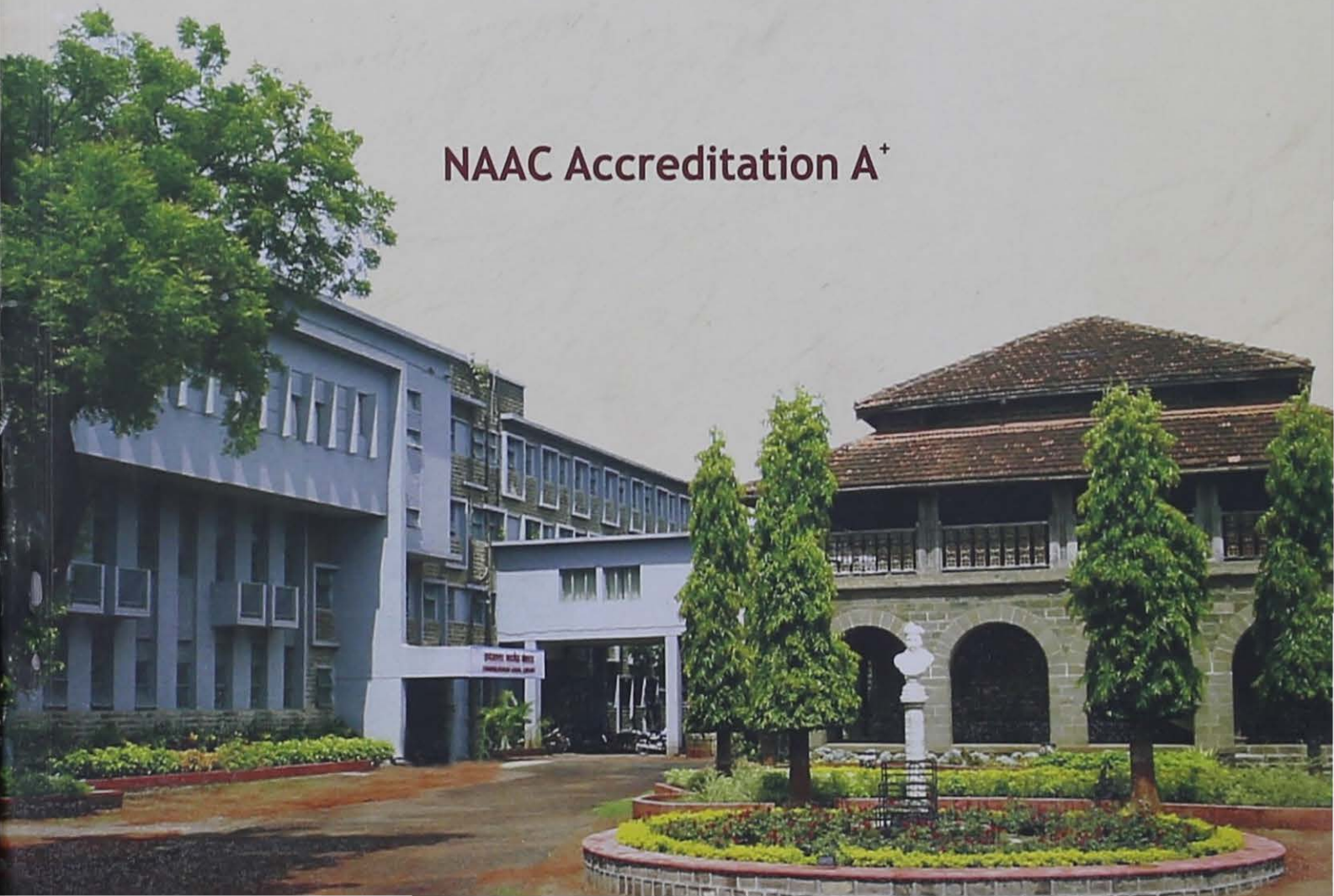

PART B

1. Activities reflecting goals and objectives of the Institution

The Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics is one of the oldest research and training institutes in economics in the country. It was founded on the 6th of June 1930 with an endowment offered to the Servants of India Society by the late Rao Bahadur R.R. Kale, Member of Legislative Council from Satara. The Servants of India Society, founded by the late Shri Gopal Krishna Gokhale, are the Trustees of the Institute. The Institute is registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860, and the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950.

The object of the Institute is to conduct research into the economic and political problems of India and to train research workers in these subjects. Under the pioneering leadership of the late Professor D.R. Gadgil, the first Director of the Institute, the latter set standards for high quality research, teaching and training in a number of branches of economics.

Keeping in view the eminence of the faculty, the contribution the Institute has made in teaching, training and research in economics, the availability of physical infrastructure, and the potential of the Institute, the Government of India, on the advice of the University Grants Commission, declared the Institute as deemed to be a university from May 9, 1993, the birthday of the late Shri Gopal Krishna Gokhale after whom the Institute is named. The Institute started functioning as deemed to be a University with effect from that day. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council processed its exercise in the Institute and on with effect from January 08, 2004 accredited it with A+ grade (score 90-95%) for a period of five years.

Research

The main thrust areas of the Institute, developed over the years through financial assistance from various sources, are agricultural economics and rural development, population studies, input-output studies for planning and development, microeconomics, macroeconomics, monetary economics and finance, public economics, international economics and the study of economics of East European countries.

Various ministries and public funding agencies including the Government of Maharashtra and private foundations like the Sir Dorabjee Tata Trust financed the research activities of the Institute in the early years. Subsequently, in 1954, the Union Ministry of Food and Agriculture established and have supported since then the Agro-Economic Research Centre of the Institute. During the early fifties, the Rockefeller Foundation made a substantial grant, spread over years, for the conduct of a research programme in rural demography. By the time this grant came to an end, the Union Ministry of Health, which had given grants for conducting some specific demographic studies in 1954-57, decided in 1964 to strengthen and expand the research work on population by financing on a continuing basis a Population Research Centre as an integral part of the Institute. The Ford Foundation gave a very generous financial assistance for more than a decade beginning with the year 1956. Later on, the Ford Foundation, in co-operation with the Planning Commission, provided a separate grant for research and training in the areas of planning and development, mainly devoted to input-output studies. The Planning Commission has also given an endowment grant to the Institute to establish a Chair and Unit at the Institute for promoting teaching, research and informed debate on all issues relating to Planning and Development. The above-mentioned Chair is named as 'Professor D.R. Gadgil Chair in Planning and Development'.

In 1962, the University Grants Commission recognised the Institute as a Centre of Advanced Study in Agricultural Economics to start with and later, in 1964, as a Centre of Advanced Study in Economics. In 1977, the UGC, as a part of its Area Studies Programme, established at the Institute a Centre of Study of Economics of East European Countries. In the same year, the Reserve Bank of India instituted a Chair in Finance at the Institute. In 1989, the Ford Foundation gave a generous endowment grant to the Institute to fund a Chair and to establish a section in international economics to carry out research activities in international economics and related subjects. The Ford Foundation grant also included support for the post of a Librarian and for acquisition of books and journals.

Teaching

The Institute, right from its inception, was affiliated to the University of Bombay, conducted the M.A. Programme in economics and supervised the work of students working for research degrees of that University. In 1949, with the establishment of the University of Poona, the Institute became a constituent recognised institute of the University of Poona. Till a few years ago, the Institute was functioning, for all academic purposes, as the Department of Economics of that University. With the decision of the University of Poona to establish a separate department of economics at its campus, the Institute, as Centre of Advanced Study in Economics, was granted effective autonomy by the University of Poona in 1986 in designing courses and in teaching and examination of M.A. courses in economics. As stated earlier, the Institute has been granted by the Government of India the status of deemed to be a University with effect from May 9, 1993. With the grant of this status, the Institute now awards its own M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in economics. After acquiring the status of deemed to be a University, the syllabi of the courses offered at the Institute were thoroughly revised on the basis of the recommendations of a committee constituted for that purpose. The courses in the M.A. Programme of the Institute are being regularly revised and updated on the recommendations of the Board of Studies and the Academic Council of the Institute.

Training

In April 1989, the University Grants Commission selected the Institute and extended assistance to it for conducting refresher courses in economics for in-service university and college teachers from the western region of the country. After the grant of deemed to be a university status to the Institute in 1993, the UGC extended the catchment area for the refresher courses to the entire country for the Institute in 1994. The Institute has been regularly conducting UGC - sponsored refresher courses for university and college teachers in economics since the inception of this scheme by the UGC.

Library

The Institute shares the Library of the Servants of India Society's Dhananjayrao Gadgil Library and has been mainly responsible for building it up during the last eight decades. The library is considered to be one of the foremost specialised libraries in India in the fields of economics and other related social sciences. The library now has 270208 books and 375 journals and periodicals, received on subscription, exchange, gift, and depository basis. The library has a microfilm camera, microfilm and micro-fiche readers, and a documentation section. With a view to making known addition of books to the library and the contents of the journals currently received in the library, two fortnightly lists, namely, Fortnightly List of Additions and Fortnightly List of Articles on India are brought out regularly and circulated in mimeograph form. A monthly Current Awareness Bulletin is

brought out by the Library in mimeograph form. The Library has recently completed its automation programme and is having its Web OPAC linked to Institute website.

Computer Section

In the Computer Section, the facilities for data processing are available to researchers. The Institute offers consultancy and guidance services in data processing in collaboration with the Indian Council of Social Science Research. The Computer Section is well-equipped with hardware and software to support the research, teaching and training programmes in the Institute. The Institute has now made computers available to all the faculty members in their own offices. A one-year Certificate Course on Computer Applications for Economic Analysis has been introduced for the past and present M.A. and Ph.D. students of the Institute to complement the training in economics received by them at the Institute.

Publications

The Institute has been regularly publishing a quarterly journal of economics in English, *Artha Vijnana*, since March 1959. This journal publishes results of research work carried out in the Institute as well as works of scholars from outside the Institute after a rigorous refereeing process. The journal has achieved an important milestone in 2008 by completing its 50th year of continuous publishing in 2008. To celebrate the occasion, Institute has brought out a Golden Jubilee Special Issue of the journal (Vol. 50, No.4, December 2008). The Institute also publishes research works in the form of working papers, books and mimeograph series. The R.B.R.R. Kale Memorial Lecture, organised by the Institute every year on the occasion of the Founder's Day, is published under the Kale Memorial Lecture Series.

New rules for the Re-registration of the course in the M.A. Economics programme was approved (Academic Council Meeting dated June 24, 2008).

Two new courses, (1) Political Economy of India's Development and (2) Thesis/Dissertation, were introduced in the M.A. Economics programme of the Institute.

4. Interdisciplinary programmes started:

The Institute has established a 'Centre for the Study of Social Exclusion and Inclusive Policy' (CSSEIP) in 2009 with a generous grant from the University Grants Commission. CSSEIP is a multi disciplinary centre established under the UGC XI Plan to carry out research and teaching in the areas of social exclusion, discriminatory studies and inclusive policy. The key objective is to conceptualise and problematise discrimination, exclusion and inclusion based on caste, ethnicity and religion. The centre proposes to focus on developing and

understanding of the nature and dynamics of exclusion and discrimination at both theoretical and empirical level. UGC has sanctioned 1 Professor, 2 Readers, 3 lecturers, 2 Research Associates and 7 supporting staff for this Centre during the XI Plan period.

(b) National Seminar on Social Exclusion

The Institute has conducted the National Seminar on “The Socially Excluded People in India: Towards an Inclusive Socio-Economic Policy”, during February 20-21, 2009. The seminar was conducted by the Centre for Social Exclusion and Inclusive Policy (CSSEIP) of the Institute. The seminar was sponsored by the University Grants Commission. The seminar was conducted on the following three broad themes of social exclusion: (i) socially excluded people and inclusive policy, (ii) gender, human rights and social exclusion, and (iii) social exclusion and inclusion through social sector development. Twenty seven researchers from different Universities and Institutions in the country presented their papers in 7 technical sessions of the seminar. The seminar was coordinated by Professor S.N. Tripathy.

(c) Training Programme for Probationers of Indian Statistical Services (ISS)

The Institute has conducted the training programme for Probationers of Indian Statistical Services (ISS) on the theme “Econometrics Including Time Series and Forecasting Analysis” during June 9, 2008 to July 4, 2008. The training programme was sponsored by the National Academy of Statistical Organization, Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation, Government of India, New Delhi. The twenty days training programme included teaching and hands on assignments. Twenty one probationers of Indian Statistical Services (ISS) attended the training. Professor Rajas Parchure and Professor S.N. Tripathy have coordinated the training programme.

(d) Two day training programme for the ‘Data Entry and Report Generation Software for the PRC Study of Rapid Appraisal of National Rural Health Mission (January 9-10, 2009)

Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India has initiated the study of Rapid Appraisal of National Rural Health Mission in 36 districts located in 20 states across the country through its 18 Population Research Centres. The study follows the uniform methodology, questionnaire and tabulation plan for all the 36 districts in the country. As the study methodology is common, the Ministry wanted the uniform data entry and report generation software for the study. The task of developing the data entry and report generation programme for the study was assigned to the Population Research Centre of the Institute.

The PRC, Pune has taken up this study and carried out the following tasks for the Ministry: (1) developed the computer programme for the data entry using the CSPro software; (2) developed the computer programme for generating tables for the district reports; and (3) two day training for data entry programme in CSPro at the PRC, Pune. The two day training programme for data entry programme for all the 18 PRCs in country was organised during January 9-10, 2009 at PRC, Pune. Two participants each from eighteen PRCs in the country had participated in the training programme. Dr. Rattan Chand (Chief Director, Statistics) and Shri Rajesh Bhatia (Joint Director, Statistics) from the Ministry have participated in the training programme. All the 18 PRCs have used the data entry and report generation software developed by the PRC, Pune for the study.
