NOTE:—From the two abstract statements herewith annexed, it will be seen that the average price per acre at which land was sold in the Jámner Táluka during the last five years, was Rs. 13 and in the Bhusával Táluka at Rs. 21. This difference is evidently owing to the importance of Bhusával as a large junction railway station and the large quantity of fertile land in proximity to the Tápti. Bhusával, many years ago, was simply an isolated place in Khándesh, but ever since the introduction of the railway, this táluka is daily rising in importance, and great number of people have invested their money in land.

In the prices realized by sale of lands under a decree of the Civil Court no marked difference can be found between the two tálukas. Prices realized at a public auction are, as a rule, fluctuating, and, on the other hand, a great deal depends on the time or season of the year when the lands are sold.

With regard to simple mortgages and mortgages with possession, the sums advanced on mortgages per acre was found to be higher in the Jámner Táluka when compared with similar transactions in Bhusával. Jámner being a cotton-producing táluka, larger loans are procurable on mortgaged lands; and also because the village of Neri in the Jámner Táluka, which is only a distance of 14 miles from the Jalgaon Railway Station, contains a number of cotton factories: and large transactions are carried on between the residents of the above-named village and the merchants of Jalgaon.

With reference to leases, the mean average rent realized is almost the same in both the tálukas under review, namely, Rs. 7, and calls for no explanation.

The mean average of Government assessment in connection with all kinds of transactions in the Bhusával Táluka may be set down at Rs. 1-4-0 and Re. 1 in the Jámner Táluka. This difference it is somewhat difficult to satisfactorily explain, as the practice obtains in the Khándesh District not to enter the tenure of the land in deeds.

It may here be incidentally noted that any one investing, say Rs. 100, in land in the Bhusával Táluka realizes, more or less, interest at 2 per cent. per mensem and in the Jámner Táluka Rs. 3 per cent., which tends to prove that the transactions are more profitable in Jámner than in Bhusával.
