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PREFACE

Object and scope of the study:

Among the 289 urban areas in Maharashtra as defined in the 1971 Census, there are 222 municipal towns, 5 comporation towns, and 62 non-municipal towns. Out of the 222 municipal councils, 20 are 'A' Class Municipal Councils, 34 are 'B' Class and 168 are 'C' Class Municipal Councils.

These towns are at different levels of development. They differ from one another in several respects. regional settings and climatological features are different, their functional importances are different and so are also the levels of infrastructural development or per capita incomes. While the census publications provide a lot of useful information about the demographic features of these towns, and the Municipal Year Books furnish details of incomes and expenditures of the Municipal Councils, there is no publication which provides consolidated information about the levels of physical and social infrastructural development of the various towns, their planning achievements or planning deficiencies and level of social facilities etc. Development Plans of all these Municipal towns have been prepared which contain a fund of information on several socio-economic and physical aspects of the towns based on surveys carried out at the time of preparation of the Development Plans. This information is however not available any where in a consolidated and consise form. felt that a publication containing information on all aspects of the towns in Maharashtra i.e. demographic, economic, physical and social would be useful not only to town planners but also to other social Scientists and administrators as well.

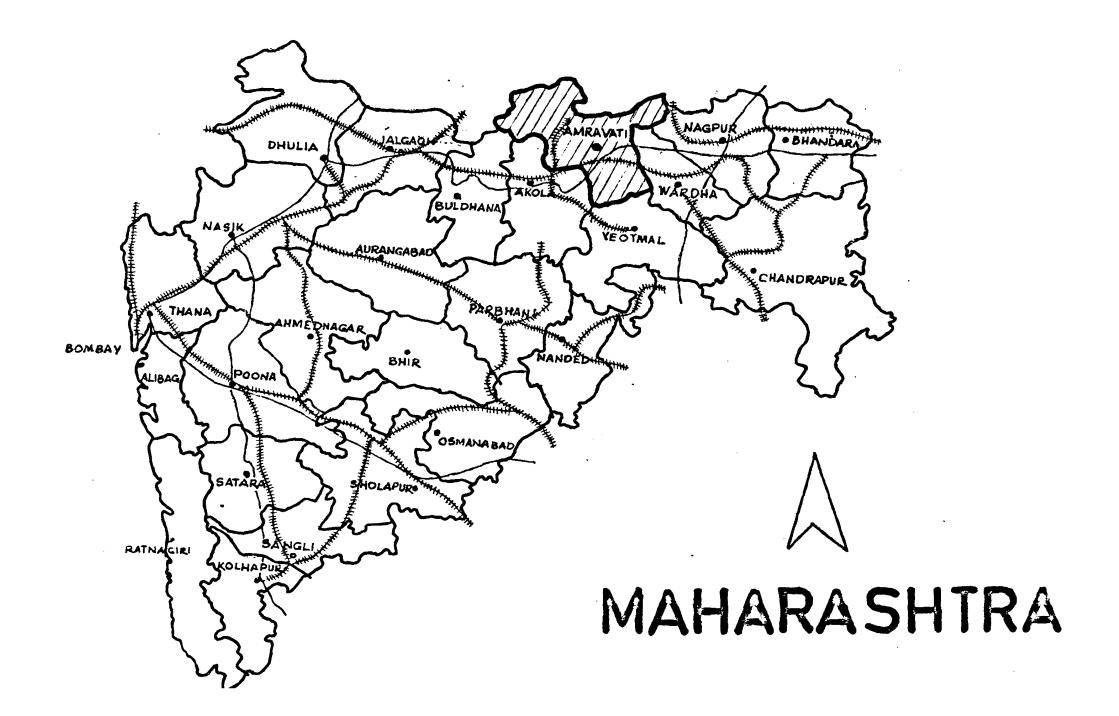
This Town Directory is an attempt in that direction. Information compiled and presented in this Town Directory has been collected mainly through secondary sources viz. census publications, Municipal Year Books published by the Bureau of Economics, District Gazetteers and Development Plan Reports. The information from the Development Plan Reports has been up-dated where necessary. Some information such as relating to water supply and drainage was also collected through correspondence with the concerned Departments/Municipal Councils. The response from the Municipal Councils was quite good as 142 Municipal Councils out of 222

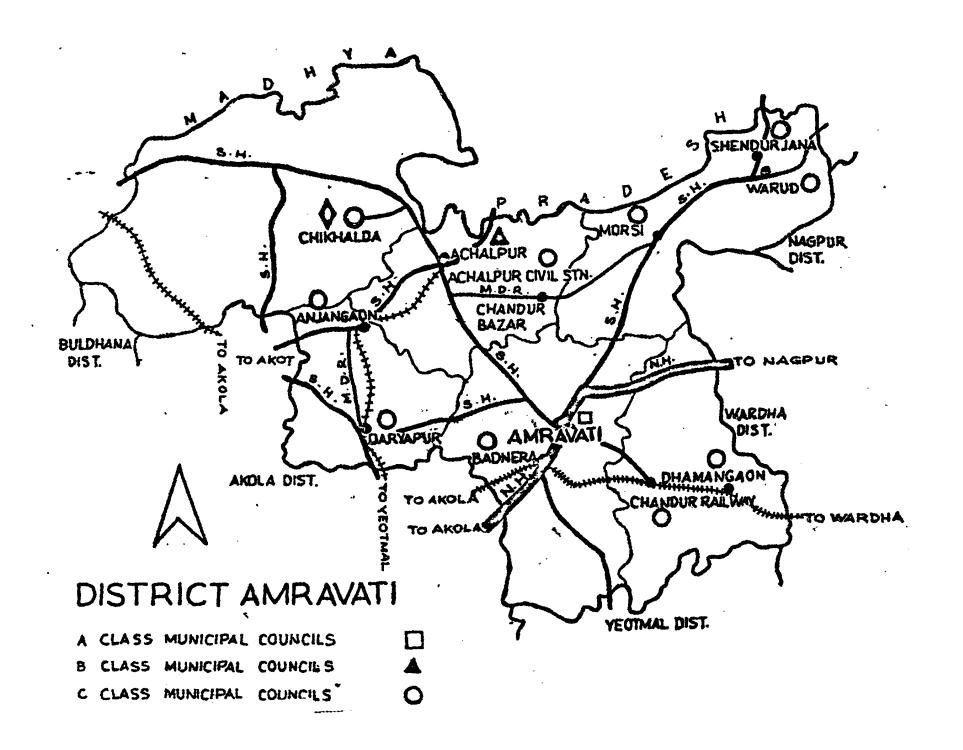
i.e. nearly 64% supplied the information as asked for it. .. e formats as prescribed.

To assess the increase in the facilities and the level of service during the time progression, all municipal councils were requested to supply information as at two time stages, viz. 1970-71 and 1975-76. However, unfortunately such information for the two time stages has not been properly supplied by many municipal councils and as such it has not been possible to throw any light on the increase in the facilities or the level of service during the time progression.

To be really useful, the Town Directory will have to be updated periodically. If the idea and attempt to compile and present such a Town Directory is appreciated and found useful, we would certainly undertake such periodical updating.

The present volume relates to Amaravati District and would be followed by similar volumes of other Districts.

4. Brief History

The history of the town is distinctly Mohamedan. It was the capital of Berar. It was under successive Mohamedan rulers who have left behind relics of their rule in the form of Idgah, mosques and tombs. The most famous of all the Achalpur antiquites is the Dulha Sah Dargah where on the 10th Rabi-Ul-Aval a great urus is held in honour of Dulha Sah. In Sultanpura there is a small fort known as Sultanpura Gadhi built in sandstone. This was used in British days as a jail. The town was fortified in the days of the early muslem rulers by a huge and solid masonry rampart with 4 gates. The names of the gates are Dulha Gate, Tondganv Gate, Bundelpura Gate and Hirapura Gate. Near the Dulha Gate, there is a window known as Dulha Khidki.

Achalpur, in the past, was a centre of cotton and silk manufacture.

The town was at one time surrounded by 54 puras all bearing mohamedan names like Sultanpura, Samastpura, Jeevanpura etc.

Geography and physical features.

Timber brought from Melghat to the bazar on Thursday is by far the most important article of trade. The depots established here by the forest depart-ment is one of the biggest depots in India.

Major portion of the town lies on the east- side of the river whereas the part of the town on the western side is well developed and is called 'Civil Lines' area. Brief History

Is quite a modern town, its existance being due to its selection as a Military Station when Salabat Khan's Reformed Troops were converted into the Achalapur Brigade and made a part of Hydrabad Contingent.

The Basti is divided into seven puras or quarters named Chhota Bazar, Motha Bazar, Moglai Pura, Gatarmal Pura, Vakil Line, Pension Pura etc. The Civil Station is a well laid out area with broad roads and excellent bungalows and public offices. The town is a picturesque place being well shaded with splendid trees. There are two temples of Datta and Vitthal.

- Amaravati is said to have been founded by Raje Raghuji Bhosale. In past it was under the rulership of both the was under the rulership of both the Nagpur and Hyderabad rulers. The town was within the present 'Fort wall' only. The wall which is about 3.62 kms.(2/4 miles) long, encircling the old town and about 6.09 metres (20 ft.) to 7.92 metres (26 ft.) high, was constructed in the beginning of the 18th Century by the Nizam's Government for protection of the town from the for protection of the town from the raids of Pendharies. The wall has five large gates and four small gates known as 'Khindis' besides two more passages. Hindu Mythology has attached great importance to this city. The name itself describes it to be a 'city of the city. The Immortals' er an eternal city. The renowned Amba Devi and Ekvira Devi Sansthans are known to be very old. It is believed that from this place Lord Krishna has carried off Rukmini, who had come to the temple with her brother Rukmi to pay her respects to the Amba Devi before her marriage with Shishupal. The town is growing faster

due to the growth of industries and educational facilities in the town. The Samadhi of Gadage Maharaj is well known. There are other Hindu temples also. Balaji temple of Jain constructed in 1735 is prominant. There are severamosques and a dargah called Cilam Sah Wab. Old Jame Masjid over 350 years old exists.
