<u>PREFACE</u>

Object and scope of the study :

Among the 289 urban areas in Maharashtra as defined in the 1971 Census, there are 222 municipal towns, 5 corporation towns and 62 non-municipal towns. Out of the 222 municipal councils, 20 are 'A' Class Municipal Councils, 34 are 'B' Class and 168 are 'C' Class Municipal Councils.

These towns are at different levels of development. They differ from one another in several respects. Their regional settings and climatological features are different, their functional importances are different and so are also the levels of infrastructural development or per capita incomes. While the census publications provide a lot of useful information about the demographic features of these towns and the Municipal Year Books furnish details of incomes and expenditures of the Municipal Councils, there is no publication which provides consolidated information about the levels of physical and social infrastructural development of the various towns, their planning achievements or planning deficiencies and level of social facilities etc. Development Plans of all these Municipal towns have been prepared which contain a fund of information on several socio-economic and physical aspects of the towns based on surveys carried out at the time of preparation of the Development Plans. This information is however not available any where in a consolidated and concise form. It was felt that a publication containing information on all aspects of the towns in Maharashtra i.e. demographic, economic, physical and social would be useful not only to town planners but also to other social Scientists and administrators as well.

This Town Directory is an attempt in that direction. Information compiled and presented in this



Town Directory has been collected mainly through secondary sources viz. census publications, Municipal Year Books published by the Bureau of Economics, District Gazetteers and Development Plan Reports. The information from the Development Plan Reports has been up-dated where necessary. Some information such as relating to water supply and drainage was also collected through correspondence with the concerned Departments/Municipal Councils. The response from the Municipal Councils was quite good an 142 Municipal Councils out of 222 i.e. nearly 64% supplied the information as asked for in the formats as prescribed.

To assess the increase in the facilities and the level of service during the time progression, all Municipal Councils were requested to supply information as at two time stages, viz. 1970-71 and 1975-76. However, unfortunately such information for the two time stages has not been properly supplied by many municipal councils and as such it has not been possible to throw any light on the increase in the facilities or the level of service during the time progression.



Latitude - 21° 10' N Longitude - 75° 20' E

'A' Class Municipal Town and Headquarter of Dhule District. It is situated at 57 kms. north of Chalisgaon which is on the Bombay-Negpur route of the Central Reilway. Dhule is also connected to Chalisgaon by a branch broad gauge line and is a terminus. It is situated on two National Highways viz. Bombay-Agra road and Surat-Nagpur road. Is also connected to Aurangabad by Dhule-Aurangabad State Highway.

Situated amidst the Satpura ranges and has a gently uneven topography. Situated on the south bank of river Panjara in a rainshadow area. To the south of the town are Laling Hills and to the east and west are the rolling plains. Dhule has fertile hinterland producing chiefly cotton and ground-nut. Town is traversed by 3 big nall as ultimately draining into Panjara river.

Altitude - 857' above M.S.L. Mean [Maximum - 46.1°c temperature [Minimum - 8.9°c Rainfall average - 608 mm.

The climate is generally dry. Prevailing wind direction is from south-west and north-west.

Dhule town is a very old settlement. Somewhere in 1629 A.D. Khaja-Abdul Hassam Shaha Jahan's general used to spend the rainy season here. With the decline of Moghul empire, Dhule alongwith other parts of Khandesh was occupied by Marathas and administered till 1803. When the famine fell on the country, the town was deserted. Balaji Balwant in the follow ug years rehabilitated the vil age. Fort Laling : was repaired and entrusted to Balaji Balwant who looked after the administration of Songir and Laling Districts. The Headquarter was kept at Dhule. In 1818, Dhule came under the British rule and was selected as District Headquarter on account of its central position. Upto this time, the town was very small. Merchants were invited from Burhanpur and carpenters and smiths from Bombay, Surat to construct Residences and offices. Various facilities were granted to the residents. A new suburb was formed. With the spread of the village, Dhule's trade increased. Handloom factories were established due to availability of cotton. Cotton growing hinterland enabled setting up of a number of ginning factories in the city. The frame work of the city is made up of a number of parallel lanes and cross streets at right angles to them. The core of the city is located at Gandhi chowk.

The Municipal Council was established in the year 1862.

In addition, there are 5 Ginning and Pressing industries, 22 Cil Mills (including baby explorers) and 9 bidi industries. The industrial co-operative society in the town has been established with 11 Acres and 6 gunthas of land, having 24 plots, out of which 19 have constructed sheds in it, the remaining 5 being vacant. The total employment in this co-operative society is 460 workers. The other important industry in the town is handloom and powerloom industry (about 2,000 industries) employing about 2,000 workers.

Two rivers flow through the town : dividing the town into three parts. Eastern portion of river Bhogawati is known as Varwade, the portion between Bhoganati and Amaravati rivers is known as Dondaiche and to the west of Amaravati river, there is newly extended gaothan. The land in the gaothans of Dondaiche and Varwade is full of ups and downs throughout and sloping towards the rivers. The height of Dondaiche and Varwade is almost 28' and 20' respectively from river cods. Extended gaothan has plain topography. A big Nalla flowing on the eastern side of the town acts as a natural barrier and has restricted development of town on this side. On south land is undulatingand hence unsuitable for development. Town has shown development trend on north and west. The wind generally flows from north-west and south-west sides. The hinter land of town is fertile. The oil seeds, pulses, chilly are the mair crops. Altitude 157 metres above -M.S.L. Mean Maximum - 40.70°c temperature | Minimum - 16.20°c 690 mm. Rainfall average -Climate is extrane being too hot in Summer and too cold in Winter. Town has no historical background. : However the town is of great commercial importance and has an important market for ground-nuts, cotton, chillies and gur.

During 7th Century, it was mere a fort, the remains of which could be seen even to-day. Wells were dug for supply of water to the town in past and the same are used for water supply even to-day. In course of time, the town was under the rule of Mogals and Marathas. During early Seventeenth Century, the town had gained prosperity. In 1818, the town passed on into the possession of : British whenafter it started

declining in importance.

The old temple of Mahadeo, Maruti and Fort reflect the past glory of the town. Outside the town on north-east is an old shrine and mosque stated to have been built in 1583 during the reign of Akbar. The town flourished as commercial town after the Surat Bhusawal broad gauge railway line was laid down in 1898.

The Burhanpur-Raver-👔 Shirpur-Taloda State Highway and the Taloda-Nandurbar-Satana State Highway pass through the town. Taloda is very near to the boundaries of Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat State. Madhya Pradesa starts across Satpuda ranges while boundary of Gujarat State starts at 1 mile distance from Taloda. The town falls in Tribal area.
 - Situated in the Tapi valley on the bank of river Khardi. The soil is fertile for cotton, jawar, banana etc. Due to nearness of Satpuda ranges which are at a distance of only 5 miles on north, the town is famous for " Fine Teak & timber Market". River Tapi flows at a distance of 3 miles only. Altitude - 108.9 metres above

M.S.L. Mean - Maximum - 43°c temperature Minimum - 12°c Rainfall average - 789.7 mm.

The Winter season is too cold and Summer is too hot. Climate is generally healthy and dry.

: The grand-father and mother of famous Shri Malharrao Holkar in Maratha regime stayed in Taloda town on account of which Taloda gained importance in history. In the past, King of Budhavali used to keep his sheep-heards at this place on account of which the settlement came to know as 'Taloda'. There is one tank in the town in ruined State. It is believed that under this tank, there are many alive water springs (Tal-Udak = underground water) - 54 -
