## C H A P T E R I

### I N T R O D U C T I O N

#### 1.1

Nasik District is situated partly in Tapi basin and partly in the upper Godavari basin. It is bounded on the North West side by the Dang and Surat districts of Gujarat State, on the North, by Dhulia, on the North East and East by Jalgaon District. On the East, lies Aurangabad District, to the South, Ahmednagar District and on the South West lies Thana District.

#### 1.2

The total geographical area is 15,573 sq.kms. and its total population, as per 1961 census, is 18,55,246. Going according to area, this district ranks first in Bombay Division, and fifth in Maharashtra State. According to population, Nasik District also ranks first in Bombay Division(excluding of course, Greater Bombay District), and third in Maharashtra State.

#### 1.3

Administratively, the district is divided in 13 talukas. The talukewise area, number of inhabited villages, number of towns, 1961 population and the position of each taluka to the District (percentage of area and population) are given below:

Nasik Zilla Parishad with its district jurisdiction and the 13 Panchayat Samitis, with respective Taluka boundaries, have been established since 1962. The Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samitis have no jurisdiction in the Municipal areas, and Gantontment areas. Other towns viz. Lasalgaon, Chandor, Ravalgaon and Manmad non-Municipal area, are however, included in the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad and the respective Panchayat Samiti. The Nasik Zilla Parishad thus covers 98.4 percent of the area and 76.06 percent of population.

#### 1.4

The district lies between  $19^{\circ} 28'$  and  $20^{\circ} 53'$  North latitude and  $73^{\circ} 16'$  and  $75^{\circ} 06'$  East longitude. Nasik District, accounts for 5.08 percent of area and 4.64 percent of the total population of Maharashtra State.

#### 1.5

Taking into account the height, climate, rainfall and soil pattern, Nasik District can well be divided into three parts as under :-

The first part, comprising of Peint and Surgana Talukas and the western parts of Igatpuri, Nasik Dindori, Kalwan and Baglan talukas, known as the Dangi or Kokan, with a normal rainfall of over 3500 mms. abounds in thick forests and hills. The only crops grown in this part are Paddy, Nagli, Vari and Khurasani(local oilseed).

The other part is just adjacent to the hilly tract is the sloping range extending from North to South comprising of the Eastern parts of Igatpuri, Nasik, Dindori, Kalwan and Baglan talukas and the Chandor taluka. This is a shadow rainfall area and gets a very limited rainfall of about ~~677~~<sup>500/</sup> mms. This part is however well served by irrigation works and grows commercial crops like Sugarcane, Grapes, Vegetables. The main food crops are Bajra and Wheat.

The third part stretches on the Eastern side of the district comprising of Malegaon, Nandgaon, Yeola, Niphad and Sinnar talukas. This part receives very less rainfall and that too uncertain. Many parts of Sinnar, Yeola and Nandgaon are quite occasionally affected by scarcity. But because of the canals of Gangapur, Nandur Madhyameshwar, and Girna, in this area, (mainly Niphad and Malegaon Talukas) grow commercial crops like Sugarcane, Onions, Grapes and Vegetables.

#### River System

Nasik District has got six important rivers (perennial) with the following length (in Nasik District)

### 1.6 Climate, Temperature and rainfall

The climate of Nasik District can broadly be classified according to distinct seasons:-

- 1) "Monsoon" from middle of June to end of Sept.
- 2) "Winter" from October to middle of March.
- and 3) "Summer" from middle of March to middle of June.

Except for the Western slopes of Sahyadris, the district generally experiences salubrious climate. The summer months are moderately hot and the temperature varies from 36° c to 43° c.

Although the days are hot, the nights are cool and pleasant.

The rainy season is comparatively cooler with sporadic rainfall distributed over four months. The major rainfall is in July and August. During winter which is severe in December and January the temperature stays between 29° c to 10° c.

The climate of the Western parts, particularly the below Ghat area of Peint and Surgana Talukas, is different from the rest of the district. The rains which begin from early June continue till middle of October and heavy downpour is generally experienced during July and August. The dampness and moisture make the climate unhealthy. The winter is also farely severe.

The district receives major rainfall because of the influence of the South West monsoon during the months of June to October. The return-rains are also experienced, in some parts, in January and April. The distribution of rainfall is quite uneven and is obviously affected by the presence of Sahyadri ranges in the western parts of the district. The rainfall is heavy in the extreme Western parts of the district and gradually declines as we go from West to East.

C H A P T E R - II

Explanatory Notes

In this chapter, short notes, on the tables presented in the abstract part, are given. There are in all 84 tables in the present combined abstract of 1968-69 and 1969-70.

2.1 Climate and Rainfall

The two tables 1 and 2 give the information of Rainfall and climate respectively. The rainfall statistics is collected from the tahsil office while the "Climate" information is received from the Meteorological Office, Bombay.

2.2 Area and Population (Tables 3 to 8)

The six tables on the topic mainly give the taluka wise data as per 1961 census. These tables give the data on taluka-wise rural and urban population, towns and villages, workers and non workers, Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribed population. The language and religion data is also given in one of the tables (District Totals).

2.3 Agriculture

There are in all 11 tables on this subject. In these tables talukewise data regarding Land Utilization, area under main crops, irrigation by sources and crops etc. is included.

In this group of tables, information is also given on Minor Irrigation (wells and Bandharas) Major and Medium Irrigation Projects in Nasik District, Agricultural Wage rates, Agricultural implements, and famine and scarcity in Nasik District.

2.4 Animal Husbandry and Forests

There are 5 tables on this topic. These tables provide information on livestock census 1966, Veterinary Services, Slaughter houses, Forest area etc.

2.5 Employment, Factories and Electricity

The information on these topics is contained in 11 tables.

Factory Statistics relating to Nasik District is given in 3 tables (Table Nos. 25, 26 and 27), Employment Exchange Statistics is given in 3 tables (Table Nos. 28, 29 and 30). Table Nos. 31 & 32 give details of Government Employees in Nasik District as on 1-7-66. Electricity Statistics is given in table Nos. 33 & 34.

#### 2.6 Co-operation

Table Nos. 35 to 42 (8 tables) present data on Co-operative movement in Nasik District including Agricultural Credit, Marketing, Money Lending and Regulated Markets.

#### 2.7 Medical and Public Health

The medical and public health statistics relating to Nasik District is presented in Tables 43 to 46. (4 tables)

#### 2.8 Education

The 8 tables (from Table No. 47 to 54) give the data on literacy, No. of institutions, pupils and teachers so also the information regarding beneficiaries under Backward class and Economically Backward class schemes and expenditure on primary education.

#### 2.9 Communication

The tables (from Table No. 55 to Table No. 61) provide the information on Railways length, roads, motor vehicles, state Transport statistics etc. This group also provides the information of postal facilities and rural broadcasting.

#### 2.10 Local Bodies

Table Nos. 62 to 65 (4 tables) supply the statistics regarding the income and expenditure of municipal bodies, village panchayats and Zilla Parishad for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70.

(Bombay and Jalgaon), information on miscellaneous subjects like Police Force, Crime Statistics, Banks, Joint Stock Companies, Cinema Statistics, Working of Courts, Insurance, Small Savings, Land Revenue etc. etc. is given.

## Chark Talukas

Relative position of Talukas in the various fields of Economic Development.

3.1 Nasik District is divided into three geographical sectors viz. the western hilly zone, the Central deccan plateau, and the third the eastern scantly rainfall area. These basic characteristics obviously have their effect on the economic progress of the various talukas. In the following paragraphs some important development aspects are studied to show the relative position of the talukas;

### 3.2 Population

Nasik District has got 24.4% scheduled tribe population (4,52,707) out of the total population of 18,55,246. This percentage for Bombay Division is only 12.3, while for the Maharashtra State, it is only 6.05. The main concentration is in the hilly areas covering the talukas of Igatpuri, west Nasik, Reint, Kalwan and west of Lunderi taluka. The highest percentage of total population is in Reint taluka which has got 75.4% and the lowest is in Reint. Taluka with only 6.4% of Tribal population to the total. In the hilly tract 5 Tribal Development Blocks are functioning. The Scheduled Caste population is negligible in Nasik District as a whole.

### 3.3 Agricultural Situation

The net area sown in Nasik District is 9.14 lakh hectares which forms 58% of the total geographical area. The gross irrigated area is 80,000 hectares which forms 8% of the total cropped area. In both these characteristics, Nasik District is relatively better <sup>off</sup> than any other district in Bombay Division. The respective position of Bombay Division is 16% and 5% respectively.

Going talukewise, the percentage of gross irrigated area is very good in Niphad and Malegaon talukas while in the talukas of Baglan, Chander, Lunderi, Sinnar and Nasik, the

percentage of area irrigated is near above the district average. In the remaining talukas, the irrigated area is almost negligible.

The main commercial crops grown in the district are sugar-cane, Ground nut, onions and vegetables. The main talukas growing these crops are Baglan, Kalwan, Malegaon, Nasik and Niphad. Their respective areas are shown in the concerned talukas

#### Co-operative Movement

Nasik District has got a good net work of Co-operative industries and the movement is quite mature in the district. The average under the primary agricultural credit is cent percent and is quite comparable to the neighbouring cooperatively advanced districts of Dhulia and Jalgaon. The crop loans advanced by the agricultural societies in Nasik district are of the tune of Rs. 5.20 crores. The talukas in which the society loaning is above the average are the sugarcane growing talukas of Baglan, Malegaon, Niphad and Nasik.

The other main activities conducted by the village Co-operatives are the marketing and distribution of fertilisers. The District and Taluka Co-operative Marketing Societies (19 in the District) are the main channel for the distribution of fertilisers and the fertilisers handled by these institutions are nearly 6500 tonnes. These activities are growing every year with the expansion of the "Hybrid" programme so ambitiously being carried out in Nasik District.

#### Livestock and Poultry

The total livestock in Nasik District, as per 1966 quinquennial census, is 14,20,711 and the total poultry is 3,67,666. The urbanised talukas of Nasik and Malegaon have a higher percentage of milk cattle and poultry. The average milk animal per acre is 0.14 for the district.

Dairying is another ~~new~~ occupation of the agriculturist and has developed well in hinterland of Nasik and Malegaon cities. There are 66 Dairy Cooperatives in the taluka covered by two milk unions-- one at Nasik and the other at Malegaon. The quantity of milk procured by these societies and unions was about 16 lakh litres in 1968-69. This milk is supplied to the Govt. Milk Scheme at Nasik and Dhulia. The milk unions at Malegaon is recently started to develop the milk pockets near about and this is likely to give a big impetus to the progressive farmers.

#### Education

The growth of primary education is quite notable. The No. of primary schools and pupils has gone up to 1978(schools) and 2.80 lakh(pupils) respectively in 1968-69. The position in 64-65 was 1922 schools and 2.52 lakh pupils only.

The position of the growth of secondary education and higher education is also likevise. The following table will show the details:

There are two public schools in the district, one at Nasik (Govt.) and the other at Deolia-Kalwan (Zilla Parishad).

#### Medical Facilities

There are in all 78 primary health centres and sub centres in the district. These cater to the needs of the rural folk and the facility serves the revivited rural population of the district.

In addition there are 26 Family Planning Centres functioning in the district.

### Water Supply

All the towns have a piped water supply scheme, except Satana.

As regards village piped water supply 29 villages with a population of 61,000 souls, have got piped water supply. In the remaining villages there are 6,375 drinking water wells (in 1271 villages). Others are covered by riverbeds. In addition to this, the Zilla Parishad has undertaken a big programme of the construction of Drinking water wells in all the villages where the drinking water supply position is difficult in the summer season.

### Electrification

There is a great stride achieved in "village electrification". Till 1968-69, electricity has reached to <sup>419</sup> ~~42~~ villages and the number of pumps electrified was 11,700.

### Industrial Growth

The following main industries are functioning in the district:

The Co-operative Industrial Estate (Satpur), Nasik is progressing well and has started 46 units till now.

The proposed Co-operative Spinning mill near Satana, will also add to the industrial growth of the district.

## CHAPTER IV

### PROGRESS OF PLAN SCHEMES

#### 4.1 Introductory

During the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 annual plans were formulated by the State Govt. in consultation with the Planning Commission, Govt. of India. This was necessary because the Fourth Five Year Plan of the country and the states have not been finalised. In drawing these annual plans, the main objectives and policies of the States' Fourth Five Year Plan have been duly kept in view. These two annual plan lay stress on the productive sectors. The agro industrial development has been the key note of these plans. From the years 1967-68 onwards the increase in agricultural production was notable and showed distinct improvement. The index number of industrial production also showed an increase after a long period of recession from 1965.

4.2 The outlay on plan schemes for the Maharashtra State for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 has been Rs. 114.00 crores and Rs. 114.00 crores  
respectively. The following paras give the details regarding the plan scheme expenditure on district level schemes as well as their main physical achievements (sector wise).

#### 4.3 Agriculture

The total expenditure on district level plan schemes has been Rs. 290.46 lakhs and Rs. 243.91 lakhs during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively and out of this, the expenditure on agricultural schemes is as follows:-

These figures only reflects the importance attached to the Agricultural Programmes by the Government. The details of expenditure on the main schemes under this sector are as

**4.4** The outstanding feature of the agricultural programmes during these two years is the Hybrid programme. The achievements of Nasik District are quite note worthy and has made a great headway especially in Hybrid Bajra. The details of achievements are as follows:-

Nasik District predominates in Bajri crop and because of the high yielding programme, the production of this crop specially will be grow up notably.

This programme involves a great deal of coordination in the activities of the different departments concerned and all of them i.e. the Agricultural department, the Co-operative department, the Block agencies have rised to the occassion and the note of the non official leadership as well as that of the District Central Co-operative Bank is also mentionable.

**4.5** The other sides of the agricultural programme such as the soil conserative, digging of wells, percolation tanks etc. is also progressing well. The achievements under the plan <sup>two</sup> schemes for the years (1968-69 and 1969-70) are as follows:-

**4.6** The total irrigation potential of the district is expected to go up notably after the major schemes of "Upper Godavari (Karanjan) and "Bhojapur" are completed. The other scheme of raising the height of "Chankapur Dam" is also in progress. All these will be of great importance to the district.

Other measures of increasing the area under minor irrigation and especially under the "Percolation Tanks" are being speeded up by the Zilla Parishad, Nasik. The total number of percolation tanks completed till now is 54 and many are under construction. There is a constant demand for new percolation tanks from all corners of the district.

**4.7** Rural Electrification programme, as a vital measure to support agriculture, is further extended as in the previous years, and by the end of 1969-70, 434 villages and towns have been electrified and 13,000 pumps energised.

All these programmes and other measures undertaken by Govt. Sector and the Zilla Parishad have shown promising results.

#### **4.8 Animal Husbandry**

Veterinary Centres are established in all the talukas with one Veterinary Hospital at Nasik. The scheme of providing artificial insemination centres has also been extended to many more blocks. The scheme of expansion of the Veterinary Hospital at Nasik is also under way and this will modernise the amenities.

#### 4.9 Community Development

All the talukas of Nasik District have been covered by the C.D. activity and in addition, there are 9 T.D. blocks. The main achievements of these blocks(C.D. & T.D.) during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 were as follows:-
