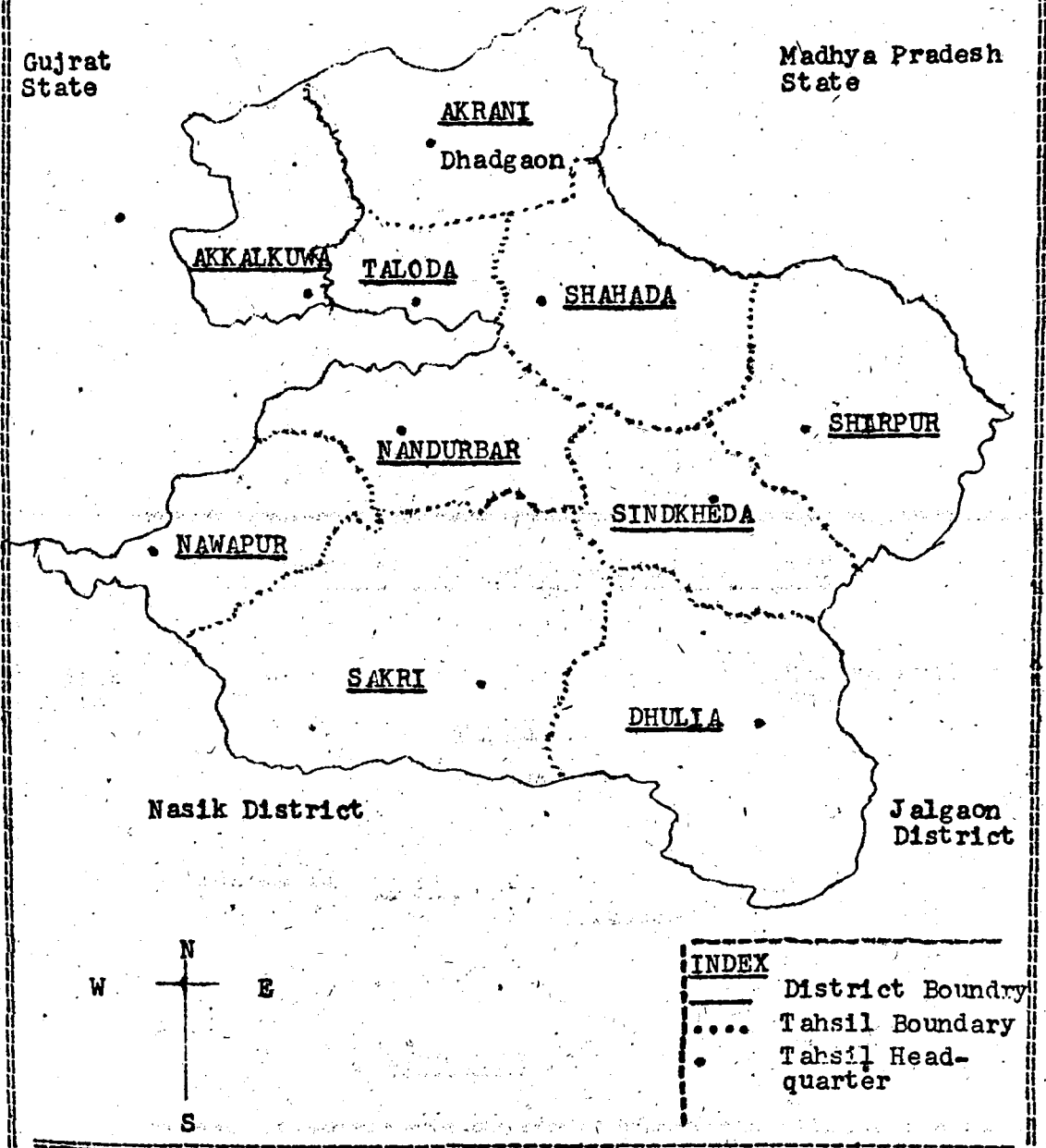

Introduction1.1 Location and Boundaries -

Dhulia District is situated in the extreme North-Western part of Maharashtra and consequently, the district has boundaries common with Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh on the Western and Northern sides. Jalgaon district lies to the east and Nasik district to the south of Dhulia district. This district lies between  $20^{\circ} - 38''$  and  $22^{\circ} - 3'$  North latitude and  $73^{\circ} - 47'$  and  $75^{\circ} - 11'$  East longitude. The total area of the district is 12,562 Sq.Kms. and its population in 1961 was 13,51,296. In terms of area and population the district accounts for 4.10 and 3.42 percent respectively of Maharashtra State stretching nearly 87 Kms. along Tapi and 48 kms, along the Eastern parts of Surat and Baroch districts of Gujarat State, Varying in breadth from 52 Kms. to 122 Kms. The district forms an upland basin, the most northerly section of the Deccan plateau.

1.2 Administrative Set Up -

Administratively, this district forms a part of Bombay Division. Before 1961 this district was called West Khandesh, Dhulia district consist of 10 Tahsils. It is sub-divided administratively into two sub-divisions, . Area population of each of the sub-divisions are as follows -

### 1.4 Municipalities

There are six Municipalities in the district, viz. Taloda, Shahada, Nandurbar, Shirpur, Dondiacha, and Dhulia. The oldest Municipality viz. Dhulia was established in 1860, while the youngest one at Dondaicha was set up in 1951.

### 1.5 The Zilla Parishad

With a view to share development efforts with the rural people in a democratic set up the Zilla Parishad is formed in 1962. The Panchayat Samities are co-terminus with tahsils. Ten Panchayat Samities are formed to implement various development schemes. For the Community Development Schemes, there was 20 Blocks, of which 13 blocks are as Tribal Blocks, while the remaining seven blocks, are C.D. Blocks in

various stages. The Zilla Parishad covers 98.9% area and 84.9% of the population of the district. The population covered includes total rural population and 5.33% of the urban population of the District. 1.6 Topography -

This district forms an up-plane basin, the most northerly part of Deccan plateau draining into the Tapi with a gentle westerly slope.

It includes most varied tracts of the country, wild hills and forests in the north, rich cultivable land on both the banks of Tapi and low rolling, rocky hills, called tail ends of western Ghats.

Although the district is divided by the Tapi there are three well marked belts of the country. In the north are the high and wild Satpudas, where modern civilization is still to reach. This area lacks in communications and life is medieval and tribal in character. In the middle, the rich Tapi valley where modern civilization is shaping itself in the form of big irrigation dams, long and linking roads, mechanised agriculture, wellknit road and rail communications and advanced social institutions. In the south are the bare ridges and well watered valleys flanked, by the Sahyadri ranges. This part is flat and the river Panzara has given tremendous scope for irrigation since historical periods.

1.7 Hills, River System and Soil -

The Satpuda hills are to the north of Tapi, the whole length of the rich alluvial plain is bounded by steep southern face of the Satpudas, a belt of mountain land from 30 to 42 Kms. broad. The ranges of Satpudas have a wall like start and winding ranges thereafter at once. For example, the whole Shahada tahsil is fairly plain but the wall like mountains of Akrani Tahsil start at once and there are high mountain peaks in its ranges rising from 54,864 metres to 91,440 metres. The grandest hill of the ranges is Toranmal, in Akrani Tahsil. After several ranges in Akrani and Akalkuwa Tahsils along the border of the State, the river 'Narmada' flows with its mighty grander.

1.7.2 The Sahyadry-

South of Tapi valley, the country is more varied than either in Tapi valley or in the North. In the east drained by the river Bori, wide stony, thorny plains rise in low broad topped balastic ridges or sink in rich valleys. West of the Bori nearer the Sahyadris the landscape grows wilder and more picturesque, with cut out hill ranges, seperated by the well watered valleys of the Panzara river. The Kan and Bori rivers stretch for east across the District. The extreme west of these Sahyadri ranges is wild and hilly covered by forests. This part is also in-habited by wild life and Adiwasis. This region also comprises of plains of Dhulia, Sakri, Nandurbar and Sindkheda tahsils. The hilly parts of Sakri and Nandurbar tahsils and the whole of Nawapur Tahsil is situated mostly in Sahyadri ranges and is in-habited by Adivasis. Sakri and Nawapur Tahsils have green forests and western winds and as a result are cooler, in the summer in comparision with other parts of the district.

1.7.3 Rivers - Tapi -

Tapi is the major river of this District. This is also rightly called 'Tapti' from the Sanskrit root 'Tap' or 'to heat' because of the belief that the river was created by the God the 'Sun' to protect himself from his own heat. This belief bears witness to the fact that this district would have been an arid area or a desert in the absence of this life giving river. In view of the fact, this district lies between 20° - and 23° North latitude near about which famous deserts of this country are situated. This major river has its course of 86 KM. In this district. Its banks are too high to enable the use of its water for irrigation. The important contribution of this river to this district is the silt it deposits on either sides of its banks, especially during the floods. However it causes damage to life and property including crops during floods in rainy season.

The River Narmada forms northern boundary of this district which flows for a length of 56 Kms. in this district Akrani and Akkalkuwa Tahsils are drained by Narmada and its tributaries.

1.7.4 The Soil of this district is broadly classified in to three Zones i.e. 1)Light, 2)Medium black, 3)Deep black. Approximately 50% of the total area is of light type of Soil, 30% of medium black soil and remaining 14% is deep black soil. The light type of soil is largely found in Dhulia and Sakri Tahsils, western part of Nawapur Tahsil and southern part of Nandurbar tahsil. These are good for Bajari Kharif, Jowar, Groundnut and Cotton. Medium black soil is largely found in Sindkheda and Akrani tahsils and western part of Dhulia tahsil and are well suited for irrigation. Deep black soils are largely deposited on both the banks of Tapi river, particularly in Shirpur, Shahada, and Taloda, Tahsils and in eastern part of Nandurbar tahsil.

This belt of rich fertile soil is of about 16 Kms. on each side of the river. Well irrigation is almost impossible in the area as the soil is deep and well digging becomes uneconomic.

#### 1.8.1 Climate and Temperature -

Dhulia district is far away from the coastal tracts and hence the climate is extreme and dry, resulting in large variations in day and night temperatures. The following table gives the highest and lowest temperatures in summer and winter seasons for one centre Nandurbar in the district.

From the table it is seen that the highest maximum temperature in summer was as high as 40.4 in 1968 and 41.4° in 1969, where as the lowest minimum temperature recorded was 14.8 and 15.8 during winter of 1968 and 1969 respectively. Within the district, there are some local variations. In the Satpudas, the heat is some what tempered by the forests. The eastern part of the Tapi valley is the hottest part of the district. The southern and west side of Tapi valley, though subject to hot winds in summer, is a little cooler the western parts of the district, viz. the valleys of Panzara and other streams have in the hottest season cool and bracing nights and are hardly ever visited by hot winds.

#### 1.8.2 Seasons -

Summer and Winter are the two broad seasons in the district, summer months are from Mid-March to Mid-October, while winter months

are from Mid-October to Mid-March. There is rainy season which interputs summer from very late June to late September. In rainy season, the temperature comes down and relieves the people of the scorching heat.

1.8.3. Rain-fall -

Dhulia District is on the eastern side of the Sahyadri. This is a rain shadow area. As such the western and South Western parts of the district having ranges of Sahyadri in it, experience good rains. The plains to the south of the District and those of the Tapi valley do not get sufficient rains and are comparatively dry. The Northern parts of the district, with Satpuda ranges experience good rains. The table below gives rainfall data for all tahsils in the district for the years 1967- to 1969.

1.8.4 - It will be seen that western and southern part of Dhulia Dist. Nawapur, as well as the three tahsils in the northern part record higher rainfall as compared to the rains in Tapi valley and the remaining plains. Generally wet months are July and August. The dry farming operations require rains for certain intermitant periods to keep the crops in good conditions.

1.8.5 - Scarcity :-

During 1968-69, 1969-70, 27 and 59 villages respectively were declared as hit by akin to scarcity, Complete and partial suspension of land revenue had to be given to 27 and 29 villages during 1968-69, and 1969-70 respectively as per details shown below -

Relief works were under taken in 7 villages during 1969-70 giving employment to persons 552 and involving total expenditure of Rs.0.59 lakhs. Similarly there were 224 villages and 107 villaves affected by flood during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. They were granted tagavi loan under A.L. Act amounting to Rs.1,63,931 in 1968-69. In 1969-70 total tagavi loan distributed to the tune of Rs.2,24,848.

1.9 - Tribal Area -

The biggest tribal district in Maharashtra is Dhulia with 37.99% of the population being tribal. The Central Government has declared Nawapur, Akrani and Akkalkuwa as Scheduled Area. The 10 Panchayat Samities contain 12 tribal Development Blocks and 1 M.D.P. and the Zilla Parishad, has large number of tribal persons as its members. Large parts of Nandurbar, Taloda, Shahada, Shirpur and Sakri Tahsils are tribal in character. There are several tribes called Bhills, in the Satpuda ranges. They are still in prehistoric condition due to their detachment from main current of national life. Some Adivasis have settled on the plains and are to some extent advanced in agriculture. These are called Padavis, Tadavis, Vavaves, Valavis etc. The largest scheduled tribe is Bhill (with 3.00 lakhs, population) followed by Gamits (1.02 lakhs population) and Koznas (0.51 lakhs population).

1.10 - ~~Some~~ Special features of Dhulia District are as follows -

- 1) Dhulia is a milk supplying centre in Maharashtra. The milk collected from Dhulia is daily supplied to Bombay.
- 2) There is an Agricultural Collage at Dhulia. Also there is an Agricultural School. Soil and Water analysis is undertaken by the Analytical chemist, Government of Maharashtra at the Agricultural School.
- 3) There are Arts, Commerce and Science Colleges at Dhulia, Nandurbar, Shirpur, Dondicha and Shahada in this district.
- 4) Rajawade Research Centre at Dhulia is famous as a his-torical research centre in Maharashtra. There is a small museum in the Rajawade Research Institute. The Samarth Vagdevata Mandir at Dhulia is also another famous Research Centre dedicated for Shri Ramadas and his literatgure. All the manus-cripts of Shri Ramdas and his works are kept here. The famous 'Dasbodh' which is read in every Marathi family was first edited at the Vagdevata Mandir, Dhulia.

5) There is one spinning and weaving mill in Dhulia. One Co-operative Sugar Factory is set up in Sakri Tahsil. Another one is being set up in Shahada tahsil at Lonkheda.

6) Dhulia is famous for its handloom and powerloom fabrics. There are more than 1,200 units of power looms and handlooms, and thousands of persons are employed in the industry.

7) Dhulia, Shahada, Shirpur, and Taloda are famous for manufacture of bullock-Carts.

8) Toranmal in Akrani Tahsil is developed as a holiday camp.

9) Prakasha - Prakasha in Shahada Tahasil. A religious Centre in this district, is beleived to be holy as Benaras, and is called 'Dakshina Kashi'.

10) Karward and Malangaon Kanholi and Panzara are the four medium irrigation projects in this district. Karaward Project contemplates to irrigate 4,536 hectares of land from Shirpur tahsil. The Malangaon R. Project will irrigate 1,500 hectares in Sakri tahsil. These two projects are about completion Kanholi and Panzara Projects are in progress during 1969-70.

1.11 - Languages - Marathi is the principal language of the district, and is spoken by 59.3 percent of the population. Bhils has the second largest number of speakers viz. 27.7 percent of population. Urdu, Gujarathi, and Hindi together account of 27.22 percent of the population. The district is located on the boundary of Gujarath, and Madhya Pradesh. Hence the percentage of Gujarathi and Hindi speakers is some what higher than neighbouring district of Jalgaon, where the corresponding percentage is 6.86.



Explanatory note on scope and limitations of statistics presented in Statistical Abstract.

### 2.1 Purpose -

The purpose of preparing this abstract is to present background of Statistical material on as many topics as possible so that the Abstract may be useful as a reference book of the district. In this abstract exhaustive statistics about important socio economic indicators of the economy have been presented. This is the combined abstract for the year 1968-69 and 1969-70. As far as possible talukwise information is furnished. The tahsilwise information is enable to compare the indicators of development between different tahsils of Dhulia district. In most of the tables the data for the year 1968-69, and 1969-70 have been given. In case of few tables the data for this year is not available the data for the latest available year have been furnished for the sake of comparison, similar data for one of the earlier years have also been given.

The statistical material presented here is mainly collected from various Offices of State Government, Government of India, Local Bodies and other agencies. When ever finalised figures are not forthcoming, previsual figures are incorporated with appropriate remarks. The foot nots showing the sources from which the material has been obtained has been indicated at the end of each table.

### 2.2 - District at a glance -

In this table some general particulars as well as district indicators under various heads like population, agriculture etc. are presented to bring forth the salient features of this district. Along with the figures for this district, corresponding figures relating to Bombay Division have also been given. Almost all items covered

are taken from the different tables in this abstract.

A rough sketch of map of this district with tahsil places and tahsil boundaries is given for ready reference.

### 2.3 - Climate and Rainfall -

The table No.1 presents monthwise information regarding rainy days and total rainfall at 10 tahsil places. All these rainfall stations are at taluka Head quarters. The data is presented for 1968 and 1969. "Normal Rainfall" recorded for each centre is the average rainfall over long period.

The table No.2 gives monthly Mean Maximum, Mean Minimum and the average of mean maximum, mean minimum temperature. The data is represented for the years 1968 and 1969. Nandurbar is only one temperature recording centre in Dhulia district.

### 2.4 - Area and Population -

The data of 1951 and 1961 population census are presented in tables (3) to (8). The District Census Hand Book 1961 of Dhulia district has been used for preparing these tables. The various concepts and definitions adopted at the census time concerning <sup>village</sup> "village", Town, workers, household, etc. have been clarified in details in these publications.

Table No.3 gives tahsil-wise Rural and Urban population according to 1961 census and percentage variation over 1951 census. The density of population for all tahsils is also given for both Rural and urban areas.

Table No.4 gives tahsilwise classification of villages according to population ranges.

Table No.5 gives talukewise classification of towns according to population ranges.

Table No.6 shows number of workers and non-workers in Rural, Urban and total area in each tahsil according to 1961 census.

Table No.7 shows the distribution of population according to age group, Mother tongue and religion for Urban and rural areas of the district.

Table No.8 - This table gives number of scheduled caste and scheduled tribes in each tahsil according to 1961 census. The information is given for males and females in Rural and Urban areas in each tahsil.

#### 2.5 - Agriculture -

The tables 5 to 19 on agriculture included in this section give information on land utilisation, area and production under principal crops, area irrigated by crops and by sources, minor irrigation works, Major and medium irrigation projects, agricultural wages, agricultural implements. The data regarding famine, scarcity have also been given. The major part of data on agriculture has been collected from the season and crop reports, and the statistician Department of Agriculture Poon.

Table No.9 gives utilisation of land according to standard heads of utilisation for the years 1967-68, 1968-69 in hectares.

Table No.10 gives figures of areas under different crops.

Table No.11 presents figures of the out turn and average yield per hectare of principal crops, in Dhulia District for the year 1967-68 and 1968-69. The production of cotton is in terms of bales whereas that of sugarcane is in terms of gur.

Table No.12 gives area irrigated by different sources in each tahsil for 1967-68 and 1968-69. The figures are provisional.

Table No.13 indicates provisional figures of area irrigated under different crops in each tahsil for the years 1967-68 and 1968-69.

Table No.14 - shows the No.of irrigation wells in each tahsil in the district during the years 1967-68 and 1968-69. The No.of wells not in use area separately shown.

Table No.15 and 16 give Minor Irrigation works excluding wells and Major and Medium irrigation projects in Dhulia District as on 30-6-769.

Table No.17 gives thre data of agricultural wagherages. There are 3 centres viz. i) Thalner, ii) Ranala, iii) Songir, from which the data is collected.

Table No.18 indicates agricultural implements in each district as enumerated at the time of 1966 Livestock Census.

Table No.19 furnishes the data on famine and scarcity conditions in Dhulia District.

#### 2.6 - Animal Husbandary -

Table No.20 presents talukwise data relating to different categories of livestock, poultry etc. enumerated at the time of Quinquennial Livestock Census 1966. Table No.21 gives information regarding developmental activities of Department of Animal Husbandary in Dhulia district, and details about veterinary aid supplied. Disease wise livestock mortality in Dhulia District has been given in table 23, while table 24, gives information relating to recognised Slaughter Houses and No. of animals slaughtered in them.

2.7 - Forests -

Table No.24(A) and 24(B) included in this section give details of area under different types of forests and estimates of forest produce both in charge of forest department and Revenue department, They are shown separately.

2.8 - Industries and Employment -

The factory statistics shown in tables 25,26 and 27 covers factories registered under factory act of 1948.

Table No.25 presents for each industry, the total number of working factories, the number of mandays for which they worked during the year and the average daily employment. The data presented in Col. 7 to 10 of this table relate only to the factories submitting the returns. The industries are classified as per standard Industrial Classification.

Table No.26 gives industrywise distribution of working factories according to working strength.

Table No.27 gives the picture of distribution of factories for each industry by No.of days worked during the year.

It may be noted that the number of workers shown in these 3 tables are the average number of workers on the register of factories.

The table No.28 and 29 give usual employment exchange statistics. The table No.30 indicates changes in volume of employment in different industries as on 31st March 69 and 70.

2.9 - Electricity -

In all two tables are included in this section. Table No.33 gives statistics relating to electricity generated purchased and electricity consumed for various purposes. Table No.34 gives towns and villages electrified and population covered there in according to 1961 Census.

2.10 - Co-operation -

In all 7 tables are included in this section under which statistics relating to various activities of co-operative movement are shown, Table No.35 gives figures of different types of Co-operative societies working in Daulia district. In next 5 tables important information pertaining to different types of Co-operative institutions and details about their operations are presented. Table No.42 gives data relating to No.of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them.

2.11 - Medical and Public Health -

Table No.43 gives particulars of medical facilities available through Public and Public aided bodies. The taluka-wise classification of patients is also furnished in this table.

Table No.44 and 45 give details about vital statistics. The information about vaccination statistics, cholera inoculations is given in table No.46.

2.12 Education -

In this section 7 tables are included. Table No.47 indicates literacy in each tahsil according to <sup>1961</sup> census. Percentage of literacy have been shown separately for both the sexes as well as for rural and urban areas. As the literate is defined as a person who reads and writes simple letters, persons having higher education are also included in this category. The distribution of literates according to educational levels have been given separately. For rural and urban areas have been furnished in table Nos. 48, and 49. Table No.50 indicator No.of institutions typewise and enrolment and teachers therein. The information is given district as a whole. The data pertaining to beneficiaries and

educational concessions to Backward Classes have been shown in table 51, while similar data relating to concessions of free education to economically backward class have been furnished in table No. 52. The figures of expenditure incurred by Government of Maharashtra state in Dhulia district by way of grant in aids of local bodies have been presented in table No.53. Table No.54 furnishes the data on classification of towns and villages without primary schooling facilities by population ranges.

### 2.13 Transport and Communications -

The statistics relating to different modes of transport are given in this section the table No. 55 gives length of railway route according to different types of rail guages in Dhulia district. The road length of extra municipal roads in Dhulia district as at the end of 31-3-61, 31-3-69 and 1970 has been shown in table No.56. The road length according to different categories and surface classification is also given in this table. Table No.57 gives relevant statistics regarding number of motor vehicles in operation in Dhulia district. The next table gives, operational statistics of Nationalised road transport in Dhulia district. The details of traffic census conducted in May 1968 in respect of roads in Maharashtra State have been furnished in table No.59. The usual postal statistics have been presented in table No.60. The table No.61 presents statistics pertaining to rural broad casting.

### 2.14 - Local bodies -

This section deals with the expenditure and Income of local bodies such as village panchayats ii) Zilla Parishad, and iii) Municipalities, 4 tables are included in this section.

### 2.15 - Plan and Community Development -

In table No.66 and 67 the expenditure and physical achievements of the district level schemes implemented at district level in the state and local sectors have been taken into account.

Table No.68, 69 and 70 relate to position of C.D. programme, expenditure and physical achievements in all types of C.D. and T.D. Blocks.

Table No.71 deals with the average retail prices of important commodities prevailing at the district head quarters. These prices are collected by the District Statistical Office. The consumer price Index number for working class are presented for Jalgaon centre. No centre from this district has been selected for calculation of the index number.

Indicator No.1 -

Percentage of Gross sown area to net sown area for the years 1961-62, 1966-67, 1967-68, and 1968-69.

The percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area indicates the extent of double cropped area in a particular year. The double cropped area is mainly due to availability of irrigation facilities.

It is observed from the table that the percentage of gross cropped area to the net cropped area is increasing steadily.

It is observed that during the years 1967-68 and 1968-69 the percentages of gross cropped area to net cropped area were highest in Shahada tahsil being 116.8, 119.1 % respectively, while the minimum was found in Akrani tahsil. Thus the ranges of variation come 100.1 to 116.8 and 100.0 to 119.1 respectively.

The comparison of data in 1967-68 with those in 1968-69 indicates that there was an increase of percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area in all tahsils except Akrani, in Akrani there is very little scope for double cropped area due to hilly tract.

The average yield per hectare in Dhulia district in respect of i) Bajara, ii) Rabbi Jawar, iii) Wheat, iv) Gram and Tur is more than average yield of state.

From the above table it is clear that production of Jawar is maximum in Dhulia district. The climate and Soil of Dhulia district, is suitable for the growth of Jawar. The minimum production is that of rice. The climate and soil of Sakri, Nawapur and Taloda tahsils are only suitable for the growth of rice. In other tahsils due to above reason rice is not grow on large scale.

Now a days due to irrigation facilities the area and production under sugarcane and Cotton is increasing.

The soil of Shahada, Nandurbar, Taloda and Shirpur is very fertile and very suitable for cotton. So there is every likelihood that the production of cotton will be increased.

From the above table it is clear that there is increasing trend in the percentage of net irrigated cropped area to net area sown of district Dhulia.

The percentage of irrigated area increased in all tahsils except Akrani, Nawapur and Sakri during 1966-67 as compared to 1961-62.

Similarly the percentage of irrigated area is increased in all tahsils during 1968-69 as compared to 1967-68 except i) Akkalkuwa, ii) Shahada, and iii) Nawapur. There is very slight decrease in the percentage of irrigated area referred to above tahsils.

Indicator No.6-

Increase in agricultural credit, out standing dues, and arrears.

This indicator furnishes the increase in agricultural credit out standing dues and arrears.

The bulk of population in the district depends on agriculture, and it is but natural that the large number of Co-operative Societies provided all types of facilities needed by agriculturist to improve their financial condition and production.

During the year 1966-67 there were 1338 agricultural and other agriculture credit societies. At the end of June 1970 there were

1338 agricultural and other agriculture credit societies. At the end of June 70 there were 1518 agricultural and other agriculture credit societies. There is large increase in other agricultural credit societies. The membership of agriculture credit societies is also increased from 92,612 to 1,06,039.

From table No.17 of the abstract it is observed that average wage-rates of male and female of unskilled labourers are increasing every year. The average wage-rates of unskilled male worker at Dhanora, Songir, and Thalner centres in this district for Male for the year 1969 is Rs.2.16, Rs.2.50 and Rs.2.00 respectively. The average wage-rates of Songir centre was highest as compare to the remaining two centres. During the year 1968 the average rates of these centres were Rs.1.91, Rs.2.50 and Rs.1.91 respectively.

Indicator No.8 -

Livestock per hectare of land -

This Indicator gives the position of livestock per hectare of land in Dhulia district as per 1961 census and 1966 census.

In an agricultural country like India the importance of working cattle ~~an~~ can scarcely be exaggerated. The livestock have an important bearing on the total out put of agricultural production. As agricultur

is a non-mechanised industry in India the cattle supply is the most important motive power for almost all agricultural operations such as ploughing, lifting of water and transport of produce from one place to another.

The number of working bullocks in the district rose from 2.59 lakhs in 1961 to 2.62 lakhs in 1966 census. The cultivable area of the district as a whole comes to 5.91 hectares per pair of working

bullocks. The cultivable area per pair of bullocks is found to be maximum in Sakri taluka, whereas the lowest is in Akrani taluka. The cultivable area per pair of bullocks is varying between 2.44 to 8.00 hectares. As against total cultivable area 7.15 lakhs hectares the total bovine and ovine population in 1966 was <sup>9.35</sup> lakhs. The bovine and ovine population per 100 hectares of cultivable land works out to 120.

Indicator No.9 -

Poultry as compared to population

This indicator denotes the position of poultry as compared to population in Dhulia district.

During third plan period special programme for poultry development consisting of training for poultry breeding and supply of improved poultry and loans for poultry keeping was chalked out and implemented. As per the Census of 1966 total number of poultry in Dhulia district was 3.10 lakhs as against 3.14 lakhs during the year 1961. This indicates <sup>decrease</sup> of 0.04 lakhs over the period of 5 years.

The number of primary schools in Dhulia district rose from 1223 in 1960-61 to 1621 in 1968-69. There is slight decrease in primary schools during the year 1968-69 as compare to 1967-68. The strength of pupils, teachers is increasing every year. The number of pupils increased by 25.5% in the year 1968-69 over 1960-61.



The number of secondary institutions in the Dhulia district increased from 53 to 123 in the year 1968-69, and the number of students attending these institutions are also increased tremendously by 133 percent in the year 1968-69 as compared to 1960-61.

As regards higher education the number of institutions, students and teachers are increased as compare to 1960-61 with 1968-69.

As regards special schools there is decrease in institutions students and teachers.

Indicator No.14 -

Increase in road length per thousand Sq.K.M.

Banking facilities are very essential for development and progress of Industry and agriculture. In the year 1961 there were 10 scheduled banks in the district. As the end of March 1969, there were 17 scheduled banks.

The District Central Co-operative Bank plays the important role for providing basic banking facilities to the agriculturists in rural areas. There were 42 branches of Co-operative banks in the district in the year 69 while there were only 26 branches in the year 1961. As such during the period of 8 years 17 new branches are opened.

The district population as per 1961 census was 13,51,236 and the number of branches functioning at the end of the year 1969 is 60. As such the average population served by one branch comes to 22,520, which was during 1961 was 37,534.

Indicator No.16 -

Prices - The trends in prices prevailing at district Head quarters Dhulia during the years 1968, 1969 have been discussed in this indicator.

It is to be noted from this table that prices during 1962, 1966, 1967 and 1968 can not be compared mainly because changes in every varieties. But in general the prices of clothing are increasing/year as compared to previous years.

CHAPTER IVANNUAL PLANS 1968-69 and 1969-70

The process of economic planning was under taken for periods of five years, upto March 1966. The uncertainties, in financial resources towards the end of third five year plan made it necessary for Government to take up planning on annual basis, pending the finalisation of the fourth five year plan. At that time the general idea was that these annual plans will form parts of the Fourth Five Year Plan 1966-71. However subsequently, the National Development Council decided that the fourth five year plan should commence from April 1969 and that the three intervening years v.z. 1966-67, 1967-68, and 1968-69 should be considered as Annual plans. As it was expected that the preparation of fourth five year plan, 1969-74 will be over by end of March 1970, the schemes to be implemented in 1969-70, were included in Annual Plan for 1969-70, which keeps in view the broad policies and programmes contemplated for the fourth plan.

At state level, the anticipated expenditure on Annual Plan 1967-68, was Rs.122.07 lakhs, as compared to this, the approved out lay for 1968-69, was Rs.153.49 lakhs, and for 1969-70, it was Rs.114.00 lakhs. The comparative smaller out lay for 1969-70, was exclusive of provision of Rs.12.10 lakhs for centrally sponsored schemes. The present chapter deals with district level schemes, implemented in 1968-69, and 1969-70.

Total expenditure on district level schemes was Rs.340.96 lakhs, in 1968-69, and Rs.151.00 lakhs in 1969-70. These figures do not include the expenditure on centrally sponsored schemes viz.

Rs.0.61 lakhs in 1968-69 and Rs.26.78 lakhs in 1969-70. Out of the total expenditure of Rs.340.76 lakhs incurred in 1968-69, the state sector accounted for Rs.263.52 lakhs i.e.77.3 percent, and the remaining 22.7 percent of expenditure was incurred on schemes implemented in Local Sector for the year 1969-70. These <sup>percentage</sup> ~~percentage~~ were 69.6 in state sector and 30.4 in local sector. The comparatively smaller amount of expenditure in 1969-70, was mainly due to the lower expenditure under the heads 'Irrigation and Power', 'Agricultural Programmes' and 'Social Services'. The programme of Rural Electrification, particularly that of energizing agricultural pumps was supplemented by funds from Agricultural Finance corporation, Agricultural Refinance corporation and from the deposits scheme of the Maharashtra State Electricity Board. Hence the state Government's outlay on the head 'Rural Electrification was lower, than the previous year. The reason for lower expenditure in 1969-70 on Agricultural programmes, was that the scheme of intensive Cattle Development Project which was implemented <sup>upto</sup> ~~upto~~ 1968-69 as a Plan Scheme, was treated as Non-Plan in 1969-70. The following statements gives the break up of total expenditure into different heads -

It will be seen that total expenditure on district level schemes in 1969-70, was much less than the corresponding figure of 1968-69. The main reason of this decline are given below :-

Under the scheme of Intensive cultivation of food crops, the expenditure incurred was Rs.2.17 lakhs in 1968-69 and Rs.0.15 lakhs in 1969-70. The subsidy scheme for construction of New Irrigation wells was implemented by spending Rs.3.10 lakhs in 1969-70, as compared to Rs.5.39 lakhs in the previous year. Similarly, under the scheme of subsidy for installation of Pump Sets, the expenditure incurred was Rs.10.02 lakhs in 1968-69, and Rs.3.98 lakhs in 1969-70. The expenditure on the scheme of contour bunding was Rs.40.25, lakhs in 1968-69 and Rs.37.15 lakhs in 1969-70. The scheme of Intensive Cattle Development Project, on which an amount of Rs.9.85 lakhs was spent in 1968-69, was treated as a non-plan scheme from 1-4-69. The expenditure on Government Milk scheme was Rs.7.19 lakhs in 1969-70 as compared to Rs.17.20 lakhs in 1968-69. The scheme of Rural Electrification was implemented in 1968-69 by spending Rs.123.00 lakhs, but in the next year, the expenditure incurred was Rs.6.02 lakhs only as the electricity Board received the finance of Rs.125 lakhs for its scheme under A.F.C. Scheme, during 1969-70. The expenditure on community Development Scheme was Rs.6.78, lakhs in 1968-69 only, Rs.3.92 lakhs in 1969-70. The expenditure on the scheme of Minor Irrigation works was Rs.15.50 lakhs in Local Sector and Rs.2.18 lakhs in state sector in 1968-69, in the next year, the corresponding figures <sup>were</sup> Rs.17.50 lakhs and Rs.12.29 lakhs respectively. It will thus be seen that lower level of expenditure during 1969-70 was due to less expenditure under almost all major heads. The physical achievements of some important schemes, under various heads are given below.

A-Agricultural Programme -

Under the scheme of Intensive crop cultivations of food crops, the area covered was as follows -

Under the scheme of Horticulture Development new plantation taken up was 260 <sup>acres</sup> areas in 1968-69, and 272 acres in 1969-70. Special Kharif and Rabi campaign was taken up to benefit 890 acres of Ragi in 1968-69 and 144 acres of maize in 1969-70. The scheme of Oil seed Development was implemented in 1968-69 and area brought under improved varieties of groundnut was 35,927 acres. The scheme of consolidation of land holdings has benefitted on area of 32,680 acres belonging to 4,724 holders in 1968-69. The scheme of subsidy for new irrigation wells was implemented to benefit 11,124 wells in 1968-69 and 1,320 wells in 1969-70. Similar scheme of installation of pumps sets was implemented and subsidy was given for 1,715 pump sets in 1968-69 and 1200 pumps sets in 1969-70. Under the scheme of Minor Irrigation works implemented in local sector 4 percolation tanks were completed in 1968-69, and 3 tanks in 1969-70, while the work of 4



lift irrigation schemes and 2 bandharas ~~was in progress during~~ both the years, the same scheme was also implemented in state sector, and the tank at Jamphal (Sindkheda Tahsil) was completed in 1967-68, and area irrigated was 254 acres in 1967-68, 1050 acres in 1968-69, 1,000 acres in 1969-70. The capacity of tank at Shanmandal (Nandurbar Tahsil) was increased by diversion of Asarbari naha, the work of tanks at Thanepada (Nandurbar Tahsil), Kuliathe (Dhulia Tahsil), and Dudukhede (Shahada Tahsil) was in progress. The estimated for tank at Hatti (Sakri Tahsil) were required to be revised, as the tenders called thrice, were at higher rates than the original estimates. The work of tank at Chhawadi (Sakri Tahsil) was deserted by the contractor in September 1969, and hence was at a stand still. Another tank, at Kothare in Dhulia tahsil with an estimated cost of Rs. <sup>16.88</sup> 1.58 lakhs will be taken up after technical approval. The work of two bandharas viz. Walkheda (Sindkheda) and Dhanarat (Nawapur Tahsil) was also delayed due to desertion by contractors. The work of contour bunding was done in 57,060 acres in 1968-69 and 45,432 acres in 1969-70.

The Government Milk Scheme, Dhulia, was put into operation from August 1962. In April 1968, some modern machinery was fixed in the Government dairy to handle about 75,000 litres of milk daily. However with a view to meet the requirement of handling about 1 lakh litre of milk per day, the Government has taken up a project costing Rs.100 lakhs of which Rs.45 lakhs will be aid from <sup>Newzeland</sup> ~~Foreign~~ Government. The work of building for the dairy was in progress. The Co-operative department gives financial Assistance to the extent of Rs.1.20 lakhs in 1968-69, and Rs.1.20 lakhs, in 1969-70, as subsidy to dairy societies.

The scheme of Intensive Cattle Development Project was implemented as a plan scheme upto 1968-69. For improving the cattle breed, the project undertook the work of artificial insemination through 60 A.I. subcentres which were spread over the four tahsils (Viz. Shirpur, Shahada, Dhulia and Chalisgaon). A modern laboratory is set up at the centres semen collection centres at Dhulia, which serves 51 sub-centres. From January 1969, semen of 'Jersey' breed of cattle is being obtained from Poona. Also in February 1969, frozen semen imported from Australia was used for 30 Cows. Besides the insemination programme, the project arranges for distribution of mixed cattle feed prepared in the unit set up at Dhulia. The sale of mixed cattle feed is at no profit no loss basis, and the per animal/price to the cultivators is about Rs.4/- to Rs.5/- less than the price of comparative cattle feed available in markets. The project also has schemes for (a) fodder demonstration (b) subsidy for fodder cutters, (c) subsidy of silo pits, (d) subsidy for fodder development, and (e) supply of milch cattle to farmers by way of extending loans.

#### B) Co-operation and Community Development-

The construction of drinking water wells was taken up by the Zilla Parishad, Dhulia, and 130 wells were completed in 1968-69, and 211 wells were completed during 1969-70, similarly, 9 piped water schemes were completed by March-1970. In state sector, the work of water supply schemes at Lamkani, Akkalkuwa, Prakasha, and Sindkheda, in Rural areas was in progress at the end of March-70.

Out of Municipal area the ~~water supply schemes of Shahada, Dondaicha,~~ and Shirpur, were in progress during 1969-70. The scheme of Applied Nutrition Programme was sanctioned for Dhulia Block from 1965-66, for Nawapur Block from 1968-69, and for Taloda Block from 1969-70. For Dhulia and Nawapur Blocks, it is operated in 10 villages each, while in Taloda Block only 5 villages, are selected for implementation of the scheme.

The most important scheme implemented in Co-operative sector, was sanctioning of Government share capital contribution of Rs.5 <sup>the</sup> lakhs to ~~be~~ corporative sugar factory in Sakri, Tahsils which was sanctioned during 1969-70. Similar Government share capital contribution of Rs.1.00 lakh was granted to the whole-sale corporative, consumer store.

#### C) Irrigation and Power -

Under the scheme of Rural Electrification, 165 villages were electrified and 2,000 pumps were connected during 1968-69, by spending an amount of Rs.122.00 lakhs, during 1969-70, 11 new villages were electrified and 364 pumps were connected under the plan scheme of 'Rural Electrification, besides this, the Maharashtra State Electrification Board, received financial Assistance of Rs.125 lakhs, out of which Rs.77.19 lakhs were spent to electrify 12 villages and connected 2181 pumps during the same year.

#### D) Transport and Communication -

Under the scheme of District Roads the construction of bridges on Amaraoti and Bhogawati Rivers was in progress, at the end of 1969-70, the work of 8 C.D. works on Songir, Dondaicha, road was completed during 1968-69, under the scheme of Roads of Economic Importance (Dairy Roads) the work of Mukti, Shirud Road, with a total length of 15 Kms. was taken up, and the work of 3 Kms. of road length was completed by end of March 1970, -

under the scheme of roads in Hilly and Inaccessible Areas, the work of Dhadgaon-Kathi road (16 Km.) was completed, while the construction of Akkalkuwa-Kathi Road, Taloda-Dhadgaon Road, and Nandurbar-Dhanora Road, was in progress under the scheme of Rural Roads, new construction of 24.5 Kms. and improvement of 56.30 Kms. of roads was completed, and work of 19 C.D. works was completed during 1969-70. All the above mentioned schemes were implemented in the Local Sector. In the state sector, the work of Akkalkuwa-Salbara Road was taken up under the scheme 'Roads in Hilly and inaccessible Area' and the same was nearly completed by end of March 1970.

**B) Social Services -**

Under the scheme of Normal Expansion of Primary Schools, 81 New teachers in 1968-69, and 97 New teachers in 1969-70, were sanctioned. The scheme of assistance to secondary schools was implemented to benefit 35 schools in 1968-69 and 9 schools in 1969-70.

The scheme for construction of quarters for Nurses under training, was taken up in 1969-70, and the work of 100 quarters was in progress. Also the work of construction of building for T.B. Clinic was in progress at the end of March 1970. During 1968-69, the work of building for cottage Hospital, Taloda was completed. Under the family planning scheme, the achievement was 12,292 operations and 87 loop cases during 1968-69, and 5,554 operations and 83 loop cases during 1969-70. Under the scheme of Tribal Development blocks, the expenditure incurred was Rs.17.22 lakhs, in 1968-69, and Rs.16.34 lakhs in 1969-70. This scheme was implemented in 12 T.D. Blocks, and Multipurpose Development Block.
