C H A P T E R (I)

I N T R O D U C T I O N

1.1 Location:-

Area of Sholapur district lies between latitudes 17 degree to 19 degree and longitudes 75 degrees to 77 degrees on the South East Border of Maharashtra. It comprises an area of 15057 sq.K.m. lying in the centre of a large plain 1800 feet above mean Sea level. It is surrounded by Mysore State on the South East by Sangli dist. and Mysore State on the South by Satara district on the West by Poona and Ahmednagar districts, on the North-West and by Osmanabad district on the North.

1.2 Topography.

1(1) Soils:-

The soil in the district can be classified in to three kinds Black , Coarse-gray and reddish. Black soil is mainly confirmed to the Banks of rivers & large streams. The soils of Uplands are shallow and more suitable for sheep grazing than cultivation. The soil is generally light and of moderate depth in North Sholapur Taluka. Deep Black soil of richer quality is however predominant between Sina & Bhima Rivers. In Pandharpur Taluka the soils is generally poor and capable of producing mostly Jowar, Bajri, & Kardi So also the soil of Sangola taluka is for the most part poor and shallow.

Barshi taluka has the best soil in the district. In this taluka the soil is generally black and fertile. The soil of Malsiras taluka is in general shallow and light

in colour and not retentive of moisture.

Large portion of Madha taluka has generally shallow soil with varying depth and quality soils in the villages along the bank of the Sina are mostly black and of great depth and excellent quality. In Akkalkot taluka the soil is rich in the vicinity of the Rivers Bhima and Sina.

In Karmala taluka about one half of the soil is black and one quarter each red and barad. There is also a small quantity of alluvial land in this dist. which is chiefly found along the banks of the Phima river.

(2) Rivers:

The principal rivers of the district are Bhima and its tributaries the Man, The Nira and the Sina of which Bhima Nira and Sina flow toward south east while the Man runs towards the North East for about 80 K.M. within the limit of the district.

The Bhima rises in the Sahyadries at Bhim-Shankar in khed taluka of Poona district. Within the district it flows south east through the Central Part comprising Karmala, Madha, Pandharpur, South Sholapur & Mangalwedha talukas. The length of the Bhima within the limit of the district is 289 K.M.

The greater part of Malsiras taluka is drained by the river Nira which is the right bank feeder of the Bhima. Sangola, Part of Pandharpur, and Mangalwedha talukas are drained by the Man river another tributary of Bhima.

.3.

The eastern talukas of Barshi and North Sholapur and parts of Kormala, Madha and South Sholapur talukas are drained by Sina River. Part of Barshi and Madha talukas lie in the Basin of Bhogavati river, a Tributary of Sina river. Thus the water courses of the tributaries in the district may be reckoned at about 650 K.m.

(3) Hill-ranges:-

There is no important hill-system in the district. Except in the North -east of Barshi, West of Madha, and South -west of Malsiras and Karmala. talukas where the tract is hilly. The district has a generally flat or undulating terrain.

The low Table Land and small separate hills in Karmala and Madha taluka act as the water shed between Bhima river and Sina river.

1.3 Climate:-

The climate is healthy and agreeable except from March to May. Climatically there are three seasons in the district viz. Summer from the beginning of March to the middle of June, The rainy season from the middle of June to middle of October and the Winter from the middle of October to the end of February. There are very little variations in the climate in different parts of the district. The climate is dry and hot in the parts except that portion of Barshi taluka which lies above the Ghats where it is somewhat cooler than in the rest of the district.

The air is generally bright clear and bracing. The hot season is marked by a dry scorching heat, strong hot winds and occassional dust storms, Nights are however generally cool. The rainy months are pleasant.

(1) Rainfall:-

Rainfall all over the district is uncertain and scanty with an annual average of 577.1 m.m. The district gets rain from South west as well as from North east monsoons. Through out the district the rain starts in June and continues upto October. The precipitation during June to August is rather precarious and of small magnitude. The showers in Sept. and October are heavy and more assured.

The following table gives the rain fall Statistics under each taluka of the district for the year 1968 & 1969.

It is observed from the above table that the rainfall in the year 1969 was much better in the district than in the year 1963.

During the year 1969 the average rainfall recorded in the district was 714.8 which was above normal. However the rainfall recorded during this period in the centre of Sholapur, Madha and Malsiras was below normal. The above table also indicates that the range of variations in Madha and Mohol taluka is very wide the rain fall being 579.6 in Madha taluka and 873.8 in Mohol taluka.

As started earlier the rainy seasons lasts from June to October. From the rainfall point of view there are four seasons in the district as in other districts of Maharashtra, viz. the pre-monsoon from the beginning of April to end of May, the Monsoon from the beginning of June to end of September, the post monsoon from the beginning of October to end of November and the Winter from the beginning of December to end of March.

In this district the rain is brought about by two currents viz. the South West Monsoon and the North East Monsoon. The South West Monsoon current brings between June and October about 74 percent of the total annual rainfall. Thus the main precipitation all over the district is in the monsoon period i.e. June, to September. Winter rains brought about by the North East Monsoon are of small magnitude. The normal rainfall for the monsoon period i.e. June to September is 410.9 m.m. which is 73.7 percent of the Annual normal rainfall. It is seen from table No.R.1.2 below that the actual rainfall recorded under this period during the year 1969 was 618.6 which was above normal. By about October the force of South West monsoon decreases and a series of storms in the Bay of Bengal set in which provide rabi rain in this district.

The normal rainfall for the post monsoon period i.e. October to November is 19.0 m.m. which is 17.8 percent of the annual normal rainfall. The actual rainfall recorded during the period 1969 was 64.5 m.m. which was below normal and so also the percentage of actual rainfall was comparatively lower than that of the percentage of normal rainfall.

The Winter season which is comparatively dry and rainless starts from December and ends in March. The normal rainfall during winter period is 18.5 m.m. which is 3.3 percent of the annual normal rainfall. The table No.R.1.2 gives the intensity & deviation of actual rainfall from normal rainfall during the

different period of Agricultural year of 1969 in this district.

2. Temperature:-

The temperature is generally mild and even

Except the hot months of March, April and May the climate is free from extremes of heat or cold. Bitter cold is almost unknown. The average temperature of the district was 26.9 degree centigrade in the year 1969. During the year the temperature was lowest in Dec. & highest in April. The mean minimum & mean maximum being 14.4 centigrade & 40.1°centigrade.

3. Humidity:-

According to Maharashtra Irrigation Commission report of 1961 the humidity is high during rainy season in this district. The summer temperatures are high and winter temperature are low. In general the humidity is less in this district as compared to other districts of Poona division with a high altitude and situated not too far away from sea.

1.4 Natural Zones:-

The district can broadly be divided in to three Natural Zones. The eastern Zone comprising Barshi, North Sholapur, South Sholapur and Akkalkot talukas has medium to deep black soils, some what assured rainfall and grows, Jowar, Bajri and pulses. It accounts for 32.86 percent of the total geographical area of the dist. The central Zone comprising Mohol, Mangalwadha, eastern part of Pandharpur and Madha talukas has uncertain rainfall, light to medium soil and grows Kharif and Rabi crops. The Western Zone comprises the scarcity areas of Karmala, Sangola and Malsiras taluka and Western part of Madha and Pandharpur talukas with light soil and uncertain rainfall. Mainly rabi crops are grown in Karmala, Pandharpur and Madha talukas & kharif crops such as Bajri and Groundnut in Sangola taluka. Large part of Malsiras taluka receives protection from scarcity due to irrigation provided by Nira Right Bank Canal & sugarcane is the major crop of that area.

1.5 Famine & Scarcity:-

Since the average annual precipitation is very low(577.1 m.m.) and subject to a large element of uncertainty this district is exposed to frequent scarcities and occasional famines.

However it is a redeeming feature that in the year 1969 there was no scarcity condition in this district.

1.6 Territorial changes in the district:-

The district of Sholapur was formed in the year 1869. The district was carved out from the districts of Ahmednagar Poona and Satara. Karmala was transferred from Ahmednagar, Mohol from Poona & Pandharpur, Malsiras and Sangola from Satara district. No major change took place until the annexation of former princely states in the year 1949. During that year & in the subsequent year this district underwent some changes by addition or deletion of some enclave villages from nearby districts. The present constitution of the district is unchanged since the year 1956.

1.7 District Administration:-

State Govt. administration for administrative purposes:

The district is at present divided into eleven talukas. The Collector is in charge of general Administration Law and Order, Treasury, Land Revenue & Civil Supplies. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector in his office & three Dy.

Collectors in his who hold charge of three Revenue Divisions viz. Sholapur, Moga and Pandharpur, and have their head quarters at Sholapur, Kardwali and Pandharpur. Eleven Thasildars are incharge of eleven taluka offices. The District and Session Judge is the head of the Judicial Dept. in the district having its assistants at district and Thasil levels. The Judiciary is entirely separate from the Executive. However, the Collector continues to be the district Magistrate and the Deputy Collectors and Thasildars are vested with limited magisterial powers.

The police force in the district functions under the district Superintendent of Police who is assisted by two Deputy Superintendents and two circle police Inspectors at Sholapur & Pandharpur. There are (21) Police Stations in the district.

In addition to these there are other officers representing various departments at district level like Divisional Soil Conservation officer, Malaria Officer, Employment Officer, Factory Inspector, Labour officer, Executive Engineer, B & C Dn., Executive Engineer, Irrigation Division and the district Deputy Registrar of Cooperative Societies, and Civil Surgeon etc. There are Govt. institutions of North Cote Poletechnical High School & the Poly technic.

Central Govt. Administration:-

Under central Govt. sector there are Divisional Offices of the Post & Telegraph Dept. and South Central Railway. There is also the office of the Superintendent Central Excise.

Zilla Parishad & Panchayat Samities:-

Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act 1962 One Zilla parishad and 11 panchayat Samities have been established in this district in the year 1962. The number of panchayat samities remained unchanged during the period under Review and the areas under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities correspond to the district & taluka Boundaries except in case of Municipal Towns which are not covered by them. Zilla Parishad covers 96.50 percent of the area and 72.05 percent of the total population of the district. The Zilla Parishad is headed by the elected president from among the elected councillors. The Chief executive officer carries out the administrative and executive work. He is assisted by various departmental heads who are officers belonging to class-I & class-II services of state Govt. The Block Development officer works as secretary to Panchayat Samiti.

Local Bodies Administration:-

As regards the administrative set up under local sectors, there is Municipal corporation in Sholapur. The Municipal Commissioner works as the Chief head of the Corporation. There are 9 Municipalities in the district under the Administrative control of the Chief officer of which Barchi & Pandharpur are city municipalities.

Public bodies Administration:-

The Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation has maintained an efficient and economic Road Transport services through out the district. The Divisional Controller functions as the executive Head of this undertaking in this district. There are six Depots under him each under the charge of Depot Manager. There is also Maharashtra State Electricity Board entrusted with the work of rural electrification programme. The Executive Engineer, M.S.E.B., works as the executive Head of this Board. There is also a branch office Maharashtra state Financial Corporation for providing credit facilities to small Scale industries.

1.8 Demography:-

(1) Census is the principal source of Demographic data in India as well as in Maharashtra. Sholapur district ranks third in population and 6th in area among the 26 districts of Maharashtra State.

(2) Density:-

According to 1961 census the density of Sholapur district is 124 persons per square Kilometer. The same for Poona division was 139 while for Maharashtra it was 128. Within the district it varies from 579 person per square kilometer in North Sholapur taluka to 78 persons per square kilometer in Mangalwedha taluka. The high density in Sholapur North and Barshi taluka is due to large urban centres like Sholapur city and Barshi town.

Sangola, Karmala and Mohol talukas are having very low density because of the light and rocky soil existing in those talukas.

(3) Literacy:-

According to 1961 census literacy in Sholapur district is lowest in Poona Division. It is 25 percent in this district where as the State and the Division average literacy is around 29. It is seen from the appended table that the highest literacy rates are concentrated in North Sholapur taluka. This is due to the vicinity of the district head quarter Sholapur city and availability of extensive of educational facilities. The highest rates are found in North Sholapur Barshi and the central portion of Pandharpur taluka. The lowest rates are found in Sangola, Mangalwedha Mohol and Akkalkot talukas.

(4) Livelihood classification:-

Of the total population of the district 44 percent is engaged in work. Remaining 56 percent is non-working or dependent population. The population of workers dependent on agriculture is very high i.e about 70 percent but it is slightly less than the division average. However the district has large proportion of workers engaged as agricultural labourers than the division average.

Proportion of workers in house hold industry and manufacturing, and manufacturing other than house hold industries are higher in the district than those for the division average. In manufacturing other than household industries the district has 7.0 percent of workers as compared to 5.2 for the division.

This district does not however have significant proportion in construction. The proportion in other services trade & commerce is also not significant.

There is a marked difference in the distribution pattern for non working among males & females. 34.6 percent out of male non workers are full time students while the corresponding proportion for females is 9.5 percent.

Scheduled Castes:-

The comparative position of the scheduled population in 1957 and 1961 in this district is as follows:-

It is evident from the above table that the proportion of scheduled castes has decreased from 15.36 percent in 1951 to 12.84 percent in 1961. It is due to conversion of a large number of persons from the erstwhile Hindu scheduled castes to Buddhism. The percentage of literacy to the total population

of scheduled castes in the district is 13 which is much behind than the general literacy percentage of the district.

Scheduled Tribes:

The total population of scheduled tribes is only 9089 or 0.49 percent of the total population of the district. The scheduled tribes population of the district has increased from 8923 in 1951 to 9089 in 1961.

Languages:-

Marathi is the principal language and the mother tongue of 71.5 percent of the population. Kanada has the second largest number of speakers. It forms 11.5 percent of the total population in the district. Urdu has the third largest number of speakers. It forms 8.8 percent of the total population of the district. The speakers of Banjara language are concentrated in rural areas. Hindi, Gujrathi, Tamil and Telegu speakers are mostly concentrated in urban areas.

C H A P T E R II-

Explanatory note on the source and limitation of the data presented in the statistical Abstract.

1. This is the tenth issue of the District Statistical Abstract brought out by this office since 1958-59. The purpose of this issue is to present material on various Topics so that the present Statistical/Abstract may be useful as a reference book for research Planning or further Socio Economic Studies of the district.

The information given in the abstract is mostly for two years of 1968-69 and 1969-70 or for calendar years 1968 and 1969. The reference years are 1967-68 and 1968-69 in case of some tables.

2.1. Climate and Temperature:

Table No.(1). This table shows monthly and annual rainfall and the number of rainy days for (12) selected stations in the district during the years 1968- and 1969. It is obtained from the Statistician Deptt. of Agril. M.S. Poona. Normal rainfall is the average rainfall over a long period. However for certain centres this average is not available.

Table No. (2)

This table presents the highest and the lowest temperatures recorded at two stations in the district viz. Sholapur and Jeur. Annual average are shown in the last column.

The data presented in this table is collected from
Regional Metrological Deptt. Govt. of India, Patna.

2.2 Area and Population:

The most salient features of Socio-Economic Statistics i.e. Area, Population Density and variations on one decade(1951-61) are presented in this section.

There are (6) tables (3 to 8) under this head. The data in those tables gives particulars of area and population of Sholapur district. The information has been taken from district Census Hand Book of 1961 and allied Census populations. The table(3) gives population variations(1951-61) in the dist. The talukwise classification of villages and towns as per population ranges are given in tables 4 & 5. Classification of working population(Defined as Economic classification) as per 1961 Census definition is provided in table No.6. The information in of non workers are also incorporated in this table. Table No.7 presents the information regarding distribution of population according to age group mother tongue and Religion. Table No.8 exhibits the information of schedules caste and scheduled tribes as defined in 1961.Census.

2.3 Agriculture:

There are (11) tables in this section (9 to 19). The data from 9 to 14 tables is obtained from the Annual Season and crop Report compiled by the District Inspector of Land Record, Sholapur. However the yield per hectare required for table No. (11) has been worked out in this office on the basis

of the out turn data obtained from the Statistician Deptt. of Agriculture. These tables show the utilisation of land and areas under various crops irrigated and unirrigated separately. Material is presented for the district as a whole and for each taluka separately for the years 1967-68 and 1968-69. The crops are classified into two main groups viz. Food crops and Non food crops. Food crops are further grouped by cereals and pulses and others. Non food crops are similarly shown under oil seeds and others. The forest area figures given in table No.11 are as compiled by the district Inspector of Land Record ^{figures} and these figures may not tally with the / " of Forest Deptt. as the latter set of figures exclude a large portion of area actually under Forest whereas in Agricultural Statistics Forest is classified according to its actual utilisation and it includes all areas actually under Forest whether State owned or private and classed or administered as Forest under any legal enactment dealing with the Forests. The data relating to tables No.s 15 and 16 has been obtained from the Executive Engineer Irrigation Divn. Sholapur and Zilla Parishad, Sholapur. Table No.15 presents the number of minor irrigation works and the area irrigated under these sources. The minor irrigation works are only in six talukas viz. Karmala Barshi, South Sholapur, Sangola, and Mangalwedha. There is no minor irrigation works in the remaining taluks of the district. The table No.16 gives the information about the medium irrigation projects in this district as on 30-6-1970. There are (3) Medium

projects in this district viz.ASHTI,Ekruk and Budhial. There is no major project in this district. The Dist. Statistical Office is collecting data on Agricultural wages from (3) centres in Sholapur district namely Mandrup,Modnimb and Vairag. The data for two years 1968 and 1969 is presented in table No. (1&) The data presented in table No.18 regarding Agril.Implements is abstracted from 10th Livestock Census 1966. The number of tractors is inclusive of those owned by the Govt. and those owned by private persons. The figures of carts shown in the table are in respect of carts used for agricultural purposes only. The material is presented for the district as whole and for each taluka separately. The table No.19 presents the data on Famine and Scarcity in this district for the year 1968-69 and 1969-70. The data is obtained from Collector Office Sholapur.

2.4 Animal Husbandry , Forest & Fisheries:

The section of Animal Husbandry contains 4 tables(20 to 23).Out of them table No.20 presents data on livestock in this district which is obtained from livestock Census of India 1966. Poultry in this table includes hens,Cocks,Chickens,Ducks, Drakes and ducklets. Table No.21 to 23 give veterinary statistics relating to aids to livestock incidences of attacks and deaths and slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in those houses.Slaughter houses include those six slaughter houses only which are recognised slaughter houses. Data in all these three tables is collected from Animal Husbandry Deptt. Z.P. Sholapur for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70.

Table No.s 24 A and B present Forest Statistics. The break up of the table as Reserved, Protected and unclassed and that under Revenue Deptt. and Forest Dept. is given. The area under Forest are classified according to legal Status in to Reserved Forests, Protected Forests and unclassed Forests. The legal Status refers to the classifications of Forests under the Indian Forest Act-XVI of 1927.

2.5 Employment Industry Mining and Electricity

In this fifth section there are (10) Tables (25 to 34) Data on Factory Statistics(by Type of Production) is given in table No.25 to 27).Data on employment table No.(28) is relating to activities of Sub-Regional Employment at Sholapur. The table No.29 shows break up of Registration by occupation. In Table No.30 volume of employment as on 31st March 1969 and 31st March 1970 is based on reports of 965 establishments covered by the sub-Regional Employment Exchange, Sholapur. Tables No.s 31 and 32 exhibite the information about census of Govt. Employees as on 1st July 1966.This data is obtained from the Bureau of Economics and Statistics Govt. of Maharashtra, Bombay .The data presented in these tables are restricted to class-I II, III and IV employees of State Govt. and does not cover any other category such as work charged personnel class-IV employees paid from contingencies daily rated workers part time workers or honorary workers .Particulars given in table No.34 and 35 are based on information supplied by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board and other private companies in the district as on 31-3-1961, 31-3-66, 31-3-64 and 31-3-1970.

There are (8, tables(36 to 43) under this section. These tables are compiled from the Annual Reports of Cooperative Institutions like Banks, Agril. credit and other societies. The data is obtained from the office of the district Deputy Registrar Cooperative Societies Sholapur.

Table No.36 relates to the information regarding sum number of different Types of Cooperative Societies working in Sholapur district in 1969-70. Table No.37 presents the information regarding the cooperative Banks. The information for the years 1968-69 & 1969-70 are presented in this table. The data pertaining to Agril. credit societies in each taluka of Sholapur district is displayed in table No. 38. The table giving information about number of societies membership, capital structure and loan advanced during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70, points out the development under cooperative sector. The term agril. credit societies includes thrift societies, Urban credit societies grain Banks and Multipurpose societies. Table No.39 relates to the activities of different types of Cooperative societies other than Agril. Table No.40 presents the activities of marketing societies. Table No.41 is designed to give the physical cooperative societies during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70. The information regarding commoditywise operation of regulated markets in all the talukas of Sholapur dist. are presented in table No.42. Position of business by Money lenders in the district is displayed in table No.43. The data relates to the year 1968-69 and 1969-70.

2.7 Medical and Public Health:-

There are (4) tables (44 to 47) o in this section. Table No.44 gives medical facilities available facilities through public and public aided bodies in each taluka of Sholapur district. The data is collected from State and local sectors covering the health institutions. The table covers all govt. institutions owned by Municipalities and local bodies and also private aided and unaided institutions.Under private institutions, charitable institutions or institutions maintained by private bodies are covered. Thus private clinics run by individuals are not included. The table No.45 gives information about the no.of births and deaths a registered in Sholapur district during the year 1968 and 1969.The table No.46 reveals the no.of deaths due to important causes in Sholapur district for the year 1968 and 1969. The information about vaccination and cholera inoculations for the year 1968 and 1969 are presented in table No.47.

2.8 Education:-

Out of eight tables (48 to 55) in this section first three tables relate to literacy and allied details rural and urban in the district as revealed from 1961 census. The material is presented for the district as a whole and for each talukas eparately with further break up of rural and urban.

The a table No.51 presents the no.of different types of educational institution in the district and the total no.of pupils(boys and girls)

and the teachers for each type for the years 1967-68 and 1968-69. The material is presented for the dist. as a whole and the data relates to the academic year ending June, The table No.(52) shows the no.of beneficiaries from among the backward class students with the break up of sch. of the Govt. schedule tribes and other backward classes. The information pertains to the year 1967-68 and 1968-69. The concession of the free education given to economically backward classes are displayed in table No.53. This information is obtained for govt. school from the Director of Education,M.S. Poona. The term economically backward class covered those families whose annual income is below 1500. Those State Govt. employees whose annual income is below 1800 are also included in this category. Every year the State Govt. is giving grants to Zilla Parishad, Municipalities to reiruburce some percentage of expenditure incurred by them on primary education. The table No.54 gives the information about actual amount of such grants to Zilla Parishad, Municipalities etc. The table No.55 shows the no.of villages with schools or without schools. The villages with a school are those which have at least a primary schools within them. Villages with schooling facilities include smaller villages(generally below 200 population) which can not be given independent school for economic reasons and are therefore attached for schooling facility to bigger villages or to urban areas within a walking distance of one Km. from them. The data relating to this table is obtained from the Zilla Parishad, Sholapur.

2.9 Transport and Communications:

There are (7) tables (56 to 62) in this section which present Statsitical information relating to various modes of transport. Table No.56 gives railway length in the district. This data has been obtained from the South Central Railway. The figures presented in this table are approximate since it is rather difficult to measure correctly the distance between the stations one of which is in this district and the other is in the other district. Table No.57 gives figures of Road length as at the end of the Financial year. The classification according to categories as National High ways State High Ways etc. and the classification according to surface as cements concretes, Black topped etc. is given in this table. The table No.58 presents the data about Motor vehicles in operation in Poona Region as on 31-3-69 and 31-3-70. The figures given in the previous Abstract were Poona Region comprising of Poona Satara, Sangli, Sholapur Kolhapur and Ahmednagar districts. The figures for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 are for the Poona Region comprising of Poona, Satara, Ahmednagar and Sholapur districts only.

The figures for the year 1967-68 were inclusive of motor vehicles in operation and Motor vehicles whose registration was cancelled. The figures for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 include only Motor vehicles in operation i.e excluding those for Registration is cancelled. The data is obtained from the Regional transport officer, Poona.

The term Motor vehicles includes Motor cycles, cars, Taxies, Rickshwas, stage carriages Trolley, School buses, tractors etc. The district wise information being not available available the data relates to the area covered by Regional Transport Officer of which Sholapur district is a part. The data presented in table No.59 relates to Nationalised Road Transport. The reference years are as 31st March 1969 and 1970. The data is obtained from the Divisional Controller of State Transport Sholapur.

The results of Traffic Census conducted on 5-5-1968 are presented in Table No. 60.

The table No.61 gives some important Statistics regarding post and Telegraph offices no.of letter boxes etc. in this district. Information in this table is collected from postal authorities of this district. Table No.62 gives information regarding radio(receiver) licenses in force as/31-3-60 and 70. The hamlets are separately counted where a receiving set is installed hence the no.of villages appears to be very high. The figures are provisional.

LOCAL BODIES.
2.10 In four tables No.63 to 66). In this section income and expenditure particulars of local bodies of Sholapur district are illustrated. Table No.63/total gives income and expenditure of village-Panchayats year-Zilla Parishad and Municipalities during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70. Table No.64 reveals information of village Panchayats(Panchayat Samitiswise) for the year 1968-69 and 1969-70.

Table No.65 part-A presents the Headwise receipts of Zilla Parishad Sholapur while Table No.65 Part-B indicates the Headwise expenditure for the year 1968-69 and 1969-70. The table No.66 reveals the income and expenditure of Municipalities during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70.

2.11 Plan and Community Development:

There are (5) tables (Table No.67 to 71) in this section. Data in tables 67 to 68 relates to achievements financial and physical under district level plan schemes, during the period 1968-69 and 1969-70. The other tables 69,70 and 71 deal in particulars with the community Development programme as on 31st March,70

The data revealed in this section has been compiled by the District Statistical Office on the information from the concerned implementing officers of plan schemes and from Block Development Officers.

2.12 Prices:-

There are two tables in this section(72 & 73) Table No.72 gives the average retail prices of important commodities at district head quarter in Sholapur district for each month for the year 1968 and 1969. The data is for the calender year. The computation is based on weekly prices collected at Sholapur by District Statistical Office and indicates price levels of covered commodities in the said period. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too from only one shop in the district head quarter the average shown in table No.72 for individual commodities can not be said to be fully representative but the data may prove more useful

as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices of over the period of time.

The table No.73 gives the consumer price index number for working class at Sholapur centre for the year 1969-70. The data is obtained from the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Bombay.

2.13 Misc.

There are in all(11) tables (74 to 84) on variety of Topics in this section. Table No. 74 gives particulars of police force and crime Statistics are given in table No.75 for the calender year 1968 & 1969
from The data has been collected from the police department. The table No.76 presents information regarding cases decided by Judicial Department in the year 1968-69. The data is obtained from the district Session Judge Sholapur. Table No.77 presents the data on Cinema Statistics while yable No.78 and 79 reveal the strength of Banking offices and Joint stock companies separately. Progress of life Insurance Business is shown in table No.80. The Table No. 81 and 82 reveals the Collection of small saving and Land Revenue. The position regarding no of pressses, News papers and periodicals published as on 31st March, 1979 in Sholapur district is shown in table No.83. The results of general election held in 1967 are presented in table No. 84.

2.14 Trends and in selected Indicators:-

Table No.85 presents the important indicators in the field of development such agril. Irrigation, Livestock and poultry, Factory employment Electricity Cooperation, Education, Medical and Health etc. for the years's 1960-61 to 1969-70. These indicators will be of great help while assessing the progress of development in every field of activities during the five year plans period.

2.15 Selected Indicators:-

Table regarding selected indicators of Development of each tahsil of Sholapur district are appended at the end . These table cover topics like population, agriculture, electricity, Factory workers education etc. An attempt is made to show the position of each tahsil in reation to its development under each item by way of ranking on the basis of latest data availables the year 1969-70.

CHAPTER -III-

Sectorial Trend

3.1 Introduction:-

In this chapter an attempt is made to present an analytical review giving the sectorial trends, position in the division and comparison between Talukas in respect of Agriculture livestock and poultry, Employment, electric consumption, Civil amenities, education and communication etc.

3.2 Utilisation of Land:

Even though Sholapur district is one of the most industrialised districts in Maharashtra, the economy of this district is mainly agrarian in character. Agriculture constitutes the most important segment of the economy from the point of view of both giving livelihood and also its contribution to State Income. The pattern of land use can be best seen from table No.R.3.1 mentioned below. This shows that the net area sown in the district was about 82 percent of the total geographical area in the year 1967-68 which slightly increased to 85 percent during the year 1968-69. Forest formed only 2 percent of the area during the year 1967-68 which remained the same in the year 1968-69. There was a decrease of 3 percent under fallow Land during the year 1968-69 as compared to the year 1967-68 So also a slight decrease of 0.19 percent is observed under other uncultivable Land excluding current fallow. There is no much scope of further reduction in this area. It appears that an increase to total cropped area can be achieved only by increasing area under multiple crops. This is possible only by extending irrigation facilities.

3.2 Percentage gross sown area :-

(i) The gross sown area in the district was 12.77 lakh hectare during the year 1967-68 which increased to 13.15 lakh hectare. Similarly the net area sown from 12.27 hectare during the year 1967-68 to 12.69 hectare in the year 1968-69. The proportion of gross cropped area to net area sown which was 104 in the year 1967-68 has slightly decreased to 103.58 percent during the year 1968-69. This than was lower /that the corresponding proportion of the division in the year 1968-69, the proportion being 105.15 percent in poona division.

(ii) Within the district the proportion of gross cropped area to net area sown does not show any marked increase in any of the Tahsils. However a slight increase in proportion is observed in tahsils, Madha, Pandharpur and North Sholapur over the previous years which ranges from 102 percent to 103 percent. The downward trend in proportion is observed in all the remaining tahsils of the district.

The proportion of Karmala and Malsiras tahsils was higher than the district averages in both the years ranging from 104.10 to 108.74 the proportion of Sangola & Barshi tahsils ranging from 105.74 to 106.89 was higher than the district average. It was however lower than the district average in the Tahsils Madha, Mohol, North Sholapur, South Sholapur, Mangalwedha and Akkalkot. The proportion of gross cropped area to the net area in the district for each tahsil is shown below in the table No.R.3.2

(iii) It is observed from the above table that the possibilities of increasing double cropped area appear to be considerable. The double cropped area of the district as a whole has shown the downward trend during the period 1967-68 to 1968-69. Extension of irrigation would enable some increase in double cropping.

(iv) In the Tahsils of Mangalvedhan, Sangola and Pandharpur which are predominantly of rabi area it is possible to some extent to take kharif crops sown in June, July and harvested well in time for preparation of Rabi season. In the remaining kharif areas there is enough moisture left in soil after harvest to sustain a short rabi crop. But the raising of such crops is not likely to add substantially to food output. For increasing the output of food grain. We will have to improve the productivity of existing cultivated area through irrigation, conservation and better Technique.

3.2 Productivity of important crops:-

1) Generally speaking the productivity of the soil of this district is poor. This district falls in the plateau where the rainfall is low and highly variable. Irrigation facilities have not developed to a degree as would significantly mitigate these natural disadvantages. However the development efforts of the district under the Five year plan have undoubtedly contributed to raise the productivity of the Land. However it appears from large fluctuations of out put from year to year that despite the programme of development the weather appears to be the prime determinant of the level of output as is obvious from Table No.R.3.3.

It is seen from the above table that excepting Rice, Bajra, Gram, Groundnut and Chillies the yield per hectare has decreased in respect of all other above mentioned crops. The principal food crops of the district are Jowar, Bajra and sugarcane and other important cash crops are groundnut and cotton. During the year 1967-68 the yield rate for Jowar was 407 Kg. per hectare which reduced to 362 Kg. per hect. in the year 1968-69. So also yield per hectare under Wheat has gone down from 643 Kg. to 586 Kgs. during the period 1967-68 and 1968-69. However the rise in yield per hectare under rice is observed from 387 Kgs. to 840 Kgs. during the period under review.

This district is quite rich in sugarcane. About 10 percent of the Sugarcane of Poona division is produced in this district. The yield rate of sugarcane has also gone down from 8147 Kgs to 7234 Kgs. per hectare during the year 1968-69 and 1962-69.

Groundnut and Cotton:-

No doubt groundnut and cotton are the principal crops of the state the area under these crops is negligible in this district. However the yield rate of groundnut has increased from 437 Kgs. to 608 Kgs per hectare in the years 1967-69 and 1968-69.

3.5 Gross value of Agricultural production:-

Since 1959 there has been marked upward trend in the per capita (Rural population) gross value of agricultural output of this district which is estimated to Rs. 193 in the year 1959-60. By 1960-61 it had increased to Rs.197. A distinct slackening in the pace of growth is noticeable towards the end of the period. However it was steady and stationary in the year 1961-62. As against this the gross value for Poona division is estimated to be 184, 193 and 192 in the years 1959-60 and 1960-61 and 1961-62 respectively. The table No.R.3.4 gives comparative picture of the per capita(Rural population) gross value of Agricultural produce during the period 1959-60 to 1961-62 in Sholapur district.

It appears from the above table that compared to the division the per capita gross value was higher in the district in all the these years i.e 1959-60 to 1961-62.

3.6 Percentage of gross Irrigated area:-

A. Percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area.

In this district the scope for increasing the area under cultivation is severely limited. But irrigation makes possible the use of the land resources more intensive by keeping land under crops for larger period in the year than it is possible merely by soil moisture derived from natural precipitation. For example with irrigation we can grow late maturing varieties of rice in Shallow-soil and long staple cotton which is a six month crop and sugarcane which is perennial crop.

The proportion of the gross irrigated area to net irrigated area increased from 115 to 119 during the period 1967-68 and 1968-69. Thus the extent of increase in the double cropped area due to irrigation is estimated to be 4 percent in this district during

the period 1967-68 and 1968-69. Within the district the proportion of the gross irrigated area to net irrigated in 1968-69 varies 102 in Sangola Tahsil to 169 in Managlwedha Tahsil. During the year 1968-69 the proportion is above the district average in the tahsil Karmala, Madha, Pandharpur and Mehol. In the remaining tahsil it is below the district average. The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area under each tahsil is given in Table No.

B. Percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown.

(1) As stated earlier the irrigation facilities now available are very scanty as compared to the vast area under cultivation in this district. The percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown was 9.5 in the year 1967-68 which reduced to 8.8 in the year 1968-69.

(ii) Within the district this proportion varies from 3.2 in Barshi to 30.8 in Malsiras Tahsil. This is due to irrigation facilities provided by the Nira Right Bank canal. The proportion is above. The dist. average in the Tahsil of Pandharpur and Sangola. In the remaining Tahsils it is below the district average. Table No.R.3.6 gives the trend in respect of percentage of irrigated area to net area sown.

3.7 Changes in crop pattern(Total & irrigated)

(i)The crop pattern of this district is dominated by Jowar, Bajra and such other low value crops. Of 13.15 lakh hectare of cropped area 7.03 lakh hect. (61 percentage) were under Jowar during the 1968-69. Where perennial irrigation is available farmers have taken to sugarcane which is extensively grown in Malsiras taluka of the district.

(ii) A peculiar feature of the district and one which is shared by the Western Tracts of the dist is the predominance of Rabi cultivation. This is due to the fact that these areas have two peaks of rainfall one in June July and other in September. The former being unreliable, The cultivators find it more advantageous to take rabi crops on the basis of moisture carried out from the rainy season.

(iii) In the year 1967-68, 86.64 percent was under food crops and 13.36 percent under non food- crops which increased to 87.12 percent under food crop. Among the food crops Jowar occupied 61.70 percent in the year 1968-69. Bajra occupied 8.09 percent in the year 1967-68 which increased to 9.16 percent in the year 1968-69. During the year 1967-68, the area covered under wheat was 1.85 percent which increased to 2.00 percent in the year 1968-69. So also the area under sugarcane increased from 0.82 percent to 0.86 percent. The following figures show the changes in percentages in nut shall.

iv) It is evident from the above table that the percentage under food crops has slightly increased. It is observed that in case of Jowar and Bajra a high proportion of cropped area is covered. It is also observed that changes in crop pattern have been quite insignificant during the period under review.

3.8 Agricultural wage rates:

In this district the Agricultural wage rate for field labour per day of male labour varies between Rs.1.50 to 2.50 while that of female labour varies between Rs.0.75 to Rs. 1.25 during the year 1968-and 1969.

Under the skilled labour the average rate was highest under Cobbler during the years 1968- and 1969 which ranges between Rs.5.08 to Rs. 6.00

During the year 1968-69 the trend of agricultural wages was found to be on the upward side which is consistent with the general rise in the price line.

3.9 Live stock per hectare of Land:-

i) On comparing the gross cropped area with the Bovine and ovine population it is observed that there are about 102 bullocks per hundred hectares of cultivated land in this district. As against this 140 bullocks per hundred hectares of cultivated land were in the year 1968-69 in Poona division.

ii) Within the district the ratio of the livestock population was the highest in Malsiras talhsil(187) in the year 1967-68 which reduced to 168. in the year 1968-69. The lowest ratio was in South Sholapur i.e 74 in the year 1967-68 which reduced to 71 in the year 1968-69. The Tahsils Malsiras, North Sholapur, Sangola and Mangalwedha have ratios more than 102 i.e above the district average in the year 1968-69. Whereas the remaining Talukas have ratios less than the district average. The talukawsie live-stock population per hundred hectare of cultivated land is given below in table No.R.3.8

iii) The figures of no.of bullocks per 100 hectares of cultivated land normally indicate the extent to which animal power is being a utilised for Agril. However there are other factors such as availability of grass, mechanical operations which also influence these ratios.

3.10 Poultry as compared to population:

(i) Poultry is generally understood includes a variety of domestic birds like fowls, ducks, gees, Turkeys, etc. of these fowls form the major category constituting almost the entire poultry in the district.

Poultry is a quick returning livestock as such its development has got a great importance in food production programme. Poultry and its products rich in protein value can supplement the food supply in short time.

(ii) The total poultry population of Sholapur district was 4.53 lakhs in the year 1961 which increased to 4.73 lakhs in the year 1966 as against this the human population was 18.60 lakhs.

(iii) Thus the total poultry population in the district formed nearly 13 and 12 percents of poultry population in the division in the years 1961 and 1966 respectively which shows lower share of the district as compared to the share of human population. The proportion in the district was 24 in the year 1961 which increased to 25 in the year 1966. As against this the corresponding proportion in Poona division was 34 and 39 in the year 1961 and 1966 respectively.

The table No.R3.9 below indicates the proportion of population to the total population in the year 1961 and 1966.

3.11 Per capita consumption of electricity:

The position of the district in power consumption was satisfactory in the year 1969-70. The per capita consumption of electricity in this district was 48.4 KWT. in the year 1968-69 which increased to 57.0 KWT in the year 1969-70. During the year 1968-69 the percentage of number of electrified villages and towns to total was 32 which increased to 35 by the end of 1969-70. Employment exchange and c vacancies notified:

At the end of the year 1968-69, there were 10,807 persons on the live register of employment Exchange in this district which increased to 11,386 persons in the year 1969-70. The no. of placement effected was 578 in 1968-69 which increased to 628 in the year 1969-70. The no. of vacancies notified during the year 1968-69 was 1,157 which decreased to 1,061 in the year 1969-70. For the year 1968-69 the no. of vacancies /10.71 percent of the total registration and where as the number of placement was 5.35 percent, the corresponding percentage for the year 1969-70 were 9.32 and 5.52 respectively.

The table No.R.3.11 gives the no.of placement made during the years 1968-69 and 1^69-70.

It is evident from the above tables that the picture is not very encouraging as far as notification is concerned in relation to the registration of candidates. The vacancies were only about 10.71 percent of the total registration in 1968-69 which reduced to 9.32 percent in the year 1969-70.Further placement is not of the same magnitude as vacancies notified.

3.13 Increase in indoor and outdoor patients treated in hospitals.

The no. of indoor patients treated has shown the decrease during the period 1968-69 to 1969-70 from 72,202 to 65,532 i.e decrease by 1.10 percent. In the same strain the no.of outdoor patients also reduced from 80,4481 to 7,88,882 i.e decrease by 1.02 percent.

3.14 Increase in no.of students in different categories(Boys and Girls separately)

Considerable progress in the spread of primary education is observed in this district. The enrolment in primary schools has increased by 1.26 percent in

the year 1968-69 over the period 1967-68. The relative increase was more for girls i.e 2.43 percent as against 0.56 percent for boys. The no.of students in secondary schools in the district increased from 51,803 in the year 1967-68 to 56,028 in the year 1968-69 i.e increase by 9.02 percent, the ralative increase was more for boys i.e 9.30 percent for boys and 8.14 percent for girls. The no.of students taking higher education increased from 8,350 in 1967-68 to 9,572 in 1968-69 i.e increase by 14.63 percent.

3.15. Increase in road length as per 100 Sq.Km.

The road length per 100 Sq.Km. area was only 14.3 Km. in this district in the year 1960-61 as against this the corresponding length for Poona division was estimated to be 20 Km. The proportion of road length to total area in this district increased to 21.0 in the year 1965-66 which remained in the senceup to 1968-69.

3.16 The no.of Banking offices in the district was 83 on 31-3-67 which increased to 95 on 31-3-69. The total no.of towns and villages having banking was 24 on 31-3-67 which increased to 25 on 31-3-69. The population served per banking in the district was 7494 on 31-3-67 which reduced 6616 on 31-3-69.

3.17 Prices

The trend in price line can be judged from the prices of various commodities given below in Statement No.R.3.13.

It is evident from the above table that there has been considerable rise in prices in almost all essential commodities during the year 1968-69 and 1969 as compared to the year 1963. A phenomenal rise in prices is observed especially in pulses during the period under review as compared to the year 1963.

CHAPTER- IV -

ANNUAL PLANS 1968-69 & 1969-70

4.1 Introduction

After witnessing a period of great strains on the economy of the district during the three years 1965-1966 to 1967-68 due mainly to drought conditions, floods and other natural calamities, the year 1968-69 marked a distinct improvement in the economic situation which continued in the year 1969-70.

The year 1968-69 is the third year of the implementation of the Annual Plan while the year 1969-70 marks the commencement of the Fourth Five Year Plan 1969-70 to 1973-74.

4.2 Size of the plan

During the year 1968-69, the out lay for the State was 153.49 crores. Besides the central share on the additional State plan programmes and Centrally sponsored programmes was of the order of Rs.20.70 crores. Out of this Rs.102 crores was set against district & divisional level schemes. The provision position of the Poona Division was Rs.31.23 crores which was approximately 30 percent of the State out-lay on the district and divisional level schemes.

As regard Sholapur district the allotment for the district level scheme was about 3.95 crores i.e 13 percent of the division out lay.

The plan programme for 1968-70 envisaged an out lay of Rs.114 crores in state plan. For the Centrally sponsored programmes a total out lay of about Rs.12.10 crores was provided. Of this provision an amount of 23.15 crores was allotted to Poona division for implementing district and division level schemes. Sholapur district received 3.19 crores of this provision for the state & local sectors altogether.

Allocation between State & Local Sectors:

Since the Zilla Parishad is entrusted with the responsibility of local development, of out of 90 schemes 33 schemes were implemented and 57 by state sector offices. Though the schemes implemented by the Zilla Parishad are 33 the expenditure incurred by the Zilla Parishad is comparatively less.

The total expenditure incurred during the year 1968-69 was 390.01 lakh of which the expenditure incurred by the Zilla Parishad is only 80.80 lakhs which comes to 21 percent. The expenditure in the State sector is Rs.309.21 lakhs which comes to 79 percent. In the same strain the total expenditure incurred during the year 1969-70 was 237.33 lakhs of which the expdr. incurred by the Zilla Parishad was 58.09 lakhs i.e 24 percent and under state sector it was 179.24 lakhs i.e 76 percent. Expenditure percentages for the Zilla Parishad are low as the schemes entrusted with the Z.P. were having comparatively small Budget provision on the contrary the major schemes like Rural Electrification, Contour Bunding Irrigation and Cooperative schemes having huge budget provision were implemented by the state sector offices.

4.3 Expenditure:

The progress of plan can be seen to some extent from the expenditure incurred on various heads of development. The total expenditure during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 was Rs. 390.01 and 237.33 lakhs respectively. The following table gives the major head-wise progress of expenditure during 1968-69 and 1969-70

It is evident from the above table that among the heads of development, the head agricultural programme has been given the top priority in both the years claiming 29 percent in 1968-69 & 43 percent in 1969-70 of the total expenditure.

Irrigation and power claims 28 percent of the expenditure in 1968-69. However the percentage under this head has gone down in the year 1969-70 due to exclusion of the expenditure under A.F.C scheme. Social services claims 25 percent during 1968-69 and 22 percent in the year 1969-70. 9 and 15 percents under Industry and Mining in the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. Under Cooperation the percentages were 5 and 7 in the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. Lastly Transport and Communication claims about 4 and 6 percent in the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively.

The review of these schemes can better be seen if analysed separately for state sector and local sector. The progress of state sector and local sector separately can be seen from the following table.

It appears from the above table that share of Local sector in the expenditure position of the district is less than 25 percent in both the years. Thus the major share is claimed by the State sector. It is also observed from the above table that out of the total expenditure under Agricultural programme amounting to Rs 316.91 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs 237.33 lakhs in the year 1969-70 Rs 309.21 lakhs and Rs 179.24 lakhs have been spent under state sector in the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. The remaining amount of Rs 80.80 in the year 1968-69 and Rs 58.09 in the year 1969-70 was incurred by the Zilla Parishad under local sector scheme. The share of expdr. on local sector's schemes on cooperation and Community development is higher than that of state sector schemes under this head.

Schemewise progress of expenditure and achievements

Detail review of expenditure and achievement is taken below:-

4.5 Agricultural programmes:

Taking in to consideration the general characteristic of the district a high priority for investment in Agricultural programme aiming at increase in yield per acre as well as income from ancilliary activities has been given in the Annual plans of both the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Development of Irrigation from large as well as small work, Soil Conservation programmes and supplies of fertilisers and improved seeds are some of the measures undertaken directly to increase production. As such

Agricultural programmes cover schemes relating to Agricultural production, Ayacut development, Minor irrigation Soil Conservation, Animal Husbandry, Dairy Development Forest, Fisheries, Ware housing and marketing.

4.5.1 Expenditure:-

Out of the total Budget provisions of Rs.362.55 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs. 319.13 lakhs in the year 1969-70. The total expenditure incurred under the schemes of Agricultural programme amounts to Rs. 114.72 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs. 102.77 lakhs in the year 1969-70. The details are as below:-

It is evident from the above table that the total expenditure over the schemes related to Agricultural programmes amounts to Rs. 114.72 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs.102.77 in the year 1969-70. It is also seen that soil Conservation and minor irrigation have been given first priority among all the heads under Agricultural programmes. The Total amount spent under these sub- heads which comes to Rs.104.74 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs.92.96 lakhs in the year 1969-70, is included to boost the agricultural production. The above table reveals that out of the total expenditure under agricultural programmes least expenditure has been incurred under Forest and Fisheries. However the progress of Minor irrigation was not satisfactory in the year 1968-69 i.e due to shortage of machinery and non availability of local labourers. So also the year 1969-70 the progress was hampered due to orders of Government for giving subsidy to small holders only and cases of small holders have not been received from L.M. Bank. At this stage it is clarified that the programme of minor irrigation works also includes a scheme of Financial Assistance to cultivators for construction of new wells and installation of pumping sets.

4.502 Physical Achievements:

Brief accounts of physical achievement under various sub heads relating to Agricultural programmes during the period under review is as detailed below:-

1) Agricultural production:

Progress in agriculture can be gauged from

- (a). additional acreages brought under cultivation, irrigation and contour bunding; (b) increase in crop yield resulting from adoption of Modern methods of cultivation. Since agriculture is a private enterprise and the farmers are free to take their own decision, the achievements on behalf of the Government in this regard consist mainly of distribution of (a) improved seeds (b) Chemical fertilisers (c) improved agricultural implements, plant protection etc. There were (25) schemes under operation during the period under review. Performances some of the important schemes under Agricultural programmes are given below:-

It appears from the ~~the~~ table that remarkable progress has been achieved under soil conservation.

Agriculture being the primary producing sector supporting about 70 percent of working population of the district efforts on this sector have not been impeded in any manner during the Annual plans of 1968-69 and 1969-70. In view of this fact the same schemes of the Annual plan for the year 1967-68 have been included in the Annual plans for the year 1968-69 and 1969-70. The scheme for the supply of chemicals and fertilisers was intensified during the period under review as it was done during the previous years. During the year 1968-69, the chemical and fertilisers to the extent of 73,433 quintals have been distributed and in the same manner 50,290 quintals have been distributed in the years 1969-70 in this district through the local comparative societies.

2) Minor Irrigation:

Among the various measures undertaken by Govt. for increasing food production minor irrigation occupies important place. The irrigation programme can broadly be classified (a) Minor Works programme (b) Medium irrigation (c) Major irrigation projects.

The district level schemes in this district in main relate to the first category i.e. Minor Works programme

The schemes of minor irrigation were implemented both in local and state sectors. Construction of new wells installation of pumping sets, improvement of irrigation wells by boring, Air compressor, drilling and blasting, operations and cooperative, Lift irrigation schemes are implemented in the state sector. The scheme regarding construction of community wells is implemented under Local sector.

Under these schemes the achievements are as under During the period 1968-69 to 1969-70, 3 spillover works classified under district level schemes were undertaken under state sector as detailed below:-

The work at Rampur was started in 1968-69 and is expected to be completed in 1971. During the year 1969-70 the work of irrigation tank at Junoni is physically completed & the work at Achakdani is in finishing stage & is likely to be completed in October 1970. In the same way the work at Karunde tank is in progress.

In Addition to these(3) works have been recently taken up during the year 1969-70 as detailed below:-

1) Kari tank at Barshi Taluka.

2) Golargi tank at Akkalkot taluka.

3) Hingani tank at Karmala taluka.

Out of 6 works taken up under Drainage schemes(4) works are physically completed and the remaining(2) works are in progress, The progress was slow due to some land acquisition difficulties which have been removed.

The programme of Minor irrigation works also included a scheme of Financial Assistance to cultivators for construction of new wells and installation of pumping sets. The progress under this head was slow since the amount was to be spent giving subsidy to small holders only as per Govt. instructions and cases of small holders were not received from L. M. Bank. However during the period 1968-69 and 1969-70, the achievement was as detailed below:

With all these efforts & measures additional irrigational potential to the extent of 30,176 acres has been created up to the end of 1969-70.

3) Soil Conservation:-

For securing fair crop under adverse soil and climatic conditions in the scarcity tract of Maharashtra state

contour bunding has played a very important role in soil and moisture conservation and also in increasing the fertility of the soil. This district is one of scarcity affected districts of the state. The total area banded up to the end of the third five year plan was 3.93 lakh hectares which increased to 5.76 lakh hectares during the Annual plans 1966-67 to 1969-70.

4) Ayacut Development:

The Ayacut development programme envisages taking up items such as land levelling and shaping, construction of new field chennals and drains and introduction of new crop patterns in respect of certain fields with proper demanstrations. The proper land development work includes survey of command areas and also establishment of Trial-cum demonstration farms. A scheme under the captioned of establishments of 3 Divisions and 16 sub divisions has been implemented in this district. Under this scheme 3,67 lakh acres were surveyed during the year 1968-69 and 6.00 acres in the year 1969-70.

5) Animal Husbandry:

The Animal Husbandry can be broadly classified in the following categories 1) provision of veterinary facilities (2) Improvement of livestock i.e cattle sheep and poultry and education in veterinary.

There were (6) schemes under Animal Husbandry and all these schemes were under local sector, in the year 1968-69.

The scheme for expansion of veterinary facilities fall under (3) groups viz provision of veterinary dispensaries, treatment against diseases & research in to diseases of livestock.

There are (12) dispensaries and (30) aid centres. During the year 1968-69, two spillover works regarding construction of building for establishment of veterinary dispensaries and centres have been taken up.

In the year 1969-70, there were only(2) schemes under the head animal husbandry as detailed below:-

- 1) Provision for veterinary dispensary
- 2) Opening of veterinary aid centres.

Under the above schemes, the veterinary dispensaries at Mandrup, Karmala and Piliv have been completed.

Veterinary aid centres at Hotagi and Pimpalner have been established.

6) Dairy Development:

Supply of unadulterated milk at reasonable price to the people especially in the urban areas was a long felt need. Accordingly Govt. Milk supply scheme for Sholapur town was taken up during the second plan, and which continued during the third plan and the Annual plans 1966-67 to 1969-70. The milk is procured through various centres and Cooperative societies.

The Dairy milk procurement was 6785 litres per day during the year 1968-69 which gone down to 3708 litres per day during the year 1969-70. due to short supply of milk by milk supply unions.

7) Forest:

The scheme Afforestation for soil conservation was implemented as state sector during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70. The principal achievement under the scheme is that afforestation of area of about (300) hectares have been covered during the year 1968-69 and (50) hectares have been covered during the year 1969-70.

8) Fisheries:

The scheme for stock of inland water with carp-fry envisages survey of fresh-water sheets and stocking, suitable sheets with rapidly growing various carp-fry(Baby-fish). During the second five year plan about 19 1160 acres of water sheets in this district was surveyed. About 4.3 lakhs carp-fry and fingerlings were stocked during the second five year plan period and 1.40 lakhs fish were netted. The scheme continued during the third five year plan period and the Annual plans for the year 1966-67 to 1969-70. During the years 1968-69, 3.12 lakhs fingerlings were stocked and in the same way 3.50/fingerlings were stocked during the year 1969-70.

9) Warehousing and Marketing:

Development of orderly marketing of Agricultural produce occupied a place of vital importance in the proper functioning of the Agricultural economy of the country. The scheme of development under this head envisages a coverage of market by way of regulation and handling of large volume of marketable surplus on cooperative basis. 9 marketing societies formed during the year 1968-69 and 4 in the year 1969-70.

4.6 Cooperation & Community Development:

Cooperation and Communication development are two sub-heads under this major head. The expenditure incurred during the year 1968-69 on cooperation & Community Development amounts to Rs. 5.47 and 12.45 lakhs respectively. Thus, the total expenditure under this major is Rs.17.92 lakhs during the year 1968-69.

In The year 1969-70 the expenditure under cooperation and Community Development was 6.81 lakhs and 8.34 lakhs respectively. Thus the total expenditure was reduced to 15.15 lakhs during the year 1969-70 under this major head

Cooperation:-

During the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 the Cooperative movement has made considerable progress in this dist. There were (6) schemes under this head in both the year 1968-69 and 1969-70. Of these , three major schemes.

- 1) Strengthening of Cooperative structure
- 2) Cooperative Farming
- 3) Labour contract societies.

constitute largest share of expenditure in both the years amounting to Rs.6.20 lakh in the year 1968-69 & 6.50 in the year 1969-70. On scheme of labour contract societies only expenditure of Rs.5.23 in the year 1968-69 and Rs. 6.50 in the year 1969.70 was incurred.

During the years 1968.69 and 1969-70 remarkable progress has been made under the community development programme. The entire rural area of the district has already been covered under the C.D.programme under the Rural works programme.Works have been taken up in (5) Blocks in the year 1968-69. The Blocks Harmala, Pandharpur and Sangola have been covered under Applied Nutrition p r o g r amme

Irrigation & Power:-

4.7 There is only one scheme under this head implemented by State sector namely rural electrification. The total expenditure under this head was Rs.109.61 lakhs in the year 1968-69 & Rs.15.20 lakhs in the year 1969-70.

The expenditure in the year 1969-70 as comparatively less as against the expenditure of the previous year due to the enforcement of the A.F.C scheme which was made applicable from 1-7-1969. During the year 1968-69, 147 villages have been electrified and 1591 pumps connected. So also in the year 1969-70, 21 villages have been electrified and 37 pumps connected.

The target fixed under A.F.C. scheme for pump connection was 4000. As against this target 1439 pumps have been connected up to end of March 1970.

Industry & Mining:-

4.8 During the period under review there were three schemes under this head. Out of these one was implemented by State sector and the other one by local sector and the remaining one was under state and local both.

The programme of industry involves the total expenditure of Rs.36.01 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs.35.26 lakhs in the year 1969-70.

The development of cottage industry occupies an important place among the industrial development in the district. The programme is designed to promote the growth of Handloom weaving industries. During the year 1968- 69 195, membership added under Handloom weavers cooperative societies . So also in the same strain.1308 membership added in the year 1969-70 under the above item.

4.9 Transport and Communication:

Development of road is the only activity undertaken under this head and the same is implemented under(4) different schemes. Of these four, one is completely implemented by the Zilla Parishad and the remaining three are implemented both by local and state sectors.

The total expenditure under this head on all the four schemes amounts to Rs.14.19 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs.14.03 lakhs in the year 1969-70.

The programme of road development has been viewed in the light of the needs of the district for communication to feed the industrial areas to important rail roads and marketing centres with the interior to provide all weather roads to facilities extension of passengers, transport services. During the year 1968-69, 8 Km. New roads constructed and 38 Km roads modernised. So also 31 Km. roads were modernised in the year 1969-70.

4.10 Social Services:

There were (9) sub-heads under this sector, and the expenditure involved on all the above sub-heads amounts to Rs.97.26 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs.53.25 lakhs in the year 1969-70. The details are as follows.

1) General Education:-

There were Ten schemes under this board in the year 1968-69. Out of these(7) were under local sector and one was under state sector and the remaining two were both under state and local sectors. Expenditure on all these schemes was incurred to the extent of Rs.22.01 l a k h .

The number of schemes implemented during the year 1969-70 increased to (15). Out of these(11) were implemented by Zilla Parishad, and(3) were under state sector and the remaining one was both state and local sector. The Achievement under education during the year 1968- 69 and 1969-70 are as detailed below:-

2.	<u>Technical Education:</u>			

In the field of Technical education there is one scheme which comprises scheme for expansion of existing polytechnic and starting a new polytechnic. Under this scheme a polytechnic institution was established at

Sholapur in the month of June 1953, providing for diploma courses in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical engineering with 60 admissions. During the second five year plan 320 students were admitted and this strength increased to 300 during the Third five year plan. No significant progress appears to have been made during the year 1963-67 to 1969-70. However an amount of Rs.1.77 lakh and Rs. 1.31 lakhs were spent on staff. Due to poor response from the students all the sanctioned posts could not be filled.

3. Health and Family Planning:

There were(5) schemes under this sub-head in both the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Out of these(3) were under local sector and the remaining (2) were under state sector. The total expenditure incurred over these schemes amounts to Rs.22.10 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs.23.96 lakhs in 1969-70. During the period under Review the activities of health centres have been strengthened. Under the Family Planning programmes 16,083 persons in the year 1968- 69 & 9,959 persons in the year 1969-70 have undergone sterilisation operations and 138 females in the year 1968-69 and 458 females in the year 1969-70 had adopted intra-uterine contraceptive methods especially loop.

The National Malaria Eradication programme Unit Pandharpur has been functioning in Sholapur district since April, 1954. During the year 1968-69, 2.52 lakhs blood smears were taken and so also in the same some way 2.31 lakh blood smears were taken in the year 1969-70.

4. Water supply and drainage:-

The work of improvement to Pandharpur water supply distribution scheme was completed. The work of Sholapur Bhima River scheme was also completed except the work of Puri plant which was in progress. 4 filter-beds have been put in to operation, Since November 1969 and water supply given to the public. The works of Sholapur drainage scheme, Pandharpur, Sangola and Mhol water supply scheme were also completed during the period under review. The work of Kurduwadi scheme was in progress.

In addition to these schemes (6) new schemes were taken up. The preliminary arrangements under these schemes are in progress.

5. Housing:-

In order to mitigate the housing shortage and also to develop Sholapur Town, housing programme has been continued in the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. There are three schemes under this programme and out of these two are implemented under state sector and the remaining one is implemented under local sector. The total expenditure incurred over these schemes amounts to Rs. 5.95 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs. 0.42 lakhs in the year 1969-70.

6. Urban Development:-

The Urban Development programme aims at providing essential civic amenities in Urban areas and at counteracting undesirable social repercussions of urban concentration and congestion. The state Government gives Financial Assistance in the form of grants and loans to the Municipal councils for enabling them to implement their development plans.

The progress under this head is not satisfactory since no Municipal council from Sholapur district applied for the grants in aid and loan. They have been advised to do so again. However one proposal of Pandharpur Municipal council was submitted for sanction during the year 1969-70.

7. Welfare of Backward classes:

These were (9) schemes under this head and out of these (6) are implemented by local sector and (3) under state sector. The total expenditure incurred over this head amounts to Rs. 3.75 lakhs in the year 1969-70.

The disabilities from which backward classes including schedule caste and schedule tribes suffer can be divided in to three broad categories (1) social (2) Economic (3) Education. The plan seeks to provide liberal assistance to this weaker section of the community so that the social and economic disabilities from which these communities are removed. To promote literacy in the backward classes and to encourage the students of these communities to join institutions of higher learning special concessions have been provided in the development programme. During the period under review 897 students were given scholarship in the year 1968-69 and 172 in the year 1969-70. In addition to these liberal Tagai loans were sanctioned for digging of wells for irrigation purposes to the backward class persons.

Labour & labour welfare:-

Under this programme, the work regarding construction of building for vocational training is in progress. The expenditure involved under this head amounts to Rs. 6.18 lakhs in the year 1968-69 and Rs. 2.26 in the year 1969-70.
