CHAPTER I

:- INTRODUCTION :-

1.1 - LOCATION :-

The Satara district lies between 17° 5' and 18° 11' north latitude and 73° 33' and 74° 54' east longitude. It is situated on the west of Deccan Plateau and is bounded by the Poona district on the north, by the Sholapur district on the east, by the Sangli district on the south, and by the districts of Kolaba and Ratnagiri on the west.

According to 1971 census the district has an area of 10492 Sq.Km. with a population of 1727,376. The district with its head quarter at Satara town comprises of eleven tehsils.

The Satara town is located on the Poona Bangalore National Highway No.4. The newly created railway station named as Satara on the new broad gauge line came into operation from April, 1971, and is situated at a distance of 5 Km. from Satara town. Previous Satara Road Station is abolished and another new station is created viz. Jarandeshwar. Acceleration of activities of Trade, Commerce, Industry, Transport are now made easier in the district in general and in the vicinity of Satara town in particular.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY :-

1) SOIL :- The Soils of the district are observed to be of varied textures. In the west, the soil in Mahabaleshwar, Wai, Jaoli and Patan is formed from the red laterite of the ghats. It is thin and poor on the hill slope, but gets richer where natural or artificial terracing has accumulated soil with vegetable matter drained by rain waters. Rich black soil is found in the low lands of the valleys of Krishna, Venna, Kudali, Koyana and Kole rivers in Wai, Jaoli, and Patan tehsils.

In the central part of the district medium to deep black alluvial soils are found. The soil in the Krishna Valley bed is very black, alluvial and is highly retentive of moisture. It is very fertile in Satara and Karad tehsils.

The soils in Khandala, Man and Phaltan tehsils are poor in quality, although there are good stripes of black soil along the Nira river and its tributaries. In the eastern part of Khandala tehsil the soil is poor, shallow and whitish but is capable of growing wheat, if adequate water is available.

Towards the east, the soil is poor with the exception of wide stretches of good black soil along the numerous streams and rivers in Koregaon tehsil.

In the farthest east of the district, that is in Khatav and Man tehsils the soil is extremely poor and shallow.

Considering the district as a whole, the percentage of rich soil is very small. The soil, in general, is of poor quality, excepting in the river valley beds in the central part.

ii) RIVERS :-

The Krishna is the principal river of the Satara district. It rises on the eastern brow of Mahabaleshwar Plateau, with its source at about 1371 metre above mean sea level. Several streams which flow from the vallies formed by the main hill ranges in the district make up the head waters of the Krishna river. The drainage system of the Krishna river includes, besides, the drainage of central system, the drainage of seven feeders, namely, the Kudali, the Venne, the Urmodi, the Tarali and the Koyana on the right and the Vasana and the Yerala on the left. From the source,

the Krishna flows for nearly 160 Km. through the Satara district and enters thereafter into the Sangli district.

Other rivers of importance in the district, are the Koyana, the Venna, and Nira, the Kudali, the Urmodi, the Wang, the Vasana, the Yerala and the Tarali. The Koyana is the largest feeder of the Krishna river in the district. It rises in the Mahabaleshwar plateau, runs towards south upto Helwak in the Patan tahsil, where it changes its course and flows towards east and falls into the Krishna at Karad. Today the Koyana has become the most important river in the State of Maharashtra on account of the Hydro-Electric Project that is being developed over it near Helwak village. Chief tributaries of the Bhima river viz. the Nira and the Manganga flow through the district in the north. The Nira enters Satara district from the Bhor tehsil of the Poona district.

From its sources in Bhor the river runs east to the north of Wai, Khandala and Phaltan tehsils, It later enters into the Sholapur district and falls into the Bhima. The river Manganga flows a length of about 64 Km. in the district and later enters into the districts of Sangli and Sholapur and ultimately falls into the Bhima near Pandharpur. These rivers go dry during summer.

iii) HILL RANGES :-

There are two main systems of hills in the Satara district. The Sahyadri range and its offshoots and Mahadeo range and its offshoots. The main range of Sahyadri with a length of 96 Km. from north to south forms the western boundary of this district. The Mahadeo range starts about 16 Km. north of Mahabaleshwar and stretches east and southeast across the whole breadth of the district. From this range three spurs stretch to the south of the district. Hills in the district are very low, barren and rugged except near

Mahabaleshwar and Koyana valley. The top of Mahabaleshwar the highest point in the district, is about 1436 metre above mean Sea level. Mahabaleshwar is one of the most attractive Hill stations in the State mainly due to its height and combination of several hill range spurs observed forming promontories that command magnificent views of the Sahyadri hills and the valleys below.

iv) MINERALS :-

Except for building stone, lime stone and little iron deposits in about 20 villages of Jaoli tehsil and 30 villages of Patan tehsil deposits of important minerals such as coal, boxite, manganese, silica are not known to have occurred in any part of the district. Building stone, sand of good quality and lime stone is found to be available all over the district. Good clay for bricks and tiles is found on the river banks.

1.3 CLIMATE :-

i) RAINFALL :- The Rainfall in the district starts by the middle of June and lasts till the end of September. The intensity of rainfall is maximum in July. Rainfall is not uniform all over the district. It is very

heavy in the western region and it goes on receding towards

the eastern part. The extreme western part gets over 5000 mm. rainfall, while* eastern part of the Sahyadri Zone gets the rainfall between

1200 to 2000 mm. The normal rainfall recorded at Mahabaleshwar centre is 6226 mm, while that at Fanchegani it is 1865 mm, It is 1723 mm. at Medha and at Patan the same is 1832 mm. The central zone gets rainfall between 600 mm. to 1200 mm. Satara centre has normal rainfall of 1025 mm. At other centres it is as follows Koregaon- 706 mm., Khandala 504 mm., Wai-710 mm., and Karad 713 mm. In the eastern zone rainfall averages below 600 mm. annually, It is as follows-

Phaltan 473 mm., Dahiwadi 463 mm., Mhaswad 473 mm., and ~~W~~
Vaduj 512 mm.

ii) TEMPERATURE :-

Monthly temperature data is available only for one station viz. Mahabaleshwar. Mahabaleshwar is located at an height of 1436 metre above mean sea level and as such the temperature data of Mahabaleshwar cannot be considered as representing the data for the whole of Satara district. The temperature at Mahabaleshwar fell down to as low as ^{degrees} 7.7/centigrade in February 1971 and rose to 33.0 degrees centigrade in April 1971.

1.4 NATURAL ZONE :-

The Satara district can be broadly divided into three natural zones. viz. western, central and eastern. The western zone bordering the Sahyadri ranges receives rainfall between 1200 mm. to 5000 mm. This zone comprises of Patan, Jaoli, Mahabaleshwar tehsils and part of Satara and Wai tehsils, The soil in this zone is thin and poor on the hill slopes. The agricultural pursuits of this zone are similar ~~of~~ to those of Konkan tract. Rice and Jowar are the main crops of this zone.

The central zone comprises of Koregaon and Karad tehsils and eastern parts of Satara and Wai tehsils. The area is flat and soil and rainfall are very congenial to better agricultural productions. The rainfall varies between 600 mm. to 1200 mm. per year. The soil is deep alluvial and very fertile. Jowar, Bajra, and Groundnut are the principal crops of this zone.

The eastern zone comprises of Phaltan, Khatav and Man tehsils and eastern part of Khandala tehsils. The soil is poor and shallow, the rainfall is not certain.

and the annual average rainfall received by this zone is less than 600 mm. This area is prone to scarcity conditions as whatever rainfall it received is not assured. Bajra and Jowar are the main crops of this zone.

1.5 TERRITORIAL CHANGES :-

Satara district was formed in 1848. It was then called a province and had following eleven sub-divisions. Bijapur (now in Mysore state) Jaoli, Karad, Khanapur, Khatev, Koregaon, Pandhappur, Satara, Tasgaon, Valva and Wai. A no. of territorial changes took place in the subsequent years. Consequent upon the merger of former princely States into the Indian Union, parts of Fhaltan, Jamkhindi, Akkalkot, Bhor, Aundh and Sangli States and one village from Poona district were added to Satara district. A new Tahsil of Fhaltan was created, and four tehsils Khanapur, Tasgaon, Valva and Shirala were transferred to the newly formed Sangli district (then named as South Satara district) with head quarters at Sangli in 1949. Satara district (then known as North Satara district) has since then the present set up of 11 tehsils. In 1958, village Shangaon from Khanapur tehsil of Sangli district was transferred to Karad tehsil of Satara district. The name of the district was changed from North Satara district to Satara district in 1960.

1.6 DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION :-

1) STATE ADMINISTRATION :- Until May 1962 the administrative set up of the district was under the unitary control of the district Collector, After passing of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act in 1962, the administrative set-up became dual. Excepting for a few safeguards, the developmental functions and administrative functions excluding matters relating to law and

order, judicial functions and developmental functions involving high technical skill have been devolved on Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities, with the Chief Executive Officer as their executive head. Under Govt. Sector, Collector continues to act as the district head and also as coordinating authority. The Collector, who is also the District Magistrate to maintain law and order, is in charge of general administration, treasury, land revenue and civil supply. He is assisted by a Resident Dy. Collector and three Dy. Collectors, who hold charge of the three revenue divisions and have their head quarters at Satara, Phaltan and Mahabaleshwar. The district is divided into eleven tehsils and they are in charge of the Tehsildars stationed at the tehsil headquarters.

The Superintendent of Police heads district police force. He is assisted by two Dy. Superintendents stationed at Satara and Karad, below them the Sub-Inspectors are posted at Tehsil head quarters. Various branches such as crime, local intelligence, Anticorruption have been evolved for efficient maintenance of law and order in the district.

On the judicial side the District and the Sessions Judge is the head of the Judicial department in the district. He is assisted by two Assistant Judges and Additional Sessions Judge. For convenience of administration of justice and for the public convenience, civil judges are posted at tehsil level. They deal with both civil and criminal suits at tehsil level.

The Executive Engineer B and C Dept. Satara is in charge of all roads and buildings in the district which fall in the state sector. The Executive Engineer (Irrigation) is in charge of all State Sector irrigation

Projects in the district. Besides him, there are special Executive Engineers for Irrigation and Power projects such as Koyana Dam Project., Dhom Dam Project, Vir Dam Project, Borkhal Project and Pathakal Project. Office of the Superintending Engineer named as D.I.C III to supervise, coordinate and control the activities of these irrigation projects is situated at Satara.

The office of the Dy. Registrar of Cooperative Societies is located at Satara. The Dy. Registrar is assisted by three Asstt. Registrars having different territorial jurisdictions.

The Divisional Forest Officer, Satara has his head-quarters at Satara. The other important state sector offices located at Satara are those of Divisional Soil Conservation Officer (at Satara and Phaltan), Consolidation Officer, Sales Tax Officer, District Employment Officer, District Industries Officer, District Statistical Officer, publicity Officer, Superintendent of Prohibition and Excise Civil Surgeon, Malaria Officer, District Marketing Officer, District Prison Superintendent, Principal I.T.I. Poultry Project Officer, Town Planner.

ii) CENTRAL GOVT. ADMINISTRATION :-

The Offices of Income Tax Officer, Superintendent of Central Excise and the Superintendent of Post Offices are located at Satara.

iii) LOCAL BODIES :-

Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities, Act. Satara Zilla Parishad and eleven Panchayat Samities have been established in 1962. The area under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities correspond to the district and tehsil boundaries respectively excepting the Municipal areas which are under

the control of municipal councils. Ninety Seven Point Two percent of the district area and 89.46 percent of population of the Satara district is covered under the Zilla Parishad. It has replaced the erstwhile statutory bodies known as District local board, District Panchayat Mandal and District School Board.

The Zilla Parishad is headed by the President elected from the elected members. A vice president is also elected the same way. For three committees viz. 1) Works and Health Committee 2) Finance and Education Committee. 3) Agril. and Coop. Committee, Chairmen are to be elected to look after the developmental work falling under their respective jurisdiction. To carry out the administrative and executive work of the parishad an officer in the senior scale of I.

A.S. works as the Chief Executive Officer of the Zilla Parishad. He is assisted by various departmental heads viz. the Agril. Developmental Officer, the District Health Officer, the District Animal Husbandry Officer, the Administrative Officer for village panchayats, the Education Officer, the Executive Engineer, Cooperation and Industries Officer, Social Welfare Officer, the Chief Accounts and Finance Officer and the Dy. Chief Executive Officer for carrying out the developmental activities effectively.

At the tehsil level, Panchayat Samities have an elected chairman and vice chairman called as sabhapati and Upsabhapati respectively. The Block Development Officer works as Secretary to the Panchayat Samiti. He is the administrative and executive head at tehsil level, under Zilla Parishad. The State Govt. Officers continue to exercise technical supervision and give necessary guidance to the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities, The State Govt. have

~~powers to issue directions to the Zilla Parishad in respect~~
of any works and schemes in the interest of National and
State Developmental Plans.

The other local bodies functioning in the district are the Municipal Councils of the 8 urban areas viz. Karad, Mahabaleshwar, Mhaswad, Panchagani, Phaltan, Rahimatpur Satara, Wai and village Panchayats at villa level. As per 1971 census in addition to above Satara Road, Bhade, Patan Gokul-Tarf Helwak, Sadashivgad and Humberli are treated as urban area. The total no. of village Panchayats functioning at the end of March 1972 in the district is 1080, under which all the villages in the district are covered.

The other statutory bodies functioning in the district are 1) the Maharashtra State Electricity Board 2) the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation and 3) the Life Insurance Corporation. The offices of all these corporate bodies are located at Satara. A sub office of Maharashtra State Finance Corporation is recently set up at Satara to assist the industries.

State Farming Corporation has an Estate at Sakharawadi, Phaltan Tehsil. Maharashtra Warehousing corporation has established an office at Karad.

1.7 DEMOGRAPHY :-

1) General :- The Satara district ranks 13th in population and 16th in area among the 26 districts of the Maharashtra State as per 1971 census. According to this census the human population of the Satara district is about 17.27 lakhs as against 14.30 lakhs of 1961 thus recording an increase of 20.8 percent in the 1961-71 decade.

ii) Density :- The population density of Satara district is 165 per Sq.Km. as per 1971 census. This is very

slightly higher than the State density of 164 persons per Sq.Km.

Within the district, great variations are observed in the tehsilwise population densities. The density is low in the hilly tracts of western zone and also in the scarcity affected areas in the eastern zone. The central zone consists of rich soil and has high proportion of net sown area to geographical area and as such it has the highest density of population.

iii) SEX RATIO :-

The sex ratio is the no. of females per thousand male population. The following have been the sex ratios for the Satara district.

Satara district has recorded a higher sex ratio at each census, than the State sex ratio. This was due to outmigration of males from the district. Difference in rural urban sex ratios indicate that out-migration is much more from rural areas than from urban areas of the district.

iv) LITERACY :-

The percentage of literacy increased substantially from 33.98 percent in 1961 to 38.32 percent in 1971 in the district. The female literacy rose from 21.16 percent in 1961 to 24.77 percent in 1971. The male literacy rose from 47.41 percent in 1961 to 52.38 percent in 1971.

As per 1971 census the percentage of literacy for the Satara district and the Poona division is ^{as} follows-

There has been substantial increase in the literacy in the decade 1961-71 in Satara district. The progress of female literacy particularly is a note-worthy achievement. The percentages are slightly higher in Satara district than in Poona division. The mass literacy campaign the scheme of compulsory primary education and the facilities extended by the well known Rayat Shikshan Sanstha of Satara have played a significant role in achieving this progress in the field of literacy. Satara district ranks second in Poona division.

vii) LIVELIHOOD CLASSIFICATION :-

As per 1971 census, of the total population of the district, 31.34 percent population is engaged in work. Remaining 68.66 percent population is non-working or dependent population. Seventy four point forty Seven percent of the working population derives its livelihood from Agricultural pursuits while the remaining from nonagricultural activities such as construction, industry, trade and commerce, transport, communication and other services.

As compared to the 1961 figures, there is a marked decrease in the proportion of workers in 1971. The decrease is more pronounced in the case of female workers, which is due to the change in the concept of the term worker adopted in 1971. Unlike the 1961 census the 1971 definition gave scope for the inclusion of housewives who had helped in cultivation or in the household industry carried on by other family member, for hour or more, as

workers.

Fifty six point Fifteen percent of the working population in 1971 in Satara district was engaged in cultivation as cultivators 18.32% as agricultural labourers and the rest 25.53% in other activities, i.e. 1.72% in livestock, forestry hunting, plantation orchards and allied activities, 0.39% in mining and quarrying, 7.29% in manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs (a -3.08% in household industry and 4.21% in other than household industry), 1.87% in construction, 4.25% in trade and commerce, 2.04% in transport storage and communications and 7.97% in other services.

1.9 FAMINES AND SCARCITY :-

The eastern part of the Satara district is prone to scarcity conditions. According to the Fact Finding Committee, appointed in 1960, the rainfall is not dependable in the areas of Lonand circle of Khandala tehsil, Man tehsil, southern, part of the Phaltan tehsil and Fusesavali and Vaduj circles of Khatav tehsil. The areas in Khandala and Man tehsils are likely to be affected by scarcity conditions once in six years, while areas in southern part of Phaltan and Khatav tehsils are likely to be affected once in ten years.

In recent years, it was in 1966-67 that scarcity conditions were reported in 52 villages in Phaltan tehsils only and after a gap of 3 years i.e. in 1970-71 scarcity conditions hit Khandala, Phaltan, Jaoli, Koregaon, Khatav and Man tahsils and then again in the year 1971-72 Khandala Phaltan and Man tahsils, The tahsilwise no. of villages and population affected is given below.

Full suspension of Land Revenue was granted in 41 villages in Khandala, 59 villages in Phaltan, 5 villages in Khatav and 53 villages in Man tehsil for the year 1970-71 and 46 villages in Khandala tehsils, 59 villages in Phaltan tahsil and 58 villages in Man tahsil for the year 1971-72.

CHAPTER - II

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Purpose :-

2.1 This is the 11th issue of the District Statistical Abstract prepared by this office since 1957-58. The purpose of the issue is to provide statistical data on as many topics as possible so that the Abstract may prove useful not only as an official reference book but also for research, planning and further socio economic studies. The data are presented, generally, tahsilwise to facilitate tahsilwise comparison. Where the data are not available tahsilwise, it is given for the district as a whole. The sources of the data collection are shown at the foot of each table, while unit of information is shown either in the column headings or at the right hand top corner below the Table number. Concepts, sources, limitations of the data are briefly discussed below.

District at a glance :-

2.2 In this table a few general particulars and important indicators under various heads such as population agriculture etc. are given with the corresponding figures for the Poona Division. The data on agriculture are generally received late. The data of 1970-71 is therefore presented in this Abstract. The livestock data is based on quinquennial census taken in 1966.

Area and Population :-

2.3 The data on area and population are based on the final figures of 1971 census. The data on houses and population, decadal variation in population since 1901 population of urban area, workers and non workers, etc. are cited under this head.

"A town or an urban area is a place which has a municipality, a cantonment or a civil line or a population 5000 or over and at least 3/4 ths of male population dependent on non agricultural pursuits.

A population enumerated in urban areas is urban population & the population enumerated in all other places is rural population.

A "Village" is a statutorily recognised village having a defined boundary and separate land records.

A person is classified as worker if (a) in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying household industry, etc., he had worked in the current or last working season for the greater part of the season, and (b) in the case of regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day of the enumerator's visit to the household.

A person who was working but was absent from his work during the fifteen days preceding the day on which enumerated or even exceeding the period of fifteen days due to illness or other causes has been treated as worker.

A person who has been offered work but had not actually joined has been treated as a non worker.

The 1971 census ~~and~~ stipulated that a person primarily engaged in household duties or those who were ~~Students~~ and helped with family economic activity but not on a full time scale should be treated as a non-workers in respect of their main activity.

Climate :-

2.4 Normal rainfall and monthly rainfall data and temperature data from the selected centres in the District

are reported in Table No.8 and 9 respectively. Normal rainfall data are based on the rainfall over a period of five to ~~six~~ 80 years. A day is counted as a rainy day if the rain gauge records a minimum of 2.5 mm. rainfall during the 24 hours of the day. As regards temperature, Mahabaleshwar is the only station in the district for which the data are available. The Directorate of the Indian Meteorological department, Bombay supplies this data. Mahabaleshwar is on a very high attitude of Sahyadri ranges and the data of this centre cannot therefore be said to be representative for the whole district.

Agriculture :-

2.5 The agricultural statistics of 1969-70 (final) and 1970-71 (Provisional) are presented in the tables 10 to 20 (B), Land use, crop pattern, outturn of crops, yield rates, irrigation sources and area and crops irrigated, irrigation projects, wage rates, data on agricultural implements and scarcity and famine conditions are some of the salient topics dealt with under agricultural statistics. The data collected from the District Inspector of Land Records, Season and Crop reports are of provisional nature. The finalised data, wherever available from the Statistician, Deptt. of Agriculture are reproduced in these tables. The Zilla Parishad, the Panchayat Samities, the Executive Engineers of Irrigation Projects the Collectorate, and the Bureau of Economics and Statistics are other sources for various tables on agricultural statistics. There are variations in the Area figures obtained from the Surveyor General and those based on village papers. The latter are sum total of data given by talathis where as the former are calculated in blocks.

All lands actually afforested and lands classed and administered as forests, whether state owned or private are termed as 'forests' if any portion of such forests is not wooded but put to agricultural use it is shown under that appropriate head.

Land put to Non-agricultural uses stand for lands occupied by buildings, roads, railways, rivers, canals or other such purposes.

Lands which cannot be brought under cultivation except at a very high cost are classed as unculturable lands, whether in isolated blocks or in cultivated holdings.

Culturable waste includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and the last five years or more in succession.

Current fallow lands comprise cropped area kept fallow during the current year. Other fallows include all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than 5 years.

The net sown area consists of area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once in a year being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents sum total of area under all crops in a year. The estimates of average yields and production in respect of rice, bajara, jawar, wheat, gram, cotton, groundnut, tobacco, ragi and tur are based on the results of crops estimation surveys conducted annually by the Agriculture Deptt. The estimates of yields for the remaining crops are based on the anna valuation figures and normal yields reported by the Revenue Officers.

Animal Husbandry forests and fisheries :-

2.6 Statistics on animal husbandry, collected through the 10th quinquennial census of 1966 are reproduced in table No. 21. The data collected from the District Animal Husbandry Officer, Municipal Councils on veterinary dispensaries, animal diseases, artificial inseminations, livestock mortality, slaughter houses statistics are shown in tables on this subject.

The Statistician, forests deptt. and Divisional Forests Officer provides data on forest area and forest produce. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production and in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forest, the restrictions are not so rigid, right of grazing or cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassed forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste.

Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity :-

2.7 Tables 26, 27, 28 present data on registered factory statistics e.g. on employment, working strength of factories, days worked by the factories. The word "factories" here includes only the registered factories. They are of three types.

- i) Factories using no power but employing 20 or more workers.
- ii) Factories using power and employing 10 or more workers,
- and iii) Factories not covered by (i) and (ii) above but notified by the Government as covered by the Factories Act.

Tables 29, 30 and 31 are based on the data collected from the district Employment Exchange. The monthly registration of unemployed persons, notification of vacancies, placements as also volume of employment by type of

Industry is shown in these tables.

Data on census of Govt. employees conducted in 1966 is repeated in Table no. 32 and 33.

On the basis of data collected through the Annual Survey of Industries a table is prepared on registered factories in various industry classification groups, showing their productive capital, employment, gross output and value added. The figures are of provisional nature and are based on actuals of reporting census sector factories and estimates of sample sector factories.

Tables 35 and 36 are included to show consumption of electricity and towns and villages electrified in Satara District. The data are collected from the M.S.E.B. and also from the private electric company of Satara. All the electricity is now supplied by the M.S.E.B. and no electricity is generated in the district by any private company. The private company purchases it from the M.S.E.B. and sells the same to its consumers in Satara.

Cooperation :-

2.8 The Tables on cooperation (numbers 37 to 44)^S are compiled from the data supplied by the District Dy. Registrar of Cooperative Societies and the Agricultural Produce Market Committees. Statistical information is shown separately for i) Primary Agricultural Credit Societies. ii) Agricultural Non Credit Societies. iii) Non-agricultural Credit Societies. iv) ~~Non-agricultural~~ ^{Non Agril. Non} ~~Credit~~ ^{Marketing} Societies. v) ~~Marketing~~ Societies.

The District Central Coop. Bank and the Land Development Bank are covered under Agril. Credit Societies and shown in Table No. 37. Urban Banks, Salary Earners Societies, factory workers societies are covered under Non-Agricultural Credit Societies.

Working capital includes paid up capital, deposits and borrowings. The break up of loan advanced by coop. Banks is shown by the term of loan, short, medium and long term. All long term loans are given by the Land Development Bank, whereas both short term and medium term loans are given by District Central Coop. Bank and Urban Banks. Overdue loans refer to amount of loan or installments which were due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted. The cooperative year starts in July and ends in June. Salient achievements of the coop. Societies, such as marketing fisheries, farming, irrigation, agricultural processing, sugar factories, consumers, housing are shown in Table No. 42. Commoditywise turnover in the regulated markets is shown in the Table No. 43.

A separate table No. 44 is given on registered money lenders and loans advanced by them. The data are collected from the Dy. Registrar of Cooperative Societies.

Medical and Public Health :-

2.9 Data on medical facilities and other vital statistics such as births, deaths are shown in tables under this section. The data are collected from Civil Surgeon, Dist. Health Officer, Zilla Parishad, Municipalities and Director of Public Health, Fcona.

Under medical facilities data are given for hospitals, dispensaries, maternity houses, primary health centres, medical personnel, hospital beds as also the no. of indoor and out door patients availing these facilities. In table No. 46 data on births, deaths, infant deaths are recorded. Table No. 47 shows causes of deaths, occurred in the district.

The birth rate and death rate are given in the District at a Glance. Birth rate is the no. of births per thousand estimated population of the year. Death rate is similarly the number of deaths per thousand estimated population of the year. The data on vital statistics are collected through revenue agency for rural area and for urban area it is the statutory function of Municipal Corporations and councils. The data presented on medical facilities are of State and Central Govt. institutions, institutions owned and run by municipal councils and local bodies and public aided institutions. The private clinics run by individuals are not included in these tables.

The year of reference for medical and health statistics is the calendar year.

Education :-

2.10 Salient features of the progress of education in Satara district are presented in this section. Literacy in each Taluka as per 1971 census, education on Rural and Urban Areas in each taluka as per 1961 census no. of educational institutions, pupils, teachers by type of education, B.C. beneficiaries, educational concessions, expenditure on primary education by various agencies, are the various subjects dealt with under the tables on education.

The sources of data are the 1971 Census, the Directorate of Education, the Parishad Education Officer Zilla Parishad, and the Registrar of Shivaji University,

The classification of institutions according to "Type" is slightly different from "Stages" of education. Many secondary schools impart education in primary courses. Nevertheless, the entire enrolment of students is included under secondary education. A realistic picture may be had only after obtaining the breakup of students according to

standards. The pre-primary institutions i.e. the kindergardens, montessorys educate the children between age 3 to 5. Primary educational institutions provide education for pre-primary and standards I-IV or I to VII/VIII or less, and teach the curriculum approved by the Education Deptt. Whereas Secondary institutions coach students for standards VIII to XI with or without lower standards, Higher Education is education after passing the secondary school certificate Examination, leading to degree examinations.

The Tahsilwise break up of data on institutions, pupils teachers in respect of pre-primary education, secondary education and special schools could not be obtained for publication in these tables. Only district totals are supplied. The years of references are the educational years 1970-71 and 1971-72.

Transport and Communication :-

2.11 Important statistics on different modes of transport, category of roads, traffic census, posts, telegraphs, telephones and radio licenses issued and rural broadcasting are given in this section.

The difficulty arises in getting accurate rail length in the district. The length had to be compiled by reference to railway time tables and railway map. The figures presented in table No. 57 are therefore, approximate that extent. Information presented in this table pertains to to/new broad gauge line. The road statistics presented in table 58 are for both extra municipal roads and roads within municipal limits, shown separately. The statistics of motor vehicles in the district are not available separately. Therefore, the statistics of motor vehicles in Poona Region, (comprising of Poona, Ahmednagar, Satara and Sholapur district) are presented in Table No. 52. The vehicles shown are as per live register maintained by the R.T.O. Poona. Table No. 60 gives

statistics of nationalised Road Transport of the Satara S.T.Division. The Satara S.T.Division comprises of Satara district and a part of Sangli district.

The reference year for these tables is the financial year 1971-72. The data on traffic census is based on the census taken in May 1969.

Local Bodies :-

2.12 Financial position of Village Panchayats, Municipal Councils and Zilla Parishad is shown in this section for the year 1971-72.

The no. of village Panchayats include no. of independent village Panchayats as also group village Panchayats. Income and expenditure of Village Panchayats are exclusive of opening and closing balance respectively. Grants include grants from Govt. as well as from Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities for developmental activities. Govt. grants in respect of municipal councils are mainly grants on account of dearness allowance, grants for roads, for water supply, for educational purposes, for medical purposes and on account of percentage in land revenue. The receipts of Zilla Parishad are shown under four sub-heads, viz., i) Self raised resources, ii) Govt. Grants, iii) Grants for agency scheme and iv) debt section. The expenditure is shown under two heads. Revenue expenditure and debt section.

The data are collected from the Zilla Parishad Satara and all the Municipal Councils in Satara District.

Annual Plan and Community Development :-

2.13 The Table 68 included in this section gives details of expenditure under each sub-head of development for state and Centrally sponsored programme for 1971-72. Important physical achievements are given sub-head-wise in table No. 69.

These data are based on the quarterly progress reports received from various implementing officers.

The stagewise blocks under C.D. Programme are shown in Table No.70 while stagewise expenditure in each tahsil is shown in Table No.71. Physical achievements of these C.D.blocks are shown in Table No.72. The data are compiled from the quarterly returns received from the Panchayat Samities in the district.

Prices :-

2.14 There are three tables in this section. The first table No.73 is newly included for this year which presents data on wholesale prices of certain agricultural commodities at regulated markets. The second i.e. table No.74 is on average retail prices of important commodities at the District Head Quarter Satara. The data are presented for all the months of the year 1971.

The data are collected on every Friday from selected shops, for given specifications of the selected commodities. As such they cannot be said to be fully representative. However, the data may be useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over a period of time.

In the table No.75 the consumer price Index Numbers for working class of Sholapur and Poona centres are given. The Index is compiled by the office of the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay.

Miscellaneous :-

2.15 As the title indicates data on other various subjects such as police, crime, court cases, theatres, Joint stock companies, Life Insurance, Small Savings etc. are presented in this section.

Trends in selected indicators:-

2.16 Table No. 87 shows important indicators in the various fields of development such as population, agriculture, livestock, industry, electricity, cooperation, etc. Besides these, tahsilwise indicators are worked out and appended at the end.

CHAPTER NO. III

AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS 1971-72.

3.1 In part II of this volume statistical data on various subjects is presented. In this chapter the data are analysed with a view to ascertaining the significant achievements in various socio-economic fields of development.

3.2 The years 1960-61, 1965-66, 1969-70 and 1971-72 have been considered for the analytical review. However, in the case of agriculture, data regarding which are generally received late, the years of reference are 1960-61, 1965-66, 1969-70 and 1970-71.

3.3 Agricultural development over a period of time can best be judged from 3 main indicators. They are 1) Percentage of gross area sown to net area sown 2) Percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown. 3) Productivity of important crops.

3.4 TABLE NO. 1

3.5 The above table shows that the percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area was more (108) in 1960-61 as compared to the figures in 1965-66, 1969-70 and 1970-71. The position of Satara district compares favourably with that of Poona Division. As compared to 1960-61 the percentage is more only in Phaltan and Khatav tehsils in 1969-70 and 1970-71.

3.6 In 1960-61 the gross cropped area was 7.35 lakh hectares. It was 7.32 lakh hectares in 1965-66. In 1970-71 it rose to 7.51 lakh hectares. Thus it will be seen that there was little addition to the gross cropped area during the ten year period.

3.7 The range of percentages of gross cropped area to net cropped area in the tehsils of Satara district is from 103 to 115 (1970-71). The percentage is highest in Khandala tehsil (115%) and lowest in Karad Tahsil (103%). The percentage in Phaltan, Wai, Jaoli, Koregaon, Khatav and Patan tehsils is greater than the district percentage of 107.

3.8 The gross irrigated area in the district increased from 1.01 lakh hectare in 1960-61 to 1.03 lakh hectare in 1969-70 and it was 1.02 lakh hectare in 1970-71. In 1965-66 however, the irrigated area declined to 0.90 lakh hectare. In 1969-70 and 1970-71 the gross irrigated area showed an increase of 2 percent and 1 percent resp. over 1960-61 area.

3.9 The net area irrigated by different sources in the years 1960-61, 1965-66, 1969-70 and 1970-71 is shown below.

3.10 There is a net addition of 4 percent area in the net irrigated area in 1970-71 over that in 1960-61. The area irrigated by wells has increased by 21 percent in 1970-71 as compared to 1960-61. Also net area irrigated by other sources increased by 63 percent. The no. of wells in use has increased from 34340 in 1965-66 to 37365 in 1970-71.

3.11 The net irrigated area figures and the net area sown figures during the three reference years are as under.

3.12 The percentage of net area irrigated to net sown area comes to 11.70, 10.29, 11.89 and 11.74 in the years 1960-61, 1965-66, 1969-70 and 1970-71. The increase in this percentage is very small. However, the percentage for Satara district compares favourably with the corresponding percentage of Poona Division. In the Poona Division the percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown was 10.00 in 1960-61, 10.37 in 1965-66, 10.87 in 1969-70 and 11.15 in 1970-71.

3.13 Productivity of important Crops :-

The principal crops in Satara district are Jowar Bajra, Rice, Wheat, Gram, Tur, Groundnut, Sugarcane and Cotton. The yield rates of these crops are given below.

3.14 The year 1965-66 experienced scarcity conditions and the yield rates in 1965-66 were very low. The yield rates in 1970-71 showed an increase as compared to those in 60-61 in respect of Bajra, Rice and Groundnut, while in the case of the remaining crops the yield rate had declined.

3.15 Changes in cropping pattern:-

The following table will broadly indicate the trend of cropping pattern in this district.

3.16 The percentage of area under food crops shows a declining trend, which in other words means there is an increase in the percentage of area under non-food crops. More than 5 percent of the cropped area has been shifted from growing food crops to non-food crops. Under the sub-head food crops, it will be seen that there was reduction in this percentage in 1969-70 and 1970-71 over that in 1960-61 in respect of both cereals and pulses.

3.17 The percentage of areas under different irrigated crops to gross irrigated area, show that the percentage of total irrigated food crops has decreased from 93.56 in 60-61 to 92.35 in 1965-66, 91.75 in 1969-70 and 91.42 in 1970-71. The percentage of irrigated non-food crops increased from 6.44 in 1960-61, to 7.65 in 1965-66, 8.25 in 1969-70 and 8.58 in 1970-71. For details, the following table is designed.

3.19 Wage Rates :- The data on agricultural wage rates in rural areas are collected in three rural centres in Satara district since 1963-64. The centres are Umbraj in Karad Tahsil, Limb in Satara tehsil and Koregaon in Koregaon tehsil.

3.20 The wage rates are found to vary at different places depending on the nearness to urban areas. During 1971 the male field labourers are found to get wages between Rs.2.50 to 4.00 at Umbraj, between Rs.3.00 to 4.00 at Limb and Rs.3.00 at Koregaon. The female labour is paid between Rs.1.75 to Rs. 2.25 at Umbraj, between Rs.1.25 to Rs.2.00 at Limb and Rs.2.00 at Koregaon. Data on wages of child labour is not reported at these centres.

3.21 Skilled workers such as carpenters, blacksmiths, cobblers whose services are required occasionally for agricultural purposes are sometimes observed to be paid in cash. Carpenters, blacksmiths are found to earn Rs.5.0 to Rs.6.0. Generally they are paid on baluta system on annual basis and as such their employment in agricultural sector on daily basis is still a phenomenon not very frequently noticed in rural areas.

3.22 Live Stock and Poultry:-

Animal Husbandry makes a substantial contribution to the economy by providing subsidiary income to farmers, food to human population and provides avenues of employment to landless labourers. A quinquennial census of Livestock, ~~xxx~~ poultry and agricultural implements is carried out all over the country. The 10th Livestock census was done in 1966.

3.23 The following data will depict tehsilwise details of livestock per 100 hectares.

3.24 It will be seen from the above table that the indicator in Jaoli tehsil is very low. It is also below district average in Mahabaleshwar, Koregaon, Khatav, Satara and

Patan tehsils. As against this Khandala, Wai, Man and Karad have a fairly high no. of livestock per 100 hectare. The district average and average of Phaltan tehsil is the same.

3.25 The no. of livestock per 100 hectare for Poona Division as a whole was 116. The indicator 131 for Satara District compares favourably with that of the Division.

3.26 The total poultry in 1966 was 7,76,198 as against 6,57,771 in 1961. The human population according to 1961 census for Satara District was 14,30,105. The poultry per 100 population was 460 in 1961 and 543 in 1966. The comparative ratios for Poona Division are 344 for 1961 and 394 for 1966. (Population assumed to be constant.).

3.27 Consumption of Electricity :-

In 1960-61 the per capita consumption of electricity was 4.53 kwh in Satara district. In 1971-72 the per capita consumption was 32.18 kwh. The per capita electricity consumption in Poona Division was 84.85 kwh. in 71-72. The consumption is comparatively very poor in Satara district, indicating its backwardness.

3.28 All urban areas in the Satara district have been electrified. In rural areas there are 1175 villages. Till 60-61 only 30 villages were electrified. By 1965-66, 186 villages were electrified. As at the end of 1970-71 the total no. of villages electrified was 484 and 535 as at the end of 1971-72. This works out to 46 percent of the total villages in the district.

3.29 Enrollment in the Employment Exchange & Vacancies notified:-

The statistics available with the District Employment Exchange on this subject throws light on the gravity of unemployment situation in general. A large portion of unemployed labour force does not avail of the service of the

employment exchange. This comprises mostly of uneducated masses and unskilled agricultural labour, who are either not at all employed throughout the year or are seasonally employed. Statistics of such unemployment is not reflected in the data of the Employment Exchange. The data available with the Employment Exchange, Satara are presented in the following table.

3.30 Enrollment of candidates at the employment exchange is 40 percent higher in 1971-72 than that in 1965-66. However, the percentage of notified vacancies to total registration during 1971-72 declined to 10 percent from 28% in 1960-61. In the year 1971-72 only 889 vacancies were notified as against 992 in 1970-71 and 1823 in 1960-61.

3.31 Increase in indoor and outdoor patients treated:-

The medical facilities are being availed of by increasing numbers of patients year after year through public and public aided bodies in this district. The following table shows a little decrease in indoor and outdoor patients, in 1971 as compared to 1970.

3.32 The medical facilities availed by patients in 1971 was 187 percent of that in 1961. The indoor patients have considerably increased over 1961 though there is a little decrease of both indoor and outdoor patients in 1971 over 1970.

3.33 Increase in no. of students in different categories:-

There has been increase in the no. of students and teachers at all the levels of education in Satara district during 70-71 as compared to the position in the earlier year.

In the case of pre-primary education, there was an addition of 8 institutions in the district in 1969-70, while there is no addition of any institution in 1970-71. The percentage increase by 7% in the no. of students is also very poor as compared to the previous year.

In the case of primary education, there was an addition of 14 schools in the district in 1970-71. The no. of students increased by 6295 in the year 1970-71 over the previous year showing an increase of 2.29% while the no. of teachers decreased by 56. Percentage decrease is 0.73% over the previous year. The ratio of students to teachers which was 35.79 : 1 in 1969-70 rose to 36.87 : 1 in 1970-71 which does not indicate the improvement in the Teachers students ratio.

In case of Secondary education there has been an addition of 13 institutions in 1970-71. The no. of students

increased by 2.59 percent in 1970-71 over the previous year. The percentage increase in case of girls is more. It is 6.0 percent while the percentage increase in no. of boys is 1.66 percent. The teacher student ratio which was 1 :- 23.75 in 1969-70 has declined to 1 :23.51 in 1970-71 showing a little improvement in the ratio.

In case of higher education there has been increase in the no. of students while the no. of institutions~~are~~ declined to 15 in 1970-71 from 16 in the earlier year. There is an increase of 15.05 percent in the no. of college going students over the previous year.

3.34 - Increase in Banking Facilities :-

The total no. of banking offices in the district was 76 at the beginning of 1970. This figure rose to 90 in the year 1971. The population covered for the reference year is 296818 as per 1961 census.

The no. of scheduled banking offices rose from 39 to 50 during the reference year. It will thus be seen that the scheduled commercial banks are now taking more and more interest in opening branches in rural areas to cater the need~~ful~~ of agriculturists and small traders and small scale Industries.

3.35 Increase in Road Length :-

Rail length consequent ^{up on} conversion of metre guage to broad guage in Satara district as on 31-3-72 was 124 Km.

3.36 At the end of March 1972 the total road length of all types excluding municipal roads was 4136.44 Km. The road length at the end of March 1961 was 2481.06 Km. and at the end of March 1966, it was 3164.43 Km. Thus the road length per 100 Sq. Km. of area increased from 24 Km. in 1960-61 to 30 Km. in 1965-66 and to 39 Km. in 1971-72.

3.37 Prices :-

A glance at the consumer price index for working class (Sholapur centre) will show that the general price index in 1971-72 shot up by 98 percent over the base year 1960. The food group items recorded 114 percent increase during this period, while pan supari and tobacco and fuel and lighting groups recorded 78 and 75 percent increase respaly. Clothing bedding and foot wear group shows 88 percent increase while miscellaneous group items showed 68 percent rise.

3.38 Since November 1962 prices of important commodities are collected by the District Statistical Organisation at each of the district head quarters. The prices of certain important commodities prevailing in 1962, 1965, 1970 and 1971 at district head quarter, Satara are given below.

3.39 It is observed that almost all commodities of daily necessity have recorded sharp rise in price in successive years over the base year 1962. However, while compared to the previous year it seems that in case of commodities Rice, Wheat, Jowar, Gramdal, Groundnut Oil, Vanaspati (loose), Potato and Chillies there was small decrease in the prices. Jowar which is the staple food of the population of this district rose from 53 paise in 1962 to Rs. 1.13 in 1971 showing an increase of 113 percent. Gram dal too showed an almost equal rise of 110 percent during the same period. Groundnut oil increased from Rs. 2.00 in 1962 to Rs. 4.59 in 1971. The increase is 129 percent.

Vanaspati (Dalda) recorded 92.25 percent rise in 1971 over the 1962 price. Gur rose from 73 paise in 1962 to Rs. 1.48 in 1971 showing an increase of 103 percent. Tea (leaf) rose by 32 percent during the same period while kerosene rose from 38 paise in 1962 to 60 paise in 1970 showing an increase of nearly 58 percent and was constant in 1971. The price of ordinary cigarettes rose by 123 percent over a span of 8 years. Washing soap price increased from Rs. 1.50 per bar in 1962 to Rs. 2.10 in 1971 showing 40 percent rise in price.

C H A P T E R - I V

ANNUAL PLAN 1971-72

4.1 The year 1971-72, under the review was the third year of the Fourth Five Year Plan. After completion of the Third Five Year Plan, series of Annual Plans were implemented in the Satara District as elsewhere in the Maharashtra State. The annual plan of the Maharashtra for the year 1971-72 was of the size of Rs.201 crores as against Rs.170 crores for the year 1970-71. The allotted budget of Annual Plan of Satara district for the year under the review was Rs.3.33 crores for the district level schemes implemented in the state and centrally sponsored plans from both the state and local sector. The budget was about Rs.47 lakhs more than that of the year 1970-71.

4.2 The following table gives the major headwise expenditure incurred during the years 1970-71 and 1971-72 in the state and local sector schemes executed in the state and central plans together in Satara District.

4.3 Fersal of the above table reveals that Rs.37.91 lakhs were spent more in the year 1971-72 than the previous year i.e. 15% more money was spent in 1971-72. The annual percapita expenditure (based on 1961 population) on plan schemes in Satara district was Rs.10 during the Third Plan period and the same was found to have increased to Rs.19/- in 1971-72 (based on 1971 population data). As compared to the expenditure incurred in the year of review with that in the year 1970-71, it will be seen that more expenditure was made on the heads of 'Irrigation and Power, Miscellaneous Social Services and Industries' Programmes, while the same was less on Agril. Programme and Coop. and C.D. and Transport and Communication.

4.4 In the Annual Plan 1971-72 of Satara district 82 schemes were implemented in the State and Centrally Sponso-red Plans together. Of the 82 schemes, 50 schemes, were excuted in the State sector and 26 schemes in the Local sector and 6 schemes in both the sectors.

4.5 Agricultural Programmes:-

During the Annual Plan under review high priority was assigned to this major head of development through which important schemes relating to grow-more food, Irrigation Pro-grammes etc. were executed in Satara district.

4.6 From the above table, it is seen that 90% of the allotted budget for the major head "Agril. Programmes" was utilised during the year 1971-72. The provision earmarked under the sub-head Animal Husbandry, Dairy Development and Warehousing was fully spent, and that under "Forest" it was spent in excess, and under other sub-heads there was saving to some extent, much being under fisheries.

1. Agril. Production :-

Under this sub-head of development, under the state plan 6 schemes and under the Centrally Sponsored Programme 2 schemes were implemented in Satara district during the year 1971-72, 5 in the state and 2 in the local sectors and one in both the sectors. On these schemes, Rs.9.17 lakhs were spent, Rs.1.20 lakhs in the state sector and Rs.7.97 lakhs in the local sector. The important schemes executed were i) Integrated Area development-Small-holders in Karad block ii) Town Compost iii) Horticultural development and iv) Intensive cultivation of food crops, in which almost all grants were fully utilised, Progress of expenditure on "Taluka Seed farms" was however, to the extent of more than 50% only due to slow progress of constructional activities on seed farms.

The physical achievements thus fell short of the targets.

2. Minor Irrigation :-

Under this sub head ~~these~~ schemes of well subsidy, pump-set subsidy, coop. Lift Irrigation were implemented in the State plan and the scheme of Minor Irrigation works under Rural works Programme was executed under Centrally Sponsored Programme. The scheme of Minor Irrigation works was also executed in the state plan in both the sectors. On the above schemes 75 percent of allotted provision was expended during the year 1971-72. During the period of review, 316 wells & 221 pump set cases were subsidised, 7 coop. Lift irrigation works started, 7 bandharas, 2 percolation tanks works and 9.12 lakh ^{Running} Km. of excavation of channels were completed. Also under the central Sponsored Plan Rural Works Programme 5 works ~~are~~ were in progress.

3. Soil Conservation :-

All the four schemes were implemented in the state sector and 98 percent of sanctioned grants were spent during the year 1971-72 in Satara district, and 13970 hec. of area was bunded and 996 hec. area terraced as against the resp. targets of 22079 and 1173 hectares. Also 8 hectares of Saline and Alkaline land was covered and 170 hec. of plantation and 162 hec. of premonsoon work was done during the above period.

4. Animal Husbandry :-

There was only one scheme of "Veterinary Aid Centres and dispensaries." executed in the local sector and 100% grants were utilised for opening of 2 aid centres and dispensary buildings. The progress of the scheme was satisfactory.

5. Dairy Development :-

Under the sub head, both the schemes implemented pertained to the state sector on which Rs.0.51 lakhs(100%)

expenditure was made during 1971-72. The milk procured was 2245 litres on average as against the target of 3500 literes and 30 coop. Milk Societies federations were assisted.

6. Forests :-

On the four schemes implemented under the sub head, 104 percent of the allotment was spent during the year of review and 215 hec. of plantation and 257 hec. of premon-soon works were carried out as per programme through these schemes of afforestation, and fodder development.

7. Fisheries :-

The progress of the two schemes executed under "Fisheries" programme was not satisfactory due to less scope to this activity in Satara district. 1.80 lakh Kg. of fish stocking was done and 200 Kg. of cotton and 112 Kg. of Nylong twine was distributed. Only 33 percent of budget amount was spent.

8. Warehousing and Marketting :-

On the scheme of "Development of Agril. Marketting" Rs. 0.25 lakhs were spent in Satara district for assisting 7 Agril. Produce Market Committees during the year under review.

4.7 B :- Cooperation and Community Development :-

Under this major head, 5 schemes were implemented in the state sector and three schemes in the local sector in Satara district one scheme was implemented under the centrally Sponsored Plan. An amount of Rs. 9.61 lakhs (practically 100% of the budgetted amount) was spent on the above schemes during the period of review. Physical targets were fulfilled in most cases which will be seen from the following table.

4.8 C Irrigation and Power :-

Scheme of Rural Electrification and Normal Development was executed in Satara district by spending Rs.20.14 lakhs out of the allotment of Rs.26 lakhs during the year 1971-72. The expenditure was about 4 times the previous year's expenditure. Through this programme 9 out of target of 12 villages were electrified and 502 Agril.pumps were energised alongwith maintenance and Normal development works.

4.9 D Industry and Mining :-

Under "Small Scale Industries" development programme one scheme was operated in the state and two schemes in the local sector and one in both the sectors of the state plan. A little over 100 percent grants were exhausted on these schemes for assisting one weavers' society, 4 industrial coop.socys, 84 beneficiaries assisted under "the state aid to Small Scale Industries under S.A.I. Rules" Scheme and 39 persons were granted grant-cum-subsidies for their cottage Industries units.

4.10 E :- Transport and Communications :-

Under this programme, road development schemes pertaining to the district roads, hilly and backward areas roads, village roads, black topping of roads were implemented in the state and local sectors. Practically full amount sanctioned was utilised on the above schemes. Work of 2 bridges, 9.7 km. of district roads, 192 km. of roads in hilly areas were in progress. So also 17 C.D. works on District Roads were completed during the year 1971-72.

4.11 Scheme of Development of Pratapsinh park at Mahabaleshwar was executed under "Tourism" through Forest Deptt. during the period of review by spending 64 percent of the budget provision for the year 1971-72. Work of log house is in progress.

4.12 E Social Services :-

This major head of development, like Agfil. Programmes, occupies significant place in the Annual Plan of Satara district of the year 1971-72 and important schemes relating to General and Technical education, public Health Housing, water supply, Backward class welfare etc. were executed through various Implementing Officers.

4.13 Sub-headwise expenditure and its percentage to the budget provision for the year 1971-72 is given in the following table.

4.14 From the above table, it will be seen that 96 per-
cent of the budget was spent during the period of review on
all the minor heads under this programme, under the State
and Central Plans together. The expenditure incurred was 63
percent more than that of the previous year. The progress
of expenditure was satisfactory under all subheads except-
ing "Labour and Labour Welfare."

4.15 General Education :-

Under this sub head 6 schemes were implemented in
the state sector and 6 schemes in the local sector by spe-
nding 97 percent of the allotted provision of the year
1971-72. The important schemes executed in the local and
state sectors were 1) Expansion of Primary education ii) Gra-
nts to local bodies for const. of Primary school buildings
iii) Basic training to Primary teachers iv) Development of
Non-Govt. secondary schools v) Concessions to Economically
backward classes vi) Free education to Sons and daughters
of Primary teachers.

The expenditure incurred during the year 1971-72
was nearly three times that of the previous year and the
progress on almost all the schemes was good excepting the
schemes of Appointment of Head masters in Primary schools
and eradication of illiteracy.

4.16 The following table shows important physical
achievements of the year 1971-72.

4.17 Technical Education :-

Two schemes were implemented in the state plan and one in the Central Plan in the state sector during 71-72 and almost all the allotted grants on these schemes were fully utilised. The expenditure was more by 150 percent over the previous year's expenditure. There was some saving due to non receipt of equipment for Govt. Polytechnic, Karad, Construction works at Satara and Karad, Technical High Schools and minor works on the hostel buildings of Engineering College, Karad are in progress.

4.18 - Health and Family Planning :-

Two schemes were implemented in the state plan (one each in the state and local sector) and three schemes (one in State and two schemes in Local sector) in the central plans. Comparatively less expenditure was reported on this programme in the year 1971-72 as compared to the previous year and only 77% of the budget ^{was} utilised. Minor works of Satara and Karad hospitals were in progress. During the year 200919 blood smears were collected, 281 surveillance villages covered under National Malaria eradication programme and 9213 sterilisation operations were performed as against the target of 12048 during the reference period.

4.19 :- Water Supply and drainage :-

Under this sub head on the Govt. Municipal and Rural water schemes expenditure of Rs. 40.13 lakhs was made and it was 14 percent more than the sanctioned grants. The same was also more by about Rs.17.00 lakhs over previous year's expenditure. Under Govt. and Municipal water supply and drainage schemes minor works were in progress at Satara Camp and Pan-chagani, Phaltan Mhaswad and Rahimatpur. Thirteen V.P. Water works were in progress and 179 well works and 38 piped water

supply works out of the targets of 250 and 50 resp. were completed and the remaining were in progress during the reference period.

4.20 Housing :-

Only two schemes i) Subsidised Industrial Housing and ii) Low income group housing scheme for economically weaker classes were implemented in Satara district during 1971-72 and 60 percent of the budget was exhausted, by doing ancillary work at Satara Road and Karad where 192 and 296 tenements were already completed long back.

4.21 Urban Development :-

Under the Scheme of "Financial Assistance to Local bodies for implementing development plans" for construction of primary schools and L.A. cost to Karad Municipal Council during 1971-72, 79 percent of budget was spent on the scheme.

4.22 Backward Class Welfare :-

Under this programme, 6 schemes were implemented in the local and two in the state sector of which one was in the central plan. Progress of all the schemes was satisfactory as 100 percent funds were spent. The important physical achievements are given in the following table :-

4.23 Labour and Labour Welfare :-

Under the scheme of Technical and vocational training, work of additional workshop at I.T.I.Satara and ancillary works at I.T.I.Karad were in progress during the period of review. The expenditure was however, not satisfactory (40 percent of the sanctioned amount). The same was also substantially less, compared to the previous year's expenditure.

4.24 :- § F - Miscellaneous :-

Under this programme scheme of Rural Broadcasting was executed in the state sector by spending Rs.2.02 lakhs (100% of the grants) One hundred and sixty Radio sets were installed in the year 1971-72.The expenditure incurred during 1971-72 was more than two and half times previous year's expenditure.

4.25 Perusal of the above table reveals that Rs.10.77 lakhs were spent more in the year 1971-72 than the previous year i.e.60% more amount was spent in 1971-72. More

expenditure was made on the heads of "Agril. Programmes" and "Social Services" while the expenditure on the head coop. and C.D. was less by 35 percent during the year 1971-72.

4.26 In the Annual plan of Satara district 8 schemes were implemented under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes out of these 8 schemes 4 schemes were executed in State Sector and 4 were executed in local sector.

4.27 Agril. Programme :-

During the Annual Plan under review out of Rs. 11.61 lakhs, Rs. 11.56 lakhs were spent on Minor Irrigation Works under Rural Works Programme, Five works were in progress during the year. The budget provision was exceeded by two thousand rupees.

4.28 Cooperation and Community Development :-

Under this head out of budget provision of Rs. 1.16 lakhs, an amount of Rs. 0.97 lakhs was spent on the scheme of Applied Nutrition Programme. During the year 1971-72 five more villages were covered under the scheme.

4.29 Social Services :-

Sub-headwise budget provision and expenditure incurred and percentages are as under:-
