CHAPTER I  
INTRODUCTION

LOCATION:

1.1. The Nasik District lies between  $19^{\circ}23'$  and  $20^{\circ}53'$  North latitude and  $73^{\circ}16'$  and  $75^{\circ}16'$  East longitude. With an approximate length of 300 Km.

BOUNDARIES:

1.2. It is surrounded by the Jalgaon District in the east and the north east, Dangs and Surat District of Gujarath state on the North west, while Thana is on the west and south west. Ahemadnagar is to the south and Aurangabad is to south east.

TOPOGRAPHY:

1.3. The District is situated partly in the Tapi basin and partly in the upper Godavari basin. Nandgaon, Kalwan, Baglan and Malegaon Talukas are drained in the North and north east by the Girna and its tributories. These Talukas lie in the Tapi basin while all the remaining Talukas are covered by Godavari basin and drained by the Godavari and its tributories, while the satmala range of hills provides a fine watershed between the above two basins.

HILLS AND RIVERS:

1.4.1. The satmala or Ajanta range runs right across the District. It stretches east-wards from the Sahyadris, particularly from the highest summit viz. Kalsubai having a height of about 1654 - Mtrs. The other main system of hills is Sahyadri and its offshoots which run from north to south on the western portion of the District. From the main Sahyadrian range, three prominent spurs stretch out to the east. Many of these ranges are <sup>mostly</sup> rocky flat topped and regular in height and slope, whereas some are conical and irregular.

1.4.2. The Godavari and the Girna are the two main rivers of the District. Other important rivers are Vaitarana, Darana, Mosam and Kadava. The Godavari rises at Brahmgi and drains Nasik and Niphad Talukas for---

for about 96 Km. . A huge earthen dam on this river has been built at Gangapur; for storage and irrigation; during its course The Kadava, The Darna and The Nasardi with many other small streams meet the Godavari.

1.4.3. The Girna rises at the West of the District, near Hatgad village in Surgana and flows through Kalwan and Malegaon Talukas. The course of Girna within District is 144 Km. No. river in this district is navigable.

SOILS:

1.5. Soil of Nasik District Can broadly be divided in to 4 groups, black (Kali), red (Mal) and black (Koral) and light brown (barad)

CLIMATE:

1.6. The climate of Nasik District can broadly be classified as 1) Man-soon-From June to September 2) Winter-from October to middle of March and 3) Summer- from middle of March to middle of June..

The District generally experiences Salubrious climate. The summer season is moderately hot and the temperature varies from 36<sup>o</sup> c to 43<sup>o</sup> c The rainy season is comparatively cooler with Scoradic rains distributed over all the mansoon period. The Winter is quite fair and slightly sever during the month of December and January.

RAIN FALL:

1.7. Although rainfall is not uniform in the District still the District receives major rainfall because of the influence of south west mansoon during June to October. The District can be divided to three Zones. Following table gives rainfall during the years-

AREA:

1.8. The total Geographical area of the District is 15,573 Sq.Km. covering 5.08 percent of the total area of the state. According to area Nasik ranks <sup>first</sup> in Bombay Division and fifth in the state amongst other Districts in the Maharashtra.

FORESTS:

1.9. The total forest area in the District is 3,35,858 Hectares, out of which 7,401 Hectares area is under Revenue Department and 3,28,457 Hectares area is under Forest Department. Out of the total forest area 19,898 Hectares area is protected and all remaining area is Reserved forest. Forest in Nasik District mainly gives production of Timber and Fuel.

MINERALS:

1.10 There are no minerals in Nasik District.

POPULATION:

1.11 Total population recorded in 1971 population census-

census is 23,69,221, which shows that Nasik ranks first amongst other Districts in Bombay Division. Table No.2 of this publication gives population figures since 1901 to 1971 alongwith Decade variations. Tahsilwise No. of villages, No. of Towns and population during 1971 Census is given below.

ADMINISTRATIVE SET-UP:

1.12.1. GOVT. SECTOR: Administratively the District has been divided in <sup>to</sup> 13 talukas. The Collector is in charge of General Administration, Law and Order, Treasury, Land Revenue and Civil Supplies, who also keeps supervision on various other Government offices, which use to meet once in a month for Coordination meeting where various internal problems in the District are solved under ~~xxx~~ the Chairmanship of <sup>the</sup> Collector.

ZILLA PARISHAD:

1.12.2. Under the aim of decentralisation of powers, Zilla Parishad Organisation has been formed which functions at District Head quarters, with 13 Panchayat Samities at 13 Taluka Head quarters, This has been established in 1962 under the Maharashtra Z.P. and P.S. Act of 1962; and it covers only a rural part of the District. Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities function with the elected persons and assisted by the Chief Executive Officer, Z.P. and B.D.O's at Panchayat Samities, who are appointed by the Government, level,

MUNICIPALITIES:

1.12.3. In the District Eleven Municipalities in urban areas and one Cantonment Board at Deolali are functioning at present. This Organisation also run with the elected persons from the area under jurisdiction of these Municipalities.

SPECIAL FEATURES:

1.13 Following are the notable specialities of Nasik Dist:-

- (1) It is a main production centre of Onion, covering an approximate area of 5000 Hectar per annum.
- (2) Other main Agricultural productions are grapes and Sugarcane. Nasik grapes are speciality for visitors in summer Season.
- (3) Main Supplier of 'Vegetables' to Bombay.
- (4) Manmad is the biggest stocking Centre of Food Corporation of India.
- (5) India Security Press at Nasik Road and Government of India press at Gandhinagar-Nasik.
- (6) The Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) Factory at Ozar Near Nasik.
- (7) The Co-operative fruit canning and Juice Factory at Pimpalgaon Basawant producing a "Pibola" drink and some other byproducts.

- (8) The central wheat Research Station at Kundewadi, Taluka-Niphad.
- (9) The thermal power station at Eklahare Near Nasik Road.
- (10) Police Training Centre Nasik.
- (11) Highly potential Industrially Devoleping area at Satpur.
- (12) Lastly it is a religious place for pilgrims to visit' -  
" Trimbakeshwar' 'Ram Mandir', Mukti Dham' and many other such  
attractive temples.

CHAPTER IIEXPLANATORY NOTE ON THE SCOPE AND LIMITATIONS OF DATA SUPPLIED IN  
PART. II. DISTRICT STATISTICAL ABSTRACT-1971-72.

In Chapter II a brief review of scope of information and limitations of the data presented in part II is given. All this data has been presented under thirteen broad categories and in 87 main tables.

AREA AND POPULATION:

2.1. Under this group in all seven tables are included giving data about classification of villages and towns according to 1971 Census, decadal variation since 1901, distribution of population according to workers and nonworkers (1971 Census) and age group, Mother tongue and religion (1961 Census) and schedule castes and scheduled tribes as per 1971 census. It may be pointed out that in absence of talukawise data the 1971 census figures for the district as a whole only are supplied.

CLIMATE:

2.2. Talukawise rainfall data giving normal rainfall No. of rainy days and total rainfall during the months of 1971 ~~xxxx~~ have been given in table No 8 whereas table No.9 of this issue gives the mean, Maximum and Minimum temperature data recorded by the Meteorological Department.

AGRICULTURE:

2.3. All the talukawise information for the year 1969-70 and 1970-71 regarding land utilisation, area under crops, sourcewise and cropwise area irrigated, yield per hectare and total out turn of principal crops has been presented in 4 tables. While list of Major, Minor, Medium irrigation projects is given in ~~two~~ two tables. Besides this Agril. wage rates, Agril implements in each taluka (66 Census) and talukawise No. of villages affected by famine and scarcity has also been given in three tables.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY, FOREST AND FISHERIES:

2.4. Talukawise information about the livestock(66 - census) Veterinary facilities available in the district during 71- 72 and other related information is given in three tables under this group. In other two tables viz.25(a) and 25 (b) area under forest and important forest produce with their total value has been given. Value ~~xxxxxxx~~ of forest products during the year 71-72 is less as compared with value ~~for~~ preceding year only because this low value was received by auction during the year.

EMPLOYEMENT, INDUSTRY, MINING AND ELECTRICITY:

2.5. out of total 11 tables in this group first three tables give factory statistics for the year 1971, Next three tables relate to data regarding Employment Exchange while two more tables relate to the census of Govt. Employees. A table relating to annual survey of industries is also included in the group and the last two tables relate to the consumption of Electricity according to uses ~~x~~ and No. of towns and village electrified according to agency.

CO-OPERATION:

2.6. Activities during 71-72 under very important sector Viz.Co-operation is presented in tables Nos. 37 to 43, while table No.44 gives information regarding registered Money Lenders and loans advanced by them during 1971-72.

MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH:

2.7. This group includes in all five tables which give talukawise information regarding Medical facilities(available through public and public aided bodies) Vaccination, Family Planning and No. of births and deaths registered during the year 71-72. The information regarding deaths due to important Causes for a district as whole is given in a separate table. It may be pointed out here that No. of vaccinations and inacculations performed during the year 71-72 are more as compared with previous year.





and consumer price Index number for Bombay and Jalgaon centres separately is presented under this group.

MISCELLANEOUS:

2.13.1. Statistical data relating to all other important activities in the District which are not covered under above categories are ~~given~~ grouped in this and presented in table No. 76 to 86, Data regarding Police; Crime offences, Work disposed in civil and criminal courts, Cinema No. of banking offices, No. of Policies and amount insured, No. of Press and Journals, Joint stock companies, Small Savings and land revenue collection is given.

2.13.2. Table No. 87 relates to the selected indicators, and presents the data for the year 50-51, 60-61, 66-67 and 69-70 to 71-72. This table is prepared from all the above tables and gives the general trend of development over a period of two decades.

CHAPTER - III -

ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SELECTED TRENDS:-

3.1. This chapter is an analytical review of important indicators under various Economic and Social sectors. In order to have inter taluka comparison, some of the indicators are worked out on data pertaining to talukas.

INDICATOR NO.1 PERCENTAGE OF GROSS CROPPED AREA TO NET SOWN AREA:-

3.2. Table No. 3.2.gives talukawise percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area during 1961-62,69-70 and 70-71. It is apparentthat as compared with 61-62,the Dist.percentage in both the years has declined. Highest double cropping percentage was recorded for Baglan followed by Malegaon,Kalwan,Nasik and Niphad during the year 1970-71. Whereas minimum was for Peint followed by Surgana and Igatpuri which are mainly tribble areas.

3.5 While comparing the position of the talukwise percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown, it could be seen from the table No. 3.5 that percentage of irrigated area has shown appreciable increase in all talukas except Baglan over last decade. Correspondingly percentage irrigated area for the district has also increased.

## CHAPTER - I V

### Annual Plan.1971-72.

4.1. After completion of Third Five Year Plan and three annual plans, Fourth Five Year Plan was started from the year 1969-70. The year 1971-72 represents the third year of the Fourth Five Year Plan. This chapter deals with the financial and physical achievements of the district level plan schemes under state and local sectors in Nasik district.

4.2. Expenditure under state sector during the year 1969-70 was more than <sup>60</sup> percent and in 1971-72 it was more than 65 percent of the total expenditure, while in the year 1970-71 it was only about 53 % of the total expenditure. The trend of expenditure under local sector during 1969-70 to 1971-72 was increasing one which can be seen from table No.4.2.

(vi) Rejuvenation activities were carried out in 22.56 hectares (target 60.70 hectares) (vii) 5 multicrop demonstrations were held (target 10 ) (viii) an area of 404 hectares was brought under intensive cultivation of food crops (target 809 hectares ) (ix) 17695 persons were benefitted by special nutrition programme (target 22000 persons) In addition the target of (a) laying of 5 demonstration plots of high yielding varieties of castor, and 15 plots of vegetable and potato (b) preparing 50 tonnes of rural compost (c) green manuring of 162 hectares area were either fulfilled or exceeded. Under the sub head Minor Irrigation Rs. 110.30 lakhs were used for construction of 446 irrigation wells against the target of 2020 wells and for installation of 302 pumps as against the ~~xx~~ target of 2080 pumps. In addition 14 minor irrigation works and 4 ~~xxx~~ drainage works were in progress and the target of completion of 5 percolation tanks was fulfilled. Under 'Soil Conservation' programme 67580 hectares of land was contour bunded exceeding the target set viz. 45861 hectares; and 414 hectares of land was covered by terracing as against the target of 580 hectares at the total expenditure of Rs. 57.68 lakhs. Three veterinary aid centres were started by utilising Rs.0.29 lakhs under ' Animal Husbandry ' programme. 5929 litres of milk was handled per day (target 8000 litres) and 26 dairy societies (target 20 societies) were financially assisted at the cost of Rs. 1.18 lakhs under 'Dairy Development Schemes'. The target set for plantation of i) general utility timber in 255 hectares (ii) minor forest produce in 28 hectares (iii) quick growing trees in 15 hectares and that of afforestation--- for Soil conservation in 80 hectares ~~xxxx~~ were fully -

fully achieved under 'Forest' schemes at the cost of Rs. 2.24 lakhs. Under 'Fisheries' programme not only the target of supply of 1002 Kg. of nylon, to the fishermen was fulfilled but also 4.15 lakhs of fingerlings were stocked and 3500 Kg. of fish was netted (target exceeded in both the cases) at the cost of Rs. 0.17 lakhs. One agricultural produce market committee (target two A.P.M.C.) was assisted to the tune of Rs. 0.10 lakhs by way of granting loan under 'ware housing and marketing' sub head.

#### CO-OPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

4.6. In all 5 district level schemes were implemented under the two sub heads of this major head. Out of these five schemes 4 schemes were implemented under the sub head 'Co-operation' at the cost of Rs. 1.40 lakhs. The targets set for assisting (i) <sup>Two</sup> marketing societies in share capital (ii) one marketing societies by loans and subsidy for godown (iii) One farming society by way of subsidy for godown were fulfilled in addition to exceeding the target of assisting 6 labour contract societies. Rs. 10.91 lakhs were spent for continuing various rural development activities, involved in 'Community Development programme' in 13 Panchayat Samities of the district.

#### IRRIGATION AND POWER:

4.7. Only one scheme viz. 'Rural Electrification' was implemented under the sub head 'Power Project' of this major head of development. Expenditure of Rs. 59.94 lakhs was incurred to electricity 36 villages and to energize 1742 pump sets during the year 1971-72.

#### INDUSTRY AND MINING:

4.8. In all 5 schemes were implemented at the cost-

cost of Rs. 18.79 lakhs under the sub head 'Small Scale Industries' of this major head. The physical achievements were (i) Organisation of one processing industry (target 2) (ii) assistance to one industrial co-operative society in share capital (iii) assistance to one handloom society (target 6) by way of rebate and (iv) Assistance to two handicraft workers societies by way of loans (target fulfilled)

#### TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS:

4.9. An expenditure of Rs.13.55 lakhs was incurred under the sub head 'Road Development' for construction of (i) 5.00 Kms. of new roads (target 9.31 Kms.) (ii) for improvement of 8.00 Kms of road (target 9.69 Kms.) In addition targets of constructing 10 bridges and 3 cross drainage works were fulfilled.

#### SOCIAL SERVICES:

4.10 In all 29 district level schemes were ~~xxx~~ implemented under the six sub heads included in this major head of development. Rs.47.03 lakhs were utilised under the sub head 'General Education.' The set targets viz. (i) appointment of 359 primary teachers and 3 Assistant ~~fixx~~ district educational inspectors (ii) creation of 46 graduate head masters (iii) development of 17 secondary schools. (iv) grant of concession to 14,400 economically backward class pupils (v) grant of concession to 150 children of primary teachers (vi) grant of merit scholarships to 150 students and (vii) giving free education to 2400 persons, were fully achieved. Also (a) 34 school rooms were constructed (target 45) (b) special facilities were provided to 3484 girls (target 3000 girls) (c) Loans were granted to 314 primary teachers (target 317 teachers) (d) One agency was assisted for construction of secondary school

building (e) 2641 persons (target 8400) were made literate. An expenditure of Rs. 87.32 lakhs was incurred under the sub head water supply and drainage during 1971-72 and 27 piped water supply schemes were in progress. Loans amounting to Rs. 0.23 lakhs were provided to the local bodies for implementation of development plans, under 'Urban Development' scheme. Under the sub head 'Welfare of backward classes' Rs. 2.25 lakhs were utilised for (i) granting tuition fees examination fees and scholarships to 9190 backward class students (ii) giving grants to 47 inmates of backward class hostels (iii) giving grants to one hostel of backward class students for construction of building (target 6 hostels) (iv) giving grants to 1 Balwadi (target 3) of backward class (v) giving grants for construction of 7 irrigation wells of backward class cultivators (vi) giving assistance to 80 artisans of backward class and (vii) giving housing aid to 6 persons of backward class (target 6). Rs. 0.58 lakhs were utilised for conducting 27 Balwadis, 27 literacy classes 14 maternity centres and 7 arts and crafts under 'Social welfare' programme during 1971-72. Under the sub head Labour and Labour welfare Rs. 1.53 lakhs were spent for providing facility of one technical institute with an intake capacity of 124 inmates.

MISCELLANEOUS:

4.11 Only one scheme 'rural broadcasting' of the sub head 'Information and Publicity' was implemented in the xxx district. And 82 radio sets installed at the cost of Rs. 1.04 lakhs as against the target of 130 radio sets.
