CHAPTER NO.1
I N T R O D U C T I O N
P O O N A - District

LOCATION

1.1 Poona district lies between $17^{\circ} 54'$ and $19^{\circ} 24'$ North latitude and $73^{\circ} 19'$ and $75^{\circ} 10'$ East longitude.

1.2 Boundaries

1.2 It is bounded on the North by Ahmednagar dist. on the East by Ahmednagar and Sholapur districts, on the South by Sholapur and Satara districts; and on the West by Kolaba and Thara districts.

TOPOGRAPHY

1.3 Hills - The main range of Sahyadri runs North and South for a length of about 117 Km. Also narrow ridges with flat tops stretch eastwards and gradually sink into the plain. The following leading peaks lie in the extreme North of the Sahyadri range :-

- a) Harischandra gad
- b) Jiwghan
- c) Dhak
- d) Ahupe

1.4 RIVERS :- The Bhima, the main river of the dist., rises in the Sahyadri in the West of the dist. at Bhimashankar. It flows Southeast through the central part of the dist. and then enters into Sholapur dist. The main tributaries of the Bhima are Vel and Ghod on the left and Bham, Indrayani, Mula, Yutha and Nira on the right. Nira forms the Southern boundary of the district for a considerable distance. Other rivers are Karha, Kukadi,

Mula-Mutha, Pawana, Meena, Gunjawani, Pushpawati, Shivaganga and Velvandi. All of these rivers flow with the magnificent volume of water during the rainy season and shrink into a narrow thread during the hot season.

1.5. SOILS

The soils of the district are lighter in the West than in the East. They broadly belong to three classes : Black, red ^{and} brown. In some places one class of soil blends with another in varying proportions and is in turn modified by sand, gravel, lime salts and other ingredients.

1.6. ~~Climate~~ ! — The Technical Survey Team set up by Government of Maharashtra has recommended that the Poona district be divided into the following four Agro-climate zones.

a) Chat zone : It covers only a small portion of Mawal tahsil. The area is extremely rugged and covered by Sahyadri mountain ranges. The soils in this area are (i) high level red to reddish brown laterite soil and (ii) light brown to dark brown forest soils. The hill tops and slopes are covered with forest trees and grasses. Small strips of land on hill slopes are used for cultivation, where hill millets like nagli, wari are grown. On some lands paddy is grown. The soils are inferior and have poor fertility.

b) Transition : I - This is formed by the Western portion of Junnar, Western half of Ambegaon, Khed and Bhor, and Western and Central portions of Mawal, Mulshi and Velhe tahsils. The area is extremely rugged. A series of table lands cut on every side by deep valleys. The soils are red to reddish brown in colour,

varying in depth and texture. In this zone also the two types of soils in Ghat zone are found. Paddy is the main crop in valleys and bagli, wari etc. are grown on hill slopes. Major portion of area is under forest and pastures.

c) TRANSITION II : The zone comprises of the mid-western part of Junnar, Khed, Eastern half of Ambegaon and Eastern strips of Velhe, Mulshi, Bhor and Western portion of Haveli tahsil. This lies on the Eastern side of Sahyadri Mountain ranges. The following brown to dark brown soils of varying depth are found in this zone :

- i) High level, low lime, shallow reddish brown loam
- ii) Intermediate medium deep brown black clay loam
- iii) Low level deep low lime brown clays

The soils are alkaline. Major crops grown are bajri, Jowar wheat, a variety of fruit crops and vegetables, and also commercial crops. Crops are grown both in Kharif and Rabi seasons.

d) SCARCITY TRACT :

This zone covers the Eastern corner of Junnar, South Eastern portion of Khed, Eastern half of Haveli, and entire portion of Sirur, Purandhar, Phond, Baramati and Indapur tahsils. This area covers nearly 50% area of the district. The soils are brown to black calcareous soils with varying depth and textures. Main crops grown are Rabi Jowar, Cotton, Wheat, gram groundnut, and sunflower and also sugarcane in canal area.

RAINFALL

1.7. The district receives its rain mostly from the Southwest monsoon, during June to October. A few erratic shower contd.....

are received from the North-East monsoon by the Eastern part of the district. The annual rainfall varies from 3000 m.m. to 4000 m.m. in the Ghat zone. The Western portion of the Transition-I zone, gets rainfall varying from 2000m.m. to 3000m.m.; whereas the Eastern portion receives 1250 m.m. to 2500 m.m. The rainfall in the Transition-II zone ranges from 700 m.m. in the East to 1250m.m. in the West, as one proceeds from East to West. The scarcity tract receives rainfall from 600 to 700 m.m.

SCARCITY CONDITIONS 1973-74

1.8 The Fact Finding Committee set up by Government of Maharashtra during the year 1973 had reviewed the position of areas which are prone to drought conditions frequently and has recommended that at least some part of the following tahsils is drought prone area

Considering the area of the above tahsils it will be seen that about 43% of the area of the district is prone to drought conditions. Important crops grown in these tahsils are Bajari and Kabi Jawar.

Scarcity conditions were prevailing in the District for the last several years. But severe conditions prevailed during 1972-73, when 1470 out of 1516 revenue villages

were affected. But the year 1973-74 was fortunate as there were no scarcity works which were started during the year 1972-73 and were continued during the year 1973-74 till 31-12-1973.

MINEALS

1.11 The rocks in the district are varieties of Deccan trap basalts, and are found in the varieties of (i) non-vesicular and (ii) vesicular. The non-vesicular types of rocks are hard, though and compact. The vesicular types are comparatively more soft and break more easily. The former type is used as building stones, for roads, and as an aggregate in cement concrete. Kankar and Gypsum are found at a number of places especially in the Eastern part of the district. Kankar is used for lime burning. There are some deposits of lime and dolomite are found in Furandhar and part of Phend tehsil. in the district. The deposits of lime is of inferior quality and hence is not used for cement. There are no other important minerals in the district.

FOREST

1.10 Forest area is in the Western and hilly part of the district. The types of forest are (i) scrub, (ii) mixed deciduous and (iii) evergreen, which are found respectively in the areas of low, medium and high rainfall. The main produce from the forests are teak (in Junnar, Furandhar, Rhor and Velhe tehsils) Hirda (in Khed and Ambegaon tehsils) and bamboos and Shikakhai (in Mawal and Mulshi tehsils).

AREA AND DEMOGRAPHY

1.11 Out of the total area of 15640 Sq.Km. of the district, urban area is only 578 Sq. Km. which is 3.69% of the

total area. All the area of the Mulshi and Ambegaon tahsils is rural area.

DECADAL VARIATION

1.12 The population of the district during 1971 Census increased by 23.8% over the population as per 1961 Census. The following table gives the area and population of the tahsils in Poona district :

The increase in population varies from 1.1 in Velhe tahsil to 47.0 in Haveli tahsil. The high rate of increase in population in Haveli tahsil can be attributed to industrialisation in the areas surrounding Poona.

DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION

1.13 The Collector of the district is in charge of general administration, law and order, land revenue and civil supplies of the district. The Collector is assisted by four Dy. Collector who are in charge of four sub-divisions, with headquarters at Poona City, Khed and Paramati. The district is divided into 14 tahsils, for administrative purposes, each tahsil being under the control of a Tahsildar.

1.14 The District and Sessions Judge is the head of the judicial department in the district. The Collector is the District Magistrate for the district except Poona City. The Resident Dy. Collector is the Additional District Magistrate, whereas the Dy. Collectors and Tahsildars are also delegated with magisterial powers.

1.15 The District Superintendent of Police is in charge of the police force of the district except Poona City, where the Commissioner of Police is the head.

1.16 Zilla Parishad at district level and Panchayat Samiti at tahsil levels were formed in 1962. The area of operation of those local bodies extends to rural area of the district. The Chief Executive Officer in the Indian Administrative Service cadre, is in charge of the general administration of the Zilla Parishad. He is assisted by various district heads

of departments. The Block Development Officers are in charge of Panchayat Samitis. Various departments such as Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Minor Irrigation, Education, Social Welfare, Public Health, etc. are under the control of the Zilla Parishad.

SPECIAL FEATURE

1.17 Poona is the head quarter of the Poona revenue division and as such Divisional offices are having their head quarters at Poona. Also Directorates of Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Education, Health Services, Social Welfare, Town Planning Sports and Youth Services Tribal Welfare and the Cooperative Department are stationed at Poona. There also important Central Government Offices which include Observatory, National Chemical Laboratory and Vikram Satelite Earth Station at Arvi.

1.18 Poona is the head quarters of Southern Command. There is National Defence Academy at Khadakwasla near Poona. There is N.C.C. officers Academy at Purandhar Fort. There is Ordnance Depot at Dehuroad and Ammunition Factory at Khadki.

1.19 Since minimum requirements such as labour power and transport facilities for industries are fulfilled, there are many industries developed in Poona and its surroundings. Industries among others include manufacturing machinery requires for Sugar Factory, Scooters, diesel vehicles, oil engines, compressors and others. Poona is full of large, medium and small industries.

Chapter II

Explanatory Note

2.1 The present abstract relates to the year 1973-74 and detailed data for the year 1973-74 are published wherever possible. In case the data for this year is not available, the data for the latest available year is published. Generally the data is published for the financial year 1973-74. The data on agriculture relates to the agricultural year, whereas the data on cooperation is for the cooperative year. The data on rainfall, temperature, civil and criminal cases is for the calendar year. The information, to the extent possible, is presented tahsilwise for inter tahsil comparison.

District at a glance

2.2 Important information on various items under different heads such as population, agriculture, cooperation, education etc. pertaining to the district is presented in this table alongwith the corresponding figures for the State for comparison.

District Statistical Abstract

2.3 The tables in the District Statistical Abstract have been grouped in suitable groups. The concepts and limitations adopted in the preparation of tables are summarised in the following paragraphs.

(1) Area and Population

2.4 There are seven tables included in this group. The data relates to tahsilwise population as per 1971 census. Data on Tahsilwise area, houses and people population, decadal variations during 1951-61 and 1961-71, classification of villages and towns according to population ranges, number of workers and non-workers and population of scheduled caste and scheduled tribes are given in the tables. Distribution of population according to age group and religion is also given in table no.6

2.5 (a) Village:- It is statutorily recognised village having a defined boundary and separate land records. (b) Urban Area:- It is a place which have has (i) a municipality, a cantonment or civil lines or (ii) a population of 5000 or over and at least three fourth or more male workers engaged in non-agricultural pursuits, (iii) a density of less than 400 per Sq.km. The place should have according to the Director of Census Operation a few pronounced urban characteristics and amenities.

(c) Worker:- The 1971 instructions stipulated that a person primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in family economics activity but not on a full time scale should be treated as non workers irrespective of their main activity.

(2) Climate

2.6 The rainfall data presented in table no.8 gives normal rainfall, monthly rainfall and number of rainy days during the calendar year 1973 for the selected centres in Poona district. A day was treated as a rainy day, if during the twenty four hours the rainguage recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall. The table no.9 gives actual maximum and minimum temperatures recorded during each of the month of the calendar year 1973 irrespective of 3 centres in Poona district.

(3) Agriculture:-

2.7 Important tahsilwise statistics on agriculture such as land utilisation, irrigation, area and outturn etc. are given in tables 10 to 14. The data presented gives tahsilwise figures.

2.8 The basic definitions adopted are given below:- (a) The geographical area:- It is according to village papers, calculated from village returns prepared for revenue purposes and as such it may be different from that according to Surveyor General.

(b) Under 'Forests' are included all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether state-owned or private (c) Land put to non-agricultural uses:- stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under rivers, canals etc. and other land put to uses other than agricultural. (d) All barren and uncultivable land like mountains, deserts etc. is classified under 'Barren and unculturable land'. It covers land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost. (e) Culturable waste lands:- These may be either fallow or covered with useless shrubs and jungles, and include all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, but not cultivated during the current year and the last five years or more in succession. (f) Current fallow lands:- These are lands which are kept fallow during the current year (g) All lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period not less than one year and not more than 5 years are classed as other fallow. (h) Total of area under all crops including area under crops sown more than once is Gross Cropped Area.

2.9 Statistics regarding no. of irrigation wells, minor irrigation works, major and medium irrigation Projects are given in tables 15,16 and 17. In table no.18 are given agricultural wage rates at centres (1) Nira (2) Bhigwan and (3) Ghodegaon. The data is collected by the District Statistical Office through the Block Statistical Assistants. Final figures of agricultural implements enumerated during eleventh livestock census are given in table no.19. Tahsilwise data on famine and scarcity are given in table 20 and 21 for the year 1973-74.

(4) Animal Husbandry and Forests:-

2.10 Typewise population of livestock and poultry as per eleventh livestock census 1972 (final data) is shown tahsilwise in table no.22. Statistics on veterinary

facilities, diseasewise mortality of livestock are given in tables 23 and 24. Table no.25 gives data on animals slaughtered in recognised slaughter houses in the district.

2.11 The data on area under forest and major and minor forest produce for the year 1973-74 have been depicted in tables 26(a) and 26(b) respectively. Area under forests under the control of State Revenue Department and under State Forest Department has been shown separately. These areas may not tally with the area under forest shown in table no.10 due to different concepts of classification into (i) Reserved (ii) Protected and (iii) unclassed forests. Reserved Forests are intended mainly for timber production. Grazing/cultivation under certain limitations and restrictions are allowed in protected forests. The unclassed forests refer to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste.

(5) Employment, Industry and Electricity:-

2.12 The Statistics relating to working factories such as average daily employment, mandays worked, classification of factories according to working strength and no. of days worked are given for the year 1972 in tables 27,28 and 29. Statistics relating to Annual Survey of Industries for the year 1965 is given in table no.30. Monthwise registration, vacancies notified, placements done, no.on live register at the end of each month, and other data of employment exchange have been shown in table no.31 to 33.

2.13 Data on consumption of electricity and villages/ towns electrified during the year 1973-74 and the year ending 31-3-1974 are shown in table no.s 34 and 35 respectively. The data are collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board, Private Electric Supply companies and sugar factories in the district.

(6) Cooperation

2.14 Statistical information on the cooperative institutions and their activities has been given for the year 1973-74 on the following items (1) different types of societies (2) Cooperative Banks (3) Primary Agril. Credit Societies (4) Central and Primary Cooperative Marketing Societies (5) and Regulated markets in table 36 to 42. Tahsilwise data regarding no. of members, capital structure, loans advanced and recovered etc. have been given. Working capital includes paid up capital, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding include outstandings in respect of loans, cash credits and overdrafts and the amount of the outstanding bills purchased or discounted. Overdues refer to the amount of loans or instalments which was due for collection but which was not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority. Information of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them is given in table no.43.

(7) Medical and Public Health

2.15 Tahsilwise data about medical facilities, indoor and outdoor patients treated, the vital statistics on births and deaths registered and the no. of deaths due to important causes, cholera inoculations and information on family planning programme are given in tables 44 to 48.

(8) Education

2.16 The data on tahsilwise no. of literates and percentage of literacy as per 1971 census are shown in tables 49. Table no.52 gives data pertaining to pre-primary, primary and secondary schools and higher institutions in Fonda district. The data on backward class beneficiaries, beneficiaries and concessions granted to economically backward classes and expenditure incurred under normal and plan grants on primary education in the district is shown in tables 53 to 55.

(9) Transport and Communication

2.17 Length of railway route according to gauge is shown in table no.56. The table no.57 gives road length according to category and surface classification. Roads maintained by municipal councils/cantonment boards are also shown separately in this table. Motor vehicles in operation in Poona region, covering Poona, Ahmednagar, Satara and Sholapur districts, are shown in table no.58. Important operational statistics relating to Poona division of Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation are given in table no.59. Results of traffic census conducted in May 1972 on important roads in Poona district are given in table no.60. Statistics on postal, telegraph and telephone facilities and on rural broadcasting are depicted respectively in the tables no.s 61 to 62.

10. Local Bodies

2.18 The data on income and expenditure of all village panchayats (tahsilwise) and municipal councils etc. as also headwise receipts, Govt.grants and expenditure of Zilla Parishad are shown in the tables 63 to 66.

11. Plan and Community Development

2.19 Information on plan expenditure under State and local sectors and physical achievements in important fields during the year 1973-74 are given respectively in table no.67 and 68. Statistics in respect of coverage of C.D.Programme, stagewise expenditure of various blocks and blockwise physical achievements under Community Development Programme are shown in the tables 69 to 71.

12) Prices

2.20 The average wholesale prices of selected agricultural commodities as quoted in the Agril.Produce Market Committees, the monthly average retail prices of important commodities at Poona City, are shown in tables 72 to 73. Consumer price index numbers for working class

for Sholapur and Poona Centres for the year 1973-74 are given in the table no.74.

(13) Miscellaneous

2.21 Statistical data pertaining to police force, crime statistics, work disposed of in civil and criminal courts, cinemas, banking offices, joint stock companies, insurance policies, small savings, land revenue collections etc. are given in the tables 75 to 84 in this section.

2.22 In table no.85 data on certain important topics has been presented for the year 1950-51, 1960-61, 1960-67, 1970-71 to 1973-74 with a view to giving a series of the data for comparison. After this table, tables of selected indicators of development together with ranking for each taluka of Poona district on important items are included.

CHAPTER III

AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS

3.1 An attempt is made in this chapter to give a comparative picture of the tahsils in the district as far as possible for the year 1973-74 with reference to the earlier year.

AGRICULTURE

3.2 The years 1970-71 and 1971-72 were drought years and agriculture has suffered a lot during these years. The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown is shown tahsilwise in the following table :

The gross cropped area during 1970-71 and 1971-72 were respectively 11,11,671 hect. and 10,87,328 hect. Net area sown during the two years 1970-71 and 1971-72 was respectively 1030623 hect. and 1010194 hect. These figures

indicate that the area under crops has declined during 71-72 in comparison with the earlier year. Percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown indicates the percentage of area cropped more than once, which indicates the extent of utilisation of land. It is observed that the available land could not be used for taking more than one crop in Mawal and Velhe due to peculiar land and climate.

From the above table it will be seen that percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown was 12.05 during 1970-71 and 12.37 during 1971-72. The percentage varied from 1.40 in Bhor tahsil to 42.99 in Baramati tahsil excluding Pune City tahsil. The percentage has been observed to be more than 15 in Haveli, Dhond, Purandhar, Baramati and Indapur where

Agriculture production is dependent on many factors out of which natural conditions and area can be considered as important, since these factors have direct bearing on the production. It is seen from the above table that production of Bajari, Sugarcane and groundnut had decreased during 1971-72, when compared with the earlier year. Total production of cereals and pulses during 1971-72 was 217500 Metric tonnes as against 200600 Metric tonnes of the earlier year. Per capita quantity of cereals and pulses during 1971-72 works out to 68 Kg.

The above table reveals that total double cropped area during 1970-71 and 1971-72 was respectively 7.3% and 7.1% of the total gross cropped area. The percentage of double cropped irrigated area during these two years was respectively 20.6 and 11.9 respectively.

3.6 The gross cropped area during 1971-72 was less than that of the earlier year by 2.3 percent. The percentage of area under food-grains is only 59.1 during 1971-72 and remaining 40.9 percent of area is utilised for cash crops and other non-food crops.

LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY

3.7 A comparative position of livestock during the years 1961, 1966 and 1972 is given below :-

It will be seen that during the 1972 livestock census, number of cattle only is observed to be less by 6.2% as compared to the figures during the earlier census. Thus no. of cattle shows a declining trend since 1961 census. The trend of buffaloes and poultry is increasing one. No. of sheep and goats decreased during 1966 census and increased during the 1972 census.

2.8 The following table gives the no. of milch animals per 100 persons and no. of working bullocks per 100 hect. of gross cropped area. The final figures of 1972 livestock census, 1971 population census and agricultural data for the year 1971-72 are utilised.

In the district as a whole there are only 4 milch animals for 100 persons which shows that availability of milk is far less. The ratio varies from 1 animal per 100 persons in Pune tahsil to 10 in Mulshi tahsil and 14 in Velhe tahsil.

3.9 There are 25 working bullocks per 100 hect. of gross cropped area for the district. This ratio varies from 18 in Baramati and Indapur tahsils to 36 in Ambegaon tahsil and 114 in Pune city tahsil. It will thus be evident that the work load on bullocks has been observed to be more on the bullocks in Sirur, Dhond, Baramati and Indapur tahsils.

3.10 There were 66 veterinary facilities such as hospitals, dispensaries and veterinary aid centres in Pune district during 1973-74. Average number of livestock per

facility works out to 22700. Similarly no. of animals per veterinary personnel works out to 17025 animals.

POULTRY AS COMPARED TO POPULATION

3.11 The number of poultry in Pune district as per 1972 livestock census was 1216510 which is 24.7% more than that during 1966 census. Out of the total poultry population that in Rural area was 1108966. The following table gives number of poultry as compared to population.

It will be seen that the poultry varied from 419 birds per 1000 population in Khed tahsil to 984 birds in Nawal tahsil. This ratio is 383 for 1000 population for the district. The ratio for all the tahsils except Pune City is higher than that of the district.

AGRICULTURAL CREDIT

3.12 Co-operative societies play an important role in increasing agricultural production by way of advancing loans at appropriate time. The following table gives the relevant details about co-operative societies.

Though number of societies has decreased by 22, the number of members during the year 1973-74 have increased by 3.62%. Loans advanced have increased by 46.68%. During the year 1973-74 overdues and loans outstanding have increased respectively by 57.57% and 46.07%. Average loan per member works out to Rs.446/- during 1973-74 as against Rs.315/- during the earlier year.

WAGE RATES

3.13. The data on agricultural wage rates is collected by this office from the three centres viz. Ghodegach, Vire and Bhigvan. Average wage rates have been worked out on the basis of averages of the wages at these centres. The data are given below :-

The averages of carpenter and blacksmith have increased respectively by 6.16% and 6.87% during 1973 as compared with the last year. The wages of cobbler, however, show a decreasing trend by 3.5% during 1973. The percentage of increase in the wages of male and female unskilled labour is 11.74% and 35.62% respectively.

CONSUMPTION OF ELECTRICITY

3.14 There are 636 villages and 22 towns electrified upto 31-3-74. During the year 1973-74, 19 villages were electrified. The percentage of electrified villages to total villages is 42.45. The total population covered under electrification is 26,40,829 which constitutes 83.09% of the total population.

The total consumption of electricity, which was 535763 thousand KWH during 72-73, increased to 559660 thousands KWH during 73-74. The increase is 4.46%. The per capita consumption during 1973-74 was 176 KWH as against 169 KWH during the earlier year.

It will further be seen that 65.26% of the total electricity is used for industrial purposes and 9.11% for domestic use. The actual consumption of electricity for Agriculture during the years 1971-72, 72-73 and 73-74 was respectively 55210, 48997 and 46793 thousands KWH.

EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE

3.16 : The number on live registers of Employment Exchanges at (i) Poonch and (ii) Pimpri, as on 31-3-74 was 70620. This was 76001 as on 31-3-73. Thus it will be seen that the number on the live registers has decreased by 7.03 per cent. During the year 73-74, 3843 candidates were placed in Employment, as against 3610 candidates during the last year. Out of these 3843 candidates, 643 (16.73%) belonged to backward classes. 3155 candidates (82.09%) out of 3843 were placed in employment under Public sector.

MEDICAL FACILITIES

3.17 There are 147 hospitals/dispensaries/health centres/primary health centres in Pune district during the year 1973. Population per hospital/dispensary/health centres/ primary health centres works out to 21619 persons. The doctors/vaidyas in Govt. and public aided hospitals in Pune district were 541. Also there were 1502 nurses in Pune district. Population per doctor/vaidya and per nurse works out to 5874 and 2116 respectively. In this context medical facilities and personnel available in private medical institutions are not considered.

During the year 1972-73, 64 Primary, 3 Secondary and 2 Higher education institutions were opened. Percentage of increase in number of pupils in Primary education and Secondary was respectively 3.06 and 9.10. The increase in pupils of higher education is 16.31 and much significant.

3.19 The ratio of pupils per teacher was 36 for Primary education, 27 for Secondary education and 20 for higher education for the year 1972-73. These ratios for earlier year were respectively 37, 27 and 18.

The percentage of girls in Primary, Secondary and Higher education institutions during 72-73 was respectively 40, 95, 33, 85 and 26.50

ROAD MILEAGE

3.20 The total length of road mileage, which was 8110 Km. during 1972-73, rose to 8462 Km. during 1973-74. Percentage increase in road mileage is 4.34. Out of the total road length, 37.9% roads belongs to Zilla Parishad and remaining to the B.C. Department.

3.21 Out of the total road length, the roads of 966 Km. are either cement concrete or black topped. The surface of roads of 1152 Km. is of water bound macadam. The remaining length of 6344 Km. is of granular material or of lower types, and this length amounts to 74.9% of the total road length.

3.22 Road length per 100 sq. Km. during 1972-73 was 51.8 Km. which is 54.1 Km. during the year 1973-74.

BANKING FACILITIES

3.23 The position of banking offices in Poona district as on 31-3-73 is given below :-

It will be seen that 76.34 of the banking offices are in urban areas of the district. These 213 banking offices serve the urban population of 13,29,774. Thus the

population served per banking office in urban area works out to 6243 persons. In Rural area having population of 18,48,255 persons, there are only 66 banking offices. The population being served by a banking office in rural areas is 28004 persons.

This ratio for the district as a whole is 11391 persons per banking office.

3.24 The banking offices are situated in 57 places (both rural and urban). 28 banking offices were newly opened during the year ended 31-3-73.

PRICES

3.25 Retail prices are collected by the District Statistical Office on every Friday from shops at Poona. The information is restricted to only one quotation and that too from only one shop. The data, therefore, cannot be said to be fully representative, but may prove to be useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices. The figures in bracket give information on Centrally Sponsored Schemes.

Out of the total provision of Rs. 13414 thousands expenditure of Rs.13241 thousands (98.7%) has been incurred. The budget provision is for the State Sector Schemes and remaining for the Local Sector Schemes.Almost the whole budget provision has been utilised under State Sector Schemes whereas only 96.3% provision has been spent under Local Sector Schemes. The expenditure incurred on schemes under the sub-heads (i) Agri.production (86.0%) and (ii) Ayacut development (88.3%) is not satisfactory.

4.4 Among regular schemes implemented during the year, the Integrated Area Development Scheme is implemented for the benefit of the Small holders in the tahsils of Mulshi, Mawali, Bhor and Velhe. Rs.446 thousands were spent on the scheme in the tahsil for the work of lift irrigation, community wells and for purchase of milch animals, sheep and goats. The expenditure incurred on minor irrigation works (State Plan) under local and State Sectors was Rs.3696 thousandas. In addition Rs.25.75 lakhs have been spent under Rural works programme (Draught Prone Area Programme) under Centrally Sponsored Scheme for irrigation/percolation tanks. Contour bunding and terracing is another important scheme, on which Rs.2743 thousands were spent during the year. The scheme of Ayacut Development is implemented in the command area of the Ghod and Khadakwasla projects. The scheme envisage development of land and excavation of field channels, so as to ensure optimum utilisation of water for irrigation purposes. The expenditure incurred on the scheme was Rs.1490 thousands.

The expenditure incurred under this head is 87.4 percent of the provision. The performance of expenditure on schemes under State Sector is satisfactory, whereas that under Local Sector is just 80.9%.

4.7 The schemes envisaging strengthening the Cooperative structure including cooperative marketing and consumers cooperative stores are implemented. All the blocks were either in stage II or post stage II phase. The scheme of Applied Nutrition Programme (Centrally Sponsored Scheme) has been made applicable to Indapur block during the year.

3. IRRIGATION AND POWER

4.9 The expenditure incurred on rural electrification and normal development by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board during the year 1973-74 was Rs.3671 thousands, against the provision of Rs.3337 thousands. There were no targets fixed for villages and pumps to be electrified. During the year four villages were electrified and 63 pumps were energised.

4. INDUSTRY AND MINING

4.10 The expenditure incurred under this major head was Rs.307 thousands against the provision of Rs.317 thousands. Percentage of expenditure was 96.8. The expenditure was incurred mainly to assist the industrial Coop.Societies of handloom weavers and others and Block Level Artisans (Balutedars) Societies. During the year 15 industrial societies (Target 13) and 13 Balutedars Societies (Target 13) were benefitted under the schemes which are implemented only in State Sector.

5. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION

4.11 There are only State Plan Schemes of road development under this major head. Rs.3312 thousands (73.4%) were spent against the provision of Rs.4505 thousands. Under Local Sector Schemes the expenditure exceeded the budget provision of Rs.1906 thousands by Rs.five thousands. In State Sector, however, the expenditure incurred was Rs.1401 thousands (53.9%) against the provision of Rs.2599 thousands. During the year one railway safety work as per the target was completed. One bridge was completed against the target of 2. Only 27 crores drainage works could be completed against the target of 101 works.

Under this major head the expenditure had exceeded the budget provisions by 10.6%. In Local Sector however, the expenditure incurred was 95.5% of the budget provision. Considering only Centrally Sponsored Schemes, the total expenditure was 96.7 percent of the budget provision. Here also the expenditure in Local Sector Schemes was 93.9%.

4.13 Assessing the sub-headwise progress it is seen that the progress of expenditure on the following sub-head was not satisfactory :-

The expenditure on the remaining sub-head was quite satisfactory.

4.14 Major schemes under "General Education" were development and expansion of non-government secondary schools and educational concessions to students (of Economically backward classes, teachers etc.). An expenditure of Rs.6731 thousands against the provision of Rs.5016 thousands was incurred on the schemes of development of non-government secondary schools. The expenditure incurred on the scheme of expansion of primary education was Rs.5193 thousands, against the provision of Rs.5227 thousands.

4.15 Under sub-head Technical education, scheme of development of engineering technological and architectural polytechnics was implemented.

4.16 Among regular schemes under 'Health and Family Planning' the scheme of additional building for Poona Chest Hospital was implemented. Piped water supply schemes were taken up in municipal as well as rural areas. Also drinking water wells were constructed and renovated.

4.17 Under the scheme of 'Backward Class Welfare' educational concessions were granted to students of B.C., cultivators were encouraged by giving financial assistance for purchase of improved implements, development of land and for sinking irrigation wells.

4.18 Important Centrally Sponsored Schemes were Family Planning Programme and Tribal Development blocks. There are

7. MISCELLANEOUS

4.20 The total expenditure incurred on all the schemes under this major head was Rs.1217 thousands, against the budget provision of Rs.1220 thousands. Out of this Rs.306 thousands were incurred on the Crash Scheme for Rural Employment which is Centrally Sponsored Scheme. Under this scheme 4 road works as per the target were completed during the year.

4.21 Under the State Plan Schemes, the important scheme was Employment Guarantee Scheme, the unique scheme introduced by Govt. of Maharashtra since 1.5.72. The amount of Rs.387 thousands equal to the budget provision was spent during the year for giving employment to the needy able-bodied, unskilled workers on productive works. Under this scheme 37 works were in progress as per target and 9 works were completed. Under the scheme of Rural Broadcasting, 66 radio sets (Target-190 sets) were installed during the year.

4.22 The year 1973-74 was the last year of the IV Five Year Plan. Per capita annual expenditure during this plan in Poona district is given below. 1971 population has been utilised to work out the figures.






Land Utilisation 1971-72




Sourcewise irrigation 1971-72




OUTTURN OF CEREALS AND PULSES IN FOONA DISTRICT

District.




No. of towns and villages electrified in Poona District




CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR POONA AND SHOLAPUR CENTRES
