CHAPTER-I-

I N T R O D U C T I O N

LOCATION:-

1.1. The Nashik District lies between 19.33 and 20.53 North latitude and 73.16 and 75.16 East longitude with an approximate length of 300 Km. and width of 280 Km.. approximately.

BOUNDARIES:

1.2. It is surrounded by Jalgaon District in the east and the north east, Dhule in the north, Dangs and Surat Districts of Gujarat State on the north west, while Thane District is on west and south west. Ahemadnagar District is to south and Aurangabad is to south east.

TOPOGRAPHY:

1.3. The District is situated partly in the Tapi basin and partly in the upper Godavari basin. Nandgaon, Kalwan, Baglan, and Malegaon tahsils are drained in the north and north east by the Girna and its tributaries. These tahsils lie in the Tapi-basin and drained by the Godavari and its tributaries while the Satmala range of hills provide a fine watershed between the above two basins.

HILLS AND RIVERS:

1.4.1. The Satmala or Ajanta range runs across the District. It stretches east-wards from the Sahyadry, particularly from the highest summit viz. Kalsubai, height of about 1654 meters. The other main system of hills is Sahyadry and its offshoots which run north to south on the western portion of the district. From the main Sahyadrian range, three prominent spurs stretch out to the east. Many of these ranges are mostly rocky flat topped and regular ⁱⁿ height and slope, Whereas some are conical and irregular.

1.4.2. The Godavari and the Girna are the two main rivers of the district. Other important rivers are Vaitrna, Darna, Mosam and Kadva. The Godavari rises at Brahmgiri and drains Nashik

and Niphad tahsils for about 95 Km. A huge earthen dam on this river has been built at Gangapur for storage and irrigation. During its course the Kadva, the Darna and the Nandini rivers with many other small streams meet the Godavari.

1.4.3. The Girna rises at the west of the District near Hatgad village in Surgana and flows through Kalwan and Malegaon tahsils. The course of the Girna within district is 144 Km. None of the river in this district is navigable.

SOILS:

1.5. There are four kinds of soils in Nashik district, black (Kali), Red (Lal) Red & black (Koral) and light brown (barad). Except in uplands, Black soil is found mostly in the plain country near beds of rivers such as the Girna and the Mosam. Red soil which is stiffer and shallower is found chiefly on hill slopes or plateaus. Red and black soil is found occasionally in hilly tracts. Light brown, the lightest of all soils, is found on hilly lands.

CLIMATE:

1.6. The climate of Nashik can broadly be classified as 1) Monsoon-From June to September 2) Winter-from October to middle of March and 3) Summer from middle of March to middle of June. The district generally experiences salubrious climate. The summer season is moderately hot and the temperature varies from 36°C to 43°C. The rainy season is comparatively cooler with sporadic rains distributed over all the monsoon period. The winter is quite fair and slightly severe during the months of December and January.

RAIN FALL AND SCARCITY:

1.7. The district receives major rainfall because of influence of south west monsoon between June and October. The rainfall is not uniform in all parts of the district. It is more in the region of the Sahyadri i.e. western part comprising Surgana, Peint and Igatpuri tahsils. Monsoon was bountiful in almost all tahsils in Nashik district during 1974.

AREAS:

1.8. The total geographical area of the district is - 15582 Sq;Km. covering 5.08 percent of the total area of the State. According to area, Nashik ranks fifth in the State of Maharashtra.

FORESTS:

1.9. The total forest area in district during 1974-75 is 3,32,875 hectares i.e. about 21 percent of total geographical area. The distribution of total forest area amongst maintaining authorities is 7272 hectares under Revenue Department, and 3,25,603 hectares under Forest Department. Out of these forests, 19,898 hectares area its protected forest and remaining area is reserved forest. Forest in Nashik district mainly gives production of timber and fuel.

MINERALS:

1.10. Mineral are conspicuously absent in Nashik district

ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP:

1.11.1. Government-Sector:- Administratively the district has been divided in-to 13 tahsils. The Collector is in charge of General Administration, Law and Order, Land Revenue and Civil Supplies. He has also to supervise the activities initiated by Government through state sector offices, except Judiciary.

ZILLA PARISHAD:

1.11.2. In order to gear-up to development activities and major participation by the people, the Zilla Parishad and the 13 Panchayat Samities were constituted under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad Act 1962. The Zilla Parishad has an elected President, assisted by Vice-President. The Administration of Zilla Parishad is carried out through a standing committee and other subject committees. At Block level, Panchayat samiti consists of all elected and Co-opted members from the area of the block and is headed by a Chairman. An I.A.S. Officer works as Chief Executive Officer, Zilla Parishad and he is assisted by various departmental heads. At Block

level, the Block Development Officer, works as a Secretary to the Panchayat Samiti.

MUNICIPAL COUNCILS:

11.11.3. In the district twelve municipal councils in Urban area and one Cantonment Board at Deolali are functioning at present. The Municipal organisations are run with the elected - persons from the area under jurisdiction of these municipal Councils From 1974-75, the President of Municipal Councils are directly - elected by the voters.

POPULATION:
DEMOGRAPHY:

1.12.1. AREA AND POPULATION: - Nashik district is spread over 15582 Sq.Km. with 20 towns 1628 inhabited villages and 4 deserted villages with its population 23.69 lakhs. as per 1971 Census and is 4.70 percent of the total population of the state. It ranks third as far as population is concerned in the state. It would be seen from table No.1.12.1. that Sargana Tahsil has got highest number of villages but the population is lowest, while Malegaon tahsil has got highest population followed by Nashik tahsil. It will be seen that Nashik tahsil has got more urban towns than any other tahsil in the district. The proportion of urban population (29%) compares favourably with the state average (31%).

DECADAL VARIATION:

during

1.12.2. Growth of population in the district, last decade (1961-71) was 27.70 percent as against 27.45 percent of the state as a whole. This means the growth of population of the district was slightly more than state average. The table No.1.12.2. indicates the decadal variation in population of Nashik district since 1901. This district witnessed a decrease in population during 1911-1921 by 7.64 percent, which was probably due to severe attack of influenza epidemic of 1918.

VILLAGES CLASSIFIED BY POPULATION:

1.12.3. According to 1971 Census, rural population of the district is 16.91 lakhs, in 1628 inhabited villages. Highest percentage (3286) of villages are in group having population between 500 to 999 while maximum population (30.83) is accounted for villages in the population group 1000 to 1999.

DENSITY:

1.12.4. The density of this district is 152 persons per Sq. M. as against 154 persons for the state as a whole. The

-corresponding figures for the rural areas only are 111 for the district and 113 for the state . Tahsilwise variation shows that tahsils of Nashik, Malegaon and Niphad are having comparatively higher density of population than the district ratio. The lowest density is 83 persons in Sargana. The density of urban area is 1741 persons per Sq.Km.as against 2554 persons Sq.Km.for the state as a whole.

SEX RATIO:

1.12.5. Since 1901, the sex ratio (Female for 1000 males) of the population of Nashik district varied between 984 to 940; while that of Maharashtra varied between 978 to 935. At each census since 1911, the sex ratio in this district has been higher than the average for the state. Same has been the pattern for urban population of the district. The sex ratio is continuously falling since 1931 and the 1971 figures are the lowest in last seventy years.

LITERACY:

1.12.6. The district has made much progress in literacy . Table No.1.12.5 gives percentage of literacy in Nashik -district since 1901. During the last 4 decades the improvement in literacy is very significant due to compulsory primary education and grant of concession to the Economically backward people by the Government. The district ranks fifth in the state in respect of literacy. According to 1971 Census about 36 percent^{are} literate in the district as against 39 percent in the state as a whole. The literacy in rural area of the district is relatively low viz. 29% as against 31 % - of the state as a whole.

WORKERS AND NON-WORKERS:

1.12.7. As per 1971 Census, out of the total population of 23.69 lakhs, only 8.98 lakhs (about 38%) are classified as workers. The percentage of workers among males and females are 51 and 24 respectively. The percentage of workers which ^{stood} at 49 percent at the time of 1961 census decreased to 38 percent in 1971, and this decrease appears to be due to the change in the concept of workers in 1971. The analysis of livelihood pattern gives some interesting features of the district. Comparatively very high proportion of about 72 % workers are engaged in Agriculture alone in the district as against 65 % for the state. About 11 % are engaged in industry, which includes household industry also as against 13% for the state, while a very small proportion of about 2.44 percent are engaged in transport followed by construction and Mining and quarrying.

POPULATION ACCORDING TO AGE GROUP AND RELIGION:

1.12.8. As per 1971 census, maximum population viz. 43.36 percent is in the age group 0-14 years while 5.33 percent while 5.33 percent were having age more than 60 years. Percentage of Hindus is maximum viz. 84.45 in the district.

SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

1.12.9. As per 1971 census, scheduled castes and Scheduled tribes constitute 4.06 percent and 23.69 percent respectively of the total population of the district. The tahsilwise analysis reveals that the proportion of scheduled tribes is highest in Surgana (96%), followed by Peint (95%) while the lowest proportion is in Yevla (6%). The proportion of scheduled castes is highest in Niphad (6%) followed by Nashik (5%) while the lowest proportion is in Surgana tahsil (0.57%).

CHAPTER-II-

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON TABLES PRESENTED IN DISTRICT STATISTICAL ABSTRACT-1974-75.

GENERAL:

2.1. The publication 'Socio Economic Review and District Statistical Abstract 1974-75 presents statistics on various topics. The data presented in various tables are collected from the concerned State and Central Government Departments. The footnotes to the tables indicate the source from which data is collected. In All the tables excepting in few cases (where latest available data is - presented) data pertaining to a reference period viz. 1974-75 or Calender year 1974- is presented. District totals are ^{given} in the beginning and tahsilwise break up follows . The concepts, sources and - limitations adopted while preparing the tables in abstract are given in the following paragraphs.

AREA AND POPULATION:

2.2. Under this head, 7 tables based on figures on 1971 Census are prepared. These tables show the salient features of the district viz. 1) Tahsilwise area, houses, and population 2) Decadal variation in population since 1901 3) Tahsilwise classification of villages and towns according to population ranges. 4) No. of workers and non-workers in each tahsil. 5) Distribution of population according to (A) Age group, (B) Religion for district as a whole and 6) population of Scheduled castes and Scheduled tribes for each tahsil.

CLIMATE AND RAINFALL:

2.3. The data under this head are collected in two tables, one relates to rain-fall and the other, temperature. Table No. 8 presents normal rainfall and No. of rainy days and actual rain-fall at 13 stations in the Nashik-District. during 1974. While - preparing this table data obtained from the Statistician Department of Agriculture and whenever the same is not available data supplied-

by Collectorate is taken in to account. Table No. 9 presents maximum, minimum temperature at three selected stations during 1974.

AGRICULTURE:

2.4. Under this head, important statistics pertaining to land utilisation, area under different crops, irrigation, yield rates and out-turn and agricultural wage rates, minor, medium and major irrigation works are presented. In first six tables viz. 10 to 15, provisional data for 1972-73, 1973-74^{of} land-utilisation, cropping pattern, area irrigated and sourcewise irrigation is given a tahsilwise, while yield rates are for district as a whole which are based on the 'fully revised provisional' for the year 1972-73 and information for the year 1973-74 is based on 'revised final forecast'. Table No.16 provides data of minor irrigation works for 1973-74. Table No.17 shows position as on 30.6-74 of the minor and medium irrigation projects. Monthly average wage rates for skilled and unskilled agricultural labourers at three rural centres for the year 1974 are given in table No.18, while table No.19 gives tahsil-wise data of agricultural implements based on 1972 Livestock census. Information regarding Famine and Scarcity affected areas during 1971-75 and determination of precarious and other scarcity areas according to history of Scarcity since 1970-71 to 1971-75 is also presented in table Nos. 20 and 21 respectively.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND FORESTS:

2.5. Under this head, information regarding livestock census, Veterinary statistics, recognised slaughter houses and forest statistics is presented. Table No.22 gives various types of livestock in each tahsil as enumerated at the time of 1972 livestock census. Table No.23 gives the information regarding veterinary statistics for the year 1974-75 in each tahsil while table No.24 gives diseasewise livestock mortality during 1974-75 for district as a whole. The information for the year 1974-75 regarding Animal Slaughtered in recognised slaughtered houses is

presented in table number 25, Table No.26(A) gives figures of area under forest while table No. 26(B) gives the information regarding production and value of major and minor forests products in the - Nashik district during 1974-75. Table No.26(C) is blank as there is no fish curing yard in the district.

EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY, MINING and ELECTRICITY:

2.6. Under this sub-head, first three tables viz. 27 , 28, and 29 give factory statistics for the year 1972 while data for from " Annual Survey of Industries" is given and has 1966 as - reference year in table No.30. Employment exchange data for each month of 1974-75 classified according to National occupational classifications is provided in table Nos. 31 and 32. In table No. 33, employment in different industries as on 31-3-1975 is given . Consumption of Electricity according to uses during 1974-75 is given in No.34 while table No.35 provides information as on 31st March 1961,1966,1970,1973,1974, and 1975 of towns and villages -- electrified. These all tables provide information for district as a whole. The population of villages and towns is given as per - 1971 Census.

CO-OPERATION:

2.7. Comprehensive data on this subject is displayed in table Nos.36 to 43. It includes . . number of different types of societies, statistics relating to Co-operative Banks, Primary Agricultural Credit Societies etc. activities of Agricultural - Produce Market Committees and financial statistics of registered money lenders. The Co-operative year starts in July and ends in June and the data presented is for the Co-operative year 1974-75.

MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH:

2.8. Under this head, information regarding medical and public health facilities is shown. Table No.44 shows medical facilities available through public and public aided institutions in each tahsil of the district for the year 1974-75. Table No.45 - gives tahsilwise data about births, deaths and infant deaths for

for 1974. In table No.46 data regarding number of deaths due to principal causes is shown for district as a whole for year 1971 to 1974. Table No.47 gives tahsilwise information regarding primary vaccination and Cholera inoculation in every tahsil in this district for the year 1974-75. Table No.48 indicates tahsilwise work done under family planning programme in the district in the year 1974-75.

EDUCATION:

2.9. Under this head, information regarding progress of education in Nashik district is collected and presented in 7 - different tables. Table No.49 gives sexwise as well as rural and Urban areawise literacy in each tahsil as per 1971 Census. Table numbers 50 and 51 give educational level in rural and urban areas of the district. Table No. 52 shows the number of different type of educational institutions and number of pupils and teachers in them in the district for the year 1974-75. In table No. 53 the total - number of enrolment of backward class students at each level of education is shown for year 1973-74. Table No. 54 gives information regarding total number of students benefitted under the scheme of free education to economically backward class students and total amount of such concessions for each educational level for year - 1973-74. The Table No.55 gives information about expenditure on - primary education during 1974-75.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS:

2.10. Under this head, information pertaining to length of railway route, -road length according to different category and surface classification, operational statistics of Nationalized road transport, traffic census, postal statistics etc. is presented. Table No.56 presents the information of length of railway routes for the year 1974-75 in the district. In table No. 57 the figures relate to categorywise and surfacewise extra-Municipal road length maintained by Building, and Communication Department and Zilla Parishad as on

31st March 1975. Table No.58 presents data about motor vehicles in operation as 31-3-1975 in Nashik Region comprising of Nashik, Dhule and Jalgaon Districts. Table No.59 relates to Nationalised Road - Transport. The information on number of routes, routes distance. Average daily earnings etc. is given for the year 1974-75. The boundary of S.T.Division does not exactly coincide with the district - boundary. In table No. 60 the data of traffic census conducted in May 1973 is given, it includes information regarding number of - vehicles, light motor vehicles and total traffic intensity in 24 hours. Table No.61 gives some important statistics regarding posts and telegraphs offices, No. of letter boxes etc., in the district for the year 1961-62, 65-66 and 1970-71 to 1974-75. Table No.62 gives tahsilwise information regarding the rural broadcasting scheme as on 31-3-1975.

LOCAL BODIES:

2.11 Under this head, information regarding income and expenditure of various local bodies viz. Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipal Councils in the district is - presented. Table No.63 presents income and expenditure of village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad, Municipal Councils at eight different - points of time viz. 1965-66 and 1968-69 to 1974-75. In table No. 64 the break up of information on income and expenditure of - village Panchayats is presented. It gives Panchayat Samitiwise - break up of income and expenditure during the year 1974-75. The total income and expenditure is further sub-divided into various major heads. Table Nos.65-A, 65-B and 65 -C gives particulars of headwise receipts, Government grants and expenditure respectively of Nashik Zilla Parishad for the years 1973-74 (Actuals), 1974-75 (Revised) and 1975-76 (estimates). Table No.66 gives sub-headwise information of income and expenditure in respect of Municipal Council for 1974-75.

PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

2.12. Under this section, five tables are presented. The

first two tables viz. Table Nos. 67 and 68 give important plan - statistics viz. Plan expenditure under different sub-heads of development and important physical achievements during 1974-75. The other three tables give data regarding Community Development Programme viz. Coverage, expenditure incurred upto 1974-75, according to different stages of block and physical achievements during 1974-75 in all blocks.

PRICES:

2.13. Under this head, wholesale prices of important agricultural commodities marketed through the Agricultural Produce Market Committees in the district and monthly average of weekly prices of selected commodities at selected shops in Nashik during 1974 are given in table No. 72 and 73 respectively. As regards the wholesale prices, the district average of only important commodities are given. Table No. 74 gives consumer price index number for working classes at Bombay and Jalgaon Centres for the year 1974-75.

MISCELLANEOUS:

2.14. As the head indicates, data on various subjects like crimes disposal in Civil and Criminal Courts, Joint stock - Companies, Life Insurance, Cinema, Small Savings, Land revenue, etc. which could not be incorporated under any of the twelve major - heads noted above, are presented for the latest available year in this section in table Nos. 75 to 84. Important indicators for the district as a whole in different fields of development such as - population, Agriculture, Live-stock, Factory, Employment, Electricity, Co-operation, Education, Medical and Public Health, Transport, etc. are presented in table No. 85. The years covered by the indicators are from 1950-51, 60-61, 66-67, 70-71, 73-74, and 1974-75.

CHAPTER - III -

AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SELECTED TRENDS:

3.1. In this chapter, an attempt is made to study the trend in various socio-economic aspects of Nashik district by working out important indicators on Agriculture, Irrigation, Live stock, Electricity Consumption, Education etc. Tahsil is taken as a unit for analysing the progress in a particular sector at different points of time. The base is taken as 1961-62 i.e. first year of Third Five Year Plan in most of the cases.

INDICATOR NO.1:- PERCENTAGE OF GROSS AREA TO NET SOWN AREA:

3.2. The table number 3.2 gives tahsilwise percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area during 1961-61, 1972-73 and 1973-74. The district percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area when compared with 1961-62 has declined to 103.86 from 107.3. While in 1973-74 also the percentage is less than 1961-62. But when a comparison between 1972-73 and 1973-74 is made, it is seen that percentage of gross cropped area has increased from 103.86 to 105.04. The year 1972-73 was a drought year. During 1973-74, highest percentage of double cropped area was recorded in Baglan, followed by Niphad and Nashik tahsils where as no double cropped area was recorded in Peint tahsil.

3.3. Yield per hectare of important crops in Washik district is displayed in table number 3.3 for the year 1961-62, 1972-73 and 1973-74. The yield per hectare for all crops except Cotton in the year 1973-74 when compared with 1961-62 have shown spectacular increase. These yield rates are not comparable with 1972-73 - which was one of the worst Scarcity year, the only exception is Sugarcane and cotton in which case the yield rates of 1973-74 are lower than those in 1972-73.

3.4. Value of important Agricultural production of important crops in Washik District is given below in table No.3:4 for the year 1971-72 to 1973-74. Considering the total value of production, it is seen that Bajra crop which is a staple food of the district stands first, followed by groundnut, wheat and Rice. During 1973-74, production in terms of value has increased for all crops except cotton. This value of Agricultural production has been arrived at on the basis of outturn figures supplied by Department of Agriculture and the average wholesale prices prevailing in the regulated markets in Washik District.

Viz. Bombay and Jalgaon in this Division. The general Index stood at 289 for Bombay and 328 for Jalgaon during 1974-75. Since the retail prices are collected at District Head Quarter from November 1962, the average prices during 1962 are compared with average prices during 1973 and 1974 in the following table. It would be seen from that table the prices of all the commodities of daily consumption have increased almost more than thrice 1962. The price of Bajra which is a staple food of this district rose from 50 paise per Kg. in 1962 to 166 paise per Kg. in 1974. During 1974 the prices of pulses, sweet oil and Vanaspati had increased considerably as compared with 1973 prices.

CHAPTER IV.

ANNUAL PLAN - 1974-75.

REVIEW OF FOURTH PLAN:

4.1. The Fourth Five Year Plan was launched in the year 1969-70 and it was over in the year 1973-74. During Fourth Five Year Plan Scheme were divided into three categories viz. 1) State Level Schemes 2) Divisional level schemes and 3) District level schemes. During period of Fourth Five Year Plan, total expenditure of Rs. 2126.88 lakhs was incurred. Usually schemes were implemented through the agencies which could be broadly classified as state sector and local sector. The following table gives an idea about sectorwise expenditure incurred during the Fourth Plan period.

FIFTH FIVE YEAR PLAN:

1.2. Special feature of the Fifth Five Year Plan is the introduction of planning with District as a unit and formation of District Plan. The Government of Maharashtra has accepted the principle of democratic decentralization of powers in third five year plan. By securing greater involvement of local people in the process of planning and implementation, the District Planning introduced since the beginning of 5th Plan is expected to show qualitative changes in developmental /^{plan} /i. The main object of the District Planning is to remove inter district and intra district imbalances. Keeping in view the National and the State objectives, the draft fifth plan of Nashik district was prepared by the District Planning and Development Council.

The year 1974-75 marked the commencement of Fifth Five Year Plan. After having adopted district as a unit of Planning the Government allocated a part of plan outlay to districts after involving a new methodology /^{of} /giving weightages to different items like population, irrigation backwardness, urbanization, schedules castes and scheduled tribes population etc. According to this methodology, Nashik district was allocated Rs. 55.17 crores for

for its Fifth Five Year Plan. The following table gives sectorwise allocations as proposed by the District Planning and Development Council, Nashik.

ANNUAL PLAN 1974-75:

4.3. The year 1974-75 was the first year of Fifth Plan. Since the Fifth Plan of State is not yet finalized, it is being implemented in the form of Annual Plans. The Government of Maharashtra has initially fixed a ceiling of Rs. 617.18 lakhs for Annual Plan of Nashik district for 1974-75 but the total of amount allotted to various schemes came to Rs. 1039.69 lakhs. However the actual expenditure on district level schemes amounted to Rs. 840.12 lakhs for 1974-75, in addition an amount of Rs. 37.48 lakhs was spent ^{on} centrally sponsored schemes. The Table No. 4.3 below gives the major headwise expenditure incurred and its percentage to total expenditure

In the following paragraphs details of physical achievements and expenditure incurred under various major heads and sub-heads are given.

AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME:

4.4. About seventy percent of the population of Maharashtra depends upon agriculture and allied activities, this also holds good for Nashik district. 32 Schemes were implemented under the developmental head "Agricultural Programmes" involving an expenditure of Rs. 146.96 lakhs during 1974-75. Under the sub-head agricultural Production Programme, total expenditure of Rs. 5.95 lakhs was incurred which resulted in production of local manure in 1,000 hectares, besides plant protection measures were taken in 8,100 hectares of land, of which an area of 3500 hectares was covered under scheme for protection from midge fly, rat control was carried out in 1350 hectares, whitegrubs were weeded out in 150 hectares where as treated seed^{was} distributed covering 3000 hectares of lands. Under (Page Yojana) scheme for Small farmers, 43 buffaloes and 362 goats were distributed to farmers in Kalvan and Bani tahsils. Under the same scheme 17 old wells

were renovated, 46 new wells were dug and 55 pump sets were installed. Under Aynaut Development Scheme, a sum of Rs. 28.47 lakhs was spent with the result that an area of 3,302 hectares of land was benefited.

Under the sub-head 'Minor irrigation' Rs. 63.52 lakhs were spent during 1974-75. It resulted in completing 24 percolation tanks, besides this subsidy for construction of 56 wells was given to small and marginal farmers, 3 pumps were installed and 5 Minor irrigation tanks with flow irrigation were in progress. Under the sub-head 'Soil Conservation' Rs. 32.08 lakhs were spent during 1974-75. Land totally 5,570 hectares was bunded, terracing was carried out in 10,935 hectares. The expenditure incurred on drought prone areas programmes was Rs. 11.51 lakhs. This amount was spent on continuing minor irrigation tanks taken up during the Fourth Plan, under the sub-head 'Forest' Rs. 3.77 lakhs were spent. Plantation was carried out in 75 hectares of land. Under the programme of 'Fisheries Development' Rs. 0.64 lakhs were spent. Fingerlings to the extent of 15.91 lakhs were stocked and 1.12 lakhs Kg. of fish was netted. Nylon thread weighting nearly 200 Kg. was distributed.

CO-OPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

4.5. Under this head of development Rs. 101.56 lakhs were spent for implementing 9 different schemes, of which 6 schemes were under the head Co-operation for which Rs. 91.51 lakhs were spent. As against this expenditure, 178 Societies were assisted and share capital contribution to 3 Sugar factories was given. The remaining 3 schemes were implemented under "Community Development" Sub-Head at the cost of Rs. 10.05 lakhs. Entire district is already covered under this programme. Five Panchayat Samitis, out of 13 Panchayat Samitis were covered under the Applied Nutrition Programme. The Gram Safai Programme was

also undertaken, under which, 148 porcelain pots were distributed during 1974-75.

IRRIGATION AND POWER:

4.6. Due to the introduction of District Planning, the major and medium irrigation projects are also transferred to district level. One continuing major project and 2 continuing medium projects were transferred at district level, besides one new medium project was started during 1974-75, an expenditure of Rs. 259.83 lakhs was incurred on these continuing and new projects. No. physical achievements can be given as all these projects are in progress. Under the sub-head 'Power Development' 2 schemes viz. (1) Rural Electrification and 2) Normal Development were implemented at the cost of Rs. 73.59 lakhs; and 143 villages were electrified and 787 pumps were energised.

INDUSTRY AND MINING:

4.7. Development of small scale industries helps in dispersal of industries, provides avenues for employment and capital mobilization. With a view to achieving these objectives, 6 schemes were implemented in this district during 1974-75, of these 2 schemes were under ^{sub} head 'Large and medium scale industries'. viz The Package Scheme of Intensive of SICOM and Spinning Mill at Malegaon for which Rs. 43.90 lakhs were spent. The rest of the amount of Rs. 0.98 lakhs was spent on small scale industries. Viz. 1) Development of Handloom industries 2) Balutedar Societies 3) Financial assistance under SAI rule, (4) Power subsidy. One Society was assisted, under development of handloom industries 13 balutedar Societies in 13 blocks were assisted and under SAI rules 100 institutions were assisted.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS:

4.8. Road development plays an important role in the economic development. For the rapid expansion of industries and other developmental activities and for linking tribal areas with-

market places, 2 schemes viz. (1) District roads including roads in Hilly and inaccessible area and (2) roads under Minium Needs - Programme were implemented with an expenditure of Rs. 11.54 lakhs. All road works were in progress at the end of the year.

SOCIAL SERVICES:

4.9. This head of development includes 50 schemes under seven different sub-heads on which an expenditure of Rs. 130.03 lakhs was incurred during 1974-75. Twenty Schemes under sub-head 'General Education' were implemented at the cost of Rs. 37.84 lakhs to 1) give the important achievements are (i) grants to Schedule castes/Schedule Tribes Students numbering 9000 at elementary stage 2) Providing 137 Balwadis with equipment 3) Attaching 52 divisions of standards V to VII to Secondary Schools 4) Assisting non-Government Secondary Schools to open 150 divisions 5) Assisting the construction of 49 School rooms. 6) Providing in service training to 613 primary teachers. 7) Grant of Loan scholarships to 184 primary teachers 8) Subjectwise summer classes conducted benefitting 87 trainee teachers 9) Economically Backward class concession given to 16350 students. ^{and} 10) Free education to 498 daughters of primary teachers. Under sub-head 'Health' 4 schemes were implemented at the cost of Rs. 2.88 lakhs. Increased medicinal grants were given to 18 primary health centres. The programme of upgradation of one primary health centre into cottage hospital is undertaken.

Under 'Applied Nutrition Programme' expenditure of Rs. 1.99 lakhs was incurred. Five blocks were taken up under this scheme. Special nutrition programme was also undertaken in 10 blocks.

Under sub-head 'Water supply and drainage' Rs. 68.52 lakhs were spent. This amount was the share of Government. The amount was supplemented by Life Insurance Corporation by way of

10th . Government supply scheme was in progress in 2 towns, 7 schemes of Municipal water supply were in progress and 53 rural water supply schemes were completed during the year 1974-75.

Under the sub-head 'housing' Rs. 0.70 lakhs were spent during the year under review, and 1011 huts were constructed . Under sub-head Welfare of backward classes, 15 schemes were implemented at the cost of Rs. 17.85 lakhs. Some of the notable achievements are as under:-

1) Tuition fees were given to Backward class students numbering 190. 2) Scholarships were given to 50 students 3) Loan for cottage industries was given to 170 beneficiaries 4) Financial Assistance was given to 58 Backward class Co-operative housing Societies. 5) 48 individuals were also given financial assistance , for construction of houses. 6) 52 Electric pumps under "Mini - Electrification" were given to Adiwasi Cultivators.

Under the sub-head ' Labour and Labour ^{Welfare} only one scheme viz. construction of building and making good the deficiencies in equipment of the Industrial Training Institute --- was taken up at cost of Rs. 0.25 lakhs.

OTHER PROGRAMMES:

4.10. Under this sub-head two schemes were implemented viz. 1) Rural broad casting Scheme and 2) Employment Guarantee Scheme. Total expenditure incurred was Rs. 71.90 lakhs for these two schemes. Out of these two schemes, the latter is of importance to this district. It is one of the prestigious schemes of Maharashtra Government under 15 point programme. Rs. 71.80 lakhs spent under Employment Guarantee Scheme which generated employment of 31,77,902 mandays during 1974-75.
