CHAPTER-I

Introduction

Location -

1.1 Dhule District lies between $30^{\circ}-33'$ and $22^{\circ}-03'$ North latitudes and $73^{\circ}-47'$ x $75^{\circ}-11'$ East longitudes. It is situated in the upper Tapi basin on the north west corner of Maharashtra State. The shape of the District is roughly round with a deep wedge like projection of Gujarat territory on the west. The breadth varies from 52 to 122 Kmr. and length from 100 to 130 Km'.

Boundaries -

1.2 The District is surrounded by Madhya Pradesh in the North, Gujarath in the West, Nashik District in the South and Jalgaon District towards its East.

Topography

1.3.1 The distinguishing feature of topography of Khandesh region is that unlike Deccan plateau the draining or gradient is from East to West. ~~South~~ almost all the rivers flow from East to West. The river Tapi passes through the middle of the Dist. and around its banks there is a belt of lowlying fertile land. The Northern region consists of hilly tract which is covered by rich forests and at the South there are scattered rocky hills which are the tail ends of the Sahyadri Ranges. Thus there are three regions of the District on the basis of its topography, i) low lying plains along the Tapi river, ii) hilly region in the North and iii) ~~South~~ region of scattered rocky hills in the South.

1.3.2 The tahsil of Akrani, Northern parts of Akalkiwa, and Taloda tahsils lie in the hilly region and has rich forests containing Teak, Sag, and other valuable forest produce.

1.3.3 The Tahsils of Nandurbar, Shahada, Shirpur, and parts of Akalkuwa, Taloda and Sindkheda tahsils lie in the belt of Tapi basin and has rich cultivated land.

1.3.4 Dhule and Sakri, Tahsils and part of Sindkheda tahsil lie in third region of scattered rocky hills. Nawapur Tahsil is on the South of Tapi basin and is partly hilly and partly consists of plains on the banks of the tributaries of Tapi viz. Raingan and Rangavali.

Hills and Rivers

1.4.1. The Satpuda ranges in the North run East West and form a natural barrier for communication between Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh. These ranges consist of rugged mountains, which are high at some places and are cut by the tributaries of Tapi viz. Aner, Arunawati and Gomai, In the South run Satmala ranges which are the offshoots of the Sahyadri terminating in scattered rocky hills and leaving low lands in between them which are irrigable and are used for cultivation.

1.4.2 The main river of the District is Tapi which flows the hills in Madhya Pradesh in the region to north of from East to West. It rises in Madhya Pradesh, and enters Dhule District at Thalner in Shirpur tahsil and in its course forms boundary between Shirpur and Sindkheda tahsils and further takes its course along the Northern boundaries of Sindkheda and Nandurbar tahsils. The total length of the river in this District is 54 Km. The river Tapi and its tributaries have deposited silt in its basin forming deep black soil region on both sides of its banks. Construction of well is therefore rendered difficult due to deep ^{alluvial} soil. The river Panzara rises in the hills at the South of Sakri tahsil & takes East wards course through Sakri & Dhule tahsils

and then runs in North East direction to join the Tapi near Thalner just on the border of Dhule and Jalgaon Districts. The total length of ~~this~~ this river is 136 Km. A dam has been constructed about 10 km. down stream from the hills where the river rises at Pankheda in the south west of Sakri tahsil to store water for irrigation, ~~and~~ Further many bandharas have been constructed in its subsequent course, contributing a large irrigation potential in Sakri and Dhule Tahsils. The ~~river~~ river Bural rises in the hills in the northern part of Sakri tahsil and runs Eastwards through Sindkheda, tahsil upto Chimthane village and then runs north eastwards to join the Tapi near Akhade village. The length of the river Bural is 77 km. ^{The} ~~A~~ river Kan which is an important tributary ^{the} of Bural rises in the hills at Bhamer in Sakri tahsil and joins it at Chimthane in Sindkheda tahsil. The length of the river Kan is 35 Km. There are two small rivers viz. Amraoti and Bhogavati, which run almost parallel from West of Sindkheda tahsil upto Dondelcha and then after their ^{confluence} ~~joining~~ take a northern course for over 7 Km. to join the Tapi. The other important tributaries of Tapi from the South are Raingan and Rangavali which rise in the hills at the South of Nawapur tahsil and after passing almost parallel in the north west direction join the Tapi. The important rivers which join the Tapi from the North are Aner, Arunawati and Gomals. The river Aner forms the boundary of this District ~~with~~ with Jalgaon District for a length of 88 km. A medium irrigation project has been ^{constructed on} ~~planned~~ this river which will create an irrigation potential in Shirpur tahsil on the West and Chopada tahsil of Jalgaon District on the East. The river Arunawati rises in the northern hills of Shirpur tahsil and after passing in its south west course for 38 Km. joins the Tapi near Vanawal village

in Shirpur tahsil. A dam has been constructed on this river at Karwand which has created an irrigation potential in Shirpur tahsil. The river Gomai which rises in the hills at the north west of Shirpur tahsil runs westwards along the District boundary and enters Shahada tahsil from the north east and takes south & west course across Shahada Tahsil to join the Tapi at Prakasha in Shahada tahsil. The length of Gomai river is 64 Km.

Soil

1.5 The District can be broadly divided into three zones on the basis of soil, i) light type, ii) medium type and, iii) deep black type, which occupy nearly 50, 30 and 20 percent, respectively of the total area in the District. The light type soil is seen in Dhule, Sakri and Akrani tahsils, western part of Nawapur tahsil and southern part of Nandurbar tahsil. This soil is good for ~~wheat~~ millets and groundnut. Medium black soil is seen in Sindkheda and Western part of Dhule and Sakri tahsils and is suitable for irrigation. Akkalkuwa, Taloda, Shirpur, Shahada and Nandurbar tahsils are mostly covered by deep black soil and have rich cultivated land.

Climate -

1.6 The District has dry climate in general. In Monsoon however the humidity in weather ^{increase} during showers. The temperature in the hot and ~~warm~~ cold seasons ^{touches the} ~~is~~ extreme, which ^{is} typical of tropical temperate zones. The three seasons of the year are Summer, ^{Monsoon} ~~Rainy~~ and Winter. The Summer ^{is} ~~is~~ intolerably hot, especially in May and June. The fall in temperature ^{is} ~~is~~ noticeable and down is ^{noticeable} ~~is~~ even in Summer. The maximum temperature recorded during April 1975 at Nandurbar Centre was ^{43.0°} C. and

the minimum temperature during the same month was 21.1°C. The difference between the maximum and minimum temperatures recorded at Nandurbar varied from 10.7° to 23.3°C. The Winter season in January and December is pleasant. The minimum temperature during January 1975 at Nandurbar was 10.7° C. Summer season is followed by monsoon season from June to September and thereafter there is a spell of hot month of October. The Winter season starts from November and lasts upto middle of February. The Summer season start after winter and lasts upto June.

Rainfall -

1.7.1 The total rainfall recorded at Nandurbar, Taloda, and Sindkheda during 1975 was less than the normal rainfall and that recorded at Dhadgaon (Akrani Tahsil), Akkalkuwa, Shahada, Shirpur, Nawapur, Dhule and Sakri was more than the normal rainfall. The overall rainfall in the District was satisfactory. Eastern part of the District covering Dhule, Sakri, Sindkheda and part of Nandurbar Tahsils are declared as drought prone and scarcity or akin to scarcity conditions usually exist in these areas. The Tahsils of Nawapur, Akkalkuwa, Akrani, Shahada and hilly area of Shirpur and Nandurbar usually receive more rainfall than other parts of the District.

Area and territorial changes

1.8 The total geographical area of the District as per 1971 Census is 13,142 Sq.Km.. The District accounts for 4.27 percent of Maharashtra State ~~area~~. The 1971 Census shows increase in the number of inhabited and uninhabited villages by 19 and 2, respectively, as compared to 1961 Census. There are 7 towns covering an area of 91.9 Sq. Km. in the District.

Forest

1.9.1 The forest in the District cover an area of 3919.7 Sq. Kms. of which 3,624.9 Sq. Km. are ^{under} ~~under~~ Forest Department and 294.8 Sq.Km. are ~~under~~ Revenue Department. The area covered under forest i.e. 3,919.7 Sq. Kms. accounts for 29.82

per cent of the total geographical area of the District. The forest under the jurisdiction of forest department consists of reserved forest and entire unclassed forest.

1.9.2 The forest under the jurisdiction of Forest Department are administratively under the central of Divisional Forest Officers of North, ~~and~~ West Divisions. The North Dhule Forest Division comprises of forests in Shirpur, Shahada, Akrani, and Akkalkuwa tahsils and the West Dhule, Forest Division comprises of forests in Taloda, Nawapur, Nandurbar, Dhule and Sakri tahsils. The forest produce during ~~1974-75~~ ¹⁹⁷⁵⁻⁷⁶ was of the value of Rs. 40.82 lakhs.

Minerals -

1.10 There is dearth of valuable minerals in the District. The mineral activities in the District are therefore, restricted to quarrying of stones and clay.

Population

1.11.1 The total population of Dhule District as per 1971 Census is 16,62,181. The district accounts for 3.31 per cent of the population of Maharashtra State ~~in terms of population~~. Increase in the total population during the last 10 years is 3,10,945 which is 23.01 percent of the total population of 1961. The percentage of variation in population in earlier decade viz. 1951-61 was 27.44. There are wide variations in the growth rates of population in different tahsils. Akkalkuwa tahsil has recorded the highest rate of 37.22 percent, while Taloda tahsil has had the lowest growth rate of 10.58 percent, which is nearly half of the District average. The central tahsils of Taloda, Shahada, Shirpur, Nandurbar,

and Sindkheda, which have fertile land have shown lower growth rates than the District average. The tahsils which are hilly and which are mostly covered by forest have had high growth rates of population. Such tahsils are Akrani, Akkalkuwa, Nawapur and Sakri.

1.11.2 The densities of population for Dhule District and its tahsils as per 1961 and 1971 Censuses are as under -

The population density of the District as a whole has increased from 108 in 1961 to 126 in 1971. Within the district, Taloda tahsil has the highest density of 198 persons per Sq.Km. and Akrani tahsil has the lowest density of 58 persons per Sq.Km.

1.11.3 The proportion of urban and ~~a rural population to~~ the total population as per 1971 Census was 17.31 and 82.69 percent, respectively. The corresponding proportions of urban and rural population to total population during 1961 was 15.97 and 84.03 per cent, respectively showing an increase in the percentage ratio of urban population by 1.34. There was an equal reduction in the percentage ratio of rural population from 1961 to 1971. The No. of urban centres during 1961 and 1971 were the same and the increase in the proportion of urban population ~~may~~ ^{may} be due to migration of rural population to urban centres.

1.11.4 According to 1971 classification of population into workers and non workers, there were 594691 workers and 10,67,490 non-workers during 1971. The distribution of workers into different categories shows that 2,18,686 (36.77%) were cultivators, 2,60,807 (43.86%) were agricultural labourers and 1,15,198 (19.37%) were workers in other categories. The ratio of agricultural labourers to cultivators is more than one in Dhule, Nandurbar, Taloda, Shahada Shirpur and Sindkheda tahsils, which are agriculturally rich and it is less than one in other tahsils of Sakri, Nawapur, Akkaluwa, and Akrani, which are mostly inhabited by tribal population. The ratio of agricultural labourers to cultivators in Sakri Tahsil is less ~~differs~~ than one by a slight margin.

Agro Industries-

1.12.1 The District is industrially backward and the industrial units, which have come up in the past two decades are mostly based on agricultural activities. The Govt. of India have therefore started a special project known as 'Rural Industries Project' for encouraging establishments of large Medium and Small Scale Industries.

However, the major industrial units having sizable assets and turnover in the district are all based on agriculture viz. Sugar factories and Oil-Mills.

1.12.2 There are two sugar factories at Shahada and Sakri. These sugar factories are run under co-operative management. The soil in Shahada in Shahada and neighbouring Tahsils especially in Tapti Bessin is fertile. The soil of the tract of Panzara basin in Sakri Tahsil is also fertile due to irrigation facility of Panzara Dam. Sugarcane is grown on a large scale in these Tahsils, which supply necessary raw materials to the above sugar factories. The sugar production in respect of both sugar factories is given below.

Out of the total production, Shahada Sugar Factory exported 38,485 quintals of sugar, while Sakri Sugar Factory exported 30,776 quintals of sugar during 1975-76, respectively.

1.12.3 The extraction of Oil from groundnut is another industry which has flourished in the district. This is mainly due to production of groundnut on a large scale in the district. There were 21 factories manufacturing edible oils and fats, mustered oil, groundnut oil, Tin Oil etc. in the district during 1975-76. In addition to this, there is one factory manufacturing vanaspathi ghee.

Special Features -

1.18.1 Dhule District has the largest proportion of the scheduled tribes and it ranks first in the state. Out of total population of 16,62,181 in the District 6,15,801 persons (37%)

belong to the Scheduled Tribes, Nawapur, Akkalkuwa, and Akrani Tahsils are predominantly tribal areas and have been notified as Scheduled Areas. Nandurbar, Taloda, Sakari, Shahada, and Shirpur, Tahsils have also large number of Scheduled Tribes. The predominant Scheduled Tribes are Etilis, Dhanku, Gucit, Kokani, Naikda, and Pratin Paradhia. Many special schemes for welfare of scheduled tribes are in progress in the District. Considering this aspect, 13 Tribal Development Blocks have been started in the district.

1.18.2 Dhule is one of the 13 Districts in the State, where Government has drawn up a special Tribal Sub-Plan alongwith the usual Annual Plan with a view to integrate Tribal Population with all sectors of developments and to raise their general level of development. Such Tribal Sub-Plan was formulated for 1974-75, & 75-76.

1.18.3 There are two Co-operative Sugar Factories at Shahada and Sakri. One more is likely to be set up in Shirpur Tahsil.

1.18.4 Government has established Rural Industries Project in a few backward pockets in the state. One of such Rural Industries Project is functioning at Dhule, as Dhule District is industrially backward.

1.13.5 Dhule District is well known for milk production and has been a supplier of milk to Bombay. Government has set up Chilling centres at Dhule and has embarked on a programme of dairy development on a large scale by providing credit and other facilities such as organisation of dairy co-operatives, milk collection transport, pasteurisation and chilling. This District is regarded as a most promising prospective district for Dairy Development.

1.13.6 In the hilly region of the north of this district is situated a Holiday Camp at Toranmal at a height of about 1000 metres. Toranmal is an attractive place for Tourists.

CHAPTER-IIExplanatory notes on the scope and limitations of data
presented in Part-II - Statistical Abstract.

2.1 This chapter gives brief description on the tables, which are broadly classified into 13 groups in Part-II of District - Statistical Abstract.

Area and Population

2.2 There are seven tables in this group in which tahsilwise area population, decadal variation from 1951, classification of villages and towns according to population ranges, distribution of population into workers and non-workers and different categories of workers, population of scheduled castes and scheduled Tribes, and distribution of population according to age groups and religions are given.

Climate -

2.3 The rainfall data recorded at Tahsil Head-quarters in the district and maximum & minimum temperatures recorded at Nandurbar during each month of the year 1975 are given in the two tables under this group.

Agriculture -

2.4 There are fourteen tables in this group. out of which, four tables give tahsilwise final figures for 1973-74 and provisional figures for 1974-75 regarding land utilisation, ~~area~~ ^{area} under different crops, area irrigated under different sources and ~~x~~ crops, one table gives yield rates of crops and production for 1973-74 and 1974-75 and three tables give tahsilwise statistics of irrigation wells in use and not ⁱⁿ use, and other minor irrigation works, and position of of major and Medium irrigation projects in the district as on

30-6-1975. Agricultural wage rates at three selected rural centres for all months of the year 1975 and Tahsilwise data regarding Agricultural implements (as per 1972 Livestock Census) are given in the subsequent two tables. Two new tables viz. those of availability of under ground water and operational holdings as per Agricultural Census 1971 for the district as a whole have been added in this sector. The last two tables give the statistics regarding famine and scarcity conditions during 1975-76 and history of scarcity for six years 1970-71 to 1975-76.

2.5. ~~2.5~~ Husbandry, Forest and Fisheries-

2.5. Out of six tables included in this group, three tables give tahsilwise livestock data as per 1972 Livestock Census Veterinary statistics and diseasewise Livestock Mortality for the district as a whole for the year 1975-76. The next table gives Tahsilwise number of slaughter houses and animals slaughtered during 1975-76 and the last two tables give statistics ^{of} ~~for~~ forest area under different classification and major and minor forest produce and ~~of~~ Tahsilwise length of rivers, ponds, lakes, reservoir suitable for fish culture and their production for the year 1974-75 and 1975-76.

2.6. Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity -

2.6. There are ten tables in this group. Out of which, first three tables give statistics for district as ^a/_{whole} regarding number of Registered factories and employment, distribution of working ^{factories according to} ~~factory~~ strength and number of days worked for the year

1974. The next table gives statistics about the Annual Survey of Industries 1966/1971. The next two tables provide statistics regarding monthwise registration and placements for employment during 1975-76, and total registration and placement according to occupational distribution during the year 1975-76. Subsequent two tables provide employment generated and expenditure incurred under Employment Guarantee Scheme during 1975-76 and industrywise volume of employment as on 31-3-76. The last two tables show consumption pattern of electric energy during 1975-76 and number of towns and villages electrified and population covered during and upto 1975-76.

Co-operation-

2.7 The data regarding different activities in the co-operative sector, viz. types of societies, their membership, loan advanced, marketing, Co-operative Banks, their memberships, and loan advanced by them for the year 1975-76 is presented in the first seven tables in this group. The last table shows tahsilwise information regarding money-lenders and loans advanced by them during 1975-76.

2. Medical and Public Health -

2.8 Tahsilwise information of medical facilities (through Public aided and Private bodies), number of births and deaths registered during 1975, and information of family planning for 1975-76 is given in the four tables and the information regarding deaths due to important causes, during the year 1971 to 1975 for the District as ^a whole is given in the remaining table.

Education-

2.9 There are seven tables in this group. Out of which, three tables provide Tahsilwise information of literacy in rural

and urban areas as per 1971 Census, and level of literacy in rural and urban areas as per 1961 Census. The fourth table gives Tahsilwise number of educational institutions, students and ~~ix~~ teachers for the years 1974-75 and 1975-76, respectively. The other three tables give statistics regarding backward class beneficiaries, E.B. concessions granted for the years 1974-75 and 1975-76, respectively, and expenditure incurred on education through local bodies during the year 1975-76.

Local Bodies -

2.11 There are four tables in this sector which provide income and expenditure statistics for village panchayats, municipal councils and Zilla Parishad, for the year 1975-76, and the first table gives figures of income and expenditure for 1965-66 and 1968-69 to 1975-76 for all types of local bodies.

Plan and Community Development -

2.12 Five Tables are included in this group. Three tables pertain to C.D. Blocks, their expenditure and physical achievements for the year 1975-76. The remaining two tables provide information regarding Plan Expenditure and Physical Achievements during fourth ~~the~~ five year plan and 1974-75, & 1975-76 under different district level and centrally sponsored schemes in the District.

Prices -

2.13 Out of three tables included in this group, two tables give statistics regarding wholesale prices of certain commodities at Regulated Markets and Monthly average retail prices of various commodities at the District Head-Quarters for the year 1975. The remaining table gives consumer's price Index Numbers for working Class at Bombay and Jalgaon for 1975-76.

2.14 There are in all eleven tables in this group. The first ^{ten} ~~ten~~ tables supply official statistics regarding Police Force and Crime Statistics, Joint Stock companies, Banking Offices, Insurance Statistics, Small Savings, Land Revenue Collection and Printing Presses and Journals. The last table indicates general trend of development in various sectors over a period ^{of} ~~two~~ decades and from 1970-71 to 1975-76.

CHAPTER-IIIAnalytical Review of Selected Trends -

Analytical review of important Socio Economic aspects over a period of decade in the form of indicators, showing comparison among Tahsils is attempted in the following paragraphs.

Indicator No.1 - Percentage of gross sown area/net $\frac{1}{2}$ sown

3.2 Tahsilwise ratios of gross cropped area to net cropped area for 1961-62, 1969-70 to 1974-75 are given in Table No.3.2.

The ratio for the district as a whole was 113.5 for 1961-62, subsequently a decreasing trend is observed till the year 1974-75 with marginal variations. In general it can be stated that the ratio of double cropped area to the net cropped area has decreased in the district during the past decade and first four years of the current decade. The ratios for Dhule, Nawapur, Taloda, Akhaluwa, and Akrani, Tahsils are less than the district ratio where as the ratios for Sakri, Nandurbar, - Shahada, Jalpur, and Sindkheda Tahsils are more than the district ratio for the year 1974-75. The highest ratio during 1974-75 is recorded for Sindkheda Tahsil and next to it comes Shahada Tahsil. The lowest ratio during 1974-75 is recorded for Akrani Tahsil.

Indicator No.2 - Production of Important crops

3.3 The yield rates of production of important crops in the district for the year 1961-62, 1969-70, 1970-71 & 1971-72 to 1974-75 are shown in Table No.3.3. The yield rates of production of Jowar show an increasing trend except for 1971-72 and 1972-73, possibly because of scarcity conditions during those years. The variation of

yield rates for sugarcane has shown a reasonable steady increasing trend during the period under consideration except for 1971-72 in which the yield rate was comparatively low. The yield rate of wheat, which was 730 Kg. per hectare during 1961-62 has increased to 960 Kg. in 1970-71 and decreased considerably during the years 1971-72 and 1972-73. The yield rate again shot up to 944 Kg. and 999 Kg. per hectare during 1973-74 and 1974-75 respectively. The yield rates of Rice Bajara and Groundnut, have fluctuated during the period without any consistent trend.

3.4 The value of agricultural production of few crops viz. Wheat,
 Jowar, Bajara, Cotton and Groundnut for the years 1969-70 to 1974-75

at average wholesale prices prevailing during the year are given in Table No.3.4. The general trend of the average whole sale - prices of the above agricultural commodities is upward for all crops. The value of agricultural production however does not follow the same trend as the prices obviously because the total production fluctuate through a more or less indefinite range depending on rainfall and other seasonal conditions. The value of production of wheat, Jowar and Bajara showed an upward trend from 1969-70 to 1970-71 and later decreased during 1971-72 and 1972-73 and increased during the years 1973-74 and 1974-75. The value of production of cotton varied from Rs.155.47 lakh in 1969-70 to Rs.280.03 lakh in 1973-74 and then abruptly attained the value of Rs.536.14 lakhs in 1974-75. The fluctuations in the value of groundnut are observed to be rather erratic with a maximum of Rs.2155.15 lakh in 1973-74 and a minimum of Rs.556.02 lakh in 1972-73.

Indicator No.4 - Percentage of net irrigated area to net cropped area -

3.5 The percentage ratio of net irrigated area to net cropped area is a good indicator for showing of irrigation facilities available in a Tahsil or a district. This ratio for the district as a whole shows a decreasing trend from the year 1971-72 to 1974-75. The over all effect of the scarcity conditions from the year 1971-72 to 1974-75 affected the coverage of area under irrigation. The decreasing trend in the ratios is evident in respect of Dhule, Sakri and Sindkheda Tahsils which lie in the drought prone belt of the district. This ratio fluctuated with ups and downs, in respect of other Tahsils. The maximum ratio is recorded in Shahada Tahsil and the minimum in Akrani Tahsil during the year 1974-75. Taloda and Nandurbar have comparable ratios of 11.50 and 7.80 respectively,

whereas Nawapur has a lower a ratio of 0.99 during the year 1974-75.

Indicator No.5 - Change in cropping pattern -

The cropping pattern for the year 1961-62 and 1970-71 to 1974-75 is given in table No.3.6 for food crops, non-food crops, area under cereals and pulses are concerned. The general trend of coverage of food crops and non-food crops is fairly constant during this period. The proportion of area under food and non-food crops is almost the same except a slight increase for food crops and

decrease for non-food crops during 1973-74. The proportion of area under cereals and pulses is also near about the same with little fluctuations. Roughly three fourth of the total cropped area is under food crops and one fourth is under non-food crops and half of the total cropped area is under cereals and a little less than one fifth of the total cropped area is under pulses.

The membership, amount of loan advanced, outstanding amount and advance and outstanding amount per member for all societies together are shown in table No.3.8 for the year 1961-62, 1970-71 to 1975-76. The advance per member shows a general increasing trend, whereas the outstanding amount per member which shows a steady increasing trend reaching upto Rs.799.00 in 1974-75, abruptly dropped down to Rs.217.00 in 1975-76. This sudden fall may be perhaps due to special recovery drive taken by Government during the year 1975-76.

3.11 Ratio of poultry to human population is given Tahsil-wise in Table No.3.11. Poultry population in the district increased from 3,10,036 in 1966 to 3,40,980 in 1972. However the ratio of number of poultry to one thousand persons has decreased from 229 in 1966 to 205 in 1972. The decreasing trend of this ratio is seen in Dhule, Sakri, Nawapur, Nandurbar, Akkalkuwa, and Shahada Tahsils whereas this ratio increased in Taloda, Akrani, Shirpur, and

The General increasing trend during the period from 1961-62 to 1975-76, whereas No. of vacancies filled in have remained almost steady with little variations from 821 to 975 for the years 1961-62 and 1970-71 to 1973-74. This number however decreased to 254 and 665 during 1974-75 and 1975-76 respectively. This steep fall in the trend might be due to ban imposed by the Govt. for filling up of vacancies in the public sector, The percentage ratio of placement to registration during the year 1975-76 is 6.84 which is indicative of a large scale unemployment in the district.

Indicator No.13 - Increase in indoor and out-door patients treated in hospitals dispensaries etc.

3.14 Statistics regarding indoor and outdoor patients treated in public and public aided hospitals and dispensaries for the year 1971 to 1975 is given in table No.3.14. The number of indoor patients shows an increasing trend whereas number of outdoor patients shows a decreasing trend during the years 1971 to 1975. The number of indoor and outdoor patients is lowest during the year 1973. The percentage ratio of indoor patient to outdoor patient has increased from 2.01 in 1971 to 7.09 in 1975.

3.15 Statistics regarding number of institutions and enrolment in Primary, Secondary, and higher levels during the years 1961-62, and 1970-71 to 1975-76 is shown in table No.3.15. General trend of Primary and secondary institutions and their enrolment during the period 1961-62 to 1975-76 is upward but average enrolment per institution has not kept ~~pace~~ ^{pace} with the increasing trend of enrolment as far as secondary education is concerned. The enrolment per institution for secondary schools in 1961-62 was 274 and the same average during 1975-76 was 345 which is indicative of increased of

pressure on the intake capacity of the secondary institutions. There were only 5 higher institutions during 1961-62, which increased to 14 by the year 1970-71. There is no addition to number of institutions from 1970-71 to 1975-76. The enrolment has however increased from 6333 in 1970-71 to 8002 in 1975-76. Like secondary schools, the intake capacity of the higher institutions also appears to be under pressure of increased demand of enrolment.

3.16 Road length per 100 Sq.Km. is a good indicator for comparison of road development for different districts. This ratio for Dhule district was 16.01 which steadily increased to 48.37 in 1975-76. The ~~steadily rise~~ ^{steadily rise} of this ratio during 1973-74 and 1974-75 is due to increase in the road length of lower types, which were constructed during the period from 1972-73 to 1974-75 under scarcity programme and Employment Gurantee Scheme. The apparent decrease from 51.02 in 1974-75 to 48.37 in 1975-76 is due to revision of total road kilometrage in the local sector. The decrease in the ratio may not be construed ~~as decrease~~ ^{as decrease} in the road length of the district.

Annual Plan 1975-76

4.1 The year 1975-76 is the second year of fifth five year plan (1974-75) to 1978-79). As contemplated in the preamble of the policy directives of the fifth five year plan, the Government decided to decentralise planning and district was made the unit of planning with view to associate people and their representatives directly in the planning process. For this purpose District Planning and Development councils is formed in each district to formulate Five year plan and annual plans within the cutings approved by the Government. The expenditure incurred and the physical achievements during the year 1975-76 as a result of implementation of the schemes in the Annual Plan 1975-76 are briefly described in the forgoing paragraphs.

4.2 The total expenditure incurred on district level schemes under State Plan and Central Sector during Fourth Five Year Plan, 1974-75 and 1975-76 are given in the Table No.4.2. The overall expenditure during the year 1975-76 is one and-half times of the previous year and nearly half of the total expenditure incurred during the Fourth Plan. The per capita plan expenditure during 1975-76 was Rs.39/-.

4.3 Headwise expenditure on district level schemes in the fourth plan 1969-74, 1974-75 and 1975-76 is given in Table No.4.3.

The headwise distribution of expenditure shows that sizeable expenditure is incurred on Agricultural Programme, Irrigation and Power, Social Services and Miscellaneous. As compared to the Fourth Plan, the trend appears to be different under Irrigation and Power and Co-operation and Community Development. This is because of inclusion of major and medium projects in the district level schemes and of higher outlays under rural electrification during

the first two years of fifth plan. The outlays under Community Development have been reduced gradually due to completion of the prescribed two stages. The distribution of expenditure under central sector schemes has also undergone changes during the fourth plan and subsequent years 1974-75 and 1975-76. One of the important changes is observed in the sub-head 'Health' under which outlay at considerably enhanced rate has been allocated for family planning programme.

Agricultural Programme -

4.5 The total expenditure under Agricultural Programme, involving ten sub-heads during the year 1975-76 was Rs.167.22 lakhs. Out of which, Rs.4.24 lakhs have been incurred under sub-head Agricultural production to achieve the distribution of 50 Agricultural implements and covering 215.30 hectares of additional land under fruits. Besides this, 1,115 quintals of Jowar, 1,917 quintals of wheat, 1,309 quintals of Bajara, 3,485 quintals of Cotton, 70,000 quintals of groundnut were distributed. Similarly 1,222 tonnes of Ammonium sulphate, 1291 tonnes of super phosphate, 1504 tonnes of fertiliser mixture and 8,629 tonnes of Urea were also supplied during the year. Under the sub-head minor irrigation, five schemes were implemented at the cost of Rs.88.82 lakhs to achieve the

construction of 19 new irrigation wells and installation of eleven pumps, continuation of the work of 30 percolation tanks, seven lift irrigation works and one bandhara under a local sector, and construction of 9 M.I. tanks under state sector and lastly covering additional area of 177 hectares under irrigation by constructing Kaccha bandharas during the year 1975-76. The programme of soil conservation involving bunding works and afforestation for soil conservation for over 23,342 and 100 hectares respectively was carried out at a cost of Rs.29.19 lakhs and Rs.33.12 lakhs from Employment Guarantee Scheme funds.

The work of development of land under the command areas of existing five irrigation projects viz. 1)Malangaon, 2)Kulthe, 3)Karwand, 4)Panzara Sayyadnagar, 5)Kanoli, were taken under Ayacut development and the expenditure incurred thereon was Rs9.44 lakhs, covering an area of 1,759 hectares during the year 1975-76. Special attention for development of drought prone area in selected water shades of Sakri, Nandurbar, Sindkheda, and Dhule Tahsils was given in the plan programme at a cost Rs.4.31 lakhs during the year 1975-76. 200 hectares of bunding, continuation of the work of one M.I. Tank at Nandre, construction of one nursery and supply of 155 buffaloes have been achieved under this programme during the year 1975-76. Under Animal Husbandry and Dairy Development Rs.0.67 and Rs.24.27 lakhs respectively were spent to start the starting of new four new veterinary dispensaries and continuation of construction and addition to existing milk plant machinery at Dhule. Plantation of valuable trees over 120 hectares, plantation of Road side trees for 40 Kms. plantation under farm forestry on 35 hectares were done by implementing seven schemes under forest at a cost of Rs.2.77 lakhs during the year 1975-76. 26,500 fingerlings were stocked, 2.65 lakhs Kg. of fish was netted and 133 Kg. of Nylon was supplied to the fishermen on subsidy basis during the

year 1975-76 by implementing four schemes under fishery at a cost of Rs.0.17 lakhs. One scheme was implemented under ware-housing and marketing involving an expenditure of Rs.3.40 lakhs during the year 1975-76 for giving share & capital contribution to the 4 Agricultural Produce Market Committees for development of their market yards and subsidy to all the 8 Agricultural Produce Market Committees for propoganda and publicity.

Co-operation and Community Development -

4.6 Four schemes under co-operation and one scheme under Community Development were implemented with an expenditure of Rs. 0.77 and Rs.8.00 lakhs respectively to give financial assistance to one co-operative marketing society, two Agricultural Processing Societies, three rural consumer stores with share capital contribution and to continue C.D. Blocks of 24 CPA size during the year 1975-76.

4.7 Irrigation and Power -

Rs.106.53 lakhs were spent under Medium Irrigation Projects during the year 1975-76 for continuation of spill over works of Panzara, Aner, Kanoli M. Medium Projects. The work of survey and investigation of new medium irrigation project on Bural river was also carried on during the year 1975-76, 23 villages were electrified during the year 1975-76 at a cost of Rs.24.92 lakhs.

Industry Mining -

4.8 Under this head Rs.5.68 lakhs were spent to implement ~~four~~ four schemes. Out of which, Rs.3.00 lakhs were spent to give interest subsidy to 67 units, share capital contribution to industrial co-operatives and managerial sub-sidy and financial assistance to the nine Block Level Village Artisan's Co-operative Societies in the district during the year 1975-76.

Transport and Communication -

4.9 Construction of 31 Kms. of new district Road, 55 C.D. works, modernisation of 21Kms. of road and black topping for 2 Kms. have been achieved during the year 1975-76 by spending Rs.28.38 lakhs. Besides this the spill over work of construction of air strip at Dhule was continued during the year.

Social Services -

4.10 There are nine sub-heads under this major head and total expenditure incurred under these nine sub-heads together is Rs. 120.12 lakhs ~~was~~ under General Education Rs.25.25 lakhs were spent to implement 28 schemes to achieve appointment of 4 A.D. E.I.S., attaching of 180 classes of stds. V to VII to Highschools, construction of 23 school buildings, continuation of the scheme of financial assistance to the Municipal School Boards, training of 8 A.D. E.I.S. and Primary Teachers in service and conducting three courses of subjectwise summer institutes, continuation of E.B.C. concessions and also granting ~~of~~ of scholarships at different levels starting of new course of 10 + 2 + 3 in high-schools, development of play grounds and conduct of district sports during the year 1975-76. Under the sub-head Technical Education, some deficiencies in equipment and machinery were removed by spending Rs.0.31 lakh * during the year 1975-76. Eight schemes were implemented under State Plan and 3 schemes under Centrally Sponsered Programme - involving an expenditure of Rs.5.55 lakhs and Rs.48.07 lakhs respectively to achieve the continuation of the work of 20 bedded T.B. ward and also of the scheme of giving increased grants for medicine to the primary health centres and sub-scentres, continuati of Primary Health Units, upgradation of P.H.C. into Rural Hospital

sparying of about 22,000 houses, examination of 39,000 cases of blood smears under Malaria Eradication Programme, Sterilisation cases of 23,843 vasectomic and 3,378 tubectomic operations and continuation of the scheme of prevention of communicable diseases like small pox, cholera etc. during the year 1975-76. The programme of Nutrition was also carried out under two schemes of Applied Nutrition and Special Nutrition at a cost of Rs.13.83 lakhs for continuing two A.N.P. Blocks and supply of 'Sukada' to 24260 beneficiaries during the year 1975-76. Under the sub-head Water Supply and Drainage one Govt. Water supply scheme, three Municipal Water supply schemes, and four Rural Water Supply Schemes were continued and 42 Bore wells were constructed at a cost of Rs.44.63 lakhs during the year 1975-76. A small amount of Rs.0.20 lakh was spent under Urban Development to implement one scheme of ~~grant~~ grant in aid to the Municipal Councils. Under the sub-head Housing ~~four~~ four schemes were implemented at a cost of Rs.10.95 lakhs to achieve the construction of 4500 huns for landless agricultural labourers, supply of tiles for 49 houses for replacement of thatched roofs and provision of basic amenities in the slum areas during the year 1975-76, 17 schemes were implemented under the sub-head Welfare of Backward Classes, with an expenditure of Rs.18.83 lakhs to achieve the items such as - 1) Grant of tuition fees to 541 students, 2) Grant of scholarships to 70 students in highschools, and grant of various other scholarships in I.T.S.I. and Colleges, 3) Grant of loan and subsidy to Backward Class Housing Societies, continuation and starting of Ashram Shala Complexes, continuation of 9 Tribal Development Blocks and grant of 92 electric pumps on 100% subsidy to Adivasi farmers during the year 1975-76.

Miscellaneous

4.11 Two schemes were implemented under this sub-head and the expenditure incurred was Rs.118.46 lakhs. The achievements under Employment Gurantee Scheme are given below -

1) Completion of 19 and continuation of 77 Minor Irrigation Works generating about 17,61,767 mandays.

2) Completion of 142 and continuation of 582 Soil Conservation Blocks creating 7,81,387 mandays.

3) Completion of 22 roads and continuation of 49 Road works giving 3,47,938 mandays..

4) Plantation works under Forest Development and seven different places involving 1,01,265 mandays, and

5) Miscellaneous works such as construction of huts and manufacturing of bricks, for about 4,608 huts giving 92,000 mandays.

6x The total mandays generated under Employment Gurantee Scheme during the year 1975-76 was of the order of 30.84 lakhs.
