Amongst these rivers the Pravara, the Mula & the Godavari have been a boon to this district, a large part of which comes under the scarcity tract. At Bhandardara in Akola tahsil on the Pravara and at Baragaon-Nandur in Rahuri tahsil on the Mula, irrigation dams are constructed. The canal irrigation system on these two rivers along with the water available from the Godavari have transformed the agricultural economy of tahsils such as Shrirampur, Kopargaon, Rahuri, Newasa from one of subsistence into that of prosperity and plenty.

1.4 (c) HILL RANGES :

The main Sahyadri range touches Akola tahsil in the western areas of Ahmadnagar District. From this main range, three spurs

CHAPTER - I

INTRODUCTION

LOCATION :

- 1.1 Ahmadnagar District is located in the central part of Maharashtra between 18.2° to 19.9° north latitude and between 73.9° to 75.5° east longitude. The district is surrounded by Aurangabad and Nashik Districts on the North by Bhir and Osmanabad Districts on the east, Pune and Thana Districts on the south-west and by Solapur District on south Ahmadnagar District with an area of 17,035 Sq.Kms. ranks second in the Maharashtra State.

TOPOGRAPHY : (a) SOIL :

- 1.2 The geographical foundation of soil prevailing in the district is mainly of Deccan trap of volcanic origin.

The district is situated on the Deccan plateau. Soil of the district is generally found responsive and fertile, except the hilly areas of Akola tahsil and some portion of the plains. Which suffer from heavy soil erosion. The soil of the Ahmadnagar District can broadly be classified into the following five categories.

1. Deep black soil, of Kopergaon, Shrirampur and Rahuri Tahsils.
2. Red Soil of western and hilly areas of Akola Tahsil.
3. Laterite.
4. Barad or gray inferior quality soil.
5. White.

1.3 b) RIVERS :

The Godavari and the Bhima are the Major rivers of the district. The Pravara is the tributary of the Godavari. The Mula, the Adhala and the Mahalungi are the important tributaries of the pravara. The southern part of the district consisting of Parner, Ahmadnagar, Pathardi, Shrigonda & Karjat tahsils constitutes the Bhima basin with the tributaries Sina, Kukadi, and Ghod.

hills
viz. Kalsubai, Baleshwar and Harishchandragad spurt out. Kalsubai is the highest peak of Sahyadri (1654 meters) and serves as the watershed between Darna and ^{Pravara} and Mula rivers. Harishchandragad is 96 Km. long and its branches run from Ratangad, serving the watershed between Pravara and Mula rivers. The Baleshwar is the largest range and demarcates the boundary of Pune and Ahmadnagar districts. On entering into Parner tahsil the Baleshwar forms two sub-branches, one going through north of Nagar town and ^{forms} watershed between the Godavari & the Bhima and the other turning south-wards across the north east corner of Shrigonda tahsil and enters into Karjat tahsil.

1.5 (d) MINERALS :

There are no major mineral deposits located in Ahmadnagar district except limestone in Parner tahsil. However sand, stone, muram etc. are found in abundance in all tahsils of the district.

1.6 CLIMATE :

Ahmadnagar district gets rain mainly from the south-west monsoon but the distribution of rainfall is mostly uneven. Agro-climatically, the district gets divided into three parts.

a) SCARCITY TRACT :

Out of the 13 tahsils in the district as many as 12 tahsils and the eastern one-third part of Akola tahsil fall in the scarcity tract. The range of annual rainfall in this part varies between 430 mm. to 650 mm.

b) TRANSITION 2 ZONE :

This second zone covers the middle one-third part of Akola tahsil, receiving rainfall between 700 mm. to 1250 mm.

c) The remaining one-third part of Akola tahsil, can be divided into three small zones in order of sequence as under.

1) Transition 1 (TR-1) zone with annual rainfall between 1250 mm. to 2500 mm.

-ii) ~~Very high rainfall tract with non-laterite soil (VEN) having~~
precipitation between 3000 mm. to 3500 mm.

iii) Ghat tract (GH) with rainfall between 3000 mm. to 3250 mm.

FAMINE & SCARCITY :

It is generally experienced in this district that out of 5 years, 3 years are scarcity years on account of uneven and poor rainfall one year is average and one year is a good year.

The following are the broad geographical regions.

a) Akola tahsil :- This tahsil covering 8.88 % of the district area gets heavy rainfall. There is a large forest area & mainly kharif crops are sown here.

b) Sangamner, Parner, Shrigonda, Karjat & Ahmadnagar tahsils :- This is scarcity area covering 47.92 % of the district.

c) Kopergaon, Shrirampur & Rahuru tahsils :- The rainfall is low but there is canal irrigation & the land is fertile.

d) Jamkhed, Pathardi, Newasa & Shevgaon tahsils :- This area gets regular rains, Newasa & Shevgaon tahsils have very fertile land and due to the Mula Project canal water is available in these 2 tahsils.

In Jamkhed & Pathardi, the fertility of the land is quite low & only well irrigation is available.

During 1976-77 there were good rains in the whole district and as such no village was affected by scarcity or famine. In fact, 260 villages were affected by floods.

DEMOGRAPHY : POPULATION :

According to the population census of 1971 total population of Ahmadnagar district was 22,69,117 and rate of increase in the population was 27.77 percent during the decade 1961-71 which was higher than that of Pune division and also that of Maharashtra the respective figures being 25.64 and 27.45.

from the above table, it will be seen that decennial growth rate in Kopergaon, Sangamner, Shrirampur, Rahuri Tahsils was above the district average. The decadal growth rate in Parner and Jamkhed tahsils was however less than 20 %..

1.9 SPECIAL FEATURES : SUGAR PRODUCTION :

Ahmadnagar district is the Sugar centre of Maharashtra. The tahsils of Kopergaon, Shrirampur, Rahuri and Newasa with deep

black soil and a wide net work of perennial irrigation system specialise in sugarcane production. Out of the 51 co-operative sugar factories in Maharashtra (1976-77) and 32 in Pune division 10 are in this district. (it has to be mentioned that the Pravara Co-operative sugar factory in Shrirampur tahsil was pioneer in sugar production in the co-operative fold.) In addition there are 5 private sugar factories in this district. These 15 sugar factories are located in the eight tahsils of Kopergaon, Shrirampur, Newasa, Rohuri, Sangamner, Shrigonda & Pathardi. Since 1976-77, 2 more co-operative sugar factories have come up in the district. One in Karjat tahsil and another in Newasa tahsil. During 1977-78, these sugar factories crushed about 54 lakh tonnes of sugarcane, producing about 53 lakh bags of sugar. Twenty five percent of sugar in Maharashtra and 10 % of sugar in India is produced by this district alone, which speaks for its pre-eminence in this field. In fact, Shrirampur is the biggest sugar market in India.

DROUGHT PRONE AREA PROGRAMME :

At the instance of the Govt. of India, two districts in Maharashtra, have been selected under the "Drought Prone Area Programme" which has been implemented since 1974-75 with the assistance of the World Bank and Ahmadnagar district is one of them. The execution of the programme is done on watershed basis. During 1976-77 there were 9 water-sheds covering 115 villages from 10 tahsils. The primary aim of the programme is stabilisation of income & ensuring the supply of basic necessities of human & cattle life such as drinking water & fodder. The programme therefore, envisages provision of drinking water & fodder, development of all sources of irrigation, dry farming, afforestation, diversification of economy by development of animal husbandry, dairy farming & development of industries.

EMPLOYMENT GUARANTEE SCHEME :

Ahmadnagar District is one of the prominent districts in the State ⁱⁿ expenditure on the Employment Guarantee Scheme & there by providing employment to unskilled needy laborers in the rural areas of the district and simultaneously creating productive assets. During 1976-77, ¹³⁸ works were undertaken at a cost of Rs 4,05 lakhs and provided ^L employment to 1,54,72,314 persons.

VEHICLE RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT ESTABLISHMENT :

In this Establishment the only one of its kind in India, vehicles of all types are tested. It is located in Ahmadnagar city.

MAHATMA PHULE KRISHI VIDYAPEETH, RAHURI :-

One of the 4 such Vidyapeeths in the State, this institute is engaged in development of various activities ⁱⁿ the agricultural sector.

INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT :

Till a few years back Ahmadnagar district ^{had} been industrially backward, excepting the establishment of sugar factories. Industrial activity has, however, been significant recently with the establishment of Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation and Industrial Estates.

CHAPTER II

EXPLANATORY NOTE

2.1 The data on different important sectors which have dominant effects on the economy are presented in this abstract for the year 1976-77. In case the data for the year 1976-77 is not available the data for the latest available year are presented. In most of the cases, the reference period of the data is the financial year. The data on Agriculture, however relates to the Agricultural year, whereas the data on 'Co-operation' is for the Co-operative year (1st July to 30th June). The data on other important items like rainfall, temperature, civil and criminal cases, vital statistics, are for the calendar year. The information as far as possible is presented tahsilwise for inter tahsil comparison.

DISTRICT AT A GLANCE :

2.2 Certain essential data in important spheres, such as -

- i. Population.
- ii. Agriculture.
- iii. Animal Husbandry.
- iv. Industries.
- v. Co-operation.
- vi. Medical and Public Health.
- vii. Education.
- viii. Transport and Communication.
- ix. Plan Expenditure etc.

pertaining to the district are presented along with the corresponding figures for the State for the comparison purpose.

DISTRICT STATISTICAL ABSTRACT :

2.3 The data incorporated in the District Statistical Abstract have been presented in suitable tables, classified in appropriate

Groups. The concepts adopted in preparation of tables are summarised in the following paragraphs. The limitations of data are cited wherever necessary.

AREA AND POPULATION :

2.4 The data of 1971 Census mainly on population, area, houses and livelihood occupation, rural urban breakup etc, are presented in the first seven tables for all tahsils in the district. Data on population per square kilometre, decadal variations during 1951-61 and 1961-71, classification of villages and towns according to population ranges, number of workers and non-workers, population of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes, distribution of population according to age group and religion are also given in these tables.

2.5 URBAN AREA :- The following places have been treated as 'Urban Areas' (towns).

1. Every place having a municipality or cantonment board irrespective of its population.
2. Every other place which satisfies following three conditions.
 - i. A population of at least 5,000
 - ii. At least three-fourth of its male working population engaged in non-agricultural pursuits and
 - iii. A density of population of at least 400 persons per square Km.

Any other place not falling under above two categories which possesses certain distinct characteristics to qualify to it's being treated as urban such as its being a project area or a developing township.

RURAL AREA : Those areas which do not satisfy the criteria prescribed for recognising urban area are called 'Rural areas'

A census village in Maharashtra has always been a revenue village. A revenue village has well-defined boundaries, a map

and a separate set of land records irrespective of whether that defined area has any population or not.

C: WORKER : A worker is defined as a person whose main activity is participation in any economically productive work through his physical or mental activity. Work involves not only actual work but effective supervision and direction of work. A public or social worker engaged actively in public or social work or political worker actively engaged in furthering the political aims of a party was also regarded as a 'worker'. In case of perennial work, such as cultivation, live-stock, plantation, some type of household industries, a person was treated as a 'worker' by ascertaining whether he had participated any time during the last one year even if he was not economically active in the week prior to enumeration. In case of regular work in trade, profession, service or business, a person was considered as 'worker' if he had participated in such regular work on any one of the days during the week preceding the date of enumeration and that work has been returned as his main activity.

D: NON-WORKER : Non-workers are those who are not mainly engaged in any economically productive work.

Persons primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in the family economic activity, but not on full time scale were treated as 'non-worker' in respect of their main activity.

2.6 **CLIMATE :**

The rainfall and temperature have pronounced effects on climate. The rainfall data presented in table No. 8 gives normal rainfall, monthly rainfall and number of rainy days during the calendar year 1976 for the selected 13 centres. Normal rainfall figures are worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five years and a maximum of

80 years. A day was treated as a 'rainy day' if during the twenty four hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 M.m. of rainfall. ^{The} table No.9 gives actual maximum and minimum temperatures recorded during each of the month of the calendar year 1976, ⁱⁿ respect of Ahmadnagar District.

AGRICULTURE :

2.7 Important tahsilwise statistics on agriculture, such as

- i. Land Utilisation,
- ii. Area under different crops,
- iii. Yield per hectare and out-turn of principal crops.
- iv. Irrigated area under different crops.
- v. Sourcewise irrigated area and
- vi. Data on irrigation etc.

are given in tables 10 to 14.

2.8 The basic definitions adopted are given below :-

- a. GEOGRAPHICAL AREA : It is according to village papers calculated from village returns prepared for revenue purposes and as such it may be different from that according to Surveyer General.
- b. FORESTS : It includes all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as ' Forests ' under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether State owned or private, If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land.
- c. LAND PUT TO NON-AGRICULTURAL USES : It stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under rivers, canals etc, and other land put to uses other than agricultural.
- d. BARREN & UNCULTURABLE LAND : It covers land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, whether

2.8-d Barren & unculturable land : It covers land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, whether in isolated blocks or uncultivated holdings. Land under mountains, deserts etc. is classified under this category.

e. Permanent pastures and other grazing land : It covers all grazing lands. Village common grazing lands and grazing lands within forest area are included under this head.

f. Culturable waste land : These may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use and includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but cultivated during the current year and the last five years or more in succession.

g. Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown :

This category includes all cultivable land which is not included in net area sown but put to some agricultural use.

h. Current fallow lands :- These are lands which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seedling area is not cropped again in the same year, it is also treated as 'Current fallow'.

i. Other fallows: All lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period not less than one year and not more than 5 years are classed as 'other fallow'.

j. Net Area sown : This consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once.

k. Gross Cropped Area : Total of area under all crops including area under crops sown more than once is taken as 'Gross Cropped Area'.

2.10 ALLIED AGRICULTURE :

Agricultural wage rates at the selected centres, viz-

- i) Karjat (Taluka : Karjat)
- ii) Akola (Taluka : Akola)
- iii) Belapur (Taluka: Shrirampur)

collected by the District Statistical Officer, through the Block Statistical Assistants are given in table No. 19. Number of operational holdings as per Agricultural Census -1970 are given in table No. 20. Final figures of agricultural implements enumerated during the eleventh live-stock census are given in table No.21. The tahsil-wise data on 'famine and scarcity' are given in table Nos. 22 & 23 for the year 1976-77.

2.11-ANIMAL HUSBANDRY & FORESTS :

Population of live-stock and poultry as per livestock census 1972 (final data) is shown tahsilwise in table No.24. Statistics

on veterinary facilities existed, animals treated in such centres and disease-wise mortality of live-stock are given in table No.s 25 & 26. Table No. 27 furnishes data on animals slaughtered in recognised slaughter houses in the district.

2.12 The data on area under forests and major and minor forest produce for the year 1976-77 have been shown in tables 28(a) and 28 (b) respectively. Area under forests with a classification into,

- i. reserved,
- ii. protected, and
- iii. unclassed forests under the control of State Revenue Department and under State Forest Department.

--has been shown. These areas may not tally with the area under forests shown in table No. 10 due to different concepts of classification into above three heads. Reserved forests are intended mainly for timber production in which rights or grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. Grazing and cultivation under certain limitations and restrictions are allowed in protected forests. The unclassed forests refer to inaccessible forests or unoccupied waste.

2.13 Inland fisheries :

The statistics relating to total area suitable for fish culture, ponds, lakes and reservoirs, area under pisciculture, inland fish production and carp fry used for pisciculture are given in table No. 29 (A)

2.14 Employment, Industry and Electricity :

The Statistics relating to working factories under different groups with average daily employment, mandays worked, classification of factories according to working strength and number of days worked are given for the years 1975 & 1976. in table No.s 30, 31 & 32. The term 'factory' includes-(a) Those employing 10 or more workers working with the aid of power.

b) Those employing 20 or more workers and working without aid of power and,

c) Those registered under the factory Act, 1948 even though the above conditions are not fulfilled. The Defence factories are excluded. Statistics regarding number of registered factories productive capital, investment, output and employment provided under different industries based on Annual Survey of Industries for the year 1968 is given in table No. 33. Monthwise registration, vacancies notified, placements done, number of employment seekers on the live register at the end of the month, occupation-wise and sectional, other data of employment exchange have been shown in table No.s 34, 35 and 37. The information regarding the employment generated under Employment Guarantee Scheme works is also given in table No. 36.

2.15 Data on consumption of electricity by different categories during the year 1976-77 is given in table No. 38 and number of towns and villages electrified during and upto the end of selected years are shown in table No. 39. The data are collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board, Private Electric Supply companies and Sugar factories in the district.

2.16 Co-Operation :-

Statistical information on the co-operative institutions and their activities have been given for the year 1976-77 on the following items .

- i) Loan advanced by co-operative banks & primary agricultural credit societies-different types of societies, their membership,
- ii) Total value of purchase and sales by the central and primary co-operative marketing societies, and
- iii) Annual arrivals in the regulated markets in each tahsil of Ahmadnagar District in tables 40 to 46. Tahsilwise data regarding no. of members, capital

structure, loans advanced and recovered etc. have also been given.

Working Capital :- It includes paid-up capital, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding includes outstanding in respect of loans, cash credits and overdrafts and the amount of the loans outstanding bills purchased or discounted. Overdue refers to the amount of loans or instalments which was due for collection but which was not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by the competent authority. Information of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them is given in table number 47.

The main functions of Agricultural credit societies are to help members by way of providing short and medium term loans for meeting their agricultural necessities like improved seeds, fertilizers, agricultural improved implements, etc. The help is also extended in the matters of storage, transportation and sales of the agricultural produce.

2.21 The agricultural non-credit societies look after the work of better farming by way of educating the agriculturists in adoption of improved agricultural practices, crop protection etc. The societies also undertake educational, economical, cultural and house building activities so as to uplift the standard of living of the agriculturists.

2.22 The main function of the Urban Bank, Urban credit Co-Operative Societies and salary earners Co-Operative Societies is to promote the qualities of economy and co-operation among the members and also to make them industrious. They also augment the saving habits of the people by way of making the banking facilities easily available. They give loans to the members on the securities like gold, immovable property, Government securities, commercial goods, etc. They also provide

loans to the artisans and small traders.

2.23 The main functions of non-agricultural non-credit societies are to run printing presses, to provide electricity to members and consumers for domestic, industrial and agricultural purposes to run Montessories, primary schools and educational institutions for educational spread and things of the kind.

The main function of primary co-operative marketing society is the purchase and sale of agricultural produce grown by its members or member co-operative societies in its area of operation.

2.24 Medical & Public Health :-

In this section, data on medical and Public Health for the year 1976 are given. Table No.48 gives medical facilities available through public and public-aided bodies in each tahsil along with indoor and outdoor patients treated. Data on 'Vital statistics' e.g. tahsilwise births and deaths and infant deaths registered in the year 1976 with break-up into male and female and number of deaths due to important causes, from the year 1971 to 1976 are given in tables No. 49 and 50 respectively. Vaccination statistics and cholera inoculation done in each tahsil during 1976 is given in table No. 51. Table No. 52 gives statistics on family planning during the year 1976-77.

2.25 Education :-

The data on tahsilwise number of literates and percentage of literacy as per 1971 Census are shown in table No. 53. The data on education level of people in rural and urban areas are given in table Nos 54 & 55. The data regarding pupils and teachers with number of institutions in pre-primary, primary secondary and higher categories are presented in table No. 56. The data on backward class enrolment and concessions granted to economically backward class and expenditure incurred under

normal and plan grants on primary education in the district is shown in table Nos 57 to 59.

2.26 Transport & Communication :-

Length of railway routes according to gauge is shown in Table No. 60. The table No. 61 gives road length according to category and surface classification. Roads maintained by municipal councils/contonment boards are also shown separately in this table. The data of number of motor vehicles in operation in Pune region covering Pune, Ahmadnagar & Sholapur Districts together are shown in table No. 62. (districtwise figures are not available.) Important operational statistics relating to Ahmadnagar District of Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation are given in table No. 63 (Ahmadnagar State Road Transport division comprises of Ahmadnagar District only). Results of traffic census conducted in May-1975 on important roads in the district are given in table No. 64. Statistics on Postal, Telegraphs and telephone facilities and on rural broadcasting are depicted in the table Nos 65 & 66 respectively.

2.27 Local Bodies :-

The financial position of Village Panchayats, Municipal Councils and Zilla Parishad is shown in this section for the year 1976-77.

2.28 The number of Village Panchayats includes number of independent Village Panchayats as also group Village Panchayats, Income and Expenditure of village panchayats are exclusive of opening and closing balances respectively. Grants include grants from Government as well as from Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities for developmental activities. Government grants to Village Panchayats are mainly land revenue grants, equalisation grants and local cess grants. Government grants in respect of municipal councils are mainly grants on account of dearness allowances, grants for roads, for water supply, for educational allowances, grants for roads, for water

supply, for percentage in land revenue. The receipts of Zilla Parishad are under four sub-heads, viz.

- i) Self-raised resources,
- ii) Government grants,
- iii) Grants for agency scheme and
- iv) Debt section. The expenditure is shown under two heads- Revenue Expenditure & Debt Section.

2.29 The data are collected from the Zilla Parishad, Ahmadnagar and all the Municipal Councils in Ahmadnagar District.

2.30 Plan & Community Development :-

Data on plan expenditure under State and Local sectors and physical achievements in important fields during the year 1976-77 are given respectively in table Nos 71 & 72. Statistics in respect of coverage of community development programme, stage-wise expenditure of various blocks and blockwise physical achievements under community development programme are shown in table Nos 73 to 75.

2.31 PRICES : The table No. 76 gives monthly average wholesale prices of agricultural commodities transacted in regulated markets. The district average for each variety and for each months is also given.

2.32 The table No. 77 gives the monthly average retail prices of important commodities at Ahmadnagar head-quarter during 1976. As the information collected for the given commodities is restrict to only one quotation and that also from only one shop in the district head-quarter, the averages shown for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative but the data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time. The table No. 78 gives consumer price index number for working

class of Sholapur and Pune centres for the year 1976-77. For the calculation of index, the years 1960 and 1961 are taken as base years for Sholapur and Pune centres respectively.

2.33 Miscellaneous:

Statistical data pertaining to police force, crime statistics, cases disposed of in civil and criminal courts, cinema statistics regarding seating capacity in different types of theatres, number of banking offices, number of scheduled banks, their deposits and advances and number of Joint stock companies, insurance policies and amount insured, collection of small savings, land revenue collections, number of persons, newspapers and periodicals published etc, are given in the table Nos. 79 to 89. Table No. 90 gives information about the quantity of Rice, Wheat, Sugar issued to fair price shops. The demand and procurement of levy in Ahmadnagar District are indicated in table No. 91. Statistics relating General Elections of Assembly 1972 and Lok Sabha-1977 are presented in table No. 92.

2.34 A table showing trends in selected indicators in the fields of development, such as

- i) Agriculture,
- ii) Livestock,
- iii) Industry,
- iv) Education,
- v) Health, etc.

is appended at the end. These collected indicators are very useful for assessing progress in various fields over important periods in the recent past.

ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS

3.1 The statistical data presented in part II of this Abstract are analysed in this chapter for studying the trends in the important sectors of the district economy.

AGRICULTURE :

Seventy seven percent of the working population in A,nagar district is dependent on agriculture for its livelihood. However , as per Agricultural Census, 1970, the percentage of number of holdings in the size class more than 10 hectares was only-14. Combined with the fact that only 13 % of the net area sown in the district is irrigated, barring the is lands, of prosperity where sugarcane is grown on an extensive scale. On canal waters, the rest of the tilling mass just eke out a living on the meagre agricultural produce. To them agriculture is just a way of life rather than a commercial proposition.

The following indicators of development show the position on the agricultural front.

PERCENTAGE OF GROSS CROPPED AREA TO NET SOWN AREA :

The culturable waste land in the district is barely 1 % of the total geographical area. The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown indicates the extent to which the available land is intensively used for agricultural production.

In the following table the tahsilwise comparative position during the years 1960-61, 1974-75 & 1975-76 is given.

It is observed that in the district the double cropped area increased by about 4 % in 1974-75 & by about 9 % in 1975-76 as compared to the base year 1960-61.

During the year 1974-75 as there were sufficient rains the Kharif sowing was quite good in the district. However during Rabbi due to very heavy rains, the Rabbi sowing was adversely affected. From the table No.1, it is seen that the double cropped area in Ahmadnagar, Pathardi, Karjat, Shrigonda, Akola & Sangamner, did not show any significant increase. The only tahsils where the percentage increase was appreciable were Shrirampur, Shevgaon, Parner, & Kopergaon. This increase might be due to the irrigation facilities available in Shrirampur, Shevgaon and Kopergaon tahsils.

3.5 During 1975-76 also there were timely rains at the time of Kharif sowing. However, at the time of Rabbi rainfall was not timely at many places. The over-all achievement in double cropped area was however, more in the district as compared to 1960-61 & 1974-75.

3.6 IRRIGATION :

Development of irrigation is the sine qua non for agricultural prosperity because water is the key in-put & without it all other inputs are either ineffective or much less effective. In Ahmadnagar district, the net irrigated area increased from 1,35,876 hectares, in 1960-61 to 1,51,993 in 1973-74 i.e. by 16,117 hectares. The source-wise irrigation facilities available in the district are given below.

3.7 It is observed that well irrigation accounts for 73 % of the total irrigated area in the district, though flow irrigation also is making progress.

It is mentioned above that during the course of 13 years irrigation facilities, increased by 16117 hectares in the district. It is, however, observed that these facilities are concentrated in a few pockets such as in Shrirampur, Kopargaon, Rahuri & Sangamner Tahsils.

In the following table the relevant tahsil-wise details are given.

It is seen that during the period 1960-61 to 1973-74, the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area increased at a very slow pace (from 10.79 to 12.63 %). The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area increased relatively more (from 113.63 % to 116.42 %). It has, however, to be noted that in this district a large part of irrigation is utilised for sugarcane crop, resulting in availability of less irrigation for double cropping. For instance in Shrirampur, & Kopergaon tahsils, the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area is quite large (41 % & 39 % respectively). The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area in these tahsils is, however, only 11 % & 12 % respectively. The irrigation facilities in Shevgaon, Pathardi, Jamkhed, Parner, & Akola have not developed to any significant extent.

CROP PATTERN :

In the following table the crop pattern in the district is given.

From the data it is revealed that the pattern in the district has remained more or less the same during the period 1960-61 to 1975-76, excepting the increase in the area under sugarcane and decrease in the area under cotton and groundnut.

PRODUCTIVITY OF IMPORTANT CROPS :

Yield rate and production of important crops are the yard sticks for assessing the progress on the agricultural front. Rice, Jowar, Bajara, Sugarcane, Groundnut, Safflower, and Cotton are the important crops in Ahmadnagar District.

It is observed that the yield rate of Rice, Jowar, Groundnut & Cotton has increased significantly since 1961-62. This is due to the increased use of hybrid high yielding varieties of seed & increased irrigation facilities & use of fertilisers. In the case of Bajara, the yield rate increased in 1974-75 but fell sharply in 1975-76 due to "Gosavi disease" on a large scale. In the case of Sugarcane, the yield rate has declined as compared to 1961 to 62, but the production has increased, indicating increase in area under the crop. In the case of remaining crops (excepting Bajara 1975-76), the production has also increased.

AGRICULTURAL WAGE RATE :

The data on this subject are collected every fortnight from the representative agriculturists at the selected centres Akola, Belapur and Karjat. In the following table average wage rates paid by the selected cultivators in the above centres to male and female wage earners in the years 1975 and 1976 are shown.-

It is seen from the data that in 1976 the average wage rate for agricultural male labourer was Rs.3.00 per day except at Karjat where it was higher by 0.50 paise, while for female wage earner it was Rs. 2.00 at Akola, Rs. 2.40 at Belapur and Rs. 1.50 at Karjat.

As regards skilled laboure, a carpenter in Belapur earned Rs.9.00 per day, a Blacksmith Rs. 8-50 and a cobbler Rs. 4-00 per day, while their counter parts in Karjat received Rs. 8-00, Rs.5-00 & Rs. 4-00 per day respectively.

AGRICULTURAL CREDIT :

Given the indigence of the average farmer, supply of credit on a large scale for investment in agriculture is a "must". The Co-operative sector has made great strides in this district and a wide net work of primary agricultural societies has been established.

In the following table the performance in this field is given.

It is seen that there is a big leap forward in the amount of loan advanced by them. The disturbing aspect of the situations is however, the staggering amount of loans over due, which stood at Rs. 1239 lakhs in 1976-77. While the amount of loan advanced increased three and half times during the period 1961-62 to 1976-77, the amount of loans over due in 1976-77 was about 17 times of that in 1961-62.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY:

Livestock provides subsidiary income to the farmers besides draught power for carrying out agricultural operations. In the following table comparative data for 1966 & 1972 are presented.

It is observed that there is a small increase in the livestock population during the 5 year period. The break-up however shows that the cattle population declined by 7%. The number of livestock per hundred hectares of cultivable area was 134 in 1966 & 135 in 1972. The gross cropped area per pair of working bullocks declined from 8.1 hectares in 1966 to 6.9 in 1972. The poultry population per 1000 human population (1971 Census) was less by 48 in 1972²³ compared to 388 as per 1966 Census.

ELECTRICITY :

Consumption of Electricity is a meaningful indicator of economic development because availability of power supply is the basic requirement for both industrial and agricultural development. Consumption of electricity is also an indicator of the standard of living.

It is observed that in the district, the progress in this direction has been quite significant, Consumption of electricity, in 1975-76 was 277 million K.W.H. while in 1976-77 it rose to 317 million K.W.H.. This increase was witnessed in all the different uses viz.

industry, agricultural, domestic, consumption etc.

The consumptions of electricity by industrial units was higher by 6 million K.W.H. & by agriculture by 16 million K.W.H. in 1976-77 as compared to the previous year. The per capita consumption of electricity in 1976-77 was 140 K.W.H. as against 122 in the previous year. As of March, 1977 all the 6 urban places in the district and 76 % of villages (997 out of 1317) were electrified.

EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE STATISTICS :

The problem of educated and uneducated unemployed is assuming alarming proportions in spite of the avenues of employment created every year in the private & public sectors. No data about the extent of overall unemployment are however available. The Employment Exchange data presented in this Abstract reflects only the tip of the iceberg because information regarding the vast number of un-educated unemployed as well as some portion of the educated unemployed who have not registered their names in the Employment Exchange is not available.

At the end of 1976-77 the number of persons on the live register of the Employment Exchange stood at 16431, as against 16746 at the end of 1975-76, a very small decrease indeed. During the reference year 1976-77 986 persons got employment. It is interesting to note that out of 427 placements which were classified into 7 specific occupational distribution categories (the remaining placements were not classified) 234 placements, i.e. 55 % related to clerical work.

MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH :

Health is a basic need of human welfare & a pre-condition for productivity. The Health Survey & Planning Committee, has recommended one doctor for 3000 population & 1 bed for 1000 population.

Comprehensive data covering both private & public health facilities are, however, not available for exactly assessing the progress in this field. The information given in the following table, which covers the health facilities available through public & public aided bodies will however be a useful indicator to some extent.

It is observed that considerable progress has been made in providing health facilities to the people, though the achievement falls short of the prescribed norm. A further point which needs mention is that though there are in all 9 hospitals in the district they are not evenly spread over in the district. Out of the 9 hospitals, 5 are in Ahmadnagar Tahsil & one each at Rahuri, Shirampur Sanganner, & Kopargaon tahsils. In other words 8 tahsils do not have this facility at all.

It is found that the numbers of students in primary & Secondary Schools has increased, while that in higher institutions is rather stable.

In 1974-75, the pupil teacher ratio was 34 for primary, 26 for secondary, and 28 for higher institutions. The corresponding figures for 1976-77 are 36, 26 and 24 respectively.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION :

Communications constitute an important item of infrastructure for the progress of all development activities.

Ahmadnagar District is served by only a broad gauge single line railway with a length of only 197 Km. with 18 railway stations.

The total road length (extra municipal) in the district as on 31-3-1977 was 14324 Km, giving a road length of 84 km. for 100 Sq.km. area. The road length per 100 Sq.km. area as on 31-3-61 was 18 km. only. Thus there is ^{an} increase of 66 km since 1961. Till 1977 in road length per 100 sq.km. area. This speaks about spectaculalar progress of Road Development programme.

The Maharashtra State Road Transport Coropration is serving more & more places by providing new bus routes. As on 31-3-1977, there were 372 routes with a route distance of 27972 Km. As compared to the previous year, the number of routes increased by 36 and route distance by 2569. km.

BANKING OFFICES :

As on 31-3-1977, there were 198 banking offices (scheduled and co-operative banks) located at 89 places in the district.

While as on 31-3-1976, there were 176 banking offices at 78 centres. Thus during the period of one year, 22 new banking offices were opened.

PRICES :

Prices registered a decline in 1976-77 as compared to the previous year. The average general index of consumer price index number (Revised Series) for working class was 296 for Pune Centre and 342 for Sholapur Centre. During 1976-77, the corresponding figures were 287 and 308 respectively.

CHAPTER NO. IV

ANNUAL PLAN : 1976 - 77

1. Since the constitution of District Planning and Development Councils, the Planning process has started from "below". The Draft Fifth Five Year Plan of Ahmadnagar District was the first such plan for this District covering the period from 1974-75 to 1978-79. Taking into consideration the felt needs of the area and the aspirations of the people, the plan envisaged an expenditure of Rs. 55.16 crores against the allocation of Rs. 45.81 crores by the Govt.

In this chapter, the financial as well as physical achievements of the Annual Plan 1976-77, (including Centrally Sponsored Schemes) are reviewed. Wherever necessary comparison with the Annual Plan of 1975-76 is made.

For the year 1976-77, the District Planning & Development Council had prepared an Annual Plan of Rs. 732.00 lakhs, out of which nearly 95 % allocation was for continuing on-going schemes, leaving a meagre amount of about Rs. 22.00 lakhs for new schemes. Considering the fact that a major portion of the district is a scarcity tract, due weightage was given in this plan to agriculture, irrigation & electrification. This district is one of the 2 districts in the State where the World Bank aided D.P.A.P. is implemented. Sufficient provision was, therefore, made for D.P.A.P. Programme also.

The actual expenditure in the district during the year, however, exceeded the original allocation by about Rs. 4 crores. The lion's share in the increase was claimed by Employment Guarantee Scheme, where the actual expenditure exceeded the original allocation by about Rs. 3 crores.

In the following table the major head-wise expenditure during 1975-76 & 1976-77 is given.

The comparative picture shows that during both the years the order of priorities remained more or less the same. Maximum expenditure (38 %) was on the major head "Miscellaneous" which covered the E.G.S. Under the Employment Guarantee Scheme, Minor Irrigation works, Soil Conservation & Land Development Schemes, Forest work, etc. were undertaken. Next in percentage expenditure comes agril.

~~programme (27% & 20% respectively). On Industry and Mining, the expenditure was the least (only 2 to 3 %).~~

AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME :

Two facts characterise the economy of Ahmadnagar District. One is that it is an industrially backward area, which in other words means that agriculture is the mainstay of the economy.

The district is however scarcity prone. Out of the 13 tahsils in the district as many as 12 tahsils & the eastern one-third part of Akola tahsil fall in the scarcity tract. This district is, therefore, covered by the World Bank aided D.P.A.P. Keeping in view the formidable problems, arising out of frequent scarcity conditions, ^{Other} suitable schemes like Intergated Area Development Scheme for Small holders and agricultural labourers, Soil Conservation etc. were taken up and implemented.

The D.P.A.P. programme is executed on watershed basis. During 1976-77, there were 9 watersheds covering 115 villages from 10 tahsils. The programme covers Minor Irrigation, dry farming, Dairy Development, Forest etc. The share of the ^{World} Bank is 50 % while the remaining 50 % matching contribution is provided by the District Planning & Development Council.

The Scheme of Integrated Area Development, popularly known as the 'Page Scheme' is in operation in this district in Pathardi and Sanganner Tahsils, since 1969-70. Both the tahsils are covered entirely under the scheme. The small holders & agricultural labourers are deprived of the benefits of modern technology due to lack of credit facilities & uneconomical agricultural holdings. The scheme, therefore envisages provision of modern technique & inputs to this class at subsidised rates.

The other programme covered under agriculture include, minor irrigation, Animal Husbandry, Dairy Development, Forests etc.

In table No.2 given below the financial achievement under agricultural programme is given for the 2 reference years.

During 1975-76 the financial achievement was not satisfactory under Soil Conservation D.P.A.P. & Animal Husbandry. However, during the year 1976-77, the performance picked up in the case of Soil Conservation & D.P.A.P. (from 89 % to 157 % and from 89 % to 99 %). The performance under animal husbandry, however, deteriorated and only-60 % of the budget provision was utilised in 1976-77.

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION :

Under this sub-head 4 schemes viz. Strengthening of seed Certification organisation, Subsidy for pesticides, raticides etc. Integrated Area Development Scheme for small holders & resettlement of landless labourers on forest land were implemented. In 1976-77, 92 % of the budget provision was utilised. The main reasons for the small short fall in financial achievement were that for the scheme of resettlement of land less labourers though the original budget provision was of Rs. 2.00 lakhs, only Rs. 1.63 lakhs were actually released by the Government and secondly the vacant post of Agricultural officer under the Scheme of Strengthening of seed certification organisation was not filled in.

It is also worth mentioning that during 1976-77, 1808 quintals of hybrid improved Jowary-seed, 2361 quintals of improved Wheat Seed, 3178 quintals of Oil Seeds and 21465 M.Tonnes of Sugarcane (seed) were distributed. The chemical fertiliser distribution was 60,000 metric tonnes.

In addition to these State Plan Schemes, 3 Centrally sponsored Scheme viz. Scheme for production of H-4 cotton, production programme of pulses & organisation of demonstration on sunflower were implemented.

2. MINOR IRRIGATION :

Under this sub-head 4 schemes viz. Construction of new irrigation wells, installation of pumpsets, construction of percolation and irrigation tanks^{were} implemented in 1976-77 at a cost of Rs. 114.61 lakhs, which was 138 % of the original budget provision. As compared to the previous year i.e. 1975-76, the expenditure was higher by Rs. 55.26 lakhs.

SOIL CONSERVATION :

During the year 1976-77 the expenditure on this sub-head was more than twice the amount spent in 1975-76. As compared to the budget provision also, the financial achievement was quite satisfactory.

The physical targets were also achieved during the year. An area of 5841 hectares was bunded during the year. Terracing work in the district is confined to the hilly Akola tahsil only. The area terraced was 156 hectares. In addition, afforestation works were undertaken for soil conservation in the following area.

4. AREA DEVELOPMENT :

The Ayacut Development Scheme was implemented in the district at a cost of Rs.11.57 lakhs, and 1626 hectare area was covered under land development & 11 drainage works were completed during the year 1976-77.

5. DROUGHT PRONE AREA PROGRAMME :

This is the most important programme implemented under agricultural programme. The total expenditure which embraced various schemes such as minor irrigation, dry farming, cattle and dairy development etc. was Rs.116.04 lakhs, out of which 50 % i.e. Rs.58.02 lakhs was shared by the District Planning & Development Council as matching contribution. Almost all the budget provision was utilised.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY :

The overall performance under this sub-head was poor in both the years.

During 1975-76, only 2 schemes viz. Opening of Artificial Insemination Centres and ^{poultry} development were implemented at a cost of Rs. 0.15 lakh. Out of this Rs. 0.05^{lakh} were spent on the 5 Artificial Insemination Centres located in Pamer, Shrigonda, Newasa, Nagar & Shrirampur tahsils & all the budget provision was fully utilised. In the case of poultry development scheme, there was a shortfall of Rs. 0.06 lakh (Budget provision Rs. 0.16 lakh, expenditure Rs. 0.10 lakh) because at the Kopargaon farm, some cockrels were found weak and some died & hence as against the target of 800 cockerels, only 672 were distributed.

In 1976-77, 4 schemes were implemented with a total expenditure of Rs. 2.29 lakhs. Out of the 4 schemes, the expenditure on the scheme of land development work at the cattle breeding farm, Kopargaon was substantially less. For this scheme Rs. 2.00 lakh were budgetted, while the amount actually released was Rs. 1.37 lakh as against which the expenditure was Rs. 0.50 lakh only. The expenditure on the remaining schemes viz. Providing Artificial Insemination facilities at existing veterinary institutions, providing medicines to existing veterinary institutions and veterinary dispensaries was, however, almost 100 % of the budget provision.

During the year 2 Veterinary Dispensaries were opened one at Ashwi in Sangamner tahsil and another at Sonai in Newasa tahsil. For provision of medicines & equipment Rs. 0.50 lakh were spent.

DAIRY DEVELOPMENT :

The expenditure on this sub-head of development was Rs. 16.06 lakhs (1976-77) which was 97 % of the budget provision.

During the year 25 milk societies were assisted as against the target of 19, Under the Govt. Milk supply scheme, the target of 25000, litres was exceeded by 6462 litres.

8. FOREST :

Forest in Ahmadnagar cover about 7 % of the district area. However, the so called forests of the district are nothing but barren hills useful mainly for cattle grazing. The plan object is, therefore, afforestation with a view that the forest land contributes its share for the economic well being of the community. With this object in view schemes like farm forestry, development of minor forest produce were taken up for implementation.

96 % of the budget provision was utilised during the year 1976-77. The short fall of 4 % was due to the fact that oil engine required for implementation of the scheme of establishment of Central Nursery was not received in time.

9. FISHERIES :

The schemes of fish seed production, fish farming in impounded waters, assistance for purchase of fishery requisites & subsidy on fish exports were implemented during 1976-77. Rs. 1.96 lakhs, were expended during the year which was satisfactory.

The scheme of assistance to Agricultural Produce Market Committees was discontinued during 1976-77.

II. CO-OPERATION & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

The expenditure on this major head of development was only Rs. 26.28 lakhs, during 1975-76; which was 3 % the total plan expenditure. In 1976-77, there was a big leap forward & the expenditure shot up to Rs. 152.62 lakhs. (13 % of total plan expenditure). This was due to the massive assistance (Rs. 140 lakhs) given to the Sugar factories in the district under the scheme of share capital contribution to co-operative sugar factories.

CO-OPERATION :

Ahmadnagar District is very well served by a net work of primary Co-operative societies and hence no effort is called for in the direction of expanding the co-operative base. The effort in the Plan for the co-operative sector is, therefore, to utilise the finances available for broadening the income base of the district and for diversifying the rural economy. Keeping this aim in view, six schemes were taken up for implementation during 1976-77. The original budget provision was Rs. 54.69 lakhs, while, the actual expenditure was Rs. 141.41 lakhs, which was a little more than two and a half times of the former. As said earlier, the bulk of expenditure was on assistance to co-operative sugar factories. The second important scheme was share capital contribution to agricultural

~~Processing Societies other than sugar factories.~~ On this scheme Rs.0.90 lakh were spent out of a budget provision of Rs.1.00 lakh.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

Two schemes viz. Community Development Project including Block grants for local development works & Gram Safai programme were implemented during 1976-77.

III. IRRIGATION & POWER :

As said earlier, Ahmadnagar District is a Drought Prone Area. Out of 13 tahsils, irrigation facilities are found to be concentrated only in a few pockets viz. Shrirampur, Kopergaon, Rahuri, tahsils. The average net irrigated area by all sources is around 11% of net sown area. With a view to harnessing the available water resources, 4 medium irrigation projects have been taken during the ^{Fifth} Five Year Plan.

1. ADHATA PROJECT : This project is located at Deothan in Akola tahsil. The irrigation potential of this project is about 4000 hectares. The project was completed in 1976.
2. PARAGAON-CHATSHIL PROJECT :- Located in the drought affected area of Pathardi taluka, this project is expected to irrigate

about 1600 hectares of land.

3. TAKALIEHAN PROJECT : This project located in Shrirampur tahsil will provide irrigation facility to about 1100 hectare area in Shrirampur tahsil.

4. SINA PROJECT : This project is located at Nimgaon Gangudda in Karjat tahsil and will irrigate about 6200 hectares of land in the drought prone area of Karjat tahsil..

These four projects together will thus create additional irrigation potential to the tune of about 13000 hectares.

During 1976-77, the expenditure of these projects was of the order of Rs.65.35 lakhs as against the total budget provision of Rs.91.40 lakhs. The schemes of flood control works for which provision of Rs. 0.40 lakh was made was not implemented.

POWER :

The importance of electricity in the metamorphosis of a backward economy need not be overemphasised.

During 1976-77, 17 villages were electrified under the rural electrification programme bringing the total number of villages electrified upto 31-3-1977 to 997, which was 76 % of the total number of villages in the district. On this programme Rs. 32.12 lakhs were spent. Under normal development 969 agricultural pumps were energised. The expenditure on this scheme was Rs. 15.38 lakhs.

INDUSTRY & MINING :

Ahmadnagar District is an industrially undeveloped district. However, due to the existence of Sugar factories the industrial index is high.

During 1976-77, an amount of Rs.38.07 lakhs (118 % of the budget provision of Rs.32.26 lakhs) was spent on industrial development in the district.

During the year S.I.C.O.M. which attracts industrial investment by offering a package of financial incentives & other services assisted 6 units to the tune of Rs. 24.00 lakhs. Under the small scale industries sector, 69 units were given subsidy under the scheme of state Aid to Industries Rules. The Scheme of seed Money to Educated unemployed was implemented in the district with an expenditure of benefitted under this scheme as against a target of 1053 persons. Rs.6.11 lakhs. 543 persons. There are 3 industrial estates in the district one each at Ahmadnagar, Shrirampur and Kopergaon. In order to complete these estates as per their revised schemes, Rs.2.98 lakhs were spent. The following were the other physical achievements under the industries sector.

Under the C.S.P. one scheme viz. Loans to small scale and cottage Industries under Rural Industries Project was implemented at a cost of Rs. 1.30 lakhs benefitting 42 persons.

There are no mineral resources in the district. Hence no scheme were taken up in this field.

TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATIONS :

The development of transport & communication facilities in the district from the District Plan funds is confined to only district roads. State Highways & National Highways come under the Plan purview of the State Govt.

During Scarcity years, most of the villages in this district have been connected by some kind of roads. The main effort during

the Fifth plan was therefore to save this investment by taking up metallizing programme & by providing at least a murum covering to the roads. The budget provision for this major head of development Rs. 39.81 lakhs, while actual expenditure reached the level of Rs. 42.05 lakhs (108 %).

During the year 31.50 km. new road length was constructed & 31.70 km. road length was modernised. The number of cross drainage works constructed was 51.

SOCIAL SERVICES :

This major head of development covers important aspects of development, such as education, health, welfare of Backward Classes, etc. As such 18 % of the total expenditure in 1975-76 & 12 % in 1976-77 was incurred on this head of development. On the entire Social Services programme, Rs. 142.41 lakhs were spent in 1976-77 as against the budget provision of Rs. 166.42 lakhs. The expenditure fell short by 15 %.

The details of the expenditure are given below.

GENERAL EDUCATION :

Financial achievements under this sub-head of development was satisfactory. "105" the budget provision was utilised during 1976-77 as against 95% in 1975-76.

Education is rightly called "Investment in Man". The percentage of literacy (1971 Census) in Ahmadnagar District was 36.23 as against 39.18 for the State. With a view to strengthening and expanding the educational infrastructure, schemes like Educational concessions to Economically Backward Classes, in-service training to primary teachers, development of non-Govt. Secondary Schools were undertaken & implemented.

During 1975-76, the majority of the schemes were implemented by the Directorate of Education, Pune. During 1976-77, however some schemes such as attaching standards V-VII to the Secondary Schools, development & expansion of non-Govt. Secondary Schools were transferred to the Education Office, Zilla Parishad. During the year new schemes like UNICEF aided Programme & Book Banks were taken up & implemented at a cost of Rs. 0.86 lakh & Rs. 2.29 lakh respectively.

PUBLIC HEALTH :

The achievement under this head of development was below the mark in both the years 1975-76 and 1976-77. During the latter year 53 % of the budget provision was not utilised. The expenditure was less in respect of almost all the schemes such as in centre of communicable diseases, expansion of facilities in general hospital, Blood-bank, Construction of Primary Health Centre, Sub-Centre & Rural Hospital. In respect of the first 2 schemes, because of non-receipt of Government sanction for appointment of personnel, the expenditure was less. The entire budget grant (Rs.0.04 lakh) for Blood-bank was surrendered. The amount earmarked for construction work could not be fully utilised as the plan estimates did not receive approval in time. Further, under the scheme of supply of medicines, as against the budget provision, of Rs.0.60 lakh, the expenditure booked was only Rs.0.13 lakh because the bills from the concerned agencies were not received by 31-3-1977.

Under this sub-head of development the National Skill Development Programme & Family Welfare Programme were implemented under the Centrally Sponsored Programme. The total expenditure was Rs. 58.42 lakhs.

3. APPLIED NUTRITION :

The expenditure was 108 % of the budget provision. Under the scheme of Special Nutrition Programme in Tribal Area, the number of beneficiaries was 4800 & the target fulfilled.

4. WATER SUPPLY & DRAINAGE :

Rural drinking water supply programme by its inclusion in the 15 point programme of Government has been given a high priority in the development programme of the State. It has been decided by the State Government that all the villages should be provided with drinking water supply through simple or special measures by the end of the V Plan. During 1976-77, 78 % of the budget provision of Rs.57.00 lakhs was utilised. No amount was spent on the scheme of repairs to hand-pumps & the budget provision of Rs.2.00 lakh was surrendered as the scheme did not get approval. Under the scheme of Government water supply out of the budget provision of Rs.1.50 lakh, Rs. 0.13 lakh remained unutilised because the works could not

be completed by March, 1977 due to late acceptance of tender for the tank work at Vitad. Under the scheme of municipal water supply, 6 works were taken up at Kopargaon, Shrirampur, Sanganner, Ahmadnagar and Rahuri. Out of these works, the work at Ahmadnagar was completed during 1976-77, while the remaining works were in progress

The budget provision for this scheme was Rs. 15.00 lakh. However, 8.18 were expended. For the scheme of piped water supply the actual amount sanctioned was Rs. 9.00 lakh, out of which Rs. 36.00 lakhs were sanctioned and 30 schemes were taken up. Out of them 15 schemes were completed and the remaining schemes were in progress. The expenditure was Rs. 32.548 lakhs which was less than the budget provision by Rs. 3.52 lakhs, because 10 schemes received late sanction. Under the scheme of simple Measures, 10 wells were constructed as against the target of 19. Under the scheme of Boring Operation of Ground Water Survey & Development Agency, 24 bore wells as against the target of 20 were constructed. The number of hand pumps installed was 17.

5. URBAN DEVELOPMENT :

Under the scheme of Financial Assistance to Municipal Councils for implementation of their Development Schemes, Ahmadnagar, Shrirampur, & Rahuri Municipal Councils were assisted to the tune of Rs. 5.00 lakhs. All the budget provision was utilised.

6. HOUSING :

The schemes under this sub-head are meant to assist the weaker sections of the society.

Under the scheme of Provision of Basic amenities to Zopadpatties Rs. 0.39 lakhs, out of Rs. 2.00 lakhs were spent & water supply to 9 units was provided. Under the scheme of provision of house-sites to landless workers in Rural areas & construction of huts, 1079 huts were constructed as against the target of 3074.

Budget provision was utilised fully ~~45 houses were covered~~ & the target fulfilled under the scheme of Tiling of roofs of huts. All the grants (Rs. 0.18 lakh) under the scheme of extension of Village Gaothan area & provision of house sites were, however, surrendered.

7. WELFARE OF BACK-WARD CLASSES :

The population of S.C. & S.T. in this district is 2.11 lakhs (9 % of total population) & 1.46 lakhs (6 % of total population) respectively. Since these are the most vulherable sections of the society, it was necessary to earmark financial provision for the exclusive benefit of these classes. Twenty schemes were included in the Anual Plan of 1976-77 for the uplift of these classes, with a budget provision of Rs.24.58 lakhs. The schemes selected and implemented covered important aspects relating to education, agriculture, housing etc. Award of scholarships to B.C. Students, award of post S.S.C. scholarships to V.Ts. & N.Ts., outside S.A./L.I.G. subsidy and loan to B.C. agriculturists for development of land, purchase of fertilisers & implements, financial assistance to individual & group housing of B.C.s., improvement of Harijan Bastis, award of stipend to B.C. students in Industrial Training Institute were some of the important schemes implemented during 1976-77.

The expenditure on this sub-head of development was 54 % of the budget provision. The following were some of the reasons for non-utilisation of allotted funds.

a) Award of Post S.S.C. Scholarships to V.Js. & N.Ts. outside S.A./L.I.G.

Rs.2.00 lakhs had to be surrendered as sufficient applications from deserving students were not received. Hence as against the target of 250 students, only 144 students received the benefits.

Grant-in-aid to aided Backward Class hostels:-

16 hostels were found to have been closed down & hence expenditure was less.

c) Grant of loan-cum-subsidy to Backward Classes for cottage industries & professions :

Applications in sufficient number were not received. Hence the number of beneficiaries was only 7 & Rs. 0.43 lakh remained unutilised.

Five Schemes, such as Expansion of work under prevention of Begging Act, Rehabilitation of physically handicapped were implemented at a cost of Rs. 1.31 lakhs.

9. LABOUR & LABOUR WELFARE :

96 % of the budget provision was utilised on 2 schemes implemented during the year.

MISCELLANEOUS :

EMPLOYMENT GUARANTEE SCHEME :

This scheme not only provides employment in manual labour to the unemployed but at the same time creates assets in various sectors. It is the prestigious scheme of the State.

During the year 1976-77 a colossal sum of Rs. 4.37 crores was spent on this scheme & the same was higher by Rs. 1.27 crores as compared to the previous year.

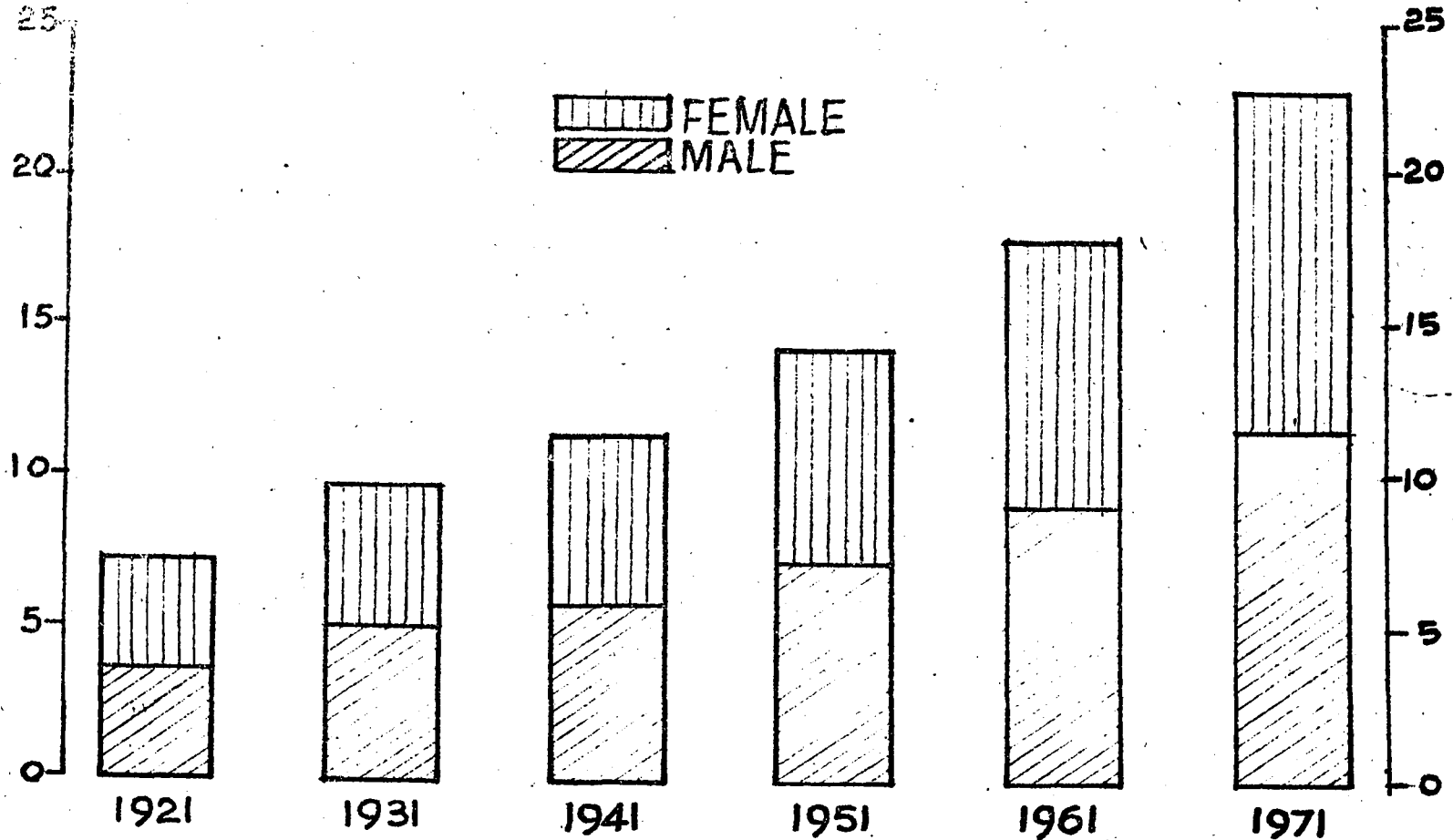

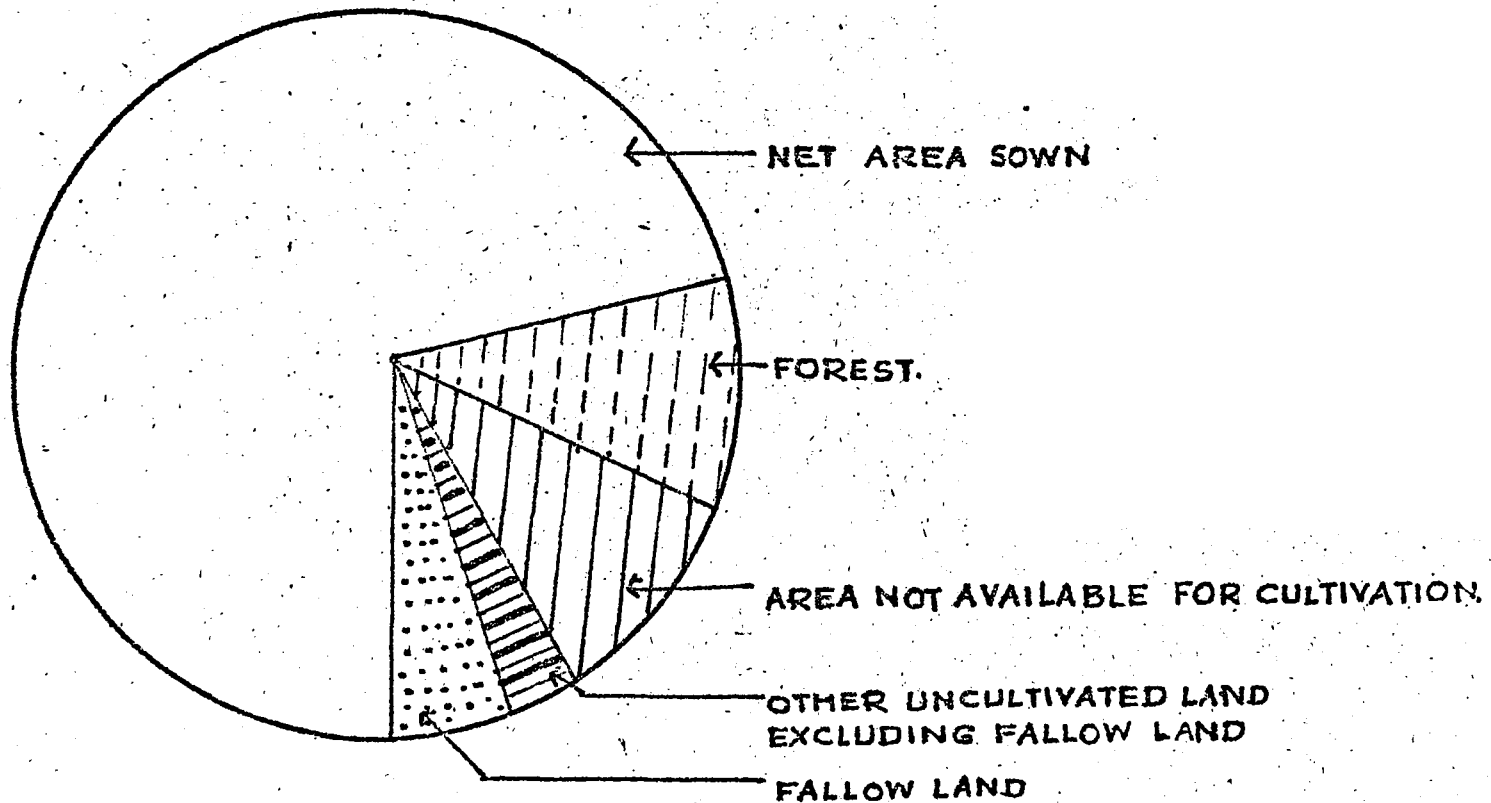
POPULATION DURING LAST FIVE DECADES IN AHMEDNAGAR DISTRICT (IN LAKHS)
