## C H A P T E R - I

### 1. INTRODUCTION AND LOCATION.

The age-long famous temple at Tuljapur town of this district enshrines the goddess 'Bhawani' the popular deity of Maharashtra. The cult of goddess is very ancient one and finds mention even in 'Vedas' where she is called 'Aditi'. The earliest inscrip-tional evidence regarding its antiquity can not go beyond 1893 A.D. The goddess was the principal deity of 'Chatrapati Shivaji', the other Chatrapatis and Peshwas who donated quite generously to the temple. The village 'Thair' in the district is also an ancient place and was known as "Tagra". It also finds mention by Ptolemy in his work "Geoplus of Arghreen sea" (1st century A.D.). There are an ancient Buddhist caitya has been converted in later period into a Brahmanical shrine by installing the image of "God Vishnu" and is at present known as "Trivikrama" temple. Thair is also the native of poor saint "Gora Kumbhar". The Rashtrakutas who succeeded 'Chalukyas' of Badami in 753 A.D. had their epithet, "LATTA-LURA PURA VARDHISA" which implies that they were the inhabitants of Latur.

### 2. BOUNDARIES.

The extreme south of Maharashtra Osmanabad district lies between 17° .35' and 18° .40' north latitude and 75° .16' & 76° .40' east longitude. Osmanabad district is bounded by Solapur district on the southwest, on the northwest by Ahmednagar, on the north by Beed and Parbhani district on the northeast by Nanded district and on the southeast and south by Bidar and Gulbarga districts of Karnataka state.

Solapur city is the nearest town and it has therefore close commercial and social ties with it. Barshi taluka in Solapur district is almost surrounded by Osmanabad district. Wanded and Deed towns are about 218 Kms and 128 Kms. respectively, away from Osmanabad town and are directly connected by the State Transport bus Services.

The Solapur Aurangabad road passes through the Dist. The Latur Miraj Railway line (Narrow gauge) and Parli-Hyderabad Railway line (Broad Gauge) now included in south-central Railway zone also pass through this district. Latur is the biggest Railway station in this district.

### 3. AREA.

The area of Osmanabad district is 14,117.0 sq. ms. according to figures furnished by the Surveyor General of India as per 1971 Census which is 21.88% of the area of Marathwada and 4.59% of the area of Maharashtra state. The rural area of this Dist is 13,725.859 Sq.Kms. ~~and~~ and the urban area is about 391.2 Sq.Kms. The area reported by the Director of Land Records, Maharashtra State for Osmanabad district is 14,256 Sq.Kms. In Marathwada Region, this district is next to Aurangabad.

In terms of area Osmanabad district ranks seventh among 26 districts of Maharashtra state. The average area of district in Marathwada region works out to 12,905 Sq. Kms. and the average area per district in Maharashtra state is 11,337 Sq.Kms.

### 4. TOPOGRAPHY.

A major portion of this district is laterite plateau with an average height of 2,000 feet above the sea level. This district is covered with small hills and off shoots of the Balaghat. Parts of Bhim, Aysa, Kallam, Osmanabad, Tuljapur talukas situated on Balaghat ranges and the rest on table lands.

The district lies partly in the Upper Godawari basin and partly in the Bhima-basin. Ahmedpur, Udgir, Kallam, Ausa Latur and Nilanga talukas are situated on the plateau of the Balaghat and lie on the valley of the river Manjra, which is an important tributary of the Godawari. Osmanabad and Umerga talukas are drained by the Terna and important feeder of the Manjra. Paranda and parts of Bhum, Tuljapur and Umerga talukas are in the basin of the Sina river which is a tributary of the Bhima.

Of all the towns in the district, Bhum commands the highest elevation of 2,500 feet from the sea level whereas Paranda has the lowest height of 1,735 feet from the sea level. The average height of the plateau is 2,000 feet above the sea level. The low land portion to the south of the plateau lies in the Bhima basin.

#### 5. HILLS RIVER SYSTEM AND SOILS.

The main system of hills is the Balaghat & its offshoots from the north-west corner from Ahmednagar & stretches to the south-east. It divides the district into two portions, plateau to the north-east and low lands to the west, south-west and south. The general slope of the plateau is from south-west to north-east.

There are two broad natural zones in the district viz.

1. Balaghat plateau drained by the Manjra and the Terna river and their tributaries and
2. the southern low lands plain which is in the Bhima basin. The river Manjra flows on northern border and demarcates this district from Bead district. In addition to hill ranges the district bounds in net work of rivulets running from all sides.

The Manjra which rises in Patoda taluka of Beed district runs towards the east along the northern boundary as far as the north eastern corner of Latur taluka where it takes southerly direction before entering Bidar district of Karnataka state. Its length in the district is about 104 Kms.

The Terna flows from west to east in Osmanabad, Ausa, Umerga and Nilanga talukas and meets the Manjra river near eastern boundary of the district. The Manyad is also a tributary of the Manjra. It flows towards the north-east through Ahmedpur taluka and enters Nanded district & to meet the Manjra on the eastern boundary of the district. The Tawarja which drains in Latur taluka joins the Manjra at Siwani village, on the western border of Paranda taluka. The sine flows from the north to the south. The Bori flows through Tuljapur taluka and joins the Sina river lower down in Solapur district. Even though there are number of small rivers and rivulets streaming in the district like the Bori in Tuljapur taluka or the Manyad in Ahmedpur taluka or the Bennitura in Umerga taluka or the Banganga in Bhum taluka, they remain practically dry for most part of the year as the water from them is drained out of this district from the high plateau resulting into considerable shortage of water in the district.

The soil can be divided into three zones 1. The eastern part consisting of Ahmedpur, Udgir and parts of Latur and Ausa talukas. 2. Osmanabad, Kallam talukas and parts of Latur, Ausa and Umerga talukas 3. Tuljapur, Paranda and Bhum talukas.

The first zone consists in general of light & light medium soils, they are of inferior type, not retentive of moisture and is therefore, suitable only for the cultivation of Kharif crops. The soils in some parts of Nilanga are of laterite type.

The second zone consists of changing types of soils. Heavy deep black cotton soils as against shallow light soils are found in this zone. Due to this peculiarity of soil both Kharif and rabi crops are grown in this area. Broadly it can be said that the eastern part of ~~Osmanabad~~, Latur, ~~Osmanabad~~ and ~~Kallam~~ talukas grow more kharif crops than rabi crops, while the western parts of those talukas grow rabi crops predominantly.

The third zone consists of heavy soils which is more retentive of moisture. Hence rabi crops are the major crops of this area. The mountainous ranges in this zone have formed typical steps suitable for paddy cultivation. This is a peculiarity of this zone. Even though the types of soil are classified above on a broad basis varieties in soils, however are found within the talukas and more within the zones categorised above.

The forests allotted all over the district are somewhat dense in Tuljapur, Kallam and Udgir talukas. They occupy too little portion of the total area in this district and have definitely resulted in soil erosion to a large extent.

#### 6. CLIMATE TEMPERATURE AND RAINFALL

CLIMATE: As the district forms part of the Deccan plateau, its climate is dry and is subject to extremes. The year can be divided into rainy season from middle of June to the end of September, a sultry period from about the end of September to the middle of November, winter from the middle of November to the end of January, dry period during February and March & summer during April, May and middle of June.

Summer is in general full of gales and gusty winds. Even though the variations in temperature are large in general and the weather is subject to extremes of heat and cold, the summer season in the district more cooler than in any other districts of Marathwada region, being at a higher altitude. In general the climate of Osmanabad district is considered to be bracing and salubrious.

TEMPERATURE :

Previously there was no provision of recording temperature at Osmanabad station. From January, 1977 a instrument has been installed at Osmanabad station for recording the temperature. Monthly temperature records are available only for Osmanabad station. In the year 1979 the mercury touched the highest point i.e. 38.7 centigrade in the month of April and the lowest temperature recorded was in the month of December i.e. 14.7 centigrade.

RAINFALL: Osmanabad district gets rains from the south east monsoon like other districts of Deccan plateau and the rain starts in the middle of June, becomes intense in July and ceases by the end of September. The normal rainfall of Osmanabad district is about (787 Mms.) Tuljapur and Osmanabad talukas on the west usually get 1,016 Mms. to 1,346 Mms. of rainfall while Paranda and Bhim talukas get near about 762 Mms. to 888 Mms. of rainfall. This part comes in the shadow of western ghat and is therefore, called "Rain shadow area". Because of the low rainfall in Paranda and Bhim talukas there is always a fear of scarcity and shortage of water.

These talukas as compared to the other talukas in Osmanabad district are backward. The northern part of Ahmedpur taluka is also some times affected by scarcity of water. In general Osmanabad district is not considered as scarcity area.

Recently Government of Maharashtra had appointed committee under the chairmanship of Shri Sukhthankar, the Secretary, Govt. of Maharashtra, Agriculture and Co-operation Department to look into the problem of scarcity and to identify areas which are more prone to scarcity.

Accordingly after deapth study of the problems the committee has identified the following areas as drought prone 1. Paranda 2. Bhum 3. Part of Kaller, Osmanabad, Fuljapur and Ahmedpur talukas. This area is now being covered under drought prone area's programme.

#### 7. RECENT DEVELOPMENT.

As per recent Govt. orders the Collector has been named as member Secretary of the District Planning & Development Council in place of the Chief Executive Officer, Zilla Parishad. Now he is responsible for preparation of developmental plans in the district. He is assisted by the District Planning Officer in work of district planning.

With a view to utilise the surplus milk available in the area it is decided to set up a milk powder plant at Udgir.

For Osmanabad district, the State Bank of India is a Lead Bank is expected to estimate credit demand from the existing pattern of economic activities and also those emerging while growth oriented programmes are being implemented and to evolve schemes for meeting this demand in co-operation with other bank and financial institutions. For estimating the credit needs of this area, deep studies of the area are being undertaken by the State Bank. On the basis of deep studies credit plan suitable to the Economic conditions and infrastructure facilities available in the district has been formulated by the Bank.

Osmanabad district has been selected for implementation intensive electrification scheme under rural electrification programme. Accordingly the scheme of intensive electrification is being implemented in the district.

Under the Integrated Rural Development Programme seven talukas viz. Osmanabad, Kallam, Udgir, Tuljapur, Ahmedpur, Paranda and Umerga has been selected. Osmanabad, Kallam, Udgir, Tuljapur and Umerga talukas are covered under central finance whereas Ahmedpur and Paranda talukas are taken up under state finance.

C H A P T E R - II.

=Explanatory notes on scope and limitations on Statistics presented in District Statistical Abstract.

PURPOSE: This is the 17th issue of the District Statistical Abstract since its 1st publication in the year 1958-59, in this publication every attempt is made to include statistics about important socio economic indicators of the district. The talukawise data is furnished wherever possible so as to enable the reader to have a clear picture of the achievements in various fields in different talukas of the district. The data presented in most of the tables pertains to the year 1979-80. In case of few tables where the data for the year of publication is not available the data for the latest available year is furnished.

The Statistical material presented in the publication is collected from various departments of the both state & central government offices, local bodies and other agencies. The source from which the data is collected is given in the foot note of the each table.

DISTRICT AT A GLANCE:

In this statement basic statistics which brings forth the salient feature of the district e.g. Population Agriculture, Co-operation, Medical and Public Health, Education etc. in comparison with Maharashtra State level figures is presented. The reference period for the figures pertaining to this district and Maharashtra state are mentioned against each of the items. The scope and limitations of the information presented in this abstract is also discussed in the following paras.

AREA & POPULATION:

In all 7 tables i.e. table No. 1 to 7 are included in this section. Data for 1971 population census has been included in all the tables except table No.6. The table No.1 indicates area, houses and population according to 1971 census. The term rural and urban area used in these tables are defined as under:-

For any place to be recognised as an urban area (town) for 1971 census, it was to have a municipal corporation or an area under a municipal council or a cantonment or a civil line. If it did not have any of these urban local bodies to administer its affairs, the following empirical tests were applied, (a) a minimum population of 5,000 (estimates for 1971), (b) a density of not less than 400 per Sq.Km. (1,000 per sq.mile), (c) 75 percent of the male working population pursuing occupations falling outside agriculture, (d) the place should have according to the Director of Census operations of the State, a few pronounced urban characteristics and amenities.

The term village (rural area) used in the tables denotes a statutorily recognised village having a well defined boundary and separate land records. Hamlets, wadis or padas have, therefore, not been shown as separate villages. On the other hand, statutorily recognised village having no population have been shown separately as "Un-inhabited" villages. Villages also include forest villages comprising mostly forest labourers and their families.

Table No.2 indicates decadal variation in population since 1951 to 1971. Table No.3 gives classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges. Total population of the villages in each range is also indicated in the table. The table No.4 gives population of urban areas accordingly to 1971 Census.

The table No.5 gives number of workers and non-workers in the District according to 1971 census, and they are classified according to standard of live-lihood classes.

The population according to livelihood classes is also shown separately for rural and urban areas and also for the District as a whole. The concept of dependency has been abandoned for economic classification at the 1971 census. Instead, the population is classified into workers and non-workers. The emphasis is now on work and not on income or economic dependence. A person is defined as worker if (a) in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying household industry etc. he has some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season and (b) in the case of regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the seven days preceding the day of the enumerator's visit to the household.

Persons like beggars, pensioners, agricultural or non-agricultural royalty, rent or dividend receivers, etc. who earn an income but who are not participating in any productive work in any occupation a person who had been offered work but who had not actually joined have been classified as non-workers.

The table No.6 gives/distribution of population according to (a) group and (b) religion separately for Rural and urban areas and also for the district as a whole as per 1971 census.

The table No.7 gives population of Scheduled castes, Scheduled tribes, and neo-budhist separately for rural and Urban areas and also for the district as a whole.

## 2. Rainfall and Climate:

The table No. 8 gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the year 1979. A day is treated as a "Rainy day", if during the 24 hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.55 m.m. of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table. Normal rainfall is the average rainfall over a period ranging from a minimum of five years to a maximum of ten years.

The table No. 9 gives monthwise "Maximum", "Minimum" and also annual temperature recorded at selected centres for the year 1979. The data are supplied by the Meteorological centre, of Govt. of India. The mean maximum and minimum temperature denotes the average of the maximum and minimum temperature recorded daily during the month. The mean (average) temperature is the simple average of the mean maximum and minimum temperature.

## 3. Agriculture:

In all 14 tables i.e. table No. 10 to 23 are included in this section.

The table No. 10 indicates talukawise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of land uses for the years 1976-77, 1977-78 and 1978-79 against each taluka. The breakup for the Geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the Geographical area are forest, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and uncultivable land cultivable waste permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous tree crops not included in area shown, current fallows other fallows and lastly net area sown.

Under "Forest" area included are actual forest areas or lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural uses, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be. "Land put to non-agricultural uses" stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agricultural uses. "Barren and unculturable Land" covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains deserts etc. Land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at high cost is classed as "Barren and unculturable land" whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. ~~"Culturable"~~ "Cultivable Waste" includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such land may be either fallow or covered with shams and jungles which are not put to any use. They may be assessed or not assessed and may be in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. "Permanent pastures and other grazing lands" cover all grazing lands whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Village Common and grazing lands within forest area are included under this head. "Land under Miscellaneous tree crops etc not included in the net area sown", includes all cultivable land which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural uses.

Land under casurina tree, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other for fuel etc. which are not included under "Onchards" are classed under this category. "Current fallows" comprise of cropped area, which are kept fallow during the current year. "Other fallow 1-and" includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The "net area sown" consists of net area sown with crop and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The "Gross cropped area", represents the sum total or area under all crops. The difference between the total or gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same or different crops.

The table No.16 is introduced from the year 1975-76 gives the information of activities of the Ground Water Survey & Development Agency in the district such as No. of bore holes drilled No. of bore holes successful etc. during the year 1979-80.

The table No.17 gives the information of minor irrigation works excluding wells in the district. All sectors such as Zilla Parishad, state and Private sector (co-operative) have been covered in this table.

The table No.18 gives the information on Major and Medium both complete and incomplete irrigation projects in the district. The cost of Medium Irrigation Projects ranges between Rs. 20 Lakhs to Rs. 5 Crores whereas that of Major Irrigation Project, it is Rs. 5 Crores & above.

Table No.19 deals with monthly agricultural wage rates during 1979. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from three selected Rural Centres.

The table No.20 is also new table, included from the 1975-76 and gives the findings of Agricultural Census.

The table No.21 gives data on Agricultural implements.

The table No.22 and 23 deals with famine, Scarcity, Akin to scarcity in the district.

#### 4. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY & FOREST.

In all 6 tables i.e. table No.24 to 29 are included in this section.

##### A- Animal Husbandry.

The table No.24 gives talukawise number of various types of livestock and poultry ~~and~~ enumerated in District in the Livestock Census. The census is conducted throughout the country on an uniform basis, of concepts and methods of enumeration once in 5 years. During the livestock census operations the livestock and poultry were enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care was taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit.

##### B-Forest.

The Table No.28(A) gives details of area under different types of forests during the year 1979-80. Data regarding forests under the control of the state Government's Forest Department and those under the control of the State Government's Revenue Department are shown separately. The area under forest are classified according to legal status into reserved forests, protected forests and unclassed forests.

The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forest Act XVI of 1972. Reserved Forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production where in the rights of grazing and cultivations ~~is~~ allowed. In protected Forests the restrictions are not so tight. Right of grazing or cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The un classed forest refers to the inaccessible forest of unoccupied ~~xxx~~ waste.

The forests which are ~~xxx~~ taken over by Government from local bodies or private individuals for management on lease basis are called "Leased forests". There is no classification of exproprietary forests as such. The forest area shown in table No. 28(A) may not tally with the area shown in the table No. 10. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons. (i) In the Indian Forest Statistics returns, the whole area including non wooden area under the control of forest Department is taken as area under the Forests, while in Agricultural Statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation. (ii) The Forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the Forest areas and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view Forest Department, as it is in the Land Utilisation Statistics under Agricultural statistics (iii) The Forest Department returns relate to financial year while the Agricultural Statistics relate to the Agricultural year.

Table No. 29(A) is new table regarding fisheries included from the year 1975-76.

#### 5. EMPLOYMENT INDUSTRY & ELECTRICITY:

The factory statistics shown in table No. 30, 31 & 32 cover following types of factories registered under the Factories Act, 1948. (1) Those employing 10 or more workers and working with the aid of power (Section 2 m(i)). (2) Those employing 20 or more workers and working without aid power. (Section 2.m.(ii)).

(3) Those registered under section 85 of the Act, under which the State Government ~~has~~ <sup>makes</sup> applicable the provisions of Act even though the above conditions are not fulfilled. However, statistics of the Defence Factories are excluded.

The table No.35 gives occupational distribution of total registrations and placements in the employment exchange for the year 1979-80, according to the standard national classification. The table No.36 indicates the progress of Employment Guarantee Scheme in the District. The table No.38 gives the consumption of electricity, table No.39 indicates the towns and villages electrified as on 31.3.1980, in the District.

#### 6. CO OPERATION.

In all 8 tables i.e. table No.40 to 47 are included in this section.

Loans outstanding, referred in the Table, include outstanding in respect of loans, each credits and overdrafts and the amounts of outstanding bills purchased or discontinued. Over dues referred to amount of loan or instalments which were due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by a competent authority.

In table No.47 number of Registered Money lenders and loans advanced by them, the separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders have been furnished. The transaction of Money Lending in the State are regulated under the provision of Bombay money lenders Act. The information for loans advanced to traders and Non-traders relates <sup>to</sup> these money lenders who have submitted the returns.

VII. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH:

In this section five tables are included. The table No. 48 deals with the medical facilities available through public aided bodies in each taluka. The tables numbering 49 and 50 present the information about vital statistics. While the table No. 51 deals with the vaccination statistics and Cholera inoculation, the table No. 52 presents the number of family planning centres functioning in each taluka and the number of sterilisation operations done and the number of intrauterine contraceptive device insertions performed.

VIII. EDUCATION:

In this section seven tables are included. The table No. 53 indicates literacy in each taluka of Osmanabad district according to 1971 census. The percentage of literacy has been shown separately sexwise as well as for rural & urban areas. The tables numbering 54 and 55 deal with education in rural & urban areas in the district as per 1961 census. The number of institutions according to types, enrollment and the teachers employed in them is presented in the table No. 56. The table No. 57 deals with the beneficiaries of backward class students of different categories in Osmanabad district. The table No. 58 indicates the number of students getting benefits of concessions under the scheme of concession of free education to economically backward class students. The table No. 59 indicates the expenditure incurred on primary education by way of grants.

IX. TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATIONS.

In this section the statistics relating to various modes of transport is given. The table No. 60 presents the total length of railway route in the district according to different types of rail gauges.

The surfacewise and categorywise road length is given in table No.61.This table also includes roads constructed by different agencies such as Municipal Councils,Zilla Parishad and the public works and Housing Department.The table No.62 gives statistics regarding the number of motor vehicles in operation in Aurangabad re-gion.The table No.63 gives operational statistics of the nationalised road transport according to S.T.divisions viz.Osmanabad.The table No.64 gives the data of traffic census on important roads in Osmanabad district in 1977.The table No.65 presents postal, telegraphs and telephone statistics for 1961-62,1965-66, 1970-71,1974-75 to 1979-80,tha table No.66 gives the statistics regarding rural broadcasting in Osmanabad district.

#### X.LOCAL BODIES.

The Statistics relating to local bodies such as village panchayat municipalities and Zilla Parishad is presented in this section,while the Table No.67 deals with income and expenditure of local bodies viz. village panchayats,municipalities and Zilla Parishad,Table No.68 deals with the income/expenditure of Municipalities in the district.

#### XI. PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT.

In this section as many as five tables are included. The tables numbering 71 and 72 give plan expenditure under different heads of developments and important physical achievements during 1978-79 and 1979-80.The table No.73 gives particulars of Community Development programme implemented in the district.In table No.74 expenditure incurred in different development blocks is shown and physical achievements of some selected items have been detailed out in the table No.75.



XII. PRICES.

The Table No.76 deals with the monthly wholesale prices of certain agricultural commodities at re-gulated markets. The Table No.77 deals with the monthly average retail prices of important commodities collected from the district headquarters for the years 1979. In the table No.78 price index for the working classes is shown for Aurangabad and Nanded centres. The consumer price index number for the working classes is based on the price level of 1961.

XIII. MISCELLANEOUS.

There are in all 15 tables in this section. The section deals with the statistics pertaining to police department, Judicial court and Revenue department and also on items like cinema, banking offices, joint stock companies, Insurance, small savings and revenue printing presses etc. The table No. 79 gives statistical data about strength of police force while table No.80 gives crime statistics of this district for the calendar year 1979. The table No.81 deals with the work disposed of in civil and criminal courts. The table No.82 deals with cinema statistics while the tables numbering 83, 84 and 85 gives the data regarding banking offices, scheduled banks and joint stock companies respectively. The table No.86 gives the number of insurance policies issued and amount insured while the table No.87 deals with the collection of small savings. The table No. 88 present the land revenue collection. The data regarding number of printing presses, newspapers and periodicals published is given in table No.89 while the table No.90 deals with the year<sup>wise</sup> quantity of Rice, Wheat and Sugar issued to fair price shops in Osmanabad district from 1971 to 1980, the table No.91 presents the yearwise demand and procurement of levy in Osmanabad district. The table No.92 deals with the General Elections held in 1980 for Parliamentary and 1978 Assembly Elections.

This indicator highlights the extent of double cropping in the district. The table placed below gives the net cropped area, gross cropped area and the percentage of the later to the former.

It is seen from the figures given for different years that the percentage of gross cropped area to the net area sown which indicates the extent of double cropping has shown a slight increase upto 1977-78 as compared to the year 1960-61. But during the year 1978-79 the percentage of gross cropped area to the net area sown decreased slightly as compared to the year 1977-78. Inadequate irrigational facilities had been the root cause of such low proportion of double cropping. During 1977-78 La-tur and Nilanga accounted for highest area under double cropping whereas Paranda and Bhum talukas accounted for lowest area under double cropping in the District.

From the above table it is observed that food crop still share the major area of gross cropped area from 1960-61 to 1978-79. In 1960-61 the area under food crops was 73.59; in 1970-71 it was 73.12 in 1977-78 and 1978-79 it increased to 78.29 & 81.91 respectively. Among the food crops Jowar crop is the main crop which accounts about 40% area of the total gross cropped area during 1960-61, 35% during 1970-71, 39% in 1977-78 and about 44% in 1978-79. Among non-food crops groundnut is the major crop but it is observed that the area under groundnut is decreasing since 1970-71.

3. Yield rates and out-turn of principal crops.

The yield rates and production of important crops for the years 1960-61, 1970-71, 1977-78 and 1978-79 are given in following table.

From the above table it is observed that the out-turn of Bajra, Tur and groundnut decreased during 1978-79 as compared to the year 1960-61, whereas the out-turn of rice, wheat, jowar, gram, sesamum, sugarcane and tobacco increased. The decrease in the production of Tur and groundnut could be attributed to the scarcity and untimely rains for the last 6 to 7 years.

4. Net irrigated area to net area sown.

From the above table it is observed that the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown showed increasing trend since 1970-71 to 1978-79 as compared to the year 1960-61. It showed a slight decrease during the year 1978-79 as compared to the year 1977-78. The increase in the irrigated area is due to the overall efforts under plan schemes to increase the irrigational potential in the district.

From the above table it is observed that major portion of irrigated area is covered under jowar crop i.e. more than 40% during 1960-61, 1970-71, 1977-78. The jowar crop is the major crop in the district and requires protective irrigation.

From the abovementioned table it is observed that the area irrigated has increased by about nearly 3 times in 1977-78 and nearly two times in 1978-79 over that of 1960-61. The main source of irrigation in the district is wells. (81.67%) during 1977-78 and 77.75% during 1978-79)

II- CO-OPERATION  
Primary Agricultural Credit Societies.

Primary agricultural credit societies are the backbone of the rural economy providing the most need agricultural credit to the farmers. Providing easy credit to the poor farmers in the rural areas was the main objective of extending the co-operative movement in the rural areas and establishing service societies in the villages. Table below indicates the facts about the credit societies and loan advanced by them over a period of time.

From the above table it is observed that the number of agricultural credit societies increased from 913 in 1960-61 to 961 in 1979-80. Membership in these primary societies also increased from 55,000 in 1960-61 to 2,25,000 in 1979-80. Working capital and loans advanced also showed remarkable increase during 1970-71, 1978-79 and 1979-80 as compared to the year 1960-61. Because of increase in the amount of overdues and loans outstanding the figures of loans advanced have decreased in the years 1978-79 and 1979-80 as compared to 1970-71.

### III. Agril. Wage Rates.

Agricultural labour is an important component of the rural society and their socio economic condition mainly depend on the wages. They receive during the agricultural seasons for undertaking various agricultural operations. The wages of skilled and un-skilled agricultural workers are collected from three rural centres of this district viz. Kingaon in Ahmedpur Taluka, Killari in Ausa Taluka and Murud in Latur taluka, respectively. The change in wage structure of the agriculture labour is discussed below for each - centres.

At Kingaon the wages of skilled labour for carpenter were Rs. 6.00 in 1977 and 1978 and upto Oct. 79 and have increased <sup>to</sup> Rs. 10/- in December, 1979 the annual average being Rs. 7.23 during the year 1979. The <sup>average</sup> wages rates of blacksmith, cobbler were Rs. 4.70 and Rs. 4.56 respectively in the year 1978. During the year 1979 the average wage rates of blacksmith comes to Rs. 7.23 and that of cobbler it moves to Rs. 5.40. The wage rates of unskilled field labour for males were Rs. 3.12 during 1978 and Rs. 4.08 during 1979. The rates of unskilled field labour for females were Rs. 2.05 during 1978 and Rs. 3.10 during 1979. The wage rates of herdsmen were Rs. 2.00 during the year 1978 and the same were increased to Rs. 2.08 during 1979.

At Killari centre the average wage rates for carpenters were Rs. 6.58 in the year 1978<sup>and</sup> has increased to Rs. 13.00 during 1979. The wage rates for blacksmith and cobbler were Rs. 5.58 & Rs. 4.00 respectively during the year 1978 and have increased to Rs. 10.30 and Rs. 6.50 respectively during the year 1979. The wage rates of unskilled field labour males were Rs. 4.00 during the year 1978 and were slightly increased to Rs. 4.08 during 1979. The wage rates of unskilled females were Rs. 2.00 during 1978 and increased to Rs. 2.40 in 1979. The wage rates of herdsmen were Rs. 3.00 during the year 1979.

At Murud centre the wage rates of carpenter were Rs. 6.13 during 1978 and the same were slightly decreased to Rs. 6.00 during 1979. The wage rates of blacksmiths were Rs. 6.27 during 1978 and the same were slightly decreased to Rs. 6.00 during 1979. The wage rates of cobbler were Rs. 5.00 in 1978 and have increased to Rs. 5.70 during 1979. The wage rates of unskilled field labour males were Rs. 3.69 during 1978 and increased to Rs. 4.52 during 1979. The wage rates of female field labour were Rs. 2.00 and Rs. 2.20 during 1978 and 1979 respectively. The wage rates of herdsmen were Rs. 2.00 and Rs. 2.30 during 1978 and 1979 respectively.

#### IV. LIVESTOCK

##### Bovine and ovine population per 100 hectares of cultivable land.

Livestock plays a very important role in Indian agriculture being a source of draught power, milk and manure basic requirements in the rural economy. Osmanabad district has already established its name in the field of livestock. There are three breeds of cattle viz. Deoni, Red Chandari & Killari in Osmanabad district, Deoni breed hails from Udgir and Ahmednagar.



talukas of this district, Khillari breeds is mainly found in Paranda, Umerga and Tuljapur talukas of the district and Red Khandari in border areas of the district and joining Nanded District. Among buffaloes Pandharpur and local breeds are found in the district. The table below gives livestock population (Bovine and ovine) cultivable land in hectares and livestock per hectare of cultivable area in Osmanabad district as per 1978 livestock Census.

It is observed from the aforementioned table that the livestock per hectare of cultivable area is more in Ahmedpur, Udgir and Bhum talukas. The ratio is less in Umerga, Paranda and Tuljapur talukas being 0.83, 0.84 and 0.88 respectively. The lowest ratio is in Paranda taluka 0.84 and the highest in Udgir taluka.

V.- ELECTRICITY:  
Consumption of Electricity.

Per capita consumption of electricity is a good indicator of economic development being carried out in the district. The consumption of electricity in the district is increasing at a faster rate since 1965-66. The table below indicates the villages and per capita consumption of electricity.

The per capita consumption which was at 0.65 K.W.H. in the year 1960-61 has increased to 37.38 K.W.H. in the year 1979-80. The increase in consumption of electricity mainly attributed to rural electrification programme in the district for energising irrigation pumps and demand of power by the increased number of industrial units.

Enrolment of candidates of the employment exchange showed an increasing trend. In the year 1960-61 the enrolment was 227 whereas in the year 1979-80 it increased to 13,384. The increasing trend in the increase in number of enrolment indicates the magnitude of the unemployment. This does not include the unemployed persons seeking manual work and those who have not registered their names with employment exchange. The number of candidates on the live Register as at the end of 1979-80 has increased considerably as compared to the year 1960-61. The ~~xxx xxxixx~~ percentage of placement to total registration has decreased from 21% in 1960-61 to 5% in 1979-80 and this is due to the establishment of State selection Board in November, 1976 i.e. in 1976-77. The other reason is that vacancies notified and placements have not increased in proportion to the enrolment

VII. MEDICAL FACILITIES.

Increase in the indoor and outdoor patients in hospitals, dispensaries and primary health centres.

There are three hospitals in the district of which one is located at Osmanabad and two at Latur. Of these two hospital at Latur one is equipped with pathological laboratory and radiology unit. ~~Rxxxxxx~~

Further there are 32 dispensaries of all kinds located at other urban and rural centres and as many as 15 primary health centres and 20 primary health units in rural areas of the District.

From the above table it is observed that the number of indoor patients treated showed increasing trend in 1971 & in 1978 whereas in the year 1979, the number of indoor patients treated decreased. The number of out-door patients treated showed increasing trend since 1971. The number of beds per lakhs of population during the year 1961 was 21 the same was increased to 43 in the year 1978 and decreased to 32 in the year 1979 as compared to the year 1978.

**VII. EDUCATION.**

**1. Increase in the number of students in different categories. (Boys and girls seperately).**

With provision of free education upto primary level and grant of concessions, scholarships etc. to eligible students in the secondary and higher education the number of students both boys and girls in all the educational institutes recorded remarkable increase in recent years. The number of teachers and institutions also recorded simultaneous increase obviously due to increase in number of students. This can be seen from the following table.

In the primary section the number of institutions, enrolment of boys and girls recorded remarkable increase. In the field of secondary and higher education the increase is indeed remarkable. The glaring fact noticed is that there had been tremendous increase in the number of girls as compared to boys in the primary and secondary section.

The increase in primary schools during the decade 1961-71 was only 416 whereas the enrolment of boys is nearly doubled and the increase in No. of girls is  $2\frac{1}{2}$  times. Similar trend is found in this decade for secondary and higher institutions.

From the above table it is observed that the ratios of secondary to primary institutions decreased in 1970-71 and 1979-80 as compared to the year 1960-61 and this is due to increase in secondary schools. The ratio of higher to secondary has also increased in 1970-71 as compared to the year 1960, 1961 because of increase in secondary institutions. However this ratio decreased due to increase in No. of higher institutions. The ratios of teachers to pupils showed increase for primary, secondary and higher institutions during 1979-80 as compared to the year 1960-61 but this ratio has decreased in respect of secondary and higher institutions as compared to 1970-71.

IX. BANKING.

Increase in banking facilities in proportion to population.

Banking facilities play significant role in developing economy. Since the nationalisation of the banks, the various banks have brought the field of agricultural and industrial development in their operational fold and are advancing loans to the agriculturists and units of small scale industries. The co-operative banks have succeeded to a greater extent to meet out the need of rural credit by establishing as many as 73 branches in the rural areas of the district. However the number of branches opened so far were found to be inadequate as compared to the credit needs.

It can be seen from the above table that the increase in the number of banks during the decade 1960-71, was 67, whereas it jumped from 84 in 1971 to 124 in 1978. Latur being the commercial and industrial town in the district claimed highest number of banking offices i.e. 19 and Osmanabad being the Dist headquarters has 15 banking offices during the year 1978-79.

Next in order was Umerga having 14 banking offices. In the year 1960-61 the number of households served/per bank was 16,311, which declined to 2,600 in 1978-79 as a result of increase in the number of bank branches.

X. ROADS: Road length according to category and surface.  
Roads play an important role in the developing economy.

The Latur-Miraj narrow and Vikarabad Parli Vaijinath broad guage railway routes go through Osmanabad district with the total length of their routes being 54 Kms. and 64 Kms. respectively. There is no increase in railway length since 1961. During the year 1960-61 the total road length was 703.21 Kms. excluding municipal roads and the same was increased to 5,139.00 Kms. in 1979-80. The total length per 100 Sq.Kms. of area increased from 5 Kms. in 1960-61 to 12 Kms. in 1970-71 and it further increased to 36 Kms. for 100 Sq.Kms. in 1979-80.

The table below gives the category and surfacewise road length per 100 Sq.Kms. during 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1979-80.

CHAPTER- IV.  
P L A N N I N G

The concept of planning is a heritage from the pre independence period. However the principle of achieving economic growth through the process of planning was adopted at the National level while launching the country's First Five Year Plan in 1951. Initially the planning process started from the National level and the state plans were formulated within the national policies and frame work of Development.

The emphasis of regional planning had however certain disadvantages and it was noticed that the disparities within the region in some cases tended to get accentuated. Plan expenditure was considered to be an end itself rather than means to increasing output for the state as a whole. The experience gained during the four plans implemented till 1970-71 it was felt that planning should be decentralised and it should be at multi-level. In furtherance of philosophy of multi-level planning the Maharashtra state took a bold step in adopting district as a unit of planning. The first conscious attempt to district planning made at the time of the formulation of the Fifth Five Year Plan for the state. The District Planning and Development Council established were requested to prepare an integrated plan for the district taking into account local conditions and resources available and in conformity with the broad policy laid down in the National and States approach to the Fifth plan. In the light of the above draft Fifth five year plan of each district was prepared by District Planning and Development Councils. However in concurrence of the National Fifth Five Year Plan not having been finalised the states Fifth Five Year Plan as well as District Plans remained exercise only.

4.2. As per recent Govt. orders the Collector has been named as Member Secretary of the District Planning and Development council in place of the Chief Executive Officer, Zilla Parishad. Now he is responsible for preparation of Annual plans in the district. He is assisted by the District Planning Officer in the work of District Planning. The District Planning Board and the Dist. Development Consultative council were amalgamated to form a single body viz. District Planning and Development council which meets every month to review and discuss the progress of various schemes taken up for the implementation in the district. The District Planning and Development Council consists of the following official and non-official members.

1. The designated Minister of the District. Chairman.
2. The Commissioner of the concerned Division. Vice Chairman.
3. All members of the Lok Sabha and Vidhan-sabha elected from the district. Members.
4. All members of the Rajya Sabha and Vidhan Sabha residing in the District. Members.
5. The Chief Executive Officer, Z.P. Member.
6. The president of Zilla Parishad Member.
7. President of Municipal Council Member
8. The Chairman Dist. Central Co-operative Bank. Member.
9. Director, M.S. Co-operative Development Bank. Member.
10. The Regional Manager, Lead Bank. Member.
11. A representative of Reg. Development corporation. Member.
12. Three non-official members of the former Dist. planning Board nominated by Government Member.
13. Four non-official members of the former Dist. Development Consultative council nominated by Government. Member.
14. The Collector of the District. Member Secretary.

4.3. During the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 i.e. Ist and IInd year of the Fifth Five Year Plan Annual Plans for the Dist. were formulated and implemented in the district as per the guidelines laid down by the Planning Department. Total expenditure incurred during 1974-75 and 1975-76 on the Dist. level schemes <sup>RS.</sup> 518.02 and Rs. 709.28, respectively. Since the third year of the Fifth Five Year Plan i.e. 1976-77 outlays for the district level schemes in the State Annual Plans were determined with reference to the outlays provided by District Planning and Development Council for each scheme. This draft Annual Plan was discussed at state level meetings between State Govt. and executive Committee of District Planning and Development Council at which Representatives of Administrative Departments were also present in such meetings. In the light of the above procedure the draft Annual Plans of the district for the years 1977-78 to 1979-80 were discussed and finalised. The table below indicates the head of Developmentwise outlays finalised by District Planning and Development Councils for the Dist. Plan vis-a-vis expenditure on District level plan schemes as finalised in the Annual Plans for the years 1974-75 to 1978-79.

4.4. Since the finalisation of Fifth Five Year Plan both at national and state level was delayed considerably the District Five Year Plan as finalised by the Dist. Planning and Development Council never got sanction and the subsequent Annual Plans in the Fifth Five Year Plan formulated at District level had hardly any reference to the Dist.Five Year plan. The trend in expenditure on the District level plan schemes every year is an increasing one.

4.5. The expenditure incurred under the plan schemes in the district since IInd Five Year Plan to Vth Five Year Plan are given below.

From the aforementioned table it is observed that during the both Fourth and Fifth Plan "Agril. and allied Services" accounted for maximum expenditure as compared to other sectors and next in order was "Water and Power Development". During Fifth Five Year Plan Industry and Mining, Transport and Communication, Social and Community Services and Employment Guarantee scheme was implemented in Fifth Plan with a very high amount of expenditure.

4.6. Annual Plan 1979-80. The plan outlay for the Annual Plan of Osmanabad District during the year 1979-80 was Rs. 802.24 Lakh whereas the actual expenditure incurred was Rs. 1052 Lakhs.

The share of local sector and state sector expenditure was Rs. 1007.34 and 45.18 lakhs respectively.

The following table gives the Headwise and sectorwise expenditure in the Annual Plan for the years 1978-79 and 1979-80.

From the figures presented in the above table it can be seen that there has been increase in the expenditure on Annual Plan 1979-80 over the Annual Plan of 1978-79. Employment Guarantee scheme registered maximum percentage of expenditure i.e. 31.67% to the total expenditure.

Next in order was "Social and Community Services" with 20.71% "Water and power Development" accounted 17.13% expenditure and "Agril. and allied Services" recorded 16.95% expenditure. "Transport and Comm-unication" accounted for 12.08% of expenditure while "Industry and Mining" and "Co-operation" shared 1.43% and 0.03% of expenditure respectively.

4.7. Sub Headwise progress of expenditure and physical achievement of targets is discussed in the following <sup>Para 4 -</sup> graphs.

I- AGRICULTURAL AND ALLIED SERVICES:

1. Crop Husbandry: -1. Agriculture and allied Services".

During the year 1979-80 an amount of Rs. 1.34 lakhs was spent under this sub-head. The percentage of expenditure to the total expenditure of agriculture and allied services was 0.75. The physical achievement under this sub-head are as under. Under the plant protection campaign an area of 4,889 hectares was covered under midgefly control, while under eradication of white grub an area of 103 hectares was covered.

2. Ware housing and marketing.

During the year 1979-80 an amount of Rs. 0.10 lakhs was spent for the development of warehousing and marketing. Financial assistance was given to one Agricultural Produce Market committee.

3. Drought prone area's programme.

Under this programme an amount of Rs. 24.86 lakhs was spent during the year 1979-80. Contour/graded bunding was taken up in 841 hectares of land and 8 Nala check bund works were completed.



4.Minor Irrigation.

An amount of Rs. 106.97 lakhs was spent against this sub-head in state sector. The physical achievements under this sub-head are as under. As many as 84 new irrigation wells were constructed, subsidy for the installation of 91 pumping sets was given during the year 1979-80. An irrigation potential of 1000 hectares was created.

5.Soil Conservation.

The soil conservation programme which was initially undertaken in the Third Five Year Plan and continued further was also included in the Annual Plan 1979-80. An expenditure of Rs. 5.00 lakhs was incurred during 1979-80. Under new bunding an area of 2,447 hectares was covered.

6.Area (Ayacut) Development)-

An amount of Rs. 12.52 lakhs was spent on this sub-head and land development works were carried out in an area of 1940 hectares of land during the year 1979-80. The ayacut works were taken up under Terna project (Tq.Osmanabad), Gharni project (Tq.Nilanga), Teru project (Tq.Udgir), Manjra (Tq.Kallan Ambli (Tq.Paranda) Kurnoor (Tq.Tuljapur) Khandala (Tq.Tuljapur) Harni (Tq.Tuljapur) Jakapur (Tq.Umerga), Banganga (Tq. Bhum) and Ranganga (Tq.Bhoom)

7. Animal Husbandry:

An amount of Rs. 2.50 lakhs was utilised for implementing various schemes under this sub-head viz. 67 Heifers were supplied by providing subsidy. One Veterinary dispensary was constructed and medicines were supplied to 113 existing veterinary Institutions.

8. Dairy Development.

An amount of Rs. 21.71 lakhs was spent during 1979-80 and as many as 92 dairy societies received benefit of subsidy.

9. Fisheries.

An amount of Rs. 2.47 lakhs was incurred during the year 1979-80. As much as 70.95 lakh fish-production (seed) was achieved during the year 1979-80. Fish seedlings to the extent of Rs. 46.08 lakhs were stocked in the impounded water. Netting of fish to the tune of 766 M. tonnes was done. 4 Fisher youths were trained, 5 societies were benefited under the scheme "Development of Fisheries Co-operatives" and share capital was provided to one society. Nylon twine to the tune of 321 Kg. was supplied under the scheme "Assistance for purchase of Fisheries requisites."

10. Forest.

An amount of Rs. 1.12 lakhs was utilised under this sub-head and an area of 90 hectares was covered under the scheme "Afforestation of degraded forest".

11. Community Development:

Under this sub-head an amount of Rs. 4,000/- were spent for implementing the various schemes of community Development.

II - CO-OPERATION:

The amount spent under this head was Rs. 35,000/- Share capital contribution was given to one society during the year 1979-80 and subsidy was given to 3 consumer societies.

III-WATER AND POWER DEVELOPMENT.

Under this head an amount of Rs. 180.29 lakhs were spent. The earth work of Wataphal (Paranda) project to the extent of 18,113 cubic metres was completed during 1979-80.

The earthwork of Whatl project (Ahmedpur) to the extent of 58,160 cubic metres was completed during 1979-80. The earthwork of Turori project was completed to the extent of 53,970 cubic metres. The masonry work of Aurad-Shahjani project was completed to the extent of 3,900 cubic metres. The masonry work of Giraksal project to the extent of 2,300 cubic metres was completed, during the year 1979-80. Under the "Rural Electrification Programme" as many as 141 villages were electrified during 1979-80. As many as 27 new pumpsets were installed during the year 1979-80. Electrification of 387 Harijan Bastis was also achieved during the year 1979-80.

#### IV. INDUSTRY AND MINING.

Two sugar factories one at Dhoki in Osmanabad taluka and another located at Killarixk in Ausa taluka are functioning during the year 1979-80. Number of Saw mills, processing mills such as ginning mills, rice mills, oil mills are already in existence and there is still a large scope for the establishment of more units in the district. Besides this there is also scope for other types of small scale industries. During the year 1979-80 an amount of Rs. 15.04 lakhs was spent under this Head. Under seed money assistance 328 individuals were benefited. Share capital was given to as many as 4 societies. Financial assistance was given to 156 small scale industries under S.A.I. Rules.

#### V- TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION.

Under this head an amount of Rs. 127.07 lakh was spent during the year 1979-80. Road length of 42 Kms. improved during 1979-80. Under the crash px scheme of road, a total length of 129 Kms. was completed during the year 1979-80. Two C.D. works were also completed during the year 1979-80.

VI- SOCIAL AND COMMUNITY SERVICES:

1.General Education:- An amount of Rs. 20.99 lakh was spent under this sub-head during 1979-80. Under the scheme Educational concessions to economically backward pupils 972 pupils were benefited. Grants were provided to 43 secondary schools for development and expansion. Govt. open merit scholarships to 64 students were awarded.

2.Technical Education:- Under this sub-head an expenditure of Rs. 4.10 lakh was incurred for implementing the various schemes.

3.Medical and Public Health:- The total expenditure under this sub-head was Rs. 7.76 lakhs which was utilised for implementing various schemes under the sub-head Medical and Public Health involved replacement of two jeeps to primary Health centres, grants to two mobile health squad and various constructional activities taken up.

4. Sewerage and water supply.:- Under this sub-head an expenditure of Rs. 77.17 lakhs was incurred. Under rural piped water supply scheme 5 villages were benefited. As many as 119 bore wells were dug by G.S.D.A., 49 drinking water wells were constructed and 95 handpumps were installed.

5.Housing:- Under this sub-head an amount of Rs. 65.06 Lakh was spent. As many as 2,357 huts were constructed under scheme of "Housesites to landless workers" in rural areas during the year 1979-80.

6. Urban Development:- Under this sub-head amount of Rs. 12.00 lakhs were utilised for assisting the municipal councils for implementing their development plans during the year 1979-80.

7. Labour and Labour welfare:- Under this sub-head an amount of Rs. 15.17 lakh was spent for implementing the various schemes which are almost staff schemes.

8. Welfare of backward classes.:- An amount of Rs. 10.61 lakh was spent. As many as 100 students were benefited under grant of tuition fees, examination fees to backward class students during the year 1979-80. 1,000 backward class students received the scholarship. As many as 27 B.C. hostels were opened for B.C. boys and girls. Under the scheme of "Improvement of Harijan Bastis" 10 harijan bastis were improved.

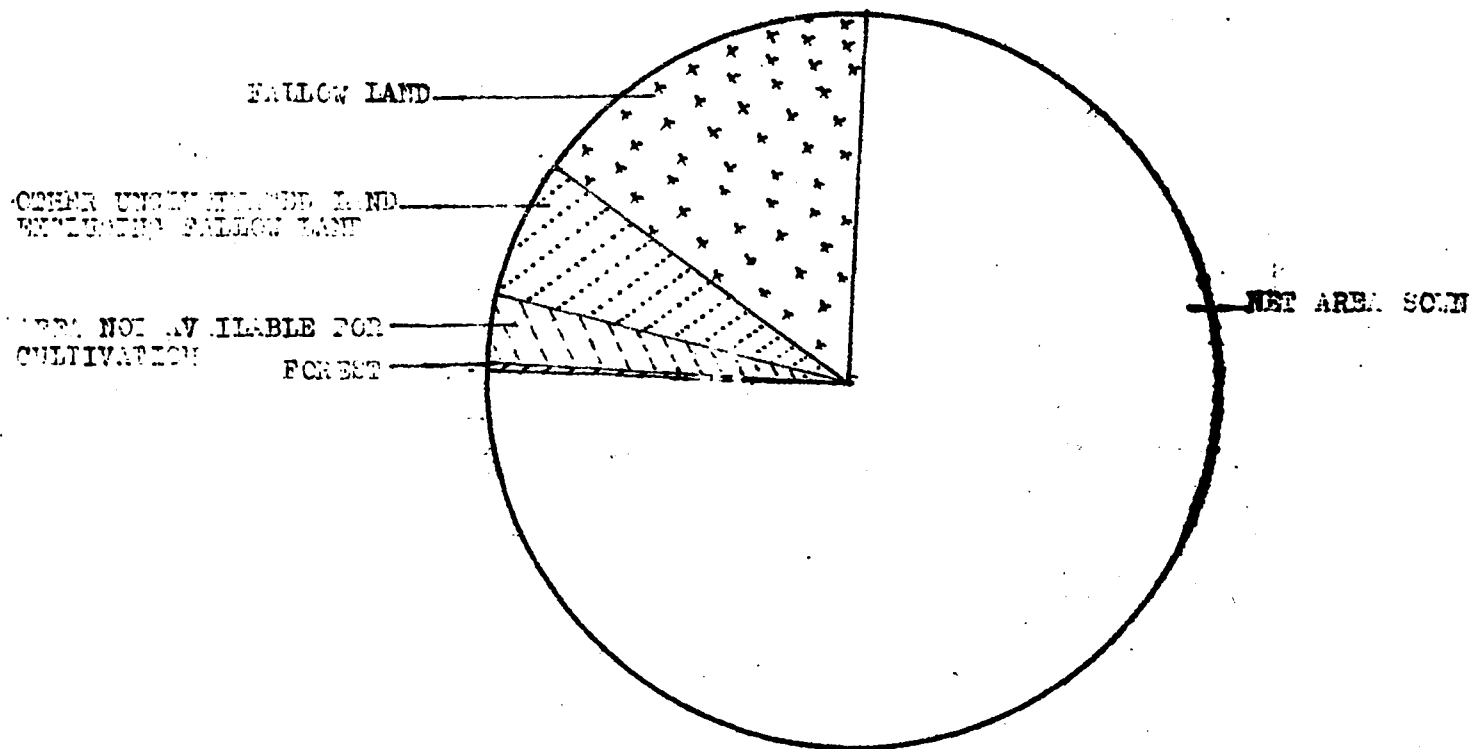
9. Social Welfare:- Under this sub-head an amount of Rs. 0.04 lakh was utilised during the year 1979-80 for giving grant in aid to voluntary Institute for infact guidance and also to the institutes for disables.

10. Nutrition:- An amount of Rs. 5.09 lakh was spent under school feeding programme and as many as 2,000 students were benefited.

VII- EMPLOYMENT GUARANTEE SCHEME:

Under this head an amount of Rs. 333.32 lakh was spent, during the year 1979-80 and 427 labour oriented works were in progress with labour attendance of 23,377.

# LAND UTILISATION IN OSMANABAD DISTRICT 1978-79.



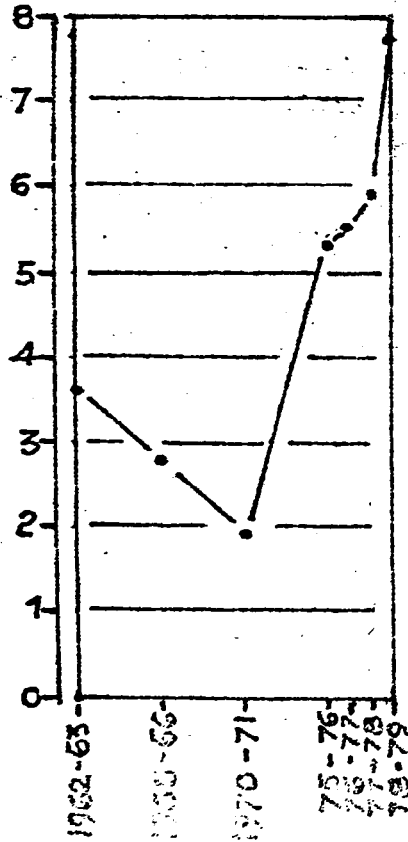
